Cada fired

Sanibel Police Officer Brent Cada was fired early this week. Cada had been suspended with pay from the island force since April 16, when an internal affairs investigation determined the officer had violated police security.

Attorney Robert Young of Fort Myers acted as hearing officer in the case and affirmed Police Chief Richard Plager's recommendation, made in May, to terminate the officer. Cada had appealed this decision.

Further challenges to Cada's termination must be made within 30 days, through filing an action in the Circuit Court.

Plager refused comment other than to say Sergeant John Terry brought termination papers to Cada's home Monday afternoon, July 12 and collected all city property from the fired officer.

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City nets changes to proposed conservation zone

At a Florida Marine Fisheries Commission hearing in Tampa last Friday, July 9, the City of Sanibel gained some changes in a proposed rule restricting motorized fishing in what will be the Sanibel Island Conservation Zone.

The changes make the rule more like Sanibel's original request and includes partial bans on net fishing. At a previous commission hearing, the rule was amended to ban all motorized fishing within the zone.

Commission staff will include these changes when the proposal is forwarded to the Governor and Cabinet for final approval in the near future.

Sanibel City Council member Wally Kain and a number of islanders attended the meeting. While Kain expressed satisfaction with the changes, he said the final hurdle remains.

"There are currents of political influence at the Governor and Cabinet level," Kain said. "You could be 100 percent right on the conservation issue, yet lose the rule because it affects others economically."

Presenting arguments for modifications to the extremely restrictive proposal the commission fashioned were Sanibel Conservation Officer Rob Loflin, Sanibel/Captiva Conservation Foundation Director Erick Lindblad, J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge Manager Lou Hinds and Bob Slayton, president of the local

chapter of the Audubon Society.

Ralph Woodring, who operates a bait shrimp trawl operation from Woodring's Point, also spoke at the meeting.

The proposed zone stretches from waters off Dixie Beach Boulevard on the bay side of the island, north past the Wulfert Keys, through the south side of Blind Pass, along the gulf shore, into and including Clam Bayou.

At the previous hearing which produced the restrictive rule, the commission took the city's request to ban all net fishing in the zone, and altered it to ban all fishing—hook and line as well—from boats propelled by motors in the zone.

Island youths share mountain TOP experience

For the past three years, Sanibel Community Church has sponsored a missionary experience for young people. Barbara and Chuck Nave are the team's coordinators and motivators.

"We want to show young people that they can be missionaries wherever they are. They don't have to be called to a foreign field to minister," Barbara Nave said.

Open to committed young people, the program actually begins each November when the kids begin with local opportunities to help needy or handicapped people. They work with Habitat for Humanity and have painted the Children's Home Society headquarters.

In addition to the community work they do, the children are involved in raising funds to pay for the Mountain Tennessee Outreach Project (TOP), near McMinnville, Tenn., which takes place each

July.

In January, interested teenagers and the adults who volunteered to accompany them were introduced to the church congregation at a Sunday worship service. After the service, the team cleaned the windshield of every car in the parking lot. Donations were accepted for the cleaned windshields and more events followed to raise the \$11,000 needed for the proposed mission work.

Car washes and a rent-a-servant program, in which people could hire teens for anything that needed to be done around the house for an hourly fee, were successful in bringing in some cash.

"Stocks" were sold to supportive shareholders—who might be family members or other church members—at a cost of \$25 per share. The money raised paid for camp fees, meals, motels, tools and the rental of four vans—three for people; one to haul equipment.

Sixteen teenagers and four adults left Friday, July 2 for McMinnville.

Participants in the mission project returned Saturday, July 10 with stories of spiritual renewal and insight gained, as well as the building of strong, new human relationships.

Lindsay Pitt, 15, who attends Cypress Lake High School, took part in the program for the first time this year.

"I didn't really want to go. I guess I was really caught up in myself. The experience changed me a lot. I had a wonderful time," she said.

Lindsay explained how her group went to a different site each day and worked on the homes of people who were unable to do the work themselves. Most were ill, in poverty, alone or somehow disadvantaged.

Pitt was amazed at how thankful people were for the work she did for them.

"We get so used to our large, comfortable houses on Sanibel. I worked on homes that were no bigger than my bedroom. I was shocked to see such a different lifestyle," she said.

Cada's termination was effective the following day. He had been suspended with pay because criminal charges were not filed against him.

Cape Coral attorney Robert Burandt, who represented Cada, said he was not surprised at Young's decision.

"It is difficult to be fair when you're serving one master," he said, noting Young was chosen to be the hearing officer and paid by the City of Sanibel.

Burandt said he was offered the opportunity to protest Young's selection but didn't object because the appeal process was already under way.

"I assume there will be an appeal of this [Young's] decision," he said. "There's been no real testimony that Brent did anything wrong."

Burandt said he may file an action on Cada's behalf for failure to follow due process.

According to the police department's internal investigation, Cada's alleged transgression occurred after an express warning from a Combined Law Enforcement Against Narcotics (CLEAN) agent that his off-duty activities were interfering with CLEAN operations.

CLEAN is a multi-jurisdictional

She also enjoyed meeting, living and working with teenagers from New Jersey, Ohio, Tennessee and Texas. She reported that she made some new, close friends from New Jersey, which greatly pleases her.

Greg Doramus, a third-year veteran of the program, has been so influenced by his experiences that he is considering joining the staff of Mountain TOP next year.

"It would be a real sacrifice. It would mean I would have to give up my job and leave my mother who needs my support very much right now. But I am seriously thinking about it. I would be doing it for God. The first year, I went to Mountain TOP for myself; this year I went for God. It is a very moving experience because you take so much for granted in your life. These people you meet are so happy with what they have, which isn't much," Greg said.

Rick Adams was one of the four adults who accompanied the young people and this was his first year. Adams was born Jewish and became a Christian within the past year. He said he began working with these young people through Logos, a weekly, after-school program at the

church.

"I had been with these kids each week for months but I really didn't know them. You really get bonded when you're with someone 24 hours a day. You see each other in a different way," he said.

Adams explained that adult volunteers are not "leaders" in any way but only drive the transportation vehicles.

"It's difficult to keep from taking charge. My wife and I are business owners and are used to being in charge. We try to allow the kids to make their own decisions and live with the outcome," he noted.

task force which handles anti-narcotics activities in the region.

As a result of Cada's reported actions, two long-term CLEAN operations were abandoned. In addition, the safety of confidential informants and task force agents may have been jeopardized, the investigation noted.

Young took about a week to reach his decision regarding Cada.

Thursday, July 1, he conducted a hearing in which each side was permitted to question or reinforce the credibility of witnesses against Cada.

There, Burandt attacked the credibility of two witnesses.

In his decision, rendered Thursday, July 8, Young determined that while one witness Burandt questioned lacked credibility, the other was credible.

Reviewed with the testimony of other witnesses against Cada, quoted in the transcript of the officer's pre-termination hearing in May, this witness "provided substantial, competent evidence to support the findings made by Chief Plager," Young found.

However, Burandt said the stories of the witnesses changed a great deal from the pre-termination hearing to the July 1 hearing.

He added the hearing officer saw

credibility in a statement made by the witness, quoted in the internal investigation but not even transcribed by a court reporter.

"It's a scary thought that police can take a statement in the back room and use this for a termination," Burandt said, adding police used a tape recorder when taking statements.

He said another problem was that Cada was not represented by a lawyer when some of the statements were taken.

Also present at the hearing was Fort Myers attorney J. Michael Hussey, an expert on police law who represented the city's interests and did not present testimony; the two witnesses; a paralegal and a Florida Police Benevolent Association union representative.

Young's decision caps a lengthy appeal process.

After the internal investigation into the charges and May's pre-termination hearing, Plager recommended to City Manager Gary Price that Cada be terminated.

Price exercised his right to put the matter before an independent hearing officer and chose Young.

Hussey was selected to represent Sanibel's interests. He is general counsel for the Lee County Sheriff's Office as well as the CLEAN task

force.

Cada's offense was similar to a violation of the city personnel code, specifically a Group III offense which is punishable by termination, the investigation stated.

Burandt said he believes some changes should be made in the rules and regulations for department personnel—including a clear definition of improper conduct, which he said the personnel manual lacks.

The Florida Police Benevolent Association (FPBA) is seeking to represent police department employees in a proposed, police bargaining unit and Burandt has sought to tie his client's activities on behalf of the proposed union to his problems with CLEAN.

In previous interviews, Burandt said that if his client was terminated, he would file an unfair labor practices suit against the city.

Tuesday, Burandt said he had not yet spoken to the FPBA about this. He added he would most likely not handle such a suit himself.

Cada, the senior road officer in the department, was vocal in his desire for a unionized department. He was hired on a temporary basis in November, 1986 and became a full-time officer in October, 1987.

According to Kain, last Friday's hearing was incredibly complicated, but several concessions were clearly gained.

The first was that recreational hook and line, along with cast net, fishing could be done only from boats with their combustion engines shut down. However, fishing is permitted from boats powered by electric trolling motors. The long-time bait-shrimping operation owned by Ralph Woodring would also be permitted.

Secondly, entanglement nets—gill and trammel nets—could only be set and retrieved in the conservation zone via pole skiffs, without motors. Pole skiffs are small, shallow-draft boats which are poled through the water. Larger, motorized boats may tow the pole skiffs to the conservation zone, but the larger boats may not assist in working the nets.

Third, during the winter mullet roe season, all net fishing—entanglement nets as well as cast nets—would be banned in Dinkins Bayou and parts of Blind Pass, out to the COLREGS line, which demarcates where inland navigation rules give way to international navigation rules.

However, simple dip nets and landing nets would be allowed in this area, Kain added.

He said the commission discussed including all of Blind Pass in the conservation zone. Currently, the conservation zone divides the pass down the middle and only includes waters on the Sanibel side. However, no action was taken on this proposed addition to the conservation zone.

Traffic surveys begin

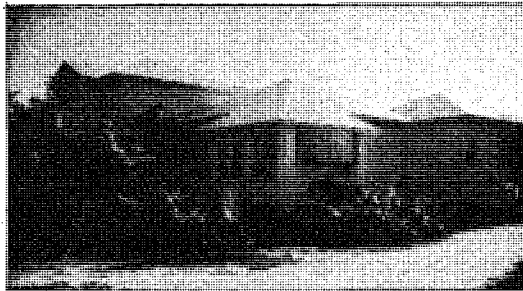
The Lee County Department of Transportation will be conducting traffic surveys during the next few weeks.

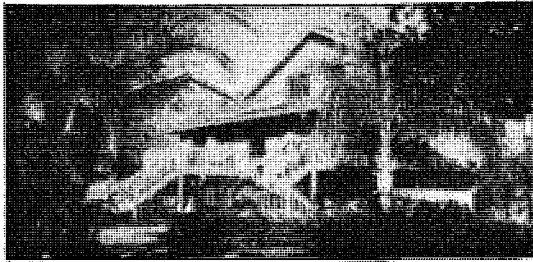
The goal is to find out more about the traffic patterns of Lee County residents and visitors.

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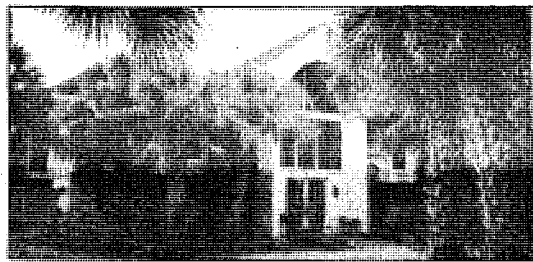
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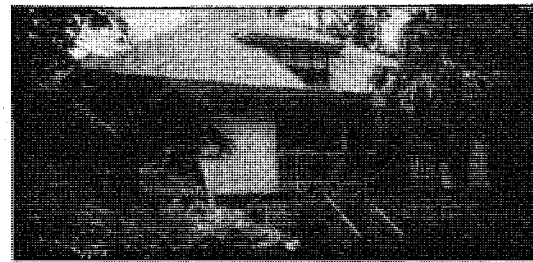
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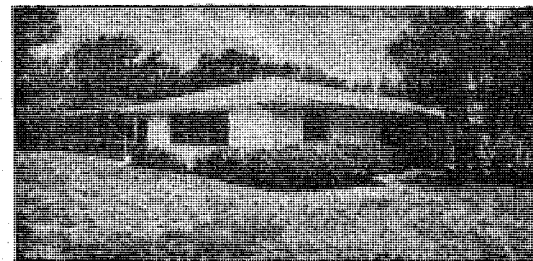
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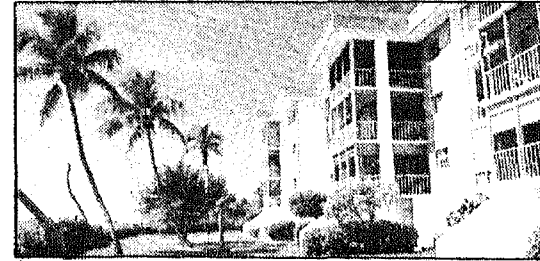
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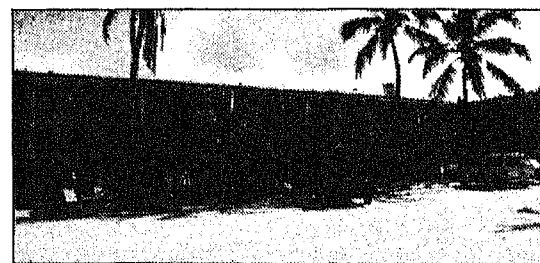
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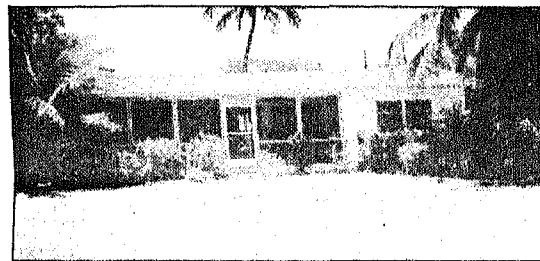
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Nudists' jaunt to Bowman's Beach a quiet success

The Sanibel Naturists' plans to meet at Bowman's Beach last Sunday afternoon, July 11 for a clothing-optional gathering to gain public support for a nude beach was rather low-key, in part because thunderstorms threatened to rain that afternoon.

According to Priscilla Ahlert, membership coordinator for the group, the gathering garnered some positive media attention.

A local television station filmed clothed naturists carrying signs and gathering signatures on petitions in support of a clothing-optional beach. The clip aired last Sunday evening.

Ahlert said the naturists have been in touch with the Lee County Parks and Recreation Department, which she said will put the group's request for a clothing-optional beach on the county commission agenda within the next several months.

While Ahlert said she saw a sheriff's department helicopter over the area along with two sheriff's squad cars and a boat in the vicinity of Bowman's Beach Sunday, there were no confrontations with law enforcement officials.

She and her husband were armed with a camcorder, in case there was a confrontation.

Ahlert said about half the people showed up at the extreme western end of Bowman's Beach; the other half were at the parking lot at the east end of the beach.

The beach the nudist group traditionally uses is located at the remote, western end of Bowman's, on privately-owned Silver Key.

John Franklin, with the Lee County Parks Department, called Sanibel police Sunday afternoon and said he might have a problem with nudists, according to police reports.

However, when Sanibel Officer Jamie Phillips arrived on the scene a few minutes later, the nudists were gone.

Franklin was unavailable for comment. Last week, Sanibel Sergeant John Terry said police would respond to any complaints of nudity on the beach and issue citations if violations were observed.

While Sanibel police do not patrol Bowman's on a regular basis, officers do occasionally patrol the beach in a Jeep. Phillips was the only Sanibel officer to visit the beach Sunday.

Last weekend, during festivities at the Lani Kai Resort in Fort Myers Beach in honor of National Nude Weekend, the nudists sponsored a clothing drive for Guadalupe Mission in Immokalee and spread the word about the gathering at Bowman's.

One of the goals was to point out to people how secluded the area is.

"It's a hard place to get to," Ahlert said, adding some people are too intimidated by what they see as a hike through surf and dense

woods.

"When you go nude, you distance yourself from others so you don't offend them," she added.

The issue of nudity on Bowman's Beach, owned in a cooperative agreement between the city and Lee County, reached fever pitch this spring.

Easter Sunday, April 11, a Sanibel police officer arrested four nude people there.

They were charged with violating Florida Statute 800.03, the law about indecent exposure. A violation of this law is a first-degree misdemeanor.

One man pled no contest to the charges and was found guilty. He paid a \$150 fine.

The others are fighting the case. The original charges were dismissed and the state attorney recently re-filed new charges for breach of the peace. The three are being represented by Stuart Pepper, a Cape Coral attorney retained by the naturists.

City loses appeal of Wanner case

City Attorney Robert Pritt received word July 1 that Sanibel lost the final appeal of a court case which tested the legality of a 1992 Code Enforcement Board decision.

The District Court of Appeals overturned a Circuit Court decision which came out in favor of the city.

The matter at hand dealt with the 1040 South Yachtsman Drive residence of Thomas and Gail Wanner. Sanibel's Code Enforcement Board cited the Wanners in October of 1992 for having a duplex on a lot zoned for a single family residence only. The city maintained the duplex was in violation of the land development code but the Wanners and the Court of Appeals believed the duplex was grandfathered into the city code.

"While the decision of the code enforcement board was patently incorrect, and the upholding of same by the Circuit Court was contrary to law, there is no basis for further challenge or appeal. [The Florida Supreme Court] does not extend to this situation," Pritt said. "Therefore, it is recommended that no further action be taken by the city and that the case be closed."

Committee appointment

The Sanibel City Council unanimously supported the nomination of Harry Bertossa to the city's historic preservation committee.

Bertossa brings to the committee 40 years experience in the fields of civil engineering and surveying. He also was a member of the old Bailey Store reconstruction crew.

Bertossa will fill the vacant position left by the resignation of Rodney Jobe.

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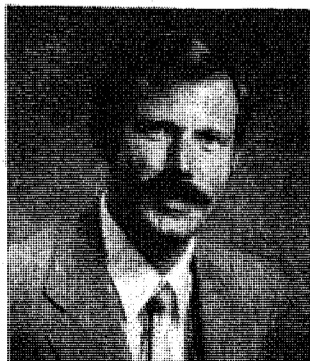
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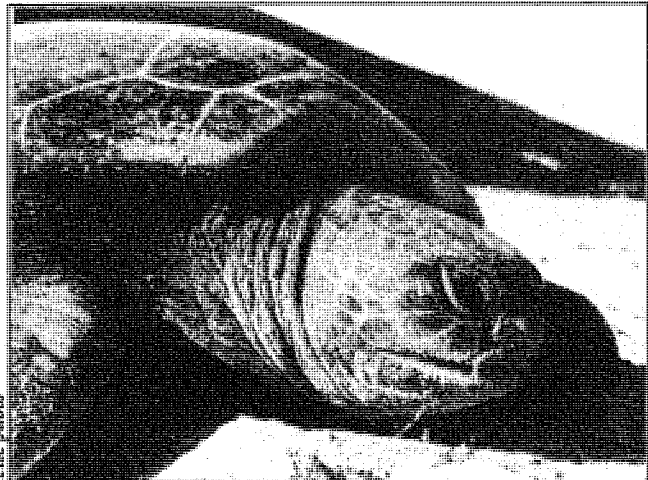
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Due date nears for turtle hatchlings

The first sea turtle hatchlings of 1993 should clamber out of shoreside nests any day now, according to Katherine Getty, sea turtle program coordinator for the Sanibel/Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF), which employs 40 volunteers to patrol nesting areas on the barrier islands.

Getty said there about 10 more nests on the barrier islands this year than last—130 in Sanibel and 80 in Captiva.

Eighteen nests laid on the east end of Sanibel were relocated to a nursery site on the west end of the island; about half the Captiva nests were relocated to a nursery site in Captiva, Getty reported.

"The nests are due to begin hatching now. The first one was due last Saturday, but has not hatched yet," she said, adding, "We'd like to remind residents to keep their lights off on the beach, now that hatching season is here."

If lights are left on, hatchlings can become disoriented and head inland instead of to sea.

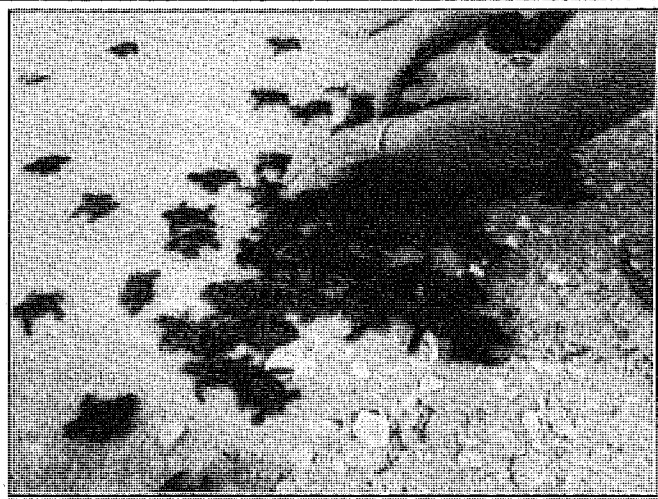
While two storms last summer destroyed 18 nests on the barrier islands, nests at risk from erosion this year were relocated.

This year, two nests have suffered predation: one, in Captiva, was destroyed. The other, in Sanibel, was most likely predated by a raccoon, which destroyed 32 eggs before being scared off.

Getty said she found both raccoon and dog tracks around the nest and noted a dog may have wandered by and scared off the raccoon, which if undisturbed, would have destroyed the entire nest.

About 36 eggs from that nest were relocated to the Sanibel nursery area, she said.

Getty said a few dead turtles have washed onto the barrier islands this year, about an average number since commercial fishermen

began using Turtle Excluder Devices (TEDs) in their nets.

TEDs allow turtles caught in nets to escape drowning and have been very effective in reducing turtle deaths.

However, one green sea turtle which washed up Saturday afternoon, July 3, was missing its head and flippers.

Getty said she was unsure if the head and flippers had been cut off or if the turtle was attacked by a shark.

She photographed the three-foot, 200- to 250-pound turtle and forwarded the photographs and other information to the Florida Department of Natural Resources, which is investigating.

Eve Haverfield, founder of Turtle Time, a sea turtle program which has 60 volunteers who watch nesting areas on Estero Island, Lovers Key and Bonita Beach to the Collier County line, said there are 77 nests in these areas, about the same number as last year.

Many of these have been relocated from developed areas to more remote beach locations.

Haverfield, who is also a volunteer with SCCF's turtle program, also expects nest in the Fort Myers Beach area to hatch any day now.

City gets \$104,000 from tourist council

Sanibel will receive \$104,000 from the Lee County Tourist Development Council (TDC) for tourism-related improvements. The TDC agreed to Sanibel's request for funds at its monthly meeting last Friday, July 9.

Sanibel had requested \$180,000. Of this, \$12,500 for improvements to the Sanibel/Captiva Islands Chamber of Commerce restrooms was outright denied and \$55,000 for beach maintenance was withheld, pending debate over Capital Improvements Projects (CIP) funds.

Money appropriated must provide public utilization of facilities for tourists, assistant county attorney Audrey Vance noted. Under such restrictions, the renovation of the chamber restrooms is considered ineligible for these funds.

The TDC will discuss appropriations for

beach maintenance at its August meeting. So far, the TDC has never granted CIP money to incorporated cities for beach maintenance; the county has been the sole recipient.

According to City Manager Gary Price, who attended the meeting, the TDC seemed to favor giving CIP money to the cities but it will take further discussion to determine an equitable distribution, especially because Cape Coral has no beach.

Projects the TDC found acceptable were: construction of dune/ridge walk-overs (\$17,000), renovation of Tarpon Bay walk-overs (\$15,000), restoration of the lighthouse property restrooms (\$20,000), re-shelling of lighthouse property roads (\$10,500), beach-related plantings and herbicides (\$16,500) and overall environmental restoration (\$32,000).

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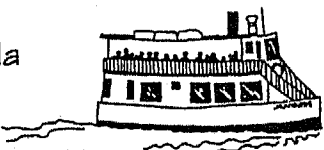


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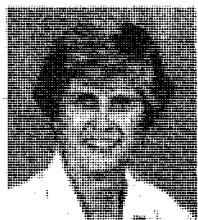
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Commission approves Children's Center expansion

Tuesday, the Sanibel Planning Commission unanimously approved permits that will allow the Children's Center of the Islands to expand its facilities.

In addition to connecting to the Sanibel sewer system, modifying the driveway and creating parking areas, the center gained permission for the second house on the property. The new building—a house previously located on West Gulf Drive, donated anonymously and moved to the center early this year—will house two classrooms, a kitchen, meeting room and storage area.

This addition of another building exceeds the permitted developed area on a residential piece of property. As a result, the center's board was compelled to seek "institutional" status, which would allow for the expansion. The center's conditional use permit now legitimizes its institutional status.

Although the building permit was also approved, the Children's Center may soon have to apply for a variance as well.

Because of the building permit's stipulation that all Brazilian pepper trees must be removed from the property before work begins, and because of the non-profit center's financial inability to do so, the board may seek a variance which would allow for the gradual removal of the trees.

The city staff suggested the Children's Center use the less expensive chemical-removal method to get rid of the trees. But Lauren Davies, treasurer of the center, noted that the long-term effects of exposure to the chemicals used in Brazilian pepper removal are unknown.

"I would hate to see these kids getting sick in 10 or 15 years because they had been exposed to [the chemicals]," Davies said.

While commissioners were sympathetic to the problem, they said

the variance process would be the easiest solution.

The building permit requires that construction on the project begin within 60 days and end in less than six months.

High-level commitment promised for new VA facilities

The prospects may be improving for Southwest Florida's veterans to have a new outpatient clinic and 120-bed nursing home built in Lee County by 1996.

U.S. Rep. Porter Goss (R-Sanibel) announced Tuesday that Secretary of Veteran's Affairs (VA) Jesse Brown told him funding for the new facilities will be made available in next year's federal budget. The two facilities are estimated to cost about \$30 million to build.

"As far as the secretary is concerned, he said this is a done deal, the money will be requested in next year's budget and the facilities will be completed by 1996. This is the firmest and most straightforward commitment we've had to date and we intend to hold the VA to its word," Goss said.

John Slocum, director of Lee County's Veteran Service Office, said Brown's commitment to the new facilities for Southwest Florida's 150,000 veterans is welcome news, but the battle hasn't been won yet.

"I think that it is a very positive statement. I'm very pleased to hear the commitment by Secretary Brown but I don't think we can sit idly by and assume it will be done," he said.

Veterans and their families need to write and call Brown, Goss and Florida's U.S. senators and assert how much the new facilities are needed in the area, Slocum said.

"We need a strong commitment from our entire Florida delegation, that we need to get our fair share," he added.

Florida ranks number two in the nation for its population of veterans but ranks 45th in the country for VA facilities, Slocum said. There are 59,000 veterans living in Lee County.

Veterans from Southwest Florida now have to travel 150 miles to the Bay Pines VA Hospital in St. Petersburg because the existing outpatient clinic in Fort Myers cannot help them with needed, inpatient care.

Goss has been rallying for the new outpatient clinic and nursing home that was promised to

Southwest Florida's veterans by the Bush administration. Following President Clinton's election and the appointment of the new VA secretary, the "momentum was lost" for the new facilities here, Slocum said.

"The VA was in a posture of re-looking at all VA projects in the state of Florida. We need to move forward," he added.

Goss met with Brown Tuesday afternoon to push for the funding of the facilities in next year's federal budget. They are expected to serve more than 70,000 veterans a year. Staffing needs are estimated at 266 people.

Goss also delivered to Brown copies of land proposals solicited by the VA from Southwest Floridians.

Slocum wouldn't elaborate about a possible location but said the plan is to build within a 10-mile radius of the existing outpatient clinic on Carrell Street in Fort

Myers.

"So a 10-mile radius could include Cape Coral, down to the HealthPark, out to Lehigh Acres or North Fort Myers. I plan to talk to people in Washington who will be doing the planning," he said.

Slocum expects some land donations for the new facilities or some other "interesting proposals."

He noted one idea that could ensure a 1996 opening is for a developer with the financial backing to build the facilities and turn them over to the VA to operate with the assurance that the VA has the funding to pay the developer back.

"That could be possible if the VA alters their normal way of handling projects. The VA earlier said they wanted to look at non-traditional proposals for new projects," Slocum said.

Another option is for the VA to lease property or take a lease-purchase approach, he noted.

Sanctuary chimney heights amended

The Sanibel City Council is in the process of permitting the Sanctuary at Wulfert Point to build its chimneys as tall as everywhere else on the island.

At the July 6 meeting, council members completed the first reading of an ordinance which would amend the land development code's restrictions on the height of chimneys at the Sanctuary.

The amendment specifically will exempt the Sanctuary's structures

from the height stipulation of 35 feet above pre-development grade. All other island buildings are already exempt from this, but because of the special classification of the Sanctuary property, it had been overlooked when the code was originally amended.

The amendment does not affect the regulation which limits chimneys to three feet above the top of a structure.

A second reading of the ordinance will take place at the July 20 city council meeting.



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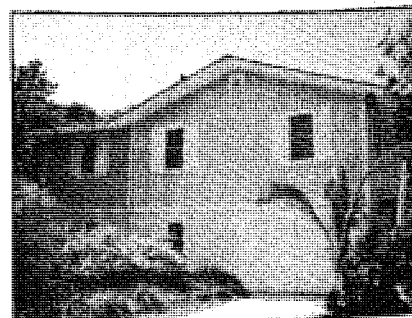
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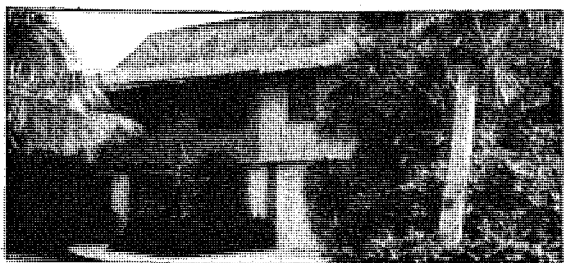

'Prisoner of Second Avenue' focuses on big city life

"The Prisoner of Second Avenue" opened last night at the Pirate Playhouse. Directed by Robert Cacioppo, the play stars amateur, local actors and marks the theater's first community production.

The cast of the production is an eclectic group whose day jobs range from curtain installer to international, commercial real estate executive.

Although their daytime activities may vary wildly, these seven people from Sanibel, Fort Myers and Cape Coral have joined forces and combined similar talents three evenings a week for the past two months to put on a show that Cacioppo assures will rival a professional production.

"The play is about the stress of living in a big city," Cacioppo said. "People are going to see why they moved here."

Mel and Edna struggle against the effects of the economy, pollution, loud neighbors and crime. When Mel suffers a nervous breakdown, the Edisons demonstrate a resiliency in their relationship and a grit to survive.

"'Prisoner' is really about relationships. It's about a stressful time the couple goes through and their survival as a couple," Cacioppo said, adding that while the play shows a marriage in troubled times, it also shows how a married couple can pull together and support each other.

"I relate it to the very best things in marriage," he said. "I know from the hard times in my own mar-

riage, you can get through things that you might not have gotten through on your own."

"The Prisoner of Second Avenue" will be performed tonight at 8 p.m. and tomorrow at 2 and 8 p.m. Shows resume Wednesday, July 21 at 8 p.m. and continue through Saturday, July 24. Tickets are \$10. Call 472-0006.

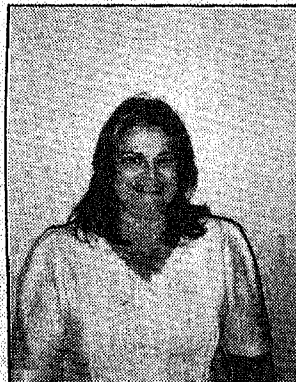

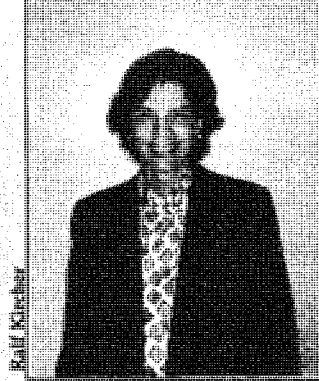

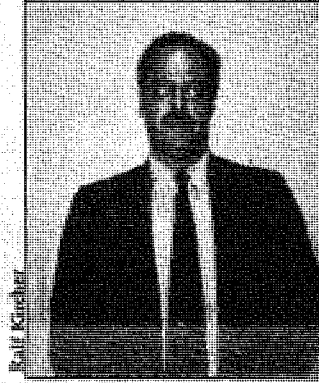

Wild woodcarver wields weapon to perfect craft

A chainsaw-toting wood sculptor from Fort Myers by any other name would probably still be Robert K. Harniman. "Robert," "Bob," "R.K.," "Harnie," "Tree Carver," or simply "Tree"...call him what you will, Harniman is an individual as unique as his art, which in turn, is as unique as his technique.

Harniman has been working with wood for 27 years, which isn't unusual. What is unique about Harniman, however, is how he pares down this wood into sculptures. Just like in the horror movie that took place somewhere in Texas, he uses a chainsaw. Not just one chainsaw, Harniman will use as many as 13 saws on one sculpture, switching from one to another as Michelangelo might have rummaged through his toolbox for just the right chisel.

Harniman's saw of choice is a small Stihl with a low profile speed chain on a "dime" bar, known for the bar's dime-sized tip. The chain's large number of teeth per inch and small diameter tip cause the revolutions per minute to be substantially higher than those on a conventional chainsaw. These modifications to the saw bring the price tag to somewhere around \$800.

He prefers to work with cypress, white cedar, redwood or black walnut and goes through 10 tons of it a year. Logging trucks visit his Fort Myers home two or three times a year and dump tons of rough-cut tree trunks in his yard.

Out of these tree trunks, Harniman likes to sculpt wildlife, folklore characters and historical figures but he does not limit himself to any single category.

Recently, he created a piece to display outside the Lazy Flamingo II restaurant. The piece was meant

to resemble a figurehead on an old sailing ship, combining the traditional, woman figure with a flamingo. Unfortunately, the naked breasts on the figurehead proved a little too risqué for outside display.

Last Monday, Harniman worked on a sculpture in the parking lot outside the Galleria at Fantasy Island, where he sells his work on the island.

He was putting the finishing touches on "Lone Wolf," a piece made from black walnut. He had quickly carved the piece in Chicago for the 90th anniversary of Harley-Davidson motorcycles. His "Lone Wolf" sculpture was meant to be a symbolic representation of the special anniversary edition motorcycle called the Lone Wolf.

Harniman is an expert at carving quickly. He is a three-time world champion chainsaw carver. Periodically, he explained, the logging industry will sponsor logging-related competitions. One such contest is chainsaw carving, in which the contestants are given a log and eight hours to come up with the most artistic sculpture.

Other feathers in Harniman's cap include a spot in the Guinness Book of World Records for the largest wood sculpture. His "Sir Walter Raleigh" in Manteo, N.C. stands 30 feet tall, weighs 48 tons, and is made from a piece of 500 year-old cypress. As a result of this opus, Harniman had appearances on "The Tonight Show" and "Good Morning America" and he was able to create wildlife pieces for such celebrities as Sylvester Stallone, Willie Nelson, Dolly Parton, Bob Hope and Wayne Newton.

Harniman's latest work has only somewhat to do with his wildlife art. He is trying to gather together artists and performers to put on a benefit festival in November, 1994 in Fort Myers called "Save the Wild

Life." He stresses the two words to underline the double entendre.

Harniman is a man who cares greatly about preserving wildlife and endangered species—he has always had orphaned wolves as pets instead of dogs. But he is also a great supporter of personal freedoms, and thinks freedom an

equally worthy cause.

Although the planning of the festival is taking some of his time, he still finds hours to work every day.

"If I'm not working, I'm doing something I want to do, which is pretty much the same thing," he said smiling, as he yanked the cord of the chainsaw.

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Birdhouses become booming business for builder

Paul Wheeler is Sanibel's newest building contractor. He is also the island's most unusual. Wheeler's houses require no variances, conditional use permits nor even building permits. And Wheeler will not be seen before the Sanibel Planning Commission Tuesday morning, begging for an exception to the land development code.

Wheeler's houses have no running water or electricity, not even any doors or windows. And yet they provide a vital housing need in Sanibel.

Paul Wheeler builds birdhouses. But not just any birdhouses. Wheeler builds veritable bird mansions, styled to resemble real homes, with details down to a white picket fence in the front yard.

Wheeler and his wife, Kim, moved to Sanibel from Madison, Conn. in April and started Architectural Aviaries from their home.

For several years, Wheeler restored and preserved historic houses in New England.

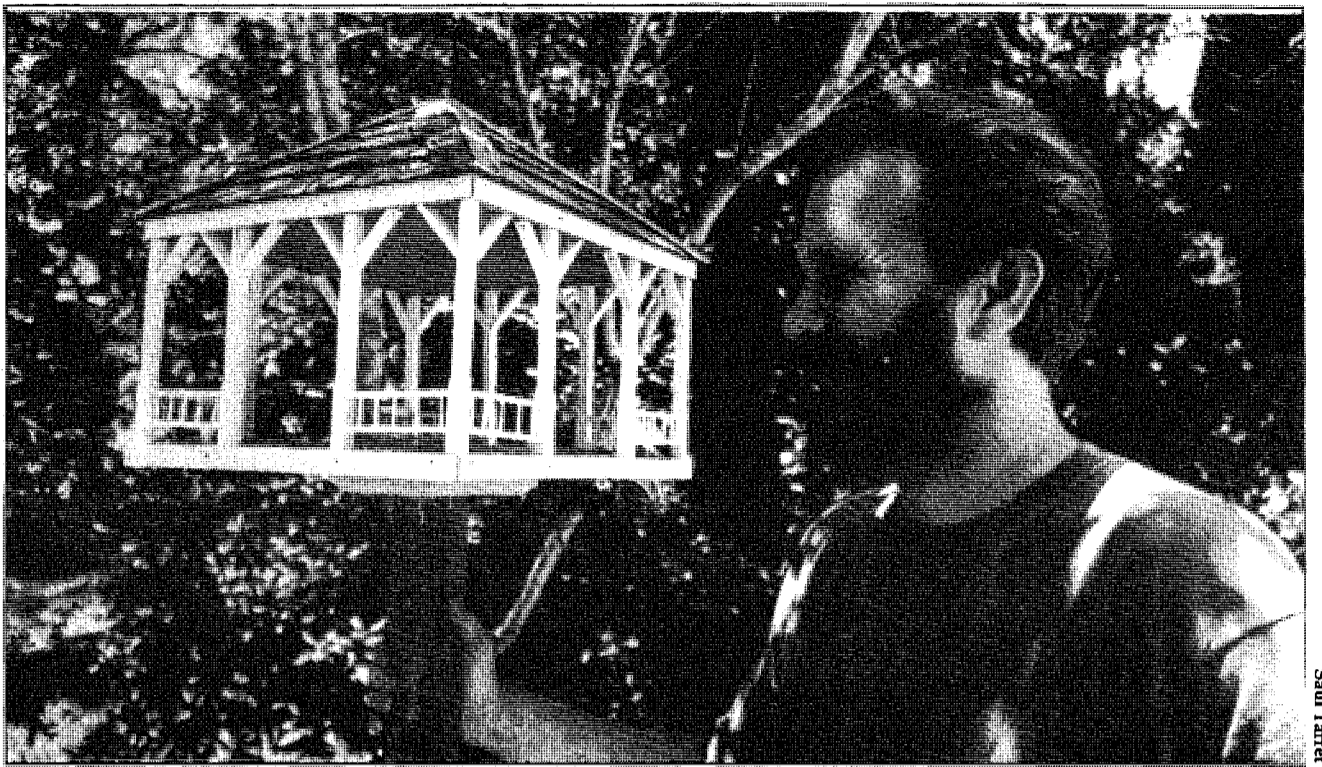
His had saved his own 18th century, Cape Cod-style cottage from the path of a bulldozer three years ago. With only six weeks before the bulldozer was to raze the cottage, Wheeler scrambled to dismantle and number each piece. He later reassembled the building a few miles away.

To honor his achievement, his daughter, Jessie, suggested he build a replica of the cape in miniature, as a birdhouse.

He set to work using barnwood and when he finished, the little house was precise in its detail, with copper flashing, a plank door and a fenced courtyard.

Upon completion of the first house, he was hooked. Soon he had an entire village of styles from garrison and saltbox to Greek revival and Italianate.

When his neighbors and friends saw his work, they began to ask Wheeler to copy their houses and Wheeler's hobby rapidly became a

business. Through word-of-mouth he began to receive commissions from as far away as California and Texas. Gift shops and interior designers carry his birdhouse from Grosse Point to the Hamptons.

"The business just started to take off and it's given us a lot of flexibility," Wheeler noted.

So much flexibility, in fact, that the Wheelers were able to escape the winter gloom of New England and move to the island with their daughter and new-born baby.

"We wanted a place that had a good artistic and environmental awareness—a good community," said Kim Wheeler. "Sanibel fit the bill. You feel like you're in a different world here."

Wheeler is presently trying to portray that different world in his birdhouses. His most recent design, a 1895 Cracker House, was inspired by the lighthouses at Sanibel and Boca Grande.

Until now, he had only constructed New England, Southern and Midwestern Heartland collections, with a few custom, modern birdhouse in between.

Wheeler has even built several boats, for those birds who have earned their "sea wings."

"A lot of people end up using them as indoor decorations or even as sculpture in gardens," Kim commented. "The fact that they're birdhouses is sort of secondary."

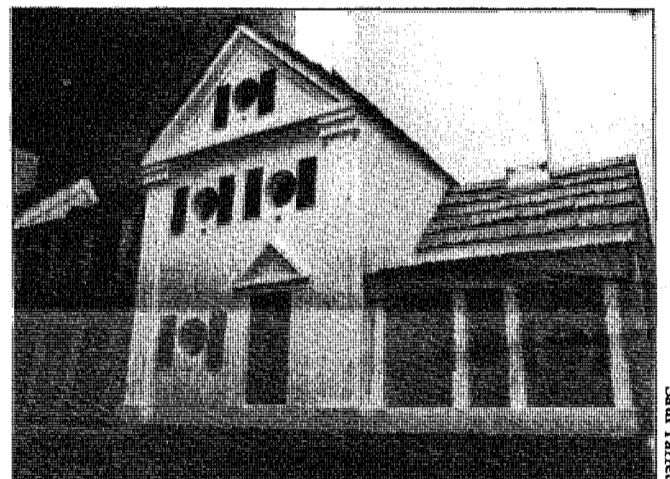
Wheeler builds each of his houses from solid white pine and red cedar. He begins with stock lumber and then rips it down to Lilliputian dimensions.

He tries to utilize conventional house-framing

down to the most minute details, that resemble actual homes and architectural styles.

techniques on a smaller scale. He uses mortise and tenon joinery on porch railings that have hand-carved spindles and newel posts. A "bird-barn" he built recently used real post and beam construction.

Most of the birdhouses Wheeler builds come from his imagination or actual houses he has seen in pictures or in person. But many are custom houses, commissioned by people who want a miniature version of their own house.

"The smaller, standard houses, if you're building a lot of them at once, take only about half a day to make," Wheeler said. The bigger ones, he noted, can take weeks.

Kim explained that the size of the house does not matter to the birds. The size of the hole makes the biggest difference, she explained.

"Some house have songbird-sized holes," she said. "Other holes are even smaller for birds like wrens."

She said that unlike humans, birds are not always set on moving in right away.

"Unless you get it right at nesting time, it usually takes anywhere from three months to a year for birds to get used to the houses," Kim said.

Wheeler's creations range in price from \$45 to \$600, depending on the complexity of the project. He said the average price range is \$200 to \$300. Right now, Wheeler sells his birdhouses from his home, but he plans to be supplying them to local businesses by the end of the month. Chelsea Gardens in Naples and Sally Kramer's on Marco Island carry the Architectural Aviaries.

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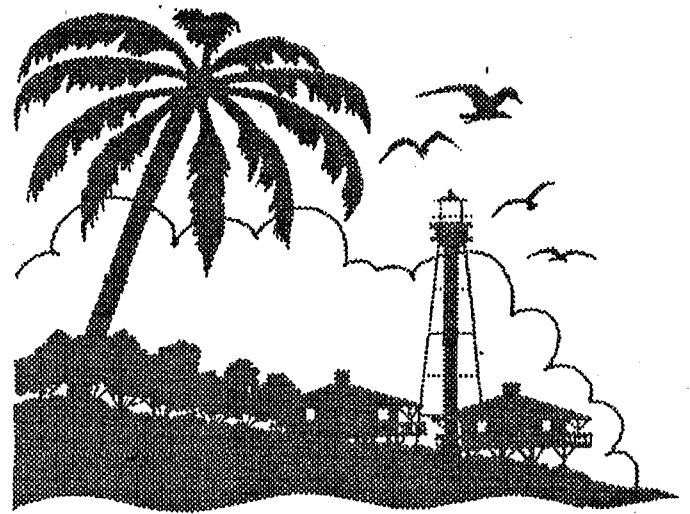
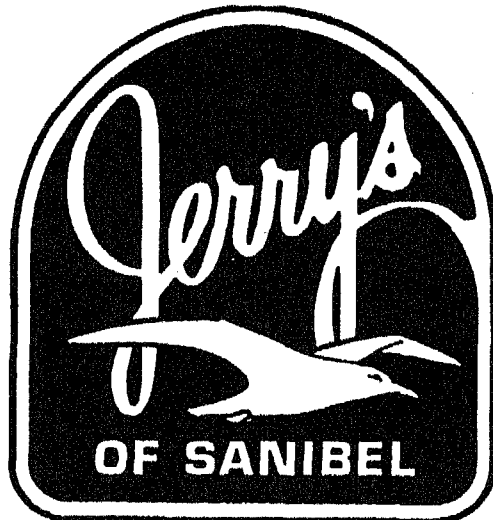
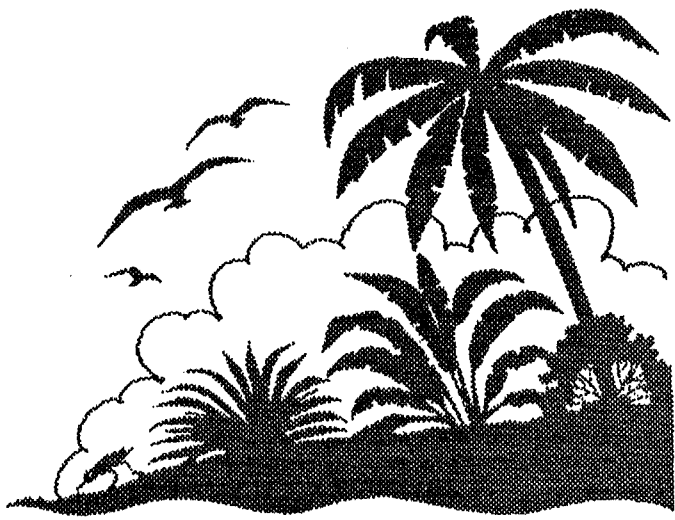
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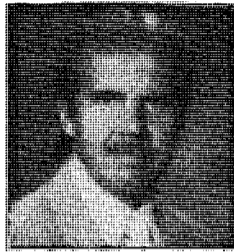


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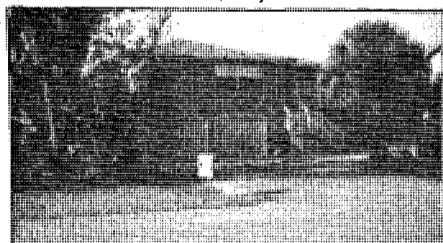
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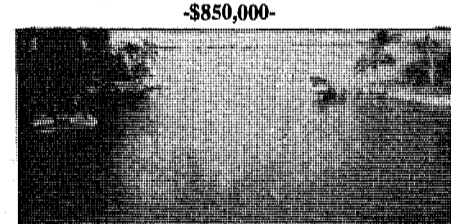
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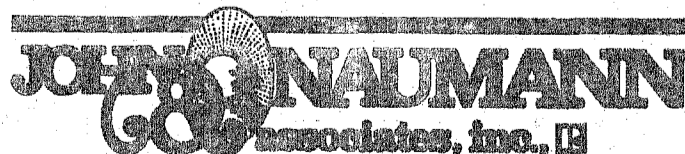

Teachers, business in partnership for better schools

The fifth annual Collegium for the Advancement of Teaching took place at South Seas Plantation this week. A partnership between the Foundation for Lee County Public Schools, the plantation and Sprint-United Telephone of Florida, the week-long seminar married business training with teacher's skills, in pursuit of empowered educators and better schools.

The collegium offered teachers interaction with business leaders, training in communication and interpersonal skills, networking and other opportunities for personal and professional growth.

Forty-six teachers attended the program at no charge to themselves. Funded entirely by partners and sponsors, the collegium began Sunday, July 11 and concludes today.

Attending were more than 30 teachers from Lee County schools; 10 from Collier County schools; others from Canterbury School and

year's winners attended the program in previous years; no one repeats the program.

The other Lee County teachers were selected for their high scores in the annual Golden Apple selection process, which this year saw 4,800 separate nominations from the public for 1,300 of the county's teachers—more than half the county's educators.

Amid the lush palms and laid-back environs of the resort plantation, teachers stayed a rigorous schedule which began with an optional, 6:15 a.m. aerobic beach walk, segued to breakfast at 7:30 a.m. and continued into the evening hours.

Packed between were seminars about behavioral styles, communication skills, conflict resolution, problem solving, decision making and personal action planning; programs on nutrition and aerobic walking and presentations by guest speakers from the business world.

Recreation included early morning beach walks and a trip to

sonal assessment—how teachers viewed themselves—and taught new ways to communicate with others different from themselves.

Stephen Barkley, executive vice president of Performance Learning Systems, taught a seminar on communication skills.

And as part of its involvement in the collegium, which is Sprint's first-ever, change-oriented corporate sponsorship, the communications giant dispatched corporate trainers to teach business skills to the elite corps of educators.

Among the trainers was Donna Divine, collegium facilitator and the finance employee development manager with Sprint's "University of Excellence."

Divine, a former teacher and school principal, drew on both her business and teaching skills to help design this year's collegium, where she taught programs as well.

Divine facilitated a program on conflict resolution and in conjunction with Karen A. Krepps, Sprint's vice president of human resources development with the University of Excellence, instructed teachers in sessions on problem solving, decision making and personal action planning.

Linda Lehtomaa, president of the Foundation for Lee County Public Schools, and Darlene Grossman, foundation vice president, also

helped design the collegium.

Lehtomaa said she believes the skills taught at the collegium are necessary as the Lee County school

Bishop Verot High School in Fort Myers; St. Ann's School in Collier County and teachers from Duval and Marion counties.

The Lee County teachers corps included three of the five Golden Apple award winners for the 1992-1993 school year. Two of this

Starting Sunday, teachers learned new ways of understanding themselves and others in a behavioral styles program presented by Jan Kantor, owner of Success Systems, Inc.

results—are made at each school, by teachers and administrators who know best how to meet their student's needs.

Lehtomaa sees the future of education in empowered teachers making their own site-based decisions, rather than complying with state-ordered mandates—but said with this new approach comes accountability and often fear.

"The teachers welcome change, but training has to go along with that," she said.

While Divine said programs like the collegium help teachers understand their roles and responsibilities in site-based management, the programs also help teachers lose their fear of accountability.

"Many teachers have never had to walk in that realm before," she said.

One ongoing collegium session, on problem solving and decision making, borrowed ideas from the concept of TQM—total quality management.

Teachers were given a "case study," a detailed report about a fictitious school fraught with problems, then formed teams to devise solutions to the problems.

Team members were assigned roles with a variety of extenuating conflicts of interest.

For instance, one team member was assigned the role of a school board member who was also a developer with a hidden agenda.

Using a seven-step, problem solving structure, teams presented their solutions to a faux school board, made up of fellow teachers.

Lehtomaa said many corporations which offer to help schools today, want to do more than write a check.

"Businesses can bring so much to schools," she said. "They can bring in employees to mentor kids, provide positive role models and have a meaningful involvement in schools."

Today's sponsors want to see results, according to Grossman, who said corporate givers want to report back to boards of directors with positive, tangible news regarding what the corporation's largess has wrought.

Any sponsor would be happy with the walking, talking results personified by Fort Myers High School marine biology teacher Bob Fain, a 1989 collegium alumnus who spoke to the group Tuesday afternoon.

Fain attributed his 1990 selection as a Golden Apple winner directly to the collegium.

Before he attended, he had been teaching for 16 years and had admittedly grown pretty cynical.

"I felt I'd learned it all, seen it all, knew it all. But I started getting uncomfortable during the first day of the program, and realized I was missing something. There were skills—learned skills, intuitive skills—I needed to improve on. I turned from a cynic to a believer," he said.

The week after the program, Fain used con-

flict resolution skills learned at the collegium to resolve a real-life problem; to his amazement, the conflict dissolved.

"I'd been a griper and a complainer in my professional life, with students, teachers and administrators. I took control of some things that bothered me and instead of being a complainer, became a doer," he said.

Fain remembered one collegium facilitator who taught the value of doing things a little bit at a time.

The facilitator noted many of the teachers there were faced with figurative "elephants."

The facilitator asked, "How does one eat an elephant?" The answer, "One bite at a time."

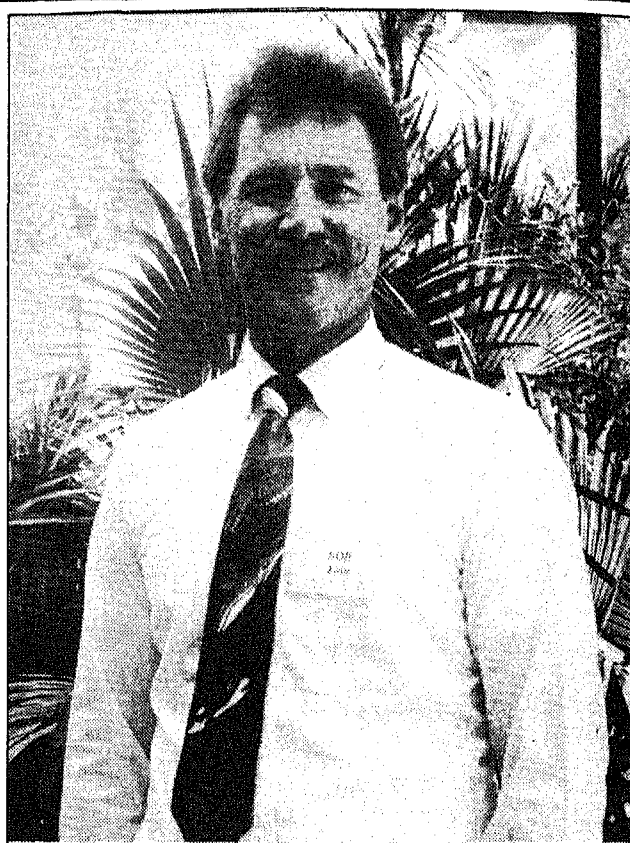
Fain said in 1989, there was very little recognition for teachers at Fort Myers High School. So he designed and began, with the principal's blessings, the teacher recognition program which has operated there for the past five years.

Fain said after attending the collegium, he began to take more risks in teaching and his students responded. Now, he and his students set down the rules, within academic constraints, whereby grades are determined in class.

Pre-collegium, the average grade in his class was C. Now, Fain said the average grade is B, noting the content of the marine biology course has not changed one iota.

It creates opportunities for local businesses to assist schools.

For instance, the Business Partners program, formerly Adopt-A-School, allows businesses to assist schools by providing funding, in-kind contributions, employee volunteers and mentors. It allow gives business the opportunity to become involved in special projects.

Darlene Grossman, vice president of the foundation, said the Adopt-A-School program began with Sprint-United Telephone's "adoption" of Riverdale High School in the 1980s.

However, she said the program limited the number of corporate sponsors which could assist a school. With Business Partners, there is no limit.

The foundation's range of initiatives includes the well-known Golden Apple teacher recogni-

tion program; the Academy of Teachers; the Collegium for the Advancement of Teaching; mini-grants for teachers; the A-Team challenge, the Jim and Ellie Newton Children's Literature Center; School Checks, a fundraising program; the Smart Kids Project and scholarships for county public school students without the means to further their education.

The couple plans to live in Guthrie, Okla. after a honeymoon in the Windward Islands.



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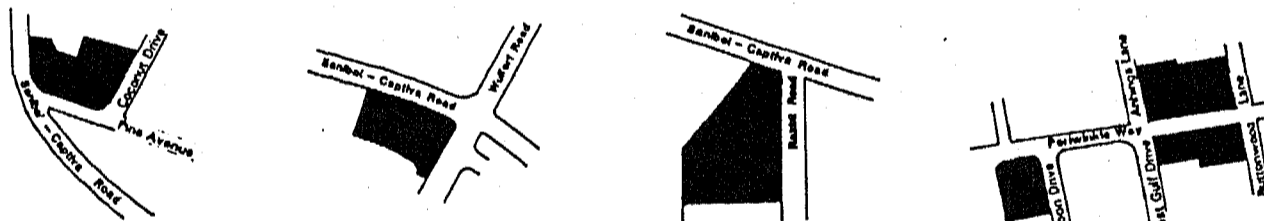

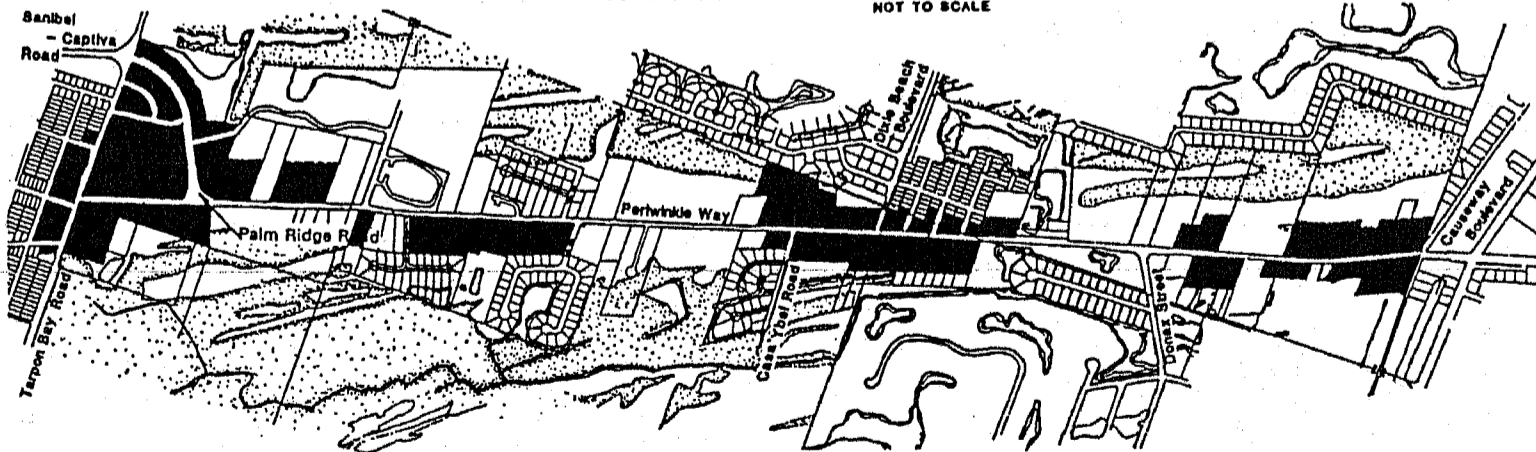

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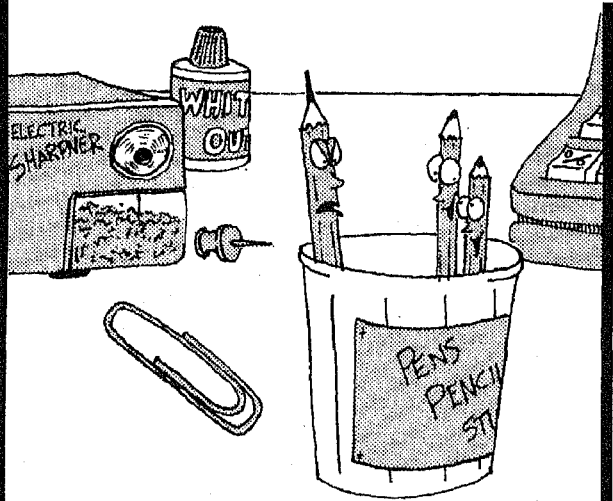

Make Sanibel nude: support MkNaked

To the editor:

We must thank God for the Sanibel naturalists' efforts to make clothing optional on our idyllic island. They have delivered us the opportunity for salvation with the arrival of nudity in Sanibel.

Our new group, called "MakeNaked" (abbreviated "MkNaked") has been born to heighten public awareness of National Nude Weekend by mounting a campaign to draft legislation to "Make Sanibel Naked."

Letters from Washington

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Florida fared poorly in the deliberations of the Military Base Closing Commission, according to two Florida representatives in Congress serving on the House Armed Services Committee.

U.S. Rep. Earl Hutto (D-Pensacola) and U.S. Rep. Tillie Fowler (R-Jacksonville), both of whom had lobbied hard to retain the Florida installations, told the results to the Florida forum meeting at the Capitol Hill Club.

The legislators reported that 20,000 civilian jobs will be lost in the state if the commission's recommendations are accepted by President Clinton and the entire Congress, as expected.

Both Representative Hutto and Fowler support economizing government expenditures but questioned the basic fairness of the commission, which was staffed by military brass.

Hutto said it appeared the military advisors had already made basic decisions on which

bases to close and then obtained commission approval.

Fowler is a 50-year-old lawyer serving her first term after succeeding former U.S. Rep. Charles Bennett, a Democrat.

Fowler said she has learned an awful lot in her battles with the military over base closures during her first six months on the Armed Services Committee.

Fowler indicated she is not trusting of all the information supplied by the military and will question the Pentagon diligently on future matters.

Citing a 15-page military regulation-recipe on how to make chocolate chip cookies, Fowler—a homemaker with two children—believes there are ways the Pentagon can economize.

One bright spot in the commission action was the retention of Homestead Air Force Base where the economy was devastated by Hurricane Andrew last summer.

♦♦♦♦

The nation's capital seems certain to retain its title as the U.S. murder capital with 24 slayings recorded here in one week during June.

Police reported some of the killings were due to drugs and gang wars but that explanation didn't fit one drive-by shooting at a neighborhood swimming pool where six children were wounded by a gunman who parked his car, opened automatic weapon fire on the pool and then drove away.

♦♦♦♦

Despite stifling temperatures in the 90s, the Washington Humane Society hosted its first annual "Mutts in the Mall" recently at the Washington Monument grounds, just across the street from the backyard of the White House.

Dogs of mixed breed were eligible, with pure breeds also welcome.

Sponsors were told by park police not to expect more than 10 people to show, but mutt fanciers arrived by the hundreds and it was truly a dog day afternoon in Washington.

Competitions took place in a variety of categories including the curliest tail, the most owner/mutt look-alike, the most difficult to ascertain lineage and the best trick.

It was the best show in town, outside of Congress raising taxes.

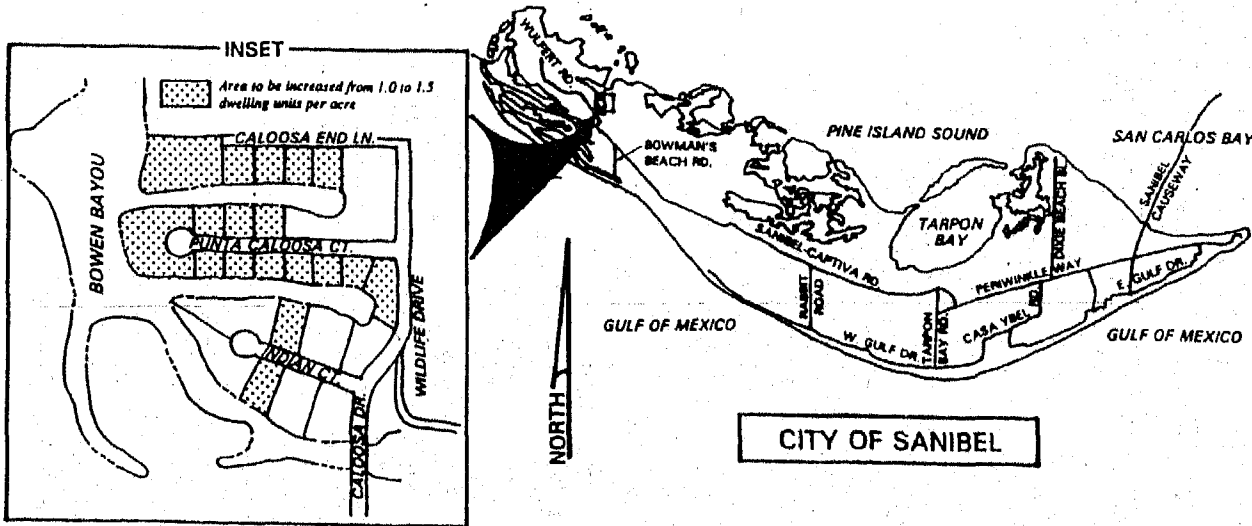

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Sanibel's Teen Club grows with community, youths

If two of the qualities needed in a teen program coordinator are enthusiasm and energy, Dave DeFonzo meets the criteria. The fact that he probably has even more energy than your average teenager suits him to his job perfectly.

In the fall of 1992, DeFonzo was given the assignment of overseeing the development of a teen program for the City of Sanibel Parks and Recreation Department.

The recreation program actually began in 1978 with the establishment of the Sanibel Water Attack Team (SWAT) swim program.

Parks and Recreation Director Dick Noon explains how the community and the city have responded to the recreational needs of a growing and changing community in the new brochure published by the department.

With a budget of its own this year, the teen program is becoming a more recognized function and with a little help from its ardent supporters, DeFonzo hopes to continue to build on the foundation laid last fall.

"I have more than 50 teens, age 12 to 15, enrolled in the program. We have between 15 and 20 kids at any given activity and they are really into the program. We want to attract that particular age group because once teenagers get their driver's license, they're gone," DeFonzo said.

Teens were given a survey sheet on which to identify the activities they found most attractive. Choices ranged from babysitting certification, tutoring, career planning, make-up and fashion to field trips to Minnesota Twins games, Disneyworld and Wet & Wild Water Park.

"They went for the physical activities—the fun things, so that's what we give them," DeFonzo said.

Besides field trips, the teens enjoy Friday night movies and munchies, with Isabella's and Subway donating food.

Basketball games in the gym, swimming and just hanging out with friends—some of whom

have gone all the way through Sanibel Elementary together—the teens find it all fun.

DeFonzo and the teens are lucky to have another supporter in Nancy DeFonzo, Dave's wife, who accompanies the group on a volunteer basis wherever it goes.

Jennifer Hubbard, who attends Cypress Lake High School, and is the Teen Club president, says she'd like to see more frequent activities.

This sentiment is echoed by parent Betty Reynolds, whose 13-year-old son, Scooter, enjoys the teen activities.

"Dave is doing a great job. We'd like to see a regular meeting time so the kids get in the habit of having that activity to go to," Reynolds said.

She and husband, Steve Reynolds, islanders for 20 years, have seen the recreation program come a long way in response to residents' needs. They believe the Teen Club is a wonderful, inexpensive means for the young to enjoy themselves in a local, safe place.

"Ideal conditions for youth to start the socializing process," the Reynolds described the program.

From a group of devoted parents who are willing to drive members of the Teen Club anywhere, anytime, Barbara Traum is another parent whose support and praise for the program is whole-hearted.

"Dave and his wife are wonderful. They're very responsible people. We're so lucky to have them," Traum said.

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All hits, all the time: island son makes it big

Rowe Jones, third and youngest son of proud islanders Pat and Stanley Jones, got his start at an AM radio station in Fort Myers after an inauspicious academic career.

Between on-air work, minding radio logs, cleaning bathrooms and otherwise minding the store, the young man who'd tolerated business courses at three different institutes of higher learning before falling into radio at Edison Community College, found his way into one of those odd niches in the business world.

In 1989, while living in Sanibel, Jones founded RadioVision, a radio production company and advertising agency now based in Sunrise, near Fort Lauderdale.

RadioVision's first office was in the Old Iona Schoolhouse on McGregor Boulevard, which still sports the company logo.

From small beginnings, the business took flight. Jones' affable voice has become familiar to millions as the voice of the VH-1 music television cable network, the

National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing (NASCAR) and the Pete Rose Show. He is heard across the country in thousands of radio and television commercials.

Asked to "do that VH-1 thing," a jingle which is played 10 or 12 times each hour on that music television network, he readily agreed.

"All hits, all the time," the familiar voice, this time on a telephone, said.

The man who makes his living with his voice brings his pet dog, "Shoppie," also known as Shop Dog, to the studio every Wednesday.

Funny thing is, Shoppie is a Basenji, an Egyptian breed of dog which is mute. But maybe there's no room for accidental, doggie sound effects at RadioVision.

"I see myself as a humble little voice cobbler, making ends meet every day," he said, adding at times it seems he has won the lottery with his voice.

Within a year of landing the job at WCAI, 1350 on the AM dial here, Jones answered an ad in *Billboard* magazine seeking "a man of a

thousand voices to write and produce radio commercials."

An accomplished mimic, he sent them a tape.

TSI, the mammoth radio commercial syndicator which placed the ad, hired him at its production facility on Florida's East Coast and turned him loose.

At the age of 23, Jones' was the most-heard voice on commercial radio in the United States.

Jones estimated he wrote and produced 40,000 to 50,000 commercials during his 3 1/2 years with TSI.

The idea for RadioVision was born in 1988, when Jones was working for a broadcast group in Michigan and getting prickly under the collar.

Running into creative walls; feeling stifled, he decided he wanted to work for himself. He returned to Florida, bought studio equipment and set up shop.

No relation between him and Tom Jones, but like that of the famous crooner, his voice offers an intangible, magnetic image that lingers long after the radio—or television—is off.

While Jones said he doesn't have the best or worst voice around, he does have drive and determination, two qualities which helped earn his success.

In late 1991, when VH-1 went shopping for an old-style radio voice, they chose Jones over some of the top radio and television voices in the country.

He was the exclusive voice for VH-1 for almost 2 1/2 years; a few more voices now round out the station's venue.

"To have a company [VH-1] with that kind of clout come to Rowe Jones from little Bonne Terre, Missouri—it kind of hits you," he said.

Born in that sleepy town in St. Francis County, a county with no traffic lights, Jones said it was a half-hour drive to the nearest McDonald's. Raised in rural quiet

and descended from Scottish and Welsh stock, in maturity Jones likes things "big and loud."

His brother Gordon, 36, is a doctor in Sikeston, in the boot heel of Missouri; brother Courtney, 34, lives in Los Angeles and works for Rick Dees, host of the syndicated radio show "Rick Dees' Top 40."

Locally, Jones handles radio advertising work for eight lines sold by Freeland auto dealers. He handles all aspects of their advertising, from developing creative ideas to stopping just short of pushing the button at the radio or television station to roll the commercial.

His clients include national and international businesses.

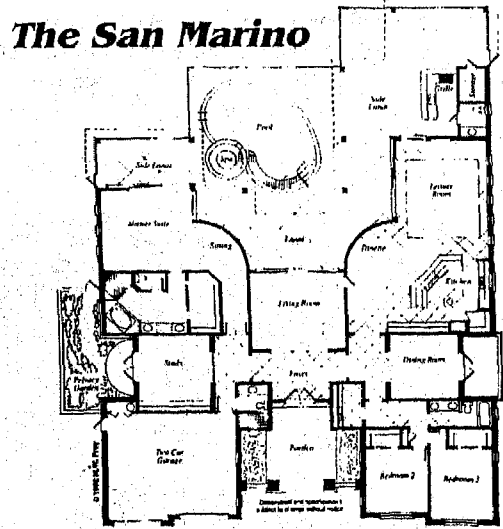
One open door leads to another in this business; Jones' radio career may segue to television in the future.

For now, he ponders getting a place in New York, where he's already made it, and dividing his time between here and there, as he makes the rounds of television auditions.

The long commute—from his Fort Lauderdale home to the Big Apple—would pose no problem, this young man of vision said.

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Making a living in paradise

Tracey Markwalter finds her niche at Pick Kwik

A rumpled tourist/father asked, "Where's the beach?" while leading his four hot and thirsty children straight for the coolers.

Pick Kwik deli manager Tracey Markwalter hefted her thumb over her shoulder and told him, "Right at the end of Tarpon Bay Road."

She's plumb in the middle of the usual Sunday tourist crowd—halfway between busy and chaotic—but she hasn't lost her sense of humor, which is a requirement for working at the busy store located at the intersection of Tarpon Bay, Palm Ridge and Sanibel-Captiva roads.

"We try not to get too serious around here," she said in her soft, Virginia accent. "Every day something hysterical is going to happen." Markwalter just tries to stay loose.

What is a former college art major/licensed property manager/certified interior decorator/advertising sales manager doing working at Pick Kwik?

"It was the best-paying job I could find when I came to the island a year ago and they've been good to me," she said.

Markwalter said when her father went into the hospital, Pick Kwik management let her have the time off she needed; when she was hospitalized unexpectedly and was out for six weeks, everyone kept in touch with her, phoning often. The district manager even brought her flowers. And all that was on top of getting hospitalization insurance, she noted.

As deli manager, Markwalter has a long list of responsibilities.

"It's not just hanging out behind a cash register like people think," she said.

She slices cold-cuts, makes sandwiches, prepares salads, wraps all the food, shops for produce, stocks shelves, keeps the coolers filled, sweeps the front sidewalk and even cleans the bathrooms.

But she likes her job. Markwalter says it was the perfect job for a newcomer to the island because she got to meet everyone.

"I think I've made most of my friends on the job. People come in over and over and pretty soon, you know all about each other. A little bit of your life gets known each time," she said.

She figures the customers break down to a third locals, a third tourists and a third workers.

"The locals are great! They have a bad rep off-island as being uppity, but it's not true. They are so nice. One customer went out of her way to find and bring me a huge sack of marshmallow 'Peeps' for Easter because I love them and couldn't find them anywhere," she recounted.

Tourists are ok with Markwalter, too. They can add hilarity to the job, she said.

"They can't figure out how to work the gas pumps," she said with a shrug.

According to Markwalter, the most-asked directions are to South Seas Plantation and the Dunes Golf & Tennis Club.

"They drive down to Bowman's Beach and then turn around and come back. I have to tell them, 'Keep driving' or 'Go back to the causeway,'" she said.

Workers are another story. Markwalter said she has never heard the words, "Wanna go out?" so much in her life. Usually, she said, this is accompanied by a "line" as long as a telephone wire.

This isn't surprising since Markwalter is attractive in anyone's book—strikingly pretty with strawberry blond hair and a flawless complexion. She's a neat dresser, talks with that cute Virginia accent and has a great sense of humor.

Markwalter doesn't feel apprehensive working nights because "the police are good about watching out for us. I know they'll pull the bridge if I get robbed."

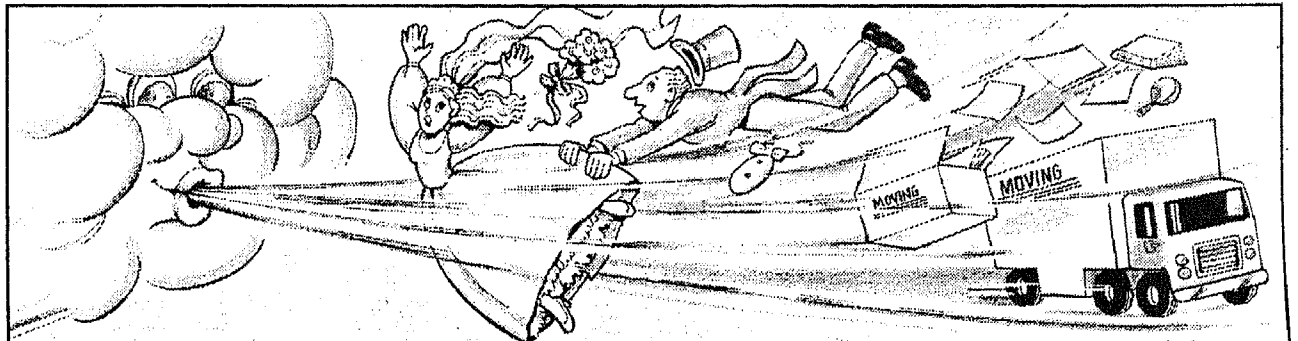
But working the midnight shift doesn't mean sitting behind the counter reading. There's

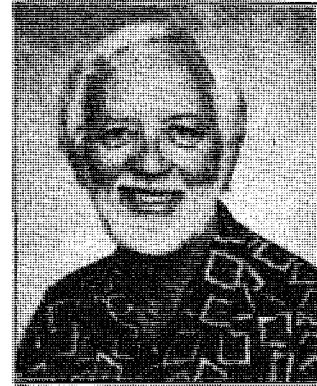

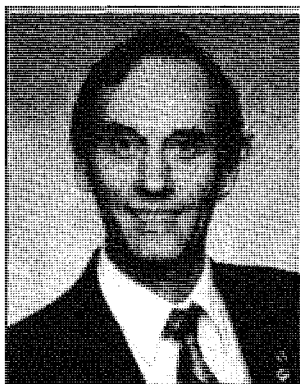

"These kids are at that very critical age—too old for the activities of their early childhood and not old enough to drive and be independent," she noted.

that he now wants to come to all the activities.

This turn of events also pleased parents who believe that as island youth mature, it seems a matter of always taking them to the mainland for recreation.

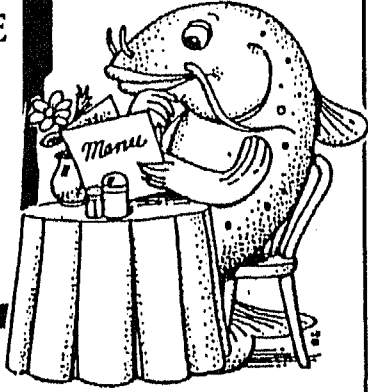

"Some people get on the island late at night and stop in here and do their entire grocery shopping at one or two in the morning," she said.

The dark can play tricks on you, though. Markwalter told about the time a customer came in to pay for her gas and when she went back to the pump, her truck was gone. They called police to report the theft. The police came over and found the truck had just slipped out of gear and rolled down the hill to the end of the drive. The women were embarrassed but anyone who's been out past 10 on a Sanibel winter night knows how dark the night can be.

Markwalter admits to being a "shopaholic." She said she gets armloads of bargains at consignment shops such as Noah's Ark or Goodwill. Her "best buy" was a pair of Raybans she got at Sam's for half the price the trendy glasses cost at the new outlet stores.

Her creative flair and art training keep her mind churning with innovative and funky ideas for redoing furniture, home accessories, and bicycles—things she can pick up at resale shops and garage sales, decorate and resell.

She also likes painting furniture and bicycles in combinations of bright, island colors and bizarre designs.

Her one big regret is that she moved off the island about two months ago due to what she calls her "stupidity."

Off-island friends had been saying how much more apartment you could get for how much less money off-island, so she finally gave in. Now, she misses being able to lift her bike from her porch and take off for a ride or go to the beach whenever she feels like it.

"So, it's a hundred dollars less—it's not worth it," she said in disgust.

She's looking for another place on the island—thinking maybe several friends can go in together and get a really nice, big place. She's so eager to get back, she's been driving the subdivisions, looking for what might be possible rentals.

A little more than a year ago, Markwalter came to Sanibel to visit friends. She vacationed for two weeks, went home to Bristol, Va., sold all her belongings and, within two weeks, moved here permanently.

It was love at first sight and the love affair with the islands is still strong. If she can just find a rental so she can be living back on the island, living will be paradise again.

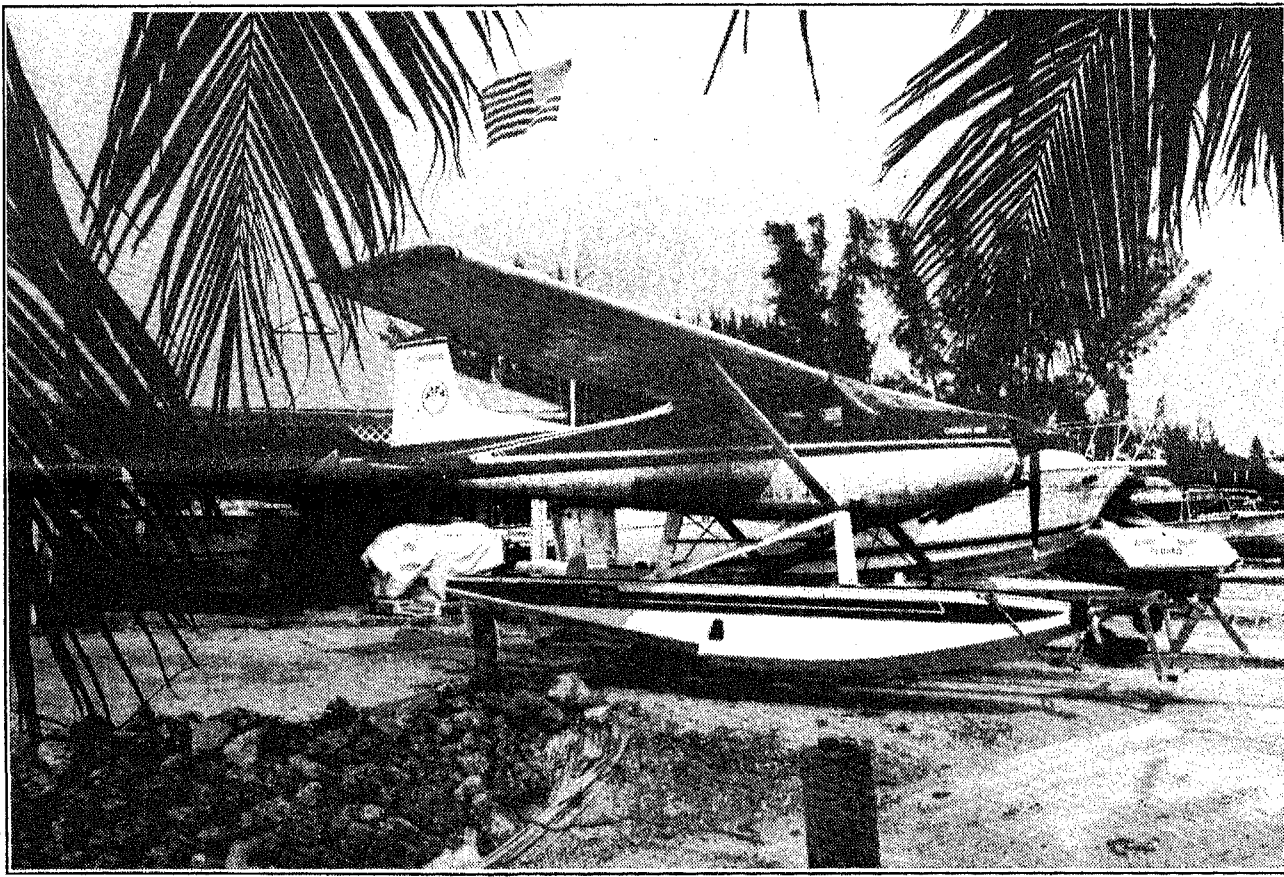

Boating

Used boats a buyer's market—but beware, agency warns

If you're looking for a used boat, there are plenty of bargains available. But most boats on the market need some maintenance and repair and should be thoroughly inspected by a qualified marine surveyor, according to the Boat Owners Association of the United States (BOAT-U.S.).

"A used boat is no bargain if you're faced with costly, major repairs after the sale," said BOAT-U.S. Consumer Affairs Director Caroline Ajootian.

A complete bow-to-stern survey usually costs between \$8 and \$12 per foot and is money well spent, Ajootian added. Marine surveyors can be found via word of mouth, through boating magazines, and in the Yellow Pages. A marine mechanic can also offer a referral to a reputable surveyor.

At the very least, the survey should determine if the boat's fuel and electrical systems meet United States Coast Guard standards.

The survey should also uncover any structural defects in the hull or deck, such as waterlogged deck core material and stress cracks in the hull and identify symp-

toms of engine problems, such as leaks or unusual noise and vibration.

The boating agency also suggests the prospective used boat buyer do some additional detective work which may save grief and expense later.

This includes checking with the Department of Motor Vehicles to make sure there are no liens or encumbrances that would prevent you from taking clear title to the boat; calling the Coast Guard hot line, (800) 368-5647, to see if any safety recalls or defects have been reported for that model and taking the boat for a sea trial.

A thorough sea trial should put the boat through its paces without punishing it and its not a bad idea to bring a mechanic along for the ride.

As with cars, some noises occur out on the water—when there's usually no mechanic around to listen.

The sales contract should be contingent upon the results of the survey, sea trial and your ability to get insurance coverage for the boat.

Some insurance companies won't insure

older hulls. And wooden boats, no matter how well maintained, are often uninsurable.

The sales contract should also include a list of equipment and accessories to be conveyed with the boat.

Finally, the contract should spell out that deposit money is refundable if any contingency is not met.

Facts about drowning

The Southwest Florida Safety Council offers a few facts about drowning—a preventable tragedy.

While overeating before any strenuous exercise is dangerous, a moderate amount of food before swimming will provide energy, and keep you warm.

Once you've consumed alcohol, only time will sober you. Hitting the water won't lessen the effects of alcohol on muscles and the brain.

Most boats won't sink, even when overturned. If you stay with a capsized boat, you'll have something to help you keep your head above water—and you'll be easier to spot.
