I believe that the City should first conduct a general survey of the salaries of all City employees before making any increase.

## Meters Conserve City's Water

Only Once, Past Summer, Was City Called on to Get Outside Supply

Although considerable criticism of the increased cost of water in the city, due to the installation of water meters, is being heard, Secretary James J. Kinnealy, reported to the Board of Water Commissioners Friday night that 200,000 gallons of water were saved daily the past year, despite the heavy use of local industrial concerns.

On only one day during the past year did the city have to resort to outside supply to obtain water from the Madison Water Company, with which Rahway has made arrangements to be supplied.

The unexpended balance of the Rahway Water Company was reported as \$26,877, which has been placed in the surplus revenue account for the coming year.
