At Nain I was entertained for the night by a Turkish effendi, who owned, he said, 1,100 acres of land, but tilled it in a most primitive manner, threshing the grain on the floor, horses being driven around in a circle over the floor, so as to trample out the grain. The house was a two-story stone structure, fand I was given a front room on the second floor, overlooking the animal enclosure, that contained perhaps 50 goats, mules, ponies and cattle. Around the corral were hovels of mud, in which the natives lived, who worked for the effendi; and these huts, I was reliably informed, were alive with vemin. I was served a meal of beef-stew, with bread, sans

knife and fork. When I realized that I was supposed to pick out the pieces of meat and vegetables too, with my fingers, from the large container set before me, I laughingly told the effendi's son, in the few French words that I had acquired in France, that it seemed a pity for me to put my fingers in such a fine pot of stew. He smiled and said, perhaps he could get me a knife and fork, and went down stairs. After about 15 minutes he came back with the brassiest knife and fork I ever saw, but






