THE BRUTALITY OF WAR.

War is a terrible thing, however great its horrors may be magnified by the spirit of Christian philanthropy, to which soldiers owe so much in the war for the Union. By its resort to brute force in battle and its selected slaughter at its chosen means for success, a state of warfare inflicts the worst possible of human nature and affords a lesson to brutality that the most ardent advocate of war, even circumlocuted communities are insufficient to effectually restrain.

In a half-civilized community like where the conflict is between rival powers, war assumes a species of ferocity unknown to Christian lands. This is terribly illustrated by the indifference sent to the press from the devastated city of Alexandria, the last accounts from which represent a scene of carnage accompanied by arson and pillage such as disgraces humanity. Two miles of burning buildings, fired by the torch of the incendiary, streets strewn with empty clock and jewel cases and ruined debris, the fruits of plunder, and two thousand massacred persons of both sexes and of all ages, lying stiff and stark in death, furnish the outlines of a picture terrible to contemplate.

There are many who will ask what it all about—who is responsible for this fatal outbreak of diabolical violence? That there is a heavy responsibility resting someone is plain, and that this it will probably be determined who is immediately to blame for the destruction which has fallen on Alexandria. This is a rapid and prosperous city should be saved by fire and sword and subject to destruction, with the atrocities committed in this age of the world's progress, under the conscience of the civilized world.

Primarily, the blame belongs to England, without whose hostile action this calamity would never have been possible. Even the most benevolent of the city, the presence of the French and English ironclads and the justice attitude of the Arab population against the Christian residents of Alexandria. That, however, had been suppressed and the native authorities were pledged to preserve order in the future. This pledge was kept up to the time the English ships stood first in port. In this, the French did not participate in their entire responsibility for it, and to a great extent for its results, must be at the door of the Government of Great Britain.

Mr. Gladstone, when questioned in the House of Commons that the British Government could not have anticipated the terrible events which followed the bombardment of the city. This is undoubtedly true, but it requires for him to show that an act of war, which his supporters so dismally failed in, was in every event, justifiable. England and Egypt were not at war. No terrible enthusiasm in his behalf was sought by the English, and still less was it asked or desired by the Sultan, who is acknowledged by England as sovereign of Egypt. So far as we can see, the Egyptians had a right to erect the fortifications for defending their city of which the English Admiral complained. He blocked by his government, took the responsibility of destroying the defenses, the construction of which the Egyptians could not accomplish, and the results which followed are the direct fruits of his action. We agree with a contemporary that "some one has blundered, and that the blunder has resulted in a blot on the annals of the nineteenth century."
