## PEACE TIME SPENDITIS

With the ending of the war on all fronts the principal topic of conversation among nearly all groups of Rahway residents, and quite likely throughout the nation, is the reduction of taxes. While we here in Rahway are fundamentally unopposed to municipal levies it seems as the momentary Rahwayans are giving more and more time to the discussion of revenues-of our Federal government.

News coming out of Washington lately seems to convey the idea that some members of Congress either haven't become aware of the war's end or the news hasn't reached them as yet. A flock of new bills now before the Congress propose peacetime spending of 50 billion dollars, a sum exceeding the all-time peak of 47 billion dollars in years collected during the last wartime fiscal year ending June 30. Many a Rahway taxpayer has asked, "Why this runaway spending program if the obnoxious world peace is to be so promised."

Congress has been asked to get itself on a peacetime spending basis, cut in half the 1946 wartime tax bill of 47 billion dollars and initiate a special program of tax relief. The Committee on Post War Tax Policy has advocated a real effort be made to balance the national budget within a reasonable period, to cut down the huge national debt and eliminate deficit spending that has been the rule in the Nation's Capitol for more than a decade.

The reduction of Federal spending, thereby easing the tax burden of the Nation, will go a long way toward easing the trying period of reconversion with its layoffs, strikes and cutbacks. Reduction of Federal taxes, which affect nearly every pocketbook in the U. S. A., will add considerably to the "take-home" pay of the worker, which at the moment, appears to be the bone of contention in organized labor.

## BACK PAGE PIONEERS

A back page of a late New York Times carried an account of the expanded benevolent program of the United States Medical Service, Inc., a prepaid medical care organization sponsored by the Medical Society of the State of New York and seventeen county medical societies. The expanded plan provides medical, surgical and maternity care, including after-care, in the home and in the doctor's office, as well as in the hospital. A feature of the new arrangement is a provision entitling subscribers to specified payments toward the services of qualified specialists.

The cost of complete coverage for the expanded service will be \$1.60 a month for individuals and \$4 a month for a family consisting of husband and wife and children under 18 years of age. Until the new plan is proven successful, it is being tried on a limited scale.

There is a sample of the way the medical profession throughout the nation is pioneering the way toward the broadest and highest-possible-levels-of medical care. When it takes a step forward, as in the case of the New York group, no banner headlines spring from Washington. And yet at this time millions of persons are being cared for under privately-operated-group-health-plans that have come into being within the past few years and are expanding as rapidly as experience permits. These plans have at least one permanent advantage over the most efficient Federal health plan that will ever be devised—they are based on voluntary action. There is no payroll deduction or charges of any kind, except by the consent of the individuals who wish to come under their protection.
