

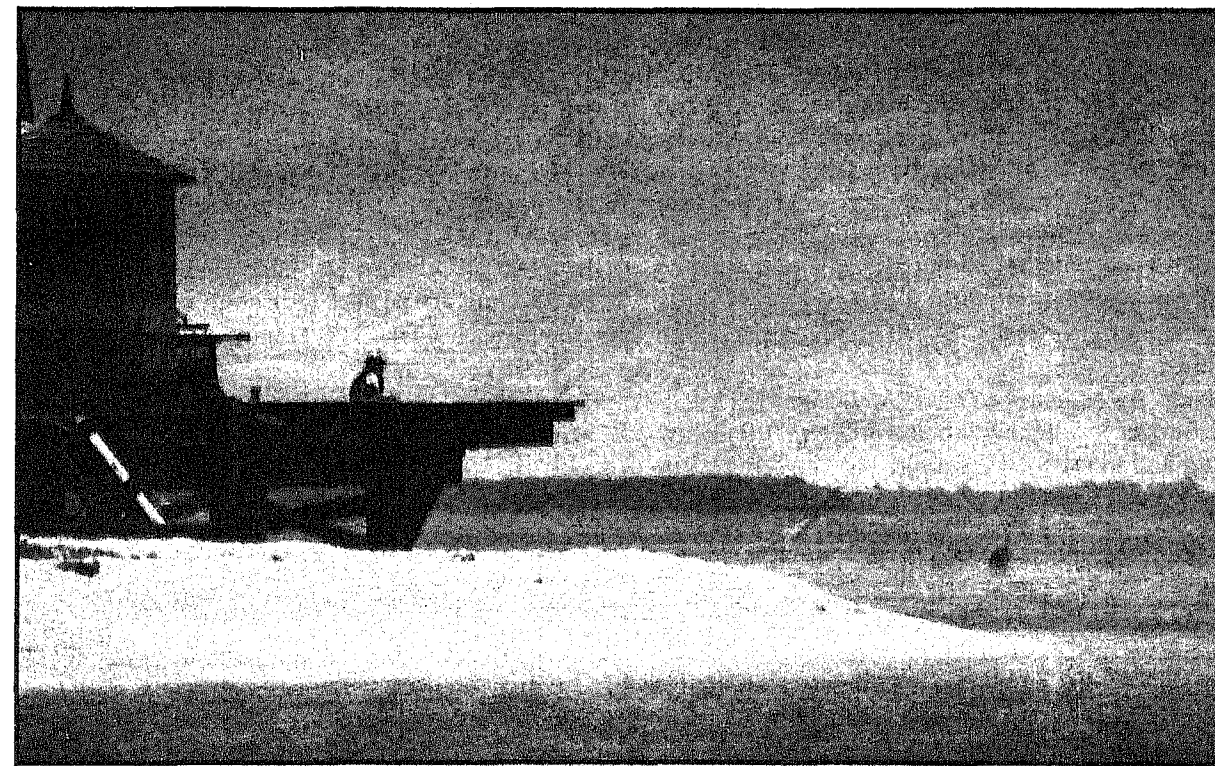

City Council to discuss 1995 budget

*Saturday meeting first
of two budget hearings*

The Sanibel City Council will meet tomorrow to discuss the proposed budget for the 1995 fiscal year.

The proposed budget totals \$15,797,429 which is an 8.1 percent decrease from the 1994 net budget. However, it is a 7.8 percent increase from the 1994 budget approved by City Council in September 1993.

Last year, the City Council approved a \$14,654,805 budget for fiscal year 1994. The net budget for the year, however was \$17,188,900, or 7.8 percent higher than the budget passed. This increase was due to unanticipated revenues from various sources, according to the Budget Message prepared

CEPD approves tentative \$533,050 budget

The Captiva Erosion Prevention District (CEPD) board of commissioners agreed to a tentative budget for 1995, elected a new vice chairman and moved ahead with plans for the next beach maintenance project at a 4-hour meeting Wednesday night.

Aside from the regular monthly meeting, the first hour of the meeting served as a tentative budget hearing. The commissioners accepted a tentative amount of general fund expenditures of \$533,050, up from \$321,040 in 1994. Total revenue is proposed to be \$407,622, after \$371,378 is transferred for capital projects.

The breakdown of the general fund reflects an increase in payroll from \$63,024 in 1994 to \$68,500 for 1995. Payroll covers the administrator's salary of \$43,872 as well as an assistant's salary of \$10,000 in the proposed budget.

Total office administration costs were set at \$64,226 for 1995, up from \$58,707 in 1994. Administrative consulting costs were set at \$120,266, up from \$108,355 for 1994.

Beach monitoring costs of \$100,000 were the only expenditures from the general fund that the commissioners questioned. Commissioner Doris Bowen initiated a discussion that led to a proposal to try and lower the cost by

the final budget hearing.

Tom Campbell, district engineer, advised the board that the current beach monitoring timetable could be reworked because of the degree of stability evidenced since the 1988-89 beach restoration project. He suggested that parts of the beach may only need to be monitored once a year instead of the current rate of twice a year.

Administrator Alison Hagerup agreed to work on lowering beach

monitoring costs prior to the final budget hearing.

Total expenditures on capital projects for 1995 were accepted at \$371,378, up from \$262,7906 in 1994. The breakdown of costs reflects total beach maintenance expenditures of \$211,378, up from \$117,500 in 1994. Much of the increased spending relates to the legal, engineering and financial costs necessary to move ahead with the

115 Australian pines to be axed

In what some environmentally conscious residents of Sanibel might call political suicide, the City Council voted unanimously to chop down 115 Australian Pine trees.

City Council determined that 35 trees may block emergency evacuation routes during hurricane warnings.

"If any of these trees were to be knocked down by a storm, there would be no way to leave the

island," said Natural Resources Director Robert Loflin.

Others expressed similar concerns.

"God love the pine trees, but we're doomed if a storm like Hugo or Andrew rips through here," said Sgt. Jack Primm, director of the Sanibel Emergency Management Program.

The first 18 trees are located on the east and west side of Causeway Road—near the Chamber of Commerce and the

boat ramp. The remaining trees that are a threat to evacuation routes are on the northwest corner Causeway Road and Periwinkle Way and East Gulf Drive west of Lindgren Boulevard.

The greatest portion of tree removal will be on West Gulf Drive between the two entrances of Daniel Drive, the northwest corner of West Gulf Drive and West Rocks Drive, and the north side of East Periwinkle.

Hurricane construction codes to change

The Sanibel Building Department completed a study of the Hurricane Resistant Construction Code and presented City Council its recommendations for revisions Tuesday.

Builders and residents voiced their displeasure with the current standard requiring 130 mph wind resistant windows and doors.

"While it is possible to attain 130 mph windows and doors, the size and selection would be such as to substantially alter the appearance and livability of any home built to such standards," said George Shaffer, production manager for Frey and Son Homes. "Homes on Sanibel would begin to look more like pill boxes, a substantial detriment to someone wanting to take advantage of the beautiful wildlife views."

A fellow builder agreed and intro-

duced the issue of cost as well.

"In our opinion the 130 mph code would increase the cost of the average house somewhere between 5 and 20 percent," James M. Peters who owns his own construction company.

In light of the builders' comments, Building Official Max Anderson recommended that the policy should change to 120 mph and give the residents an option to put up extra reinforcements, such as shutters. Council agreed and that the shutters must meet the 120 mph wind velocity.

Due to the destruction caused by hurricanes Andrew and Hugo, the construction industry has been faced with adopting new construction codes for installing windows, doors, skylights and garage doors.

The city of Sanibel has been a leader in requiring construction that is resistant to winds as high as 130

Five-year budget projections presented to Council

The city's General Fund is projected to increase steadily from 1996-1998, according to

a five-year budget projection.

Finance Director Renee Lynch came before the Sanibel City Council Tuesday to offer

a projection of the city's budget from 1995 to 1999.

"This is not necessarily a plan, but only an outline of sorts. It shows

what we've got now and where we might be five years from now," Lynch said.

The five-year budget projections report

includes three years of historical data, five fiscal years of budget projections, as well as the budget, estimated revenues and expenses of the current fiscal year.

The General Fund, an operational fund which provides basic government services, is the focal point of the document.

Not all city funds are reflected in the report since most of the city's special revenue funds and enterprise funds are self-supporting and do not affect the ad valorem tax rate, Lynch said.

Looking ahead to 1995, the the rolled-back millage rate reduces the General Fund 8.13 percent under 1994's budget.

In 1996 an additional \$188,650 will be needed for the projected General

Fund, which is projected to be 1.16 percent greater than in 1995.

In 1997 the General Fund is projected to increase an additional 4.58 percent. Another 5.2 percent increase is predicted in 1998. However, in 1999, a 2.11 percent decrease should occur, according to the report.

Lynch told Council members that the five-year budget projections is just an outline and that nothing here is set in stone.

She added that to provide a detailed, accurate report, it must be maintained an analyzed regularly. To do this, Lynch said, would take additional staff in the Finance Department. Council members made no decision Tuesday on whether to continue updating the report.

by City Manager Gary Price and Finance Director Renee Lynch.

To achieve the same \$17 million figure this year, a millage rate of 2.1738 mills is required. One mill is equal to one dollar of taxation for every \$1,000 of assessed property value. The 2.1738 figure is known as the rolled back rate, which specifies the taxation rate needed to achieve last year's total budget using this year's higher property value assessments.

One tree will be removed from the Lighthouse beach parking lot to promote dune plant growth.

Bids were received Aug. 21 for the removal of the trees and of the three bids Arbor Tree and Landscape submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$30,000.

Funding for the removal of the 30 West Gulf Drive trees and the one Lighthouse beach parking lot tree is drawn from the Public Works Street Budget. The removal of the 49 trees on East Periwinkle will come from the Periwinkle Way Road and Bike path Improvements Fund. The Causeway Road and East Gulf Drive tree removal will be funded by the Natural Resources Management budget.

The project will be completed by Sept. 16.

proposed 1996 beach maintenance project.

The tentative budget allots \$90,000 for the Blind Pass Inlet project, which is down from \$2,485,406 in 1994. However, the budget also provides for a \$90,000 county grant for the Blind Pass project. An additional \$70,000 in costs are provided for the Redfish Pass project, up from \$25,000 in 1994. The increase reflects a \$35,000 permitting cost.

While reviewing the budget, Hagerup told the commissioners that she had received verbal assurance from the county that about \$200,000 would be forth-

coming for the next beach maintenance project.

"The county basically says the check is in the mail," she said. The \$200,000 is comparable to the county's contribution to the last beach restoration project. It basically reflects the benefits the county will derive—in terms of storm protection and recreational benefits—from the next beach build up. The next project is slated for 1996 at the cost of about \$7 million.

After accepting the proposed budget, the commissioners moved into their regular monthly meeting. Hagerup advised the board that since former vice chairman of the board Sheila Hoen resigned in July, the board needed a new vice chairman.

Hoen was replaced by Dave Jensen, who was appointed to the CEPD by the governor a couple weeks ago.

The commissioners voted 4 to 1 that Doris Bowen become vice chairman. Bowen cast the dissenting vote. The commissioners also voted to have Bowen serve on the county's Beach Management Task Force. She agreed that she was the only commissioner with enough time to take on the extra role.

The commissioners also voted unanimously to move ahead with the plans for the next beach maintenance project. They were required to confirm the resolution that established the project following the public hearing that was held at the August meeting.

The commissioners also authorized a money market account at NationsBank where the \$1.8 million federal reimbursement check has been deposited.

Commissioner Nolan Murrah voiced his concerns that a check of that size should automatically demand discussion prior to the selection of a depositor. However, he moved to authorize the account at NationsBank. Hagerup assured the board that the account was receiving a good interest rate.

Hagerup also reported on the efforts to secure funding from the county, state and federal levels for the 1996 project. Initial steps have been taken at the federal level and the state level. She reported that County Commissioner John Manning has indicated that the county would pass a motion supporting the project.

The commissioners voiced their concerns that the county express its support of the project prior to the November referendum that will authorize the millage

rate for the 1996 project.

District economist William Stronge passed around a resolution that he drafted at Manning's request that outlines the history of county's assistance in the first beach restoration project. The CEPD commissioners agreed that Hagerup should forward the resolution to the county.

While the CEPD did finally receive federal reimbursement of \$1.8 million a couple weeks ago, the distribution of the reimbursement poses some problems that may hold up the mailing of checks for a week or two. Because of the intricacies in researching who paid for the 1988-89 project and their current whereabouts, Nancy Stroud, CEPD attorney, advised that letters regarding the reimbursement will go out next week.

Hagerup had hoped letters would be going out by the end of last week. Property owners who contributed to the 1988-89 project are due to get back about 23 percent of what they paid. The CEPD will be sending out letters with county tax documents that have to be signed and notarized before anyone will receive his check.

The commissioners agreed to give people until Jan. 31, 1995 to return their notarized forms to receive their checks. Commissioner Jensen questioned why a deadline was being imposed.

CEPD attorney Stroud said the district didn't want to complicate matters by allowing the federal reimbursement process to be dragged out over time.

The CEPD waited for almost eight years for the federal reimbursement to become a reality after it was promised. Given the recent arrival of the large sum of money, Stephen Cutler, chairman of the board, raised discussion concerning a celebration of the arrival of the check.

While Cutler was eager to bring the community together to enliven spirits concerning the CEPD's success in getting federal funds, the rest of the board did not show interest in having a party.

Cutler, smiling bright, said he wanted to go on the record in favor of a celebration.

The other commissioners, as well as Hagerup, expressed hesitation to spend money on a party and feared that no one would come.

Mobile irrigation service tells you how to water your lawn

The Mobile Irrigation Laboratory (MIL) is armored to save water and reduce irrigation costs at homes and businesses in Lee County.

MIL is a free service provided to evaluate systems of homes, residential developments, parks, recreational areas, government facilities and schools. The laboratory evaluates the irrigation system and water supply and makes recommendations for improved irrigation efficiency.

Ismael Reyes, MIL Director, said the laboratory is not in direct response to any water shortage recorded by Lee County or the result of a "dry" summer.

"Recently everyone is concerned about the water supply but part of the problem is that water is wasted in their own lawns," Reyes said.

The laboratory is sponsored throughout the year by the Lee County Regional Water Supply Authority, Lee Soil and Water Conservation District, and the USDA Soil Conservation Service.

Reyes and an assistant operate by appointment only and bring the labo-

ratory equipped with probes, meters and chemicals to the system's location.

The laboratory does not evaluate sprinklers attached to hoses. The service is strictly for those who have a sprinkler system. Reyes said the whole process takes approximately 2 1/2 hours and does not require the presence of the home or business owner.

The MIL tests the irrigation system's efficiency through a multi-step process. Reyes first checks the entire irrigation system for malfunctions such as broken sprinkler heads or ruptured pipes. He then will operate the system to measure how evenly water is distributed across the lawn. A lawn with a distribution uniformity of 70 percent or less is considered poor. Results are graphically represented to illustrate problem areas. Reyes said lawns in the area are typically below the desired distribution uniformity.

"So far we have seen most lawns in need of improved efficiency because they either have too much in an area or not enough," he said.



Lee County Regional Water Supply Authority's Mobile Irrigation Laboratory will come to your home free of charge and examine your sprinkler system.

"Most lawns are 70 percent or lower."

Reyes said there has been a good response to the sparse service they have performed so far.

"We've had several calls from people who have complimented the service but the problem is that not many people know about it," he said.

Reyes offers follow up visits to determine the resulting water savings from any modifications made to the system.

"Remember that the service is free and we can tell you of any improvements made as many times as necessary," he said.

In addition to the efficiency of the system, Reyes includes in his report recommended grass types for the particular lawn along with

helpful tips to keep the existing grass type healthy.

Grass height, how to recycle grass clippings, proper fertilization and various cues to look for provided by the lawn itself, according to Reyes, are included.

"The report will list treatments which cater to

the specific grass type," he said.

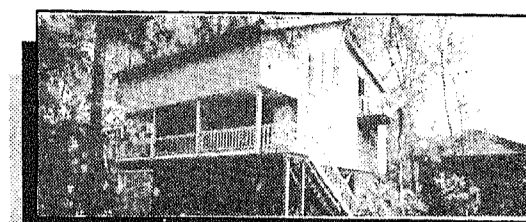

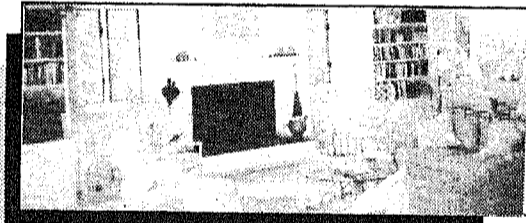

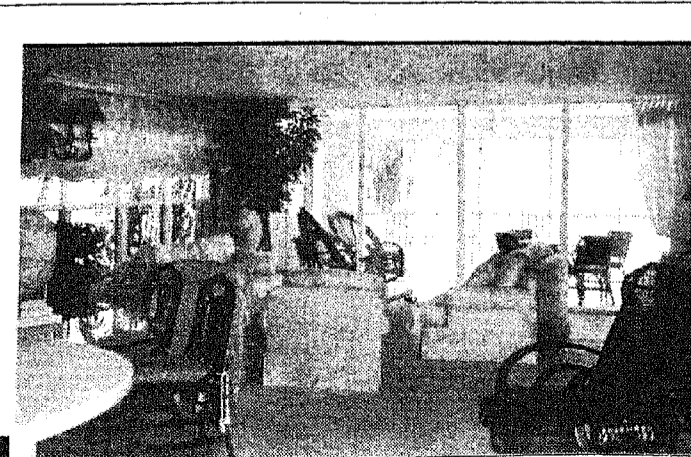

SCCF supports net ban

To the editor:

In 1976, concerned about widespread overfishing along the coast, Congress passed the Magnuson Fishery Conservation and Management Act, and called upon the states to regulate the number and type of fish caught in offshore waters.

But the states were slow to respond. Until Congress intervened in the early 80s, striped bass had all but disappeared from Chesapeake Bay. Today the bass are back, although catches are still strictly regulated by the federal government.

In Florida, the Marine Fisheries Commission (MFC) is charged with managing the state's commercial and sports fisheries. But regulations to protect the resource proposed by the MFC have been regularly rejected by the governor and cabinet, responding to pressure from commercial fishermen. To date, the legislature has stubbornly refused to act.

The only course now available to protect Florida's rapidly diminishing fish stocks is a constitutional amendment that would ban the use of gill nets and other entanglement nets, and nets larger than 500 square feet in mesh area, in nearshore and inshore Florida waters. The Florida Supreme Court has approved the wording of the amendment and Florida voters will be asked for their support on the November ballot.

Conceding that the problem is related, in part, to pollution, dredging and uncontrolled coastal development, the Florida Audubon Society and other environmental organizations in the state have, nevertheless, endorsed the ban.

Voters in Texas and Louisiana approved a similar net ban six years ago. California followed suit in 1992. Their fisheries have already begun to recover.

While it depletes the fact it has become necessary to bypass elected state officials to protect Florida's priceless resources, the Board of Trustees of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation supports the net ban amendment and urges residents to approve it on Nov. 6.

CEPD apportionment based on conventional economic analysis

To the editor:

In recent letters to the press and Captiva islanders, Jack Zwick has called for a better way to share the cost of the proposed 1995-96 beach maintenance nourishment. The letters are based on some misconceptions.

I am the economist who presented to the board of commissioners of the Captiva Erosion Prevention District (CEPD) both the cost apportionment plan for the 1988-89 Captiva beach restoration and the cost apportionment plan for the proposed 1996 beach maintenance nourishment.

The CEPD is empowered by law to pay for beach projects out of ad valorem tax revenue, to which property owners contribute proportionate to the taxable value of their properties, or by means of special

assessments, to which property owners contribute on the basis of the benefits their properties receive.

The CEPD has elected to pay for the 1996 beach maintenance nourishment (as it also did for the 1988-89 beach restoration) using special assessments. Taxing properties on the basis of benefits received seemed the fairer way to the CEPD board in both cases and it also seemed fair to an overwhelming majority of voters in the 1987 referendum and an overwhelming majority of property owners in a 1987 opinion poll.

In order to use special assessments, the law requires an economic analysis to determine the benefits received by each affected property and the cost of the project must be apportioned using this economic analysis. A property that receives five percent of the benefits should be assessed five percent of the cost.

Jack Zwick is incorrect when he says that "approximately half the estimated cost is apportioned to those ... with single-family beach homes." Single-family beach homes will pay approximately 25 percent of the cost apportioned against Captiva property owners and, even less, of the total cost of the project because of the anticipated contribution from Lee County. Single-family beach homes south of the Tween Waters Resort will pay approximately 15 percent of the cost apportioned against Captiva property owners.

Jack Zwick is also incorrect when he states that the 1988-89 treated all gulf-front properties alike, assessing all at the same millage rate. The gulf-front properties were, in fact, separated into more or less the same beach "zones" or "reaches" as in the apportionment plan for the proposed 1996 project. Even within the beach zones, the 1988-89 project applied different millage rates depending on the extent to which properties had existing structures designed to prevent storm damage.

The enabling legislation of the CEPD, in fact, calls for dividing the gulf-front into different zones based on degree of benefit. Once a decision is made to use special assessments, properties can only be grouped together with other properties that receive the same degree of benefit.

The economic analysis undertaken for both cost apportionment plans uses the standard, reasonable and objective methodology employed by economists to evaluate the benefits of beach projects. Every beach project that receives federal grants must undertake this methodology to demonstrate that the benefits of the project exceed the costs. The overwhelming majority of beach projects receive federal grants and, indeed, the Captiva project recently received \$1.8 million on the basis of the economic analysis of its benefits. The apportionment plan simply allocates the benefits to individual groups of properties on the island.

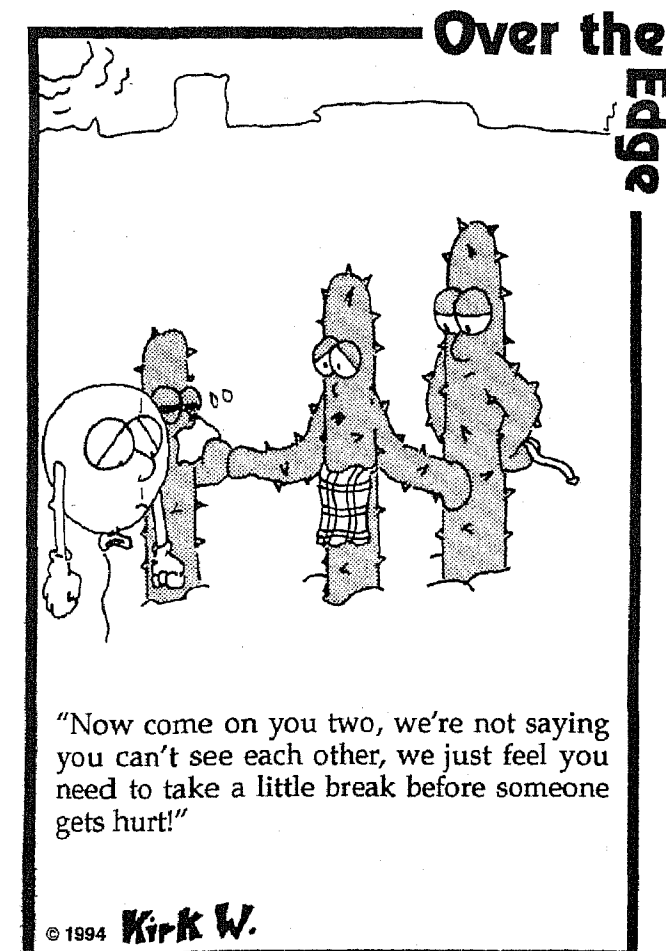
The benefits of the beach project are the prevention of storm damage to gulf-front properties and the recreational experiences of people living or staying in properties throughout the island. The approaches and models used to determine these benefits are the same as those applied by the Army Corps of Engineers to determine the size of the federal grant recently received by the 1988-89 beach restoration. We anticipate receiving an additional Federal grant for the beach maintenance nourishment after the project is completed.

The standard methodology for measuring benefits was applied consistently across all properties.

The results of the economic analysis for the 1996 project showed some differences from the analysis of the 1988-89 project because a maintenance nourishment is different from a beach restoration. But, the guiding principles were exactly the same.

It is not for me to say whether the apportionment plan is fair. That is a decision for Captivians. But, the approach is based on conventional economic analysis, was applied objectively and follows the same principles that were approved overwhelmingly by Captivians in 1987.

Erosion shrinking land and property values

Tuesday, Sanibel City Council members assured residents in the Gulf Pines and Gulf Shores subdivisions that something will be done to halt the eroding beach and put an end to the declining property values.

In recent years property owners in both subdivisions have experienced noticeable erosion that may

soon threaten beachfront homes.

However, Council members offered no specific solution other than to suggest raising funds on the county, state or federal level.

Not all members of the public were pleased with the Council's inability to provide a definite solution.

"You're looking at this the wrong way," said VIP Realtor Dave Schuldenfrei. "The city's livelihood depends on its beaches, if there is no beach, there will be no tourists."

A local expert in geology agreed.

"The erosion is getting to the serious point. If it continues the erosion will breach a beach ridge and cause serious damage to the interior wetlands by allowing saltwater to filter in and destroy it, and thus makes the Tarpon Bay weir useless," said Dr. Chet Smith. "There is nothing to stop this erosion, Gulf Shores/Gulf Pines are in a sand starved condition."

On one hand, the erosion experienced at Gulf Pines and Gulf Shores could lead to an environmental disaster. On the other, the property owners could experience a financial disaster. Already, property owners have experienced a decrease in property value due to erosion, according to Natural Resources Director Rob Loflin.

To determine the assessed property value trends in Gulf Pines and Gulf Shores, the subdivisions were compared with homes on West Gulf Drive that were not experiencing beach erosion. Loflin indicated that the erosion began to seriously impact Gulf Pines and Gulf Shores in the late 1980s and that property values were decreasing while the homes on West Gulf Drive continued their trend of increasing in value.

Council member Mark Westall told homeowners in the two subdivisions that the City Council is taking action on the issue and it will not be ignored.

SCCF to update Sanibel Report

The Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation has announced plans for a two-day conference Nov. 3 and 4 to review and update "The Sanibel Report," a unique document that greatly influenced the city's CLUP, the comprehensive land use plan.

Many of those who helped prepare the original report nearly 20 years ago will gather with other environmental authorities at "Workshop 20-20," a conference held in conjunction with Sanibel's 20th anniversary. Its primary purpose is to provide environmental groundwork for the next 20 years.

Attendees will review the report, now out of print, and will prepare addenda for each of its five key sections. The report and addenda will be reprinted prior to a review next year of the city's land use plan, required every six years by the state.

The author of the Sanibel Report, Dr. John Clark, a senior ecologist with the World Wildlife Fund, will be among the participants. Other consultants and technical personnel who contributed to the original report will also be on hand.

The city has earmarked \$10,000 to help finance the workshop. Other funding is being arranged by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation.

There will be five "focus groups." Meeting on Thursday, Nov. 3, each will concentrate on one of the report's five major sections—uplands, wetlands, mangroves, beaches and water/hydrology. Each group will include original participants, city representatives and assorted authorities.

An all-day community workshop is scheduled for Friday Nov. 4 at the Sanibel Community Center. All city residents will be invited to participate. There will be reports from each focus group, community input, questions and answers, and a slide presentation by Dr. John Clark.

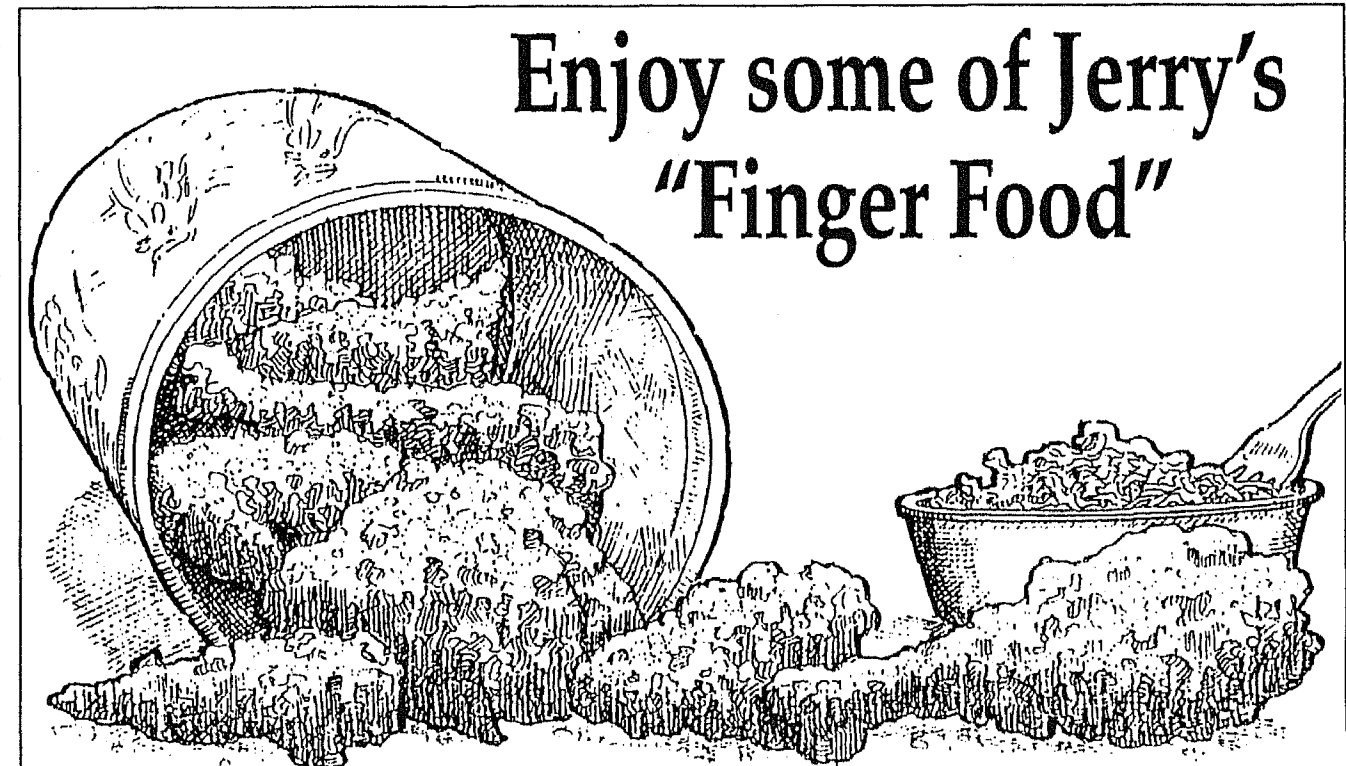

Two skippers guide Gilligan's to Sanibel

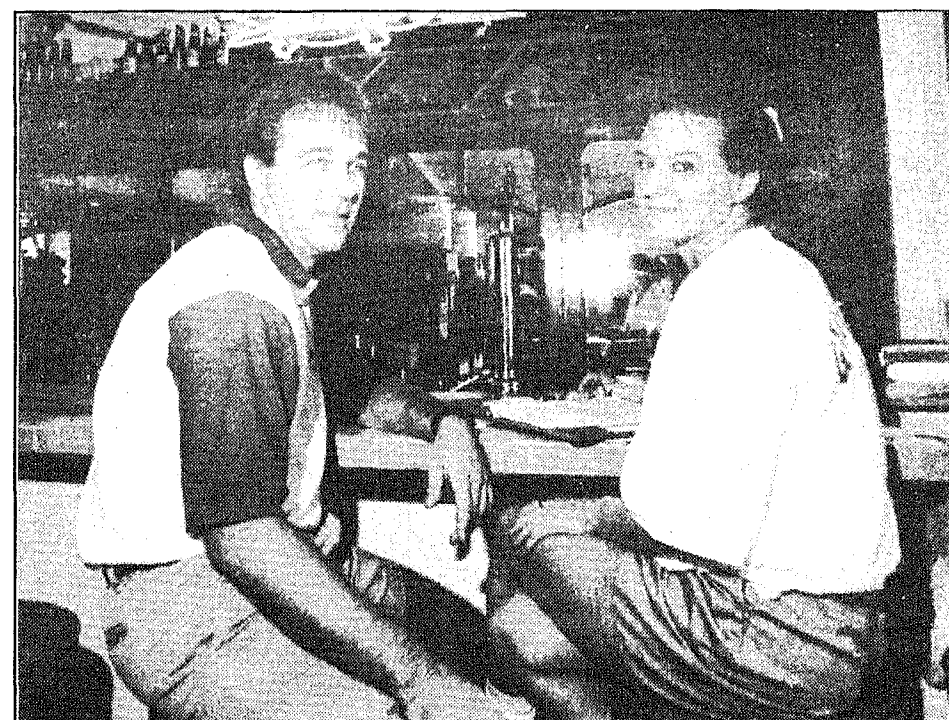

Council members approved a request to re-install two directional signs on city property to the Sanctuary under the condition that they are only temporary and will be removed after a year.

The City Council originally approved the signs in 1991 for building the Sanctuary.

Her interest in birding began when she was a young child. When only 10 years old, she wrote an article on birds for the New Haven Register, and her passion never diminished. Years of extensive birding took her to many of the conterminous United States as well as on a memorable trip to Trinidad and Costa Rica. She was also interested in butterflies and moths, loved classical music, would smack the hand of anyone touching her Sunday New York Times crossword puzzle before she'd had it, and had read most of the mysteries on the Sanibel Library shelves.

There are no surviving family members, but her memory will be especially dear to Blair Nikula, her "adopted" son of Chatham, Mass.; to Bernice Fowler of Troy, N.Y.; to Suzanne and Carl Goodrich of Eastham, Mass.; to Anne Bellow of Fort Myers and Sanibel; and to many other friends, too numerous to list by name, that she made in her long productive life.



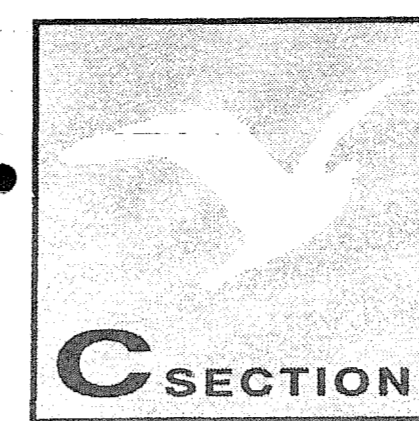

Off Beach Players' 'Dial "M" for Murder' lives up to its promise

The Off Beach Players, a community theater group performing at the Old Schoolhouse Theater, promised in their promotions a production that would really put wind in the audience. They came through in "Dial 'M' for Murder."

Director Evelyn Mercado, who last appeared acting in the thriller "Wait Until Dark," is finely honing her skills in the murder mystery genre as both actress and director. "Mysteries work well in this little theater because it becomes so ominous when it's dark. I like the intensity of working on a murder mystery," Mercado said.

When the audience knows who-dunnit and actually witnesses the deadly struggle, it takes a good play and good actors to keep suspense high to the end of the play. In fact, the audience was so involved in Saturday evening's performance, that they kept whispering and calling out warnings and clues to the actors. Now, that's audience involvement.

'Right Bed, Wrong Husband': Right theater, wrong play

To begin with it is a poorly written play. The language does not work, the lines are not funny. The dramatic theme of mistaken identities is older than Shakespeare and best done by him. "Right Bed, Wrong Husband" is a worn-out cliché.

This is the story of a poor little rich boy, who lives on Sanibel Island, and tells his uncle who controls his estate that he is married—thereby getting an increase in his allowance. The uncle comes for a visit and bedlam ensues.

This is a review one hates to write of the Broadway Palm Dinner Theatre in Fort Myers, whose productions have been top-notch for a year. But, to use some clichés, as the playwright might have been wont to do if writing this review: "Better luck next time," "You can't win them all," "Try, try again..."

Maybe it can be fixed and the opening night performance will be just a bad memory.

Always looking for a way to give a performance a positive face, it is easy to resort to calling it

"entertaining" if nothing else. But judging by opinions heard in the audience and the very weak laughter that rippled around the room occasionally, this play even failed the pure entertainment test.

Liz Abbott's performance as Evelyn Stevens, the stand-in wife, stood out as the only good bit of acting. A farce needs a straight character to bounce off of, but

even Abbott couldn't carry the play alone.

In reading the career biographies of the performers, a clue to part of the performance problems began to emerge. They are singers first, actors only in the same sense that operatic stars are actors. They tend to call off lines rather than act.

Summer jazz ends with Jack Lewis Jazztet

Lazy Sunday afternoons were perked up this summer with a series of great jazz concerts at BIG Arts. Put together by John Friedman, the hours between 4 and 6 p.m. on a jazz Sunday were sometimes the liveliest activity of the week.

Sept. 4, in the Phillips Gallery, brought together a foursome who succeeded in replacing the afternoon siesta with some energizing music. There were a number of musicians in the audience so the old favorites played by the "Jazztet" brought out the urge to play along, and as usual fingers, hands, shoulders, gluteals, legs, feet, and toes got a good workout.

Jack Lewis, who brought the jazztet together, is a drummer who uses every bit of surface to tap out his rhythm. Snare, kettle, bass, gourds, both ends of the sticks, rims, cymbals—everything within reach got a touch, a whisk, or a hammer.

"Satin Doll" and "A-Train" were Duke Ellington tunes that started out the concert with a double purpose. A tape of Ellington introducing Jack Lewis was like a spooky voice from beyond.

John Lamb, terrific bassist brought down from St. Petersburg by Lewis, was also an Ellington alumnus. Asked how he came to play the bass viol, he said he originally started playing music on the tuba. It was the only instrument left in the school band that hadn't been taken so he picked it up and started blowing.

"I fell in love with the bass notes," Lamb chuckled. "And I loved the marches. I'd follow a band anywhere."

Later, he transferred his love of bass notes to the bass viol. He studied music seriously at a couple of conservatories and went on to make his living by it. "I loved the life," he said. "I got to travel everywhere—and to go first class."

Lamb surprised the audience with an interesting arrangement of "Battle Hymn of the Republic" which brought a warm round of applause and cheers.

Ray Olsen on guitar made such an impression on the audience, they insisted he come out from behind the Vibraphone where he was hidden during the first half of the concert. Featured in three romantic songs "Meditation," "Body & Soul," and "Nuache," Olsen wooed the audience with his mellow guitar.

Olsen said he was a self-taught musician, cannot read music and hasn't taken lessons. "I picked up a guitar when I was 12 and started imitating all the cartoon music I heard on TV," he said. His mother and father were good singers though not professional, and the house was always full of music. Married with three children, Olsen lives on Marco Island and plays in the area whenever he gets the chance.

In another surprise for the audience, and the performer, Lewis called pianist Jose Morocco out of the audience to play a great rendition of Scott Joplin ragtime on the Bluthner grand piano recently donated to BIG Arts by Dana Brantley, a long-time former resident of Sanibel. The Bluthner was made in Leipzig, Germany where it is considered national treasure.

A medley of Ellington, "I Got It Bad," "Solitude," and "Mood Indigo," featuring "Sir John" Jeffrey on vibes rounded out the concert.

Jeffrey, in fact, did a great job throughout the afternoon of keeping the concert moving with his energy, style, and sense of humor.

Asked whether he had been knighted, Jeffrey admitted it was a nickname from childhood that just stuck. "My folks were from England, so the other kids used to call me Sir," he explained. Jeffrey started his musical career on drums and other percussion before he began to study the Vibraphone.

"Playing in nightclubs doesn't help your health much," he said. "You have to be a really strong person to be breathing in that smoke every night of your life." His son, also a musician, opted for a career in computers rather than music after watching his dad and satisfies his musical urges by playing with a church group in Chicago.

The next jazz at BIG Arts comes during the Thanksgiving holiday, but the really big Sanibel jazz weekend, Jazz on the Green comes to the Dunes again Oct. 8 and 9.

"He's such a good actor, though," Mercado said. "I wanted to wait for him to be available."

Then two weeks before opening, Todd Keene was drafted to play the lead and did an incredible job of learning all those lines.

"This is his biggest role," Mercado said, "and he's doing a great job. I call him my wonderboy."

Lynn Schneider, playing Margot Wendice the hapless wife of a tennis pro, gave a stiff, nervous performance for her debut with the Off Beach Players.

Mitch Haley as Max Halliday, Margot's former lover, gave a thumbs-up interpretation of the sensitive, endearing man who looks out for Margot's well-being. A writer of murder mysteries, he sets up some of the audience's expectations right in the beginning by explaining there are only five reasons why someone would commit murder: jealousy, fear, revenge, money, or to protect someone you love.

Tony Wendice is played as a sly, high-class sleaze by Todd Keene who uses his body and face as clues to underlying emotions which motivate Tony's behavior. The audience loves to hate him.

Vince Kelly has spread around word that he is

actively working on promoting his acting career. Judging by his performance as Captain Lesgate, Kelly has tempered his former tendency to over-project, into a controlled and excellent rendering of a shady character.

Inspector Hubbard, played by Don Williams, brings the audience almost to frustration before he finally gets all the evidence he needs to solve the mystery. He does a good job of plodding along, sustaining the suspense until the very last moments.

All of the action takes place on one set, and it is a beautiful creation of a comfortable London flat with enough interesting focal points to add dimension to the play.
