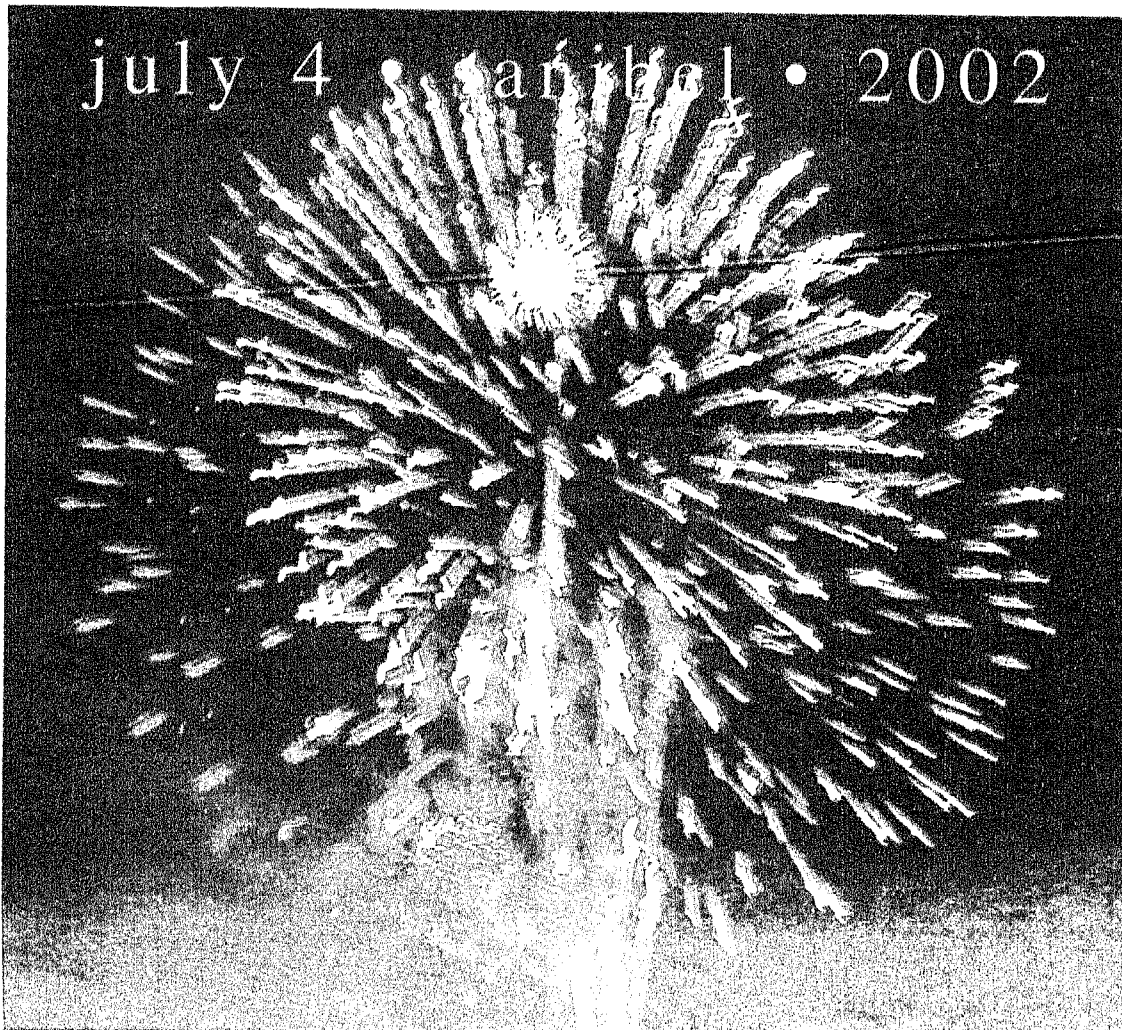

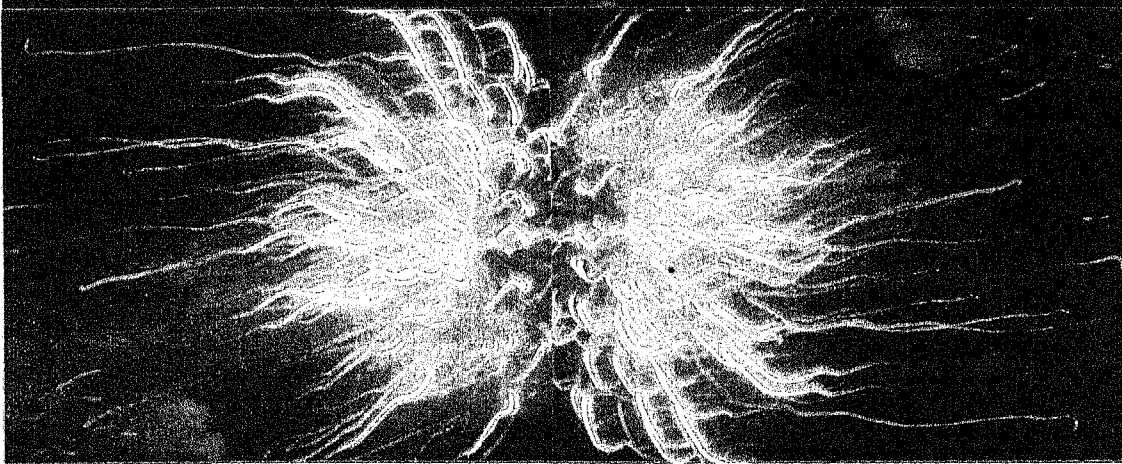

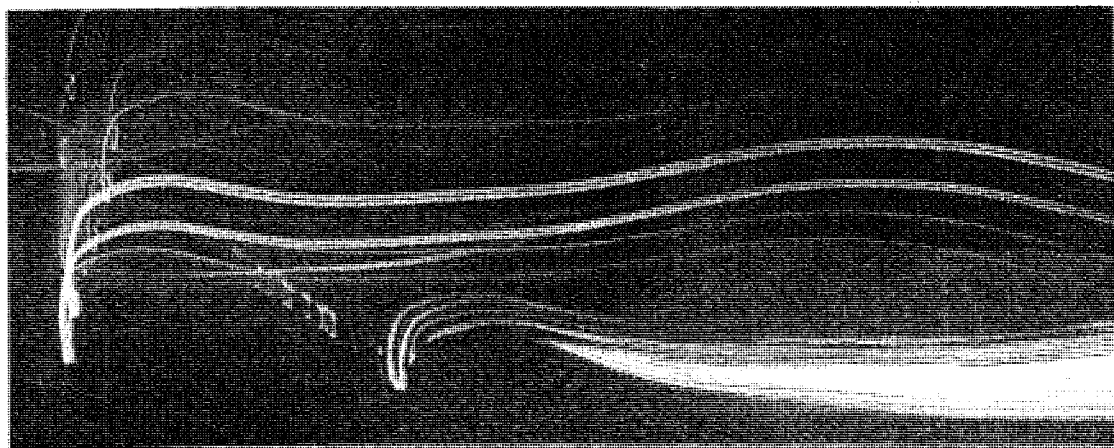

Major fee increases proposed

Stuff may cost more in the near future as City Council is considering increasing its fees for just about everything in an effort to ease the burden on the general fund.

The council, at its July 2 meeting, had the first reading of four ordinances — 41 pages of legislation — raising more than 200 different fees. The changes are based on a recent user-fee study conducted by Tindale-Oliver and Associates, Inc.

The city is moving faster than the

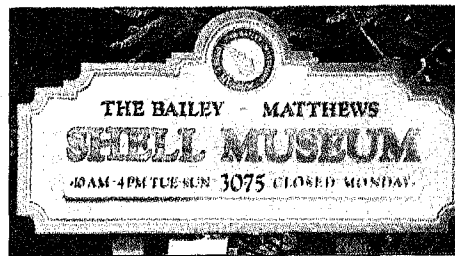

State grants funding

Shell Museum, SCCF pocket \$35,000-plus each

The Florida Division of Cultural Affairs recently announced the list of general program grant recipients, which includes two prominent island organizations. The Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation and the Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum received \$35,215 and \$34,189, respectively. While the grants represent a relatively small percentage of total operating expenses for both organizations, they were nevertheless welcomed by all.

"It will go toward environmental education and habitat management," said Erik Lindblad, SCCF executive director, about planned use of the monies. The SCCF needs about \$1 million annually and relies on state and federal grants as well as private donations to meet their budget. "It's very helpful," Lindblad said. "We survive on adding all those things

up."

This is the fifth year that the SCCF has been awarded this grant, which includes another \$35,215 for next year as well. Lindblad added that this grant is currently the only state monies received for this fiscal year.

Debbie Frederick, BMSM business manager, said this is the fourth year in a row that they have been awarded this grant and that funds will go toward general operating expenses.

BMSM's first such grant came when the museum was under construction and, like SCCF, it also will receive the same amount next year.

Frederick added that the grant provides less than 10 percent of the museums operating budget, with the rest coming from private foundations and individual donations.

Other Lee County grant recipients included Florida Gulf Coast University's CORE, Cape Coral Children's Science Center, Abuse Counseling and Treatment, Florida Repertory Theatre, Alliance for the Arts, Southwest Florida Symphony Orchestra and Chorus Association, and Pineland for 'Music on Pine Island.'

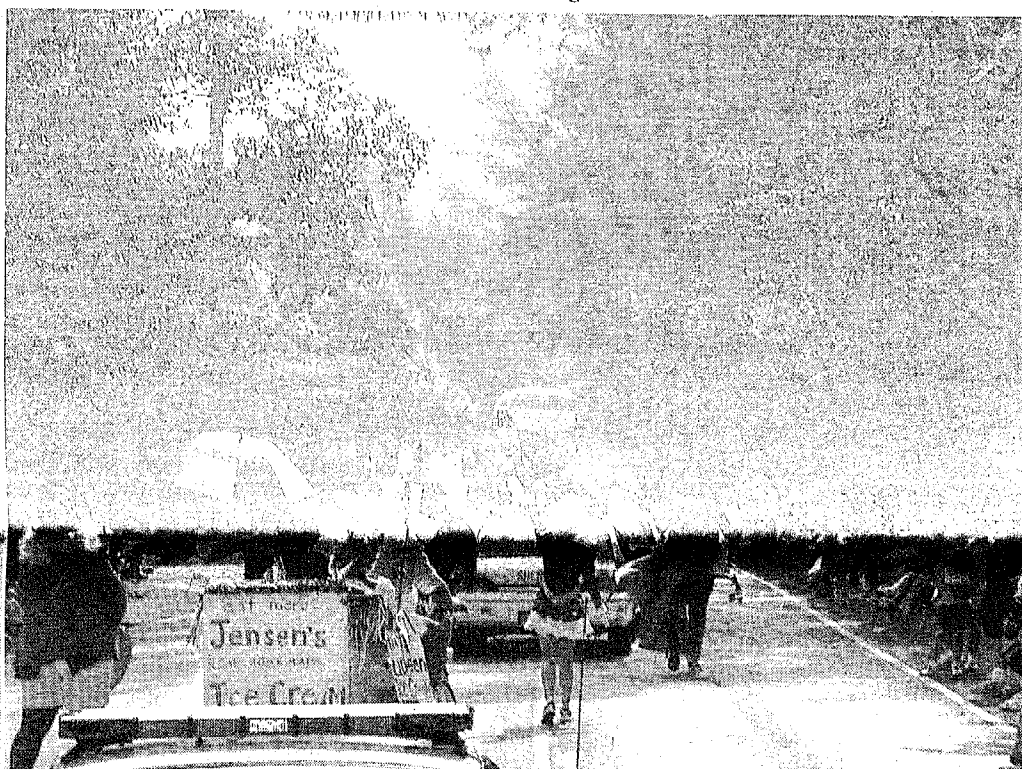

If the matter would go to trial and a jury set a price at or lower than the offer, the owner would be responsible for their own attorneys' fees and expert witnesses rather than the city.

"It's a mechanism to force them to think about settling," said Ken Jones, the city's outside counsel.

The eight lots were appraised by the city at \$160,000 and by Nevid Holdings for purposes of mediation at \$320,000.

City Council also approved settlements of \$9,500 for a pair of lots owned by Gerald and Nancy Austin and \$16,400 for two lots owned by Juan Fernandez Caballero.

While the offers are \$500 and \$4,700

higher than the city's previous offers of judgement, "I think it's well spent, in the long run it will save money," Jones said. The Fernandez Caballero settlement figure includes attorney's fees, expert witnesses fees and court costs.

Going to trial could cost tens of thousands of dollars more in new appraisals, expert witnesses, attorneys' fees and court costs, Jones said.

The city, in conjunction with the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, is in the process of restoring the subdivision, along with the adjacent Tarpon Bay subdivision to its natural state.

While all of both subdivisions are in the hands of the SCCF or the city, prices for about a dozen properties obtained through eminent domain by the city have yet to be set, Jones said, three or four of which are being contested.

If we continue to operate like the post office we grew up with, the only post offices our children will know will be the ones they'll see in museums. We are at a point in our history when it's time for the next phase in postal evolution. Every American — no matter who, no matter where — has a fundamental right to affordable, accessible mail service." This was a statement made by Postmaster General Jack Potter when he recently unveiled a transformation plan for the U.S. Postal Service. He further commented, "We are proud of the Postal Service's 225-year tradition of serving America. If transforma-

tion is not accomplished now, the universal mail service we rely on could be in jeopardy."

In April 2001, the General Accounting Office said that the Postal Service could be in danger financially unless something was done. The 1970 Postal Reorganization Act changed the Post Office Department to the current Postal Service. For the past 32 years, the legislation passed in 1970 has served the nation well. However, the 32-year-old law no longer gives the Service the ability to meet increased expenses for safety, maintenance, expansion, and modernization. Legislation is needed to address the next 30

years.

The Postal Service responded to the GAO's challenge with a plan that would create a new business model called a Commercial Government Enterprise (CGE). Its implementation will require legislative changes from Congress. A CGE is owned by the government but structured and operated in a much more businesslike manner with attributes appropriate to the unique role the Postal Service plays in the nation. The CGE outlines steps the Post Office will take to improve efficiency.

Growing your own pineapples can be fun

Dear Ron: I've recently discovered some "volunteer" pineapples growing on the grounds of my condo complex. My question is: How does one know when a pineapple is ripe to pick? — C. Shellart

Dear C. Shellart: My guess is that the "volunteer" pineapples you've discovered on your condo's grounds had some human help getting started. So before I answer your question about how to determine when the fruit is ripe, I'd like to discuss how any of us here in Southwest Florida can grow our own pineapples. I've done this myself a number of times, and while you shouldn't expect to produce the hefty pineapples grown on Hawaiian plantations, with a little patience you will be rewarded with an edible harvest.

Interestingly, the pineapple (*Ananas comosus*) is a member of the Bromeliaceae family, the most common of which is the Bromeliad — making pineapples sort of South Florida natives-in-law. In fact, while not indigenous to our area, pineapples are native to other parts of subtropical and tropical America.

Many nurseries sell pineapple plants that you can stick in the ground, but it's more fun to start one yourself. The first step: Buy a pineapple at the grocery store. Then cut off the crown about one-half-inch below the leafy stalk. Cut away the excess flesh and you should see tiny root nodes at the bottom of the stalk. Peel away some of the outer leaves of the stalk, then hang it upside down in a dry, cool area for about a week to allow the "scars" to harden and to prevent the starter plant from rotting. Then, simply place the crown on top of the soil, pushing it down slightly to avoid any gaps between plant and earth. The soil should be highly enriched with organic matter, such as peat moss and cow manure, or you can simply dig a small hole and fill it with a commercial planting medium. It's also important that the pineapple is planted in a sunny, well-drained location, because it disdains "wet feet," through which it can easily succumb to fungus.

The next ingredient is patience, because it can take up to two years for the plant to produce a ripe fruit. While you're waiting, fertilize the plant every two or three months — but don't water it more than once a week during the dry season. You also need to remember that the pineapple is very cold-sensitive and needs to be protected during frost and near-frost conditions. And keep an eye open for common garden pests such as mealybugs, mites and scale, all of which can be eradicated with a soapy spray.

You might also want to treat the planting area with a fungicide.

After about a year, or maybe a few months longer, when your plant is about two feet tall, a bud should begin to form in the center of the leaf stalk. A few weeks later, the bud will produce rows of tiny, light-blue flowers. After the flowers have all dried, usually in about two or three months, the immature fruit will emerge in the form of a tiny, bright-red cone, which later will turn green. When the fruit is about six months old, it will start changing color from the base up — from green to white to yellow.

Commercial pineapple growers pick their fruit when the bottom half has turned a golden

color. The pineapple is ripe and edible at that point, though you can delay picking it if you wait until the entire fruit is yellow.

And if you want another pineapple from the same plant, trim off all but one or two of the side shoots that have emerged from the stem. In about a year, you should have a second harvest.

Fish and Wildlife seeks public input

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced today that it is seeking public comment regarding the preparation of a draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) that will evaluate alternatives for structuring and implementing incidental take regulations currently being developed for Florida manatees under the Marine Mammal Protection Act.

The Florida manatee is a federally protected species under both the Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973 and the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) of 1972, as amended. Both the ESA and the MMPA prohibit "take" — causing the death, injury or harassment — of listed species without specific authorization. To date, there is no authorization in the regulations covering the incidental, unintentional death, injury or harassment of manatees caused by otherwise legal activities.

The Service has started the development process for special incidental take regulations, which could ensure that governmental agencies and the public comply with the MMPA by addressing government activities related to watercraft and watercraft access facilities, and their effects on manatees and manatee habitat.

"It is our goal in this process to pull together local, state and federal manatee conservation efforts and improve manatee protection while providing more efficient and predictable regulatory programs for watercraft-related activities," said Sam Hamilton, the Service's Southeast Regional Director. "We are producing an EIS to accompany the proposed regulations but, before we begin writing it, we are seeking public input."

Hamilton said that the Service is looking for input on five specific topics:

- Suggestions regarding the range of alternatives to be considered in the EIS;
- Information on the direct, secondary and cumulative effects of this rule-making on manatees, manatee habitat, and other aspects of the human environment;



• Information regarding the potential social and economic effects of the proposed regulations; information on potential mitigation measures, including technological measures, that would result in the least negative impact on manatees and their habitat; and

• Ways to measure, monitor and report the effects on manatees of incidental takes.

The Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact State (EIS) was published in the Federal Register on June 10. Publication of this Notice is in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and also complies with one of the provisions of the settlement of the lawsuit *Save the Manatee Club et al v. Ballard*.

Snowy Plover nest countdown • Week 18

Mike Brady from "Ding" Darling and Bev Postmus silver-banded an additional seven chicks this past week. At least 24 chicks have been banded: 11 with unique color-coded bands (allowing identification of individual birds without having to recapture them) and at least 13 with silver, numbered U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service bands. SCCF biologist Brad Smith noted that next year there will be "several birds that we can potentially recapture as adults. The more we have banded, the more likely they are to survive and return next year; the data on the recaptured birds is golden."

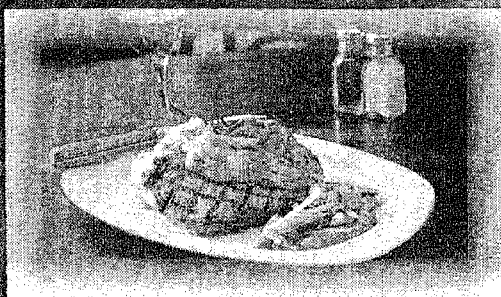
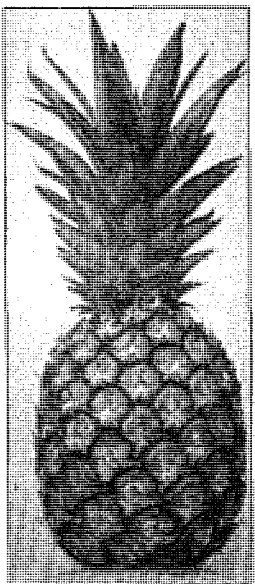
The nest count remains at 27 although there were probably two additional nests that weren't discovered until the chicks hatched.

With fewer than 200 pairs of snowy plovers in the state of Florida, the bird is on the state's endangered list. The SCCF will post and stake off nests and track them throughout the March-to-July nesting season. Snowy plovers nest on the beach just below the grass line. Both the birds and the eggs are so

well camouflaged that if the sand-colored birds are not moving, they are almost impossible to see.

To protect the nests, please observe the following guidelines: 1) Observe the warning signs and stay out of fenced-off areas. 2) Keep your dog on a leash. 3) Minimize your disturbance to shorebirds by walking around them. 4) Keep beach furniture below the lower dune vegetation line at all times. 5) Do not fly kites near a nest; the birds mistake the kite for a big raptor and panic.



More statistical legerdemain from 7

FCAT scores and school grades do not cor

The Florida Department of Education has recently released its 2002 School Grades Report, which is its rating of 2,515 state schools. Commissioner Crist said, "even as we continue to raise the bar, we have consistently seen that schools across the state have met the challenge of higher expectations." Governor Bush ~~seemed happy~~ with the grading system because he feels that "Learning gains are a critical component of the A+ plan (a Bush/Brogan initiative) and are designed to help individual students make progress, whether the student attends a high performing or lower performing school."

The report points out that of the 82 schools that previously received an F, only 10 of them received an F for the second time. "This is evidence that school improvement efforts and accountability are working and will continue to expand to help students still in need," said the report. Lt. Governor Brogan concurred, "Real accountability has proven time and again that parents, students, and teachers will rise to higher standards and expectations if called upon to do so." Jim Horne, Education Secretary agreed with Brogan, "Accountability is a key component of our K-20 reforms, and the history of school grades shows that accountability has brought about progress and improvement." Just about everyone quoted in the

report seemed to be happy with the learning gains that the state's schools had made or were continuing to make.

It must be easy to make bureaucrats and politicians happy.

To the right is a graph that shows the correlation between the combined (reading and math) 2002 Florida Comprehensive Achievement Test (FCAT) student scores and the 2002 Grades for Florida schools. Does anything strike you as odd?

As the legend indicates, the blue bar represents the students' FCAT scores and the cyan bar represents the school grades. Schools are rated A, B, C, D, F, I, and N. For the sake of comparison, I did not use I (incomplete) or N (school graded for the first time). Schools that fell into these categories totaled 5.8% of the state's schools. While FCAT scores aren't letter grades, there are five levels. Level 5 corresponds to A, level 4 to B, and so on. So according to the data provided by the Department of Education while only 5.47% of Florida's students were achieving at level 5 (or A), 34.2% of the state's schools received A's. Conversely, where 29.51% of students were achieving at level 1 or F, only 2.7% of schools received F's. Curious?

How could that be?

The Department of Education uses the following

method to grade schools:

- Schools earn one point for each percent of students who score in achievement levels 3, 4, or 5 in reading and one point for each percent of students who score 3, 4, or 5 in math;

- The writing exam is scored on a scale of 1 to 6. The percent of students scoring 3 and above is averaged with the percent scoring 3.5 and above to yield the percent meeting minimum and higher standards. Schools earn one point for each percent of students on the combined measure;

- Schools earn one point for each percent of students who make learning gains in reading and one point for each percent of students who make learning gains in math. Students can demonstrate learning gains in any one of three ways:

- 1) Improve achievement levels from 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, or 4-5; or
- 2) Maintain within the relatively high levels of 3, 4, or 5; or
- 3) Demonstrate more than one year's growth within achievement levels 1 or 2.

- Special attention is given to the reading gains of students in the lowest 25% in levels 1, 2, or 3 in each school. Schools earn one point for each percent of the lowest performing readers who make learning gains from the previous year. It takes at least 50% to make adequate progress for this group.

'Ding' Darling pays \$91,301 to Lee County

On July 2, Rob Jess, Refuge Manager of the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge presented a check to Lee County in the amount of \$91,302, representing the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's annual revenue sharing payment.

Of this amount \$81,188 is attributed to the J.N. "Ding" Darling Refuge, \$9,953 and \$161 are attributed to Pine Island and Matlacha Pass Refuges respectively.

The payment is for fiscal year 2001 and is authorized by the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act of 1978. Funds credited to the National Wildlife Refuge Fund are derived from income nationally on Service lands such as oil and gas revenues, the sale of timber, gravel, and grazing receipts, among other sources.

The Act authorizes payment to counties in which Service-owned lands are located based on one of several methods of computation — in Lee County's case, three-fourths of one percent of the fair market (appraised) value of the refuge-owned lands located in the county.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has made payments to counties for refuge lands since 1935. In the beginning, counties received 25 percent of net revenues from the sale of various products or privileges from refuge lands located within a specific county.

The result was that in counties where no revenue was generated from refuge lands, those counties received no payment.

The Refuge Revenue Sharing Act was amended in

1964 to also include the fair market value method of computation such as that used for Lee County.

Originally, payments could only be used for roads and schools.

Beginning with fiscal year 1976, there were shortages in the revenue sharing fund and payments to counties had to be reduced accordingly. Partly because of this situation, the Act was amended in 1978 to authorize Congress to make up for the shortfalls and to include all lands administered solely or primarily by the Service (not just refuges) in the calculation of revenue sharing funds. In addition, the 1978 amendment allowed the payments to units of local government to use the payments for any government purpose, not just schools and roads.

Using the state's criteria then, you could have a school where 50% of the students were achieving no higher than level 3 in both reading and math which would earn the school 100 points. If those same students averaged 3.25 on the writing test, that would produce another 50 points. If those same students were also level 3 students the previous year, the school would receive an additional 100 points. If the other 50% of the students were at levels 1 or 2, but showed one-year's improvement, the school would receive another 100 points. That school would now have 350 points, only 30 points less than the number required to qualify for a grade of B, with two more ways of earning those 30 points. So, there could be a school in which there are no level 4 or 5 students, and which has 50% of its student population at levels 1 or 2, and yet receive a grade of B.

There are several other scenarios I could present, but I'll just suggest one more. If there were a school where all students were achieving at level 3 (average) and did so last year, that school would earn 400 points, ten less than the number required for an A, and the school would still have three more categories in which to earn those ten points and yet not have any level 4 or 5 students.

Hmm?

One would have thought that the Department of Education statisticians would have run several *what-if* models to test for correlation, then again maybe they

did. Actually, the correlation between FCAT scores and school grades is quite strong (-.71697, the highest is 1). Unfortunately, it's a negative correlation; with only one exception as one score goes up the other goes down.

The report talked a good deal about accountability, about parental choice, and about the Assistance Plus program, a program designed to help the lowest performing schools. Let's take a quick look at these points.

Just who is accountable? The report never said. Is it the politicians, the Education Departments in the state's universities, the State Department of Education, the district superintendent, the principal, the teachers, the students, the parents? Who? Generally, it is the superintendent who gets fired or the principal who gets reassigned if scores are low. People feel better for having done something, although firing the superintendent usually changes nothing. In fact, it is rare for a superintendent to complete two four-year terms in a row in the same district.

What choices do parents have if they can't afford a private school, can't drive the greater distance that their school of choice might require? What if their school of choice is full?

The report contains a whole page of bulleted items outlining the Assistance Plus program. They catalogued *outreach strategies, summits*, and the financial and human resources available.

Sound like a plan? Not to me it doesn't. It rings of bureaucratic *emptyspeak* that sounds impressive but will do little to change the quality of education in the state.

Let me suggest another, more radical plan: reduce

class size; make teacher education more rigorous, with more subject-matter courses and less methodology courses (especially for middle and high school teachers); let department chairs and teachers choose their books; let teachers teach and let them teach to educate not to a test.

I have sat in literally hundreds of classrooms, observing and evaluating teachers. The good ones all had the same characteristics. They brought enthusiasm to their subject matter, which they knew well. They had high standards, reflected in the books they chose, in the labs they conducted, in the essays they assigned, and in the attention they paid to their students. They participated in science fairs, in music and computer programming and debating competitions, in writing contests. They continuously refined their craft. Never once, however, did I see a successful classroom that was the direct result of some bureaucratic plan. Moreover, the further away from the school that the plan was developed, the less effective it was. Education takes place in the classroom, not in the state capital and certainly not in the State Department of Education. Politicians need to provide teachers with the resources that will allow them to do their jobs. I'm not sure what bureaucrats need to be doing, but it shouldn't be producing *emperor's-new-clothes* statistics.

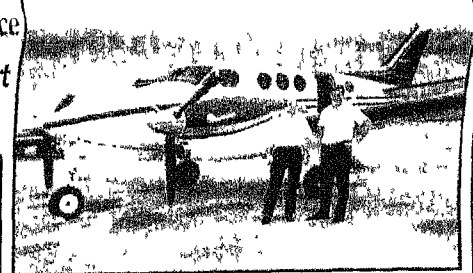
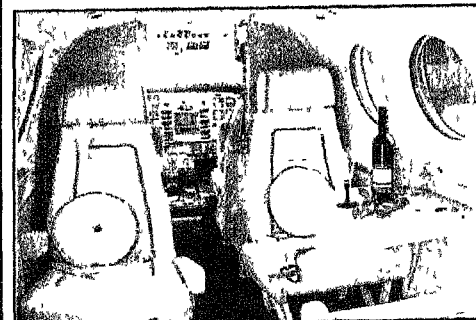

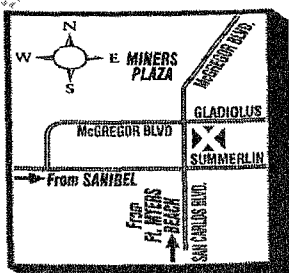

Crisis can lead to critical turning points in life

In some respects, critical events or crises share the qualities of an epiphany. Epiphany refers to the sudden perception of the essential nature or meaning of something, a moment of truth in which all is revealed. There is a sense in which an epiphany is experienced as the lifting of a curtain so that what was known in shadows is now brilliantly outlined.

There can be varying responses to epiphany-producing critical events.

• There is shock and denial similar to one of the dying stages identified by Kubler-Ross. The reaction is, "No, not me. This can't be happening to me." Denial is manifest through the vigorous pursuit of activities which were rewarded in the past. Activity is a tried and true method of managing anxiety.

• Withdrawal and depression when the event is swift, unexpected and pervasive. For some, the epiphany is so devastating as to shatter all sense of self-worth and purpose in life. All the meanings of life were related to previous role definitions, and in a very real sense there is little of self that remains.

• Anger and rage expressed overtly.

Individuals have been described as having been duped, sold out, betrayed and raped by the universe, and the response is frequently anger and rage in cosmic proportions.

The person experiences the death of those parts of the self identified with former roles. The passing of former selves is accompanied by a fear of separation from the familiar. The future is unknown and one is alone without the knowledge that there are alternatives. Critical events bring a period of mourning, for who does not mourn the loss

of parts of self, especially in the face of uncertainty, and who does not grieve for a world where things are as they were promised, even though the makers of the promises were themselves deceived?

The critical event of my divorce after twenty-four years of marriage forced me to choose new goals and forced me on another path and caused me to examine my life. New competencies and renewed awareness of potential skills needed to be developed if the critical event was to be resolved successfully. For me, the development of a greater degree of risk taking, courage, and independence were forged.

Because the critical event in my life was a significant turning point. I believe others have had similar critical events as well. My purpose is to request readers and others who wish to contribute a story of their most significant critical event for inclusion in a book I am writing on "CRISIS-Healing and Hope."

Sanibel School.

Presented to City Council in late April, and endorsed by the Park and Recreation Committee in May, the city's parks master plan is awaiting the Planning Commission's blessing before the council can formally adopt it.

The most expensive item on the committee's to-do list is the estimated \$500,000 to move the city's baseball and softball fields. Located at the school, the fields and buildings need to be moved around to make room for the school's expansion.

Next was a four-point request for coming up with facilities and equipment standards, a plan for the road-side park on Periwinkle Way, a conceptual plan for the pool and a plan for the proposed park and sailing center at Bailey Beach. The committee estimated those cost at between \$75,000 and \$100,000.

Funding for the development of the Periwinkle park — about \$50,000 — was the third item.

While the committee asked that those come out of the fiscal year 2003 budget, it also asked that money be added to the Capital Improvements Fund for 2004 to roof a proposed pavilion that will be part of the school's expansion. The school district plans on building an open, hard-surfaced structure.

"If we got involved now and assured them it was part of our capital funding," Ball said the school district would go ahead and design the pavilion with a roof. School district standards call for those kinds of structures to be built without a roof, City Manager Judy Zimomra said.

THE 1031 TAX-DEFERRED EXCHANGE

Section 1031 of the Internal Revenue Code allows an owner to exchange one property for another and defer the payment of state and federal capital gains taxes as long as both properties are of "like-kind". This means that the properties must be either 1) held for productive use in a trade or business, or 2) held for investment. Despite reports that the new 1997 tax bill would change the rules governing the 1031 "like-kind" exchanges, no provisions were included in the bill.

It is crucial that the funds in such a transaction be held by a qualified intermediary and that the time period requirements of the exchange are met. timeline proposed by Tindale-Oliver in order to have the increases in place for next year's budget, City Manager Judie Zimomra said. The consultant's schedule has the new fee schedule implemented in October.

In the case of the Planning Department, it took 30 days needed to get new sign at beach parking lots, Zimomra said. City staff is recommending approval of the changes at Tuesday's City Council meeting.

The increase in permit and application fees are designed to eliminate the need for property tax revenues to be spent in the Building and Planning Departments, the city manager said.

"This represents a major change in philosophy," Zimomra said.

Tindale-Oliver calculated that Planning Department fees needed to increase by 52 percent to completely pay for the department's permitting process. Accordingly, most Planning Department permit application fees would generally go up by 50 percent. A permit for a new single-family home — by far the department's most issued permit — would increase from \$700 to \$1,000 for a house up to 2,000 square feet, with an additional 30 cents for each additional square foot.

Similarly, the consultants found the Building Department's permit fees to be below those charged by nearby communities. Under the new fee schedule, most of the department's permits would more than double, generally to \$25 for base permits with extra costs as a project's complexity or value go up.

Additionally, the city would begin charging for reviewing construction plans — 25 percent of the permit fee for commercial building and 10 percent for residential. Tindale-Oliver recommended the department's plan to create a position to review plans.

Beach parking rates would also just about double under the proposed change — "A" stickers to \$10 and "B" stickers to \$10 to nonresident property owners. "B" stickers for others and "C" stickers would go from \$30 to \$40.

General parking rates would go to \$1.50 per hour, although the consultants recommended an initial jump to \$1 an hour.

While Tindale-Oliver estimated the proposed general parking rate increase would cut usage of the lots by 30 percent, the consultants still figure the city will see its meter revenue go up by 70 percent.

Fee revenue generated by beach parking is limited to beach-related uses.

Overweight fees at the weigh station would also increase from \$5 per 1,000 pounds over the limit to \$7.50.

While the weigh station currently generates almost 10 times its operating costs, the extra money would be used to pay for road improvements, Zimomra said, lessening that burden on the general fund as well.
