During the war everyone knows there has been a shortage of help in all street and sanitary departments. The war plants with their high wages took in these men to the disadvantage of health and sanitation—and the public health. In cities of low sea-level the danger is more acute than those more elevated, and Rahway is what can be called a sea-level town.

The Rahway Board of Health is getting busy and leaving no stone unturned in making a thorough investigation. Since the new health officer Mr. O'Neill has come on the scene, nothing in his department, he claims is going to be overlooked.
