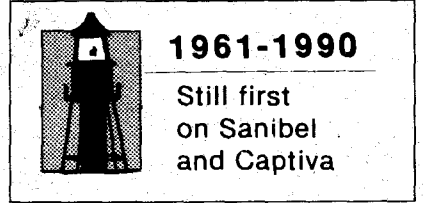

1990 Shell Fair called 'best ever'

Thousands attend annual island event

Blessed by beautiful weather, aided by hard-working volunteers and with displays of thousands of shells in 88 categories, the 53rd annual Sanibel Shell Fair drew thousands of visitors, March 1 through 4.

In addition to competitive categories, the Live Shell Tank, manned by 5th grade students from Sanibel Elementary School, and the Driftwood Shop, featuring hand-crafted shell items, helped swell shell fair income. A giant raffle and busy refreshment stand also contributed to profits, according to Margaret Thorsen.

According to Thorsen, who served with Mili Backus, Dorothy Putnam and Jean Hallstead as the four directors of the 1990 Shell Fair, this year's event was the "best ever."

Co-sponsors of the annual event were the Sanibel Community Association, with Doris Platt, president, and the Sanibel-Captiva Shell Club with Anne Joffe, president.

Trophy and award winners learned of their success at a preview Wednesday evening, prior to the opening of the fair at 9 a.m., Thursday, March 1.

City makes first bid for CARL funding

Kain announces council candidacy

Wallace M. Kain, president of Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife, formally announced his intent to run for a seat on the City Council in the November 1990 election. Kain filed his Declaration of Intent to Seek Office with Sanibel Finance Director Renee Lynch last Friday, March 2.

Kain, 61, has been an island activist since he took early retirement from his job as an AT&T intellectual property attorney and settled here six years ago with his wife, Joan, after having visited the islands since 1975.

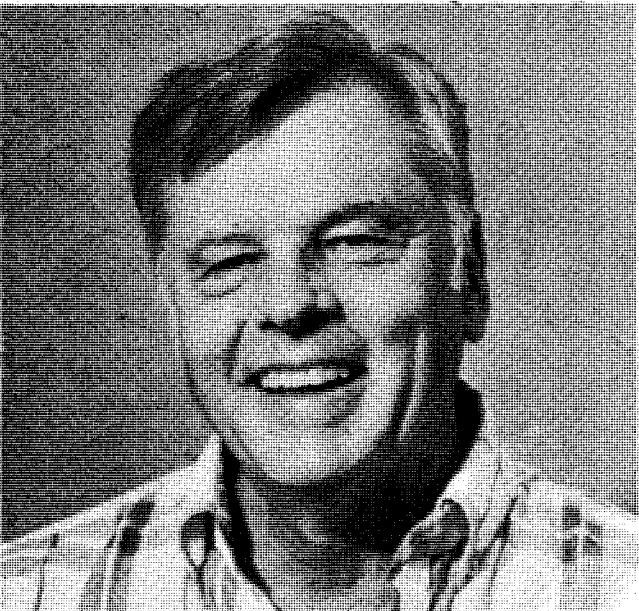
"We're boat people, very water-oriented," he said. That and his long standing interest in wildlife and photography prompted him to join CROW as a volunteer.

Erick Lindblad and Councilman Mark "Bird" Westall made the oral presentation to the Lands Acquisition Advisory Council of the Department of Natural Resources, the agency responsible for selecting projects to receive funding from its Conservation and Recreation Lands (CARL) Acquisition Program.

Sanibel's trio had a lot of information to wedge into a short period, and the allotted 10-minute presentation time for each of the 56 applicants was strictly adhered to, according to Mills. The other presentations ranged from basic, good-old-boys' small-scale projects to elaborate, video-tapes of projects involving thousands of acres.

Mills said the board appeared to be familiar with Sanibel's land acquisition program and Surface Water Management Plan, and expressed interest in the .25 mill tax the city has enacted for land acquisition.

Mills said the selection committee will make its decision Monday, March 12, as to whether Sanibel's project will be selected to receive the full CARL review and assessment, which will be a year-long, ongoing evaluation and priority ranking process, which involves an intensive analysis of the proposed project's natural attributes, vulnerability and endangerment. To progress, a project must receive the approval of four of the six members of the committee. By the end of 1990, Sanibel will know whether it is on the final prioritized list of projects seriously under consideration for funds.

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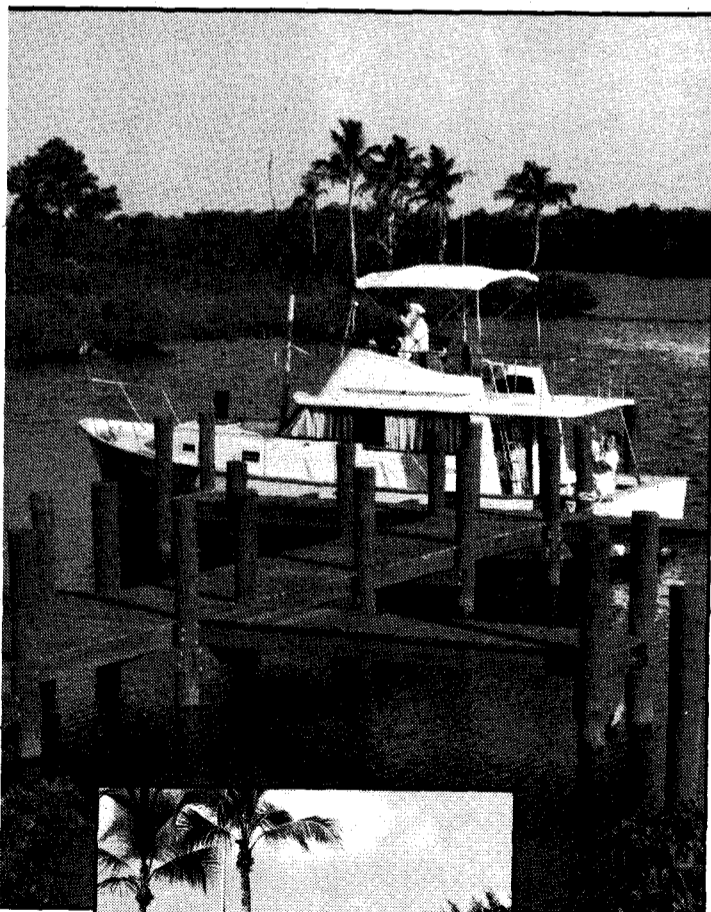
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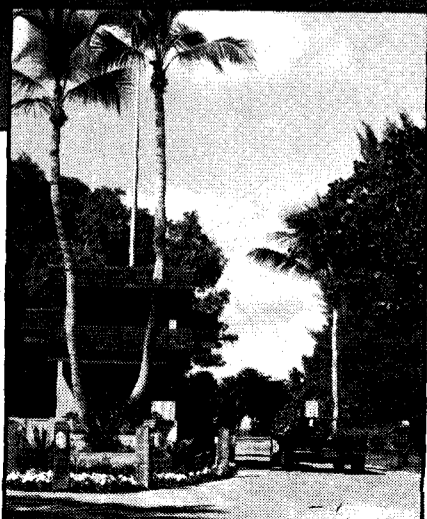

Lights, camera ... Matsumoto subject of Japanese national television documentary

Island artist Ikki Matsumoto is the subject of a Japanese television documentary on outstanding Japanese people living outside their homeland.

From March 1 through March 4, a production crew from Japan Record Center, headed by producer Hideo Nakamura, followed Ikki through his days.

Nakamura and cameramen Ryuich Kumita and Hajime Tanaka also saw a lot of the barrier islands.

After filming Matsumoto at his studio in Fort Myers, the crew recorded on site at the J.N. "Ding" National Wildlife Refuge, on Cabbage Key, along lots of gulf shore, at the Matsumoto Gallery on Sanibel and at other island sites.

The film, part of a series that includes 70 successful Japanese, will be aired on a national network throughout Japan on April 15.

"We hope it will be a good thing for Sanibel," said producer Nakamura. "The series has been filmed in New York, Rome, Paris, London, Mexico and many other places, but we like Sanibel best," said Nakamura, the diplomat.

"Ikki's Japaneseness is a strong part of his art," he continued. "We are pleased that this Japaneseness is so well loved here. He is a unique artist."

The art sense of the entire Matsumoto family impressed the crew. Polly Matsumoto is a master weaver. Thai Matsumoto creates unique furniture and Amy is a successful jewelry designer and creator.

"It is nice to see the whole family contributing to art," Nakamura added, "and to the community."

Ikki enjoys great success in Japan, where he is regularly exhibited in leading galleries.

The camera crew was on hand at a Matsumoto Gallery opening Sunday evening featuring the works of Thomas and Rosana Workman.

It was a global evening. Polly wore Mexican fashions in honor of the Workmans, who live and work in Mexico. Ikki assembled a Japanese look. Thai was conservative Sanibel and Amy, the epitome of the leading edge of fashion.

The Tokyo guests, on the other hand, wore the

international look that stems from the United States. Nakamura's red cowboy shirt was printed in six-shooters and horseshoes. Kumita's sweatshirt featured a parade of Captain Santas in shorts, while Tanaka's shiny black jacket would have been at home anywhere in the world.

Indeed, the entire crew is quite at home wherever they go.

Taste progress continues

"I think it'll happen."

With one brief statement, Scott Siler, representing the Mariner Corp., gave a positive indication that the 1990 Taste of the Islands will be held again this year at The Dunes Golf and Tennis Club on Sanibel.

In recent weeks, rumors have spread that the Taste would not be held due to increased health code restrictions. Discussions between representatives of the Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife, the chief benefactor and one of the co-organizers of the Taste event; Mariner, which manages The Dunes; and the county Health Department, have been held and representatives of each have indicated that the Taste will be held.

According to Siler, Dr. John Naponik, the director of the health department, indicated that the state HRS Department has given permission for local health agencies to grant one-day permits for such taste festivals to be held.

Siler said that the one-day permits allow the local health department to be a bit more flexible with some of its health-care restrictions. He said the county is concerned with the safety and welfare of the people and that is still a major concern.

"We've cleared that (health) hurdle," Siler said.

The work in organizing the event though is now just

SCUBA SCOOP

This past week our divers once again sighted large manta rays, also known as Southern sting rays. The rays were about 6 feet from wing tip to wing tip. The pair was seen in 55 feet of water.

Also seen on the barge wreck ... a gentle 200-pound jewfish entertaining happy divers.

Surface temperature: 68 degrees.

Bottom temperature: 68 degrees.

Visibility: 10-15 feet at 35-foot depth;

15-40 feet at 55-foot depth.

Snorkelers are sighting lots of shells near the beaches. Visibility has greatly improved!

This time of year we are involved in a lot of open-water scuba training with snowbirds who have come to enjoy our warm Florida waters. They have completed the academic and pool training portions of their scuba courses back North. Once they complete four open-water training dives with one of our instructors, they are certified as PADI open-water divers.

We have also been conducting a lot of the full, open-water certification courses. The students complete a number of pool/academic sessions, take quizzes and a final exam, then do their open-water dives aboard the Island Hopper. Students completing this training receive a certification card which allows them to participate in diving activities around the world.

March 4, 1965

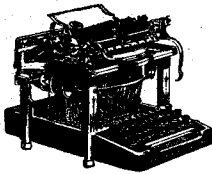
Now that the necessary 600 subscribers have been secured, the Island Water Association has set up temporary offices at the Fire House on Sanibel.

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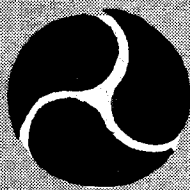
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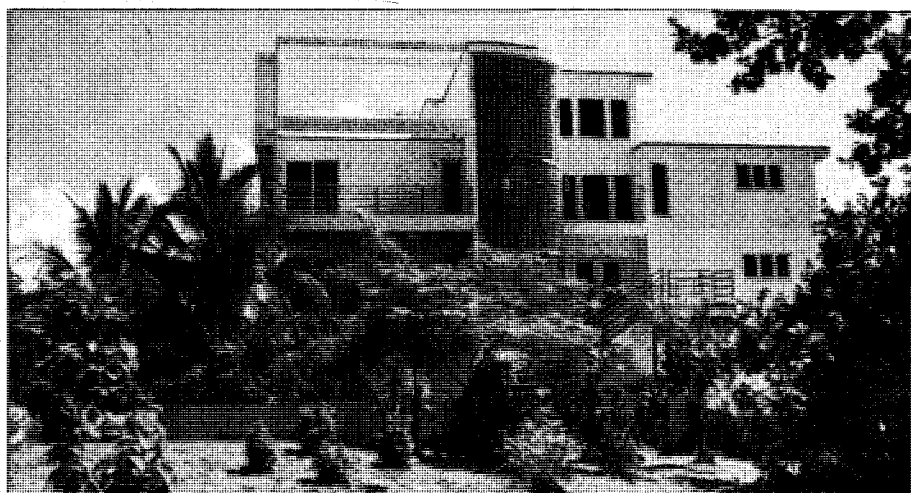
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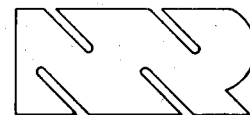

The mystery of Oliver Bowen

Several years ago, we lived in the Dinkin's Bayou area, near the battle zone known as Wulfert Point. It was a great part of the island to live in, even if you aren't fond of no-see-ums. I always felt closer to the heart of the island there, to its thriving, pulsating life force. It reminded me of my rural childhood days, where adventure awaited across a barb-wired fence or a muddy stream.

And if no true adventure were to be found, it was easy enough to invent one.

At the time we lived there, I was deeply immersed in the fantasy of local pirate lore. I was actively researching tales of buried treasure for a travel piece I was writing.

A friend, who actually listened to my laxated loquaciousness on the subject, told me about an article he had read recently in one of the island newspapers. It was about, he said, a pirate whose coffin -- and perhaps treasure -- was buried on Sanibel. And near our house, no less.

"Spirits of dead pirates are said to watch over their buried treasure," I had already written as the lead to my

story. "Along Florida's legendary treasure-studded Gulf Coast, alligators and rattlers stand guard as well," I continued.

I didn't mention no-see-ums. Travel readers don't like to hear about no-see-ums.

But knowledge of possible pirates lying around in my own back yard, well, that was enough to squelch any fears of ghosts, gators or gnawing. (Which only alliterates well if you pronounce it ga-nawing. This license is allowed in legend-telling.) For, as I wrote later on in my article, "the true hunter for pirate's treasure is made of precious mettle."

(Pretty clever, hunh.)

Besides, I didn't believe my friend, Joe. He lies a lot. He grew up in Rabbit Hash, Ky., where I'm sure one is often forced to invent adventure in the absence of the real thing. I'm not certain he didn't invent the town itself.

So, one still summer's day, my husband and I set out over fence and stream in search of a grave site. I'm not sure I could find it again, but sure enough, it was there. An old concrete slab marked "Oliver F. Bowen. Died Feb. 17, 1894."

There was something about the stillness -- and the shock of realizing Joe had been telling the truth -- that charged the scene with a current of eeriness. I'm sure it wasn't pirate spirits that made us feel like not sticking around very long. I'm pretty sure, anyway.

Joe couldn't remember in which paper he'd seen the article, or when, but with a little digging, I unearthed Maggie Greenberg's story "The case of the captain's coffin" in an August 1982 issue of *The Islander*. She made references to Elinore Dormer's history of the islands, which I also read with interest.

I was relieved to find Joe was, indeed, lying. More or less. At the very least he was legend-building. He had read between the lines of Maggie's story to fabricate a neat solution to what the author had left to the reader's imagination.

The facts: Oliver Bowen was a wealthy homesteader on Sanibel for only one year. During his stay, he built a home from wood he had shipped in on a vessel he once captained. He also dug a well, over which he permanently retired in a hammock until his death.

Before he died, Bowen apparently instructed his Jamaican wife to fill the well, leaving only enough room to bury his coffin at the top. That way, I suppose, he didn't have to commission his ghost to guard whatever was buried in the well. His spirit could sail on to new waters, leaving his body to discourage treasure robbers.

That's what Joe supposed, too. And rightly so, for the tale continues, now entering the realm of speculation and legend.

Prince Charles' building principals apply to Sanibel

Re: Land-use development, architectural style and social/environmental harmony

Mr. Scott Naumann's letter published in *The Islander* newspaper Tuesday, Feb. 20, revealed just how utterly contemptuous is his attitude toward those of us who live in the modest-sized, older-style Sanibel homes of 2,000 square feet and under. Clearly, Mr. Naumann anticipates with great relish the prospect of a future hurricane sweeping such houses off this island thereby allowing their replacement by superior-sized, "Miami-style" dwellings which he considers more in keeping with his utopian plans for the development of Sanibel.

It is salutary to remember that in western Europe, the so-called "modernist" school of architects also considered themselves visionaries, but their architectural arrogance -- coupled with the financial greed of certain of the property-developers -- has since the 1950s blighted much of the urban and suburban landscape. Showing complete insensitivity to the real cultural and social requirements of the communities they were transforming, these property developers and architects exerted a perverse influence whose detrimental effects remain very much in evidence to this day.

Fortunately in Britain, His Royal Highness, The Prince of Wales, has exhibited great courage in speaking out against this perversity, and in his recently published book, "A Vision of Britain," Prince Charles provides sound advice as to how to redress the imbalance that has arisen between the utopian aspirations of the architects and developers and the everyday desires of the majority of the people seeking a pleasant environment in which to live and work.

American readers may reasonably ask: How relevant are the suggestions made by Prince Charles to the situation here in the U.S., given the book's emphasis on Britain? There can be no doubt, that with appropriate modification, the general principals proposed by Prince Charles for improvement in architectural/building objectives and standards do indeed have application in this country -- and it is especially interesting to see that one example he cites as illustrating how sensible architectural/building codes have achieved a harmonious environment is the town of Sea Side on the Gulf Coast of Florida (which in some ways reflects the "garden-city" concept so successfully adapted in Britain.)

In view of Mr. Naumann's declared support for the building of massive "Miami-style" dwellings throughout

the island, irrespective of the existing scale of adjacent houses in the same neighborhood, it would be useful for residents to read Prince Charles' important book and then objectively appraise for themselves the ongoing development of this island. Perhaps the time has come to be just as bold and outspoken as His Royal Highness before the harmony of the local environment is despoiled forever.

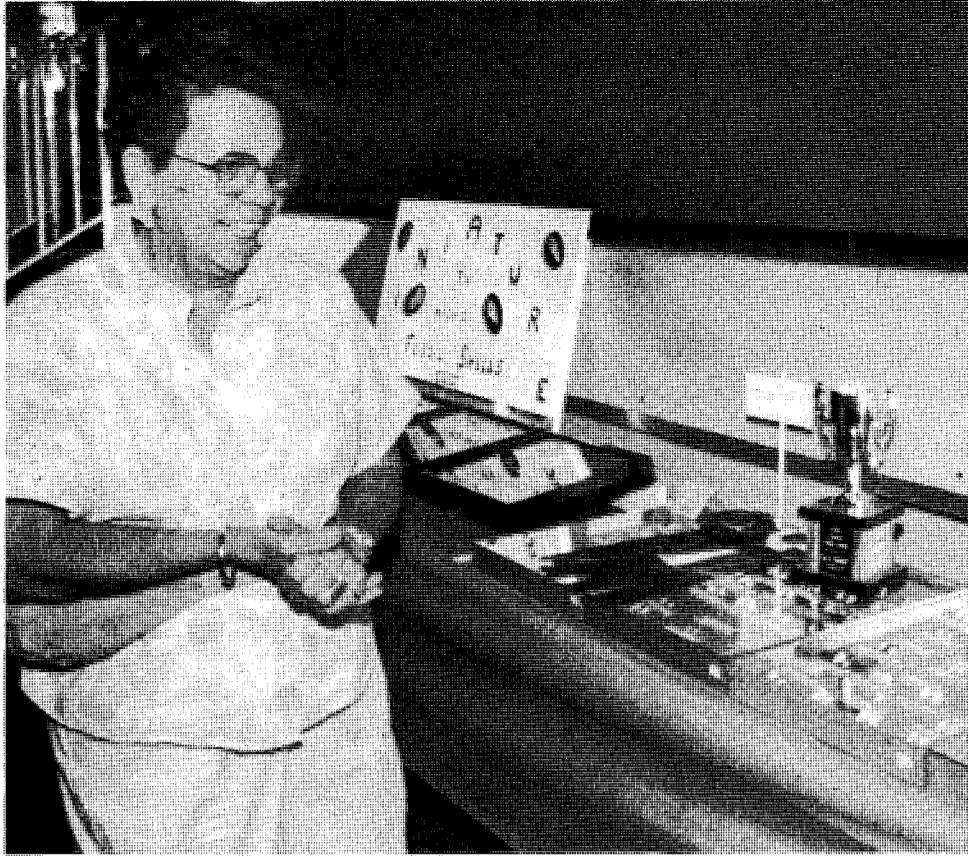

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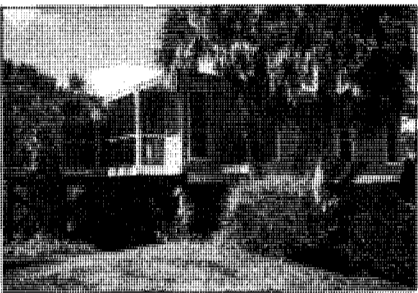
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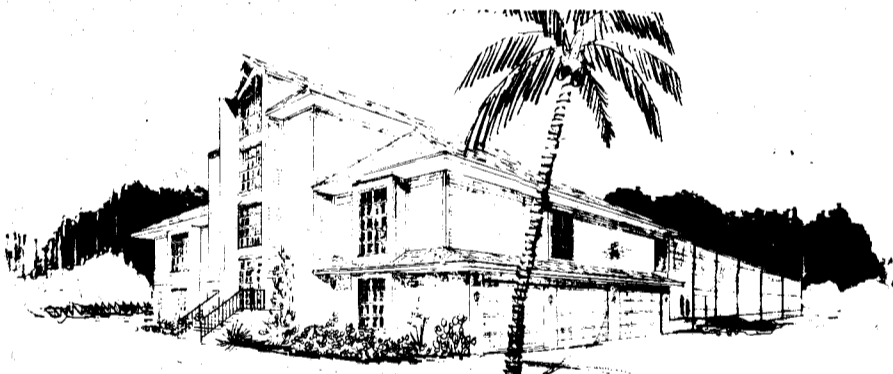
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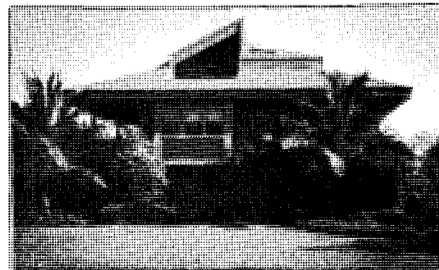
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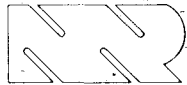


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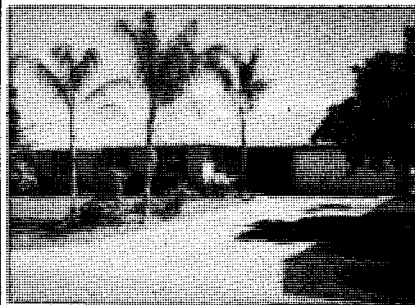


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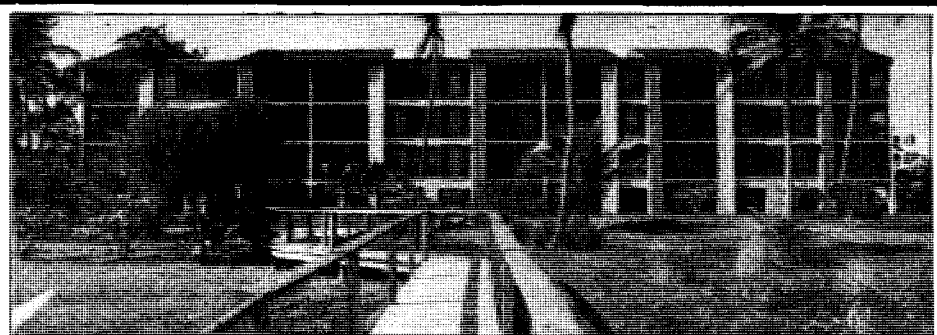
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Candidate urges mayor be elected position

Sanibel City Council candidate Anthony Jordan would prefer to be a candidate for mayor. He has suggested that the city amend its laws to have the mayor elected by all the voters rather than the current procedure which has the mayor elected from among its five members by the City Council.

Jordan has written and called City Manager Gary Price and City Attorney Robert Pritt to urge the change. Price said Jordan has also urged that the law requiring council members to attend council meetings be changed to allow them as many excused absences as needed.

Jordan is currently in the Lee County Jail as the result of a bench warrant issued for not showing up at a hearing on his not having made all child support payments.

"I would like to run openly for mayor with the mayor's seat elected by a majority vote," Jordan said in his letter to the Sanibel officials.

But what Jordan is currently running for is one of the two council seats coming up for election in November. These are the seats of Lenn Lorenson and Jerry Muench. The two candidates that get the most votes win the two seats.

Jordan's proposed city charter changes will be discussed by the council at today's meeting.

Kain is a member of Committee of the Islands, was chairman of the city's Environmentally Sensitive Lands Acquisition Advisory Committee, which pushed the failed \$10 million bond issue to acquire sensitive lands, and was active on the Ad Hoc Committee of Concerned Citizens promoting the successful 4/5 super majority vote needed for increases in density and removal of land from the wetlands.

Kain said his main concern right now is

finding ways for Sanibel to secure as much sensitive land as possible.

Kain is the second Sanibel elector to enter the race for one of the two seats becoming vacant in November. Anthony Jordan declared his candidacy last month.

Neither Mayor Jerry Muench nor Councilman Lenn Lorenson, the incumbents whose seats will be up for grabs, have announced whether they intend to run for another term.



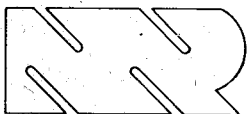
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Bay Beach residential improvements denied

In their attempt to hold the line on encroachment into the sensitive Bay Beach Zone, the Planning Commission Feb. 27 recommended denial of a request for a variance which would allow Anton and Elfrieda Heldman to add a second-story bedroom to their home on San Carlos Bay Drive and to build a lap pool and deck in the back yard.

The addition of the bedroom had the sympathy of some commissioners because it isn't an encroachment into the Bay Beach Zone, merely development within the existing footprint. But a variance to street setbacks is needed as an extension of relief granted the property in 1987, when the property was granted a 36-foot setback, in lieu of 50 feet. In addition, a 1982 condition of development specifies that the residence be limited to one story above the pilings.

The swimming pool was the snag, for it would mean an outright 14-foot encroachment into the Bay Beach Zone.

Mark Naumann, of Carlton-Naumann Construction Inc., represented the Heldmans and argued that the 32 percent developed area (with the addition) would still be within the 40 percent allowed in developed area. In addition, the height would be six feet under the current 45-foot height limitation. He cited other area residents who were granted variances even greater than this.

Naumann said the addition and lap pool were needed for Mrs. Heldman's mother, who is moving in with them.

Several neighbors spoke in support of the Heldmans' request, each saying it would be an improvement to the neighborhood.

Candy Mather, a neighbor across the street, thought the proposal was "fantastic," but took exception to the further encroachment into the Bay Beach Zone.

"Mr. Naumann was talking about the

precedents ... this is precedent row! Somebody gets an inch; the next guy gets a foot; the next guy goes for 10 feet. When do we stop?" she asked.

Mather said the Bay Beach Zone is being eroded terribly, but it's from the landward side.

Commissioner Louise Johnson agreed, saying her concern is that the basic principals of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan are being eroded. She said she could not support the request and made a motion for denial.

Commissioner Jim Krieger pointed out that the Heldmans had only bought the property in November 1989.

"I worry about changing property to suit an individual's needs, particularly when it is a new property that has been acquired," he said.

Krieger objected to making a special accommodation for a special need and wondered if it's necessary.

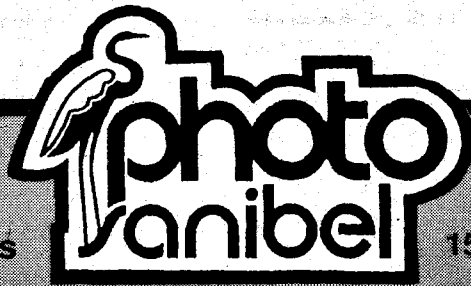
"Perhaps houses should be changed and locations should be changed where the needs of a family can be accommodated without having to bend the rules and regulations we've all been working under," he said.

Commissioner Ernest Klautt observed it was very rare that there's an application which violates all seven of the criteria for granting a variance, but said he had sympathy for the house addition, not the pool.

Whether the request should be considered as separate variances was the subject of some discussion, but Johnson held to her motion to deny it as a single issue.

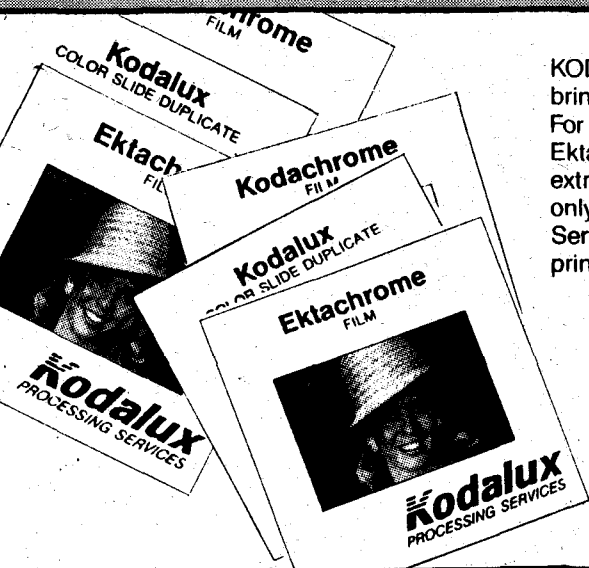
The vote was 4-3 to recommend denial, with commissioners Johnson, Krieger, Jim Levy and Bob Janes voting for, and commissioners Klautt, Bob Davison and Jim Hermes voting against. A second hearing will be held March 13.

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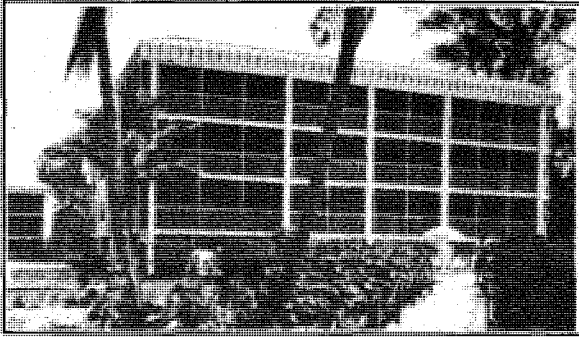
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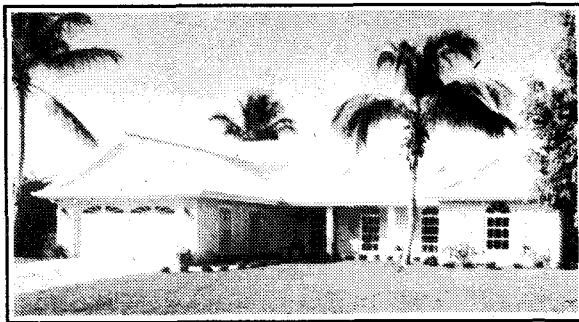
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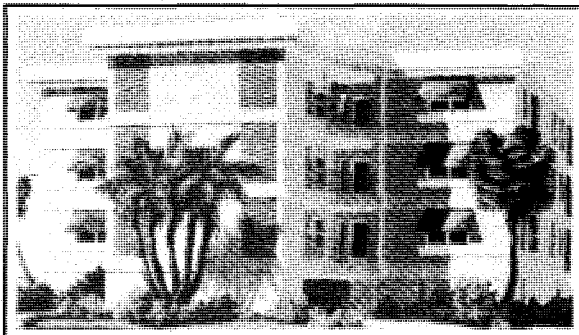
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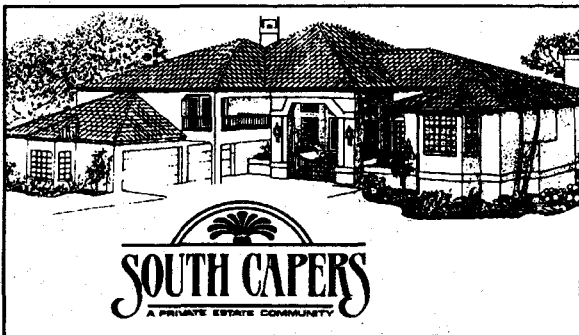

Building standards meeting moved to March 19

Many islanders intending to express their opinions about a controversial ordinance arrived at City Hall Monday, March 5, only to learn that the special Planning Commission meeting has been rescheduled to 1 p.m. Monday, March 19.

Because of an advertising error, the Sanibel Planning Commission was forced to reschedule its March 5 special meeting to discuss the proposed Land Development Code changes pertaining to the size, height, number of stories and appearance of homes being built on the island.

Planning Director Bruce Rogers informed

commissioners Feb. 27 that the legal notice of the hearing was incorrectly published in the Island Reporter newspaper. He said the newspaper left out the time of the meeting, which, in effect, obviates its legality and eliminates the required 14 days notice.

"That rather derails the idea of trying to work expeditiously," commented Commissioner Louise Johnson.

"It's important to notice that it wasn't our fault that we're not proceeding expeditiously," noted Chairman Bob Janes, "it's the Fourth Estate's."

"We've had lots of problems," said City Attorney Bob Pritt. "The only way we can be fairly sure, unfortunately,

that things get published as they're supposed to be published is by putting them in the News-Press." The legal advertisements for the special hearing ran correctly in both papers on March 2.

A large audience is expected to attend the March 19 hearing when the Planning Commission hears the recommendation of its Land Development Code Review Committee on the size and appearance of buildings. If the commissioners reach agreement at that hearing, the proposed changes will be presented in the form of an ordinance to the City Council at two public hearings, tentatively set for Tuesdays, April 3 and April 17.

Experts to study docks on the bay

The Planning Commission will be seeking the advise of area environmental experts to help to determine if Sanibel's Land Development Code should be amended.

Attorney Timothy Murty, representing Naumann & Rhonehouse Inc., proposes to amend the code to eliminate the requirement that docks be no closer than 1,000 feet to any other dock, and to provide that any bayside property can have a dock, as long as it's nearly equidistant from its lot lines.

The Planning Department Feb. 27 recommended denial of the amendment request, citing damage and destruction to sea grasses, shellfish and other marine life, increased boating activity, accidental fuel spills, agitation to the bay bottom, erosion, and concluded that "the visual impact would turn a largely natural-appearing shoreline into one dominated by man-made structures.

"It's come to the point where a decision has been made that docks aren't very pretty, therefore, we don't want them and we will use these reasons," summarized Murty, after he had countered all the Planning Department's objections. He said the long-term effects are exactly the opposite of what is stated.

Murty said the "shading" of a dock actually enhances the sea life; that the best fishing is always at the end of a dock. Most refueling activity goes on at a marina or a filling station, not at a residential dock. As for propeller damage to shell beds, the depth of water at the end of a dock is 3 feet, not an environment for sea grass or shell beds. He said the docks protect the grasses and shell bed by keeping the boat traffic away from those areas.

Both Wallace Kain, president of Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife, and Erick Lindblad, director of Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, suggested that further study be undertaken before any rules are changed.

Lindblad suggested enlisting the services of Jim Beaver, the resource manager of Pine Island Sound Aquatic Preserve, who also used to do permitting work for the Department of Natural Resources. He said Beaver's extensive aquatic research should provide plenty of data.

Murty maintains that 1,000 feet between docks is an unreasonable distance that effectively eliminates many people from having a dock simply because his neighbor previously installed a dock.

"Do you want to do things to raise property values?" Sanibel resident Donald Scott asked the commissioners. He pointed out that if a dock is built, the property value is further enhanced, and that it is faulty reasoning to think everyone should be allowed to have a dock.

"You're standing at the switch on that one," Scott warned commissioners.

Facing the prospect of adding 69 more docks to a shoreline that already has 20 docks, the commissioners were in total agreement to proceed with caution and to secure more solid scientific information, "with one eye on the statutes," because possibly the 1,000-foot restriction isn't exactly right, either.

The hearing was continued to a date uncertain.

Frey retail complex OK'd

Vege buffers can be fertilized but pesticides, mowing disallowed

The Planning Commission approved a development permit for Frey & Son Homes to build a three-unit retail complex on land between Island Moped and the Islander Trading Post on Periwinkle Way.

But what should have been a routine approval at the Feb. 27 meeting turned into a disagreement between commissioners about a permitting condition which specifies the treatment of vegetation buffers.

By a narrow 4-3 vote, the commission decided to amend the conditions to allow the use of fertilizer in vegetation buffers where it originally had prohibited its use, along with no sodding, mowing or pesticides.

Commissioner Louise Johnson, a member of the city's Vegetation Committee, suggested the change, but qualified it by saying that she's not advocating its use, but doesn't want to eliminate the possibility that sometime it may be beneficial to use it, especially when a plant is stressed.

Commissioner Jim Krieger, also on the Vegetation Committee, argued that if a plant's in distress, it needs water, not fertilizer.

Commissioners Johnson, Ernest Klaut, Jim Levy and Jim Hermes voted for fertilizer use, while commissioners Krieger, Bob Davison and Chairman Bob Janes dissented.

The commission later united and unanimously passed a resolution approving a development permit for the 3,163 square-foot building with a 19-space parking lot.

In other action at the Feb. 27 Planning Commission meeting:

- The commission unanimously passed a resolution granting a temporary use permit for a sales office at ROYAL TERN condominium on West Gulf Drive, between West Shore and Sanibel Sunset condominiums. As a permitting condition, if any vegetation is removed to provide the required parking spaces, it must be re-vegetated once the condo units are sold.

CITY BRIEFS



- City planners gave preliminary approval of a development permit to remove exotic vegetation with machinery on 70 acres of BEACHVIEW COUNTRY CLUB, located south of Periwinkle Way, east of Casa Ybel Road, north of Middle Gulf Drive and west of Donax Street. As conditions, no casaurinas will be cleared from within 50 feet of Periwinkle Way right-of-way, and a city-certified vegetation contractor must be on-site to supervise the mechanical clearance activity. In addition, a city vegetation inspector will monitor the mechanical clearing. The final hearing will be on March 13.

- The Planning Commission gave preliminary approval of a variance to street setback standards to allow the after-the-fact development of a solid-wall enclosure of an existing screen porch at Ronald Legore's residence on SANIBEL-CAPTIVA ROAD. Legore agreed to take down part of the enclosure and convert it back to a partly screened porch in order to avoid having to upgrade his wastewater system. If the variance is approved, an after-the-fact development permit also is needed. A second hearing will take place March 13.

- Planning commissioners gave preliminary approval of a variance to allow for an extension of Richard Mauch's non-conforming patio dock on KINGS CROWN DRIVE. They agreed that all seven criteria for granting a variance were met, which, when approved, will allow Charlie Garcia of Florida Marine Construction to build a 4.5-foot-wide by 50-foot-long wooden addition to an existing concrete patio dock and to install a 10,000-pound boat lift adjacent to the dock extension. Garcia testified that it would be too expensive to remove the existing structure. A condition of the variance will be that the existing boat lift be removed. A second hearing will be held March 13.

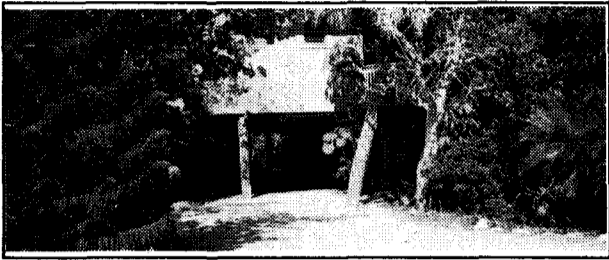

The mail-in deadline on the notice is March 12 and Siler said that by March 15 he should be able to give a definite "yes or no" answer concerning the Taste of the Islands future.

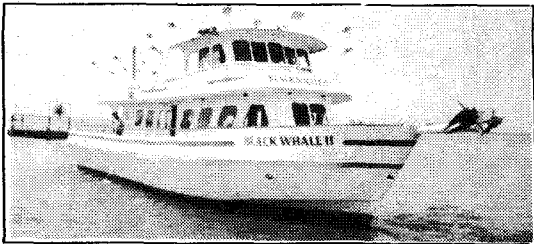
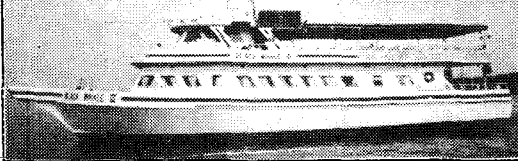

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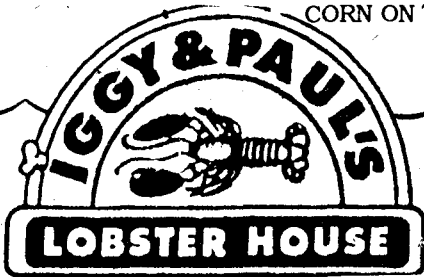
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Timbers complex gets go-ahead

The new complex on Tarpon Bay Road, housing the new Timbers restaurant with five office spaces and a bank with a drive-through facility, received a tentative go-ahead from the Planning Commission at its Feb. 27 meeting, when it recommended approval of a development permit for the project.

The commissioners approved a conditional use permit for the restaurant and bank uses on Jan. 23, but they postponed the development permit hearing to study some outstanding issues, which now appear to have been resolved.

Most of the outside agencies' permitting is in the works, but the snag came when the landscaping plan was rejected, according to contractor Rick Kennedy.

George Kneram of Earth Care Inc. said he didn't understand the vegetation buffer ordinance and that he was told he didn't have the correct amount of species. He said he used the standard formula for a 15-foot-wide buffer because the adjacent Promenade property has 15-foot-wide buffers, not realizing that the Timbers complex is required to have a 20-foot-wide buffer.

Commissioner Jim Levy suggested he "use the system" and have a member of the Vegetation Committee review the plan, preferably after the clearing of exotics is completed.

Soundproofing standards were questioned, especially in lieu of the fact that the Timbers doesn't intend to provide entertainment. The commissioners suggested that there be a condition that prohibits live entertainment, to cover all possible future owners.

The commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the development permit. A second hearing will be held March 13.

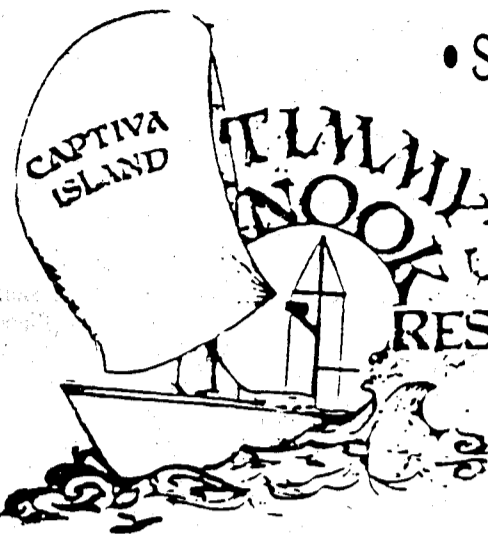


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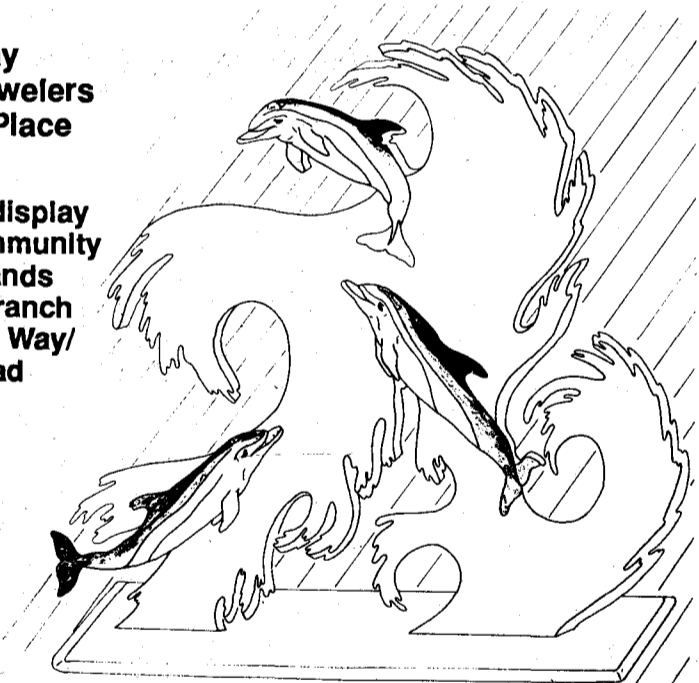
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County officials plan Earth Day press conference

The two big events on Sanibel will be a water fair and the Rid Litter Day -- Great Island Pickup the day before Earth Day.

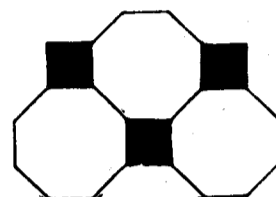
Realtors in Lee County are each contributing at least five trees, which will give school children over 20,000 trees to plant. The global goal is the planting of a

billion trees.

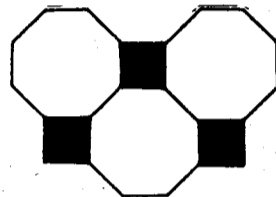

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Chicken is a versatile, inexpensive meat

Chicken is one of my favorite meats, but I can only serve it once a week. My husband, Tom, is not fond of it. I think this dislike comes from too much "Southern fried" chicken in his childhood. There are a number of reasons I would like to serve it more.

It is the least expensive of all meats. Plus it is so versatile and even more important, I love it. One of my favorite parts is the boned, skinned breasts. They are expensive. What I do is buy them with the bone in and the skin on. Then I bone and skin them, saving those parts which I put in the freezer so when enough accumulate, I can then make stock.

Today, I will do two different types of boned chicken breasts. One is a Nicoise and the other has a potato crust. Both are off-beat and delicious.

Chicken Nicoise

2 boneless, skinless, chicken breasts cut in half

6 large Greek or Italian olives, pitted
3 medium-size tomatoes, peeled and diced
1/2 teaspoon capers
1 teaspoon anchovy paste of one fillet mashed
1/2 teaspoon dried tarragon
1 teaspoon minced garlic
2 tablespoons olive oil
Salt and pepper

Pat the chicken breasts dry and set aside. Put the following in a food processor fitted with the grating blade: olives, tomatoes, capers and anchovies. Use on-off button 3 times. Set aside.

In a small bowl, mix the tarragon, oil, garlic, salt and pepper. Stir to blend. Take a non-stick broiler pan and place the chicken on the pan. With a pastry brush, coat the chicken with the oil, mix on both sides. Preheat the broiler and broil the chicken 4 minutes each side. When ready to serve, place on a bed of shell pasta and pour the tomato sauce over this.

I prefer the sauce room temperature. It can be heated, but if served at room temperature, I think it brings out the flavor best. It's up to you, try both ways.

Chicken in Potato Crust

2 whole, boned chicken breasts, skinned and cut in half
1 large Idaho potato, peeled and grated
2 eggs
1/2 cup minced parsley, stems removed



WHAT'S COOKING?

1/4 cup flour
Salt and pepper
2 tablespoons olive oil
Parsley sprigs for garnish

In a medium bowl, beat the eggs, parsley, salt and pepper and potatoes. Set aside. Dredge the chicken in the flour. Pat some of the potato mix on both sides of the chicken, try and coat it thoroughly. In a non-stick saute pan, heat the oil until it is hot but not smoking. Place the breasts in the oil and cook about 6 minutes; turn to brown the other side and cook another 5 to 6 minutes or until the chicken is golden brown. Serve immediately on a warm platter and garnish with the parsley sprigs.

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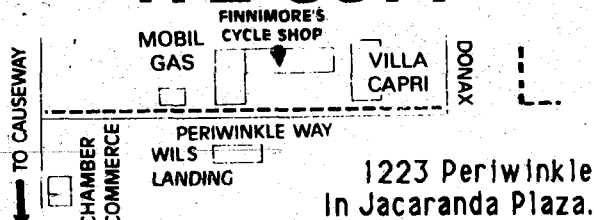
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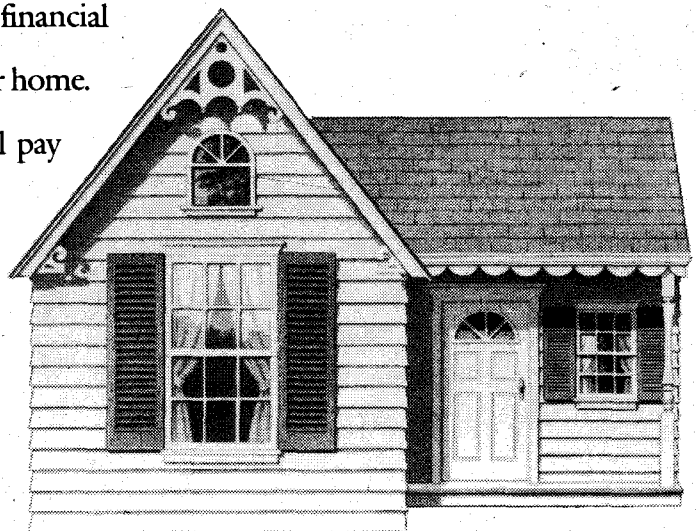

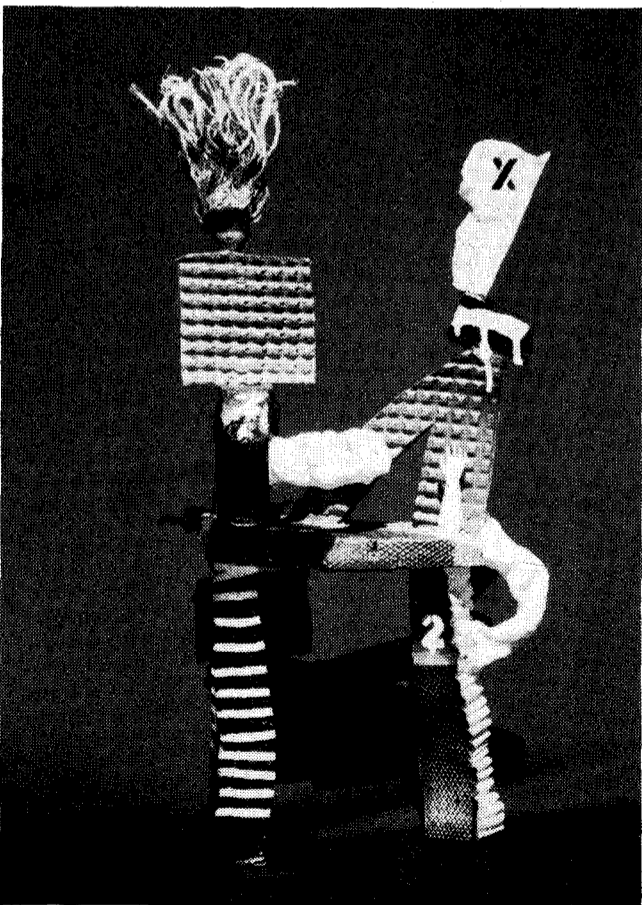

might have been somewhat responsible for the less than great characterizations on the second night (Feb. 27) when I saw the play.

But despite these taxing technicalities, *The Dining Room* is a fascinating piece of theater. The actors at the Pirate Playhouse do their level best to keep things moving, and they do just that.

Family situations of all kinds are cleverly interwoven, with humor, pathos and the intriguing audience challenge of speculating on what might have happened next. In some cases, it would be nice to know ...

The dining table and chairs are certainly workable; the lighting is good because it does not intrude. Tim Baker did his job well. Grant North's stock of sweaters and aprons and other accessories serve nicely to differentiate between the characters and help the actors know who they are.

Ken Loewit's direction seems as organized as a timetable, with who-goes-where when carefully plotted so his cast doesn't fall over each other.

How much guidance Loewit gave the players was difficult to tell, but they all seemed capable enough. Not exciting, but capable.

In *The Dining Room*, one exception is the playing of Jeff Wolf. He is a lot more than capable. He is good. He is convincing. He understands the males he's portraying; whatever age or style is intended. Bravo, Wolf.

Of course, Robert Toperzer is Robert Toperzer. His voice and his subtle ways are always charming and he inspires confidence. In this production, perhaps he might re-think the small bespectacled boy in the red sweater. But his crotchety grandfather is a dandy.

Fort Myers resident, Richard Boyd, is a welcome addition to cast regulars Brenda Mace, Dana Kabaker and Eleanor Lukitech, completing the roster of those who occupied *The Dining Room* in various happenings designed by inventive author, Gurney.

Except for Sundays, *The Dining Room* will play nightly at 8 p.m. through March 31. Tickets are \$13. Call 472-0006 or come to the box office at the Playhouse from 10 a.m. to noon and from 4 p.m. until curtain time at 8:00.

Go see it! There are wry smiles, hearty laughs, sympathetic chuckles and empathetic feelings, all waiting around that handsome dining table at the grand ol' Playhouse.

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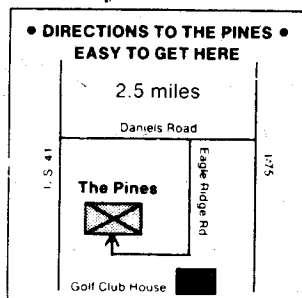
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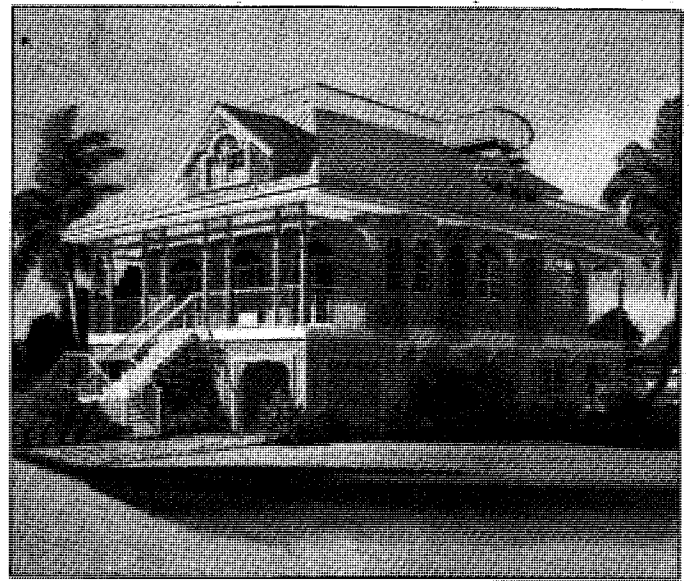
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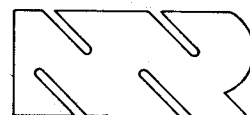
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Obituaries

George A. Heffner, 81, died Friday, Feb. 9, 1990 at Lima Memorial Hospital in Lima, Ohio.

Survivors include his wife, Mary Jane (Steiner) Heffner of Lima; one son, Dr. George S. Heffner of Kent, Wash.; one daughter, Mrs. Pete (Belle) Mickelson of Cordova, Alaska; and two grandchildren.

Graveside funeral services were held on Feb. 12 at the Woodlawn Cemetery in Lima, with the Rev. Richard Sheffield officiating.

W.D. 'Tommy' Wood

W.D. "Tommy" Wood, 86, died on Thursday, Feb. 22, 1990 at his home in Tarpon Springs, Fla.

Born in Ozona, Fla., Mr. Wood was a highly skilled and respected aircraft pilot who first soloed in 1927. He went on to serve as a seaplane pilot with the U.S. Navy in the South Pacific theater during World War II, attaining the rank of lieutenant commander. Following his military career, he settled in Key West, Fla., and operated the Wood Seaplane Service.

In 1948, Mr. Wood joined the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at the Key West National Wildlife Refuge. In 1949, he came to Sanibel Island to assume the duties as the first manager of the Sanibel National Wildlife Refuge. As a member of the "Ding" Darling Memorial Committee, which eventually became the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, he laid out and supervised construction of the mosquito control dike which is today the refuge's Wildlife Drive.

Mr. Wood was a noted, colorful personality. During his distinguished career, he was the recipient of several outstanding awards, including one for rescuing a marooned fisherman on one of the outer Florida Keys following hurricane Donna in 1960.

He served as refuge manager of the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge until his retirement in 1971.

Mr. Wood was married to the late Louise Wood and is survived by two sons and their families.

T. John Caveney

T. John Caveney, 65, of Sanibel, died Tuesday, Feb. 27, 1990 at Lee Memorial Hospital.

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Mr. Caveney was a four-year resident of the island, coming here from Lowell, Mass. He was a graduate of Miami University (Ohio) and was a veteran of World War II having served in the U.S. Navy.

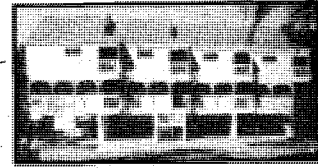
He was a member of the Sanibel Lions Club and the Beachview Golf Club on Sanibel.

Former islander continues life-long quest for world peace

Brigid Bock, a lifetime peace activist, is also a lifetime traveller. She took her first trip at nine months, when her parents, nursemaid and chauffeur drove a Locomobile through Europe.

One of her first memories is trying to roll a hoop in the Bois de Boulogne, Paris.

"I must have been around five," she recalled.

The memories that have motivated her have to do with, first, the dropping of the atomic bomb on Nagasaki and Hiroshima and, second, the bombing of Cambodia during Tet, 1968.

Bock and a companion were trapped in Cambodia when the U.S. bombing began.

"I kept telling my friends that I wasn't afraid, that I was sure it was a mistake," she stressed. "Then I found out it was a deliberate act against a neutral, unarmed country and I was terrified, angry and very disappointed."

From the time of the release of the atomic bomb, she had worked for restrictions, especially the Limited Test Ban Treaty of 1963 that banned atmospheric testing of nuclear weapons.

The Cambodia experience solidified her desire for peace and led to active involvement in peace groups and initiatives throughout the country.

Born in Camp Hill, Pa., near Philadelphia, Bock began visiting Sanibel in 1966 and moved here permanently in 1970.

She became charter member of the Lee County Coalition for Peace, founded May 20, 1982.

The center, now known as the Environmental and Peace Education Center, currently has about 400 members.

"And, a wonderful library with everything from exposes to history, covering world peace and world environment," Bock added.

"We have to take care of the world," she stressed, citing Cambodia again. "The people were so happy and cheerful. They had a bike factory, enough rice to export, plenty of fish in the Mekong River and everybody had a place to live. Now, nothing. They're starving and have no place to call their own."

From 1928-1933, Bock lived in Egypt and her daughter, Candy Baker, was born there. She also lived in Beirut, Lebanon and spent time in Sri Lanka when it was beautiful Ceylon.

She mourns the passing of peace and beauty in places she has known.

But, unlike many others, she has worked to keep devastation at bay. With such activists as Bobbie

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Heinrich, Dr. Helen Callicot, Holly Davies and Cicely Bok, author of "Outline for Peace," she has been in the front lines of marchers, protesters and letter-writers.

To underline her desire for environmental preservation, Bock donated a valuable bay-front plot to the city of Sanibel, with the one restriction -- that nothing be built upon it. The park at the end of Dixie Beach Drive will be known as Peace Park and a plaque is to be installed honoring Bock's donation.

"I still have some hope that something can be done about peace and the environment. Some hope, but not much," she admitted. "The Stealth Bomber is already obsolete. Star Wars is crazy. The military budget's too large and most of the environmental gains that we made earlier have been dismantled.

"We must start caring -- really caring -- about the Earth. We must become emotional about saving it from war and destruction," she stressed.

Bock, who chose her first name of Brigid from a favorite book, James Steven's "Crock of Gold," is not deterred. She pins her hopes on the young and on

women and still hues the line set forth by WAND (Women Against Nuclear De-
velopment).

In her cool cream and black apartment at Myerlee Manor, Bock, who was born in 1908, keeps up with the wide reading that has marked her life.

"I like to ready philosophy and when I find something complex and puzzling and deep, and finally understand it, I get what you would call a real high," she confessed.

A life as long and as active as Bock's cannot escape tragedies. Among hers is the loss of her husband, Bruce Pinter, a White House Correspondent, who died unexpectedly of dengue fever after a Pacific assignment during World War II. Other disappointments and other relations have balanced themselves out.

She is now married to Alexander Bock, a former singer who performed at The Lido in Paris and with the Metropolitan Opera Touring Company. He owns Bock Travel Agency of Boston.

Bock has memories, friends and souvenirs from the past. And, hope for the future of mankind.



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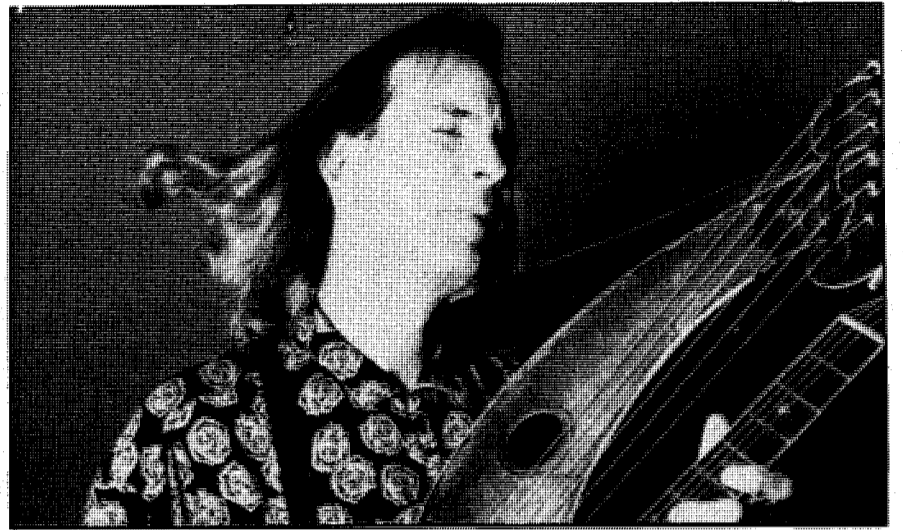

Bob III sprints to freedom

Young bobcat released back into the wild by CROW staffers

Bob III, a young bobcat that had been recovering from injuries at the Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife facility on Sanibel, was released back into the wild last Wednesday near Punta Gorda.

The growling cat, which was taken to recently CROW after being struck by a car, at first refused to leave the transport cage but then suddenly turned into a blurred streak that crossed a field and vanished into nearby palmetto bushes in the blink of an eye.

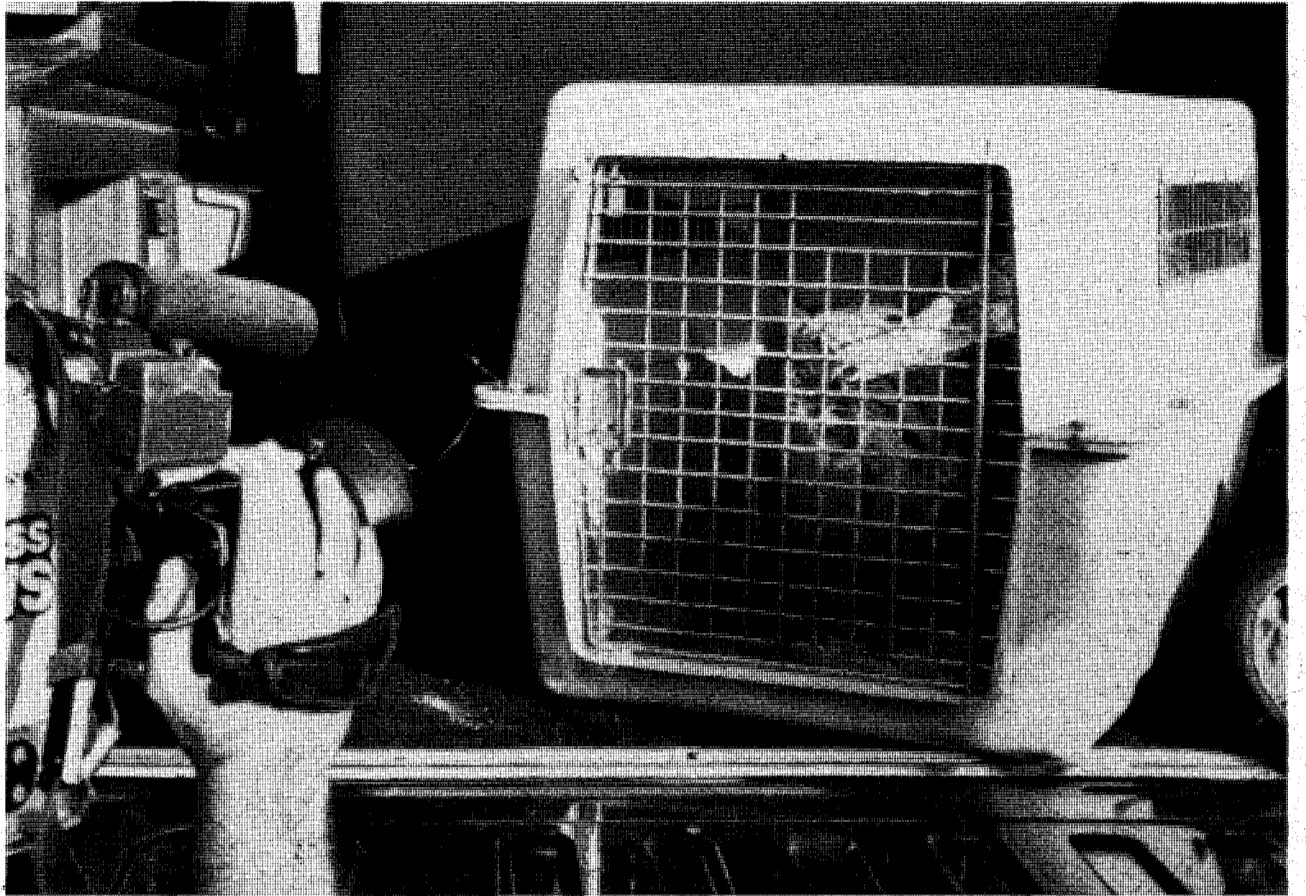
The driver of the car that had hit the bobcat, Jim Birth, was on hand for the release. Birth said Bob III was one of two young bobcats that had darted out onto a road near his home near Punta Gorda in December. He could not avoid hitting Bob III.

Birth said the other bobcat paused for a few moments, looking back at its companion unconscious on the pavement, before darting off.

The ferocity of the caged cat startled Birth, who, in December, had picked the unconscious feline up, taken it home and kept it there overnight.

The next day, he turned it over to a veterinary assistant he knew and she took it to a veterinary hospital, which turned it over to CROW, where it remained in a coma for a couple months.

After it emerged from the coma and recovered from eyesight problems which followed the coma, the CROW staff noticed that one of the cat's canine teeth was broken. A week ago Thursday, Dr. Timothy Hogan, who usually works exclusively on humans,



removed the tooth from the cat.

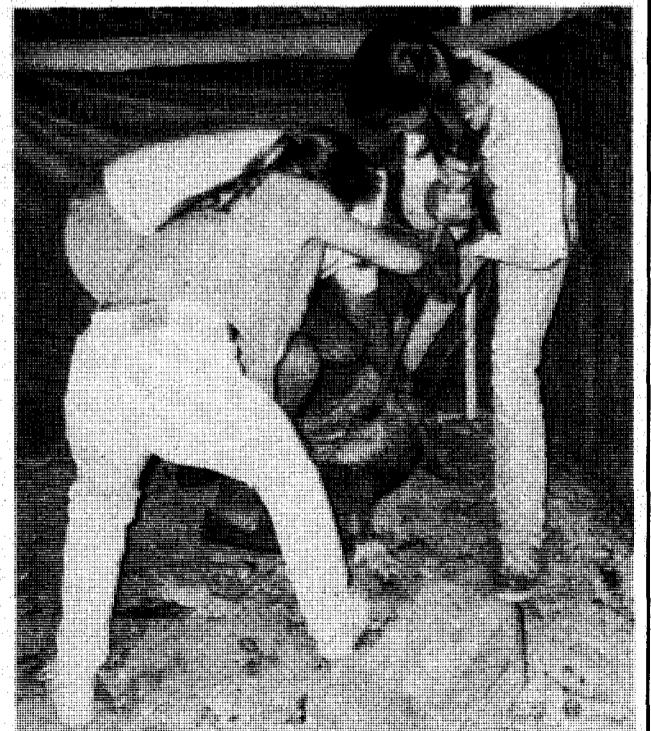
In order to catch the bobcat to take it anywhere, it had to be snared with a noose at the end of a long pole. Apparently the cat learned from his trip to the dentist that being caught in the noose was a painful experience. He fought ferociously Wednesday trying to avoid being caught. CROW staffers said he had been a lot easier to catch the week before.

Eventually he was snared, placed in the carrying cage and loaded into a car for the trip north.

Somewhat pacified while the cage was covered, the cat became very agitated at the release site when the covering was removed and a television camera was aimed at him. He growled, bared his teeth and clawed at the front of the cage.

However, when the cage was opened, Bob III stayed as far back in the container as possible, growling and making threatening gestures. Urging the bobcat by prodding him with a small stick just made him growl more.

Finally, somebody tilted the cage forward and he slid toward the front. Then, almost instantaneously, he converted himself into a streak of blurred fur, flying across the landscape and deep into clumps of palmetto bushes.

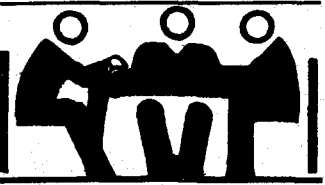
Tournament bridge: an interesting passion

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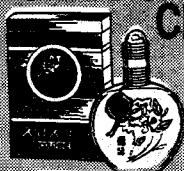
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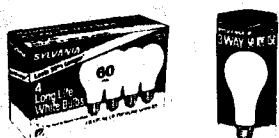

Alligator vegetation barricade considered for park

The city of Sanibel Vegetation Committee has been asked to come up with suggestions for vegetation to block access between people and alligators at the Roadside Park on Periwinkle Way.

At last Thursday's meeting, committee chairman Steve Mullins reported that Assistant City Manager Bill Mills said the city is considering an additional fence and more vegetation to block off the alligators and would like the vegetation committee's input.

Everything from Spanish bayonets to poison ivy were discussed, but no definitive recommendation was made. Committee members were unsure of a source for Spanish bayonets.

In other matters, it was announced that a committee is being formed consisting of Mullins, Eric Lindblad of the

Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, and others to look into the idea of completely getting rid of Brazilian pepper from Sanibel. Mullins said it might involve a special tax and could cost several million dollars.

A brief discussion took place on the use of Garlon to control Brazilian pepper and the problems caused by restriction on its distribution in small quantities. The suggestion was made of having one year-round resident in each neighborhood volunteer to take care of Garlon use in that neighborhood. Neighborhood associations are going to be contacted for further discussion of this suggestion.

A number of committee members complained about specific shopping centers and businesses around Sanibel keeping their landscape vegetation trimmed back further than the committee members consider appropriate.

A discussion was held regarding how "disgusting" it was that the annual Swamp Cabbage Festival was still

being held in LaBelle. Palm trees are killed to obtain swamp cabbage, which is also known as heart of palm. Nobody on the committee seemed sure where the palm trees used in the festival had come from. One committee member said they had heard that 25,000 trees had to be killed for the weekend event.

A progress report was delivered on the committee's efforts to get the joewood tree declared an endangered species in Florida.

The proposal will be presented to the state's Endangered Plant Advisory Council on March 12 and then will be studied for a year before a decision will be reached. The committee plans to gather additional facts and references regarding joewood to back up their case during the council's year of study.

Biologist visits Sanibel

James D. Lazell Jr. first visited the islands in 1971 to look for the Sanibel rice rat. He did not find one then and still has not found one in the wild.

A week ago Monday, Lazell was again on Sanibel, this time guiding a group of birders and signing copies of his latest book at the Sanibel Island Bookshop on Rabbit Road.

The book is entitled "Wildlife of the Florida Keys." But Lazell said you could probably find most of the animals in it on Sanibel.

Personally, he had hoped to find painted buntings and Everglades kites either on Sanibel or at his next stop, the Corkscrew Swamp sanctuary.

In 1971 he had been told that the Sanibel rice rats were abundant in a marsh near the Sanibel Lighthouse. However, when he got here, he found that the marsh had been drained and Australian pines planted in its place.

The book about Florida Keys wildlife is Lazell's third. The first was about West Indian lizards and the second was about wildlife in the Cape Cod vicinity. He has also written about 115 other publications.

According to the biography in Lazell's book, he concentrates his research in the West Indies, various islands in the Pacific Ocean, Australia, and Asia.

He has a PhD in biology and has taught at the University of Massachusetts and at Tufts. He is currently an officer of Harvard University.

Lazell said a major aspect of his research is rare or little known species. He said a number of the things he writes are controversial among biologists. "I set up a lot of targets for people to shoot at."

Most of these controversies revolve around whether or not things such as the Sanibel rice rat, the Key rabbits, or the Key raccoons should be considered separate species.

This was his fourth trip to Sanibel.

Richard W. Angle of Captiva has been named general chairman of the \$1.25 million capital campaign to build the Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum on Sanibel.

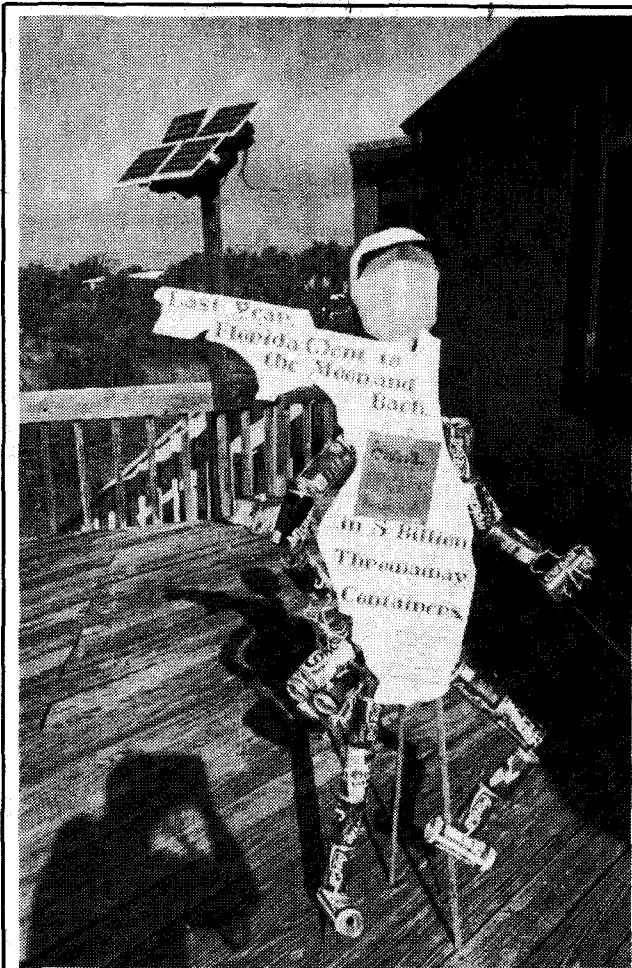
The museum is to be built on an eight-acre parcel of land on Sanibel-Captiva Road adjacent to the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation property.

Water in aquifers continues to drop

"We're not running out of water, we're running out of cheap water," Henry LaRose of the U.S. Geological Survey told the audience in his Tuesday at the Center lecture last week at the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Center.

LaRose showed slides of charts illustrating how water levels have been dropping over the years around Southwest Florida.

He said we are reaching the point where "we can't use water just once and then throw it away." He mentioned the dual water system being constructed in Cape Coral to use canal water and processed sewer water to water lawns. But LaRose went further asking, "What's wrong with using sewer water that has been through reverse osmosis to drink? The astronauts do it."

Among the wells whose water levels over the years LaRose illustrated with charts was one at the end of West Gulf Drive. The water pressure in wells can force water up in a vertical column above the land surface. From 1977 to 1980, the height of that column from the West Gulf Drive well averaged 24 feet above sea level. It had dropped to sea level at one point in 1989 and ended that year four feet above sea level.

If the water level drops below sea level, LaRose said, more salt that is already in the water will intrude. This will require better filters in the water processing plant to eliminate. And, he said, the filters are expensive.

Just under the surface on Sanibel is a surficial water layer. All water layers are actually sand permeated with water. Beneath that layer, about 20 to 30 feet down, is a layer of impermeable limestone. Beneath that is a shallow artesian level.

Then comes more limestone followed by the Lower Tamiami aquifer, which is filled with fresh water. Below that, in between limestone layers, are the Mid-Hawthorne aquifer (fresh), the Lower Hawthorne aquifer (salty or brackish) and the Suwanee aquifer (salty or brackish).

Sanibel uses the Lower Hawthorne and the Suwanee aquifers as its sources of water. The water in them filters down from the Highlands area in the center of the state.

The Suwanee aquifer is also being used by Pine Island, Cape Coral and other cities.

Of all the boating and fishing skills a person can learn, none is more important than knowing how to guard and protect your vessel's most valued piece of equipment -- the five-gallon "fish bucket."

Not a fishing guide I know can function without the essential white pail. I could take a fishing trip without a radio, but I wouldn't go without my trusty bucket.

I mention this because recently I was the victim of a bucket heist which left me unable to function in a manner normal for a boat captain.

I had committed an almost unthinkable error: after filling up the pail with ice, I left it on the dock -- unguarded. It vanished in moments. Someone out there, with the morals of an unfixed tom cat, is walking around

with a bucket that says Flex Bon Paints, Semi-Gloss.

That's who I stole it from.

Anyway, a guide is defenseless without a bucket because that's how we collect garbage after a charter. And, it's how we transport bait and drinks before the trip. And, it's how we get ice, if we don't forget the bucket, that is.

The same problem of disappearing white buckets plagues marinas to a point where the staff takes unnatural possessiveness of them. Like if you ask if you can borrow one of theirs to get some shrimp, they look at you as if you'd asked them to loan you their wallet (or purse, in the

case of baitpersons of either sex who carry such things).

At Tween Waters Marina, on Captiva Island, the staff took a nice new white five-gallon bucket and wrote on it, "THIS WAS STOLEN FROM TWEEN WATERS MARINA".

It didn't even last until noon.

Capt. Joe Burnsed said he got tired of people stealing his buckets so he devised a deterrent. He cuts off the white plastic handle, thinking that people won't carry heavy ice or water, holding it by the wire. And that works, too.

I get emotionally attached to my buckets. One time I had a brand new one I bought for \$1.25. I told one of the guides about this and he couldn't believe someone would actually buy a bucket when just about any Dumpster has one for free.

"That's like paying for air," he said, shaking his head.

We all become very protective of our white five-gallon buckets. I hide mine when I leave the boat at night. Some take them home, yet leave all sorts of expensive electronics equipment aboard.

And for that amoeba brain who stole my last one, I hope a large Flex Bon person sees you with his bucket and deals with you severely. Just don't tell him where you stole it.

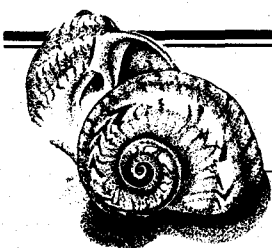
One sponge is a notorious shell wrecker

When we talk about sponges, many will think of the once popular soft sponges used for washing everything from your face to the family car.

But, there are many different kinds of sponges and one in particular is very damaging to shells found along our coast.

The red-colored boring sponge damages more large whelk and conch shells than any other natural member of the marine world. The worst part is these unusual sponges ruin many of the older, larger shells which otherwise would have been perfect specimens for shellers.

When you find a dead whelk shell, perhaps just washed to the beach, look carefully at it to see if there are any tiny holes peppered all over it. If it has such holes -- about the size of pin heads -- then chances are, after the living shell died, it was covered by a fast-growing, orangish sponge.

orangish sponge.

You will often see these sponges on pilings of docks and bridges. Marine scientists tell us that it is this determined sponge that is often responsible for breaking down coastal rocks, in addition to man-made structures.

Ironically, the sponges are a kind of a needed clean-up

crew on the floor of the gulf, disintegrating old shells and other material.

Not only do we shell collectors worry, but oyster harvesters also fret about the red boring sponge because it can infest oyster beds and damage crops. Although the sponge is not interested in the oyster meat, but the shell, it weakens the living oyster to the point where it dies.

We have found a few large, old whelks this winter which are riddled with holes and at first, they seem useless to collectors. But, one of my customers said she looks for these big, old shells because they become her air plant holders back home. Some even grow living plants in them, but the sponges usually drill too many holes for this idea to hold water.

Incidentally, the old sponge industry based in Tarpon Springs, north of St. Petersburg, tried to make a comeback every year for awhile but a combination of over-harvesting and a kind of disease nearly wiped out the natural sponges from the coast of Florida.

Still, sponges are found around the world and many people feel that a natural sponge is the most gentle and best for delicate cleaning jobs.

The red boring sponges are harder-bodied animals, with very little resemblance to their more famous, soft cousins.

Good shelling this week. As always, please observe Sanibel's shelling limit of two live ones, per species, per person.

The Mid-Hawthorne, whose pressure in the Cape Coral area averaged 22 to 24 feet above sea level from 1945 to 1957 but dropped to 40 feet below sea level in 1982, is no longer used by Fort Myers and Cape Coral as a source.

LaRose said that, although water levels in general continue to drop, "we have not reached the point of collapse like the Ocala sinkholes." If enough water is taken out, there is nothing to support the land and a hole suddenly forms. In the Ocala area, cave-ins have taken parts of buildings with them.

As water near to the cities tends to get depleted, the

cities move their well fields further away, LaRose said. As a result, Fort Myers has tended to move its well field east while Miami is moving its west. LaRose said the day may come when the well fields pass each other in the middle of the state.

In addition to the dual water system, fresh water injection (pumping water below ground in the wet season so it can be pumped back up in the dry periods), Xeriscaping and showering with a friend are other methods to save water, LaRose said.

A "tame" alligator becomes bold; he loses his fear of man. Then he has difficulty distinguishing between a fish and the hand that holds it. Because of the alligator population here, dogs should never be allowed to run on the islands. Fence your dog or walk him on a leash. **NEVER** tie your dog in an unfenced back yard. On Sanibel UNRESTRICTED PARKING WITH NO STICKER is permitted for everyone along the causeway, at the Sanibel Lighthouse and Fishing Pier at the eastern tip of the island, at Gulfside City Park off Casa Ybel Road, on the east side of the Sanibel end of the causeway, at the gulf end of Tarpon Bay Road and at the Trost property on Tarpon Bay Road. Off-islanders with **RESTRICTED PARKING STICKERS** can find beach access at Bailey Road, Beach Road, Dixie Beach Boulevard, Nerita Street, Donax Street, Fulger Street and on the Sanibel side of Turner Beach. **RESIDENTIAL PARKING STICKERS** can park on West Gulf Drive west of Rabbit Road, the bay and gulf sides of Buttonwood Lane, the bay and gulf sides of Seagrape Lane, Colony Walkway, Bay Drive and on Henderson Road at Castaways Lane. The user fee for the **COUNTY PARK AT BOWMAN'S BEACH** on the western end of Sanibel is \$2 per car.

On Captiva UNRESTRICTED PARKING at the beach access can be found on the north end of the island, just past the entrance to South Seas Plantation, and at **TURNER BEACH**, just past Blind Pass Bridge. State law prohibits nude sunbathing on all Florida beaches.

Biking

The extensive network of bike paths on Sanibel is clearly marked along the edge of the road. Observe caution when driving near the bike path. A state law and city ordinance combine to prohibit parking or driving on the bike paths. Mopeds are not permitted on the bike paths.

Camping

Camping on the beach is prohibited, as are open beach fires. Fires are permitted, however, in city-approved cooking containers (not to exceed 48x24x12 inches deep) with an extruded metal grill for non-commercial food preparation. After you have your beach party, please assume responsibility for cleaning up any litter or debris from the area.

suit, got a response of one of a different suit and made a rebid of 1NT, showing balanced distribution with only about 12 to 14 points. His partner invited game by raising to 2NT, and Mike decided to decline the invitation by passing since he held the barest of minimum opening bids.

Before he spoke, however, Cappelletti saw baby David James waving his fist the three fingers bunched. Since no bridge player could possibly ignore such a clear signal from heaven, Cappelletti bid 3NT.

The baby's prediction was like an ancient Greek oracle -- accurate but misread. Cappelletti went down three tricks.

Not all tournament fiends misread the tea leaves. When mathematics professor Ivar Stakgold isn't winning bridge championships, he's busy producing long lines of flawless logic. Sometimes, as in today's hand, he spins out a line of logic with mathematical accuracy at the bridge table.

West cashed two diamonds and switched to the king of hearts. Stakgold won and returned the suit to see what would happen.

East looked doubtfully at dummy's low heart and, after a long moment or two, played the jack. Stakgold followed suit, and West took several seconds to think things over. Then West overtook with the queen of hearts.

West then led the jack of diamonds for

dummy to ruff, whereupon Stakgold worked out what was going on.

"Why did East step up with the jack of hearts?" the professor wondered. "He had nothing delicious to lead back, so why did he want to win the trick? He must have realized that his partner's natural switch would be no trumps, and his would worry East only if he had the queen of trumps."

This was one problem solved: East had the queen of spades. Now Stakgold tackled his other problem.

"But why did West overtake with the queen of hearts? He knew that his partner wanted to win the trick, and West wouldn't be disturbed if East wanted to return a trump. Therefore, West must have been worried about a club return by East; and therefore West must have the queen of clubs."

So the professor cashed the ace of spades, led another spade to drop the queen and then led out the king and ace of clubs to pick up West's queen.

The opponents stared at him in amazement and some resentment. "Why didn't you take a finesse?" they asked. "How did you work it out?"

Stakgold shrugged, "It was obvious."

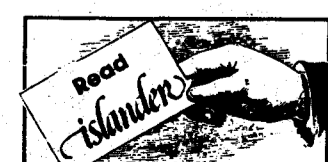

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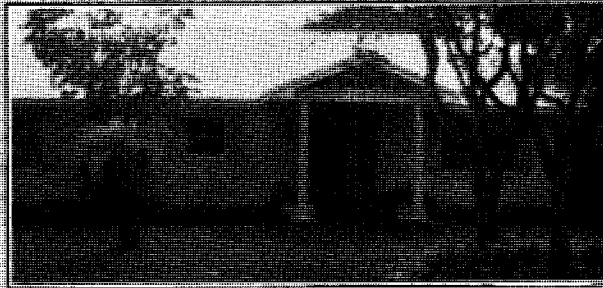
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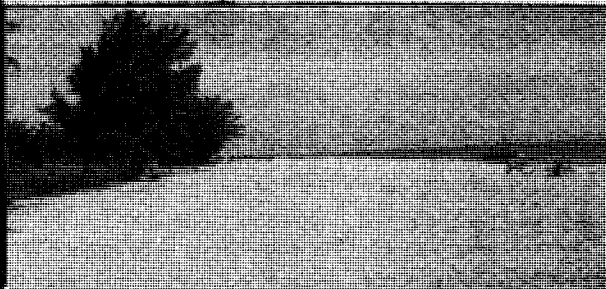
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
