



Currently at 234, the volunteers gathered at the Sanibel Community House on Friday, March 22 for a luncheon. Former volunteer coordinator J.D. Bolden, down from Maryland for the lunch and Florida sunshine, helped Cindy Anderson hand out the awards to the volunteers.

Jim Sprankle, the president of the "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society, started his

"Ding" Darling Wildlife Society, started his talk with a reference to Bolden. "Before I get too senous," said Sprankle, "I want to ask J.D. if he's worn the signature off his Cal Ripken baseball playing catch."

Sprankle went on to speak about his trip to Washington, D.C. with Molly Krival

and Mike Cuscaden for a conference about Friends Groups. "What was so interesting to me was that 20 percent of the work force at the refuges comes from volunteer," he said. "At 'Ding' Darling volunteers make up the equivalent of 10 full-time jobs. I think that's increalled."

As the volunteers ate the salmon and chicken provided by Mozella Jordan's new catering service, Refuge Manager Rob Jess took the floor. "This refuge is one of the chosen few to have the volunteer backbone that we do," said Jess "It does make a difference - it really does

Jess introduced the new members of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service – Stephanie Brady, Mike Brady, Kendra Willett and James Willett. Jess said they are delighted to have the new personnel, but that "Ding" Darling is still under-

Jess said he is still getting about four calls per day about the bicycle policy.

ity Council has established a list of priorities for 2002-03, and Sanibel citizens will have a chance to provide input on these goals at a spe-

cial Town Hall meeting April 4.
A redevelopment strategy – encompassing the disproportionately large house issue, the Building and Planning Departments, the traffic study and the parks and recreation master plan currently underway, perhaps even a bike master plan – emerged as the top priority in a Council goal-setting workshop March 25.

The remaining six goals, in descending order: public safety, a competitive work force, improved communications, following the chain of command, environmental capital and land acquisition, sound financial management (tied for sixth) and, lastly, Sanibel's sewer system.

In the area of public safety, Council plans to focus on improving police radiocommunications and response to calls, hurricane preparation/recovery and

implementing the management study. City Manager Judie Zimomra, who acted as facilitator during the workshop, said she hopes the police force will be back at full strength very soon. Council member Steve Brown said marine patrolling of Sanibel waters has suffered because of vacancies in the department.

Sanibel also experienced two serious bicycle accidents recently, and the City Manager said bicycle safety is among the top concerns of community groups, "The whole bike issue needs to be look at." according to Mayor Nola Theiss, who was in favor of more education for prevention of bike accidents. Zimomra said the Parks and Recreation Steering Committee probably will request a Bike Master Plan for

Development of a competitive City work force addresses morale and employee benefits and retirement packages. It dovetails with one of Council's previously stated goals: establish a positive work environment and create job satisfaction through employee evaluation programs and merit bonuses. Zimomra said "pay for performance" is high on her list of goals.

Council members agreed that improving communications between residents, businesses and government was a top priority. The City web site was included under the communications goals, and it was suggested that perhaps citizens could

apply for building permits via computer. Management of volunteers also fell into this category.

Council agreed to follow the chain of command and refrain from micro managing. So far, Zimomra said the members have been "perfect" in not interfering with day-to-day operations of the City. Sound financial management encompasses both long term reserves and funding for capital projects and overlaps into the next goal, environmental capital and land acquisition. Council plans to explore financial opporfunities available for beach renourishment, the Sanibel Gardens project and alternate fuel sources.

Brown said the City should become more aggressive in acquiring lands to preserve and protect wildlife, a goal that will be referred to the Wildlife Committee for study and recommendations.

Finally, the City's sewer system, the "largest expenditure we've ever done," according to Council member Marty Harrity, should be closely monitored. This goal includes determining the City's capacity to manage expenses and the selling of effluent water. Members debated the benefits of having a separate water and sewer system and discussed the potential for consolidating the two

The Town Hall meeting is scheduled for Thursday, April 4, beginning at 7 p.m. at the Sanibel Community House, Past goals will be reviewed, the new 2002-03 goals will be presented and public comment will be heard. A brief written summary on the work of each City committee will be available.

At a special meeting prior to the work-shop March 25, Council voted 5-0 to authorize the execution of an amended and restated interlocal agreement between Sanibel and Lee County governing the bridges and Causeway.





#### Citizen Input Welcome At Town Hall Meetina

n April 4, the Sanibel City Council is sponsoring a Town Meeting. It will be held at the Community House, 2173 Periwinkle Way, at 7 pm.

The purpose of the meeting is to get public input on City Council's proposed goals for 2002-2003. This will give us a clear idea of the community's priorities, which will help immeasurably in shaping our goals. To facilitate the dialogue, a review of last year's goals and a written summary covering the work of each City Committee: Five-Year Budget Projection Review, Historical Preservation, Marine Advisory, Parks and Recreation

Stewardship, Traffic, Vegetation, and Wildlife will be available.

This has been a very busy year in City government. In the last 12 months, we have hired a City Manager; conducted a management assessment of the police department; are currently conducting a similar assessment of the planning and building departments; and have successfully negotiated contracts with our City employees. Also, negotiations with the County have resulted in a favorable interlocal agreement on the Causeway. And the purchase of "Pond Apple Park," formerly known as the Mariner parcel, was approved by the voters and financed in part by a Florida Community Trust grant to the City

City Council is now taking a close look at its long range plans in the areas of Parks and Recreation, Traffic, User Fees, Disproportionate Houses and a Redevelopment Master Plan and has benefited from the input of citizens through surveys, public hearings and discussions

Also, as our City matures, we must consid-7 er the ramifications of the fact that many City employees are approaching retirement age and that a number of citizens have indicated a desire for increased City

These are challenging issues which must be resolved. All of them require, and have received, the cooperation and effort of City Council, City staff and citizen input. Discussions have often reflected differing but legitimate points of view. City Council is nonetheless prepared both to engage the difficult long-range issues and to deal as well with situations which require immediate attention.

Council needs and welcomes citizen participation at all levels, and we invite everyone to the Town Meeting on April 4 at 7 pm. Come and listen to our proposed goals and share your ideas with us This is an opportunity for all to participate in City government in a positive and open way We hope to see you there!



at all aspects of this issue," said Jess. "It has not been an easy decision, but we're going to adhere to this policy. Safety is most important."

The Wildlife Service is currently working on three projects to improve the refuge: 1) running a fiber optic cable to the observation tower 2) building a new handicapped-accesible tower and 3) adding a second tower.

Jess addressed law enforcement by asking volunteers not to get in over their heads. "Things can go bad in a heartbeat," he said. "I want you to be a good set of eyes. Inform, don't enforce."
Indigo Trail will be resurfaced with a

new hard-packed surface.
Cindy Anderson closed the day with some reminders: 1) Wildlife Drive is oneway for bicycles 2) parking is only on the right side of the road 3) there are no bodies of fresh water on the left side of Wildlife Drive and 4) motorcycles are permitted on Wildlife Drive.



n April 13 the Community
Center of Sanibel will once again

art gallery for the second annual Sanibel

area's finest artists. World-renowned
artist Darryl Pottorf of Captiva will be

Darryl Pottorf has been producing visually provocative forms of art for more than three decades. Pottorf was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1952, and grew up in Florida. After financing his education at Florida State University by painting and building homes and commercial properties, Darryl made Florence, Italy his home from 1976 to 1978.

In the late 70s Pottorf returned to Florida and established his studio creating art that reflected his appreciation of architecture and classical art. In the 80's he began experimenting with more minimal expressionistic paintings and by the late 90's Pottorf expanded his palette to include color. Pottorf began transferring color images onto paper mounted on poly-laminate, sometimes painting over the images with a grid of crisp lines. The images appear beneath a powdery veil

that subdues color and form. The paintings have the physical attributes of oil on canvas and the surface delicacy of watercolor.

The artist Robert Rauschenberg has said of Pottorf's work: "Darryl Pottorf's works are some of the most provocative visual creations on the contemporary scene. These paintings are proof and witness of change even when no one is watching. The fixed images have the


appearance of an archeological dig that seems to be uncovered within the surface "





Dunlop Road, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Dr. Sanders will discuss challenges and opportunities facing our schools, with special focus on topics of interest not only to parents, but to all Sanibel citizens, whose taxes fund local and area schools. Some of these topics include school choice, upgrade of Sanibel School facilities, com-

parison of FCAT test scores, and "best practices," a method for collecting information from other school systems, and applying those practices that help optimize school resources and quality.

The Forum will include a question and answer segment for audience questions and discussion, which will be moderated by COTI past president Armand Ball. COTI seeks to make the event one in which islanders can both receive and pro-

vide input on a full range of school issues. John W. Sanders, Ed.D., became superintendent of Lee County schools last September. Prior to that he was superintendent of Hernando County, FL, a position he also held in school districts in Mississippi and Michigan. He has also been a school principal, teacher and coach, as well as an associate in an architectural firm that specialized in school

As superintendent here in Lee County, Dr. Sanders serves as chief executive offi-cer of a PK-12 school district with 62,000 students, 8,000 employees, and a budget of \$660 million

All are invited to the COTI Forum to



hear Dr. Sanders and to participate in the discussion that follows.

This Forum is part of COTI's ongoing effort, over a period of years, to contribute to quality education in this area. Other examples have included 1998 endorsement of school board candidates supported by Citizens for Quality Education; the COTI Board position, taken last year, urging the County to adopt impact fees to fund school construc-tion (the fees have since been approved); and discussions begun in January of this year with County school officials and school board members on the application of a Best Practices program to optimize the use of school resources. 

decisions about the future direction that the City will take with respect to beach restoration and renourishment. Each Council member has been briefed on the contents of the draft reports and will decide at their April 2 meeting whether to accept the reports for deliberation. No decisions or actions on report recommendations are anticipated at the meeting, according to one source.

City Manager Judie Zimomra empha-

City Manager Judie Zimomra emphasized that the reports at this point are very preliminary and in draft form. "A lot of changes could be made before the report is finalized," she added.

Council deliberations will determine the future course the City will take on management of island beaches including the possibility of a long-term financial commitment to continually renourish beaches and if that decision is made, who will pay for it

The issue of beach restoration on Sanibel began with the first project in the Gulf Pines-Gulf Shores area in 1996 when severe erosion threatened several homes. The City policy at the time was not to intervene in natural events. The City suggested that threatened homes be moved further inland away from the threatening surf. Armoring of the beach with bulkheads and sea walls was prohibited. The City permitted several homes to use sandbags as an emergency measure but the surf quickly destroyed the bags. Beachfront owners in the area turned out force at City Council meetings. The

issue spawned the Sanibel Chapter of the Florida Shore and Beach Preservation Association, a statewide organization, in a common cause effort led primarily by beachfront owners. The City ultimately approved a restoration project costing approximately \$2.4 million to be paid for by the establishment of a special taxing district that assessed beachfront owners 82 percent (approximately \$2 million). The balance came from volunteer donations, (approximately \$195,000) Lee County Tourist Development Council and the City of Sanibel. Neither Federal nor State funds was available since there were no public accesses in the project area.

Now, six years later, engineers have generally deemed the project a success. The beach remains intact with varying degrees of erosion depending on location. The project has not been tested with a hurricane, however No major hurricanes have hit the Island during that period although there has been tropical storm activity. The engineers predicted in 1996 that the project would only have a life of six to eight years and a second renourishment would be necessary. But City Council at the time cautioned residents in that area not to assume a precedent had been set to continually renourish the

The current study, which addresses the benefits derived from beach renourishment, also suggests a payment formula for the cost of the new project, which, according to the report, will be approximately \$4 million. The cost of the 2003 project is higher than the 1996 project because an additional 1,300 feet of beach

along West Gulf Drive is included. The report defines a benefit of over \$17 million that accrues to various property owners island wide, including the City and the County, from a new renourishment project.

Based on those benefits, which Stronge defines as storm protection and recreation, the report assigns a dollar value to the four entities that shared in the cost of the 1996 project. (See chart) These benefits, Stronge's report says, "will show up as enhancement of property values beyond the levels they would have attained in the absence of the project." According to the report, the value of properties protected by the 1996 project was \$25 million. The value of those prop erties will rise to \$53.7 million in 2003 with the new project. Adding in the value of the properties along the additional 1,300 feet of heach to be renourished (\$21.8 million), the total value of properties protected rises to \$75 5 million.

The significance of the apportionment of costs rests with the change in the percentages assigned to the various paying entities from the first project. In 1996 Gulf front owners were assessed 82 percent of the total cost Stronge's report assigns them 65 percent for the 2003 project since that is the estimated percentage of the benefit they receive from the project. Gulf front owners have lobbied the City for a fairer formula for future projects Gulf front owners' tentative assessment for the project will total over \$2.5 million with 43 individual owner assessments ranging from \$14,000 to over \$103,000.

Off beach neighboring property owners were not included in the 1996 assessment, but in a 2003 project, 178 off beach owners in Gulf Shores, Gulf Pines and upper West Gulf Drive will be assessed slightly over five percent of the total project cost, approximately \$205,000. Assuming City Council approves the apportionment formula, individual assessments will range from \$192 to \$2,377, depending on their location

Lee County's share jumps a whopping six fold in the 2003 project. The City's share, which includes residents outside the project area, rises slightly from a percentage standpoint from the 1996 share but doubles in actual dollars from approximately \$250,000 to over \$500,000. The City's share for 1996 shown in the chart was reduced by Tourist Development Council and voluntary contribution money. It is unlikely that voluntary contributions will be available for the 2003 project since virtually all the people who donated in 1996 will now be assessed

Stronge could not be reached for comment, but Coastal Engineer Ken Humiston echoed Zimomra saying, "The reports are very preliminary."



The board of directors elected Mike Gillespie president succeeding Tom Gilhooley, whose term on the board expired with last week's meeting.



#### Renourishment

onto beaches to stem the erosion that threatens low lying coastal areas Controversy has surrounded the issue as opponents decry the negative environmental effects of dredging the nation's beaches. The costs of beach renourishment on a national basis have skyrocketed in recent years. According to government figures, rebuilding the nations' beaches topped \$125 million in the year 2000. Some estimates say that almost \$2 billion

has been spent in the past decade with \$5.5 billion estimated for future projects Local governments are budgeting millions of dollars in taxpayer money to fund the local portions of these projects. Lee County alone is budgeting over \$80 million for beach projects in the next 10 years, according to Steve Boutelle, natural resource manager for the County. Federal, State and County funds normally are used only where public access is available. Critics of these projects argue that in many cases the money being spent on renourishment far exceeds the value of the structures they are protecting and equate

them with using taxpayer money to build sand castles that wash away in the first storm Proponents answer that renourishment protects property values and maintains the recreational function of beaches that draws visitors and therefore maintains the local economy. There is little agreement by the opposing sides about the environmental effect of dredging the beaches. Both sides support their arguments with data that they claim is irrefutable.

Zimomra said the City will have about six months to debate the issue but time will be a critical factor. "If the project is

approved we can tie into the Captiva Renourishment project scheduled for late 2003, we can save \$800,000 in mobilzation costs," she said

The draft report on the Renourishment Project is on the agenda for 2 pm at the April 2 City Council meeting.


am pleased to report that the water temperatures in the gulf reached 74 degrees last week and that the fishing improved, as predicted. The only problem is that a cold front on Friday knocked the temp back down and

the fishing kind of shut down for a couple of days. During the few short days that it was up the fishing was terrific. We caught the king mackerel as predicted. We got some real nice ones on deadbait and trolling lures and spoons, and ballyhoo. While trolling ballyhoo 15 miles off of the island on the downrigger we had another great surprise. We caught a real nice dol-phin and Harold Miller and family of Captiva had a nice Mahi-Mahi dinner that night. The dolphin might have been a fluke but the nice clean blue water that comes off of the loop current in the gulf was not. This clean blue water that moves up here from the Yucatan Peninsula can bring in every type of Pelagic into the area. King, dolphin, and even sailfish can run in this blue water on their way to the northern and central gulf where they will spend their summer and fall. It is possible that if you go out into this water far enough you might even run into a white or blue marlin or swordfish. These are the fish that we will be looking for as we work our way further and further into the central gulf to the edge of the shelf which plummets to depths of 6000 feet. That is right, six thousand feet. The edge of that shelf is about 120 miles out and is referred by us who venture out there as the edge. It is quite an adventure to go there because you never know what you may run into on one of these hunting trips.

#### The snook are still running on the small side, but showing up in greater numbers.

I have a good friend, Capt. Mike Malay, whose is setting up a chart divided into five mile squares starting at 75 miles out and into the middle gulf. He is setting up a website that will be used by venturous anglers to report their catches in these waters and we will get this shared information from the internet so that we can all benefit from the knowledge of each other. We are truly excited about this, because it is difficult to know who is venturing out there and what kind of fish there their adventure came up with. If you need further information about this please call me

at 472-6089. Inshore and Backbay: Reports are that Capt. Dave Godfrey is catch as many as 20 nice redfish on some of his trips. Capt. Jimmy Burnsed, and his dad, Capt Jimbo Burnsed are having lots of great trips. The snook are still running on the small side, but or showing up in greater numbers. There are still some gator sized trout out there. The large shrimp that we have right now are paying off and the bait schools are getting better to net at this time. Dick, who stays at Jensen's every year and fishes on the dock every day, has caught lots of nice grouper and hit a tarpon right off of the dock last week. So as you can see the water temps have improved the fishing greatly, and some better tides should make the fishing very good in the next couple of weeks. Good Fishing!☆



#### 26The Simple Language Of Orchids

#### Ludisia (loo-DIS-ee-ah) discolor (Achille Richard) 'Jewel Orchid'

any orchids grow with inconspicuous leaves bereft of worthy attention until the plant bursts into bloom. Not so for the jewel orchid. The foliage reddish green, dark purple, or brown-patterned — as if an artist had painted the thin parallel line of the colorful leaves and then shadowed in

and then shadowed in red tones with white accents — is the excitement for this lesser known orchid. The orchid is beloved foremost for its fabulous, year-round multicolored leaves. I have found several of mine with slightly different leaf color tones. Ads promoting jewel orchids many times never mention their miniature lovely whitish, one-half inch asymmetrical flowers dotted with yellow lips, borne on eight to ten inches erect or sometimes twisted, long, one inch wide stalks.

Dr. John Lindley, noted botanist, in 1826 gave it the synonym "Haemaria discolor" using the Greek word meaning "blood red" for the undersides of the leaves. He dedicated the orchid in 1826 to the Spanish botanist Don Luis de Terres. This is one of the more exciting things Lindley accomplished. In the times of 1800, or there-about, other orchid men were off to exciting trips, of course, rich (from inheritances) — on massive ships accompanied by, no less than full orchestras and their packs of hound dogs. These explorers always dressed in formal wear for dinner, spent their days searching — accomplished by guides — dangerous jungles for rare, exclusive orchids to add to their collections. Meantime, poor Lindley was back in his lab naming and renaming orchids and other plants.

Ludisia discolor found in India, Indonesia and the Indochinese peninsula are not always listed in orchid books. I sometimes find them under Haemaria, genera Goodyerinae. They are an Asiatic orchid for warm climates that prefers humidity to dryness. The best plants are cultivated from small offshoots. Try to find a massive old plant as this orchid is slow growing. I do not find this a difficult terrestrial orchid to grow as we appear to have the perfect setting. Most books will differ from my experiences.

I use a shallow basket or pot, filled with rich-light in texture—potting materials, humus and a few chunks of charcoal. Pot the plant with bottom leaves above the soil line. The jewel orchid, a small-medium terrestrial, has no pseudobulbs so it can not continued on page 28



store water. Therefore, it must be keep 23 moist but not soggy or it will rot. The growth habit of creeping stems on top of the soil will cause the stems to cascade over the container. As to culture, I keep it moist, in the

#### 34 Celebrating The Sweetest Sounds Of Richard Rodgers

by Pamela Gilbert Wortzel

his year marks the centennial celebration of the birth of Richard Rodgers, the legendary giant of the American musical theater Rodgers, in collaboration first with Lorenz Hart and later with Oscar Hammerstein, created the music for many of the best known and best loved hits of 20th century musical theater His career spanned more than six decades and earned him countless accolades including numerous Oscars, Tonys, Emmys, Grammys and Pulitzers. During his remarkably prolific career he wrote more than 900 published songs and 40 Broadway musicals

Born in New York City in 1902, he began his professional collaboration with lyricist Lorenz Hart in 1920. Together, the two produced a string of musical hits that included On Your Toes, Babes In Arms and Pal Joey Hart died in 1943 and Rodgers went on to become an icon of musical theater through his long and fruitful collaboration with lyricist Oscar Hammerstein. Their 1943 hit, Oklahomal, ushered in a new era in musi-cal theater and also became the first in a series of phenomenally successful Broadway musicals which included Carousel, South Pacific, The King and I,

Flower Drum Song and The Sound of

The sounds of Richard Rodgers, which seem to have been playing somewhere in the background of our lives as long as most of us can remember, are the basis for the latest production at Sanibel's Old Schoolhouse Theater. In a show conceived and staged by JT Smith and directed by Artie D'Alessio, the cast pays tribute to Rodgers' musical acumen with a selection of mostly well known tunes that span

the years of his collaborations with Hart and Hammerstein. Musical director and accomplished planist Ken Jones, accompanied by the energetic Miguel Cintron on percussion, provides the musical founda-

tion of the show. Old Schoolhouse familiar faces Jeff March and Erik Hogan are joined on stage by newcomers Kathryn Stefanic and Samantha Rotella. Lighting and scenic designer Evan Tuttle has created a perfect background for the American-as-apple-pie world of Rodgers' musicals. A yellow clapboard exterior of a house with blue trim, a white picket fence, flowers, and an ivy covered trellis form an idealized setting for this musical tribute Although some of Rodgers' musicals took place in faraway lands, the dreams and aspirations of the characters always reflected a very American way of looking at the world.

From where I sat I could see the audiences' expressions of pure enjoyment as they recognized their old favorites Spirited tunes from Oklahoma! included Oh What a Beautiful Morning and June is Bustin' Out All Over. Nothing Like a Dame from South Pacific is still a great tune Sung by Hogan and March, this humorous lament by soldiers stuck on an island during the war holds up well after so many years Other great numbers from South Pacific include Wash That Man Right Out of My Hair and Honey Bun Don't Marry Me from Flower Drum Song, featuring the four cast members, still holds up well also Lovely romantic ballads include Love Look Away and

Some Enchanted Evening.
A comical rendition of Blue Moon features Jeff March as an Elvis-like crooner accompanied by three "gals" in 50's garb One of the "gals" turned out to be a bewigged and bespectacled Erik Hogan who always shines in these comic turns. Costumes by Marilyn St John exude glamour when glamour is needed and are always appropriately goofy for the comical

All four performers have great stage presence and singing voices Remarkably, they manage to deftly execute their dance







not a valuable plant, pull on it if it comes out of the ground easily, it is a valuable

One Easter as my grandchildren were searching for Easter eggs in the front yard, my daughter-in-law saw a variety of small plants in the grass and she said, "I can't believe Mother has let all these weeds grow in her yard." So she obligingly pulled them all up and showed me proudly. I said "Oh gee, those are flowers – I just let them grow where they were happy. Needless to say she does not pull up

### Rauschenberg At Edison College

The Gallery of Fine Art, Edison College, is pleased to welcome back world-renowned artist Robert Rauschenberg. This exhibit, titled "Robert Rauschenberg: Recent Work" is taken from Rauschenberg's most recent series of paintings, titled Short Stories, which was executed between 2000 and 2002. The exhibit will open March 28 and run through April 28. The exhibit opens to the public on March 28 with a reception in the Gallery from 6 to 9 p.m. Kat Epple will perform and the docents of the Gallery will provide refreshments.

Rauschenberg, often cited as the most important artist of his generation, did more than any other artist to reach beyond contemporary thinking by challenging limits, perceptions, and every other boundary in sight. After all, this is the artist who erased a deKooning drawing, created a tire impression on paper with John Cage, worked extensively with the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, ushered in "Happenings" and "Pop Art," and influenced virtually all artistic thinking since Abstract Expressionism.

A career retrospective was organized by and displayed at the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York and the Guggenheim Museum, Soho, in late 1997. The exhibit of more than 400 pieces showed Rauschenberg from 1948 to the present. In the 50 years of relentless pursuit of imagery,

Rauschenberg's mark of free association and experimentation is seen on painting, performance, collage, sculpture, printmaking, and photography. It was Rauschenberg's first retrospective since 1976 and one of the largest exhibitions ever held of work by a living artist. Following the New York opening the exhibit began touring with stops in Houston, Texas, as well as venues in Germany and Spain.

The exhibit at The Gallery of Fine Art, Edison College, is comprised of 15 large format pieces, measuring 85 and one half inches by 61 inches, that were completed between 2000 and 2002. The mixed media work, all on polylaminate, was executed using a pigment transfer process or vegetable dye transfer process, and also incorporates acrylic and/or graphite. The highly technical process Rauschenberg uses to create his work was developed at his Captiva studio. The process includes creating, on a film, computer-driven soluble (transferable) laser images of Rauschenberg's own photographs. Those laser images are then used by Rauschenberg in creating his paintings.

To make this exhibit more accessible to the students and faculty at Edison Community College and to the greater Fort Myers area, the normal days of operation are being extended to include

Mondays.



Tincreased-density multi-family units. The resolutions recommend that City Council adopt amendments to the Sanibel Code permitting the proposed 12-unit affordable housing development known as Woodhaven (at unassigned 800 Casa Ybel Road).

Commissioners closed the public hearing in the matter March 12.
Construction of Woodhaven, scheduled

to begin within the year, moves the City a step closer to its goal of having 95 BMRH units in place 15 years from now when Sanibel is estimated to reach build out.

Currently there are 52 affordable housing units on the island, according to Jan Hyatt, executive director of Community Housing and Resources, Inc., the agency which administers the affordable housing

program.
The 3.07-acre parcel owned by CHR was removed from the Interior Wetlands Conservation District last year to allow for increased density housing. Earlier this month City Council waived application fees for the Woodhaven project.

Woodhaven also has been referred to as "Casa Mariposa II" because it will resemble closely the Casa Mariposa development completed in mid-2000 at 2301 Periwinkle Way. That \$1.2 million affordable housing project has been cited by the State of Florida as an "excellent example of attractive, well-designed and well-maintained affordable housing," Hyatt said.

"The residents love Casa Mariposa." She added that the Florida Housing Coalition based in Tallahassee is featuring Casa Mariposa and other Sanibel examples in a new booklet to be used statewide to combat what Hyatt called "NIMBY-ism" (not in my back yard) objections to afford-

able housing.
The new Woodhaven project is planned as an adult development, mostly single adults and some couples.

In one of the shortest session on record, the Planning Commission adopted its summer meeting schedule, voting to cancel one of two meetings in each of the summer months. Legislative and quasijudicial business will be combined in one meeting on the second Tuesday of each of the four months: June 11, July 9, August 13 and September 10. A second monthly meeting may be called as necessary.

When questioned about the "light" summer agenda, Ken Pfalzer of the Planning Department said most permits are short form/staff issued and do not require Commission attention. Applicants want to receive permitting quickly and thus conform to City Codes rather than seek variances.

Most people know "variances are getting tougher and tougher" to obtain, according to Commission Vice Chair Marie Gargano.

Pfalzer said that over the summer he expects two commercial development applications to come before the Commission. "You haven't seen this in a while," he added.

A Planning Commission hearing scheduled for April 9 will determine whether the

8.61 acres composing Pond Apple Park are placed into the Environmentally Sensitive Lands Conservation District, a move which would restrict the parcels from being used for anything other than

passive activities.

The former "Mariner" property was acquired by the City after voters approved the purchase in a referendum last November.

Commissioner Jack Samler cautioned against the ESL designation until Sanibel's Parks and Recreation Master Plan is complete. It could turn out the City may want to use the land for some other recreational purpose, he said

Pfalzer also reported that his department is close to selecting a consulting firm to study the disproportionately large house







Tiktor Schreckengost, regarded as one of the giants of the age of v industrial design, spoke for 90 minutes at BIG ARTS on Thursday, March 21 about his life as an artist and an inventor.

With his wife, Gene at his side, the 95year-old icon spoke about his memories of work and travel in the United States and Europe. The audience hung on his every word, though Schreckengost kept saying, "I hope I'm not boring you."
Schreckengost designed a multitude of

everyday appliances such as bicycles, flashlights, lawn chairs and dinnerware. He created the first cab-over-engine truck. He came up with new concepts for the printing press.

Schreckengost's fingerprints are all over America. The story is told that one morning when the inventor was on his way to work he counted 32 things he had designed, including a lawn mower, tractor and a light fixture. His bicycles and pedal cars gave millions of children hours of recreation.

Like Carl Jung and Pablo Picasso, Schreckengost is a marvel not only for the works done in his prime, but for his longevity. He is still inventing, creating, and designing in his 90s.

The audience warmed to him at once as he spoke with eloquence and wit. He did not get frustrated when he couldn't hear questions from the audience, but waited until his wife spoke into his ear. He kept going back to the excitement of his

career. "It was fun all the time," he said.

"I just thought it was outstanding, the range of his contributions," said Andy Priem, who made the trip out to Sanibel from Fort Myers Beach "He was very lucid in his explanations and had a good sense of humor."

His most farmous work is the Jazz Bowl. This work was commissioned by Eleanor Roosevelt, though Schreckengost wasn't aware of the part played by the First Lady until later. When he first spoke to her on the phone, she said she wanted a bowl that was "New Yorkish." She was pleased with his production, and told him she would like a bowl for Hyde Park and

the White House He told a funny story applying to a school in Vienna. School officials wanted him to come to Europe for an interview, but Schreckengost told them he

wouldn't pay the travel expenses unless they guaranteed him a spot They told him to get a ticket, they would take him. When he arrived the officials told him they would charge him 25 times the regu-

lar fee.

"I said goodbye, but when they said that only came to \$72, I said, I'll stay,' Schreckengost recalled

During World War II Schreckengost served in the Navy and worked on radar equipment. He flew into France during the Battle of the Bulge, and made topographical maps of aerial photographs.

The Schreckengosts frequently winter in Sanibel. This year they came in the middle of January. The couple returned to their home in Cleveland, Ohio on Tuesday, March 26.な







### **Bob Janes NAMI** Meeting Speaker

ental Health Court was the focus of NAMI Lee County's general education meeting with Lee County Commissioner Bob Janes on March 11. Listeners gathered at St. Hilary's Episcopal Church.

NAMI Chapter President Mary Lou Weddle introduced Bob Janes who spoke about a mental health court being established in Fort Myers, referring to it as "one of my favorite areas of accomplishment." The special court procedure, presided over by a judge can involve an incarcerated individual in a treatment plan, preventing further criminal behavior. Eventually the special courts will reduce the county's jail population.

A Mental Health Court is expected to be functioning here by the end of March. A doctor, family, police or others may recommend adults who are arrested for misdemeanors to have a court evaluation before the case even comes to trial. According to a psychiatric team evaluation the individual may be offered an alternative of having appropriate treatment and medication in lieu of incarceration. The program is unavailable to DUI and spousal abuse offenders.

Much work is needed at the advocacy and legislative levels of government for appropriate housing and the necessary medications in order to achieve the mental health court objectives. Volunteers are being recruited by NAMI to participate in furthering the mental health court goals.

### Island Mural Sells

Island aerial photographer and digital artist Matt Stein recently sold a framed, 20 inch by 36 inch print of his Sanibel Airphoto Mural for \$1,100 to a Sanibel couple. The print is one of only ten original printing proofs - five unlaminated and five laminated - which will ever be offered for sale. In beautiful blues and greens, each depicts a map-like aerial view of Sanibel, Captiva and the surrounding waters and land areas compiled from 102 aerial photographs. These include Stein's best photos from the 1990s, which took eight years to collect. The totally seamless, color-matched digital mosaic required six months to create.

This is the same image which can be seen in a mounting six feet high by 10 feet long in the conference room at the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation.

### Really! At Our Age What's A Body To Do? Part Two

ast week's column offered some of the alternative views on Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT), this week's column is on alternative views on mammography

Dr Donald Berry, chairman of the department of biostatistics at M. D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, testified in February before a joint session of two U.S. Senate subcommittees which were investigating the conflicting recommendations on mammograms from recent studies. A New York Times article of February 28, indicated the subcommittees were particularly questioning experts about a Danish study which had found serious flaws in seven previous breast cancer studies which indicated that mammograms prevented breast cancer deaths starting at age 40. In his testimony, Dr. Berry was quoted as saying, "Recent scientific studies showed that the benefits of mammograms did not outweigh the risks, which include

unnecessary surgery to remove tumors that might not have threatened a woman's life."

On January 23, an independent panel of experts, called the P.D.Q. board, which writes for the National Cancer Institute's online database, seemed to agree with the findings of the Danish group in casting doubt on the validity of the prior studies. The chairman of the panel is Dr. Berry and he is outspoken about his reservations, Screening programs bring in patients, it isn't just the mammography, but it's the biopsies, the surgeries and the like. We know that screening is exquisitely fine at finding cancers. Therefore it brings in patients and they demand treatment." He narrowed the question further, "The problem is if the women who have mammograms fare no better or do even worse because of excessive treatment


than women who are not screened."
In January of 2000 the controversial report by Danish researchers was published in the British medical journal Lancet. According to an article this February in the Washington Post, the report concluded, "screening for breast cancer with mammography is unjustified." The reason the Danish researchers cited was that it does not reduce mortality in the population that is screened. In October of 2001, after considerable criticism, two Danish scientists of the Nordic Cochrane Center in Copenhagen reiterated their previous findings, "There is no reliable scientific evidence that screening for breast cancer reduces mortality.

Another study was conducted by Laura Esserman of the University of California among American and British radiologists testing each of their skills in analyzing the same mammography films. The study indicates that those physicians who see the greatest number of films each month are the most efficient in finding actual tumors and therefore order the fewest biopsies. The results showed that British physicians were the most efficient in reading the films. This could reflect on the practice of socialized medicine in Britain; they order less biopsies due to lack of financial incentives and have less fear of malpractice lawsuits.

Some in the medical community are posing hard questions about mammograms and pointing out that the risks are often not in the tests but in the treatments - chemotherapy, surgery and radiation – when malignancies are found. Gina Kolata, a science writer for the New York Times, wrote in an arti-cle in February entitled The Painful Fact of Medical Uncertainty, "But what if mammograms are picking up tumors that would never threaten a woman's life, and would otherwise never have been noticed – or treated? What if mammograms are finding tumors that could be treated just as well a few years later, forcing the woman to spend those years with the dreadful knowledge that she has

breast cancer?"
Virginia L. Ernster, professor of epidemiology at the school of medicine at the University of California in a New York Times article, Mammograms and Personal Choice posed a different con-cern, the risks of false positives (mammograms which erroneously indicate the presence of cancer) and the potential for diagnosing and treating breast cancers with surgery or radiation which possibly "may never have progressed to become symptomatic during a patient's lifetime In the article Ernster wrote, "Various studies find that 80 percent to 95 percent of mammographic abnormalities turn out not to be cancer lates into hundreds of thousands going through the anxious experience of an abnormal test until the final result is known."\$



### Treasure Coin Show At The Cedar Chest

fascinating collection of authentic ancient collector and shipwreck Cedar Chest on Monday, April 1 and Tuesday, April 2 from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. These coins, valued at over a million dollars, will be available for sale. Included in the show are: Shipwreck Atocha "pieces of eight," 1715 Fleet "Doubloons;" Ancient Greek and Roman silver and gold; Alexander the Great, 336 to 323 B.C.; the Roman Emperors; Biblical Judean "Widow's Mites;" Dutch Ducats; Portuguese Reis and many other valuable coins

Among the rarest of the coins are two from Fort Worth a gold doubloon escudo from the Atocha shipwreck in 1622 and another from the Margarita. Also of interest to coin collectors and treasure aficionados is a cluster of 25 silver coins that looks as though it had just been discovered at the bottom of the sea. According to John Pollard of the Cedar Chest, it's very unusual to find this size and quality of a collection in Southwest Florida.

All coins are guaranteed to be genuine and are accompanied by a Certificate of Authenticity from the American Numismatic Association. The coins are mounted in heirloom quality mountings; some are set in 14k or 18k gold with precious stones such as diamonds and emeralds. The coins are ready to be worn as pendants, earrings, rings, bracelets and cuff links. During the two day event there will be a drawing for a free treasure coin which will be given away to the winner.

Each of the coins tells a bit of a story about a distant time in history. The silver Julius Caesar Coin, minted around 49 to 44 B.C., depicts an elephant treading on a snake. It is propaganda on Caesar's part against his enemy, Metellus Scipio, whose family sponsored coinage featuring snakes. The elephant symbolizes the power of Rome: the snake is no match for its might. On the reverse side are the articles of the Office of Pontiff Maximus, the head of the board of priests which directed the state religion laws and legislature.

Another coin with great historical significance is the gold Alexander III the Great coin. Alexander the Great, who conquered the world by age 36 (and also died at the age of 36) is believed to be the first man to put his own likeness on a coin. He was known to give these coins to generals that won battles for him. Athena, the goddess of wisdom and battle, is on the front of the coin and Nike, the goddess of victory, is pictured on the reverse side. Also included in the show is the Alexander the Great Silver Drachma, which depicts Alexander as Hercules wearing a lion skin headdress On the reverse side is Zeus seated on his throne and holding an eagle. Alexander, who believed he was the son of Zeus, is likening himself to Hercules, the strongest man in Greek mythology.

Minted around 100 B.C. is the Roma

silver coin which portrays the bust of Roma, the patron goddess of Rome, which dates back to pagan times. Rome still uses Roma as a symbol and her likeness is printed on modern day coins. On the reverse side is a four horse chariot with a charioteer. Another coin of interest is the Widow's Mite which dates back to biblical times. This copper coin depicts an anchor surrounded by a Hebrew inscription. The reverse side shows a star, wheel,

or a form of a compass.
In addition to all the coins, the Cedar Chest carries a wide variety of fine jewelry. The oldest jewelry store on the island, it has been owned and operated by Pat





anorexia rather than tanorexia, but there he lay, day in and day out, until he finally came to resemble a shar-pei on steroids. When I asked him why he lay in the sun all day he responded, "Because not only do I feel and look more athletic, but brown fat is healthier than white.

More than one million North Americans will get skin cancer this year! Ten thousand will die from tanorexia. Melanoma, the deadliest of the skin cancers, is the

fourth commonest cancer of those aged 15-35.

Ultraviolet rays emitted by the sun include the nasty UVB and a milder UVA. Besides promoting cancer, overexposure to these rays cause the skin to wrinkle, sag, wrinkle, age prematurely, wrinkle, mottle, break out in cold sores/herpes and wrin-

kle.

The popularity of tanning "salons" is a good indicator of the prevalence of tanorexia. Using only UVA, the least destructive of the rays, these salons are certainly less injurious to the skin than direct exposure to the sun. But is there such a thing as a safe suntan? Tanned skin is damaged skin. In fact, browning of the skin is an attempt by the body to shield us from further ultraviolet damage. It figures that if it can collect enough melanin pigment cells together it might be able to block the dangerous UV rays from penetrating and destroying deeper layers of skin. Tanning salons should be regulated as if they were saloons. Teenagers, fair-skinned folks, those with any history of skin problems and basically those who want nice skin should never go into a tanning saloon.

But being what it is, human nature would have us sacrifice long term health for present feel good aesthetics. Tanorexics, smokers, drinkers, Snickers addicts and others who ultimately abuse their body in exchange for instant gratification may discover one day that the damage their body has incurred is irreversible. Their body turns out to be worth only a fraction of what it should be, which only goes to prove





One important point, acetyl-L-carnitine is the activated form of L-carnitine, both of which are widely available in health food stores. But don't get confused, the "acetyl" form is considered superior because it makes more of that famous brain messenger "acetylcholine" that influences mental performance. The more acetylcholine you have, the more brain power you have and the less chance of your developing Alzheimer's disease

Here's more food for thought. This special supplement works wonders from the neck down also In fact, without sufficient amounts of this amino acid, the body cannot burn fat very efficiently resulting in unwanted weight gain.

Fibromyalgia and chronic fatigue syndrome sufferers use acetyl-L-carnitine to help energize the body and relieve sore achy muscles. Now this is not an all-in-one magical supplement, but if offers people another option and it is well tolerated by



My 82 year old mother lives in another northern state and I want her to come and join me I think it would be good for her arthritis and I would enjoy having her live


Could you give me some guidance in this area?





alone would be worth \$400,000," he said.

Under the Save Our Homes law, "we can't raise the taxable value (of the home of a permanent Florida resident) more than three percent That's \$32 billion in value in the State that can't be taxed," he noted

Wilkinson said his office currently is working to "solve the loophole" regarding illegal land use, agriculture being one example There are approximately 300 such parcels identified in Lee County, and when one of these is assessed a lower tax, "you pay the difference," he said "We will
