Book of Evidence for Youth Activities February 2010 - January 2011

Rake and Hoe's Juniors committee supports a youth club that meets monthly through the course of the school year. The club is a fun introduction to the joys of flowers and gardening in the broader context of environmental conservation and good citizenship. To that end, the club's objectives fall into three general categories: to develop floral design skills, increase environmental awareness, and provide service to the community.

Many of the year's activities were designed to meet objectives in more than one category. Participation in the GCNJ flower show (30 entries plus 4 volunteer clerks) and a lesson from a professional florist were specifically directed toward the design process, while making hummingbird feeders and a winter bird tree were creative activities that also helped the birds. At another meeting design and service were combined when members made floral arrangements to brighten the classrooms of students with cerebral palsey at the Jardine Academy.

A very special trip to Diane Genco's butterfly garden was an interactive lesson in plants, garden design and the amazing migration of the monarch butterflies. Weeding the gardens at historic Miller Cory house was an opportunity both to learn about native plants useful to the colonists and to support our community with some sweat equity. All these activities and more are summarized in the Juniors Schedule.

The results of these activities can be measured in different ways. There are the Youth National Design and GCNJ Artistic Craft Awards won at the GCNJ Flower Show along with a number of blue, red and yellow ribbons. There is recognition in the local press. But the pictures that are part of this book perhaps tell the best story of enthusiasm, interaction and achievement.

Financial Statement: All youth members paid \$20 in dues. Rake and Hoe budget for this activity was \$500. Expenses were \$264.




