
1011 MINISINK WAY



The Harrison home, located at 1011 Minisink Way in Westfield, was built in 2011 by Mrs. Anastasia Harrison, an environmentally-conscious architect. Her goal was to build a home for her family that achieved high-silver or low gold LEED certification from the U. S. Green Building Council. The construction used recycled, energy-efficient and eco-friendly materials such as a high-tech heating and cooling system, reclaimed lumber for floors and ceilings and reused antique windows and a staircase. This environmentally "green" home features show the owner's dedication to leaving a minimal environmental footprint.

Recycled materials from nature will be used to enhance the "Enchanted Holiday" theme of the club's decorations. Pine cones, twigs, mushrooms, and birds will take on a silver sparkle. The kitchen will feature wreaths and a topiary using fruits and vegetables. Mercury glass balls in both silver and turquoise will complete the look throughout the home.

288 WATCHUNG FORK



The Womelsdorf home, located at 288 Watchung Fork in Westfield, is a handsome, sprawling stone Dutch Colonial built in 1934. It was renovated in 2011. The interior of the home is enhanced by many fine design elements. The large living room, decorated in the French Country style, is painted a brilliant bamboo shoot green, which gives the illusion of bringing the lovely grounds into the interior of the house. The delightful portrait of "The Lady with Cats" above the fireplace was purchased in a small artist's studio in Rouen, France.

The Rake and Hoe designers will transform these rooms and others to celebrate "A Tartan Christmas." All rooms will be trimmed in Scottish elements that are tied together with heather. Handmade ornaments of tartan ribbon, Queen Anne's lace, and dried hydrangea will adorn the Holiday Tree along with the family's monogram. Surrounded by almost an acre of park-like property, the home presents a delightful landscape even in the winter. The interior of the home is enhanced by many stately design elements. Make sure to see how the designers introduce their theme as you approach the front lawn!

210 South Euclid Avenue



The Jaruzelski home, located at 210 South Euclid Avenue in Westfield, is a colonial in the revival shingle style, built in 1906 by Walter J. Lee, a real estate developer and publisher of The Westfield Leader. The current owners purchased the property from Mr. Lee's daughter-in-law in nearly its original condition. Working with Architect Barbara Vincentsen, the Jaruzelski's renovated, restored and expanded the house. The house has won the Great American Home Award from the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and award from the Westfield Historic Preservation Commission and was featured in *Old House Journal* and *Preservation Magazine*, this colonial revival is a shingle style home, popular at the turn of the century. The handsome interior combines classical as well as arts and crafts elements.

"A Visit to Old Westfield" will be the Deck the Halls Holiday House Tour theme for this Victorian Era home. At this home, visitors will be charmed by the beautiful holiday tree decorated with hand-made ornaments made from copies of the long-time local newspaper. Topiaries, unique floral designs and lush evergreens will bring this lovely home an aura of Christmases long ago.

625 Westfield Avenue



The Toricollo home is located at 625 Westfield Avenue in Westfield. Beveled glass, Doric columns, and American Chestnut wood highlight this 1905 shingle-clad neoclassical home. This home features a wrap-around porch with iconic columns and a unique entryway with a full beveled glass door, elegant leaded glass sidelights and an outstanding leaded glass elliptical transom. All of the wood detailing on the first floor, including door and window casings, baseboard moldings, doors, and the staircase are of American Chestnut, which is now extinct due to blight in the early part of the 20th century. Large windows with striking diamond patterned panes light up an interior and are highlighted with impressive woodwork, railings, and stained glass. The home has been restored and decorated in a manner that preserves its charm.

"Birch with a Twist of Moss" is the theme of the decorations throughout this stately home. Guests will notice the club's use of unique containers, the presence of sparkle and reflections, and seasonal fruits, as well as birch and moss. The living room will have a handmade terrarium as one of the many exceptional designs. A highlight is sure to be the music room with a large pot et fleur as a centerpiece and decorative trees made of sheet music. In keeping with the feeling of the home, the seasonal color palette will center on lavender and Clementine orange touches that will enhance the holiday spirit of the home.





Preheat oven to 350°. Grease & flour 2 pans. Mix wet ingredients (Grp I). Mix dry ingredients (Grp II) in bowl and add the wet ingredients.

Add nuts and cherries (Grp III) to batter. Pour into pans and bake for 40-50 min or until toothpick comes out clean. Let cool for 10 min; remove from pan. Sprinkle with powdered sugar, if desired.







Recipe of the Month Easy Appies for Entertaining

CRAB DELIGHT 8 ounces <u>cream cheese</u>, softened 6 ounces crabmeat, drained and flaked 12 ounces seafood cocktail sauce <u>fresh parsley</u>, to garnish (optional)

Mix crab meat and cream cheese together. Spread into a 9 inch size pie pan or similiar dish. Pour cocktail sauce over crab meat mixture to cover completely. Sprinkle with parsley. Refrigerate at least 1 hour to blend flavors. Serve with assorted crackers.



SMOKED OYSTER TIDBITS 24 Nabisco Triscuits 1 (8 ounce) cream cheese 24 smoked oysters (TJ's has them) chopped parsley

Spread cream cheese on Triscuits. Top each with a smoked oyster. Garnish with parsley.

ASPARAGUS ROLL-UPS 1/4 lb prosciutto, 20 very thin slices 1 lb asparagus, about 20 roasted 1/4 lb cheese, 20 pieces (use your favorite semi-firm sliced cheese).

Place prosciutto on a working surface, place I piece of cheese on each slice then lay spears on cheese.

Roll each up and place on a platter.

Bake 350 for 1 hour or until set

Sontag's interest in photography was based on her view of the ephemeral quality of the image, the "illusion" of a captured reality that it claims to hold before the viewer as a presence. But Sontag recognized that the photograph is actually a "pseudo-presence and a token of absence." And, as a result it continually generates successive readers and reading – that is it demands a critical involvement, that is ongoing and dynamic.
