Murder shakes Captiva

Gunman
'had always
wanted to
kill someone'

Waves of horror, disbelief and despair crashed on the shores of Sanibel and Captiva islands with the news of the murder of Jory Leonard Dahmer.

Dahmer, 37, lived on Captiva for 12 years. His life as a bartender and friend to many ended early Tuesday morning after Matthew Alan Ortiz shot Dahmer on the beach near the southern end of South Seas Plantation resort on Captiva.

Dahmer was pronounced dead at the scene when deputies arrived shortly after 1 a.m.

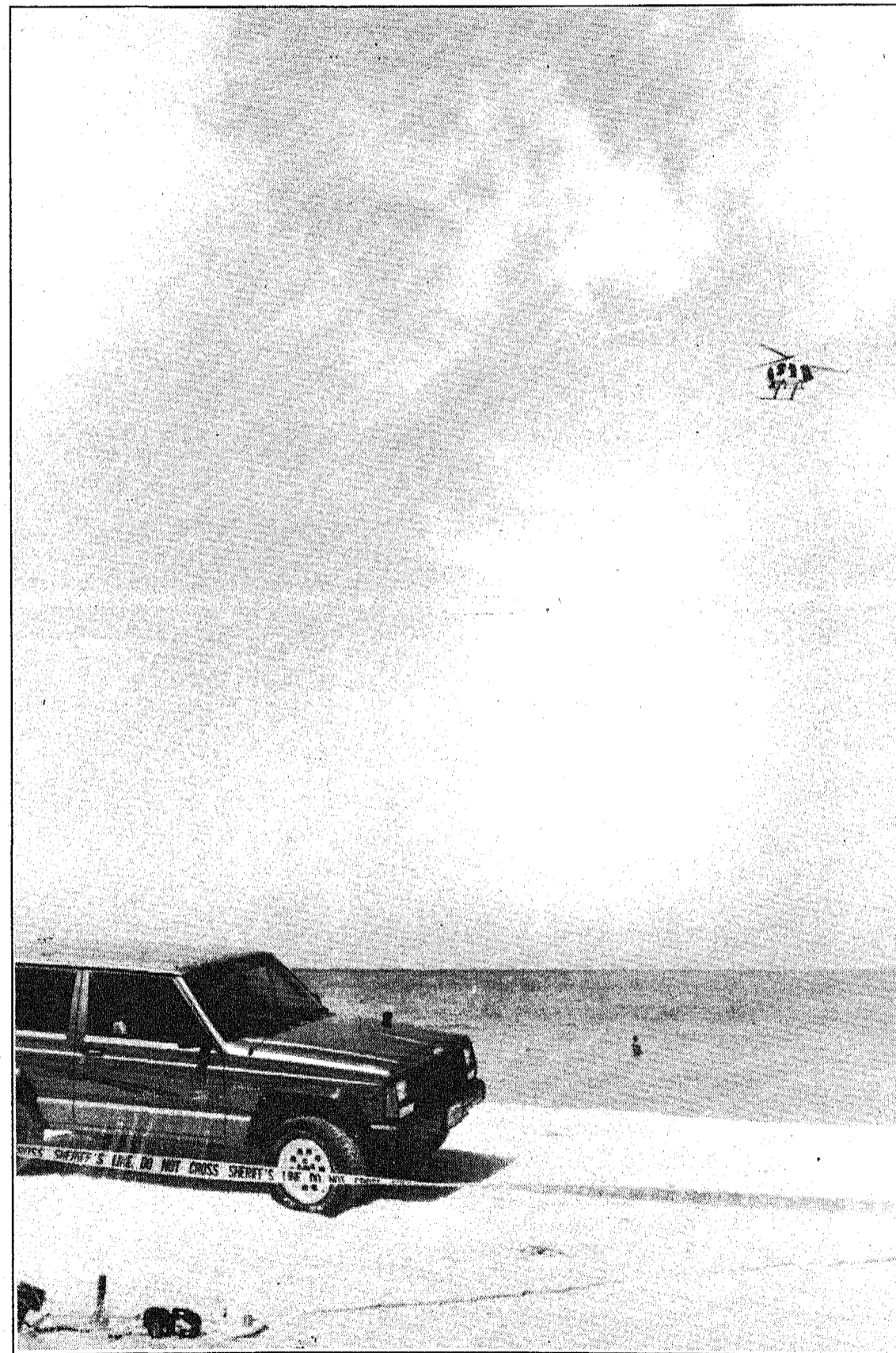
Deputies arrested Matthew Alan Ortiz, 21, after talking him out of his South Seas Plantation employee dormitory in which he had barricaded himself, armed with a 9 mm Beretta, for 40 minutes.

Ortiz purchased the handgun from Gold Miners Pawn Shop, 4421 Hancock Bridge Parkway, on his 21st birthday, which was April 25. He reportedly told friends and family that he "had always wanted to kill someone," according to Tim Hetz, public information officer for the Lee County Sheriff's Office.

Florida law requires handgun purchasers be at least 21 years old.

Ortiz was charged with first degree murder and remains in the Lee County Jail without

Friends
of Dahmer
establish
memorial

If love and caring could be gathered from the grains of sand on the beach, an enormous castle would stand on Captiva for Jory Dahmer. Built by more friends than he probably knew he had, the imaginary castle would be the culmination of a labor of love from the employees of local shops and restaurants, residents and all of those who remember Dahmer. It would be the result of many a strong hand lent in a time of bitter sadness, grief and questioning.

The communities of Captiva and Sanibel came together this week in support of one another in the midst of a horrendous crime against not only one individual, but the community. Within hours of the tragedy several restaurants had begun a collection to lessen the expenses of Dahmer's loved ones and to donate to an underprivileged children's fund for baseball. By Tuesday evening, Tween Waters alone had raised over \$600. Thousands of dollars were raised from the Timbers, the Bubble Room and other island restaurants and businesses, all collected from servers, managers and friends who wanted to give unselfishly of themselves.

Dahmer's friends hope to have one of the Sanibel softball fields renamed Jory Dahmer Field. A portion of the funds

Tourists undeterred by Tuesday's 'random act of violence'

Even as the sun rose over Captiva Tuesday morning, the normal trickle of early risers walked the beach, passing by sheriff's lines cordoning off the site at which Matthew Ortiz shot Jory Dahmer. At first curious, then horrified,

most shrugged off the incident as a tragic fact of modern life.

By 10 a.m. the parking lot at the beach access behind employee housing at South Seas Plantation was already close to full. Many of the vehicles were from the sheriff's department or the press, but others were cars belonging to

tourists, resolute that no sheriff's lines would keep them off the beach.

Again, most arrived curious, expressed concern or horror, and then walked around the crime scene to go set up their umbrellas, chairs, coolers and towels.

By 11 a.m. the crowd on the

beach had grown to its normal size for this time of year, beachgoers only casually glancing up at the circling sheriff's department helicopter.

A woman arriving, seeing the sheriff's cruisers, called out, "It doesn't have anything to do with parasailing, does it?" She appeared nervous, as

if to get back into her car and flee the dare made by her husband the previous evening over a pina colada. When informed that all was safe with the parasailing business and that the beach was the site of Captiva's first murder in over 20 years, she said, "Oh. Can you tell me

Community remembers, mourns loss of friend

Captiva is about ambience—glowing sunsets at dusk, sandy roads that leave clouds of dust in the air, and old rambling houses hidden by leafy tropical plants. Part of what creates this ambience are the local characters, people whose personalities make the island truly come to life.

Jory Dahmer was one of those people, and the loss of his life early Tuesday morning was a tragedy for the island community.

For locals who frequent area restaurants and bars, he was someone everyone knew. Many knew him just as the smiling face behind the bar, and others knew him simply as "Jory"—

no last names with such a familiar face. The community on Captiva is small, and many will say nothing is more comforting than being able to drop in the local hangout and be able to chat with people they know.

As a bartender at Tween Waters Inn for over seven years, Jory was one of those friendly faces. He knew what drink you preferred, and he knew at least a little bit about you, so locals could count on some warm words and a welcome feeling when they sat down at the bar. He knew the non-drinkers in the crowd, and would say with a twinkle in his eye, "Will it be water tonight, or are you cutting back?"

And for the people who knew him well, he was a friend who cannot be replaced.

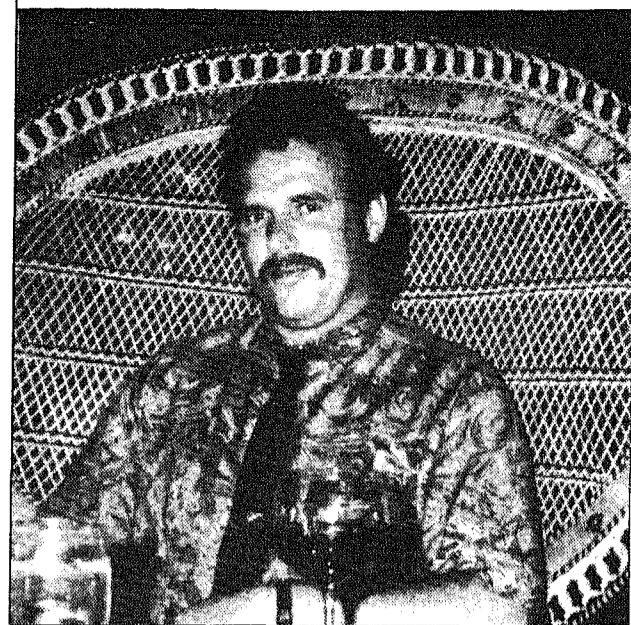
"Jory was the foundation of this place. He was just so wonderful to people, and he made everyone feel special and good about themselves. People were drawn to him and they wanted his friendship. And you never wanted to let Jory down or disappoint him,

because he was always there for everyone else. He made us all better people, I think. Somehow we are all going to have to pull it together without him, but he was the center here and it's not easy at all," said Paul Whitaker, Dahmer's close friend and co-worker at the Crow's Nest.

"He was part of the local color. Any bar takes on the personality of the bartender, and people loved to come and see Jory. We needed that here at Tween Waters,"

said Brian Schoof, a manager at the establishment.

"He just had a huge heart. And all of the people here loved him so much," said friend Brian Houston.

A heavy silence hangs over a place where ocean breezes and the beauty of the natural world usually calm a troubled mind. Tuesday evening, as another golden sun sank into the horizon outside Tween Waters, people gathered at the bar, their hearts laden with grief and disbelief that a tragic

and senseless murder could have stolen the life of their longtime friend and companion, Jory Dahmer. For those who did not know him, Tuesday was just another lovely day on Captiva with blue skies and quiet waves lapping gently at the shore, but for those who knew and cared, it was one of the darkest days in memory.

As the island community mourns the loss of their friend, Whitaker said, "I think now we have to take what we learned from him while he was here and go on. It is hard to fill his shoes, impossible really, but I think he taught us a lot about life and the way we should be with people. I think I'm a better person because of him."

So while Dahmer's life was tragically ended and his familiar and friendly smile will no longer greet his many friends at Tween Waters, his spirit lives on for those who knew and loved him. Memories of his presence will remain far beyond his days at Tween Waters.

Tuesday morning, the strength of the community and the efforts of its members stands as a testimony to human goodness. The concern and love for one another speaks against a dark blight of violence against one of Captiva's own. This unselfish love must serve as a beacon of hope, for when so often it seems there is nothing but violence in the world today people must remember the bright lights

that shine among us from time to time. For these demonstrations of kindness lend hope to humanity and make the spirit soar far above a senseless act by a lone gunman. His voice is silenced by the many others who join together in this time of tragedy. There must be many of these sandcastles in this world, and surely one was built on Captiva this week.

here. Remmerbach said that the incident would not deter him from returning, however.

Nor will it keep Hartmut Tendies of Bad Lippingspringe, Germany away.

Tendies has visited the islands for three years,

and is already planning his next trip.

"If I tell friends I make vacation in Florida, they say how terrible," Tendies said. "When I am here, I feel very safe."

Tendies said he believed much of the fear in traveling to

Florida is unfounded. "If you make a long journey, there is a risk, [but] Germany is not so safe a land—there is crime in vacation areas," he noted.

"What happened yesterday is terrible," he said. "That's life, unfortunately."

Jory Leonard Dahmer, 37

Jory Leonard Dahmer, age 37, of Captiva Island, died Tuesday, May 31, 1994. A resident of Captiva for the past 12 years, Dahmer relocated from Nantucket, where he was a lifeguard for five years.

Dahmer attended the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. While at UN, he participated in swimming and baseball.

An avid Nebraska fan and sportsman, Dahmer's local activities included softball, jogging, and kayaking. He recently entered and completed the first annual International Kayak Classic at Tween Waters Inn on Captiva.

He was employed by Tween Waters Inn as a bartender for the past seven years. He was also recently employed at the Sanibel Grill.

Dahmer is survived by his mother, Joyce Dahmer of Omaha, Neb.; two sisters, Carla Dahmer and Kim Moy, of Omaha, Neb.; fiancée Liz Seymour of Sanibel; nieces Shannon, Cassie and Selina; nephew Josh; and many, many friends. He was preceded in death by his father, Roy Dahmer.

Funeral services are being held this week in Omaha, Neb. A local memorial service is planned for 4 p.m., Monday, June 6 at the Crow's Nest at Tween Waters.

A group of surviving friends are inquiring about the possibility of renaming one of the Sanibel softball fields Jory Dahmer Field. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to the Jory Dahmer Memorial Fund at Community Bank of the Islands, P.O. Box 1640, Sanibel, Fla. 33957. Attention: Elaine Smith. Money from the fund will be used to erect a marker at the field in Dahmer's honor, or donated to a nonprofit island organization in his name.

He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

bond, Judge Radford Sturgis ruled in a hearing this morning, Hetz said.

Ortiz, of 3824 S.W. 14th Ave., is a one-year employee at South Seas Plantation, a 330-acre resort on Captiva Island. He had been living in employee housing there. The building is within view of the beach access where Dahmer and 23-year-old Sarah Wood, a co-worker, had parked a gray Jeep Cherokee.

Deputies are saying the murder was random and do not believe that Dahmer, a popular bartender at the Crow's Nest at Captiva's 'Tween-Waters Inn, and Ortiz knew each other. They have ruled out robbery as a motive.

"[Ortiz] just wanted to shoot somebody... This was a random act of violence," Hetz said.

Violence is virtually unheard of on Captiva; the island's only other murder occurred more than 20 years ago.

The incident has left the close-knit island community shocked.

According to Hetz, Ortiz confronted Dahmer and the woman on the beach at approximately 1 a.m. Tuesday. He fired three shots with his semiautomatic pistol.

One bullet hit the Cherokee's tire, one flew over Dahmer and another struck him in the head, knocking him to the ground and fatally wounding him.

Firefighters, who arrived first on the scene, began CPR on Dahmer, but upon arrival, medics said he was beyond recovery, according to one Captiva firefighter.

There were several eye witnesses, including Ortiz' roommate Arthur Ruhe, 21, and Wood.

Ruhe told deputies that at around 11 p.m., he talked to Ortiz at the Key Lime Lounge, an employee bar at the resort. Ruhe reported Ortiz wanted to meet him on the beach at 1:30 a.m. At that time, Ruhe saw a vehicle and heard Ortiz asking Wood and Dahmer to write a note, later said to be a suicide note.

Ortiz was waving a gun around in

the air, and when Dahmer refused to write the note, the shots were fired, killing Dahmer. Ruhe said Ortiz then pulled Wood by the hair, and threw her on top of Dahmer, who fell to the ground. He put a gun to the back of her head. Ruhe talked Ortiz out of harming Wood, and Ortiz walked away.

A Lee County Special Response Unit was called to the scene and tracked Ortiz to his third-floor room. After a 40-minute standoff, Sgt. Stephen Ford, supervisor of the sheriff's canine division, talked Ortiz into disarming himself and surrendering.

Deputies returned to search Ortiz' room later Tuesday and found numerous bullet holes in the ceiling and walls. One bullet passed through a side wall of his room, entering the men's locker room next door. They have yet to determine whether the shots were fired before or after the killing.

South Seas officials said they had no reason to believe that Ortiz, who worked as part of a set-up crew for conferences at the resort, was unstable nor that he had the potential to kill someone.

"He was a very nice kid, a good employee who worked here for over a year. There was no reason to be worried about that particular employee. It's hard to understand. He was just a really sweet kid," Public Relations Director Suzanne Willis said of Ortiz. "As far as South Seas goes, we are shocked and very saddened by it. I don't believe it. We're just really sad for the families and friends of both the South Seas employee and the 'Tween-Waters employee."

Ortiz had no prior record and Willis said a background check was conducted before he was hired.

In a written statement, South Seas general manager Fred Hawkins said, "We are very distressed that this tragic incident occurred on Captiva Island. Our deepest sympathies are extended to the families and friends of those indi-

viduals involved.

"We are concerned how this incident may affect our employees and...will provide counseling for employees that may need it."

Steve Addison-Adams, a co-worker of Ortiz', said, "I can't believe he did it. He was such a nice person. That seems to be the general consensus out here. I guess everybody has a dark side but you tend to see it or suspect it in someone, but not with him."

Dahmer, a native of Nebraska, had lived on Captiva Island for 12 years. He had worked as a bartender at the Crow's Nest for the past 7 years and also worked at the Sanibel Grill.

Dahmer's body was flown to Nebraska for burial Wednesday. Friends plan to conduct a local memorial service at 'Tween Waters at 4 p.m. Monday, June 6.

'Low probability' of hurricane striking Sanibel

To the editor

Sanibel residents and newcomers, 220 strong, survived another scary forewarning at a hurricane seminar held May 19 at the Sundial Beach and Tennis Resort. Jim Reef said, "this may not be the year of the BIG ONE, but it's coming is inevitable." You would think we live over the San Andreas Fault.

However, there were some new informative data presented:

A. Devastation caused by Hurricane Andrew upon post northern analysis showed weakness in building codes, structural practices and construction materials. The Sanibel Strap got rave reviews (kudos to Max Anderson).

B. Barrier islands on the Florida West Coast are especially vulnerable to tidal surges because of shallow water for miles westward.

C. Therefore, Florida West Coast is especially at risk to storms originating in the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico, as compared to those from the Atlantic.

D. Bob Sheets (National Hurricane Center) and his assistant illustrated with superb slides the hurricane path for many decades (since the 1960s as I recall.) The important storms from the Southwest come in June and July. In the past we have been repeatedly told that August and September and early October were the months to fear on Sanibel.

E. Tracking of storm paths have improved dramatically through airplane surveillance and computer analysis. For example, landfall of Andrew was pinpointed within an 8 mile radius. Some residents who carefully listened to the radio data revised every four hours, did not leave the island nor move boats from their backyard docks! It was obvious that our island would not be in difficulty.

During the question and answer period, I told Bob Sheets that I lived year round on Sanibel since 1980 and had never found it necessary to evacuate. His reply was not very reassuring when he said, "Thirteen years is not very long in hurricane history."

As a personal observation, there was no way that Hurricane Andrew could pass below the tip of the Florida Peninsula, make a right turn and strike Sanibel. Why? First, the Coriolis effect, and secondly the viscous drag of the 150 mile deep atmosphere. Indeed, according to the Fort Myers *News-Press*, our island enjoys the lowest probability in Florida of an off-shore strike.

The fields are plowed and now it is time to plant the seeds for "WILDFLOWERS."

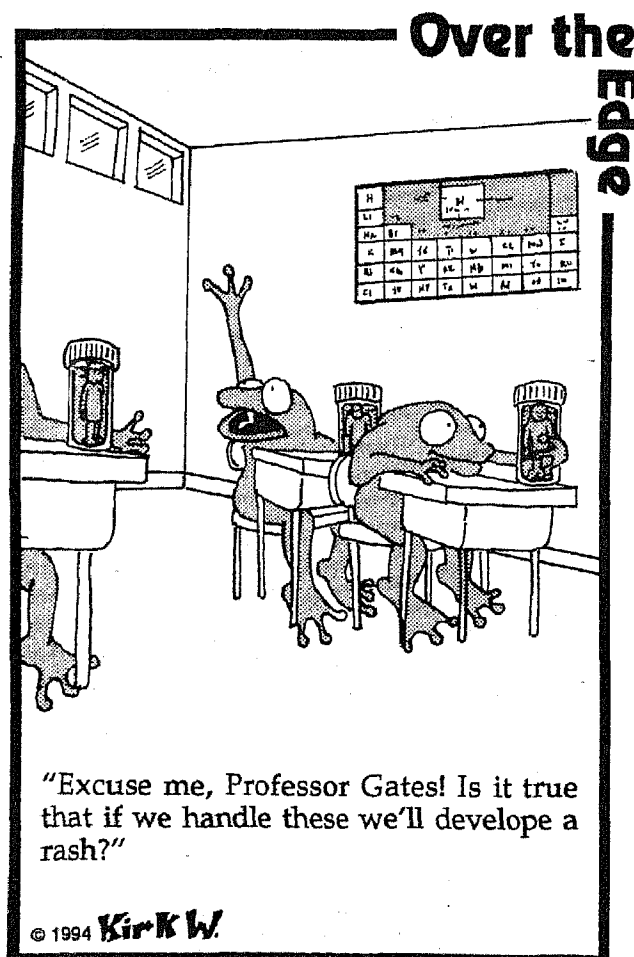

Envision a newer and

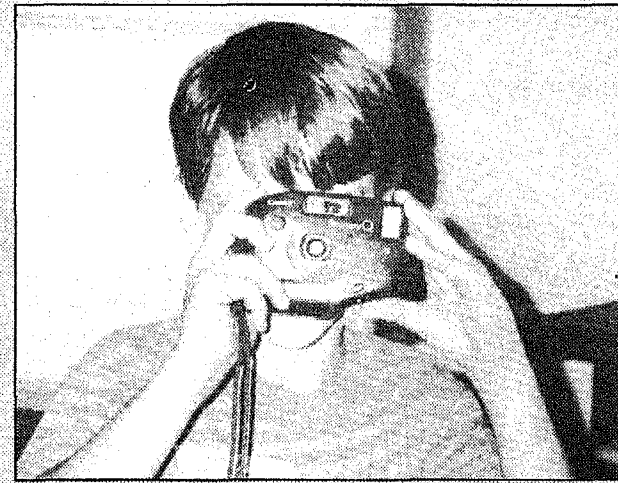

CEPD approves plan to distribute federal money

After several months of controversy and debate, the Captiva Erosion Prevention District (CEPD) Board Commissioners unanimously approved a plan late Wednesday night for distributing a \$1.8 million rebate from the federal government to Captiva property owners.

The federal check is expected within the next two weeks and will be divided among Captiva property owners who paid a special assessment totaling \$5.9 million in 1988 and 1989 to help finance the \$10 million Captiva beach renourishment project.

"The district has researched and discussed the appropriate method to distribute these funds and is interested in a fair and equitable distribution," the commissioners stated.

The district plan "intends to distribute the federal grant moneys to any and all property owners on Captiva who have prepaid or paid money toward the beach special assessment, and can provide adequate proof thereof in proportion to the amount the owner paid, and to Lee County as required under the applicable interlocal agreement. Further all owners of property on which installments toward the special assessment are due shall receive a proportionate credit against the amount due."

The commissioners expect Lee County to receive about \$300,000 of the federal rebate, and the commissioners also agreed to set aside three percent of the federal check for administrative and legal costs.

Approximately 1,200 Captiva property owners are expected to share in the distribution.

Ironically, as the commissioners voted to close the financial chapter on the 1989-90 beach renourishment, the first round of the new debate over the next, and perhaps more expensive beach restoration for Captiva in 1995-96 opened.

As the commissioners engaged in their first discussion on how to apportion a new special assessment to pay for rebuilding Captiva's eroding beaches, they received a warning shot from a representative of the several thousand interval ownership residents of South Seas Plantation.

Michael Hoyman told the Commissioners that the interval owners would oppose the special assessment formula used in the previous beach renourishment project.

"The perception is that most of the owners from the Northeast and Midwest believe you stuck it to us," Hoyman commented.

Costs of the next Captiva project may run as high as \$13.4 million if the beach renourishment on Captiva is combined with projects at Redfish Pass north of Captiva and Blind Pass, which separates Captiva and Sanibel.

On Wednesday night the commissioners voted unanimously to order construction of the total erosion prevention project at \$13.4 million, but indicated this was the highest figure for the project, and could be scaled back to the Captiva project alone if federal, state and county funding problems developed.

The commissioners also instructed its planning director, Bill Stronge, to proceed with an economic analysis of the proposed program, including a determination of benefits to Captiva residents to determine a plan for apportioning the special assessment.

Stronge told the commissioners that the last special assessment apportionment was based on benefits derived by residents for increased storm damage protection and recreational advantages.

Stronge said he believes the new special assessment should include additional benefits to residents due to increased protection for the hurricane evacuation route and beautification of the island.

Stronge said the 1989-90 beach widening on

Captiva had increased property values on Captiva a total of \$60 million, a 20.6 percent hike. Only a \$14 million increase had been forecast before the beach improvement, Stronge added.

Stronge said he believes that the higher property values have resulted, in part, from the approval by 87 percent of the property owners and the continued maintenance of the project.

Stronge suggested in his comments that the increased benefits were so pervasive that an ad valorem, or over-all tax, could be assessed to replace the special assessment.

Stronge ran into hard opposition at this point from CEPD Board President Stephen Cutler who commented that the beach renourishment project had been stalled before over opposition to an ad valorem tax.

Stronge argued that the majority of funding for the future project, expected to start either next year or in 1996, will come from special assessments.

Stronge also told the commissioners that a beach survey of tourists indicated that assessments could be spread more evenly to include owners of single family homes because tourists are staying in single family homes as well as condos, motels and interval properties.

To ascertain the public's view on financing the next erosion prevention project on Captiva, expected to start either next year or 1996, the commissioners will mail a public opinion poll in July; schedule a public hearing later in the year, and a ballot referendum next Nov. 8.

The commissioners also scheduled a special meeting at 6 p.m. on June 22 in the Captiva Civic Center to consider the special assessment issue.

Alison Hagerup, administrator for the CEPD, also advised the commissioners that a special meeting

Temporary sandbags approved for Gulf Pines beach

As an emergency measure to prevent more erosion at Gulf Pines, the Sanibel Planning Commission approved placing temporary sandbag structures on the beach Tuesday, May 21.

At past hearings, several parties objected to the temporary permit, which would be issued for one year, until the applicants could plan for a long term solution to the problem. Henry Glissman, president of the Gulf Pines Property Owners Association, objected to the proposal because he was worried about the impact of cutting into the escarpment with a trench to create a return wall. He was worried that it could damage Sanibel's fresh water supply with contact from the ocean waters.

Planning Director Bruce Rogers said the city's engineering consultant assured the sandbags would not adversely affect Sanibel's fresh water system.

Other residents felt that the sandbag structure could cause damage to other property on the shore by causing erosion in other places adjacent to the area. Timothy and Linda Koelz, who own a lot in the area withdrew their application for sand bags when they discovered that localized scouring could occur at the point of the return wall, which their attorney, Steve Hartsell said was not consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Despite others' concerns, Edward Gale, Elizabeth Funston and Helen and Irwin Chernin submitted applications for construction of the sandbag structure in an attempt to keep the shore from continuing to creep inward toward their homes.

The commission voted 5-1, with Commissioner Louise Johnson dissenting, to allow the residents to sand bag the area.

"I am sympathetic to home owners, but I firmly believe the beach is a very dynamic and changing

structure. The island is changing. I can understand it's an emergency effort but I can't support it," Johnson said.

At Tuesday's meeting, Andre Perron, attorney for the applicants, told the commission his clients would be willing to pay to remove the structure after a year, and to repair the beach, should any scouring occur. Cost of replacing the sand may be up to \$12,000, with a possible 1,000 cubic yards needing to be added to the beach. Rogers said the city will monitor the beach, and when and if sand is needed, will instruct the applicants to replace it. The localized scouring will not affect homes far down the beach, Rogers said, but he wanted to make sure it was clear that erosion could take place in the immediate area.

Perron said he would apply immediately for a permit to replace the sand on the beach and return to the commission.

with Sanibel officials, including City Manager Gary Price, is scheduled for June 20, 21, at the Sanibel City Council chamber to discuss the lingering dispute over the Blind Pass Inlet Management Plan.

The project has been stalled due to concerns by Sanibel, but the Captiva commissioners voted 4-1 on Wednesday night to pay engineering work already performed on the disputed project.

Tom Campbell, engineer for the CEPD, reported on the results of his latest beach erosion survey on Captiva

and Sanibel.

In the past six months, Captiva beaches have lost an average of 1.8 feet, a "very moderate" figure, according to Campbell.

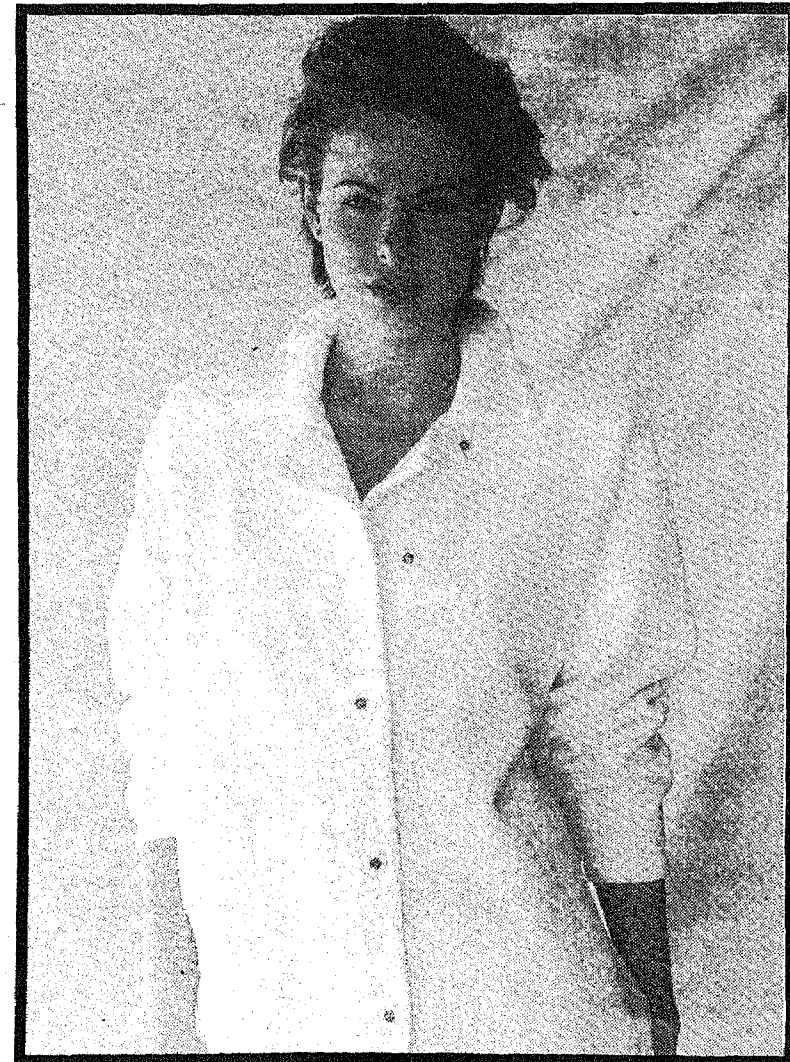
During the same period, northern Sanibel beaches have eroded by an average of 7.2 feet, and actually show a build up in some areas. Campbell said the 7.2 figure was only about half the normal loss on these beaches for the same period.

The over-all survey figures are much more grim. Campbell reported that in the five year period since April of 1989 to April, 1994, the northern Sanibel

beaches have lost an average of 90.8 feet, and Captiva has lost an average 11.2 feet.

This five year period coincides with construction of the 300-foot jetty (groin) north of Blind Pass at Turner

Beach which Sanibel officials contend has caused record high beach erosion on northern Sanibel. The groin was part of the 1989-90 Captiva beach renourishment project designed to retain sand on Captiva beaches.



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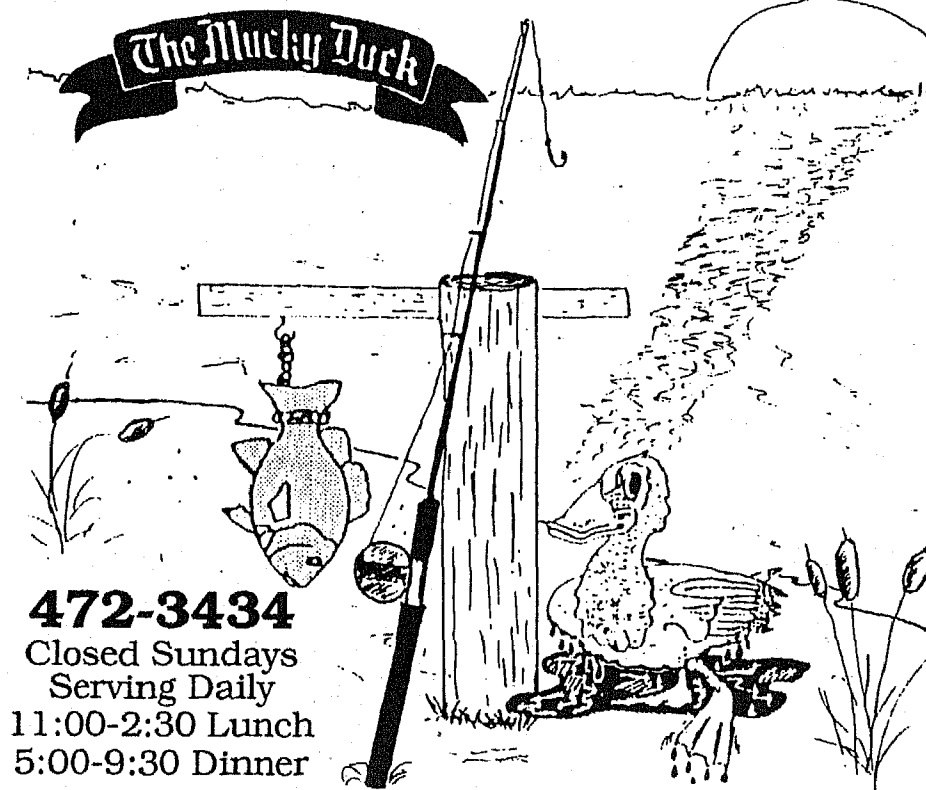
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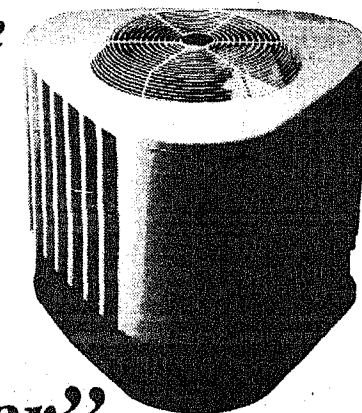
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


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County Commission OKs Andy Rosse Park on Captiva

The Lee County commissioners reconfirmed the public beach access at the end of Andy Rosse Lane as a county park in a 4 to 1 vote at their meeting Wednesday.

The vote, from which commissioner Ray Judah dissented, will allow the county to place a banner designating the beach as a park without any public parking.

The beach access has always been considered a county park, but there has never been anything marking it off as one.

The county was considering making improvements at the beach access, including the allotment of a few public parking spaces. However, they decided to simply leave the beach access as is.

Judah dissented from the ruling, citing "disparate" treatment of the Captiva access from other county park accesses in Lee County.

Judah suggested that the county commissioners approve an option that

included the placement of three parking spaces at the beach access as a way to show that the county had done everything it can do to assure public access.

Jim Yeager, county attorney, agreed with Judah's logic and suggested that the commissioners go for the option that included three parking spaces to leave the county in better standing in case litigation should arise.

Commissioner John Manning led the effort to approve the option that did not include parking, saying that about 50 percent of the beach accesses in Lee County do not offer parking.

However, Yeager said that the beach accesses that do not offer parking are different from the Andy Rosse access. He said that those beach accesses are not as wide as the Andy Rosse access, which is located adjacent to the Mucky Duck's parking lot.

"If we are going to go ahead and proceed and enforce this as a park, our best position for argument purposes would be that three parking spaces are better than none," said Yeager.

Judah brought up the fact that reconfirming the Andy Rosse access as a county park would prohibit commercial activity on the beach.

"We can't deny the relationship between the beach banner and prohibiting the encroachment of commercial activities," said Judah in reference to the jet ski rental business located at the beach access.

Judah suggested striking a balance between the interests of a large number

of Captiva citizens who have expressed their desire for the prohibition of the jet ski business and the interest of the commercial operator.

He suggested that the balance could be reached by giving in to the county's desire to place the parking places at the access.

However, the other four county commissioner present did not see the need for parking.

won an award from the Dunbar American Legion Post 192, honoring students who must overcome difficult obstacles to achieve goals in school.

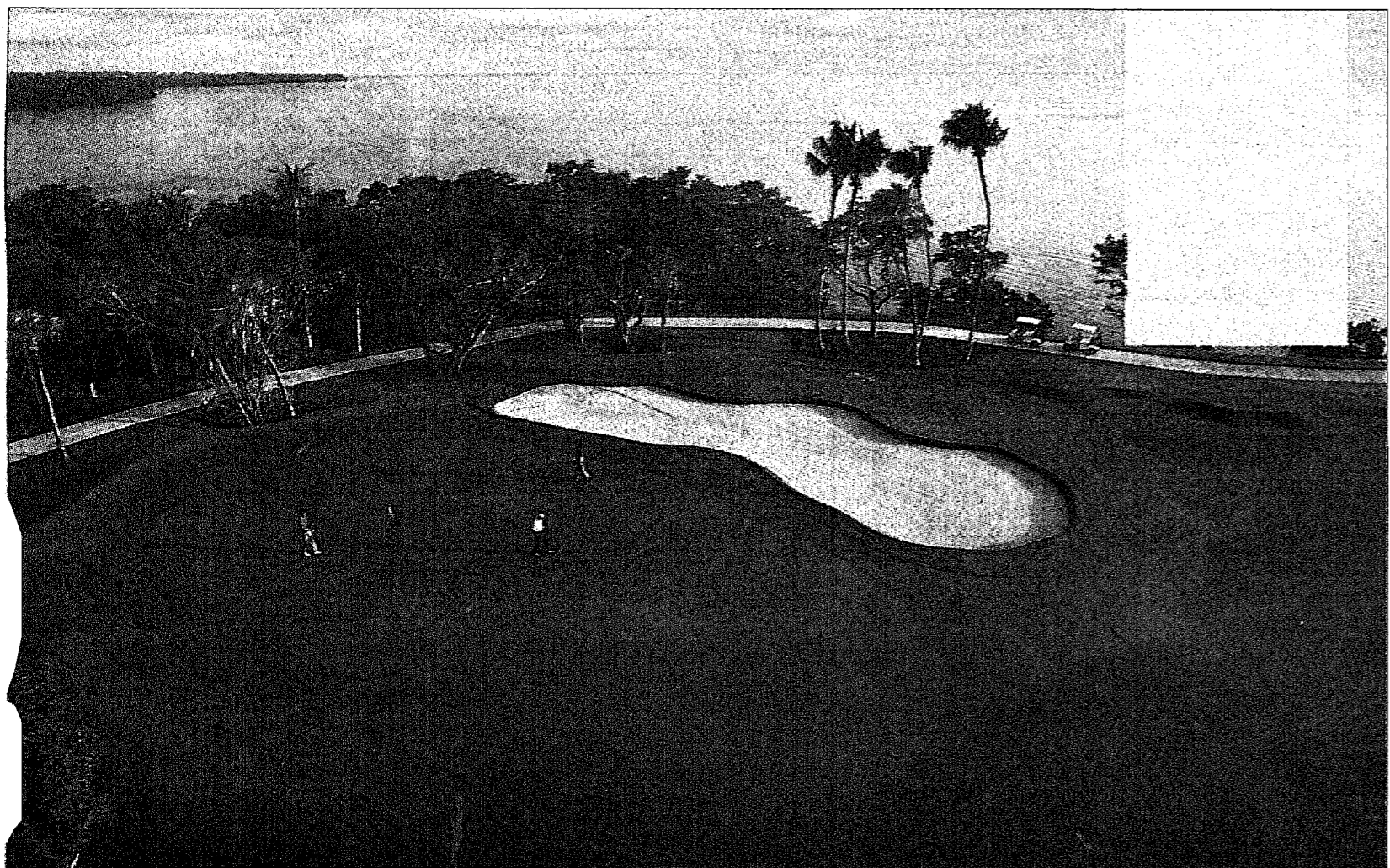

Next year, the 13-year-old will attend Cypress Lake Middle School where she looks forward to being a member of the swim team and joining the chorus.



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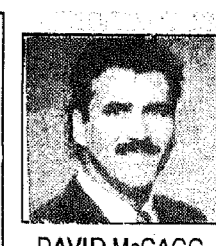
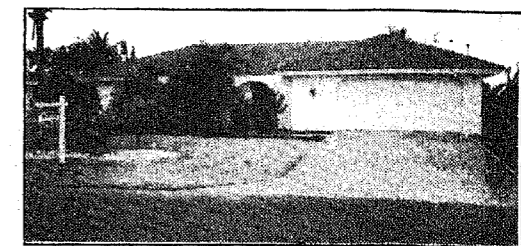
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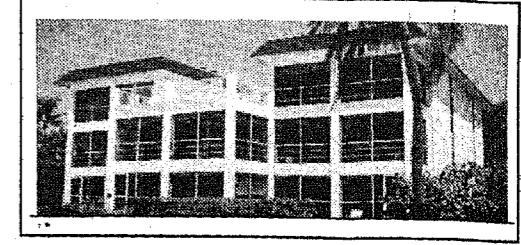
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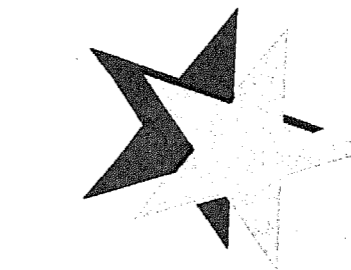
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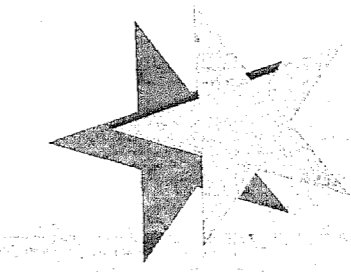


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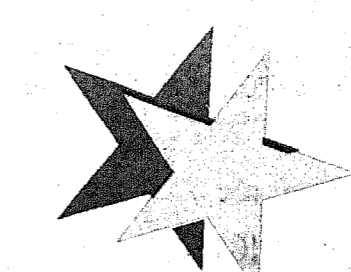
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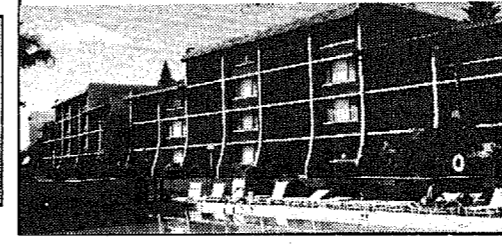
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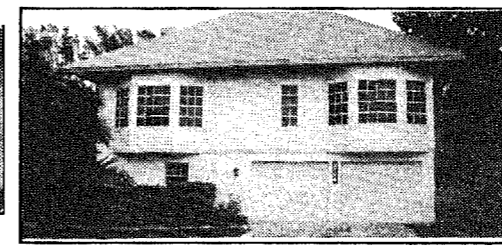
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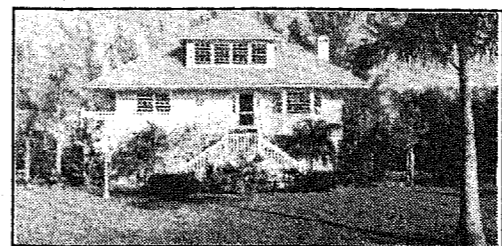

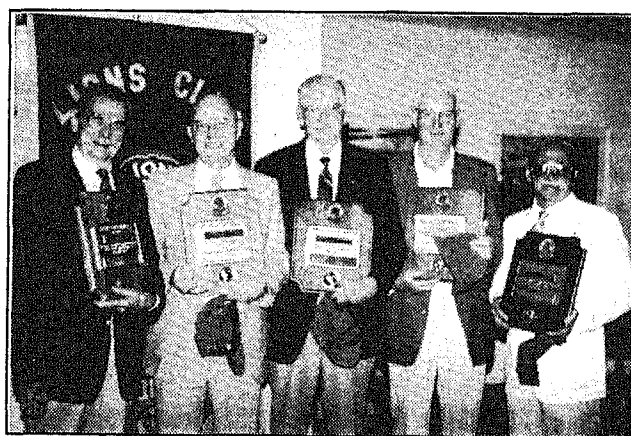
Five Lions named Melvin Jones Fellows

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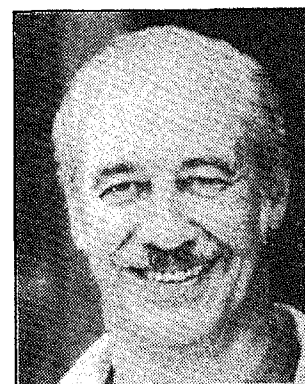

in the Congregational Church of Chagrin Falls and the Youth Fellowship.

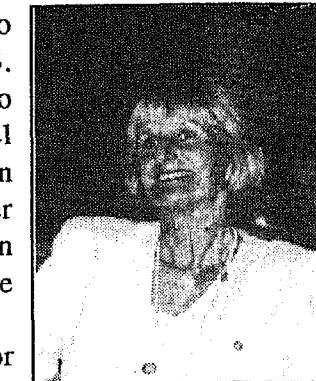
The Irvins have also spent their summers in Pointe au Baril where his family has owned an island since 1903.

'Bullshot Crummond'— Good acting, corny play

The problem for novice actors in community theatrical productions is that there are so few opportunities to act, one doesn't have the luxury of considering whether it is a piece he really likes. He's so glad to get a part, there's only the slightest twinge of foreboding.

Thus, a collection of good actors in a silly play, "Bullshot Crummond," now running at the Old Schoolhouse Theater.

It does, however, have some very funny moments amid the corn.

Erin Keene and Steve Hooper are perfect as Lenya and Otto Von Bruno, a dastardly duo. They play off each other masterfully, listening and responding. Several of Hooper's comedic conventions are absolutely hilarious, and most of the couple's slapstick comes off OK. Keene manages to be seductive and evil at once, and is an even match for Hooper, who plays a strong character.

Kevin Pottorf does an excellent job of his character, Hugh "Bullshot" Crummond, an over-confident, discoverer of the obvious, the detective makes his way through numerous pitfalls and

dangers during the criminal chase.

What would be considered the ingenue part was played just a little too self-consciously by Vicky Vaughn Bailey. Bailey is such a cutie and definitely has the stuff—if she had been less restrained the character could have been more humorous.

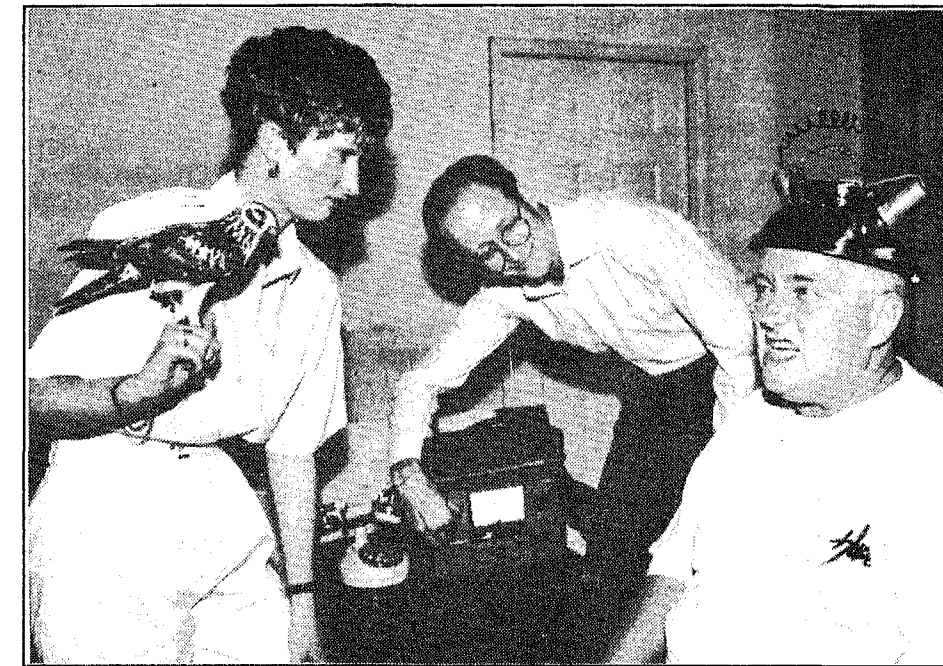
Bert Michaels is hugely hilarious most of the time. In the seven roles he plays, he manages to build a modicum of differentiation between them, but the really funny part is just seeing his huge girth appear as yet another character.

Fun stuff from the production staff included great music between sets. The actual changing of sets in transformation from field, drawing room, tea room, and dungeon is fascinating to watch and done entertainingly.

The sets are great—each one held the most minimal furniture or prop necessary to create the mood.

Special effects of the dastardly duo's "aeroplane" flight, crash, and subsequent parachuting scene is worth the price of admission. Good work, June and Jack Koc.

But the play itself just feels like one of those beery, silly, satires that sophomore collegians whip up and perform,

Birds nesting again by Sanibel River at Donax

In a little enclave backing on the Sanibel River off Donax Road, where Lloyd and Bernice Ravenscraft moved 18 years ago, nesting birds have returned and their human neighbors are rejoicing.

For years the area, dense with trees and bordering the river behind their house, was a natural rookery for all species of island birds. The wildlife show was something the Ravenscrafts and their neighbors loved to watch. During the five months of the year the birds were involved in rearing their offspring, many evenings were spent watching a natural zoology workshop.

Then last year, exactly at the time egrets, white, blue, and tri-color herons, and anhingas came to their favorite mating spot, a loud wood-chipping project was set up near the river and the birds were frightened away.

Neighbor Betsy Webber remembered, "There was a gorgeous snowy egret who had nested and laid three eggs. She flew away and left the eggs. She never came back."

This year, however, the birds did come back, and now there are between 20 and 30 nests in the area. Wednesday Ravenscraft counted about 200 birds before stopping. The sight in the evening, when adult

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Centerpiece of historic village has history of its own

The 1913 Clarence Rutland house that has served the islands as historical museum for nearly a decade has a history of its own. The house now serves as a centerpiece of the Sanibel Historical Village which boasts a total of four restored vintage buildings offering a glimpse of the past to residents and visitors.

The square hard pine house with its trademark peaked tin roof and beaded pine interior served Rutland and his wife Ruth Wiles well. Built for Sanibel's hot and humid summer weather, the rooms are 12 by 12 by 12 foot cubes, all on one floor and with a surprisingly wide and roomy center hallway.

Rutland bought the home in 1928 and subsequently replaced worn cypress shingles with the less expensive tin roofing. He installed his own wiring system when electricity came to the island in the early 40s and when the original old style cut nails rusted out he renailed the entire house. Wavy window panes attest to the age of some of the glass.

Until it was moved to its present site on Dunlop Road in late 1982 and the house stood on Periwinkle Way between Huxter's Market and She Sells Sea Shells. On land homesteaded around 1885 by Pastor Andrew Wiren. The homestead was 160 acres that extended along Periwinkle and down to San Carlos Bay.

When Wiren died in 1890 he was buried on the property and shortly thereafter his widow returned to Maine with their children. Gradually she sold

off parts of the homestead, the final parcel which included their home to W. D. Swint in 1913.

Clarence Rutland lived in the Wiren house as a child when his family first came to Sanibel in 1895. When Clarence's father, Othman Rutland, died a year later at age 37 he was buried beside Wiren. Although the original wooden grave markers were lost, today a fieldstone monument commemorates the two men.

Some time later, Mrs. Rutland married Henry Shanahan, the lighthouse keeper, and mover her family from the Wiren property.

When Swint, who was a farmer, bought his portion of the homestead in 1913 it consisted of 60 acres of land and the Wiren home. Swint contracted with Dan Waldron for \$800 to build the house that is now the historical museum.

When Rutland bought the acreage with the two houses from Swint's widow in 1928 the price was \$1800 which he borrowed from Frank Bailey, founder of Bailey's store and father of Francis and Sam Bailey who operate that business today. Clarence's monthly payments were \$14.55, an amount he admitted he sometimes had trouble meeting.

Two versions exist as to the fate of the Wiren house: one that it was destroyed by a hurricane, the other that Rutland dismantled it. Both versions agree that material salvaged from it went into building a garage.

Rutland lived to age 91 and in his later years was offered as much as

\$200,000 for his home and remaining property. He refused and said, "Where am I going to go if I sell it? I expect to live the rest of my life in this house."

The structure was designated one of Sanibel's historic sites in 1978 while Rutland still occupied it.

After his death January 17, 1982 (Ruth died in 1958) the house with 5.66 acres was offered for sale at \$250,000. The city of Sanibel had right of first refusal to preserve the historic site, but eventually Jerry and Dick Muench became the owners and gave the house to the city with the condition that it be moved.

Two locations were considered: the new city hall property on Dunlop Road, and the Algiers, property where Gulfside Park is now located. The

Algiers site was rejected as prone to flooding.

The move was accomplished, the old house set up on fresh pillars and readied to begin its new career as the Island Historical Museum. Last November, the 1927 Bailey store opened in the "backyard" of Rutland's former home, followed by the tiny Reed post office a few months later. Miss Charlotta's tea room is dressed and awaiting its formal debut. These three have been relocated from the bay side of the island.

The name of the complex at 950 Dunlop has been changed to Sanibel Historic Village and Museum. It is open Wednesday through Saturday each week from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

June 23 slated for Sanibel-Captiva butterfly count

June 23 has been slated for the 1994 Sanibel-Captiva butterfly count. It is part of a nation-wide population sampling held by the North American Butterfly Association (NABA) Xerces Fourth of July Count.

This year's count will be the second for the area and the 20th annual count for the NABA-XERCES Association. In 1993, 211 were held around the nation, up 12 percent from the 189 counts in 1992. Since 1990, the program has grown by 70 percent.

The purpose of the count is two-fold. First, annual counts of butterfly or any other animal population serve to audit changing environmental conditions in the area being examined. Dwindling populations point to environmental problems. Secondly, the counts are designed to be educational. Both adults and children are invited to participate.

Three such counts took place in Peninsula Florida during 1993, one at Sanibel-Captiva, one at Christmas and one at Homestead. Twenty two butterfly and skipper species were collected during the 1993 Sanibel-Captiva count. This represents approximately a third of the species that have been recorded here in previous records.

One interesting form of butterfly watching was

recognized by the NABA-Xerces count in 1993, that of garden watching. In the subsequent report, garden watchers reported the highest number of a species seen at any one time for each species observed. Depending on participation in this year's count, garden watching may be part of the 1994 activity.

It was pointed out in 1993, however, that an imminent threat to habitats here is due to mosquito spraying and land development. Pesticides used by homeowners also may seriously affect visitations by butterflies and other beneficial insects. Thus gardeners that plant butterfly attracting plants and then use pesticides are defeating the purpose of the attraction procedure.

Butterfly count coordinator, Dr. Henry Hermann, is a recently retired entomologist from the University of Georgia and a resident of Sanibel. He is also president of Hallmark Recycling, a company that supplies homeowners and businesses with products and assistance for composting and other forms of recycling.

Thus he is a proponent of organic gardening and insect control without the use of pesticides.

Last year's count also included butterfly experts, Jane Ruffin, who has presented several butterfly gardening workshops at the conservation foundation and world renowned lepidopterist, Dr. Gary N. Ross, President of the Louisiana Audubon Society, and author of numerous publications on butterflies around the world and a recent book on butterfly gardening.

Participants in the count are requested to meet at the Conservation Foundation at 8 a.m. on the morning of the count. Anyone wishing to add their name to the list of participants are requested to call the foundation prior to the count's date. Participants should have their own net. Also, a field guide to the butterflies would help participants recognize the species sighted, although other participants are sure to have one on hand.

birds come home from hunting to feed their young is breathtaking.

"Since we moved here the wildlife has increased in our area. We think it's because we haven't too much space left." Most recently the wilderness area along the Sanibel River from Donax to Casa Ybel Road was cleaned out to add nine more holes to the Feachview golf course.

"That's a big adjustment the birds have to make in finding another secure place for nesting," said Ravenscraft. "It takes a while for them to feel safe when we walk out of the house, that we're not going to interfere with them in any way."

Bobcats, raccoons, alligators, and an occasional rabbit are also visitors to the neighborhood.

"We just had a big cat in here the other night who walked around looking things over for about 20 minutes. We just sat and watched him and every once in a while he'd look up and watch us," Ravenscraft said.

Ravenscraft spoke wistfully of the years when the river was also full of alligators. They were never considered a problem. The only time they came up out of the

river was to sunbathe on the bank. "If they came too close, I'd give them a shot with the water hose. They don't like water in their eyes. After a couple of hoseings, they wouldn't come near," he said.

"During mating season I would have about 10 alligators back here. The male would gather a bunch of females and they would swim around and around him. The females would lay their heads on the back of the male. It was something to see—very sentimental," said Ravenscraft.

Betsy Webber described the current bird scenario. "First, they come in and mate and start building their nests. There can be four or five nests on one limb sticking way out over the water, out of raccoon reach. Then they lay the eggs and hatch them. After that, the adults take off every day to hunt for food, and come back at night to feed the young ones. They force it down their throat at first. Then

as the babies grow a little, the adult encourages them to hop, by standing off on the limb a way so the baby has to come after the food."

As the young mature, farther and farther out on the limb the parent birds entice them with food. Finally, it is the big hop across the river.

That is their first solo flight. "One baby made it across the river and then wouldn't fly back, for days the adult scolded that little one to go back across but it wouldn't. Finally, it was gone,"

Webber said. These are the dramatic wildlife events their human neighbors want protected. "Just don't destroy any more of this area," said Ravenscraft.

"The city is trying to do as much as it can by designating areas all over the island as wildlife sanctuary areas. We hope that will be the case with this spot."

Still, Ravenscraft said there is some talk about dredging the river, mak-

ing it deeper to accommodate sudden flooding, and cleaning out the Brazilian Pepper trees which form about one-third of the nesting sites. That would mean dislocation of the wildlife once again.

"The area keeps shrinking and shrinking for the wildlife," worries Ravenscraft. "We talk about being environmentally conscientious on the island, but it is with tongue in cheek. When it comes down to the animals or us, which is it going to be?"

Ravenscraft believes finding ways for wildlife and humans to cohabitate an area is a global problem that needs to be solved. But here on Sanibel, it comes down to the importance of just a few hundred feet of the Sanibel River. "Just leave it wild," said Ravenscraft.

The area described is private property and accessible only to residents, human and wild.

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
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
