Motorists Urged To Protect Cars

With snow, ice and hazardous traffic conditions around the corner, it is now vital for motorists who would drive this winter to have their vehicles inspected under possible conditions. Motor Vehicle Commissioner Arthur W. Mage warned today:

"Your life may depend on how well your vehicle's safety equipment works — or how well it works after the winter," said the commissioner. "If you are a motorist whose car is in shape, you have the safety built half gone. You are taking the chance that inspectors at stations you frequent will find out. If they do, any car that bears a current inspection sticker is entitled to free inspection."

Control Cars

Commissioner Mage cautioned motorists to get their cars ready for winter by keeping their cars under control at all times, exercising extra care when driving on slippery roads. "If you are not in control with snow, the main cause of accidents is the driver's impaired visibility," he said. "If you are not in control of your car, the safety features of the car, such as the brakes, the shape, and the speed, are greatly reduced under the conditions then existing."

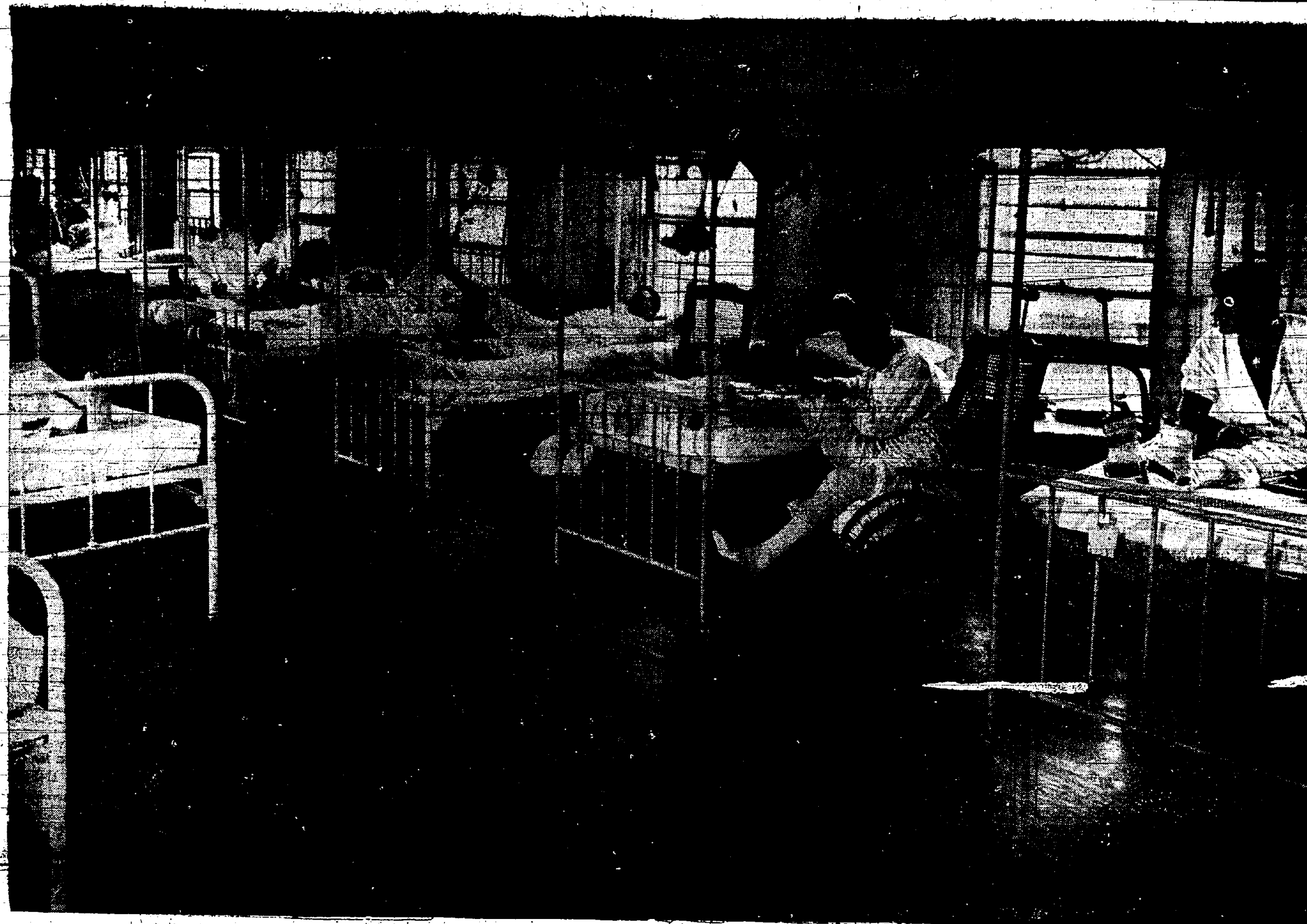
