## Yecch! Red tide! Don't despair! It's perfectly natural and it will go away — eventually

**L**ayers of dead fish, mouths agape and eyes stolen long ago by shorebirds form a smelly barrier between the white sand and the high water line on Sanibel-Captiva beaches.

With the state's fish getting worse each day, islanders and visitors alike are becoming reluctant to stroll along the island's gulf shoreline.

From the air, the cause is evident — in reddish-brown stripes commonly known as red tide.

The tiny one-celled plant organism, which is always present in the Gulf of Mexico, has multiplied to dangerously high toxic levels, depleting water oxygen and causing clams, oysters and fish to die and eventual ly litter area beaches.

First reported on Jan. 9, the noxious mist released by

a natural solution

**T**he future battle of microscopic, blue-green algae could solve the problem of the regular gulf coast red tide bloom.

A recent discovery of an algae found in ferns by scientists at the University of South Florida in Tampa could offer the possibility of controlling the outbreak of red tide and its resulting problems. The marine organism, *Gomphonema spumosa*, does not kill the red tide organisms which is always present in Gulf waters but can stop the spread of the harmful toxin it releases. Scientists feel that the cost of finding relief from the

## The sticky decision on a 156-acre trade-off

Weighing the advantages of obtaining 156 acres of environmentally sensitive land off Cass Ybel Road in return for granting development rights for 24 dwellings elsewhere on the island proved a sticky one for Sanibel planning commissioners Monday.

For while the idea of opening up the land to the public for low intensity recreational use — such as canoeing — appeared, there were implications of the deal that bothered them.

## The Captiva survey controversy

Yet another storm is brewing on the otherwise peaceful tropical island of Captiva.

It is not a winter storm, but a row over an opinion poll being conducted by a group of residents.

The Natural Beaches Group of Captiva claims "phony" returns have been made to their poll of more than 400 property owners regarding beach renourishment.

They also say that prearrangement factions on the island are telling people not to respond because it comes from an "anonymous" group and that the ballots are coded to identify the returnee.

Group member Kay Schultz says the 45-plus members felt there had been no real suggestions at Captiva Erosion Prevention District (CEPD) meetings from

property owners — the people who would have to pay for the multi-million-dollar beach rebuilding project.

A letter was drafted seeking their opinion. "Quite by chance ten that were finished first were mailed before the others. We got 50 returned next day," she told the *Island Reporter*.

"Somebody had duplicated them. We knew it was phony. So we numbered the rest so we would know if it happened again. We haven't opened the 50."

"I admit it sounds funny to number them but we were forced to. No record is kept of the numbers. They are absolutely not coded," she added.

"This is not intended as a gain support or to tear down the CEPD work," she said of the letter sent out last

Due to the conflict in business zones in a residential neighborhood, the city of Sanibel has told the center's directors to close shop. This is the story of the result of two-month struggle.

**W**hen Mary first arrived she was recovering from an illness — still weak, depressed and very overweight — the young girl could barely walk from the car to the front of the house. Seven days later she claims to be walking a healthy three miles a day on Sanibel beaches.

But, was a typical prescription addict. The retired school teacher took at different daily doses of drugs to correct her heart, blood pressure and other assorted ailments. Today she says she feels healthier than ever in her life and vows never to swallow another pill, in-

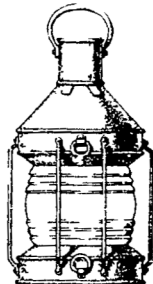


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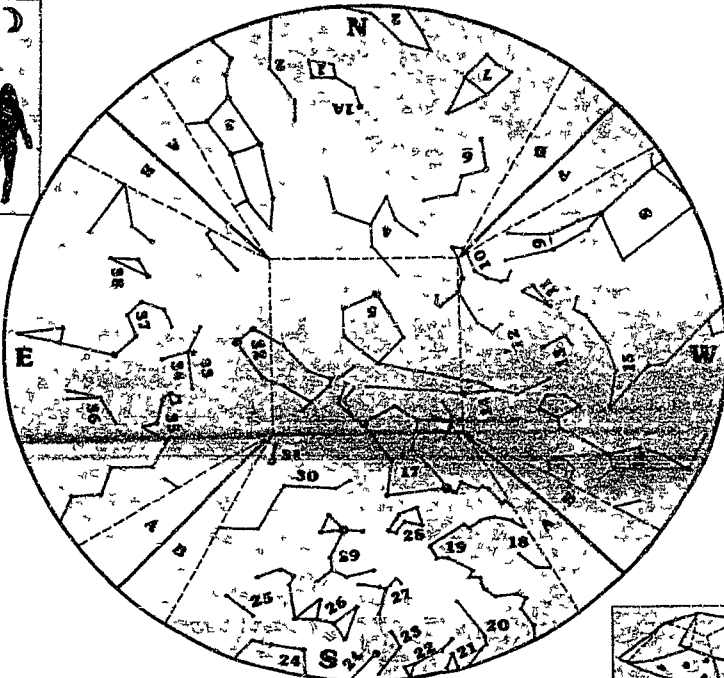


# Star Tracks

## How to assemble map

The celestial map can be cut out and folded to form a cup or interior side of a dome to represent the shape of the sky. When assembled, you can use it to visualize and locate star and constellation positions.

### To Assemble:

- 1 Adhere back of page to thick paper or card to strengthen it.
- 2 Cut along dark black lines, around circle and into four slots in the circle.
- 3 Fold four dotted lines forming the square in toward center of printed side.
- 4 Fold eight angled dotted lines out away from printed side.
- 5 Glue or tape A tab to B-tab together at each of the four corners on the outside (not printed) side of the cup so the tabs do not interfere with the printed map side of map. The sides should buckle and when the printed side is pushed in at the square the cup will be formed.

### To use assembled model:

Look up into the cup as if looking into an eggshell, and use it to represent looking to the heavenly sphere. The inside square represents the top of the sky. Each side represents one of the four directions.

<p><b>It's official now: no deal on causeway</b></p>	<p><b>Reprieve for peppers</b></p> <p>After hearing from Jerry Muench that removing the Brazilian peppers from the extension to Periwinkle Trailer Park would be a hardship at this time, Sanibel City Council agreed to a postponement until spring. They also accepted his offer of a \$1,000 bond in line with normal practice in such cases. Councilman Mike Klein agreed that spring would be a better time to avoid widespread reseedling.</p>

**I**t could be June before Captivans get some respite from the bone-shaking drive along the island's main road

For although the repaving of the road is listed as priority for Lee County's 1982 road program, the work, due to begin in mid-February, is scheduled to take about four months.

Work began in November with the laying of a new water pipeline for the Island Water Association. This will increase water pressure.

It is also raising drivers' blood pressure as they jolt and bump through clouds of dust and over deep ruts and potholes. There have been complaints of flat tires, dented wheel rims and alignment problems as residents and visitors alike pit their vehicles against the narrow, rocky road, some of them leaving behind relics of the arduous trek, like this exhaust and muffler. □

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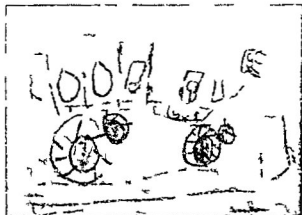

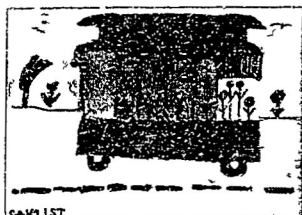

The winning entries are on display at the Chamber of Commerce on Causeway Road.

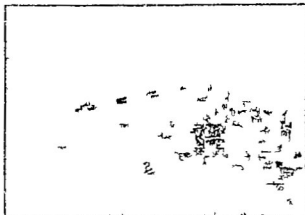

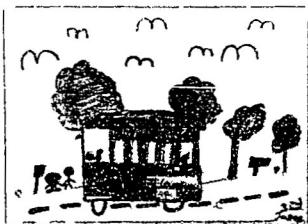

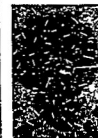

# Bank of the Islands presents Island Epicures and the foods they favor



## Bobbie Sharp

Bobbie Sharp doesn't mind devoting hours to the tedious and laborious creation of a chocolate roll that she will never eat herself. But she just loves watching her guests swoon with culinary delight when they are served with well-thought-out desserts.

I guess you could call me a food voyeur," she remarks. I happily do," she says with a twinkle in her eye.

Cooking is definitely Bobbie Sharp's labor of love for her own pleasure. Bobbie has spent years studying with the master of cuisine, including Julie Lannenburg and television chef Ted Allen. Tell her she isn't really the "little bit" and a little that cook he appears to be on the screen, it is just that he isn't but all his intricate ingredients in his 30-second spots.

But Bobbie will take all the time in the world to redouble a scrumptious recipe, and she'll spend 10 times longer preparing it. She cooks every morning and even on the days she is out entertaining Bobbie and her husband Tom sit down to a 4-course candlelight dinner.

We all eat, but some of us hunger for the finer side of the epicurean art. With 3 ovens, 8 burners, and nearly a lifetime of devotion to the dinner hour, Bobbie Sharp might be said to have the gourmet's insatiable thirst for knowledge.

### Marrow stuffed leg of lamb

Ingredients: 1 prepared leg of lamb

Heat a buttered roasting pan for a 6-pound butterfly leg of lamb and then remove the fat and feel off the top of the leg. Pound it with a mallet between 2 sheets of wax paper (wax the paper with water first so the meat won't stick).

Remove the stuffing. Use the marrow from marrow bones that have been cut lengthwise (open in the middle) can do this for you. Spoon marrow into the hole so that you have a 4-cup full.

Mix this with 1 cup bread crumbs, 2 whole eggs, chopped parsley, two or three cloves of garlic, chopped fine salt, and pepper to taste, and so on to fry.

Turn the leg 1 inch over so that the fleshy side, where the bone was, is up. Do not take the marrow into marrow mixture and spread it where the bone was.

Wash the leg and pat it dry. Rinse, refresh the leg, and sew it. This preparation can all be done the day ahead.

Put the leg in a roasting pan with soft butter and salt and pepper. Put on a rack in a roasting pan and cook it 19 to 20 minutes per pound. This is the perfect timing for pink lamb. The venison will be a good guess.

Let the meat 10 minutes before you remove the string, and serve it with a flame-broiled sauce with a little green vegetable.

## Federal flood insurance program: what happens after its gone?

With a March deadline by which to comment on the plan to halt the sale of subsidized federal flood insurance on undeveloped coastal lands Sanibel City Council is hoping to schedule a special meeting next week with the program's regional director.

After hearing that Glen Woodard would be visiting the area on another matter Councilman Fred Valtin suggested he be requested to meet with the city council to clarify some points.

"We just don't have much time" said Valtin referring to the deadline.

Major Porter Goss said it was important the city respond to the plan. They have de'incurred on the map the portions of the island that are undeveloped. But the real question is not the map. All that says is that federally subsidized flood insurance will not be available after Oct. 1, 1983. What worries me a whole lot more is what are the implications for people already living here?"

"If they are not going to subsidize insurance on new construction are they going to subsidize rebuilding?"

Planning Commission Chairman Ann Winterbottom said she had the matter on the agenda for Monday and a tentative date of Tuesday, Feb. 9 has been given for the special council meeting.

Fears have already been voiced that the decision — made by Congress last year to trim the federal budget — could start a building spree on islands like Sanibel as people rush to buy the deadline.

Sanibel and Captiva contain 1,290 acres of the 15,251 acres of Southwest Florida coastal land designated as undeveloped. A further 4,812 acres are on Cayo Costa 400 acres on North Captiva and 1,653 in the Lover's Key area.

Without federal flood insurance home owners could find private insurance prohibitively high. Goss has said.

Rebecca Wegryn, owner of the Wegryn Medical Clinic on San Cap Road, said she and her husband Dr. Stanley Wegryn plan to go through the special amendment process to get the zoning changed from residential to a special use category since the medical clinic is run on a profit-making basis. It could be considered for an industrial zoning.

Mrs. Wegryn found a quotation by George Washington that she said fit her feelings about the city council's approval of the new commercial plan. "Governments are not reasons they are not, because like fire they are a dangerous servant and a fearful master."

The prospect of not being able to build back if a disaster were to occur worries the center's owners. "We appreciate the fact that they established a special use category and it is our intention to seek the proper zoning to protect the present potentially precarious position of our medical center," Mrs. Wegryn said.

Another disgruntled Sanibel resident said he is plan-

ning to take the city to court over the zoning of his property under the new plan. "The nodal concept should have been followed totally and consistently," said Don Anderson, who owns two pieces of property that were affected by the plan.

One piece which is located off Periwinkle Way across from Tahitian Gardens should have been included with a nearby commercially zoned node, according to Anderson.

Anderson called the plan a pre-conceived set of ideas with no logic or the benefit of compromise. "Since his property was zoned commercial before the city's incorporation, Anderson appeared at several of the public hearings to ask for a change in zoning."

The request was turned down by the council and Anderson said he will not go through the special amendment process because it is cumbersome and expensive. "I'll have to take the only course of action the city will let us in — a court battle," he said.

Despite the lawsuits, some island business owners welcomed the new plan. "I think it will have a positive effect on the island as it will appropriately control future commercial growth," said Gail Boyd, who owns the Old House Cottage and the Post Office Deli. Her husband, William Boyd, owns the Quarters deck restaurant on Periwinkle Way, and Gail said the plan would not have a substantial impact on any of their businesses.

Bert Jenks, owner of Sanibel Sealy said, "The new commercial coverage makes more sense than the previous rules. I took a hell of a long time and a lot of taxpayer's money was probably wasted on the consultants who merely added the garnish to Bob Duane's efforts."

Jenks said he had mixed feelings about some issues of

the new ordinance, including the large concentration of commercially zoned property in the Palm Ridge area. "I don't think it's smart to encourage people to drive three miles or more to a central shopping area when others could be built closer to their homes."

"The new ordinance makes everything out of step in their current condition," Jenks added. "It's a liability to put people into the liability-exploding situation." Jenks also objected to the plan's ruling of a floor area ratio, which determines the total permitted floor area of commercial structures according to the size of the property. "The floor area ratio amounts to an attempt by the city to make future developments more limited and expensive," Jenks said. "I thought none of the businesses on the island comply with the floor area ratio and therefore could not build back in their present state, even if they are in a commercially zoned area."

Mayor Porter Goss said the floor area ratio was meant to be restrictive but that most businesses would be allowed to build back under a slightly different configuration. "In a total way out, it would mean that most businesses would not receive such an intense use."

The new plan is a big improvement and a more realistic way to handle and preserve our balance between commercial and residential development," Goss said. "According to the reason, the benefits of the ordinance include: 1) the commercial development into specific areas, removing surplus commercial zones that we don't need; 2) providing standards for future development and it offers a better delineation of resort or accessory use."

Goss noted that there were no real deep battles over issues between council members, and called the plan an orderly progression of common sense. □

piece of planning since the Comprehensive Land Use Plan. he has been responsible for many of its basic concepts.

He lays much of the credit with the five-man city council who themselves have devoted more than 60 hours to sifting through all the implications and details of the new ordinance which turns the words into city law.

"There were some very hard decisions for the council to make. It is a lot easier to make them when you are sitting here with a map coloring the areas," he says, in clearing his desk and the map-covered walls.

"The whole staff deserve credit, including planner Ken Pfaltz, who did the mapping," says the soft-spoken Bob who lives on Sanibel and finds the plan a real challenge, despite its physical limitations.

"I've worked in large metropolitan areas on mud bogging 2,000-year plans for cities of hundreds of thousands of people developing comprehensive land use plans, but I was never there when the plan was adopted."

"Here I've worked closely with the commercial plan for the past two years and it's very rewarding to see the changes. This is a real dynamic community and it's good experience for anyone in my business to work at this level of sophistication," he adds.

Bob recalled the origins of the plan, which involved his writing up the proposals for the economic consultants to work with. There was a great deal of background material cranked into the proposals and every house on Sanibel was surveyed about its shopping habits and needs.

"The result, two years on in simple terms is a series of incentives and disincentives to encourage the appropriate type and amount of development and its location and quality," he explains.

Bob is optimistic that it will produce a higher quality of development because it offers a wider range of alternatives and flexibility for the business community.

"I sure learned a lot from it. It is a misnomer to say you are a planner when you get out of school, just as it is a misnomer to say you are an attorney when you finish law school. You really start to learn when you do the job," he will tell you.

Though he admits there have been compromises — after all that's the duty of the city council — to iron out the wrinkles and listen to people's problems — Bob is happy with the results of his and others' labors.

Brought up in Chevy Chase Md., Bob studied business and economics at undergraduate school at Kansas City University, where he later went on to obtain his master's degree in city and regional planning in 1974.

He worked in the planning department at Montgomery County Md. for a year, spent two years with the city of Louisville Ky., and another two with the San Antonio Texas planning department before coming to Sanibel in April 1979.

to wipe out more than 50 percent of a business it could not be built back under the current zoning changes.

Throughout the 6 1/2 hours of council discussion on the plan several business owners who own property in the lawfully existing use category showed up to protest the zoning change. But the council stuck with the original planning staff recommendations and made no exceptions in the original commercial codes.

Those businessmen with a definite problem in the lawfully existing use category have the opportunity to apply for a specific amendment for a change in zoning according to Mayor Porter Coas.

After the 12:30 a.m. unanimous vote by the council members took time to recognize the city planning staff who spent countless hours writing, rewriting and reviewing the controversial development plan.

"I'd like to commend the city staff who spent an abundant amount of time and energy on this plan," Coas said.


"We paid a awful lot of money to a consulting firm and we derived some benefit from the market research they did, but who it comes to drawing up a concept. I'm astounded at the quality of what our own staff produced," said Councilman Fred Valtin.

## 'Gator tales

**T**hose of you who wonder what takes place during a typical day (or night) in the life of an alligator would never guess the possibilities include getting entry to a presentation of home movies.

But that's exactly what this gator attempted — or so it seemed.

Island photographer George Wias was presenting a second round of slides at 8 p.m. when the family dog began barking wildly. Thinking the pup had to pay a call, George's wife Vera leashed him and headed for the door.

Upon turning the knob, however, she discovered the door was "stuck" and thrust her weight against the door until it finally opened — and was greeted with an ear-splitting roar.

The Wias adventures were only just beginning when they discerned the source of the roar. Now what to do with this trout herptile? A quick phone call to the Sanibel Police Department roused officer Don Case and Sgt. Betty Wair, who in turn called Island naturalist Mark "Bird" Westall, described the "sticky situation," and enlisted his help.

The circumstances became a bit involved upon arrival of the rescue squad, as, by this time, the gator had become restless, and was looking for the nearest exit from the Wias' front courtyard. With some difficulty and much grunting on the part of the rescue team (Westall: "Hold him, Don! Case: I'm TRYING!"), a noose

was finally slipped around the neck of the alligator, its nose end wound around the body, securing the deadly tail and nostrils.

The gator was transported to nearby Chateau-Sur-Mer and released into a large body of water just off the San-Cay Road. "That's probably where he was heading, anyway," claimed Westall, "when he got lost in the dark and wound up at George's."

The Wias Family Robinson Adventure ended, the household settled in for the night. All except for George, however, who loosed and turned through the night, pondering ways of expanding his home movies so they would appeal to perhaps a higher caliber of audience. He had never guessed his photographs would be so popular. □

**I**f Beachview golfers were off their game over the weekend, it could have been due to the presence of a mean-looking alligator on the banks of the canal near the ninth hole.

Closer inspection would have revealed, however, that the gator posed no danger, having long departed to the Big Pond in the Sky.

"A club member discovered it on Saturday," confided Beachview employee Rod Mitchell, who learned of the gator's presence on Monday. "But we have no idea why it died."

Neither does licensed alligator official Mark "Bird" Westall, who was called upon to investigate the death. Westall, who is one of six Floridians licensed to handle the species, intends to make an attempt to find the cause.

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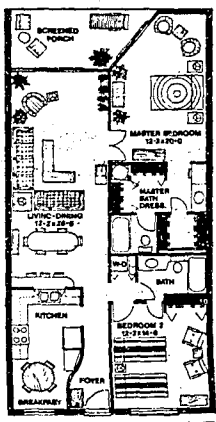

developers have scored another one with the Lee County commission as voters Goss said.

Since the Sanibel Causeway is a two-lane road argued the widening of that small stretch would not significantly increase traffic flow. The mangroves are more valuable to us as a storm surge buffer than a few extra minutes of travel time. Besides there will still be another 60 to 80 feet further up McGregor. The answer is to four lane the entire McGregor Boulevard or to open up an alternative route away from the low-lying wetlands Goss said.

According to the 1981 Hurricane Evacuation and

Hazard Mitigation Study if McGregor Boulevard were four-laned from the causeway toll booth to McPeters Lane the evacuation time for Sanibel and Captiva evacuees could be reduced by almost two hours.

Cliff John Butler, who heads the EPBET (Emergency Preparedness Evacuation Relief Team) as the chairman of McGregor is not one of the alarmed motorists. "If the county were really concerned about our evacuation route they would first elevate the road around the toll booth so it wouldn't flood then fix the congested intersection at McPeters Corner. The four-laning of McGregor would be our third priority."

Negotiations for a compromise are underway between the county and the DFR. Last November Lee County offered to reduce the mangroves to be

destroyed from 6.6 acres to 2.5 acres, but the DFR still wants more mangroves saved. Options such as eliminating the proposed bike path or narrow of the median are being considered according to Triscari.

Abt a year ago Lee County made a commitment to the city of Sanibel to include the bike path in the construction and we are trying to get something for everyone in this deal," Triscari said.

The county has already agreed to replace the 5 acres of mangroves in other areas such as one of the causeway islands Triscari said.

Environmental specialist Dan Garlick said the DFR may be willing to reach a compromise with the county. "This is one of those things that with a little bit of work it could be made into a worthwhile project."

IWA water.

"We were satisfied they met the requirements of the ordinance. They have probably spent a great deal more money in this conservation effort than if they had the hook up."

George Blain of the city building department estimated the cost of CROW's self-sufficiency measures at between \$12,000 and \$18,000. He talked of their "sophisticated" water storage system aimed at conserving water and the sewage treatment plant. Bottled water would be used for drinking.

One point that averted my decision to issue the permit was that it would eliminate entirely the possibility of contaminating the island water supply from 2 seased and 2 c animals which CROW no longer treats."

Councilman Mike Klein felt the dispute could have been settled earlier since CROW's intention not to hook up was known and Tenney agreed describing the IWA as having a reputation for high handedness arrogance and lack of communication.

He called CROW "the innocent victims of the dispute between the city and the IWA. The hook up fee would pay two months salary for the girls who cared for the animals or for the care of 10 or 12 aneels for a

year.

The new building had been designed to make use of the best conservation systems and no one presented until now when they were ready to move in Klein said.

Fletcher who said he wanted the council to arbitrate said "We can operate a utility service on the basis of excluding properties" adding that the city was "legally bound" to the terms of the franchise agreement, a point which City Attorney Neal Bowen said he was not convinced of.

Asked by Valin if he had placed the matter on the agenda to have the council override the city manager's decision, and that if the council failed to do so the IWA would sue Fletcher said the IWA board had not decided what to do. "I wouldn't be a good attorney if I didn't keep the options open," he admitted.

Valin offered to the "adversary" position the city was being placed in referring to the court reporter Fletcher had brought to the meeting to record the discussion.

Fletcher said CROW members had been invited to attend an IWA meeting to discuss the matter but no one had shown up. He had tried to talk to someone from the organization only last week without success. The council was then only recourse he said.

He said he had no proof that former IWA employees Larry Snell and Ian Watson had approved CROW's plans and agreed to monitor the system, as CROW claimed.

Councilman Francis Bailey said he had never been under the impression CROW would hook up to the IWA supply. "We want to conserve everything we can. You come here in a mean, rough adversary attitude. You ruffled our tail feathers," he told Fletcher. One exclusion need not set a precedent, he added. He urged the CROW board to talk with the IWA.

Councilman Dennis White said him "Everybody is going to know about it now. Why didn't you just forget it? You have put it in the spotlight. You could have looked at it with a community spirit."

Mayor Porter Cass wondered whether the IWA had approved providing CROW with a free hook up but Fletcher said it defied exceptions eroded principles.

Klein said a public subscription could probably raise the hook up fee over the weekend if necessary and suggested the IWA pay half, but Valin said that was not the issue. Why did the IWA make it a kind of tax over 17?

A date for the continuance will be set at the request of the IWA or the city.

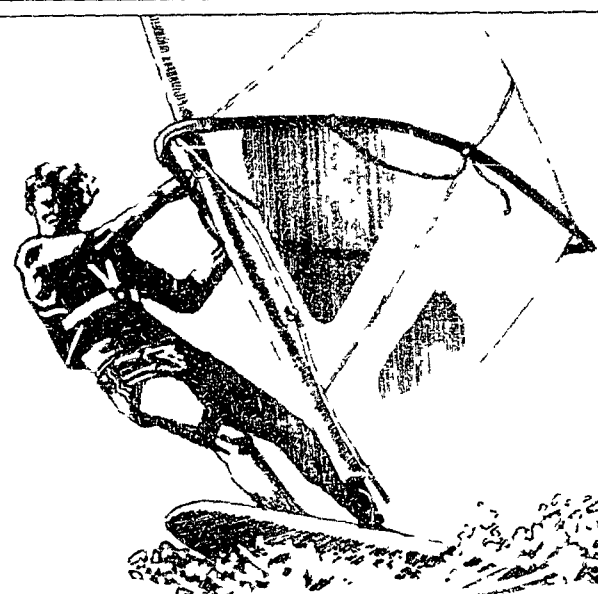

## The CLUP Season

Many people feel there are no seasons on Sanibel. Some visitors even say they could not live here because they have to have a "change of seasons." Nothing should be done to dispel that feeling! However, in truth, we do have many seasons in this semi-tropical paradise. There are the wet and dry seasons, the warm and cool seasons, the tourist season, the Shell Fair season, the summer season, the red tide season, and the season, to name a few. Most subtle of all is the CLUP season!

Subtle perhaps, but a definite season. It is the time when nearly every body, from natives to dirtippers, maligns our Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Listen around at any reputable gathering and you will hear discourses on what is wrong with our CLUP. Then you know it is the CLUP season.

Don't believe a word you hear! I have investigated the phenomenon thoroughly. In almost every case, the learned speaker has no accurate understanding of what the CLUP is all about. In some cases, the learned speaker will admit a lack of knowledge about our CLUP. He is certain, however, that something is rotten at City Hall because he can relate a "horror story": a situation, where equity and justice appear to have been denied. But when you investigate those stories, you will find that nearly always they represent the even-handed application of CLUP requirements.

For example, many horror stories deal with a denial of requests to build a pool, or extend a pool, or pave a driveway. Such requests may be denied because the CLUP sets limits on the percentage of a lot that can be covered with an impervious surface. To those who come here in the dry winter months, that may seem an infringement on individual liberty. But live here in the rainy season, when tropical downpours can dump 18 inches of rain in 24 hours, and you realize that it is not wise to cover over very much of our land surface. So CLUP acts limits on coverage by impervious surfaces. Is that a horror story? Not to me.

Yet, recently an influential citizen cited a horror story where a resident had to choose between paving his driveway and installing a swimming pool. One or the other would bring his lot up to the allowable limit of impervious surface. To me, that is not a horror story... except in CLUP season.

We could go on and on dealing with the truth or fallacy of specific tales recited as horror stories. I leave it to you to check them out for yourself.

## my turn

If you do study the CLUP, you will discover the true GENIUS of our CLUP. To save some time, let me give you a "teaser," a direct citation to the sections that are unique -- the true genius of our CLUP. Start on page 115, where the following unusual statement is made:

"The natural environment performs many valuable functions for man at no cost, it buffers storm winds and flood tides, stabilizes the shore line, purifies water, and maintains a fresh water system which supports a rich wildlife population and lush vegetation. These functions support the health, safety and welfare of every Sanibel resident and must be preserved."

"Different parts of the island contribute in varying degrees to each particular function. For planning purposes, the island has been divided into ecological zones, each with particular characteristics, each making specific contributions to health, safety and welfare, and each with varying tolerances to the range of man's activities. Six ecological zones have been identified on Sanibel...."

This principle is unusual in a planning or zoning document because it identifies the six ecological zones (in other words, the natural environment) as the base line from which both permitted types of land use and permitted land use intensity are to be derived. Stated in the simplest possible terms, it establishes the principle that the natural environment shall be an overriding consideration to determine, first, WHAT man can do, and second, HOW MUCH of it he can do.

To follow the development of this principle, skip from page 115 to page 186. The intervening 70 pages are descriptive, but are not essential to our exploration of the genius of our CLUP. On page 186 we find a discussion of Development Intensity. Although the connection to ecological zones is not explicit, the relationship is clear. All areas of Sanibel are assigned an allowable intensity of use, and those assignments are based on the six ecological zones. The most fragile zones are given a low development intensity to protect their integrity. The less fragile ecological zones are given a higher allowable intensity of use.

The principle is clear: to live in harmony with nature, we must minimize our impact on the environment, in fragile ecotones impact must be kept very low by very limited intensity of use; in less fragile ecotones a high intensity of use may be permitted without serious environmental deterioration.

In our CLUP, intensity of use is measured in an interesting way. It is measured in dwelling units, or DUs. One single family home or apartment is one DU, duplex is two DUs.

Some specifics will illustrate how this works. The Mangrove ecotone, for example, is considered a very fragile ecotone since it is assigned a development intensity of only one DU per 33 acres. In other words, to build one house in the Mangrove ecotone you must have a 33 acre lot. On the other end of the scale, the Gulf Beach Ridge ecotone is considered the least fragile zone. There you may construct one house on a lot which is only two-tenths of an acre. That means that a single acre may have five houses.

And that, in a nut shell, is the GENIUS of our CLUP. It may not seem a particularly exciting genius at first thought. However, it is an unusual and rather rare concept, one so perfectly suited to Sanibel that I believe it is GENIUS!

Most conventional planning documents establish zones where certain kinds of development may take place: offices here, factories there, homes some other place. These zones may have a relation to the environment, but often they do not. In Sanibel, the environment is the base line. From that base the allowable human uses are derived and the intensity of the use is fixed.

Few readers will find fault with this as a general principle. However, in application the consequences are sometimes grim for the CLUP season govtup mill.

For example, some people have purchased property, intending to subdivide it into small lots so several houses can be built. Let us assume that a five-acre parcel was purchased in the Uplands Wetlands ecological zone. The CLUP says that only one house may be allowed on a five-acre area in that ecotone. Therefore, the land cannot be subdivided, and another horror story is in the making.

Question: Is that a horror story? Not if you understand the need to limit the intensity of development on this fragile sandbar!

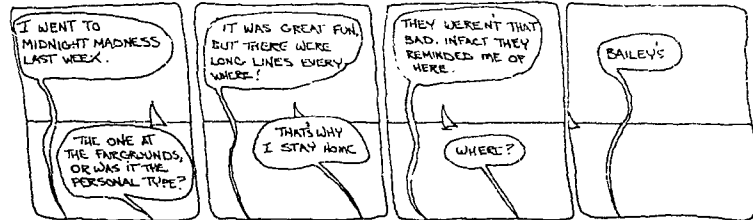
Our CLUP is a 287-page document. Its true genius is contained in only a few of those pages. Much of the remainder is descriptive and administrative detail -- essential to the governance of our community, but not to the genius of our CLUP.

Horror stories make for juicy talk in CLUP season. The majority of those stories are distortions of the truth. I hope that Sanibel citizens might someday see that even handed enforcement of the intensity of use provisions of our CLUP is the only hope for preservation of this fragile and beautiful place. When that happens, the CLUP season will be less divisive. □

It's my idea that this would "relieve the pressure" and the recreation area into which the causeway has just been turned.

The funds from this toll, imposed on Sanibel/Captiva residents only, could also be used for further improvement on the causeway, which would be certain to delight what Mr. Ed calls "off-islanders."

As for improvements to the causeway, everything is possible. At a low cost we could begin by turning the existing

walking station into a hot dog stand. After all, whoever heard of a "public recreation area" without a hot dog stand?

The three-mile long causeway road could be turned into a drag strip. We've always seen how ideal it is for drag races.

Both sides of the road could be filled with boom traps and picnic tables. If the public response is good, we might have to build "high rise picnic tables" and assign them out on an interval basis. All free, of course. As Mr. Ed Write says, why should we have to pay all those tolls and things?

If the public response seems to be promising, we might make the whole thing into a theme park. We could call it "Causeway Capers." I'm sure the Disney World people would give us some advice on possible attractions.

**B**ooks offering simple solutions are not the only spin-off Rubik's Cube has spawned. Ever since the Ideal Toy Co. brought the cube to the American market in 1977, a number of imitators and similar puzzle games have evolved.

The original Rubik's Cube sells for around \$8, while look alike imposters can had for half the price. "You're really just paying for the name if you buy the real thing," said fifth-grader John Feeney.

Toys Aboy! in Periwinkle Place sells an \$2.50 imitation called "The Fuzzler." "Our supplier didn't carry the Rubik's Cube so we decided to sell The Fuzzler instead of waiting months to get the official model. They are selling real well mostly to the 7-12 age group and also to adult men, who like to frustrate themselves with it," said manager Carol Nix Hennessey.

Besides the cube the local toy store carries anywhere from nine to twelve variations or spin-offs, including the barrel, the pyramid, a ball-shaped cube, a mini-cube, the Rubik's Snake — a twisting colorful piece of plastic that can be formed into hundreds of shapes — and the latest craze — The Tower of Babylon.

"The other puzzles are very popular and fairly simple compared to the cube," Hennessy said. The cube's possible replacement puzzle may be The Tower of Babylon — a puzzle with seven towers and variegated beads. "It's supposed to be very popular in France right now and some say it will eventually outsell the cube," she says.

**E**ven Matt, who owns three different puzzles and is saving his allowance for a fourth, said he is ready to move on to bigger and better games. "I find it a bit

boring after a while," he said. Matt has not only mastered the solution, but has learned to make crosses, diagonals and checker boards on his cube. "We usually share answers on the bus ride to school. Sometimes you can sell or trade an old puzzle if you get tired of it."

And just like any other fad the sudden excitement over the cube and its spin-off puzzles is bound to fade. Fifth grader Chanung Boswell summed up the cube's future demise: "I think the cube is going down the drain. Everybody loved it when it first came out, but it's starting to get old now."

At the ripe old age of six months or possible even a year, the Vaseline-covered cubes from Bus 36 will soon take their place on the garage shelf next to the dusty peacock and the faded hula hoops. It's the curse of the American marketplace — only the good die young. □

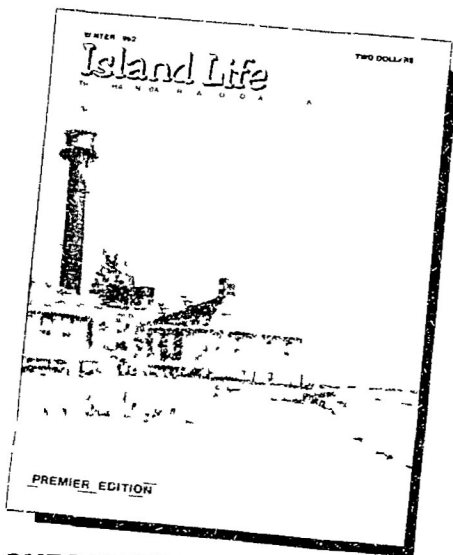

### Need for conservative trial and error

The Florida House of Representatives subcommittee for natural resources has been holding hearings on the fishery management plan recommended by the Legislature's Saltwater Fisheries Study and Advisory Council. A minority report, prepared by the president of the Florida League of Anglers in a member of the Council, criticizes certain sections of the plan. The minority report expresses the belief that fishery management should be dictated by what is best for the resource, rather than what can be passed legislatively. It points out some of the plan's recommendations deemed not to be in the best interest of the fishery.

As admitted by reputable scientists appearing before the council in the course of its study, science is just beginning to scratch the surface of the oceans as far as knowledge of what goes on below is concerned. To demand "scientific proof" of the need to protect a fishery as a condition to imposing protective restrictions is pure demagoguery.

Inadequate scientific information can be a dangerous foundation for fishery management because today's scientific theories are often discredited by tomorrow's discoveries.

Wise fishery management, due to the cost and time required for research, must, of necessity, be based upon credible experience and conservative trial and error, supplemented by reliable scientific information when and if it becomes available.

It is apparent that commercial fish houses and their fishermen are seeking special privilege to take a disproportionate share of the fishery, whereas professional guides, charter, head boat, recreational and commercial fish and line are concerned about the future of the fishery and are pleading for reasonable conservation measures to assure an enduring abundance of all species.

There is no way that the saltwater fishery can survive unlimited quantities of gear of virtually unlimited capacity in the hands of unlimited numbers of fishermen and unlimited catches. Either gear restrictions or strictly enforced quotas are imperative.

The survival requirements of the largest user group, comprised of the fish birds and mammals of the sea, have been virtually ignored by the scientists in their presentations to the council, perhaps due to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) preoccupation with

commercial marketing of seafood.

It is hardly possible that DNR can function as a research product-development and marketing arm of the commercial fishing industry, on the one hand and do justice to its conservation responsibilities on the other. While it may not constitute legal conflict of interest, they are conflicting interests that have resulted in the misdirection of effort and loss of credibility for the department. DNR at one time was known as the State Board of Conservation. In 1969 it was reorganized and given the title of Department of Natural Resources. DNR should confine its activities in the area of marine resources to conservation matters.

DNR's track record of commercial bias and its activities on behalf of the commercial fishing industry have led to what is perceived by many to be a commercial exploitation mentality that has become so firmly entrenched in that department as to render it incapable of implementing wise conservation policies for the resource it is required to protect, thus irrevocably destroying its credibility as a conservation agency.

The scientific and/or research programs of DNR have been so directed that commercial exploitation of the resource appears to have been the goal, rather than wise fishery conservation and management.

The council has proposed creation of a Marine Fisheries Commission because it agreed that the legislative process is too cumbersome to respond to urgent fishery needs as swiftly as circumstances from time to time require and that it is essential to remove management of the resource as far as practicable from the possibility of political pressure.

The proposed commission, however, bears little resemblance to the true commission needed. As proposed, the commission would have only an advisory role in rule making. DNR may express staff opinion simultaneously to the Governor and Cabinet, who would have the authority to adopt any rules. The commission's only authority would be to hire its own staff, principally the director. History has amply demonstrated that entrenched bureaucracy and its policies can survive virtually any department head, so it is reasonable to assume this would be no exception and that it would be business as usual at DNR.

Obviously, this is not the solution. What is needed is a completely independent commission with rule-making authority such as was granted to the Florida Game and Fresh Water Commission when it was separated from the State Board of Conservation in 1943 by constitutional amendment. □

## fishing report

**SEATROUT** — Anglers report lots of small trout, but the larger spotted seatrout seems to have gone somewhere. Best advice is to try new territory and chub's deeper water. As cold fronts move through, the fish change their habits, but their taste for live shrimp never changes. Anglers with the right wright action can fool most of them with the plastic imitations, as well as a variety of other artificial baits. Minimum legal length for spotted seatrout is 12 inches.



**SEEPSHEAD** — Some of these have been struck down by the red tide, but the larger ones are still down here chewing up barnacles, crabs and other small crustaceans. Best spots for sheepshead are around bridges or dock pilings, although some schools hang over rocky bottom or wrecks such as outside Punta Rassa. This fish has a small mouth filled with sharp teeth, so use a relatively small hook on a strong leader, baited with a fiddler crab, sandworm, pieces of shrimp.



**GROUPER** — Offshore anglers have been finding good-sized grouper on a 210 to 230-degree heading from Sanibel Lighthouse. The deeper the water, the larger the grouper. Squid or cut bait, on a line weighted heavy enough to hold it near the bottom for results. Some days the current runs strong and your effort is wasted if you don't get the bait down where the fish are. Minimum legal length for grouper is 12 inches.



**BASS** — With problems of fishing some of the sea water fishing recently, some anglers have been turning their attention to freshwater fishing. Although there are fish to be had from some of the local lakes and ponds, more productive areas are in Cape Coral canal in the Burnt Store Road area or in the popular Lake Trafford or Lake Okechobee, further afield. □



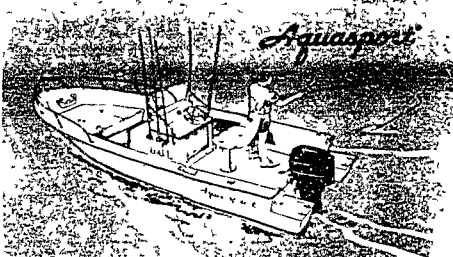

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## sanibel sightings

White-winged dove.  
now it's more common

Have you ever seen a White-winged Dove? For years it was considered an accidental occurrence in Florida. When Arthur H. Howell had his Florida Bird Life published in 1932 he considered it of casual occurrence. When the late Alexander Bryant Jr. revised Howell's book in 1954 he stated "much has taken place since Howell wrote the book in 1932. He apparently never saw it in Florida, but since 1940 records have multiplied. This is probably due to the increase in the numbers of observers."

Things have really changed in the last few years. They'd been recorded in steadily increasing numbers usually from November to April on our west coast, mostly slitting from the Southwest. That they were discovered nesting near Homestead, and about five years ago in south Naples Hal Harrison author of

Vestingbirds of Sanibel Captus and A. Burner Islands feels the White-winged Dove may be expected to reach our area eventually. As a matter of fact we have a talker on Jan 19 at the Sanibel Captus and Conservation Foundation at the weekly Tuesday at the center program on some of his experiences photographing bird nests and eggs. His book may be purchased here and is very informative.

For years I've kept records of rare sightings on the islands, and though the White-winged Dove is no longer of accidental status locally. It is still a delight to stumble upon this species. The best places to search for them on Sanibel over the years has been around the Sea Horse Shop Complex, and the Colony Motel at the east end of the island, but one or more birds may appear now at any month and are likely to be found any place on our barrier islands. K.C. Emerson saw one this fall on the wildlife drive through the refuge. Recently there has been one down near Island Inn along West Gulf Drive. Please do not disturb this bird! It may be nesting. If so, it'll be a record for Sanibel!

Midwesterners have a chance to see a species of sea duck here too. For the last two weeks now (since

Jan 19) we've had Black Scoter ducks swimming off Sanibel's beach. Mary Jo Greenwald was the first to spot one off that beach. Ducks were here when she found a chick female on the beach by Sundal Resort. The next day she called to inform me that there were 50 birds walking the beach from Casa Ybel Resort east to Sundal and confirmed the presence and numbers.

On Nov 2 1976 the late Richard Beebe called Glen Bond of the refuge (then the manager) and I informing us of two Surf Scoters he'd found along our beach.

In Nov 1977 we had the Surf again recorded plus our first Black Scoter was verified. The only record for the Surf until recently was one in January 1888. To my knowledge the Black Scoter is new to this area, for both of these sea ducks nest in the far North Atlantic and during the winter will migrate down the East Coast to Georgia and extreme north Florida. Why we suddenly have 50 is anybody's guess. Are we due for some violently cold weather? ## refuge report

## Dedication of the new refuge center

The official dedication of the Visitor Contact Station and headquarters building will be held Tuesday March 2. Assistant Secretary of the Interior Ray Arnett is scheduled to be the principal speaker. Sherry Fishers, chairman of the J. N. Ding Darling Foundation, will make an official presentation of original etchings to Area Manager Don Hankla for use at the building. Others present will include Regional Director Walter St.ultz and Fish and Wildlife Service Director Robert Jantzen. Details concerning times will be announced later. The public is invited to attend this ceremony and to visit the building afterwards.

An archaeological survey was conducted by New World Research Inc. of Pollock Louisiana on those areas scheduled for clearing Brazil an pepper with a bulldozer. We have been given clearance to continue because no significant archaeological resources will be affected by the operation. Bulldozing work has been nearly completed on the Bailey Tract and we will pick up

where we left off near the Gavin Site west of Tarpon Bay Road.

The Florida Marine Patrol has been doing an excellent job of enforcing the speed limit at the Caloosahatchee River portion of the manatee protection area.

Edmund Gavin discovered apparently orphaned or stranded river otter pups near his place on Rabbit Road recently. After waiting a half day or so in vain for the mother who was not present by a time 11:30 a.m. and brought them to refuge headquarters. We in turn placed them into the capable hands of CHOW persons who will try to raise them to a stage where they can be released back into the wild.

### All you wanted to know about ballet, and more

One of our new books is "The Ballet Goer's Guide" by Mary Clarke and Clement Crisp, two of England's most distinguished critics. They describe and analyze 143 of the most performed ballets — the choreography plus music, decor, historical background, quality of work and individual performances. The description of each ballet is enhanced by photographs and by set synopses and connotations of performances by different companies. They also explain the technical vocabulary of ballet, with photos to illustrate the positions and steps. A bear's book for the American ballet goer who wants to be informed about what he is seeing or stage.

For a novel that's different, try *Water Music* by T.

Congressman Roy A. Nease and London pomp thief and cheat, seems up with Muzg, Park, an actual Scottish explorer who lived from 1771 to 1836. In his expeditions to chart the course of the Niger River through western Africa, Nease and hero join forces to fight the Dark Continent's climate, plagues and parasitic, hostile natives and murderous Muslims who are out to thrash her devilish white skin. If you enjoy a coarse and tawdry novel filled with outlandish adventure, this one won't disappoint you.

Constance Bradford Howe's *The Marriage Bed* is a gripping, entertaining and sprightly optimistic story of a bright, attractive, and heavily pregnant young mother of two. Her family and friends all know the solution to her problems — someone else for the children so she can get out in the world and find a job. It's obvious. Or is it? She finds her own solution. A new informant we look in *The Kingdom — Arabia* and the House of Saud, by Robert Casey. This is the story of Saudi Arabia, the only country to bear the

name of the family that created a little more than 90 years ago and has ruled it since by force, loyalty among its members, ruthlessness toward its enemies and dedication to one of the world's most severe and demanding creeds. The English author took his family to live in Saudi Arabia where he spent four years gathering material, learning Arabic and getting acquainted with the most influential as well as the no royal members of the vast royal family.

*Mission MIA* by J.C. Pollock is a novel of a Jew and inter-gue. Frank Detmore, listed as missing in action in Vietnam for more than 14 years and barely surviving in a POW camp with seven other Americans, manages to smuggle out a letter to his wife. Receiving the letter, his wife goes to Washington where she gets no help. She turns to a former Green Beret buddy of her husband who agrees to organize an unofficial raid to rescue them. Many problems beset them, from the U.S. government to the steamy jungles of Vietnam, but they finally liberate the camp only to find that their troubles have just begun. □

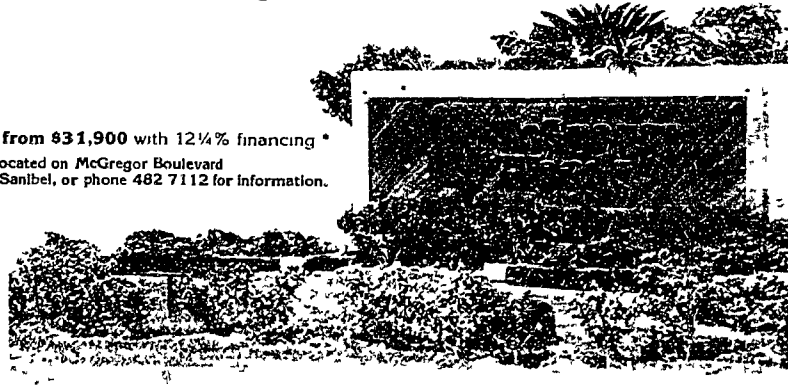

## Andy Rooney: Mark Twain of '60 Minutes'

Book of Honor by Caroline Todd In this historical novel, the author portrays William of Normandy as a more sympathetic light than usual through his childhood and youth, he was tainted for the history. His father Duke Robert named him before going on a crusade from which he did not return, and William lived in fear of those who considered their claim to the title more legitimate. Through his father he was descended from Gerold, the first King of the Angevins (Wesseax) as was his maternal cousin, Edward the Confessor, who named William his heir. Thus, when Harold Godwinson, a usurper, claimed the throne, William felt honor bound to venture the royal blood. The story is well researched, interestingly presented and should appeal particularly to anyone with an interest in 11th-century England. Incidentally

Queen Elizabeth II also traces her lineage from Gerold. *A Few Minutes With Andy Rooney* is a collection of commentaries and tele-vision scripts dating from 1966 to 1980 and they are just as enjoyable in book form as they were on the screen. Many of us must share his feelings about "marratius" and his rather wifful comments about "house" strikes familiar chord. There is a dandy commentary on "gender" and "How We Elect the President" is good for a chuckle. Three cheers for the comments on "Dirty Words." Even the preface is entertaining and anyone having read the book will surely agree with Ed Moyers, who says, "...rumors of Mark Twain's demise were indeed exaggerated, he is alive and well and appearing regularly on '60 Minutes."

*St. Peter's Fair* by Ellis Peters This is another in a series of mysteries starring Brother Cadfael, herbalist at the Benedictine Monastery in medieval Shrewsbury. St. Peter's Fair is an annual event, both commercial and social, but this time a wealthy merchant is flung from the River Severn with a dagger in his heart. Emma, his niece is left unprotected, so — Brother Cadfael to the rescue and the solution of the murder. □

## Sanibel's rice rats

Updating the list of Sanibel's indigenous wildlife may be necessitated by startling information recently uncovered by Bucknell University freshman Miss Wilson.

Miss Wilson's discovery was made during a month-long internship at the Sanibel Captiva Conservancy Foundation (SCCF) which was completed last week.


Miss Wilson's evidence indicates that Sanibel may in deed be home to a new number of rice rats, *Oryzomys palustris sanibeli*, contrary to previously held belief.

Testimony to the presence of the rodent was found buried in the nesting material of the center's barn owl box. The skull which layed down to neither the cotton rat nor the bank rat, was part of the remains Miss Wilson collected during her internship activities.

*The Nature of Things on Sanibel*, written by island naturalist George Campbell, does not include the rice rat on the list of wildlife native to the island.

The skull does not offer conclusive evidence that rice rats do inhabit Sanibel, however says Phillips who believes that more research will be needed to verify their presence. □

The book helps you make realistic decisions regarding your investments; it provides technical tips and alternatives, and most important, shows you how to construct a long-term investment portfolio tailored to your individual needs.

Nelson, Wayne F. *How to Buy Money*, *Investing Wisely for Maximum Return*, McGraw-Hill Co., N.Y., 1981 (332.6). Do you know how to buy 7% bills without a fool? Is there a tax-free money-market fund? How can I shelter my income from taxes? Answers to these and many other questions on investments can be found in this book; investment books. Written primarily for busy people who need help in making investment decisions it will help you to increase your income. It is supplemented by a selective bibliography.

Rutberg, Sidney. *Playboy's Investment and Financial Planning Guide for Singles*, Making It and Keeping It in the Eighties, Playboy Press, N.Y., 1981 (332.02). The single household is the fastest growing segment of our population for several reasons, i.e., the rising divorce rate, the tendency to marry later in life, the growing number of widows because of the gap in longevity bet-

ween men and women. Financial and investment planning is unique for singles and here is a comprehensive guide. Specific advice on their tax status, cash-flow requirements and other problems is aptly given.

Here is one more reference book. Wirtzberger Investment Companies Service *Investment Companies*, N.Y., 1981 (Ref. 332). This is an annual compendium of information about mutual funds and investment companies, a complete explanation of their functions and their various uses to the investor, data on background, management policy and salient features of all leading companies, management results, income and dividend records, price ranges, and comparative operating details. Many market funds and tax-exempt municipal bond funds are included.
