Judge says county must explain causeway maintenance

Lee County will have to prove it properly maintained the Sanibel Causeway following a circuit court judge's ruling to reinstate a portion of Sanibel's lawsuit against the county.

Lee County Circuit Court Judge James Seals reinstated the city's claim that the county failed to maintain all three Causeway bridges. The ruling permits the city's argument that the bridges did not receive proper maintenance and allows the City of Sanibel to explain the damages it endured due to that lack of maintenance.

"We (Sanibel) have at least \$2.2 million in direct damage for the county's failure to maintain the bridge," said City Attorney Ken Cuyler.

The majority of those damages came from weight restrictions placed on the Causeway after Span B failed in 2003. To adjust to the restrictions, the city ordered smaller waste removal trucks and paid additional fees to vendors making extra trips on and off the island.

The city cannot, however, argue damages over the loss of surplus toll revenues collected from the Causeway tolls.

Despite Seals' decision regarding the

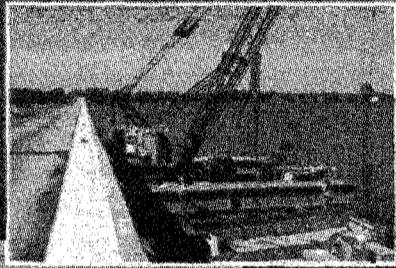
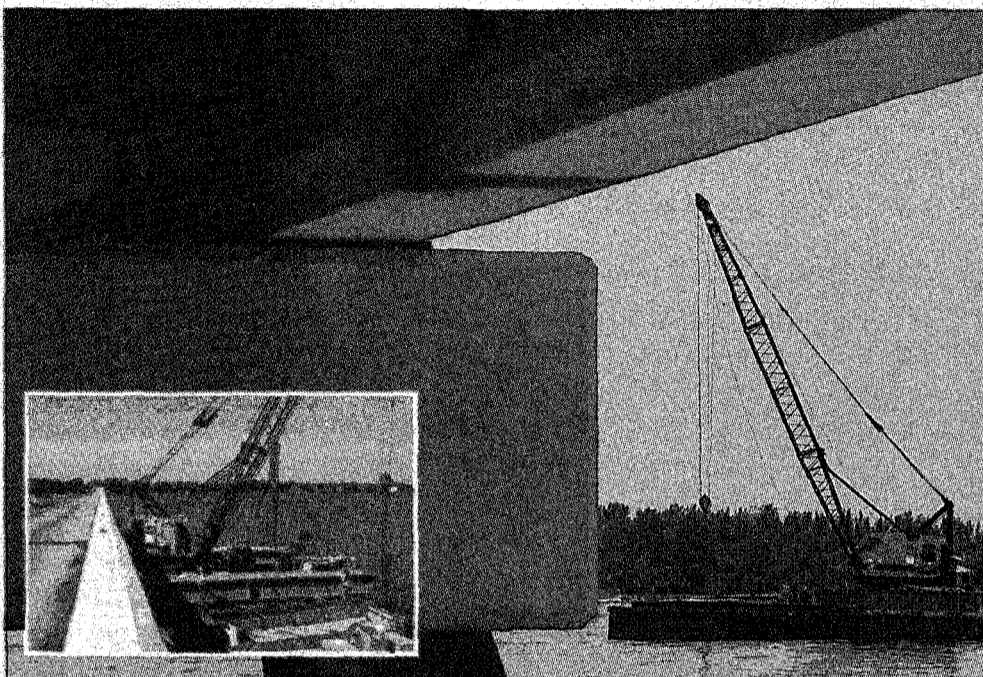

toll revenue, Cuyler feels the city has endured damages relating to that loss. If the county had maintained the Causeway, Cuyler said, it would have had a longer

life span. In past years, Sanibel received about \$800,000 annually in toll revenue from the county. Due to proposed Causeway replacement, the city will no

longer receive that money.

Lee County has 20 days to respond to the claim. The county will defend the complaint accordingly according to a press release issued by County Attorney James Yaeger last week.

The remaining counts of Sanibel's lawsuit claiming the county violated its interlocal agreement with the city as well as its own comprehensive land use plan by replacing not repairing the Span A of the Causeway were dismissed by Seals last month.

In his ruling, Seals claimed that as the owner, the county had the right to replace the Causeway. Seals also claimed the county's policing rights over the Causeway could not be contracted away despite what was written in the interlocal agreement.

Sanibel argued the agreement should have been upheld based on the Florida Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1969 which allows two governmental bodies to enter into a contract with one another.

"Local governments, through interlocal agreements, may agree to cooperate, consult, share information and solicit suggestions during the planning process, but the

Planning Commission reviews beach wildlife protection

The City of Sanibel has always taken strides to maintain the island's natural resources for its wildlife.

As stated in the Sanibel Vision Statement, Sanibel is and shall remain a barrier island sanctuary, on which a diverse population lives in harmony with the island's wildlife and natural habitats. The Sanibel community must be vigilant in the protection and enhancement of its sanctuary characteristics.

As the city prepares for its upcoming evaluation of the Sanibel Plan, it plans to re-examine protection of the island's coastal resources. One of its main concerns in doing so is maintaining the beaches for wildlife and people. The Planning Commission addressed this issue Tuesday and took input from the public for the Evaluation and Appraisal Report.

The beach will be the most difficult area to manage the co-existence between wildlife and humans, according to Eric Lindblad, executive director of the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation.

"The shore birds and sea turtles that nest there don't have any other choice," he said. "In other areas of the island they can move around and nest and feed where they like, but those suited to the beach don't have anywhere else to go."

In an attempt to alleviate any obstacles between people and wildlife on the beach, Lindblad suggested the city maintain its current volume of beach activity

and consider limiting access to the beaches.

"Any increase in activity on the beach will be detrimental," Lindblad said. "I don't see how we can maintain a co-existence without limiting access to the beach, especially during nesting seasons."

Currently, the city does close sections of the beach during animal nesting cycles. However, Lindblad suggested more formal restrictions be placed on the beach during those times.

The J.N. "Ding" Darling Wildlife Refuge also plays a major part in preserving the island's natural habitat. However, the beaches have experienced a major decline relative to human impact, according to Refuge Manager Rob Jess.

"The beaches are the most critical habitat we have on the island," Jess said. "We must be able to balance having people on the beach and restricting it enough for the habitat and its occupants."

To examine the human impacts and carrying capacity of the beaches, the Refuge is currently seeking between \$4 and \$6 million in funding through the United States Congress.

Although many suggestions made at the meeting related to preserving the habitat, very few were made in regards to visitors to the beach. In an effort to balance the discussion, Councilman Steve Brown suggested the commission examine both sides of the issue.

"It's so easy to move forward with limiting access

SWAT teams train on causeway

If you saw what appeared to be invading troops landing on the causeway on Friday, June 4 it was actually about a dozen law enforcement officers from the Fort Myers Police Department along with others from Charlotte and Hendry.

The Fort Myers PD hosted a four day training exercise designed to prepare Southwest Florida SWAT team members to deal with the possibility of terrorism in local waters.

The course focused on how to respond effectively to waterborne terrorism, or other violence on the waterways, teaching officers waterborne safety, infiltration techniques, SWAT swimming tactics, waterborne equipment and maintenance, waterborne shooting skills and boat and helicopter skills.

Friday's exercise was the culmination of the training and saw officers practicing jumps from a helicopter hovering 10 to 20 feet above the water.

The course was taught by instructors from the Blue Green Training Company at no cost to the participating agencies. It was funded by federal and state homeland security grants through the Florida Department of Law Enforcement

Planning Commission reviews build-back regulations

Redevelopment on Sanibel has always concerned residents. However, redevelopment following a disaster has raised questions among island residents regarding the effect the city's current flood regulations could have on their homes.

The majority of those concerns, especially among condominium owners, focus on whether their homes can be rebuilt after a disaster.

Under the current build-back regulations, a dwelling damaged more than 50 percent would have to adhere to the island's flood regulations. The new dwelling would be built on stilts and could not exceed a three-story height or a building height 45-feet above mean sea level. For some condominium owners, those regulations could eliminate their unit from the re-built complex.

Due to the vague nature of those "build-back" regulations the city plans to re-address them during the Evaluation and Appraisal Report process, according to Assistant Planning Director Ken Pflzer. In the report, the city must look into different strategies that address non-conforming densities during build-back from a hurricane, fire or other disaster.

Although the state is not requiring Sanibel to make any specific approach to the issue, Pflzer said it gives the city an opportunity to make a definitive statement of how to address the issue.

The Planning Commission held its first discussions on this issue at Tuesday's meeting.

Although the commission heard the suggestions and concerns from the public, some Sanibel residents decided to create their own solution to the problem.

Dave Schuldenfrei and the Sanibel-Captiva Association of Realtors are already addressing this issue. Together, with former City Attorney Bob Pritt, the association has

been busy composing a working draft of what Schuldenfrei calls "a fair emergency build-back ordinance."

"It's been a difficult thing to do," Schuldenfrei told the commissioners. "We want to be fair in what we are approving."

The ordinance would allow for condominium complexes to be replaced with the same density prior to the disaster. Although the ordinance would require the building to be elevated, the ordinance would allow the complex to be the same size and footprint as before.

"The need for a plan is essential," Schuldenfrei said. "Anything we can do in advance will alleviate some of the pressure on the city. None of us are looking for increased density, but are looking to preserve what is here."

The ordinance is near completion and will be presented to the Sanibel City Council and Planning Commission in the near future, he said.

Sanibel resident Alex Werner, pleased with the Realtors' efforts, said the city could avoid potential lawsuits by passing the proposed ordinance.

Councilman Steve Brown said addressing these regulations might be the toughest job the Planning Commission and staff will have during this process.

"Over 500 condos are built ahead of the coastal construction line," Brown said. "This is not an easy thing to deal with."

Resident Claudia Burns lives in one of the non-conforming condominium complexes built prior to the city's incorporation. However, as a property owner, Burns realizes there is a risk involved when building on a barrier island.

"Nobody can take Mother Nature to court and sue her for destroying their property," Burns said. "The reality is all of our property could be destroyed."

S.O.B. suit questions county's use of tolls

The proposed replacement of the Sanibel Causeway has raised several questions regarding maintenance, traffic, and the overall effect a 70-foot high fixed-span bridge will have on the island.

Issues raised in the lawsuit filed by Save Our Bay, Inc. even question whether revenues collected from tolls went to the bridge or to other Lee County projects.

However, this is not the first time complaints have been filed against the county over how revenues collected from the Causeway were used. Save Our Bay, Inc., and its attorney Ralf Brookes, anticipate that prior cases against the county and others filed throughout the state will help in their present suit against Lee County.

In a 1977 lawsuit Sanibel residents fought Lee County when it planned to use revenue bonds collected from the bridge to fund road improvement projects outside the island.

McGovern v. Lee County questioned whether people using the causeway should pay for substantial improvements to several roads throughout Lee County. The roads in question included McGregor Boulevard, Daniels Road, US 41, Cypress Lake Drive and Colonial — which is located about 12 miles away from the Causeway.

The court found that only McGregor could be classified as an approach to the island. In its ruling, the court denied validation of the revenue bonds, finding no evidence that the proposed improvements would "make a significant contribution to the traffic over the bridge." That ruling was later upheld by the Supreme Court of Florida.

Save Our Bay cites this specific case in its suit, claiming it has legal precedence.

"These past suits show that the toll money collected at a bridge should be used for operation and maintenance and that any profits should not be excessive,"

Brookes said. "Because the money was not spent, they were making exorbitant revenue."

Lee County attorney David Owens declined comment regarding the merit past cases in regards to the SOB suit. However, Lee County has filed a motion to dismiss the suit based on its lack of merit.

In its complaint, Save Our Bay also claims that Lee County failed to properly maintain the three bridges with the estimated \$6 million dollars collected annually from its tolls.

Another case cited in the S.O.B. suit, *State of Florida v The City of Port Orange*, established a precedent identifying characteristics of a valid user fee. In that ruling, the Supreme Court of Florida determined that a governing body could make a reasonable profit from a valid user fee. However, if that fee exceeds that "reasonable" status; it would be considered a tax.

"A \$4.5 million dollar net profit per year on a \$6 million dollar gross revenue is not a reasonable net revenue," SOB states in its complaint against Lee County.

According to Brookes, residents rely on Lee County to use the money from the toll on the bridge.

"The Sanibel bridge was paid off in 1979 and they have continued to collect the \$3 toll for more than 20 years later," Brookes said. "They spent very little on maintenance at all, and only slightly more on operating the bridge."

Throughout the year, Lee County Department of Transportation and the Florida Department of Transportation perform routine inspections and maintenance on the 40-year old bridges. The latest repairs, being performed this week, will place steel supports under Span C. Those repairs will cost the county an estimated \$440,000.

"Prior rulings limiting user fees to rea-

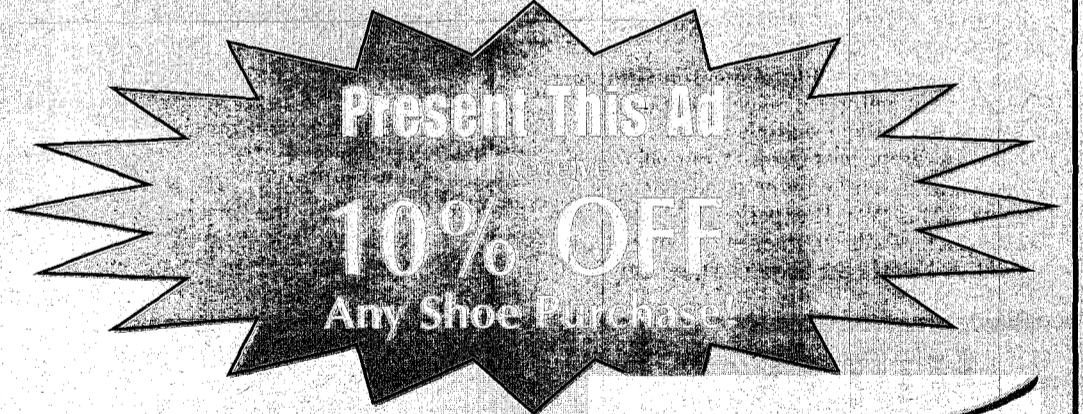

A salute to veterans

While growing up, the Tom Brokaw-dubbed "Greatest Generation" was in charge. They were riding out a reign that will be highly respected and favorably noted at least as long as America keeps its own record of history.

The Greatest Generation suffered a rude and frightening awakening at the hands of the Japanese Empire. The record shows that most Americans were not totally sure of the correct geographical or even hemispherical location of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. However, by the morning of December 9th, men by the hundreds of thousands were lining up at their local military recruiting agency, offering everything. Countless thousands, like my father's younger brother Dominic, were teenagers, still too young to volunteer without official parental consent.

These men were zealous patriots, selfless, true heroes, though not by their own definition then nor for most, not even now, unless they are talking about "...the other fellows...."

The women of the era were cut from the same cloth, possessing the matching (guiding?) spirit, enthusiasm and resolve. The uniquely demanding period prompted the emergence of Rosie the Riveter, fostering her opportunity to get out of the kitchen and grab them there bulls, 'n' ride 'em tough. Factories, in particular, will forever bear her imprint.

That entire segment of American Humanity will be most fondly revered and forever applauded, especially by those of us who are their direct descendants.

On Saturday, May 29, 2004, the National World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C. was officially dedicated by President George W. Bush with a crowd estimated at 140,000. Cameras and reporters visited with men and women who attended to represent and to honor the 16 million who donned uniforms and served. We are told that only 4 million U.S. veterans of that horrific war are still alive, their number currently dwindling by slightly more than 1,000 per day.

Of all U.S. cities with populations of 100,000 or more, the two with the highest concentration of WW II Veterans are Clearwater, Florida and our own Cape Coral. Interestingly, since learning that fact, the feeling while driving on Del Prado Boulevard or Cape Coral Parkway has changed for me. Somehow, the sun shines brighter as the sight of gray-haired folks ambling to and fro gives a sense of appreciation, perhaps one that was not noted just a short week ago.

Once in a while I get to play a round of golf with a man whom I'll respectfully refer to as Kenny. We've played together a dozen or 20 times over the past three or four years, so I called him and asked if he'd indulge me with some of his WW II experience.

I knew Kenny was a fighter pilot, but that was about it. He told me he joined the Army

Air Corp Aviation Cadets on May 1, 1941, graduating from Flight School at Kelly Field, Texas, on his birthday, December 12, 1941.

The war came as a complete surprise to Kenny and most of his contemporaries, altering his plans to use the service to complete his college education. Instead he got to know the topography of the Pacific including the likes of Auckland, Australia, Tonga Taboo, New Caledonia and Guadalcanal flying in P-39s and P-40s, the plane developed for and rejected by the British, so our boys got them.

The P-40 was hard to start in cold weather and had no oxygen, so it had to be flown at extremely low altitude. Later Kenny flew P-38s and P-40Fs with Rolls Royce engines, including oxygen, using machine guns and 200/300/400 pound bombs including napalm, as he and his squadron flew ground support. He flew 56 missions, then went back for about 50 more. The last two years of the war he was an instructor at Page Field right here in Fort Myers, receiving his discharge in October of '45.

As a civilian he was a retail merchant, his last business being a sporting goods and scuba shop.

"I didn't do a heck of a lot," Kenny said as we were wrapping up. "Others did so much more," he went on. "Look at all those who didn't come home. They are the heroes. Heck, I was just a small fry, so don't use my name. Please."

Sure, Kenny. Over 100 missions, any one of which could have ended with a splash. Instructor for two years. Small fry? Puts a whole new bent on "relative definition," if you ask me. And so very typical of so many of those who are bonafide members of the Greatest Generation.

I also had a long and very friendly visit via telephone with Phil Phillips. He was drafted in June of 1942 from his home in Cleveland and went to Camp Walters, Texas, one of a few northern guys among a group of predominantly Southerners.

Our country, every aspect of our world has changed almost beyond comprehension of most mere mortals in the past 60 years. Before the war, such a geographical mix could lead to real trouble. But Phillips overcame the obstacles, went to OCS, came out a Second Louie and taught small unit tactics until the school was dissolved.

He was sent to Europe two months before D Day and later was assigned to the 83rd Infantry, Company E. At one point he was further assigned as a graves registration officer and at the same time was told to operate the PX when not fighting.

He saw enough action to fill a book, so we won't attempt to do it here, but we do

want to mention that he met up with General Patton for a while, got involved in the Battle of the Bulge and was awarded the Bronze Star for action in another phase of his story.

His civilian career was likewise played out in the fast lane as he successfully climbed corporate ladders of a couple of America's more recognizable corporations, achieving the office of president.

Mr. Phillips retired to Southwest Florida in 1985, living on Sanibel until last year when he and his wife, Laverne Anne, moved to their current home in Shell Point. The two met in high school and this August they will celebrate 61 years of marriage. They each have earned recognition and applause for leading successful, productive lives, to which we add this all-too-brief salute today.

I had two long interviews with 22-year Sanibel resident, Gordon P. Schopfer. He even prepared a full page of information as a special favor to help me get this all down on paper. One of his friends, who we must favor with anonymity, called Schopfer "...a most important cog in the European war effort of the United States." I honestly believe that Schopfer's story could make a movie that would compare favorably in content and action to classics such as "Flying Leathernecks" and "The Longest Day."

I still haven't said a word about Mark Rubin or Jim Dozier or Ted Tyson and regrettably, I'm not going to attempt to use all the wonderful information they gave me as there is not enough space to do them and their stories proper justice. I make this simple reference to these fine gentlemen with sincere appreciation for their contributions.

I want to mention that I also had a great conversation with former Navy nurse, Jean Reed, who was on her way out the door to attend the commemorating ceremonies in Washington, D.C. the day I called. She

asked that I at least mention that one of the most profound occurrences of the WW II era was the way the people of this country - civilians and military alike - pulled together, sacrificing personal desires in favor of common benefit. Entire books have been written expounding this theme, yet there is cause to wonder if those born after 1960 can possibly imagine that so many millions of diverse people actually behaved thus for such a long period of time.

One more and we'll call it a day. I spoke to Rosie The Riveter. This one worked in a sewing factory in Hoboken, traveling on two trains and a bus each day from and to the Bronx. She sewed together those heavy, prickly-material overcoats worn by the GIs in Europe, the coats that made her uncomfortably warm as she draped them over her lap while putting the stitches in place.

Know what else she and her girlfriends put in each one? A note. A note in the pocket of each coat that said things like "Come Home Safe" or "You're In Our Prayers" or "Thanks Buddy. Come By For Coffee Sometime." For about the last 23 years, she has lived in Cape Coral and her name is Lucy. Macular degeneration took her sight, but not her spirit. After all, she, like everyone mentioned herein, is a bonafide member of the Greatest Generation.

There's an adage that cautions us to be careful what we ask for - we might get it. I asked for this assignment to call attention to the commemoration of the WW II Monument and to underscore a few of the people who played an integral part in American life during the years of World War II. Tom Brokaw wrote at least three books on this era and said he felt he did not even begin to do the subject justice. I couldn't agree more.

Maybe the best suggestion I can leave is to approach a veteran of that time and encourage him or her to have a private conversation with you. They're talking a bit more freely now. Such a conversation could change your life in positive ways that are beyond your imagination.

final say must lie with the one government possessed with sovereignty," Seals said in his ruling.

The Sanibel City Council will hold another "shade session" on June 15, Cuyler said. At that time the council will decide on how to proceed.

While the city plans its next move, the county continues its plans for the Sanibel Causeway. Lee County Commissioners approved a \$20 million dollar budget amendment to help fund the construction the replacement of spans B and C of the

Causeway. Another \$20 million dollar budget amendment is set for spring 2005.

Lee County will also be making repairs to the Causeway this week. Three steel beams will be placed in between the concrete girders underneath two different sections of Span C of the Causeway, according to Paul Wiingard, deputy director of the Lee County Department of Transportation.

Lee County's consulting engineers, Post, Buckley, Shoe & Jernigan, recommended the repairs after a Feb. 13 site visit revealed "further deterioration of the condition of the beams in some of the spans."

The repairs, which will cost an estimated \$440,000, should be completed by June 18.

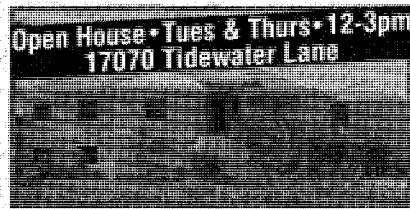

More Alligator Facts

These creatures have been around for over 200 million years and have survived the mass extinctions of almost all other known forms of life on earth. Their normal life span may exceed 30 years and their diet ranges to include fish, birds, and anything they can grab, roll under water, drown, and then rip apart. They prefer brackish water, but will swim through salt water to get food or to bellow and locate a mate.

How many alligators are there on Sanibel? Our present estimate is over 300. They are naturally afraid of humans, but unfortunately can easily be conditioned to keep looking for food offered to them by people. This causes a loss of their natural fear of humans and can result in aggressive and even fatal attacks. There are now two pamphlets available to the public. The "You Can Create a Monster" and the "Alligator Facts" address this issue. They have been widely distributed by our City Manager to contractors (involving all trades), dock permit receivers, City employees, and island associations. The Sanibel Island Wildlife Committee has also made pamphlet distributions to all of our island rental accommodations, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Sanibel Middle School. Translation of either pamphlet into Spanish would certainly be beneficial.

What can be done to minimize the attacks by alligators? This must include the continuation of our educational literature distribution, the immediate reporting of observed illegal feeding to the Police Department, always leashing our dogs, not

walking dogs at night near brackish water, refrain from wading or swimming in areas where alligators have been seen, and always being on-the-lookout when working or entertaining on property bordering known alligators habitat.

Property owners may consider adding a low alligator-proof fence near the water's edge on sites where alligators have been seen. Please note that there are City codes involving both the height of such a fence and its distance from the water. That must be observed. Another alternative would be the use of a vegetation barrier. The advantage of this option would be only the prevention of alligator access, and no restriction to smaller wildlife. Such an investment might have prevented the most recent potentially fatal local attack.

There has been an experience regarding the presence of two alligators under and around a dock on Dinkens Bayou. They would often show up at dusk, particularly if mullet or sheepshead were present. The problem was how to discourage the pair from returning without causing them any harm. The solution used the dock hose being directed on them. They reacted by trying to bite at the water stream, and when that failed to stop, they quickly swam out of sight. So far this year there have been no return visits.

Everyone can live safely with these creatures by maintaining their habitat, understanding their behavior and using common sense in dealing with any confrontations that may occur.



Identity theft is easy

"It's easier to steal your identity than your purse," Douglas J. Sprotte, Assistant State Attorney, 20th Judicial Circuit of Florida, Economic Crimes Unit, told members of the Sanibel Captiva Sail & Power Squadron at their May meeting. "Americans don't like to be inconvenienced, so they are easy targets," he stated.

"An organized crime cartel from Cuba has the Fort Myers area as one of their main targets," said Sprotte. "There are three reasons people on Sanibel are prime targets. You have retired citizens, you have wealthy citizens, and you put signed checks your mailboxes," he stressed.

"Members of the cartel come from Miami across Route 75 to Lee County. They're hoping you'll put a check in your mailbox. They'll take the check and wash off the payee names with pool chemicals and replace it with their name. The checks amount up to about \$500 or less, and they'll cash 50 or 60 checks a day," Sprotte explained.

Sprotte offered the following tips to protect yourself from identity theft: "Don't put checks in your mailbox, and don't put up the red flag. Keep track of your credit card bill. If you don't receive a credit card bill, it's serious. The thieves will take your bill, pay the minimum payment and mark a change of address to their address. Later,

they'll pay the remainder of the bill and indicate that they would like a card for my friend with their own name and address. Be sure to check your credit quarterly," informed Sprotte.

"They'll also steal your trash and find something useful to them so that they can steal money out of your credit card accounts. Buy a shredder," he said.

According to Sprotte, the cartel is setting up a Cuban theft school in Cape Coral that teaches how to use skimmers in restaurants to steal your credit card numbers. "The going rate is \$25 for skimming a card. They'll hold the credit card number for three months so you can't tell where it was skinned. They target tourists so that no one will see the pattern. They also glue skimmers to gas pumps," he explained.

"We recently seized fourteen computers with 600 identities," Sprotte stated. "Pay attention to what you're doing. Make sure they swipe your card once."

"Questionnaires you get in the mail provide information for more scams. You never pay money to win money," he continued.

"Be aware. Don't use debit cards. A credit card company will charge fifty dollars for a false charge. There is no limit on a debit card," he said.

Suspicious incident: burglary of occupied dwelling

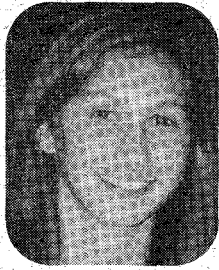

No Florida grass will match your Kentucky blue

Dear Ron: We are moving to the Fort Myers area soon and would like to know the true story of which grass is the best to plant for our new yard. Please give us the advantages and disadvantages of both Bahia and Floritam.

Yaupon holly

Dear Jens and Tricia:

Whichever grass you choose for your new lawn, it will never match the beautiful Kentucky bluegrass you probably have in Louisville. In Florida, the principal choices are Bahia and St. Augustine.

Bahia (*Paspalum notatum*) is a pasture grass introduced to the United States from Brazil 1914. Its advantages are that it will grow in infertile soil and that it requires little maintenance. Its primary disadvantage is its mediocre appearance: Bahia is a yellowish-green grass and does not provide a dense carpet.

Floritam is a variety of St. Augustine (*Stenotaphrum secundatum*), which forms a dense, blue-green lawn. St. Augustine has high salt tolerance, but prefers enriched, well-drained soil for best performance.

Its disadvantages: its broad-blade texture, its high watering requirements, a low tolerance for foot traffic and its susceptibility to chinch bugs.

The Floritam cultivar was introduced in 1973 and is the most-widely planted grass in Florida. However, a new cultivar developed in 1988, Palmetto, is now regarded by most experts as superior to Floritam. Palmetto is more tolerant of shade, cold and drought.

Yaupon holly is a good choice as an unmessy shade tree

Dear Ron: I have two black olive trees that I want to remove, and have received approval to do so from the city. I have to replace them with two native Florida native shade trees. I'm looking for a tree that will hold its leaves and something that will flower but won't drop sap like the black olives. Do you have any suggestions? One tree I saw is a Geiger, and another is a dahoon holly.

— *Neil, Pembroke Pines*

Dear Neil: Black olives (*Bucida buceras*) were introduced en masse to southeast Florida in the 1970s as replacements for the thousands of coconut palms that succumbed to lethal yellowing. I've never been a big fan of this messy native tree. And I've lost my lust for the orange Geiger (*Cordia sebestena*), which most botanists now believe is native to the Caribbean islands, not Florida. While it has pretty flowers, the leaves look awful after a cold winter and it is often victimized by geiger beetles.

I do like the yaupon holly (*Ilex vomitoria*), a Florida native suitable to all areas of the Florida except the Keys. It is a small evergreen tree averaging about 20 feet in mature height and is highly drought-tolerant and salt-tolerant.

Though its flowers are insignificant in appearance, female yaupons produce bright red berries which are favorites of birds; male yaupons have no berries.

Mangoes grow in South Florida and coastal Central Florida

Dear Ron: I had a Hayden mango years ago in Miramar, and wonder if a Hayden would grow up here in Central Florida, or if there is a similar fruit tree that you could recommend.

Dear Pat: It depends where in Central Florida you live. The mango (*Mangifera indica*) is considered adaptable to USDA hardiness zones 9B-11. Coastal Central Florida is in 9B; interior Central Florida is in zone 9A.

If you are in zone 9A, you still have many choices. You can find descriptions of seven zone 9A trees in the „Plants a Glimpse” issue of my

Florida Garden magazine. They are: avocado, black cherry, edible fig, loquat, macadamia, black mulberry and persimmon.

Ants and yellow leaves are sure signs of insect problems

Dear Ron: I have numerous Maui Ixoras planted on the east and west sides of my house and the leaves are slowly turning yellow. Some twigs are also drying up. I've fertilized with ixora plant food and clipped them way back to try to promote new growth. I've also noticed black soot.

I have treated them with Organocide but have not noticed any improvement. Also, there seems to be an abundance of little ants and I'm having a hard time eradicating these.

Are these part of my problem? Help!

— *Jim*

Dear Jim: The black soot (sooty mold) and the ants are clear evidence of an insect problem, which most likely is an infestation of scales, whiteflies, mealybugs or aphids. The insects feed on the undersides of the leaves. They leave behind a sweet, honeydew-like secretion on which the sooty mold (a fungus) grows, and which attracts the ants.

If Organocide doesn't work, try an insecticidal soap such as Safer's, or make your own by mixing a tablespoon of Ivory liquid in a gallon of water.

I don't advise cutting back any plants by more than one-third as a time. You should fertilize with a high-quality palm fertilizer four times a year.

The ixora is native to southern Asia, adaptable to Florida hardiness zones 9B-11, and is slightly salt-tolerant.

Those beautiful trees are royal poincianas

Dear Ron: We were driving in Longboat Key and we saw these beautiful trees. They had fern-like leaves and beautiful red flowers. Can you tell me what they are and possibly where they can be purchased in Florida?

Dear J.C.: The beautiful trees, which put on their flowering show in late spring, are royal poincianas. They are widely available at South Florida nurseries.

In Mexico, the royal poinciana (*Delonix regia*) is known as the “flamboyant tree” for its brilliant orange-red flowers. It is native to Madagascar, suitable for hardiness zones 10 and 11, and is slightly salt-tolerant.

The contest, held in conjunction with "Ding" Darling Days, Oct. 10 through 16, commemorates the birthday of Jay Norwood "Ding" Darling, one of the foremost conservationists in American history and driving force behind Sanibel's eponymous J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge.

Deadline for submission is 4 p.m. Sept. 30, 2004. Complete contest rules are listed below. For an entry form and other contest information, log on to www.dingdarling-society.org and click on "Select a Link," then "Photography Contest" on the drop-down menu. Or contact the Society at dingdarling@iline.com or 239-472-1100, ext. 233. Entries may be delivered in person to J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge or by mail to "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society, One Wildlife Dr., Sanibel, FL 33957.

Only amateur photographers are eligible to enter. (You may not possess a professional photographer tax identification number for the sale of photographs.)

Photos must portray wildlife, scenery, and/or circumstances found within J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge and have been taken within the two previous years.

Photos must be 8" x 10" (or full frame 8" x 12") with an 11" x 14" mat to facilitate display. Frames are not permitted. Please include one 4" x 6" copy of entry.

Each person may enter up to two photos but is eligible to win only one award.

Photos that have won awards in previous "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society photo contests may not be resubmitted.

Judging will be anonymous. Please do not put your name or anything that will identify you on your photo.

Judging criteria:

1. technical excellence (sharpness, lighting, composition, exposure)
2. originality/creativity
3. interest
4. ability to be reproduced for publication

Digital photos are acceptable, however no manipulation of original images is allowed. Any manipulation will result in disqualification of entry.

All photos will become the property of the Society and will not be returned. There is no need to include a return envelope or postage.

In the event that fewer than 16 entries are received, the Wildlife Society reserves the right to cancel the contest.

Up to 13 entries may be chosen as winners. Winners will be posted at the Refuge's Education Center and on the Society's Internet Web site in October. Photos may be used by the Society in any way with appropriate credit.

A Sanibel family's place in history

On Saturday, June 5, 2004 at 2 p.m., history was taking place here on Sanibel. Friedrich N. Jaeger dedicated a small piece of land on Rabbit Road to the late Edmond and Elnora Gavin and family.

A bronze plaque was placed on a stone near the house for Sanibel residents and visitors to view. The plaque acknowledged Edmond and Elnora and their parents, Isiah and Hannah Gavin and Harry and Pearl Walker. It goes on to describe Edmond and Elnora as "one of the pioneer Negro families that settled on Sanibel Island in 1917."

"Being a member of this family makes me proud. I take a lot of pride in the [Gavin] name and its heritage and what has developed on the island," stated Eric Gavin,

a resident of Lehigh Acres and the youngest of Edmond and Elnora's 18 children.

The plaque can be viewed as you pass 716 Rabbit Road, where many struggles were overcome with the leadership and love from Edmond and Elnora. There were a lot of problems among the Gavin household, but all those conflicts were resolved by loving one another.

One lesson the 18 children learned was to always be ready and willing to help others. "My parents made me who I am — a firefighter. I rush to aid others and learned to have a love for everyone, thanks to the way my parents raised my siblings and I," Eric explains.

The entire Gavin family is very grateful for the acknowledgement of their family. "It feels good to know that Jaeger recognized my family. Many people give credit to the Gavin family, but no one has taken a stand to make a landmark out of a house that has made Sanibel history," Eric says.

Thanks to Friedrich Jaeger's efforts to plan and prepare for the homestead dedication. It will always be remembered by the Gavin family.

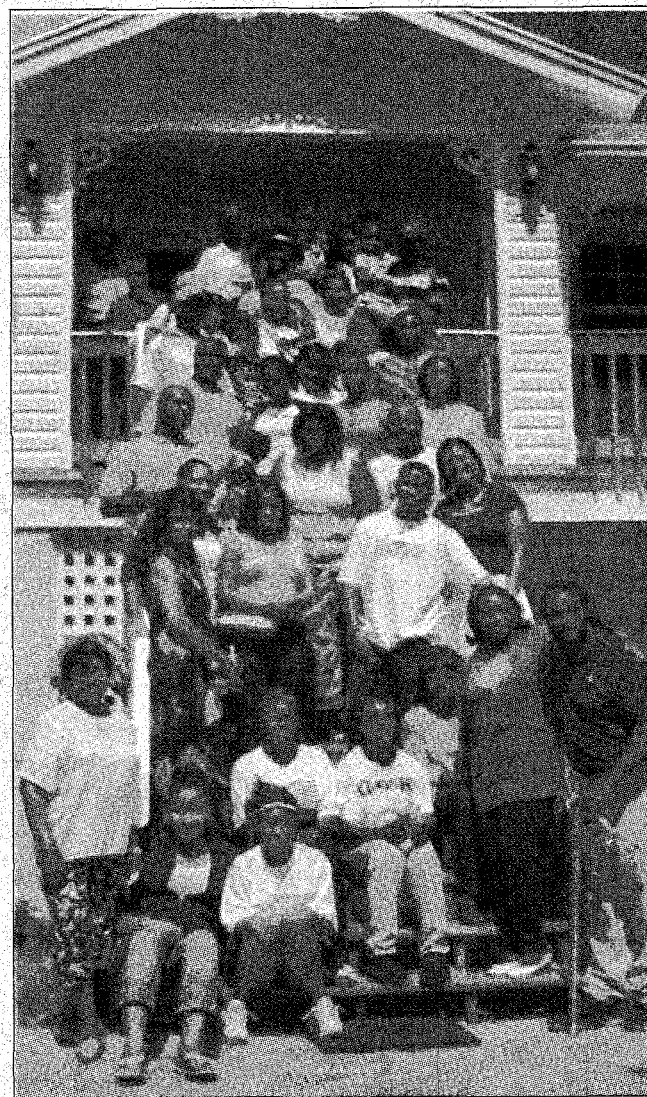

LeBuff has called Sanibel Island his home for more than 45 years. He is the last resident to serve as a light keeper of

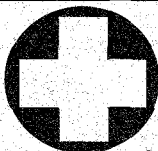

OBITUARY

Terry R. Lautenbach

Terry R. Lautenbach of Sanibel, long time Darien, CT resident and retired IBM senior executive, died Wednesday in Bedford Hills, NY. He was 65. He died of heart failure according to his family. He was with his nephew, Marc Lautenbach, at the time of his death.

Born August 10, 1938 in Cincinnati, OH. Mr. Lautenbach was the second son of the late Frances Herbert and Robert Charles Lautenbach. Mr. Lautenbach graduated from Xavier University in Cincinnati in 1959 and joined IBM that same year.

Mr. Lautenbach and his wife, Carole, moved to Darien in 1974, where they raised their six daughters. He held a variety of senior executive positions while at IBM. When he retired in 1992, he was a senior vice president and a member of the four-person IBM Management Committee. He oversaw a large part of IBM's operations, including its U.S. sales force and its worldwide manufacturing and development. He held a number of marketing and management posts during his rise to become the youngest president of the data processing division in 1976. Afterward, he served in a series of senior positions in the United States and internationally, including chairman IBM Americas, Far East and Group Executive Information Systems and Communication Group.

Mr. Lautenbach left a strong legacy at IBM. Retired IBM Chairman and CEO, John Opel, said of Mr. Lautenbach, "Terry had an extremely bright and quick intellect matched with his sensitive good humor and energy that gave him the ability to be excellent in everything he pursued - family, business, career and social and civic endeavors - every place he added value. We all wanted him on our team."

Part of Mr. Lautenbach's legacy included contributions to the advancement of women and African Americans at IBM. Ted Childs, IBM vice president, said of Mr. Lautenbach, "Terry was committed to all people and ensured that everyone had a fair chance. He hated intolerance and injustice and had a profound impact on my career and ability to do the work that I do at IBM."

Mr. Lautenbach was also an active member of the Darien Community, serving as president of the board of trustees of the Darien Library, Campaign Chairman for the Darien United Way and on his church council. After retiring from IBM, Mr. Lautenbach moved to Sanibel but continued to visit Darien frequently.

Mr. Lautenbach remained active after his retirement, serving as a director on various corporate boards, including Varian Medical Systems, CVS, Footstar, Air Products, and Loomis Sayles. Mr. Lautenbach was an avid golfer and a founding member and first president of the Sanctuary Golf Club on Sanibel.

While known primarily as a leader in the business world, Mr. Lautenbach was most proud of his family, both immediate and extended. He was a beloved husband, father, and grandfather, known to his 13 grandchildren as Poppop. He was at his happiest when surrounded by as many family members as possible.

Mr. Lautenbach is survived by his wife, Carole, for 44 years; his six daughters, Jennifer Streeter of Darien, CT, Susan Bates, Julie Maxman, Martha Lautenbach, Mary Lautenbach, and Anne Stern of Atlanta, GA; three brothers, Ned Lautenbach, Dan Lautenbach, Jim Lautenbach, and one sister, Cynthia Chappell. Mr. Lautenbach's oldest brother, Thom, is deceased. Mr. Lautenbach is also survived by his 13 grandchildren and godsons.

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Monday, June 7, 2004 at Saint Isabel Catholic Church, 3559 Sanibel-Captiva Road, Sanibel. Private inurnment will take place at a later date. Friends may visit with the family from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Sunday at Harvey-Englehardt-Metz Funeral Home, 1600 Colonial Blvd., Fort Myers. and not cleaning up the beach," said Councilman Steve Brown. "I would love to see it that way, but that is not reality."

Brown said looking at only one side of the issue would be a mistake and advised the commission explore the other side and meet with the business community before making a recommendation to the city council.

"I think you have to take baby steps," Brown added. "Try to weigh the scale in what a sanctuary island is and also looking at the commercial aspect, the condos and the people coming here on vacation."

The foundation of Sanibel's economy is its natural resources and of those resources, the beaches are perhaps the island's most visual to visitors and residents.

However, the exceptional amount of algae on the beaches this year raised some concerns among residents.

The condition of the beaches could result in a negative effect on tourism and the occupancy of resorts on the island, Louise Johnson told the commission.

"We need more effort from the city to see what causes red tide and find out why this is happening," Johnson said. Although Johnson said she sympathizes with resort owners over this issue, she said she is not suggesting that the city clean the beaches.

As part of its Coastal Zone Protection Plan, Sanibel has established certain regulations that deal with cleaning its beaches.

To assist both shorebirds and shell-seekers and to maintain the natural function and appearance of the beach, the plan regulates that raking and scrapping of naturally occurring beach wrack should be prohibited except when undertaken or authorized by the city in the interest of public health, safety and welfare.

However, the wrack line, or debris washed onto the shore, often contains nutrients for the wildlife living in that area.

"There are a myriad of invertebrates living in the wrack line that are food for a wide variety of crabs, shorebirds and waiting birds on the beach," Lindblad said. "The wrack line is a very important part of the beach system."

No decisions were made at the conclusion of the discussion. However, the commission plans to take all recommendations into consideration for its report.

Sanibel is located entirely within the Coastal Flood Plain. Because of this, the city has participated in the federal flood program since 1979. Regulations implemented by this program are all included in the Sanibel Plan.

According to the plan, structures built under the current codes should be elevated above or flood-proofed to the 100-year storm's projected wave heights. All structures must be developed in compliance with the Flood and Storm proofing requirements

of the Land Development Code.

Under those regulations, all new construction must be designed and built to withstand wind speeds of 120 mph. Structures must also have foundations deep enough to remain stable should scour or battering from wave action occur. The code also requires all building components to withstand exposure and not weaken the structure by rotting, rusting or deteriorating.

The Planning Commission did not take action on Tuesday's discussion. However, both the Planning Commission and city staff will take these issues into consideration.

"I think it's an interesting issue for the city to wrestle with," Pfalzer said. "It also gives the city the opportunity to change those regulations if it wanted to."
