Proposal keeps to last year's rates

Operating rate of 1.73 mills up for September vote

Sanibel's proposed millage rate for this year is the same as it was last year — and the year before.

City Council approved a proposed operating rate of 1.73 mills at a special meeting Tuesday. That is now the maximum possible property tax rate for 2002, although the Council can

adopt a lower rate.

Finance Director Renee Lynch estimated the operating millage would bring in \$6.3 million in ad valorem taxes for the city — a \$728,074 increase over last year.

Of the raise, \$663,109 is from from all 7 percent average increase in taxable property values, the rest from new construction.

Sanibel now boasts \$3.6 billion in assessed real property value and \$47.8 million in per-

sonal property.

Most Sanibel property owners do not make their primary residence on the island and are not eligible for the 3-percent homesteader cap on property tax increases.

"It should be a real incentive for them to become residents of this fair city," Councilman Dick Walsh said.

The council also set proposed rates of 0.383 mills for the sewer special assessment and

User fee increases finalized

City Council approved the fourth and final ordinance increasing user fees Tuesday, raising the fees for Planning Department applications.

Planning Department will be able to fund all application processing — except for \$719 — through application fees, said Steve Tindale, the city's user fee consultant.


"It puts the expense and the cost on the user," said Tindale of Tindale-Oliver and Associates Inc.

The city has had to budget general fund revenues to cover the difference between application fees and costs "for many, many years," the city's finance director, Renee Lynch, said.

"For a long period of time, it has been a free ride with the ad valorem tax paying for it," said Councilman Steve Brown.

Portable pension plan issue with city attorney

Councilman Marty Harrity is scheduled to report back to the council Tuesday on whether or not Doug Wyckoff will continue to be the city attorney.

Harrity and Wyckoff will have a

one-on-one meeting to discuss the city attorney's retirement compensation, but most members of the council say Wyckoff should start looking for another job.

Council's discussion of the issue at Tuesday's special meeting began when Jim Isom, the city's human resources manager, reported it was

impossible for the city to implement the pension plan it approved in June.

Since the city attorney is part of the general employees' pension plan, the city cannot contribute a fixed amount for the city attorney, Isom

Public hearings set for island parks

The Park and Recreation Committee is looking for a few good comments.

Public hearings on what to do with the existing nameless park on the Periwinkle roadside and the possibility of acquiring land for a new park near the Sanibel Community Association are scheduled for Aug. 9 — one at 9:15 a.m., the other at 10:30 a.m.

The hearings are parts of a grant application process the city is using to try to get state money to help implement the proposed park and recreation master plan.

The city needs to have all its information to its grant writer by Aug. 14. Lisa Mulhall of In Rem Solutions Inc., said the director of Parks and Recreation, Helene Phillips. "This has to be submitted and in by Sept. 14," she said.

In a memo to the city manager, Mulhall said a grant for the roadside park should make it through the competitive process, although SCA proposal is less likely.

At its July 25 meeting, the committee established, preliminarily, what it would like to see on the two sites.

Paramedics take on ClinCon 2002

Prehospital care was on the mind of Sanibel Fire Rescue District Deputy Chief David LaCombe and firefighter paramedic, John Griffith, along with 400 emergency medical service agents in Orlando last week for a national EMS conference.

Paramedics, firefighters, physicians, nurses and administrators met at ClinCon 2002 to get in on cutting edge clinical practices for saving the lives of the injured and ill EMS providers are called to aid.

LaCombe, conference co-chair for the past two years, heads up a multidisciplinary committee in developing the conference for a large and diverse group — a process, he said, that's hectic and packed with homework. The University of

Miami School of Medicine and Chief LaCombe led an 8-hour session on emergency airway management.

Lectures, discussions, simulations and drills put the experts to the task of learning even more.

"Each time I teach one of these sessions, I think I learn as much as the students," LaCombe said.

A manikin driven to breathe by computer to simulate worst-case emergency scenarios was utilized by class leader and Sanibel firefighter-paramedic John Griffith. High-tech programming works the manikin's tongue to swell to twice its normal size, blocking the airway.

Class participants react to the problem, assessing and opening the airway surgically.

Agreement required for access to records

House Bill 1679, approved by Gov. Bush on June 5, prohibits the Clerk's office from displaying on a publicly available Web site images of all court papers from cases filed under the Florida Rules of Family Law, The Florida Rules of Probate Rules, The Florida Rules of Juvenile Procedures, death certificate and military discharges.

House Bills No. 1673 and No. 1675, further modified by Senate Bill No. 24E, allow people to have Social Security numbers redacted from Court Records and Official Records.

All Official Records that are not governed by House Bill No. 1679 and do not have attachments that are non-compliant with HB-1679 will be available from the county's Web site. Official records and images can be ordered online from www.MyFloridaCounty.com or by completing the "Subscriber Site Agreement for Access to Electronic Records" form. All can also be viewed in the Official Records department.

We have created a subscription site to enable viewers to examine all of the documents excluded from Publicly Available Internet Web sites and containing all the social security numbers redacted from documents pursuant to these new bills.

Because these new laws do not carry state funding, the subscription service costs \$25 per month with an initial \$50 setup fee. A copy of the agreement may be obtained from the Web site www.leeclerk.org.

STATE OF AFFAIRS • 101,000 claims to return cash held by state

\$73 million returned to owners

Florida's Unclaimed Property program within the Department of Banking and Finance has returned more than \$73 million to its original owners in the past year. The state fiscal year ended June 30. The UP program processed more than 101,000 claims to return the cash, being held by the state. This is the most money ever returned to citizens during a one-year period and the

most claims ever processed since the program began in 1961.

DBF is currently holding more than \$800 million in unclaimed property belonging to Florida residents. Unclaimed property is a financial asset that has become inactive. The most common types are old bank accounts, stock dividends, insurance refunds, and contents from safe deposit boxes.



The state holds and returns the property to its rightful

owners free of charge.

Citizens can search Florida's UP database via the Internet and request claim forms. This effort has reduced the time it takes for citizens to reclaim their lost assets from months to a few weeks.

Robert J. Cope of Sanibel and Decatur, Ill., and Lexington, Ky., died at the age of 91 on



July 14, 2002, at Health Park Medical Center in Fort Myers. He was born March 25, 1911, in Decatur. He was a 1932 graduate of Millikin University in Decatur, president of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity, president of the Decatur Junior Chamber of Commerce, a former member of Lexington Country Club, Lexington Art League and the Sanibel Dunes Country Club.

He was retired from the Mueller Company in Decatur. His father, Roy M. Cope, was a prominent Decatur contractor, whose firm built the city's dam in 1923.

A resident of Sanibel since 1969, he was a frequent visitor to the Sanibel Public Library and an accomplished artist, whose watercolor paintings include the Sanibel Lighthouse, Captiva's Chapel-by-the-Sea, landscapes, wildlife and Sanibel landmarks. He is preceded in death by his wife of 55 years, Laura Belle Cope, who died Aug. 18, 1997.

He is survived by two sons, Robert J. Cope II of Hopkinsville, Ky., and Stuart B. Cope of Lexington, Ky.; two grandchildren, Robert Clayton Cope of Tampa and Cathleen Cope Swiney of Huntersville, N.C.; three great-grandchildren, Lauren Elizabeth Cope, Nicholas Edward Swiney and Evan Scott Swiney; and numerous nieces and nephews.

A private family memorial service in Sanibel will be held at a later date, followed by a gathering with friends.

Le Tour de Lance

The Tour de France is really several races, not just several stages. The Prologue, which as the name suggests, is a pre-race stage (this year only 7.3 km or a little more than 4.5 miles long), yet it contained a little bit of everything. There were bridges, 20 or so tight turns, cobblestones, even a category-4 climb. Laurent Jalabert, a French favorite, finished the course in nine minutes and ten seconds. Lance Armstrong beat him by two seconds.

As defending champion, Armstrong could have opted to start the Prologue wearing le maillot jaune (the yellow jersey), but instead he wore his blue United States Postal Service team jersey. At the end of the Prologue; however, Armstrong had qualified to wear not only the yellow jersey, but also the green jersey, and even the red polka-dot jersey. Esoteric, you might say, but understanding the color-coded jerseys gives one a fuller appreciation of the Tour and its diversity.


The yellow jersey takes precedence over the other colors. It goes daily to the leader in the over-all standings. The green jersey is awarded to the rider who has amassed the most points according to a complex system of split times that are scaled for terrain and that allow for penalty deductions. At the end of each stage, a new red polka-dotted jersey is awarded to the leader of the mountain standings. The best climber classification is determined by adding the points won in all mountain and hill climbs of a stage, in accordance with scales that are weighted by category of the climb: hors (literally outside of category), 1, 2, 3, or 4. There is even a white jersey, but Armstrong couldn't qualify for that as he was born before 1976. It goes to a young rider who has shown the most drive and sportsmanship.

The next three stages after the Prologue were relatively flat, favoring the sprinters. Stage-4 was the Team Time Trial where speeds averaged more than 30 mph. Riders started in five-minute intervals. Drafting teammates is not permitted; drafting other team members is.


This stage is about the cutting of geometric lines and of minimizing wind resistance. Time is measured on the fifth team rider to cross the stage finish line. At the end of Stage-4, Team Postal (USPS) and Armstrong were 16 seconds out of first place.

A crash, late in Stage-7, more than doubled Armstrong's deficit to 34 seconds. Stage-9 was the first of two Individual Time Trials. Other than the psychological value of the Prologue, the first moment of truth was perhaps the initial

ITT. ITT's favor natural ability and training. The climbers usually don't shine here. Even the sprinters don't because, while they do have an advantage over the climbers, the first ITT is positioned just before the climbing stages, and the sprinters know that what they could bank here they would surely lose in the mountains, especially if they were tired. In Stage-9, Armstrong cut his deficit to 11 seconds.

Stage-11 began the mountain stages. Many say this is where the race begins. Going into the base of the final climb, a category hors, there were six USPS riders. Heras (USPS) and Armstrong drove the pace, and de Galdeano, the yellow jersey holder, cracked. Armstrong won his second stage and pulled ahead in the over-all standings by seven seconds.

Armstrong also won Stage-12, another mountain stage. The final part of this ascent saw four riders in contention: Jalabert, Beloki, Heras, and Armstrong. Jalabert dropped back with 9 km to go. At 7 km, it became clear that Beloki wasn't a

threat. Armstrong wanted to give the stage win to Heras in payment for all the work he'd done helping Armstrong, but Heras, couldn't hold the pace, so Armstrong went on to capture the stage and increased his lead to two minutes and twenty-eight seconds. This was Armstrong's third stage win for this year's Tour.

Stage-19 was the second ITT. Armstrong, as wearer of the yellow jersey, rode last. Out in front of him Raimondas Rumsas, a Lithuanian, set a blistering pace. At the first leg, Rumsas' time was 17 seconds better than Armstrong's. At the 33 km checkpoint, Armstrong led Rumsas by seven seconds. At 44.5 kms, Armstrong was 34 seconds ahead. Armstrong finished the stage in 1:03:50 (29.2 mph), 50 seconds ahead of Rumsas.

Yellow jersey should race to the end, and in winning this stage, that's exactly what he did.

Stage-20 is largely ceremonial in that the race doesn't start until the peloton (the pack) reaches the Champs-Elysees, where riders tour the circuit 11 times. Those looking for final points for the green jersey will be sprinting here, as will others who are simply exuberant about finishing.

Body of unidentified female found in bay under investigation

Lee County Sheriff's Office reported the body of a white female found July 18 after floating several days face down in the Back Bay was weighted down by cinder blocks tied to the body with rope. The death is under homicide investigation.

It is estimated the deceased is about 40 to 50 years old, 5 foot 8 inches to 5 foot 9, 150 pounds with medium brown hair about three to four inches long. She was dressed in green shorts with an elastic waistband and a short-sleeved white pullover shirt with green, yellow, red and blue small flowers and green leaves. She had pierced ears but was wearing no jewelry and has no tattoos or visible scars.

County police do not believe the victim a transient. Report any information to the Sheriff's Office, 477-1200, or through Crimestoppers, (800) 780-TIPS.

Little girl all grown up

On Oct. 5, 1986, Sanibel Police Case No. 5833 dealt with a 6-year-old girl who had been bitten by a shark in the waters off Sanibel's Gulf Beach. Sanibel Officers Mike Cooper and Scott Ashby were on duty that day.

According to Matt Perez's front-page story in the Oct. 9, 1986, *Island Reporter*, Luz Helena Florez and her sister were were playing in murky water near West Wind. The family lived in Pembroke Pines, Fla. and was here on vacation.

Helena had just climbed piggyback onto her mother's fiancé's back when the pair lurched back suddenly. The fiancé stood up and lifted the little girl out of the water, then saw a 6- to 8-foot shark. He, the girl's mother and a bystander were able to drive the shark away but, when it had grabbed Helena, it had fractured her thigh, severed a main artery and nerve and taken a lot of skin. The chief of staff at Shriners Hospital in Tampa said it looked as if the shark had started at Florez' ankle and chewed

its way up to the groin and buttocks area to get a firm grip.

The little girl underwent surgery every 48 hours to clean the wound and change the bandages and followed that with several weeks of skin grafts on the stripped leg. The doctors speculated at the time that the nerve damage might be able to be repaired.

Some 16 years later — June 2002 — the Sanibel Police Department received an announcement from The University of Florida College of Journalism and Communications that the same little girl, Luz Helena Florez, graduated Summa

Cum Laude with a bachelor of science degree in advertising.

Helena's mother said she spent countless hours on sleep deprivation research in high school but, after a year at Duke University, discovered she didn't want to do experimental psychology after all. She went to community college for a year, then moved on to Gainesville in May 2000.

Her mother believes Helena wants to know so much about so many things that she had trouble picking a major. But, during her last semester, she was named an advertising project director for her honor's class. Despite being offered an internship with one of the biggest advertising agencies in the world, Helena had decided to go for her master's, although she is undecided about what field to pursue.







Feds' accounting fraud outweighs corporate mismanagement

When fraudulent accounting takes place in the business world, it is big news. Politicians and government bureaucrats so frequently mismanage our money, however, that their misdeeds go virtually unnoticed by the media. To draw an analogy, deliberate business accounting failures are about as rare as an airplane crashing, whereas government mismanagement of our money is as frequent as the thousands of automobile crashes each day. Even a brief look at the government's accounting practices reveals neither politicians nor bureaucrats are in a position to criticize — or effectively regulate — business accounting.

Each year, Congress is supposed to pass a budget resolution by April 15. Congress routinely breaks their own budget by passing "supplemental" or "emergency" spending bills, thereby ignoring their own budget. According to Tom Shatz of Citizens Against Government Waste (CAGW), Washington lawmakers have spent a total of \$142 billion above the levels set forth in their annual budgets over the past five years, more than 12 times the misstated figures from Enron, Xerox, and Worldcom combined.

Another example of Congressional accounting fraud is former Representative Dan Rostenkowski (D-Illinois), Chairman of the powerful Ways and Means Committee (you might say a sort of CEO in government), who was indicted on 17 counts of accounting fraud and embezzlement in the 1990s. Rostenkowski did not even pay for his own legal bills.

Instead, he tapped into his campaign treasury, diverting more than \$1.3 million for his legal defense. In return, Rostenkowski received a light 15 month sentence in a minimum security Wisconsin prison and an eventual pardon from President Clinton. Congress has done no better when accounting for our retirement money.

The Social Security "Trust Fund" — the money that is supposed to pay for the living expenses of future retirees — is nothing more than a box full of government IOU's. For years, the government has deceived the public by taking Social Security surplus dollars that should help pay for baby boomers' retirement and either spent the money or used it to pay back government debts that have been racked up after years of fiscal mismanagement.


Unfortunately, Congress is not alone when it comes to government accounting fraud. The accounting in our nation's bureaucracies is so terrible that Congress hires its own separate agency known as the General Accounting Office (GAO) to oversee the bookkeeping procedures of government agencies. The President also has his own accountants in the Department of Treasury and the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Multiple accounting agencies still does not prevent gross accounting fraud in government. The GAO reports the following:

- The Department of Agriculture was "unable to reconcile" approximately \$38 Billion in fund balance accounts with the US Treasury's accounts of the same fund. Rather than reconcile the difference, the Department's "merely adjusted its records to agree with the Treasury's [figures]."

- The Department of Education was unable "to prepare routine financial reports" and failed to "return \$2.7 billion dollars to the Treasury in accordance with the 1990 Federal Credit Reform Act."

- The Department of Interior's Management of Indian Trust Funds has "long been characterized by inadequate financial management as a result, account holders have no assurance their account balances are accurate."

Rather than punish the irresponsible book-keeping of these government agencies, Congress rewards them with more and more money. Unlike the government, businesses that engage in accounting fraud are closed and replaced by more trustworthy providers of goods and services. Wouldn't it be nice if government abided by the same rules it places on business?

motto. The amendment is being sponsored by Congressman Chip Pickering.

Donald E. Wildmon, chairman of the American Family Association which is sponsoring the Wepledge.com drive, said, "The online petition gives easy access to those who support this amendment to express their opinion. We expect this to be the most signed petition in history."

The proposed legislation would protect the pledge and motto from action like that taken by the 9th Circuit Court in San Francisco, which said the pledge was unconstitutional because it contained the words "under God." The amendment will write the pledge and motto into the Constitution, making it impossible for two judges to rule it unconstitutional. The three-man court made the ruling following a suit by an atheist.

The proposed amendment reads:

The first article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States shall not be construed to prohibit the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag, which shall be, "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

The first article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States shall not be construed to prohibit the recitation or use of the national motto, which shall be, "In God we trust."

Scott McPherson • Finding safety from terrorism

Since Sept. 11, safety, security, and liberty are at the forefront of every American's mind. As in most crises, some Americans believe that a stronger and more powerful central government is the answer. But is it?

Responding to an increased demand for protection, the federal government has embraced a number of "solutions" to the terrorist threat, all of which expand the powers of the government. The federalization of airport security, increased immigration controls, expanded domestic law-enforcement powers, and the incarceration of American citizens without trial are just a few examples of the way our current political leadership is dealing with the danger of new terrorist attacks.

It is understandable that Americans would turn to government in the wake of an assault within our borders. After all, defending the citizenry here at home from aggression is the primary responsibility of the state.

But what if America is being attacked by foreign terrorists because of our government's interventionist foreign policy, such as bombings and trade embargoes overseas, rather than for the freedom and openness of our culture, as many pundits and government officials would have us believe?

If that is the case, the American people ought to start asking themselves whether the inevitable loss

Caretta ponders turtle absence

25 years ago • Aug. 5, 1977

Loggerhead turtles — giant, barnacle-encrusted sea creatures that inhabit offshore Florida waters — have been staying away from their traditional summer nesting beaches in droves this year, according to Caretta Research, a Sanibel-based organization dedicated to the preservation and study of loggerhead turtles.

Records show only 12 turtle sightings on Sanibel this

summer, and of those 12, only five successful nests were discovered. Last year, 27 nests were observed. In 1975 the figure was 48.

"We don't know what the problem is," said Charles LeBuff, the founder and director of Caretta Research.

"We put participants into no-win situations to see how they react," said Griffith. "Our

strengths and weaknesses come out when the heat is turned up."

More than 60 paramedic teams from around the world were put to the test in the Advanced Life Competition, a series of simulated emergency scenes dealing with fractures and burns and weapons of mass destruction,

which the Sanibel Fire and Rescue District is competing in next year.

"We're here to scout out the situation as we prepare our competition team," LaCombe said, "but the competition will ultimately make us better."

of their freedom that accompanies every growth in government power is an effective or desirable way of making us safe from terrorists.

During the first hundred years of our nation's history, Americans faced practically no foreign menace. The world was far from being a peaceful place, but the United States largely managed to escape Europe's centuries-old conflicts by maintaining a position of neutrality. As John Quincy Adams put it, "Wherever the standard of freedom and Independence has been or shall be unfurled, there will [America's] heart, her benedictions and her prayers be. But she goes not abroad in search of monsters to destroy."

At the same time, the United States was enjoying a period of unprecedented economic prosperity. While European nations were trading blows with each other, individual Americans were trading their goods and services with people from all over the world, establishing lasting relationships and friendships that were built on goodwill and mutual gain.

Far from being seen as a potential threat, immigrants to America were welcomed and faced virtually no barriers to entering the country. The outcome was an increase in living standards unlike any in the history of civilization.

Today, by comparison, our political leaders insist on maintaining an overseas empire to police the world, keeping troops in more than a hundred countries and interfering in countless conflicts around the globe. America has strayed far from Thomas Jefferson's wise council favoring "honest friendship with all nations" and "entangling alliances with none."

The federal government also contributes to international discord by interfering with the economic freedom of the American people. Trade barriers and other political obstacles to the free movement of goods and labor create tensions with foreigners who wish to do business with Americans.

U.S. protectionist barriers also exacerbate conditions in economically stagnant nations, some of which harbor our nation's bitterest enemies. Embargoes are imposed with the alleged purpose of unseating brutal dictators, but inevitably they end up preventing vital medicines and food supplies from reaching hospitals and hungry children. Meanwhile, resentment towards the United States grows.

In the 19th century, when the U.S. govern-

ment limited itself to the role of a night watchman and left its citizens free to engage in global friendship and commerce, our nation was a shining beacon for the world. Our melting-pot society mirrored Voltaire's view of the great capitalist societies of the 18th century, where "Jew, Mohammedan and Christian dealt with each other as though they were all of the same faith."

Our history serves as a ready guide. Granting free rein to the federal government in foreign affairs, while eroding cherished liberties such as privacy, free movement, and due process of law, benefits no one and only endangers the American people.

It is through the curtailment of government power overseas and the expansion of individual freedom and free trade that peace, prosperity, and international goodwill are nurtured.

Thus, the solution to the problem of terrorism is to bind our leaders down with "the chains of the Constitution" with respect to foreign policy and once again free the American people to extend a hand of friendship to the world.

Florida natives aren't all that native

Dear Ron: I'm originally from Connecticut and have lived in Southwest Florida now for about six years. I've recently started working on my landscape here and, as a Northern transplant, I have a couple of very basic questions. What makes a native plant native? And why is it so important that I concentrate on using only native plants when there are so many other non-native plants to choose from? — *T. Robert Alexander, South Fort Myers*

Dear Mr. Alexander: Nobody says you can't use non-native plants in your landscape. There are many of these non-natives — or "exotics" as they're known — that can blend in quite well and noncompetitively with the native species. However, there are many good reasons why you should want to devote the majority of your landscape to native plants. But first, let's talk about your first question: What makes a native plant native?

Since much of Florida was once at the bottom of the sea, none of the native plant life we treasure today has been here forever. But throughout

the eons, as the land emerged, plant life from the north, south, east and west arrived by nature's own special delivery service — the wind, the sea, the birds, the animals.

The Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council defines a native Florida plant this way — "a species whose natural range included Florida at the time of European contact (1500 A.D.) when Spanish explorers first colonized parts of the state. The council defines an exotic plant as "a species introduced to Florida, purposefully or accidentally, from a natural range outside of Florida," and an invasive exotic as "an exotic that not only has naturalized but is expanding on its own in Florida plant communities."

Of course, what's native to the Florida Panhandle may not be native to Southwest Florida. This is where climate and the area's symbiosis with the water that surrounds it play an important role. Three principal factors affect native plant life in Southwest Florida — the international geographic region, average temperatures and specific ecosystems. Geographically,

Southwest Florida lies within the subtropics, an area that stretches from Sarasota County to the northern coast of Cuba. The subtropics are hospitable not only to naturally subtropical flora but also to extratropical and tropical vegetation — any of which may be either native or exotic in origin.

Average temperature is the second factor. The USDA has divided the country into what it calls "hardiness" zones. Lee County is in Zone 10, which is divided into two subzones — Zone 10A, which lies within the interior and has average minimum temperatures at the freezing point, and, Zone 10B, which encompasses the barrier islands and the coastline and has an average minimum temperature of 35 degrees to 40 degrees.

Within Southwest Florida, three specific ecosystems dictate the type and quality of native plant life — the beachfront, where vegetation must withstand assaults of wind, water and salt, the "interior" land lying beyond the coastal areas, and, the mangroves that grow at the edges of the brackish estuaries.

said. As part of Wyckoff's compensation package voted on June 18, the council said it would contribute 13.9 percent of Wyckoff's salary and other compensation.

However, Isom's first City Council appearance since he was hired quickly became irrelevant. After some discussion about whether or not to leave the city attorney in the general plan or to create a defined contribution plan for him, at Harity's suggestion Wyckoff read a draft memo expressing his position.

Wyckoff had shown Harity an earlier draft of the memo.

In the memo Wyckoff said he felt "unappreciated and unwanted" based on

the council's handling of his compensation negotiations and insistence on a 5-year vesting period for his pension, especially in light of negotiations with recent city managers.

"I cannot comprehend why Council insists on treating the City Attorney's Office in a substantially different manner than the city manager, the only other position under Council control pursuant to the charter," the memo stated.

It makes no sense to provide for 5-year vesting for the city attorney, as a hook but not for the city manager.

While council agreed to eliminate the requirement that the city attorney live on-island, Wyckoff said he was never consulted on the matter.

"In fact, as the matter presently stands, none of you know my feelings on that issue," the memo stated. In the memo, Wyckoff repeated his request for a retire-

ment plan with no vesting period. Other than that, he said, he liked his job.

"I'm very happy in this job," the city attorney said Tuesday. "I'm very unhappy with the pension situation."

During his June evaluation, Wyckoff said he would start looking for other work if the city did not offer him a portable plan similar to the city manager's.

Mayor Nola Teiss said the city manager's plan is administered by a professional association since the average tenure of city managers is five years or less.

City Council defeated a motion, 3-2, to set up a portable plan for the city attorney with Councilwoman Judy Workman and Councilman Steve Brown in the minority.

"I have felt all along that Doug should be treated like the city manager," Workman said. "We have a proficient individual whose doing an excellent job for us."

On the other hand, the vesting period is

a way to attempt to keep employees around, Councilman Dick Walsh said.

"The key element is the 5-year vesting," Walsh said. "I am not prepared to give up the 5-year vesting."

In his memo, Wyckoff said that sentiment "is offensive in that it likens an employee to a draught animal with a carrot being dangled in front of his/her nose."

The council did by 3-2 vote authorize Harity to discuss the issue with Wyckoff.

Brown felt the matter needed to be resolved immediately.

Harity is authorized to discuss severance terms with Wyckoff at their meeting.

"Doug, if I were you, I'd start working on a separation package," Brown said.

Brown also expressed concern about the handling of personnel matters in open meetings.

"We've got to come up with a better





That he did so with humility (putting his achievements in perspective), giving due credit to his team members and to the great riders of the past, gives credence to the title of this piece.





Tagging sharks, fears



Whale sharks strain plankton and small fish from the upper waters of tropical and subtropical seas by lying motionless beneath the water's surface. The largest living species of fish, whale sharks measure more than 50 feet. The whale shark poses little risk to human beings, but have been known to ram boats mistaken for rival sharks.

The United States is one of three areas noted for shark attacks in the world. Australia and the southern part of South Africa are high-contact areas with the U.S. average higher than any other place in the world and more than twice of any other region, said George Burgess of an affluent country with its people having more money and time to spend on vacations.

Burgess, director of the Florida Program for Shark Research and manager of the International Shark Attack File at the University of Florida's Museum of Natural History in Gainesville, used fact to deface fiction.

"Florida — with more shark attacks than any other region of the world — owes that to the fact there are more people entering the water in Florida than in any other area of the world. It's a function of the number of hours in the water in any given year."

The International Shark Attack File, fed by a cooperative network of scientists worldwide, collects electronic data accumulating 3,500 investigations studied for circumstances surrounding attacks in search of patterns for prediction of when and where shark attacks might occur.

The coastal waters of Florida, California and Hawaii are major areas for sharks, Burgess said, with the likelihood of a shark encounter four times greater in Florida. Florida's East Coast remains the area where most attacks occur, he said, "with large expanses of beaches highly utilized year after year."

Same holds true for San Diego, Los Angeles and San Francisco, he said, and Hawaii around the islands of Oahu and Maui. "Look at shark attack numbers historically, and there's a general rise in the world and in the United States in gradual pace with human population growth. The last decade saw the same trend in California and Hawaii, where attacks mirrored population growth."

Beach attendance and rescue data recorded by the U.S. Lifesaving Association of the last decade's growth and attack rate rise at the same rate, said Burgess of U.S. data for all beaches. Worldwide, serious shark attacks (as measured by fatality) signals attacks down this century from 30 percent to 50 percent in the early

part of the century to an average of 12 percent of the last two decades, he said.

"Shark attack is mainly a function of utilization patterns of the waters more than shark patterns."

Shark attacks occur in Florida primarily in warm-water months, March to November, with peaks between July and October. Shark populations in Florida are highest in winter, November to February, when sharks migrate south down the East Coast to winter in Florida — like tourists.

Shark attack studies by time of day record most between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Between noon and 2 p.m., attack numbers drop, when people leave the water for lunch, Burgess said.

While the number of attacks on divers remain consistent, attacks on swimmers and waders rise as do attacks on surfers which rose dramatically in the 1960s, Burgess said, with the surfing craze. Attacks occur on surfers because the activity breaks surf where sharks interpret splashing as activity of normal prey."

Burgess said the norm in the United States is not an attack but a bite, similar to a dog bite, with tooth incision wounds millimeters in length to slashes which require sutures but leave no permanent injury. Four out of 55 injuries in the United States were serious last year. Area-wise, three-quarters of attacks in California are by the Great White, the tiger shark in Hawaii and the black-tipped and spinner sharks in Florida. Other species heading attacks on the East Coast are the smaller black-nose and shark-nose sharks.

Three species of greater concern, Burgess said, are the white, tiger and bull shark species, consumers of large prey with a jaw full of teeth geared for biting. Attacks by these rare with only two out of 55 attacks in the United States last year attributable to the bull shark.

"Within the marine world, our chances of injuries are far greater from jellyfishes and stingrays with drowning by far the biggest killer in aquatic recreation," Burgess said. Two

shark fatalities and 15 drownings are Florida's averages this last decade, he said, with California's average of 15 to 20 deaths a year by drowning to one shark fatality.

The U.S. Lifesaving Association logged 2.6 million people on 68 ocean beaches in the year 2000 with 132 drownings; shark attacks, 23, no fatalities.

"The odds of encountering a shark are 10 million to 1 and, with common sense, we can avoid a shark attack," Burgess said: Minimize splashing while in the water, avoid murky water and areas with effluents entering the sea, don't enter the water if bleeding or wearing shiny jewelry, don't go where bait fish go or when sharks are most active feeding, dusk to dawn.

• 'Ding' Darling Indigo Trail rehab

The Indigo Trail at the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge is closed for rehabilitation from late August. The trail runs from the administration building to the Cross Dike on Wildlife Drive and provides access to the refuge on a daily basis.

The goal of the project is to make the trail bicycle-friendly.

The Service complies with state law: Bicycles are considered vehicles that must move with the traffic and not in opposition to it. Currently, beyond the first few hundred feet of boardwalk, the trail is mostly sugar sand and near impossible to maneuver by bicycle.

Modifications will provide the opportunity for those who can't make it all the way around the full drive (plus the return on San-Cap) to get back to the front entrance via the Indigo Trail.

Sand will be replaced with shell rock, much like the former surface on

Wildlife Drive, making it easier for hikers and wheelchairs as well as bicyclists.

At the same time, workers will be laying a fiber-optic cable that will ultimately go to a video camera located on a new, handicapped-accessible observation tower at Mile Marker 2 on the Drive to be built later in the year. The new video-cam will provide a bird's eye glimpse of "what's going on in the refuge" from the Education Center.

The completion date for the Indigo Trail project is estimated to be the end of August. • Refuge, 472-1100.



...s it Toni Halski's eighteen-year record of success as director and head pro at the Sundial Beach Resort and his reputation among tennis players that make him so popular? Actually it's the respect with which he treats people. A sales associate in the pro shop describes Halski like this: "He tries to make everyone happy and has a remarkable sense of what people want. Everyone is right! He's extremely accommodating with lesson schedules and has unbelievable patience on the court. If there are too many people for a clinic, he sets up an extra one. No one is ever left out. Toni's just a great person and that carries over to his work here."


Halski started playing tennis at day camp when he was six. "I'd always choose tennis. Later I started playing football and baseball, but I noticed that when you were depending upon other players, there were more injuries. Tennis is a more individual sport. You're in charge of your own fate."

In his junior year at Jefferson High School in Jefferson, Georgia, Halski was a runner up in the State Finals and later, at Flagler College in St. Augustine, Florida, he played lots of top-ranking teams in the United States winning the Intercollegiate Doubles Championship in 1980 and the All-American Championship in 1981. While he continued playing competitively between 1984 and 1991, Halski was ranked in the top five in Florida.

One of the most significant ways in which Halski has been able to develop a viable program at Sundial has been through a very active program offering many different options and then being creative in trying new ideas. Halski schedules daily clinics for all ages and abilities from tiny tot to adult, round robins four days each week, lessons and "guaranteed partner matching." Guests are asked what time they want to play and Halski matches them up with their level of player.

"If there's a 'no show', one of the pros plays. We call it a hitting lesson."

From May through December Halski sets up a highly appealing tournament schedule. "We've hosted about 150 USTA Sanctioned tournaments averaging about 100 or more players in each event. They come from all over the states and from different countries.

This is a great opportunity for tennis players to compete against many different players." Sundial offers twelve courts with a choice of either clay or hard surfaced courts, and two of the hard courts are lighted for night play.

For the past few years Halski has added some local teams. In two years the women's team called "Toni's Tigers" went from last to first place in the Lee County Women's Tennis League and the ladies were so proud

of their team that they presented Halski with the "Coach of the Year Award" for the 2001-2002 season. The Sundial Snowbirds, the men's team in the 15 and over division, is doing well.

"It's a good idea to have teams because we can fit the guests into our practices, and it's a win-win situation. Instead of the team playing the same players all the time, this infuses different players for them and benefits team play." He emphasizes he doesn't have to worry very much about

building spirit. Usually 99 percent of the time these people are on vacation and they're here to have fun. "It's my job to stay on top of their game and help them improve. One of the problems that keeps reoccurring is the need for people to try to hit the ball as hard as they can." With his long experience observing players Halski adds, "Many points are won because of mistakes — not because of hitting winning shots." Also he notes that a little more patience would help a large majority of tennis players.

In tennis clinics one of the most embarrassing things to have happen and one which always draws a laugh is when a player swings at the ball and can't see where it went. The person stands around looking for the ball, and the ball is stuck in the throat of the racquet. Usually this error only has to occur once!

Halski predicts that the more people are educated about the importance of health and fitness, the more they are beginning to appreciate the value of playing tennis. Today more people are doing cross-training like playing volleyball, baseball, jumping rope and





doing 20-second sprints which can be compared to the length of an average tennis point equal to a short blast of energy followed by a short break. In the future tennis players are going to get even stronger and more fit. They're into weight training and, for foot work, they're into soccer. All this cross-training is making a big difference in the game of tennis. Today racquets with graphite frames are much lighter, stronger and more powerful.

"Tennis is a great game, and everyone can find their own niche," reiterates Haski. A championship player whom Haski admires highly is John McEnroe, having grown up in the same era as McEnroe.

"I was amazed by how cleanly he struck the ball. He was a magician with the tennis racquet."

Now, it's Haski's turn to take to the court.

"Being a tennis pro is the best job in the world. Don't let anyone fool you. You go out and play a game that you love and you think is the greatest in the world. 



The SCA site, which would be property yet to be acquired, is the more ambitious of the two projects. The committee would like to see tennis courts, a multipurpose court, skateboarding area, bandshell, nature trail, water fountains, picnic facilities and playground equipment.

"You could take this place, and it really could be a showplace of the island," committee member Dick Muench said.

The roadside site would be a more passive picnicking area with one multipurpose court and some playground equipment. The key feature would likely be an overlook of the adjacent lake, although Natural Resources Director Rob Loflin has expressed concern about people feeding the alligators.

The money was to be sent via Western Union to a location to be given to the victim prior to arriving at

Western Union, according to the report. On receipt of the victim's money, Levy would bring the winner's check for \$500,000 to the victim's residence.

The Sheriff's Office is alerting the public and older citizens to be cautious when receiving a call from someone claiming connections to a sweepstakes and especially those needing an investment of personal monies in order to receive the winnings' payoff.
