N. J. Waterfowl Season From Oct. 13 to Dec. 31

New regulations governing the hunting of migratory game birds this year between October 13 and December 31—the Fish and Game Council of the State Department of Conservation has announced.

According to a memorandum sent to the State Fish and Game Council by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in Washington, the daily bag limit during the season will again be ten ducks, including not more than one Wood Duck. The possession limit on ducks is two days' bag (except Wood-Duck—only one allowed—any time). The additional daily bag of 5 mallards, pintails or widgons is no longer allowed. A Federal duck stamp is required for all duck hunters over 16 years of age.

During the season, hunters may take ducks, American and Red-breasted Diver, Green-winged Teal, and Coot. In order to promote the use of a table delicacy, the "Whiteball" will be permitted by Ducks Unlimited and it is hoped that the new name will persuade more sportsmen to put this sport on the table and thus help control the disproportionate increase of the species. According to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the "Whiteball" is the most plentiful amphibious migrant, as it ranks close behind the mallard and the pintail.

There is one duck on shore which is not open season on shore—Goose or Ross's Goose, or Swan. The taking of waterfowl by means of bait, live duck or goose decoys is again prohibited by the 1945 regulations. It is unlikeliest to be larger than to gauge and holding more than two shells.

The 80-day season on ducks is set for New Jersey is shared by 21 other States where there are Connecticut, Delaware, Kansas, Missouri, the eastern part of New York and Pennsylvania.

N. J. Families Receive \$34,909,000 In Insurance

New Jersey families received \$34,909,000 in life insurance death benefit payments in the first half of this year, compared with \$31,140,000 in the corresponding period of last year and \$25,386,000 in the first half of 1941. It was reported today by the Institute of Life Insurance.

The number of policies becoming due in the first six months was 43,400 which compared with 40,948 in the corresponding period of the previous year and 30,616 in the first half of 1941.

In spite of a reduction this year in the civilian death rate, the aggregate of death benefit payments has continued high largely because of increased war fatalities. Harold J. Johnson, president of the Institute, said in announcing the figures: "War-time payments and the greater activity in life insurance have meant many millions of dollars going to the families of those who died in service."

Of the aggregate payments in this state \$21,624,000 was under 9200 policies, \$4,825,000 was under 2313 group life insurance policies and \$8,350,000 was under 21,688 industrial insurance policies.

For the nation as a whole, \$62,617,000 was paid as death claims under 704,281 policies in the second quarter, compared with \$61,414,000 in the first quarter of 1942 and \$49,560,000 in the first quarter of 1941.

The number of policies becoming due in the first six months was 43,400 which compared with 40,948 in the corresponding period of the previous year and 30,616 in the first half of 1941.

TIMELY WARNING

Monday, while General Wainright was being honored by the President, and both houses of congress, Mrs. Baumgartner received a telegram telling that her son was still alive, and had returned on a plane toward home. He had been a prisoner in Okinawa, Formosa and most important commercial city in Japan.

Said Sam Robinson of Andy: "To us he is as big a hero as any general or admiral, and there was great rejoicing in our household when Andy's mother broke the news he was alive and on his way home. Andy, don't forget, was one of us."
