

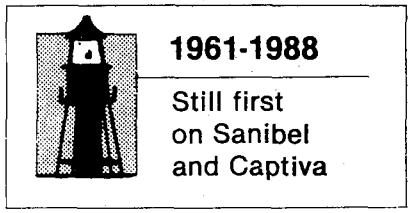

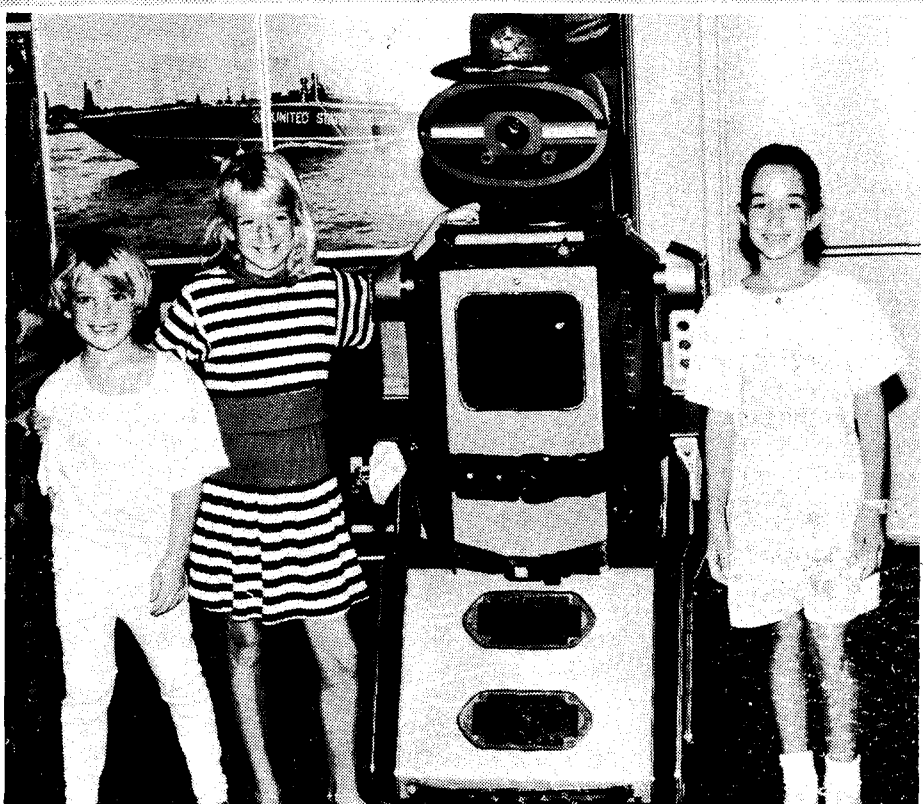

Operation CrackDown forceful display of war on drugs

"God help ya' if you should ever run afoul of these boys," the Bermuda-shorted grandfather warned his young progeny, "it don't look like they'd have much mercy, 'specially with you younger types."

That's how the old man reacted to the enormous display of local police force at Operation CrackDown, held Saturday from 9 a.m. to noon at the Sanibel Community Center, with an abundance of men and machines to fight

Southwest Florida's "War on Drugs."

The Collier County Sheriff's Department brought in their Breath Alcohol Testing Mobile Unit, a.k.a. "The BATmobile," and ran demonstrations of the procedures involved in arresting a drunk driver. Lately the BATmobile has been averaging 60 arrests per month, with a conviction rate of 99.2 per cent.

According to Sgt. Burgess of Collier County, more than 1,000 people of the some 120,000 people in the

State takes over alligator control

Sanibel's Wildlife Subcommittee on Alligators decided to recommend that the city relinquish to the state game commission all facets of the city's alligator removal program rather than accept the token responsibility of dealing only with the smaller alligators on the island at a meeting last Friday, October 21.

Two days before the subcommittee met, officials of the state Game and Freshwater Fish Commission declared that Sanibel would no longer be autonomous in the area of "nuisance"

alligator control, and that the state would respond to all calls concerning alligators over 6 foot in length. The State provided Sanibel with the option of retaining control in matters regarding smaller alligators.

In a unanimous vote, the subcommittee passed the motion urging that Sanibel City Council direct City Manager Gary Price to give up responsibility for the city's alligator removal program. The City council will take up the matter at its next meeting on November 1.

COTI wins density decreases south of Summerlin

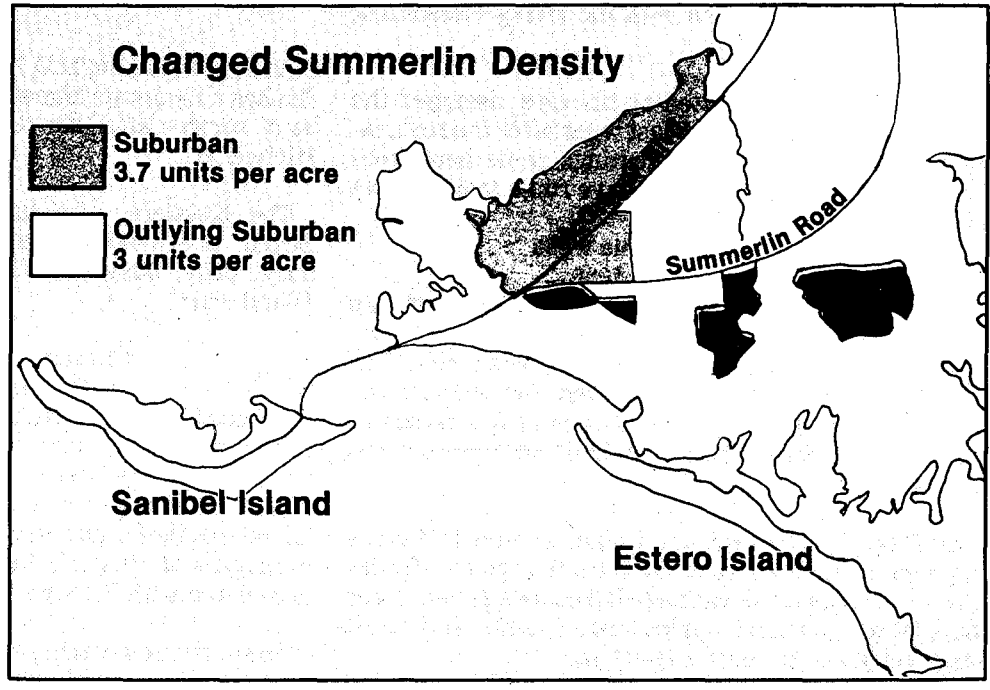
The density of future development along the Summerlin Road corridor would be reduced under amendments to the Lee County Comprehensive Land Use Plan adopted last Tuesday by the Lee County Commission. However, final approval will not be considered until January when the commission discusses the entire plan.

The changes in land classification were strongly supported by Sanibel's Committee of the Islands and by the Iona-McGregor Registered Voters and Property Owners Association. The two groups reciprocated support for each other's proposals.

The commission voted three to one for the proposed changes with commissioners Mary Ann Wallace, Donald Slisher, and John E. Manning voting in favor and commission chairman Bill Fussell casting the negative vote. Commissioner Charles Bigelow was absent.

Fussell said he was voting no because sufficient notice had not been given to property owners in the area. He also voted against a motion that the commission not consider or discuss these changes at a November 15 hearing on other aspects of the land use plan. Fussell said you could not restrict what could be discussed at a commission meeting.

The United Way will once again be this year's benefiting charity at 'Tween Waters' Sixth Annual Oktoberfest beginning tomorrow.

Rain or shine (they've got a big tent) the Captiva Island resort will roll out the barrels in their tented beergarten at 6 p.m. and merrymakers will once again oom-pah-pah and yodel to the world famous, Austrian born Stratton Mountain Boys who will perform such numbers as the Glocken Plattler (a cow bell dance), the Tiroler Holzacker Tanz (the woodchopper dance with axes and hand-saws), and the Knap-pentanz (a miners' dance using hammers and chisels). Needless to say audience participation is a must, especially with dances



like Rheit im Winkel, the traditional Bavarian slap dance.

In addition, 'Tween Waters again welcomes Toni Noichl, the popular German zither player who will be making his second appearance at the festival. Also returning will be the upbeat Dady Brothers from Rochester, New York.

Inside, local favorites Unicorn Run will be performing in the pub.

'Tween Waters will be offering its usual array of German specialties

including home-made knock wurst, Oktoberfest sausage with sauerkraut and German potato salad and to follow German chocolate cake, apple strudel and funnel cake. All this may be washed down with imported German beer and Schnapps.

The fest, one of the area's largest events will continue through Sunday, October 30. This last day is Family Day with all children admitted free and a

special Halloween costume contest at 4:30 p.m., with prizes for every single entrant.

Entrance is \$5 for adults and \$2 for children on Wednesday and Thursday and \$7.50 for adults and \$2.50 for children on Friday and Saturday. Sunday, children are admitted free and adults pay \$4.

Question of city informers comes up in code enforcement hearing

Questions regarding City of Sanibel code enforcement procedures led to the dismissal by the Sanibel Code Enforcement Board last Thursday of code violation charges against the Cheeburger-Cheeburger restaurant at 2413 Periwinkle Way.

Questions of whether code enforcement procedures allowed individuals to use the city in vendettas against particular businesses also came up at the hearing.

The restaurant had been charged with having more than the 40 seats it is zensed to have. City code enforcement officer Richard E. Baker counted 68 seats in the restaurant on June 21, 1988. He went back on July 22 and counted 49 seats inside and six seats (three concrete benches) outside. However, on October 6 he counted only 40. But the city wanted to proceed on charges based on the previous non-compliance.

The board dismissed the charges

after an attorney representing the restaurant argued the city had not specified a date by which the restaurant had to be in compliance. Attorney Steven Hartsell said neither of two letters from Baker contained a date by which the restaurant must be in compliance even though the city code requires such a date.

The city code says "the code inspector shall notify the violator and give a reasonable time to correct the violation." The code also says the violation should be brought before the code enforcement board "should the time continue beyond the time specified for correction."

"No one has ever raised this issue before," said board chairman John Smith, "I think the city may be at fault by not placing a specific time for a remedy."

After individual board members urg-

Landfill decision could cause ecological disaster, candidates tell COTI meeting

The Lee County Commission decision last Wednesday to move the county land fill to an ecologically sensitive area was such a bad decision that "I was actually ashamed to be on the board," commissioner Donald Slisher told the COTI-sponsored meeting of county commission candidates last Thursday at the Sanibel Community Center.

All the candidates that showed up said they opposed the three-to-two decision the previous day by the commission to move the landfill to a site at the headwaters of the Estero River near the Lee-Hendry county line instead of next to the present landfill west of Lehigh Acres.

Commissioner John Manning, who had voted for the move, neither showed

up nor sent an explanation of his absence. Candidate Carol Lamb, who has said elsewhere she would have voted for the move, sent word she could not attend because of conflicting engagements.

Ray Judah, Lamb's Republican opponent for the seat being vacated by Mary Ann Wallace, said he was angry about the commission's decision.

"We do not have to yield to the pressures from developers that destroyed Florida's east coast," he said.

Democrat Donald MacLean, who is running against Slisher, agreed with Slisher that the landfill move was caused by political pressure from

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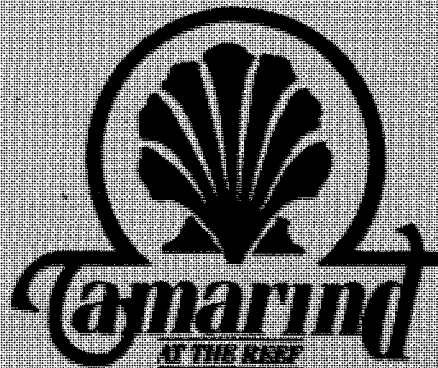
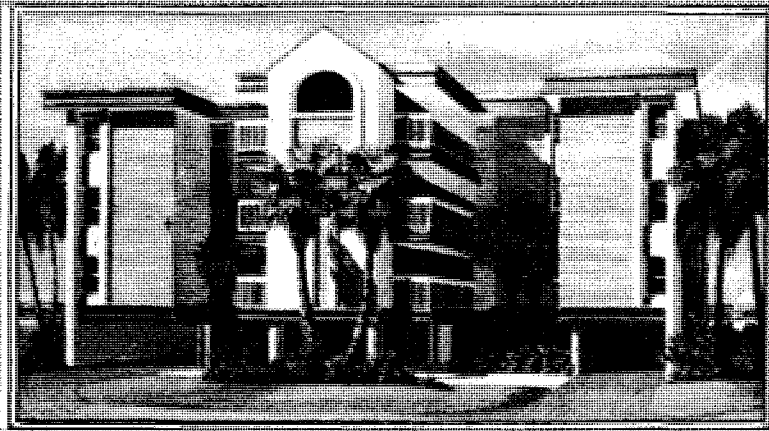

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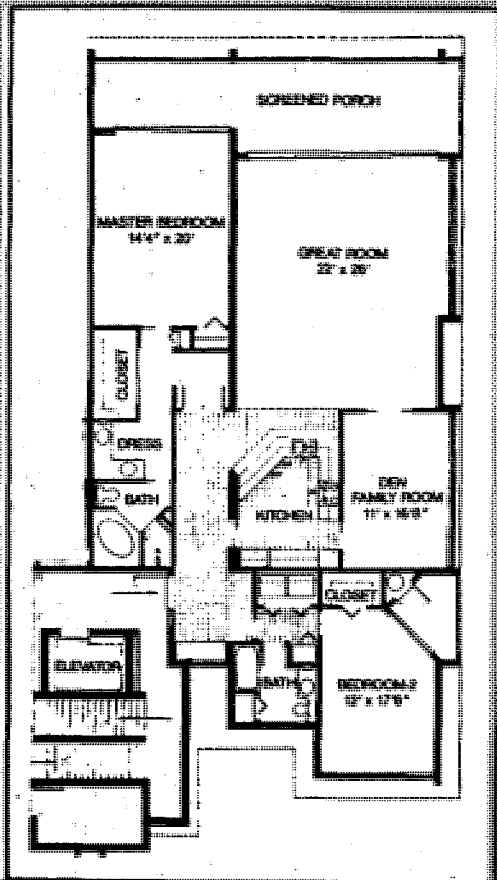

Westinghouse. "Gateway by Westinghouse is who wants it moved," said MacLean, "because they want to develop their housing project."

Democrat David Grant, who is running against Manning, told the crowd of about 100 people that after all he had heard about moving the landfill "I'd have probably voted against it."

Judah said locating a landfill where three aquifers cross, and near the wellfields tapped by Lee County Utilities and Florida Cities Water, could result in the contamination of that water. He said the landfill could also contaminate the water source for Bonita Springs and the planned source for the City of Fort Myers.

Slisher said if those water sources became contaminated it "could take over a hundred years to clean them

up." He said there was no question why the other commissioners had voted for the move. Slisher said a study six months ago had recommended a site near the planned Westinghouse community and "they have lobbied very heavily to move it away from them and to another site."

"So a spot was selected where three aquifers cross. But Westinghouse is happy," said Slisher.

Among other subjects discussed by the candidates was the Sanibel Causeway. There was a bit of a stir in the audience when MacLean, explaining his favoring user fees over taxes, said, "Maybe you should raise the toll to \$4 or \$5 on the causeway."

Judah said he favors removing the

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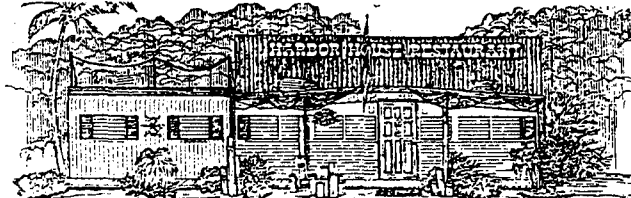

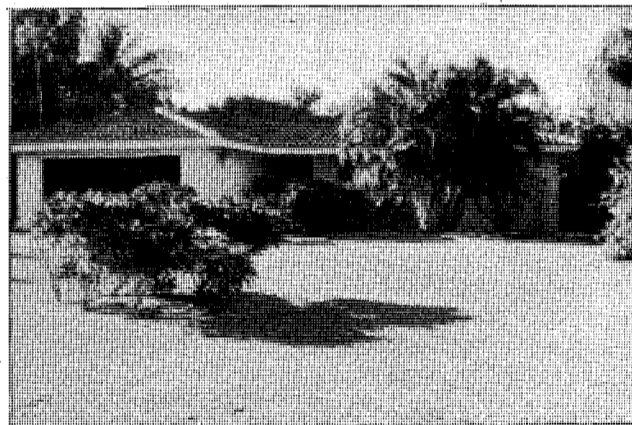

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Now feeding an alligator is signing its death warrant

On Wednesday, October 19, responsibility for dealing with dangerous alligators on Sanibel was re-possessed by the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, the body from whence Sanibel's temporary autonomy originated.

It is now up to state officials to render judgement on "nuisance" and "dangerous" alligators on the island. The Wildlife Subcommittee on Alligators Friday moved to recommend that the city relinquish all responsibility to the state. On November 1 the City Council will decide whether or not Sanibel should heed the subcommittee's advice.

Sanibel has the option of retaining jurisdiction in matters requiring the handling of the small alligators with which the state would rather not trifle. All other alligators now will be attended to by employees of the state commission.

Although local police will continue their policy of responding to all calls, state handlers will be required to enforce the zero tolerance policies regarding all alligators deemed dangerous. According to state guidelines, all alligators are, in the broadest sense, dangerous. Those over 6 feet pose a special danger to people and their property, including dogs.

"Just to see the faces of those 25 kids who came to see the displays made it all worthwhile," commented Cali.

Some 150 people visited the displays which included examples of the various paraphernalia used to inhale, inject or otherwise ingest the substances.

It was an exhibition that everyone should have attended and could have learned from. But despite the excellence of the display, I was not surprised that no more than 150 people showed up. There is a widely-held feeling that there is no drug problem on Sanibel.

Sanibel bike paths must be planned to avoid hazards

This open letter concerns an island-wide safety issue worthy of each candidate and council member's consideration. We need to know, before the forthcoming city council election, your stand regarding the urgent need for more thoughtful planning and placement of bicycle paths than is presently occurring in the Sanibel Public Works Department.

This fall, you will be voting on a revision of the Sanibel Land Use Plan that contains vague descriptions and inaccurate maps of present and proposed bike paths. Failure to amend the revision and correct the bicycle path maps this fall will allow others to make dangerous, incorrect decisions later.

Public input is excluded from the bike path planning process. Presently, whenever there is money available, it is up to the City Manager to recommend to the City Council that they lay asphalt somewhere. Why isn't the Planning Department involved? The Planning Department should propose specific bike path routes throughout the island, with safety as the primary criterion. Routing decisions ought to be in accord with accepted authorities, such as the California study Planning and Design Criteria for Bikeways; and Safety and Locational Criteria for Bicycle Facilities, a users manual prepared by

applied to the buccaneers turned pirates for the sake of their stomach. And through theyears, evidence proves that a pirate with a growl in his gut and a yearning for grog was the worst kind to contend with. A belching, snoring shipmate was less likely to mutiny, or loot the nearest village, or risk his hairy neck at ten to one odds against the crew of a sighted merchantman.

Keep in mind, then, (in case you were planning to whip up something light and easy) that your guests are probably quite hungry, possibly starving. Aboard the pirate ship on account, either feast or famine prevailed. Usually the latter.

I won't go into the specifics of the at-sea menu from pirate galleys. Suffice it to say that the men usually ate in the dark--to be saved the often off-color presentation of their entree--and always demanded plenty of good, strong rum chasers.

At home upon the islands of southern Florida, the Bahamas and the Caribbean, the pirate's first indulgence was his stomach. The ship's cook would gather up everything edible in sight and prepare a concoction of pirate invention called "Salmagundi." From the Fench medieval term Salemine, meaning highly-seasoned, today "salmagundi" is used to describe a certain kind of salad that uses anchovies and hard-boiled eggs. In non-culinary terms, it has come to mean a hodgepodge of dissimilar objects, a potpourri.

The recipe for the pirate's version is simple: Toss chunks of pork, beef, turtle, iguana, pigeon, herring, anchovies, hard-boiled eggs, mangoes, oranges, palm hearts, and onions into a cauldron; add spiced wine or rum, and lots of island spices. Heat through.

So, if you're looking to instill some principles into your potatoless Halloween guests, think tropical and think over-indulgence. Save the gourmet touches and the Grand Marnier. If you can't find inguana meat at your local market, don't fret. Just turn off the lights and let the rum flow.

Cities are liable for planning decisions that create known hazards. For example, in 1987, Key West was successfully sued for a negligently planned "governmental immunity" from liability for injuries resulting from that hazard on the theory that it arose from a planning level decision. The City of Sanibel will not be immune from liability if it creates a condition the city knows to be dangerous, but whose danger is not readily apparent to persons who could be injured by the condition. Carelessly placed bicycle paths that needlessly cross driveways possibly concealed by vegetation will surely expose the City to lawsuits from any injured bicyclists.

We petitioned in September for a safety study concerning the future placement of bike paths. The safest location for a north-south bike route on Sanibel's east end is not on Lindgren at all, but along Beach Road. A similar bike path was constructed for Rabbit Road at Sanibel's west end that wisely took advantage of a lightly used side street.

Can we hear from city officials who are going to take an informed interest in decisions regarding the location and safety of Sanibel's bikeway facilities?

ed Baker to be careful in the future to always give a specific date for compliance with a violation, the board voted unanimously to dismiss the charges against the Cheeburger-Cheeburger restaurant.

After questioning of Baker by Hartsell revealed that the city only inspects for code violations after a complaint has been received and that anonymous complaints are investigated, Hartsell argued that this could result in the city being used to carry out a vendetta against a particular business. "Our concern is that Cheeburger Cheeburger has been singled out for selective enforcement," said Hartsell.

Hartsell asked Baker, "Would it surprise you that there are numerous other restaurants not in compliance on Sanibel?" Baker responded that he

could not answer the question.

Hartsell also said his clients were concerned about the secrecy surrounding who had initially complained about the excess seats. Baker said the investigation had resulted from one complaint received by phone. He said he knew the identity of the person who complained but would not release the name of the person to Cheeburger-Cheeburger. The board supported Baker's refusal to release the name.

The American legal system requires that a person be allowed to face their accuser, Hartsell said. The identity of the person was not relevant, according to Smith, because under their procedures the accuser is the code enforcement officer and the opportunity was being given at that hearing for them to face officer Baker.

Now, should a complaint be lodged on Sanibel by someone concerned about a 6-foot gator, or one larger, trappers from the Game Commission will be sent out to "harvest" the animal. The state and the trappers retain any profits from sale of the harvested alligator's hide and meat.

If the City Council rejects the subcommittee's recommendation, the city will be charged with the resolution of complaints regarding sub-six-foot alligators.

Will the safety of islanders be better served by a state-run alligator control program than the now defunct city-directed program? That is an issue.

Will Sanibel's unique, symbiotic, (some might term parasitic), relationship between humans and alligators be maintained under the new policies? That is also an issue.

In fact, there is scarcely a point of contention, vis-a-vis alligator control policy changes, with which at least two of the many personalities involved do not take issue.

For those who had nurtured Sanibel's unique alligator control policy over the years, the change is, as Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation director Eric Lindblad says, "a giant step backward for the city."

For those primarily concerned with the unsettling scenario of simultaneous increases in both human and alligator populations, the state's assumption of jurisdiction is an especially timely comfort in light of

the June 4 killing of 4-year-old Erin Glover by an alligator in Charlotte County.

To Clem Concodora, a member of the alligator subcommittee and the father of a young girl on the island, the overriding issue is safety. It is his contention that state's authority over Sanibel's alligator problem will positively correspond to an increased margin of safety for everyone on Sanibel. According to Concodora, the city's former policy of alligator relocation was but the twisted version of a children's game which he described mockingly as "musical alligators."

"It's like taking a lit stick of dynamite from one yard and relocating it on someone else's," Concodora said. "There's no logic to it."

Indeed, logic seems to be at a premium these days with regards to alligator management. While one camp threatens of dynamite another bemoans the encroachment of "Big Brother" and the illogical doublespeak of state alligator assessments.

Mark "Bird" Westall, licensed alligator handler, chairman of the alligator subcommittee and longtime champion of progressive alligator policies, likened the situation not to dynamite but to the equally explosive image of the loaded shotgun left in the home of a toddler.

Sanibel Causeway island closest to Punta Rassa in order to help shellfish in the area. He said when the causeway was built the spoil islands blocked water coming down the Caloosahatchee from going directly into the Gulf of Mexico. Instead the water is turned into Pine Island Sound. The result of this, according to Judah, was a change in the salinity of the water which destroyed the shellfish in the area. He said removal of that island might help restore the shellfish.

Slusher, in response to a question about how hurricane-resistant the redesigned Sanibel Causeway would be, pointed out that by law bridges must be closed to traffic when winds

reach gale force levels.

MacLean said he considered the Captiva Beach Renourishment Project a waste of money. "You can't fool around with mother nature," he said, "When you dig a hole out in the Gulf and put the sand from the hole on the beach, some future storm is just going to wash the sand right back into the hole." He suggested forming an artificial reef out of old automobile tires.

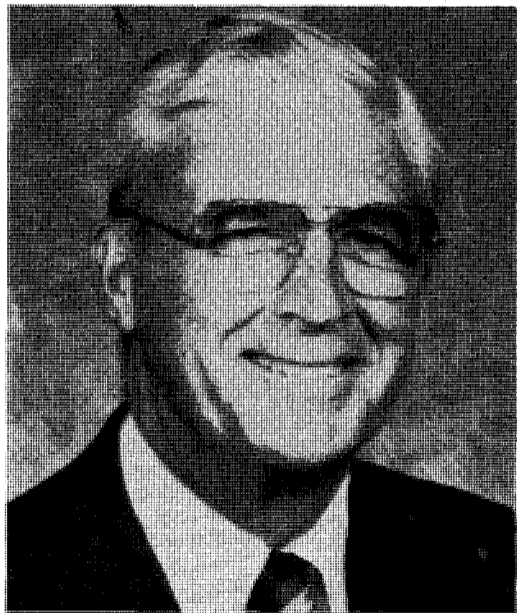

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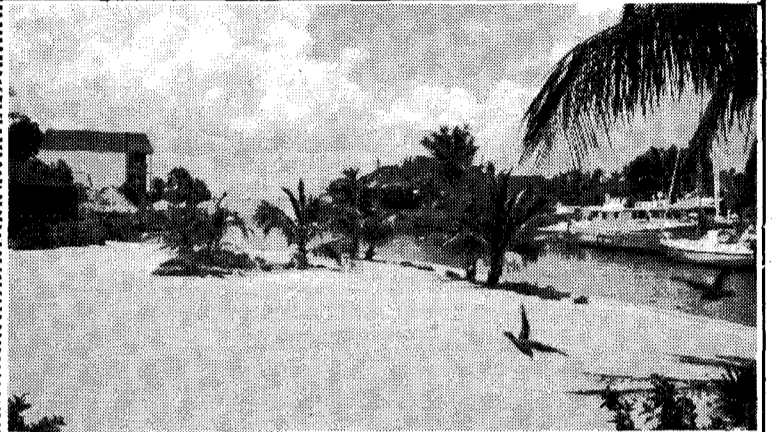
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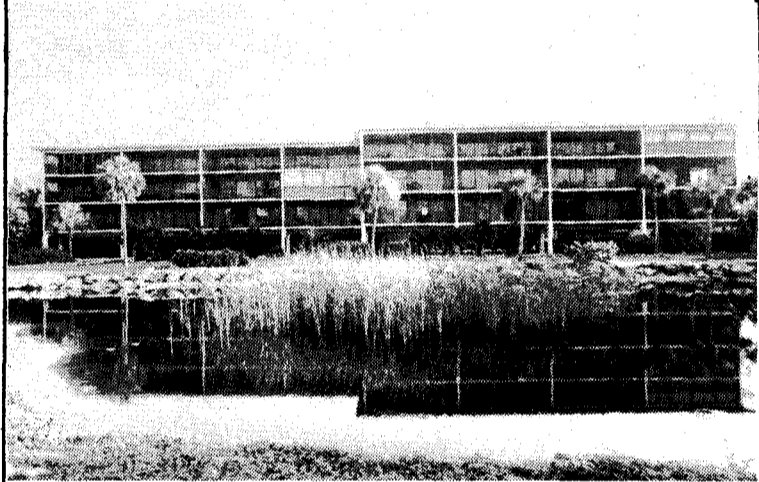
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CHR director finds nearly half Sanibel's voters support low-income housing

Dorothy Newman has no special fondness for statistics.

Her background, though, has equipped her to decipher intimidating piles and columns of numbers. A Ph.D. in sociology and thirty years as an analyst with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics mean Newman can spot numbers that tell half a story.

When she saw that a first-glance review of the recently-released results of a survey conducted for the City of Sanibel cast her beleaguered Below Market Housing

Program in an unfavorable light, she put her professional training to work.

"I couldn't believe it when I read that only 26 percent of Sanibel people approve of the Below Market Rate Housing program," she said, "so I went straight to the survey itself and dug into the numbers. And I was right!"

After hours of sifting data from the twenty-pound report, Newman, Housing Foundation Director of the city's BMRH program, found the figure to be considerably higher.

"There was misinterpretation," she said, "because the survey used two samples, and that report implied the results for one group represented the opinion of all islanders."

Research Data Services, Inc., which conducted the survey, used resident voters, those who live year-round on Sanibel, as one sample and property owners as the other. The resident voter group responded much more favorably to BMRH questions, but those results were overlooked in an early news article.

"The survey shows almost half (47 percent) of our resident voters support BMRH," Newman said, "and 12 percent are undecided. If those on the fence were to split fifty-fifty, a majority of Sanibel voters would favor the program."

The survey also showed nearly all voters are property owners (91 percent), whereas far fewer property owners (37 percent) are voters.

"There are a few very outspoken opponents of the program who get a lot of attention. It's a relief to document their bluster is not in proportion to their constituency."

"That tells me," Newman said, "that property owners who live on Sanibel and have a chance to see BMRH in action are nearly twice as likely to support us."

Newman attributes that difference between the two sample groups to awareness of the program and cited the survey result showing 25 percent of the property owners checked "no opinion" or "don't know" when asked if they support BMRH.

"When you consider these people live in 34 different states, Canada and several other countries, it's no wonder they don't think of themselves as knowledgeable enough to give a meaningful opinion. How many of them

City agrees to buy lots at 'fair market value'

Sanibel City Council agreed to pay Dr. Stephen Matthews \$55,500 for a three-lot parcel of land on Island Inn Road in Tarpon Bay subdivision that is deemed unbuildable because it is within 200 feet of the Sanibel River.

It has been city policy since the freshwater wetlands district was established to offer to purchase land that is found unable to meet development standards under the Land Development Code at fair market value.

City Attorney Bob Pritt said that the price offered for the Matthews property was a compromise between two appraisals, one for \$58,000 submitted by the owner and the second for \$53,000 obtained by the city.

Though this is the highest amount the council has considered expending, Pritt recommended that the sale be approved or the earlier decision to prohibit its development be reversed.

Pritt said that if the case went to court it would most

likely be considered by the court as a "taking" or an inverse condemnation.

Pritt said the property, easily accessible from Island Inn Road, has been kept neatly mowed and in all respects except for its location adjacent to the Sanibel River appears to be a buildable lot.

Pritt said there may be other areas along the Sanibel River where similar circumstances prevail.

Pritt suggested the council might want to consider modifying the Land Development Code's prohibition of development along the Sanibel River.

Despite their concern that accepting this inflated price would open the way to higher and higher appraisals, the four councilmen present approved the purchase.

Funds to buy the land come from revenue from the .25 mills of the ad valorem tax that is earmarked for wetlands acquisition. An estimated \$297,500 will be available for that purpose this year.

Restrooms at Tarpon Bay access reconsidered

The issue of public restrooms at the Tarpon Bay beach access, dormant since June 1987, was revived last Tuesday by a neighboring resident who claimed her privacy is constantly invaded by beach goers looking for bathrooms.

Anne Bailey who lives in a house just west of the public beach parking area, told the City Council last week that a public facility is desperately needed at that site.

"People are constantly knocking on my door and asking to use my bathroom," Bailey said, "Or worse yet using the shrubbery that surrounds the house."

Eighteen months ago the council thought it had laid the topic to rest. Swayed by objections from owners of the 16 units at Pine Cove of Sanibel condominium, the

council abandoned plans to build \$20,000 His and Her restrooms on the southwestern portion of the parking lot.

Pine Cove owners claimed the city's plans were "trying to make a park out of a dead-end street."

Convenient sanitary facilities would only increase the use of the popular gulf beach access which is already overcrowded, they say.

Night use of the beach would be increased and along with that would come a rise in crime, they add.

The condo owners, who were unanimously opposed in 1987, remained adamant in their position.

They would not object to bathrooms located in the Trost parking lot to the north of Tarpon Bay Road, they said. Bailey agreed that location would be satisfactory and City Manager Gary Price was asked to look into the feasibility of that site which is in the wetlands district and report back to the council.

Council approves paving Dunes parking lot

The City Council last Tuesday overturned a Planning Commission decision and approved paving the north parking lot at the Dunes Country Club.

Two weeks earlier the commissioners split 3-3 on whether to allow Mariner Properties Inc. to cover a sand and shell lot with asphalt.

But in line with the spirit of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan that "encourages the use of shell surfaces for parking areas to "maintain a casual retreat atmosphere" the commission turned down Mariner's request.

The council agreed with Ray Pavelka, Mariner's

representative, that CLUP does not require the use of shell for parking areas.

Pavelka also pointed out that the total impermeable coverage at the Dunes golf course is only 3.5 to 4 percent, far below the 30 percent permitted by the Land Development Code.

Councilman Lennart Lorensen and Planning Commission Chairman Bob Davison, both Dunes golfers who use this parking lot, agreed it was in deplorable condition and paving would definitely improve a bad situation.

It was council consensus that there would be no negative impact from paving.

The motion to remove the prohibition from the development permit calling for extensive improvements of the recreational amenities at the club passed by a 4-0 vote.

Councilman Fred Valtin, still convalescing from a June heart attack, was absent.

Dunes residents protest loud and late jazz

Long suffering residents of The Dunes have finally had enough.

The loudness of the music and the lateness of the hour on both nights of the eighth annual Jazz on the Green festival Oct. 8-9, brought a formal protest from residents of the country club community last week.

Gripes from 18 complainants included, in addition to earsplitting music that continued an hour and a half beyond the 10 p.m. deadline, parking problems, trespassing on private property, and drunken behavior.

David Sutherland, a spokesman for The Dunes owners, said residents had been reluctant in the past to make complaints about the annual event because it was for such a worthy cause. Through the years the proceeds from Jazz on the Green have benefitted BIG Arts.

About 3,000 persons were in attendance both days this year, Al Rosen,

general manager of the Dunes Golf and Tennis Club and sponsor of the festival, said.

In 1986 after people complained that the music went beyond midnight on Saturday night, the hours were shortened to 11 p.m.

There were no complaints last year, City Manager Gary Price said.

Sutherland was one of the 18 persons mostly residents on Limpet Drive who called The Dunes Saturday night when the music continued at earsplitting volume after 10:30 p.m.

Mayor Mike Klein was the recipient of calls from disgruntled residents some of whom lived as far away from The Dunes as Lindgren Boulevard and the Lighthouse fishing pier.

Rosen explained that the concert ran overtime because the two headliners brought their own bands and the setup time for new sound systems and in-

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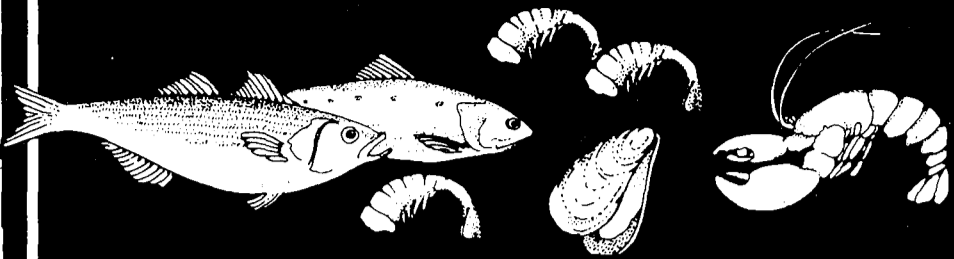

struments delayed the start of performances by both Michael Frank on Saturday and Bob James on Sunday. Klein said that Rosen was responsible for making sure the rules and regulation are adhered to. "Only you are authorized to make sure the star performers start on time and don't run over the limits," Klein reprimanded Rosen. "What I'm saying is that this should never happen again," Klein stressed, adding "As far as I'm concerned you're the guy causing the trouble." Klein suggested that a decibel meter could be used to measure the level of sound to be certain it conforms with that allowed under the city's code. Three other fund raising events are staged at The Dunes each year. Taste of the Islands is a showcase for Sanibel and Captiva restaurants and

proceeds from the one-day event provide a large portion of Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife's annual budget. The event in late April runs from noon to 6 p.m. and draws about 3,000 persons. The city has received very few complaints about this event since it was first permitted in 1985, Price said. The Fourth of July Road Rally and fireworks display is low key and usually attracts about 1,000 persons. The Chili Cook-off benefits the Kiwanis Club. It is held in late September and runs from noon until 5 p.m. It draws about 2,000 persons. There were complaints about this event in the early years but since regulations have been modified there was only one complaint in 1987 and none this year, Price said.



(which opposes the mid-point bridge), residents of

Brynwood and of Heritage Farms, and homeowners groups from Bonita Springs, North Fort Myers, and Spring Creek Village.

The group plans to send a representative to every meeting held by Lee County government on the comprehensive plan. The official general goal the coalition adopted at Wednesday's meeting is "to support responsible growth management through reasonable citizen input."

The officers elected last Wednesday are Gene Boyd of the Pine Island Civic Association as president; Dani Barker of Iona-McGregor as vice-president; Skip Huxtable of Spring Creek Village as treasurer; and Edith Slayton, an officer of COTI, as secretary.

Barker said individuals and representatives of groups that have not yet joined the coalition would be welcome to attend and to join.



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
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

county have seen the back of the dreaded BATmobile in the last 14 months. The drunkest drunk, as determined by blood alcohol content, staggered in at a whopping .454 blood alcohol content, more than four and one half times the legal limit.

In our quiet, affluent community, it is easy to believe that our children and grandchildren, neighbors and friends would neither take nor deal in drugs. Yet police say drug addiction may be as common among the more affluent. We may not be alerted to the problem because there is little of the robbery and violence which are experienced in less privileged communities.

But the problem is here, and we should know about it. Our relatives or friends may not take drugs, but we may work with people who do. I once worked with a young addict of crack cocaine for more than a year and only learned retrospectively he was taking drugs. I was oblivious to the significance of the razor blades in the bathroom, the bashed-in Coke cans, the spent matches. *I just knew his work was erratic, and he had some personal problems.*

I often think that if I had known, I might have helped. Had I the input of last Saturday's display, I most certainly would have recognized his drug addiction for what it was.



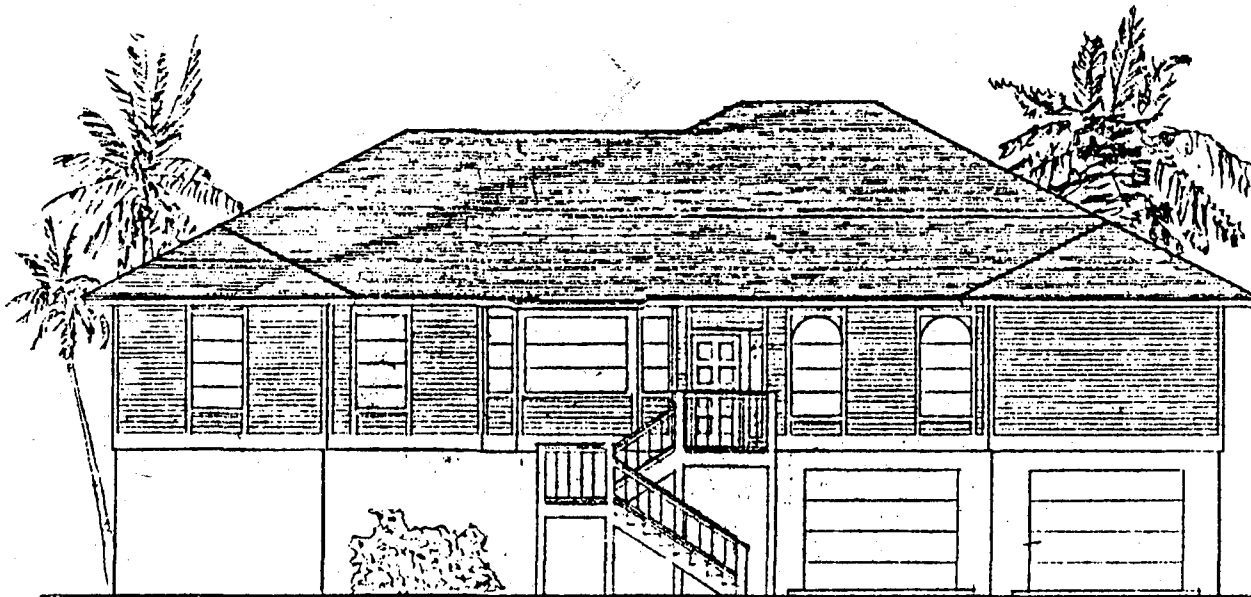
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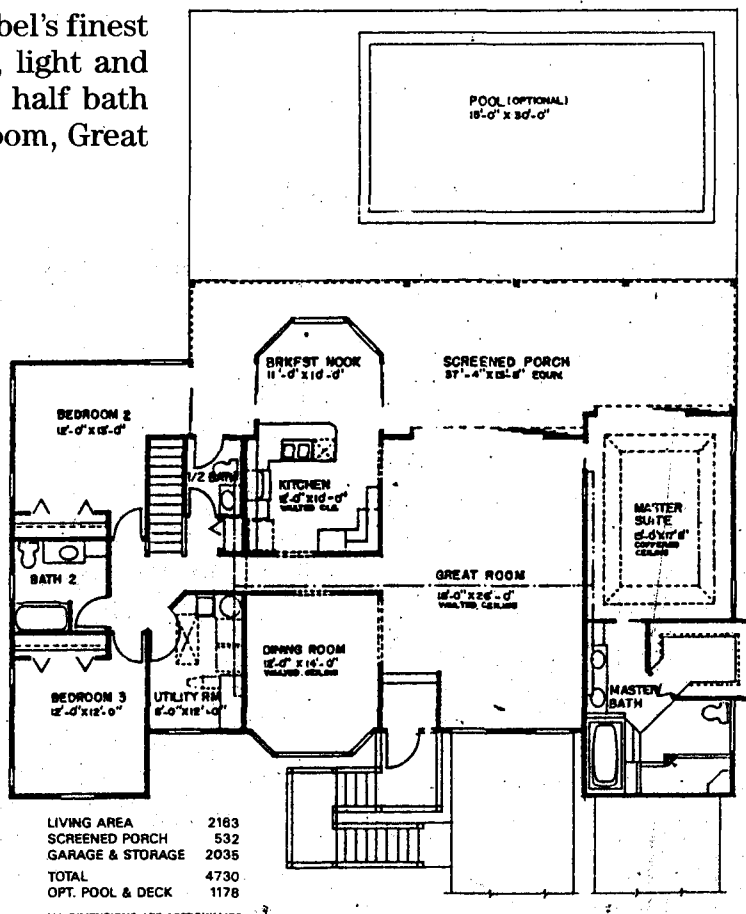
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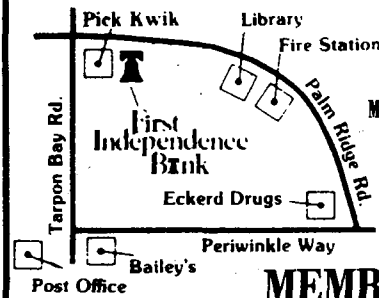


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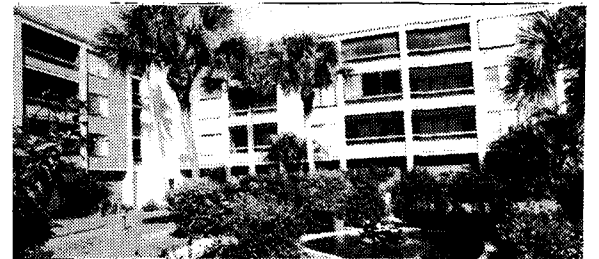
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The commission also rejected two proposals from developers to increase density use on their land in the Summerlin area. A third proposed change was withdrawn by the developer before it could be discussed.

COTI had originally proposed that all land south of Summerlin Road be reclassified. However, in a compromise the recommendation was changed last July to support of a Planning and Zoning Board proposal that only certain areas be changed.

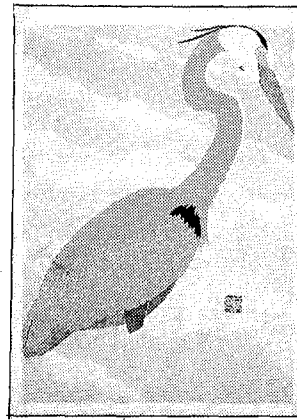
The Iona-McGregor group's original proposal was passed. It calls for lower densities on most of the land north of McGregor Boulevard from Shell Point Boulevard to Deep Lagoon and in an area south of McGregor bounded by McGregor, Summerlin, John Morris Road, and Kelly Road. The area south of McGregor had not been supported by the planning board but was included in the proposal as finally adopted.

James Hayes, vice president of COTI, pointed to the approximately 80 proposal supporters who attended

the commission meeting. He told the commissioners that "these citizens and taxpayers are striving for responsible growth, managed in such a way as to provide needed infrastructure and to protect our estuaries, our evacuation routes, our environment, our water supply and our quality of life."

He introduced Casey Wilhelm of McGregor Woods to discuss the proposals in detail. She said development along the Summerlin corridor would make evacuation of Sanibel more difficult in a hurricane. "The new hurricane study done by the Southwest Regional Planning Council," she said, "designates the entire corridor from the Caloosahatchee south to Estero Bay, and from Punta Rassa to Route 41 an A zone, that is subject to flooding even in a category one storm. The study predicts possible coastal storm surges of from seven feet (in a category one storm) to 16 feet (in a category five storm) at Punta Rassa, from five feet to 23 feet on the Caloosahatchee, and from five feet to 16

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


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


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Is gold the hedge of the future?

Often I am asked whether an individual should own gold as an investment. This question deserves some attention since much has been written about hedging your portfolio with gold. In fact, many financial consultants recommend that from 5 percent to 10 percent of an investor's assets be held in gold. Why gold?

Gold prices have historically risen during periods of inflation. With inflation eroding the purchasing power of the dollar, rising gold prices can help to offset losses on fixed income investments. During periods of political uncertainties and world tensions,

gold demand increases. It is internationally accepted. The gold supply may be curtailed by unrest in South Africa. Lastly, inflation and inflation fears are renewed by a strong economy, budget deficits, trade deficits and a weak U.S. dollar, leading to a demand for gold.

Sounds like a lot of reasons to own gold. How do we explain that the price of gold has fallen from near \$500 an ounce after the crash of Oct. 19, 1987, to near \$400 an ounce today? Are we experiencing a fundamental change in the perception of this precious metal?

Analysts point to several reasons why the luster is gone. Chief among them is the willingness of major industrial nations to raise interest rates to fight inflation. Governments are moving quickly to keep inflation in check. Secondly, official buying of gold by Japan and other countries has declined. Thirdly, alternative techniques for hedging against inflation are being employed by several institutional investors.

Will the price of gold decline to \$300 an ounce as some analysts predict? Or will it rebound to \$450 an ounce next year? If you own it, follow the trend closely for price direction. An investment in gold may not be the hedge of the future.

Advertising may become a hotly debated tax issue

The chances are pretty good that advertising will become a hot issue again, although a little differently than the recent agony it went through in Florida. As the need for state and national revenues grows and a reluctance to impose additional income taxes on individuals solidifies, then other revenue sources will become more attractive.

A shot already has been fired by the economic adviser to Michael Dukakis, who said there's a \$10 billion tax potential if advertising outlays are amortized over 10 years, rather than being fully tax deductible.

His argument is based on the premise that the full deductibility for advertising expenditures creates an "unfair bias against investment in tangible equipment, and in favor of investment in marketing and advertising - much of which cancels itself out as firms compete with one another for a pool of customers."

If this becomes open debate, and it might, it will put the advertising industry at some risk; and it also will present a legitimate opportunity for advertising to demonstrate its contribution to the economy.

Growing organization combating world hunger

Have you seen your neighbor picking "spinach" leaves off his tree? Or maybe plucking the blossoms and popping them in his mouth? Are sunflowers growing on his carport roof?

He may be someone who's growing some of the same experimental crops being grown on a 5-acre farm in North Fort Myers. The unusual plants are the weapons of a food revolution, grown to wipe out world hunger.

The farm is a sort of global extension agency called ECHO, Educational Concerns for Hunger Organization. The non-profit company combats Third-World hunger by developing capacities for year-round food production, rather than providing emergency relief aid in crisis situations.

On October 20 at the Sanibel Congregational United Church of Christ, all the seats were taken when Scott Sherman, the assistant director of ECHO, gave a slide show and talk about the amazing work this organization is doing with agriculture.

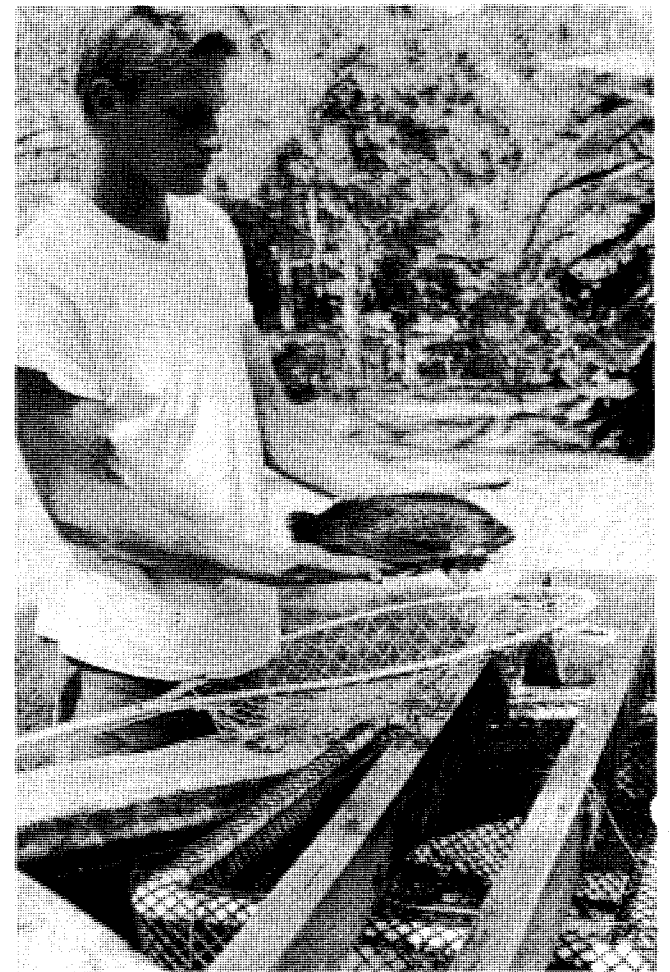
ECHO recommends food plants and farming techniques to help the farmers who are trying to subsist on land not particularly well-suited to farming. It also is a seed bank of underexploited plants with economic value - seeds you can't order from Burpee or other popular seed companies.

The Fort Myers location has proved to be an ideal location for experimenting with tropical plants. With the recent addition of two greenhouses, both tropical rainforest and desert climates have been simulated for intense growth research.

Not an inch of the ECHO property is wasted, from South Florida's only man-made "mountain" to the shallow bed gardens with only several inches of organic matter - no soil. Everything is recycled, even the droppings from the farm's resident animals, rabbits, ducks and goats.

In one small growth situation, a shallow-bed rooftop garden shades the rabbit hutch underneath. The rabbit manure and food drops through the wire mesh floor which overhangs a fish tank, which supplies the tilapia fish with a nutrient-rich water in which algae and microorganisms will thrive. The fish in turn give off ammonia into the water, which is then recycled through plants, which absorb the microorganisms and ammonia. Under the rabbit hutches, various shade-tolerant plants are grown.

Most all plants on the ECHO property are multipurpose. Besides providing food, many will stop erosion, provide fast shade or will serve as green manure.

Sherman said the most requested seed is that of the Moringa tree, also known as the "vegetable" tree or, in the Philippines, "mother's best friend," where the cooked leaves are fed to babies. Its popularity is due to the many edible parts and its ability to survive in the more arid parts of Africa.

The tender growing tips of leaflets can be cooked, stem and all, to be eaten as any greens, and are very rich in vitamins A and C. The young pods can be cooked like asparagus, and the blossoms also are edible and a good source of pollen. The seeds from mature pods are browned, mashed and boiled to release ben oil, which is good for cooking and lubricating, and also is long-lasting. The roots of the plant can be grated and used like horseradish.

It has been reported to ECHO that the Moringa trees grew 8 feet in three months in Zaire and 12 feet in five months in Nepal.

Velvet beans, a legume which grows so thickly it is used as a cover crop with corn, is another popular plant. Its seeds can be dried and ground for a coffee-like drink. The buffalo gourd is also a vigorous plant, grown for its large and plentiful roots which are used as a firewood substitute.

Super nutrients can be had with high-carotene carrots. Carotene is converted in the body to vitamin A; two varieties of high-carotene carrots, A-plus (50 percent more carotene than regular carrots) and Beta III (a whopping 300 percent more carotene) are very desirable for shallow soil areas.

One of the most important aspects of ECHO's work is distributing seeds. ECHO obtains seed from as many of these hard-to-find plants as it can and grows the plants on the farm. The staff and interns harvest the seeds, treat them with chemicals to prevent introducing diseases or insects and mail them to people in the Third World who want to try them. The organization doesn't sell the seeds, but it asks that the recipient report back with results and statistics, which then are fed back into the information bank.

ECHO also sends out another seed: information. A monthly newsletter, "ECHO Development Notes," containing practical information for the grower - from how to make a 5-gallon drum mousetrap or make planting pots from leaves, to technical growth-related data - is sent to more than 2,000 people in 90 countries.

ECHO was founded in 1973 by In-

diana businessman Dick Dugger, whose organization was experimenting with hydroponics in poverty-stricken Haiti. In 1979, Dugger asked Dr. Martin Price to serve as a volunteer consultant. A former professor of biochemistry at Geneva College, a post-doctoral researcher at Purdue University, a research manager at Battell Memorial Institute and a Fellow in the American Scientific Affiliation, Price was hired full time as ECHO's director in 1981 and moved to Florida.

ECHO's funding is 70 percent donations and the remainder comes from grants. The number of requests for seeds and information is growing faster than ECHO's income, so volunteers are always needed.

Today, Price and his staff invite public tours of ECHO, which are offered on Fridays at 10 a.m. Tours at other hours and days are available if you call a week or two ahead of time so they can schedule them. Telephone 543-3246 for information. ECHO is located at 17430 Durrance Road in North Fort Myers.

As you will see from the successful growth experiments on this small farm, many of these exotic nourishing plants adapt very well to our various soils, including the sandy soils of our islands.

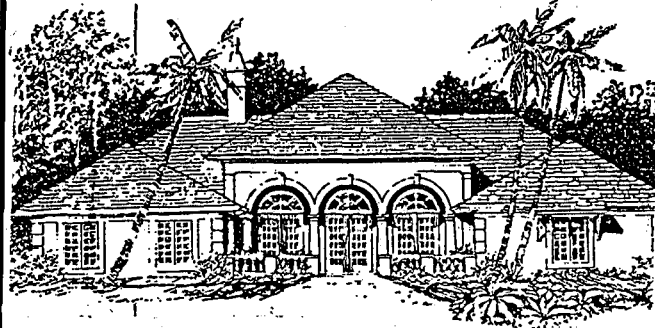

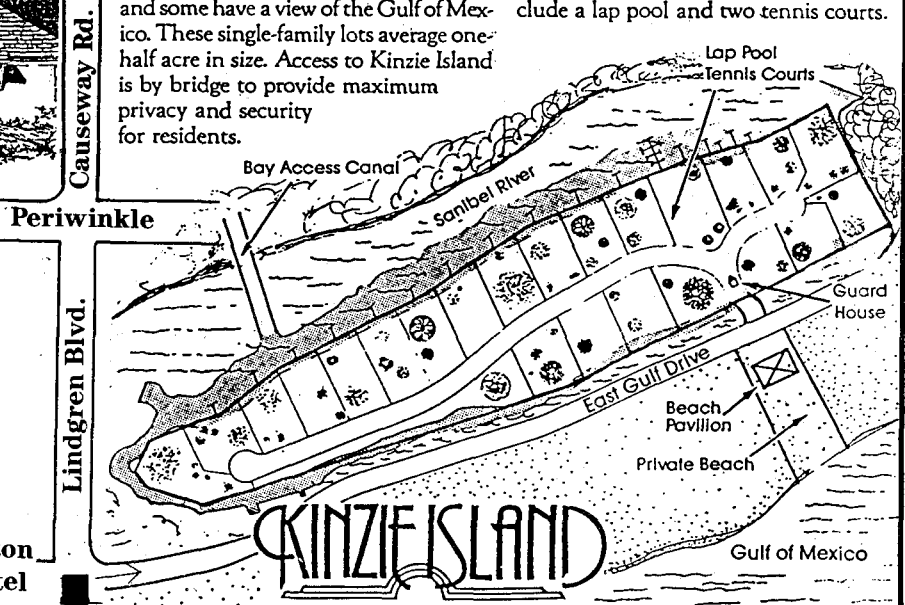

feet in Iona and Shell Point Village"

She went on to say that "the National Hurricane Centers clearly favor reduced densities. The National Hurricane Center in Washington warned, prior to Gilbert, that a major hurricane in the United States may be far worse than previously expected and that evacuating urban areas in coastal regions as well as barrier islands may be impossible. The director of the National Hurricane Center in Miami warns that people are going to be trapped in densely populated areas and that southwest Florida is one such area."

Wilhelm called the current land use map "a blueprint for a new metropolitan area, a city on a floodplain." She said that plan called for an eventual 26,594 residential units compared to the current 11,254 existing and approved units in the area. However, she said the final number of units could be much greater.

Also, 12 story buildings could be put in the area under current designations, she said.

"Most alarming about this urban community designation," Wilhelm said, "is the fact that on the west and south it is immediately adjacent to resource protection areas, areas of intense ecological significance since among other things they drain into the already polluted Estero and San Carlos bays."

"Urban Community" is the current designation of the areas affected by the Iona-McGregor proposal and of part of the area that COTI recommended be changed. That designation allows up to six dwelling units per acre and heavy commercial development. The rest of the area under the COTI recommendations is currently classified "suburban," which allows 3.7 dwelling units per acre.

The change adopted by the commission would make the areas affected south of Summerlin "Outlying Suburban," which allows three dwelling units per acre, and the areas in the Iona-McGregor proposal "Suburban."

Existing or already approved development would not be affected.

Commissioner Wallace strongly disagreed saying that during hurricane threats people crowd into commercial areas trying to buy masking tape, bottled water, and other such items.

The hearing, which had been scheduled for 9:30, did not begin until about 9:50 when commissioners Fussell and Slisher arrived in the room.

have driven by Beach Road and knew they were looking at Below Market Rate Housing?" she asked.

CHR has five BMRH units on Beach Road which have been complimented by neighbors formerly fearful of the program, Newman explained.

All categories of the resident voter sample consistently gave BMRH higher marks than the property owners sample. The greatest support (59 percent) was from those with an annual household income of less than \$40,000.

The program also has solid backing from voters in executive or managerial occupations (56 percent) or under age 45 (54 percent).

The figures prove, Newman feels, that there are many more BMRH supporters than anyone would have guessed.

"It's heartening," she said. "There are a few very outspoken opponents of the program who get a lot of attention. It's a relief to document

income figure of \$83,000 applied to property owners only; resident voters their bluster is not in proportion to their constituency."

Sanibel is not as wealthy as the first article stated, either, Newman pointed out.

The reported average household showed a median of \$52,000 annually.

"Regardless of the figure you look at, we are a well-off group of people," Newman said, "but we are not as homogenized as indicated. Sanibel is still a community, not an enclave."

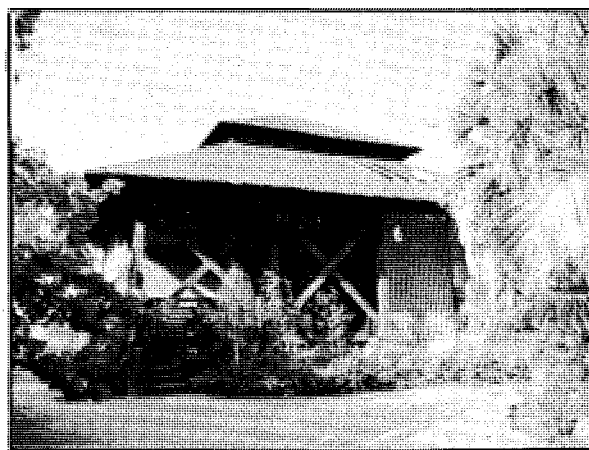

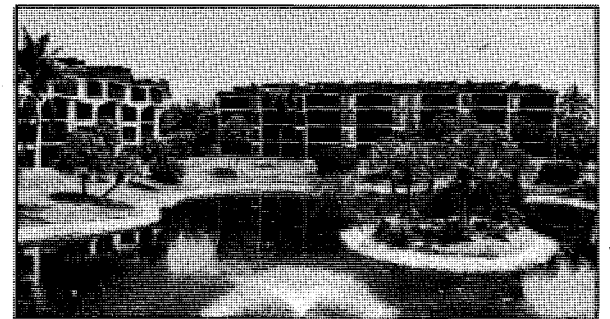

Two Sanibel police officers caught and removed a yellow ribbon snake from the porch of a Punta Caloosa Court woman last Tuesday morning.

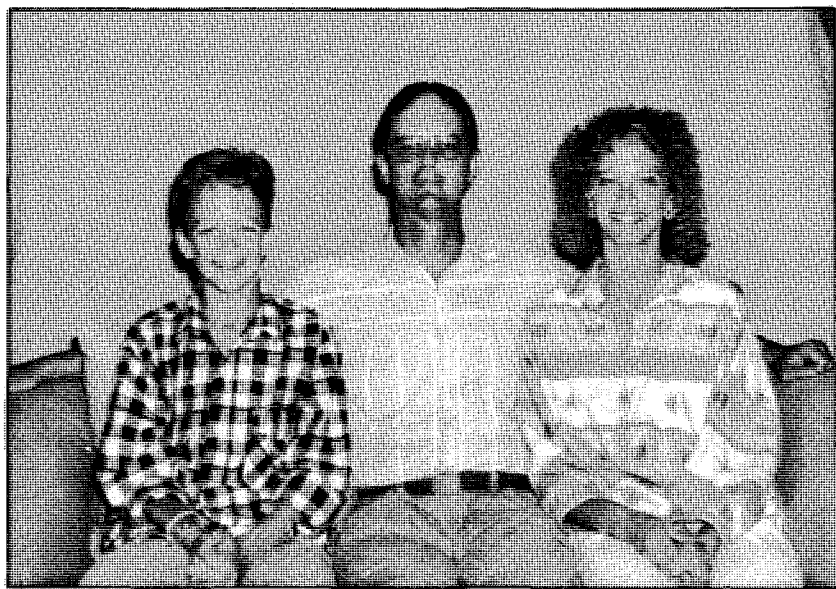

Whose fault is it when the kid gets hurt? Westall asked rhetorically.

Are you going to blame the gun, the person who loaded the gun or the kid who played with the trigger?"

Westall went on: "we're talking about an animal with the brain the size of the tip of your thumb. They don't reason...they only respond to negative or positive reinforcement. They naturally avoid humans, but, when they're fed, and positively reinforced by people, then they become a problem. And that's when we (the city's handlers and advisors) would step in and take care of the problem, with an understanding of all angles."

No longer will local people like Westall step in as they did in the past when an alligator is reported to authorities by squeamish residents. And no longer will Westall risk life and limb relocating nuisance alligators, now that alligator control is "no longer a community effort." While he plans to remain on the subcommittee, Westall foresees no

more direct contact with local, nuisance alligators.

Under the new policy alligators between four and six feet long about which a complaint had been filed would be relocated, at most, once. Larger alligators which show aggression toward people will be trapped, taken away and killed by officials of the Game Commission.

Perhaps the only point of consensus among the policy-makers and policy-takers on Sanibel is that a potentially dangerous situation now exists should people to adopt a false and careless sense of security concerning alligators and their habitat.

While almost everyone involved understands that feeding alligators is tantamount to signing his death warrant, the new policy is, in many ways, a shift in favor of those more inclined to use lethal force when dealing with an alligator whose inbred fear of humans has been gradually nullified by the handouts of naive, so-called animal-lovers.

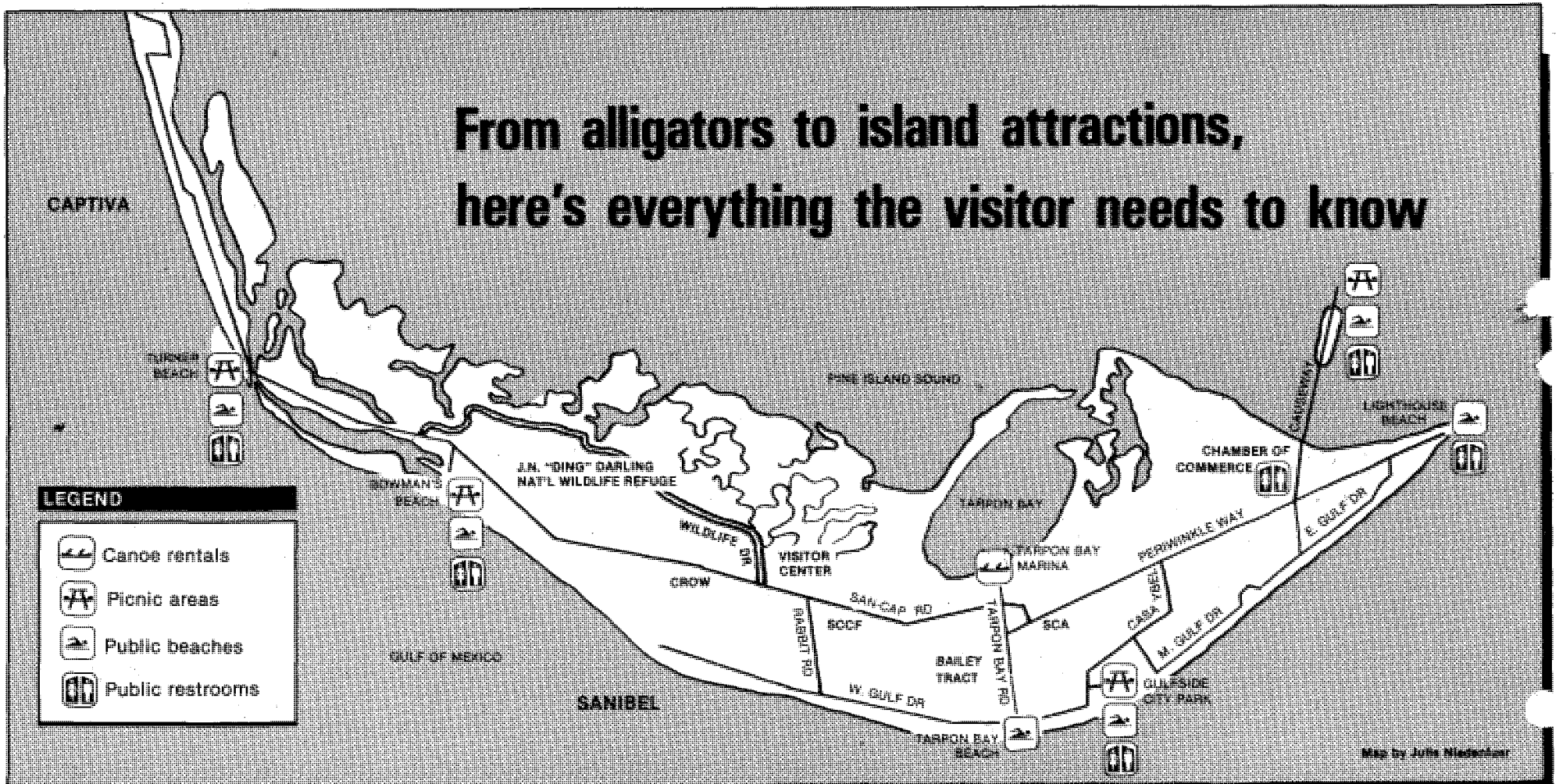

Alligators

Feeding alligators anywhere is not only **ILLEGAL**, it also is extremely **DANGEROUS**. An alligator that is accustomed to being fed will become a dangerous animal if left unfed for a period of time. Animals that are not artificially fed are less likely to become problems. A "tame" alligator becomes bold; he loses his fear of man. Then he has difficulty distinguishing between a fish and the hand that holds it.

Because of the alligator population here, dogs should never be allowed to run on the islands. Fence your dog; walk him on a leash or, if you must free him for a walk, keep him under voice control. **NEVER** tie your dog in an unfenced back yard.

For help with a nuisance alligator, call the Sanibel Police Department, 472-3111. The dispatcher will contact one of the city's several "alligator assessors" to respond to your call.

On Sanibel **UNRESTRICTED PARKING WITH NO STICKER** is permitted for everyone along the Causeway, at the Sanibel Lighthouse and Fishing Pier at the eastern tip of the island, at Guilfoyle City Park off Casa Ybel Road, on the east side of the Sanibel end of the Causeway, at the gulf end of Tarpon Bay Road and at the Trost property on Tarpon Bay Road.

Off-islanders with **RESTRICTED PARKING STICKERS** can find beach access at Bailey Road, Beach Road, Dixie Beach Boulevard, Nerita Street, Donax Street, Fulger Street and on the Sanibel side of Turner Beach.

A state law and city ordinance combine to prohibit parking or driving on the bike paths. Mopeds are not permitted on the bike paths.

Camping on the beach is prohibited, as are open beach fires. Fires are permitted, however, in approved cooking containers (not to exceed 48x24x12 inches deep) with an extruded metal grill for non-commercial food preparation.

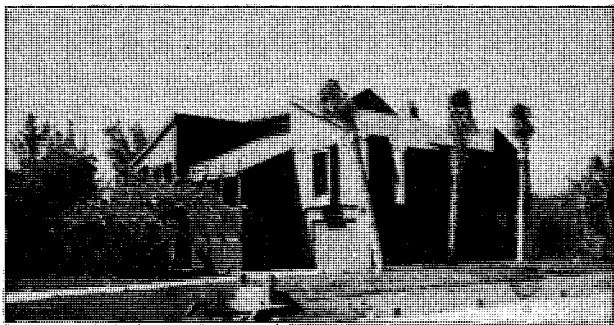

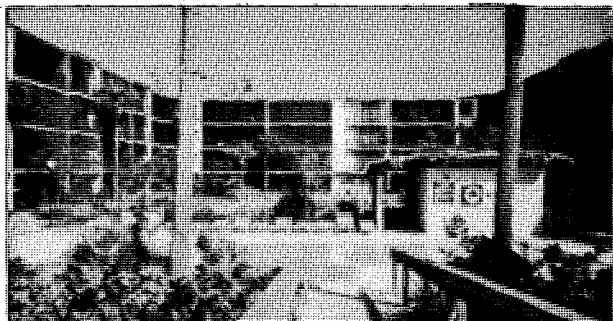

It is state policy to "harvest" any alligator, 6 feet long or larger who has been reported to authorities and is considered a nuisance. A nuisance alligator, by state definition, is one not less than four feet in length that presents a real or potential hazard to humans. Alligators between four and six feet long may be relocated once only to another part of the island by state trappers. The second time the alligator is killed.

The subcommittee also recommended to the city council that it be notified

whenever state trappers are called on to the island, that Sanibel police take a passive role whenever called to deal with an alligator situation, that the Wildlife Committee continue to monitor island alligator populations and that the Council direct an opinion regarding the policy changes to the state commission in Tallahassee.

Police will still respond to calls about alligators but they will not relocate the animal. They will instead contact the State Game and Freshwater Fish Commission in Fort Myers.

Please don't feed the alligators.

The Great Egret:

At the turn of the century egret plumes were worth nearly twice their weight in gold and the great egret became an endangered species. Now it is protected and thriving again

"Where can I buy one of those big plastic birds I saw on Periwinkle?" The visitor who posed that delightful question was not being facetious. After all, everyone knows that real birds don't stand still within a few feet of heavy traffic.

However, the great egret frequently defied conventional wisdom. In fact, not even a passing cement mixer interrupts the big bird's slow, stately stalking. But while this information may convince people that our great egret is not a plastic replica, it doesn't explain the presence of a wading bird on Periwinkle.

Over three feet long, *Casmerodius albus* weighs about two pounds. Such a splendid specimen burns a lot of fuel just taking off and flying to the feeding grounds! But although marine morsels comprise the bulk of the bird's diet, it craves variety in the form of terrestrial tidbits.

Little lizards, the avian equivalent of prime rib, are the preferred prey. When the egret finds one, its long neck sways in anticipation while the bird patiently waits for the meal to move within range. As soon as it does, the heron strikes with lightning speed - and rarely misses.

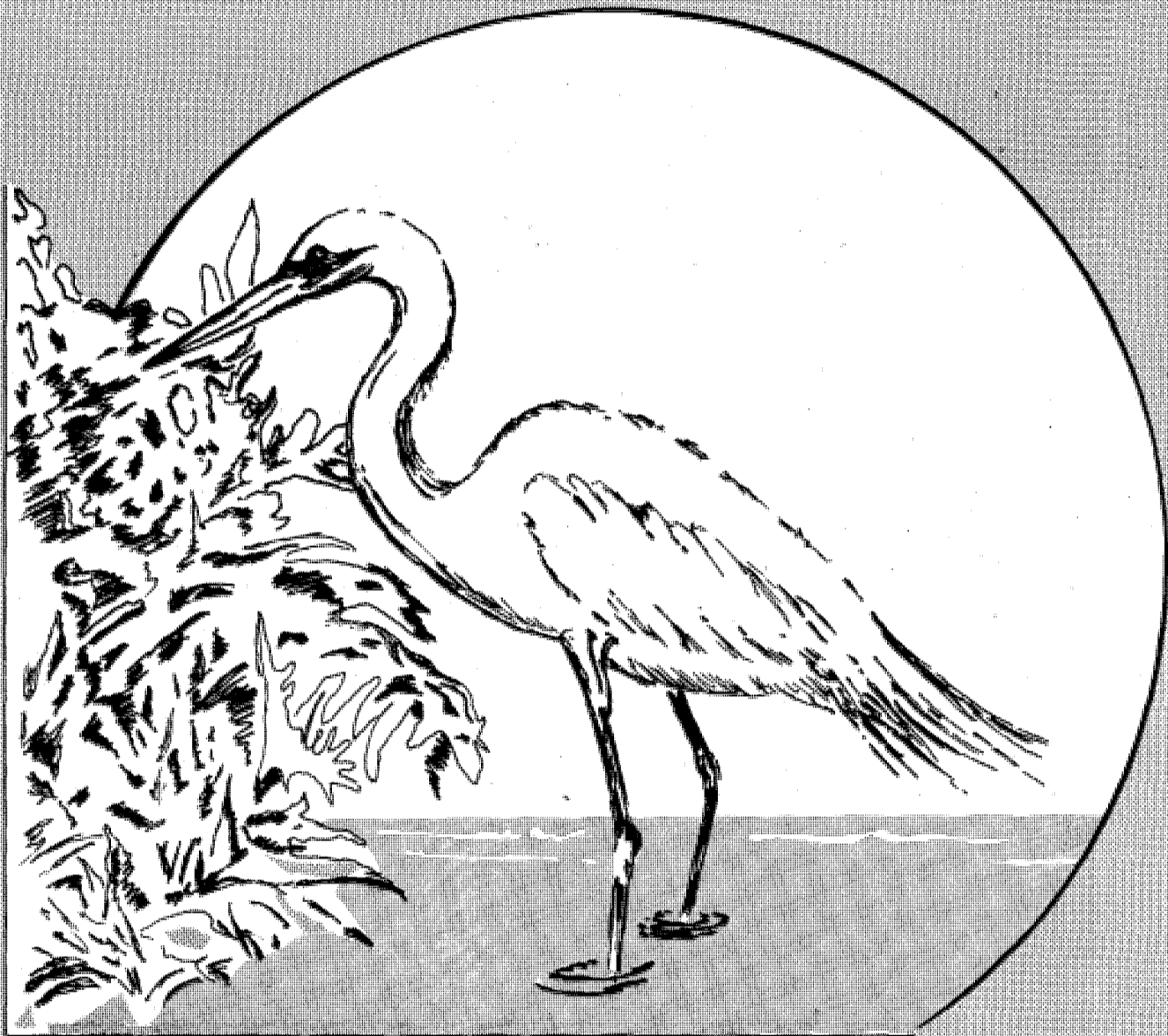
The heron? Surely the visitor whose question inspired this column would strongly object to muddying the waters with herons while explaining the presence of egrets on Periwinkle. But since all egrets are herons, but not all herons are egrets, a certain amount of confusion is inevitable.

White nuptial plumes, which the French called *copyaigrettes*, gave the egrets their special name. Just before the breeding season, both sexes of the great egret grow a magnificent cape of up to 54 feet long, lacy plumes. Unfortunately, this distinctive feature nearly caused the extinction of *Casmerodius albus*, "the adorned white heron."

Throughout history, mankind had used bird feathers for stuffing pillows and mattresses. But when nineteenth century milliners decided to adorn ladies' hats with nuptial plumes, the feather trade became big business. By 1903, an ounce of egret plumes was worth twice as much as an ounce of gold.

In order to cash in on the profitable trade, plume hunters invaded egret rookeries during the breeding season. Although the hunters were only interested in killing adult birds, their selective slaughter invariably resulted in the starvation of orphaned offspring and the rotting of abandoned eggs.

Appalled by such carnage, the National Audubon Society and other conservation groups lobbied for federal legislation to protect migratory birds. Although the Migratory Bird Treaty of 1916 protected many species on paper, it was unenforceable until Congress passed the

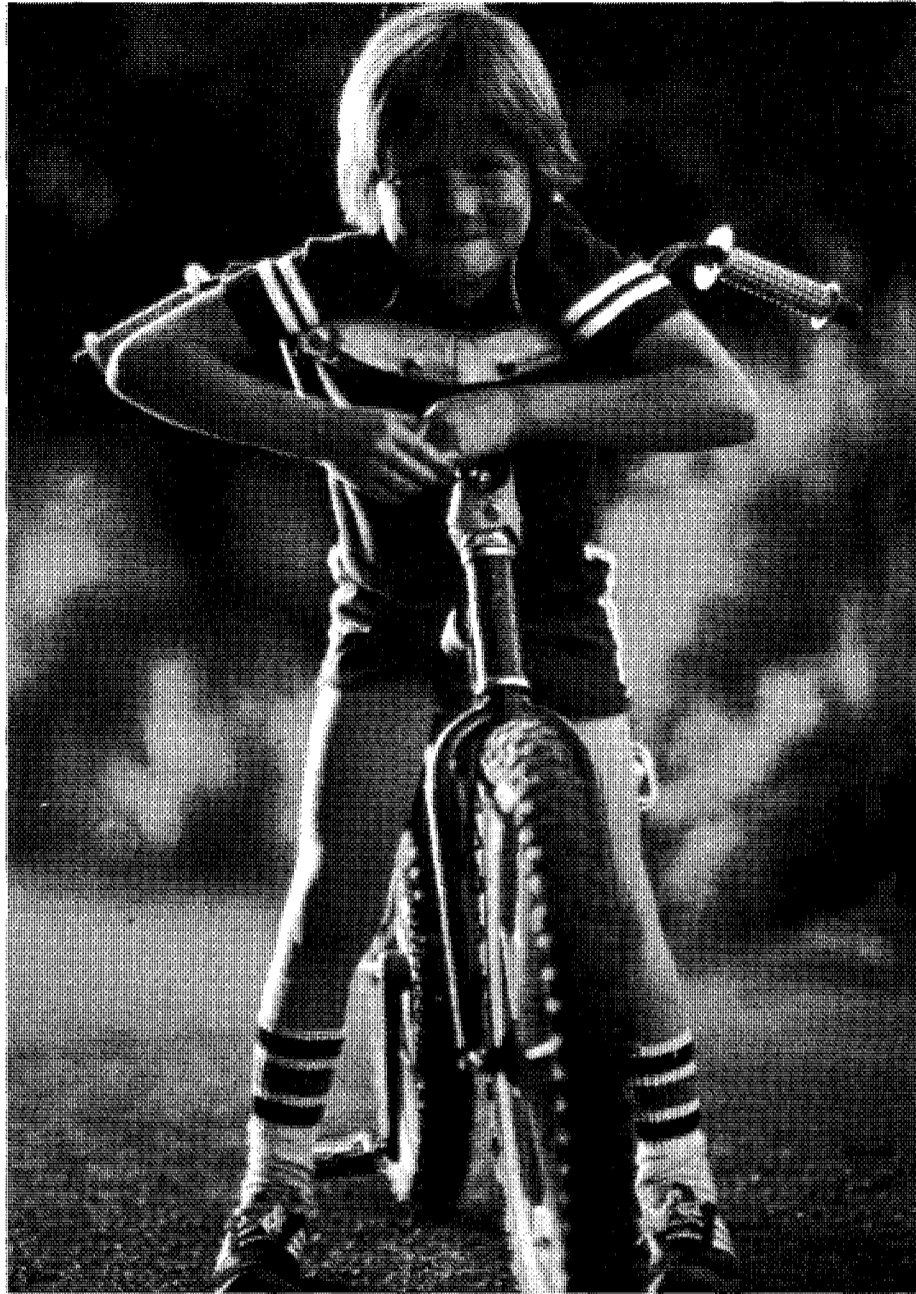
Migratory Bird Treaty Act two years later.

Thus as the Great War drew to a close, the great egret received a new lease on life. Today, the adorned white heron displays its spectacular breeding plumage in temperate areas throughout the world.

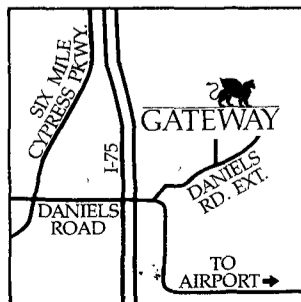

Soup of the evening

As you know by now, I am the original soup freak. The Mock Turtle in one of Lewis Carroll's books sings a song about soup. "Soup of the Evening, Beautiful Soup." I seem to have a lot in common with the turtle.

I'll write about soups today, but not turtle soup as that would be a bit unsporting of me. Instead we'll do a clam and mushroom one, then a curried leek followed by something that sounds as if it had come out of one of Carroll's "Alice" books. It's pears and peas. It definitely sounds off-beat but try it, you'll love it.

Clam and Mushroom Soup

1 pint of water
1 pint of cherrystone or little neck clams well scrubbed
1 tablespoon of grated onion
1 tablespoon minced celery leaves
1/2 tablespoon butter
One-half pound chopped mushrooms
1 cup light cream
Chopped parsley for garnish
Salt and pepper to taste.

Place the clams and water in a pan bring to a boil, put lid on turn to simmer and cook until the clams open. Remove from stove, take meat from shells and throw out shells. Strain the broth, saute the mushrooms, onion and celery in the butter until limp, add the mix to the clam broth, mince the clams and add them to the broth, taste for salt and pepper, add the cream, do not let boil, just heat it up, pour into soup bowls add the parsley and serve.

Curried Leek Soup

1 large trimmed leek
1 clove of garlic
1 onion chopped
4 cups of chicken broth
1 and one-half tablespoons curry powder
1 and one-half pounds of peeled and

chopped russet potatoes rinsed in cold water

2 cups of half and half
2 teaspoons lemon juice
Salt and pepper to taste
Dash of Tabasco

4 teaspoons minced fresh chives for garnish

In your food processor fitted with the steel blade put the garlic, use the on-off button to mince, add the onion and leek using the on-off button to chop. Put the mix in a large pot, add the broth and curry, bring to a boil, add the potatoes, turn to simmer, cover and cook about 25 minutes.

Puree the mix in batches in a blender and pour in the half and half. Pour in a large bowl, place in refrigerator and chill. Before serving taste for salt and pepper, add the lemon juice and tabasco. Whisk well. Serve in chilled soup cups and garnish with the chives. This makes about eight servings and can be done the day before.

Pea and Pear Soup

1 cup chopped onion
Two-thirds cup chopped celery
One-half stick of butter
1 large pear, either a Bartlett or Anjou, peeled, cored and chopped
5 cups chicken broth
1 and one-half cups of green peas
1 tablespoon minced parsley for garnish

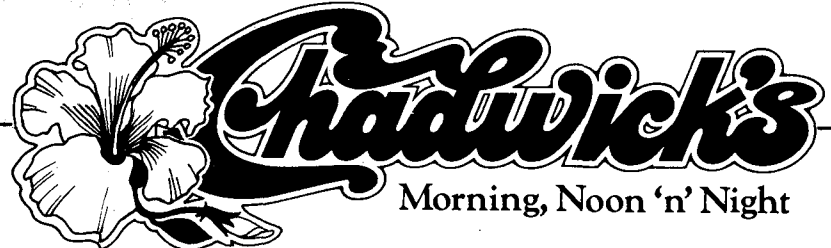

The countywide campaign got underway a month ago with a goal of \$1.3 million.


The funds will be distributed to twenty-eight different agencies, including four new ones. The various agencies provide a wide range of human services which help children, teenagers, families, and senior citizens.

In a heavy pan, cook the onion and celery in the butter, stir and cook until the vegetables are wilted. Add the pear, cook about five minutes, add the broth and the peas and bring to boil, turn to simmer and cook five minutes. Pour part of the soup in a blender, blend well in batches (if it seems too thick add more broth) pour back in pan cook for five minutes, stir well. When ready to serve pour into heated soup cups, garnish with the parsley and

serve. This makes about five servings. You can so this the day ahead and reheat in a double boiler.

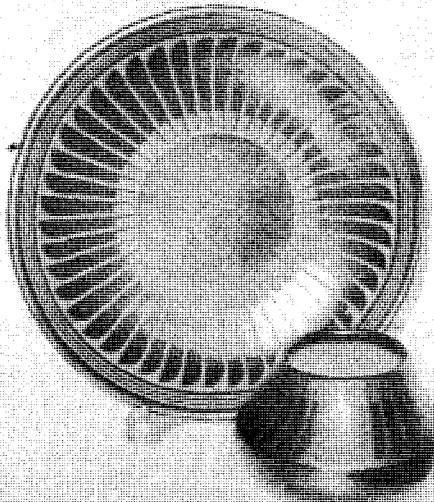

Internationally known artist opens show at BIG Arts Friday

Art works of Don Drumm, who defines himself as an environmental sculptor, will be on exhibit at the Barrier Island Group for the Arts Center Gallery starting this Friday with a 7 to 9 p.m. reception. The exhibit is expected to last through November 25.

Drumm is particularly well-known for his pioneering use of cast aluminum as an artistic medium and will be holding a workshop Saturday and Sunday in the use of that and other materials in creating art. Details on the workshop and reservations to attend are available by calling 472-2528 or 472-3307.

In addition to large sculptures and wall reliefs, Drumm is noted for items ranging from jewelry to cookware. Among individual art works he has created are: ten-story and eight-story cut-concrete relief murals at Bowling Green State University; an 18 foot high fountain sculpture of stainless steel rod and cast aluminum panels at Akron, Ohio's Cascade Plaza; a sculpted punch

bowl for those who attended the 1987 Midwest Regional Governor's Conference; a chalice for the Lord Mayor of Sydney, Australia; artwork for the presidential palace in Liberia; and a cast aluminum wall hanging for Pan American Airlines corporate offices in New York City.

Drumm's Akron, Ohio, studio includes a foundry and machine shop. His abilities with machinery and technology might be traced to his being the grandson of a blacksmith and the son of an auto mechanic. The 53 year old Drumm received a Bachelor of Fine Arts and a Masters degree from Kent State University. His career in art has spanned the thirty years since that time. For six of those years he was artist-in-residence at Bowling Green State University.

"I keep coming back to Gestalt teaching as a philosophy of working," states Drumm, "Learning to see the total relationship of the parts with the greater whole. In producing an interesting environmental experience we must be aware of how

Gorillas in the Mist: insightful and intriguing

Gorillas in the Mist

Directed by Michael Apted

Starring Sigourney Weaver and Bryan Brown

Dian Fossey was a research protegee of the famed anthropologist Louis Leakey. She spent 18 years in the mountains of east central Africa studying the endangered mountain gorillas. "Gorilla in the Mist," a new film by Michael Apted ("Critical Condition"), is the story of her experiences there.

This film is a rare joint venture between rival studios. In 1986 both Universal and Warner Brothers discovered that they were working on similar projects, i.e., the life story of Dian Fossey. In an unusual spirit of cooperation, they agreed to co-produce the film and even flipped a coin for distribution rights.

"Gorillas in the Mist" was shot on location in Kenya and Rwanda, and the lush mountain scenery is breathtaking.

Sigourney Weaver ("Alien," the sequel "Aliens," and "Ghostbusters") has the lead role of Dian Fossey, the primatologist who founded the Karisoke Research Center in the Virunga Mountains. She

traveled to Africa in 1966 to study the rare primates and take a census of their dwindling numbers. The gorillas were prime targets of poachers who sold the apes' heads and hands as souvenirs and of animal trappers hired by zoos.

Fossey devised the techniques of keeping her head low in submission and pretending to chew on

vegetation to establish a rapport with the gorillas. Gradually, as they allow her admission to their groups, the gorillas become more precious to Fossey, and she becomes increasingly outraged by the on-going rapaciousness.

Bryan Brown ("Cocktail," "F X") plays Bob Campbell, a National Geographic photographer sent to get footage of the gorillas. While shooting the apes, he falls for the lanky, lovely Weaver.

Sigourney Weaver, in the role of Dian Fossey, gives a finely shaded, intense performance as her love of the gorillas escalates into a fierce, single-minded obsession. Her eyes take on the feverish glow of the fanatic, while Fossey becomes more isolated and hardened in her battle against poachers and bureaucrats. Weaver's scenes with the gorillas and her Black African tracker are especially fine.

"Mask" writer Anna Hamilton Phelan's screenplay for "Gorillas in the Mist" is insightful and complex. The character of Dian Fossey is multifaceted and intriguing, and may be just the breakthrough role that Weaver needs to gain superstar status.

Mary Schultz, a Michigan native and five year Sanibel resident, is film critic for "The Islander."

Many declarers failed in 3NT when they cashed the ace of clubs at the second trick and then finessed with the jack of clubs. This play ignored the probability that East was short in clubs for his takeout double.

When East discarded on the second club, entries were so tangled that nine tricks were impossible.

Erdos' play virtually assured the contract.

DAILY QUESTION

You hold ♠10865♥KQ♦AQ64♣A65. You open one diamond, and partner responds one heart. You rebid one spade, and he returns to two diamonds. The opponents pass. What do you say?

POINT COUNT

ANSWER: Pass. Game is unlikely since partner's preference promises at most nine points; with more, he would jump at his second turn. Although partner could have a magic hand with A-J-x-x-x of hearts and the king of diamonds, it doesn't pay to credit him with specific cards.

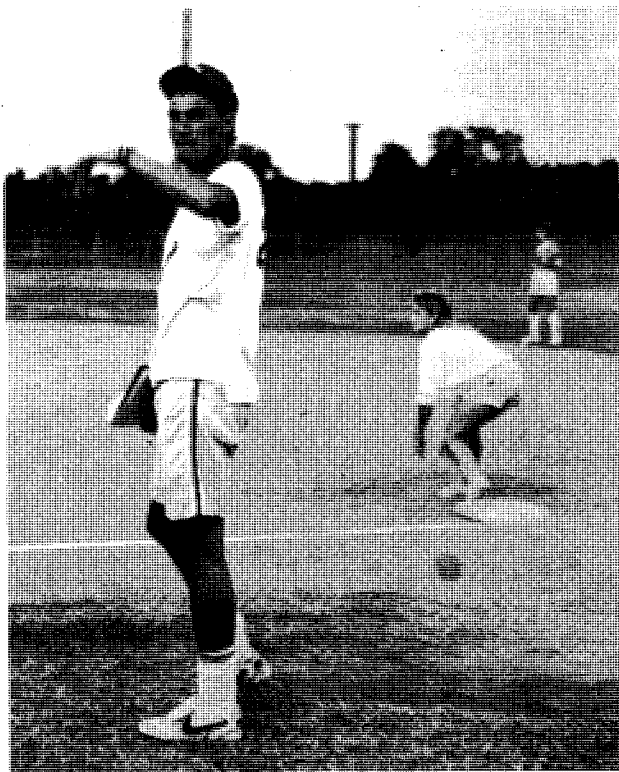

Red tide still running but usually doesn't last long

About the third week of October we began to hear reports of an approaching red tide. It wasn't long after that the tell-tale signs of dead fish made it very apparent that rumors were facts.

Red tide is not fully understood. Scientists do not know exactly why it starts, how long it will last, or what makes it end. In the simplest definition, it's a bloom of algae which depletes oxygen from the water and sometimes clogs the gills of fish.

The result is massive fish kills.

This usually is limited to smaller, non-migratory fish like pinfish, pigfish, catfish, some mullet, drum, and even trout and redfish.

In all the years I have witnessed this unfortunate "weeding out" of the fish stocks, it's rare to see a snook or tarpon or other top game fish die. Most seem to sense the danger and move to cleaner waters. The small resident fish tend to die first and in the most numbers.

I've seen red tide kills so extensive, a row of dead,

rotting fish six feet wide and miles long, will temporarily line a beach. I've seen so many catfish dead, that shellers could not walk the beaches because of the barbs from the dead catfish.

Those are extreme circumstances, but perhaps this present outbreak will be short-lived and mild.

What does it do to fishing? It doesn't eliminate it altogether, but it makes a boater look harder for fish. This red tide stretches from a couple of miles to over 12 miles off-shore, with some of it coming and

going in the passes.

If you can get into the back bays, or well off-shore, you can usually avoid the toxic water and catch some fish.

However, if you see the water turning a dull grey, or even slightly reddish, them move on, because a large bloom has occurred and you won't catch many fish.

Don't eat fish which you see swimming in circles at surface. They are most likely dying from the tide. We are told at first stages the poison in the fish won't harm humans, but from observations, pass up fish which seem injured.

The good thing is that red tide doesn't last for long. Some say it's nature's way of getting rid of over populated fish stocks. In the meantime, look for clean water, because that's where the survivors will be hiding out.

This year's spoils from Captiva beach restoration not so good

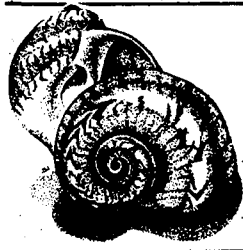
Wouldn't you just know it! We waited several years since the last time they dredged sand to renourish the beaches on Captiva Island. Then the shelling was great, but this time pickings are just a bit disappointing.

One of the ladies I know said the color of the sand was very dark and the smell of the muddy sand being put on the beach was nullifying any shells being found.

The "Pipeline Show" as we call the dredging-shelling on Captiva, is south of the South Seas Plantation property now. You can park at the free public access beach beyond the entrance to South Seas Plantation and walk about half a mile or less to where the pipe from the off-shore dredge is spilling out sand and some shells. Last week, it was coming up to the Mucky Duck Pub.

A wild rumor is going around that on the average, one junonia is found each day. Well, I said it was wild, but I didn't say it was substantiated.

Someone was asking me recently about eating

types of shells and whether there were any restrictions, in view of the Sanibel City limits of two per person, per species.

On October 1, the oyster season opened again, after being closed for three months. There are a lot of large oysters in the bay, but some oyster bars can be found.

Two things to remember: One, we are under a red tide ban and no oysters, clams or scallops are allowed to be taken for human consumption. These things usually only last a short time, and once the

approval is given, you can harvest oysters from Pine Island Sound but they have to measure three inches in length to be taken.

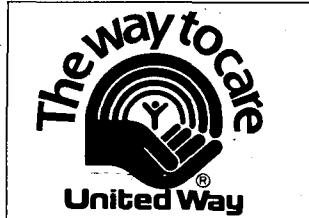
Scallop season opened on July 1 and the limit there is five gallons in the shell or a half gallon of shelled meat.

There are probably more clams than oysters to be had and shellers working the mud flats occasionally find some to eat. These hard shell clams have a minimum of one inch in thickness, with a bag limit of two bushels daily.

Good shelling this week, check the dredge if you are up on Captiva way and we'll tell you when it's okay to harvest clams, oysters and scallops again.

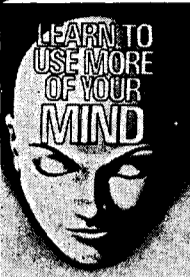

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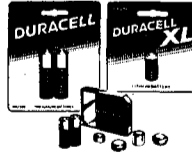
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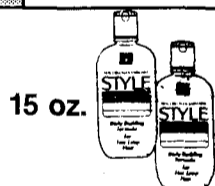
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Girl Scouts trick or treat so hungry can eat

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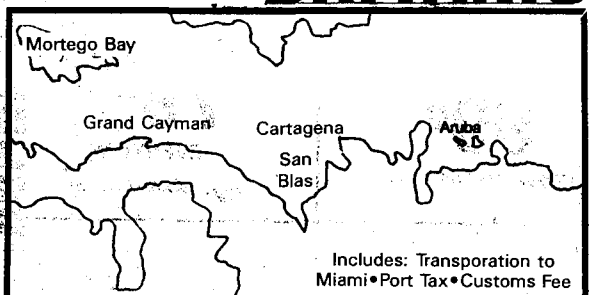

Manatee deaths increasing, majority in boating accidents

Officials with the Department of Natural Resources' St. Petersburg Marine Research Institute today expressed heightened concern for what appears to be an unfavorable trend in manatee mortality statistics, noting that 98 manatees have died between January 1 and mid-August of this year, compared with 113 for all of 1987.

According to DNR records, of the 98 manatee deaths this year, four were caused by flood gates crushing and drowning the animals, 26 are believed related to complications at birth, 18 died of unknown causes and 17 were attributed to other natural causes. Boat or barge collisions accounted for 32 manatee deaths, and one additional death was verified but the carcass could not be recovered.

The West Indian manatee, an endangered species experts believe numbers approximately 1,200, faces a continuing threat to its survival as it migrates in and around Florida's waterways. During the warmer months, the animals are widely dispersed and may be present in rivers, bays and lakes from the Florida Keys to Georgia on the east coast and to Alabama on the west coast.

DNR officials, in cooperation with the Save the Manatee Club, are stressing five ways boaters can avoid hurting manatees:

1. Wear polarized glasses while operating a boat. Polarized lenses make it much easier to see the "swirling" that occurs when a manatee surfaces for air.
2. Stay in the marked channel. Manatees have shown signs that they are avoiding heavy boat traffic areas. Additionally, channel depth reduces the likelihood of pinning or crushing manatees.
3. Stay out of seagrasses. Grass beds are prime manatee habitat. This includes areas where hydrilla and water hyacinths are present.
4. other than idle and wide open. Reducing your speed gives you greater maneuverability to avoid a manatee when you see one, and you'll also save gas.
5. Observe all manatee speed zones and caution areas.

Anyone observing an injured or dead manatee should call the nearest office of the Florida Marine Patrol or contact the toll-free Resource Alert hotline, 1-800-342-1821. Officials remind boaters that accidentally hitting is not a criminal offence; it is critical, however, that persons contact the authorities immediately in order to give the injured animal its best chance for survival.

S&H Green stamps buys manatee research boat

In late 1986, Save the Manatee Club, a Florida based non-profit organization, starting collecting S and H Green Stamps from their members for a research boat to allow researchers to track movements of manatees tagged with radio transmitters.

The Save the Manatee Club was established in 1981 by former Florida Governor Bob Graham and renowned singer/songwriter Jimmy Buffet to promote public awareness about the highly endangered marine mammal, the West Indian manatee, which lives in Florida's waters year-round. This extremely gentle herbivore is also Florida's official state marine mammal.

The Sperry and Hutchinson Company, Inc. has been in business since 1896 and continues to operate gift centers and distribute stamps nationwide.

Florida provided the only significant year-round habitat in the U.S. for the manatee. These marine mammals are endangered because of increasing threats from collisions with boats, loss of habitat and other human-related factors. More information about manatees' habitats is needed to develop plans to safeguard them from these threats. An important way to gather such information is to tag individual manatees with radio transmitters and observe them while following their movements. Findings from this research have shown that manatees travel between points as far apart as Miami, Florida, and Georgia, and that some manatees move dozens of miles in a single day.

The public is encouraged to continue to send S and H Green Stamps to Club headquarters to that another research boat can be purchased. Stamps can be sent to Save the Manatee Club, 500 North Maitland Avenue, Maitland, Florida, 32751. Inquiries about membership and the manatee adoption program can also be directed to that address.


