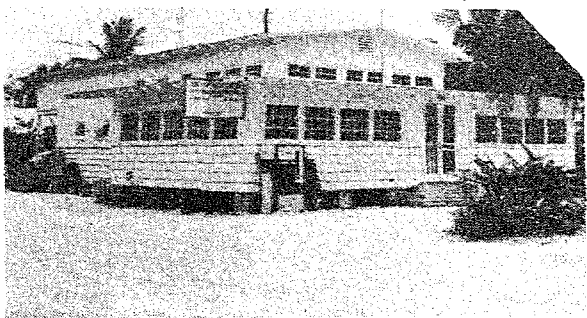

SANIBEL BREAKING INTO THE MOVIES

Recently, two half-lone shows were filmed here in six days concerning the collection, preparation, and cleaning of shells. This was done for WYES-TV Channel 8, New Orleans for a children's program "What's New" -- a daily show.

Last February, Miss Patricia Edwards of Guntherville, Alabama was asked by producer-director, William Manschot of WYES where this shell safari would be best filmed. And what could be more perfect than the soft, white, shell-dotted beaches of Sanibel?

A call was made to Velna Ridge (a friend of Miss Edwards for quite some time) and Lew Funk for reservations at his lovely beach cottages. Part of the filming took place on the beach at Gulf Breeze and Velna Ridge's yard and beach.

Mr. Manschot, Pat Edwards and Velna Ridge made a visit to Jim McGuire who then got in touch with Mim and Howard Schriener and then the safari really began!

Charles LeBuff, who was his usual charming self and a true islander, took the filming crew out to take pictures and see the turtles of Sanibel lay their eggs. Herb Purday was on hand with his little red jeep to escort the boys over our fabulous island.

David Wooster, who is always on the job, came to Funks and Velna Ridge's to meet and converse with the group.

Susan and Davy Jones, the children of Mr. & Mrs. Bob Jones who resided at the Sanibel Trailer Park, were the stars of the show. And the director said these children were true TV stars. The movie circled around Susan, age 10, who had never been shelling before. Her guide was Miss Edwards.

Gerry Funk played a big part in making the guests stay very enjoyable. Helen Denny, who was on vacation at the time, was called long distance by Miss Edwards to fly back to Sanibel and have her famous shell museum filmed for

the show.

Films of Ken Havord's world wide shell collections were filmed directly in his shop.

About the moviemakers --- Mr. William Manschot has been the director of programming for WYES for two years. In 1947 he entered television and has been in the business since. Mr. Manschot has worked for two National Education stations in New Orleans and has been producing for NET (National Education TV) for ten years.

Ronald G. Kelly is the Production Technician and Assistant. He has been the host for four shows on Channel 8. Hailing from New Orleans, Mr. Kelly has been in radio and TV for five years. He was a disc jockey for WBOK, WYLD, and a station in Baton Rouge.

Ulrik Ross, B.I.C. (Brotherhood of International Cinema Photographers) has been with WYES for one year. He is the film editor and still photographer. Born in Copenhagen, Denmark, Mr. Ross is a member of the Danish Peace Corps and does all the film work for local New Orleans stations. He has only been in the states 14 months.

Bishop Duncan, sound editor, has been with channel 8 for a year with 12 pictures to his credit. Mr. Duncan lived in Copenhagen one year, worked three years in a Buffalo, N.Y. production company, and has traveled everywhere except the middle and far east. In all, Mr. Duncan has been in motion pictures and TV for seven years. He plans to vacation on Sanibel this August.

7,000 feet of color film were shot here. These programs will soon be seen on 170 TV stations in every major city of the United States including Tampa, St. Petersburg, Miami, Gainesville, Tallahassee, Pensacola and Jacksonville.

Don't forget Saturdays 2:30 to 3:30 at Sanibel Public Library. See you kids there for lots of fun.

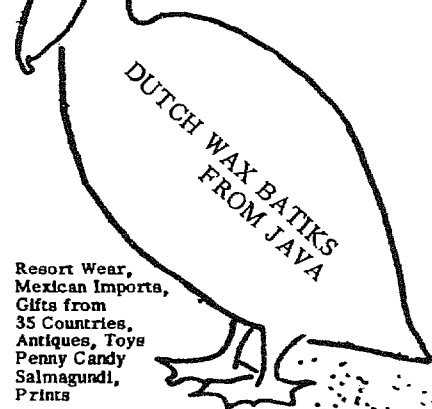
