

## HIGH SCHOOL MANPOWER

The almost critical situation confronting many of the industrial plants now working on war supplies is a most positive matter. And if the draft continues to take more men, it is going to become almost desperate, perhaps requiring a definite call for enlistment or even a draft of the pupils to maintain the output necessary to carry on at its highest degree of efficiency.

There are three sides to the question of securing greater manpower from the High School: First, the necessity of the High School keeping an excessive large staff of teachers engaged. Second, the desire of the pupils to remain in high school. Third, some way by which to man the industrial plants and keep them going at top speed.

The first consideration may be dismissed by giving a large number of the teachers leaves of absence for the duration of war in plants.

It is the second and third phases of the problem that furnish the crux of the situation. Every effort should be made to keep pupils in high school, and the winning of the war is of greater importance. It is already known that the ten men in the service that we already know of, and some of these were drafted from the High School student body.

If now the situation is such that there must be greater manpower for the industrial plants, then it would seem that the colleges and universities should be willing to change their entrance requirements for the duration of the war, so that the high school to give four hours a day to war work.

We could name a half dozen studies in the High School curriculum, some required, some optional, that could be dropped for the duration, and the required credits for school courses, and yet give credit for enough hours to permit college entrance.

If this cannot be done, then the High School course should be lengthened to five years, instead of four, so as to employ most of the high school pupils to enlist in industrial graduate with their classes. The fact is, as every school high school altogether too young for entrance into college, universities that are preventing the necessary manpower from being secured from the High School, by still insisting on a certain number of credits from High School pupils, which could easily be scaled down to fit this emergency, and thus give pupils credit for full work in school, and after all, it is even more important than any school curriculum.

## A THRILL OF PRIDE

Even though it is being hinted that the plan of the Administration to limit the use of the \$15,000,000 war bond issue to purchasers other than the banks, is intended to build up political prestige that is not intended for President Roosevelt in 1944, yet this should not be taken as the more important fact that there is yet a war secured by sale of bonds and stamps, which, beginning this month, must be bought to the amount of billions by American citizens, Republicans as well as Democrats.

There will be contests, both state and district, carried on during this Third War Loan Drive, all of which are certain to be used to attract attention upon our commander-in-chief at Washington, as needing this money to conclude a durable peace, but that factor, if it exists, must be dismissed in view of the fact that this new drive must be over and every red-blooded American, should have a share in its success.

We are told there are today 50,000,000 people in the United States contributing regularly to purchase \$25,000,000 worth of bonds, but let the people not forget, that the money from these bonds is practically all spent. See cost this year—not last year—but this year, \$100,000,000. That is why there is to be a personal appeal made to every individual to buy bonds during this drive.

War is expensive, with a single night's raid of 1,000 bombers over Rhineland costing \$1,000,000 for the bombs, five times that amount for the eight planes lost through enemy action, and \$375,000 for the gasoline used. Five and one-half million dollars for each sortie made against Germany is an expensive campaign.

But it's worth it. If we can make this old world safe, for the people of Norway, Greece, France, Poland, Ethiopia, Finland, Belgium and all the rest of the nations of the world, including our own, we can afford to go hungry many times, and also postpone buying that new suit for at least another year.

There really is no greater satisfaction in this life than to have the conscious knowledge that one has actually participated in a noble and just cause, such as that in which this nation is engaged with the Axis powers just at this time.

In the Sea of Marmara, some 15 miles from Istanbul, is Rabbit Island, only a short distance from the

island of Prinkipo, the delightful summer resort for the was once owned by a Mr. Bulwer, a former U. S. ambassador, who spent thousands of dollars in building a boat landing, terracing the slopes of the hill that formed the island, hauling in hundreds of boatloads of fertile soil for a garden, and erecting a beautiful residence at the very crest. Hardly had he been completed, however, when the chance of administration recalled him as ambassador, forcing him to abandon his island home, which has since grown up in weeds and underbrush.

No visitor ever leaves Istanbul without seeing the whirling and sword dances. With general Near Eastern Relief men, with whom I was associated, we went one Friday afternoon to see these semi-religious performances. For this privilege we paid a small fee.

The whirling dervishes, to the number of 10, started slowly circling around in a circle, their hands upraised, and bodies turning as on a pivot, a priest seated at one side. Gradually their speed increased until they were whirling like a top. Whenever they came around to the priest, however, they stopped, bowed reverently to him, and then resumed their whirling.

They went on, keeping perfect rhythmic time, as with half-closed eyes, they chanted, "Allah, Allah," as with this continued for 15 minutes until they rested. The whole ceremony was repeated four times.

They were joined by the priest, and the whirling was increased to its highest tempo, slowing down at the end of the participants gave a prayer of benediction and the gathering of about 50 fled out.

We also visited the Persian Mohammedan sword dances. A priest was engaged in sharpening a sword as we went in, and on a brazier were live coals. An attendant approached the priest and taking a sharp ax thrust it through his chest, and another man took the ax and thrust it into the chest, leaving him there for fully 10 minutes. Another attendant, with long hair, shabbily dressed and with a wooden leg, then went to the priest, who had slain hanging, while another man with a sword thrust through his shoulder blade. And war attendant came forward and had an ax driven through the flesh of his groin, and later, when these axils were removed, not a drop of blood was seen, and we sat within ten feet of several of them.

While a half-dozen of the dances were under way, going these mortifications of the flesh, other devotees were swaying from side to side and throwing their heads to the right and left, crying, "Allah, Allah," in concert. Finally a boy of 15 fell exhausted. The priest then took a red hot coal from the brazier and placed it on his tongue and closed his mouth over it, and two others ran at good speed and bunted their heads into a post, which threw them back at least three feet. One of the men who had his chest pierced, ran his tongue along a red hot steel rod, and the concluding act was by the priest, who thrust a sword into his abdomen, had it blade across his tongue, and then had two attendants lift him off the floor as his naked torso lay across the sharp blade of the sword.

Finally all the attendants, but the priest, began circling the room, throwing their heads and bodies side in time with their feet and the chant, which they kept up for a half hour, the priest occasionally joining them to increase the tempo. Faster and faster they went, with arms on their shoulders, until finally the assistant priest, breathing in his face and assisted in this position: a visiting priest then ordered them seated, and then, after an hour and a half, the ceremony had lasted.
