Fundamentally the desire of the Board to have and create the best possible playing conditions for the athletic teams of the High School is an admirable idea... and also a luxury. All things being equal... no one, in their right mind, could condemn or criticize the Board of Education for wanting to have the best field for the High School football team under perfect conditions as possible... and if that is their hope and ambition why not be consistent about it and give all sports perfect conditions under which to compete?

Let's Go To The Movies at Rahway and Nearby Moving Picture Theatres

The Princeton And Rahways

No other school in the State... to the best of my knowledge... has a practice field, a scrimmage field and a game field... with the possible exception of Princeton University... and it is a far cry from the Princeton to the Rahways. At least at Princeton, with their endowed athletic program, no student of the University is denied an athletic field upon which to compete just because he doesn't happen to be good enough to make the varsity team.

The Basketball Season

Next in line comes the basketball season... and here, there is a difference. The High School team has, perhaps, the best facilities in the State, a fine court, comfortable dressing rooms and showers right at their beck and call whenever they are needed... and they hold all of their practice sessions and scrimmages right on the same court upon which they play. But, if your memory goes back to the winter time, in this hot weather, you will remember, the elementary school gymnasiums are opened to the Recreation Commission for their leagues, which are made up for the most part of kids who are out of school and at work. Then too there is the Y. M. C. A. court which caters to many of the younger boys and gives them a chance for competition all winter long... and the Y varsity and Jayvee teams. Taken all in all we do have adequate playing space for all during the basketball season.

Let's Look At Some Other Fields

Wonder how much baseball and track or even picnics, if you will, would harm that turf at Riverside Park. Let's consider the Polo grounds and Ruppert Stadium, in New York and Ebbets Field, in Brooklyn. On all three fields they play football, baseball, hold fights and have track meets... for the best athletes in the world. It doesn't seem to cause injuries to the National League Professional football players and they play, romp and run across the diamond in the course of their football games. It doesn't seem to ruin the football field because there is a baseball diamond encroaching on the playing field.

A Business Proposition

Perhaps you may say, "Well that's a business proposition and the owners have to get all possible use from those fields in order to meet expenses and also make a profit." Well and good, but isn't operating your school system a business proposition for the Board of Education? Aren't they handling big business for you and me and every resident of the city? Is it good business to say nothing of the unfairness, maintain a field for the use of one sport and deprive the rest of the outdoor sports program of the city and schools, of a decent place to play? Is it good business to make two sports carry the entire load of teams that could produce and revenue? I am not at all against a track team of the High School and also any baseball team in the city.

If Riverside Park is to be kept entirely for football, why do we have football in the City? And if we have football in the field in the fall? Of course, I know that right now there are no other football teams in the city. The reason being, there isn't any place for them to play where they can get the money with which to provide suitable and safe equipment for the players on teams that would be formed.
