In the first two classes, we each prepared a dish garden at our January meeting. We have learned how to maintain the plants and make them 'show-worthy'.

 Limited to ages 6-9.

 Limited to ages 10-12.

Class 3: Little Shop of Horrors
 Any container grown plants from home. Must have been in our care for 2 months. *By Feb 10th container plant*

Class 4: Gone With The Wind
 Plants we started from seed or root in January. *Seed or root plant*

Class 5: Into The Woods
 Any cut specimen, flowering or foliage, from a tree, shrub or bulb in our yard. To be subdivided as appropriate.

*forsythia - cut bring in - dark - caps
 10 to 25 inches*

 Limited to ages 6-9.
- Class 7: ~~Each Gully II~~ ^{Little Woman}
~~Each Gully II~~ Min 4 entries. no larger than 5 inches
 Limited to ages 10-12. dried of fresh - femininity
- Class 8: ~~Beauty and the Beast~~ ^{Richie Rich} Min 4 entries. greens no flowers
 Design using 2 containers. evergreens - azalea
 Entries will be placed on the window shelf or the glass coffee table. 12x12x12
 12"x12", height unrestricted. wide
- Class 9: ~~Aladdin~~ 4 entries. Fabric - mat
 A Miniature Design to be placed on a 7"x7" piece of 'carpet' in a dollhouse room. Carpet is supplied by designer. 5x5x5
- Class 10: ~~Lion King~~ Min 4 entries. Ferns - vines
 Design featuring a jungle aspect. tropical
 Entries will be placed on 12"x12" area on wood coffee table located in the Family Room. The table will be covered with a natural rattan mat. Height unrestricted. Explain on card

Floral Designs depicting a high school class subject. Limited to "Graduated Rake and Hoe Juniors". Eligible for Standard Awards only. 14"x14", height unrestricted.

AWARDS: THE OSCAR

Located on Kitchen Counter.

The Standard System of Judging will be used. Judges' decisions will be final.

BLUE 1st place - minimum score 90 pts.
RED 2nd place - minimum score 85 pts.
YELLOW 3rd place - minimum score 80 pts.
WHITE Honorable Mention - min score 75 pts.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT AWARD(S) - A red, white and blue ribbon. Entry must score 95-100 points. Two may be awarded: 1 for the highest rated design and 1 for the highest rated horticulture.

This flower show is being judged for the National Council Award of 'Outstanding Flower Show of the Year by Juniors (ages 6-12)'.

RULES OF THE SHOW: THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

GENERAL RULES:

1. All entries will be made by members of Rake and Hoe Juniors, with the exception of The Special Exhibit which will be entered by "graduated" Rake and Hoe Juniors.
2. All entries MUST be removed before 6:00 pm on April 11.
3. Only 1 exhibit per exhibitor in each class or subclass.

DESIGN RULES:

4. All designs will be made under the supervision of an adult consultant on April 10, 3-6:30 pm.
5. No landscapes and/or scenes allowed.
6. Fresh plant material may not be treated. Only dried plant material may be treated.
7. No artificial plant material is allowed.
8. Cut vegetables and/or fruits may not be used.
9. Accessories and/or bases are permitted in all design classes.
10. All designs must contain plant material. Designer's choice of fresh and/or dried plant material.
11. All plant materials used should be listed on card provided by Committee.

HORTICULTURE RULES:

12. Only those dish gardens created with the plants provided at the January meeting will be allowed to exhibit in Classes 1 & 2.
13. Horticulture entries will be placed on April 10, 3-6:30 pm.
14. Any class may be subdivided by The Horticulture Committee.
15. All Horticulture entries in containers must have been grown by the exhibitor as specified in each class above. All cut Horticulture entries must have been grown in exhibitor's yard and cut by exhibitor.
16. All entries must be identified with a correct name: common acceptable, botanical preferred.
