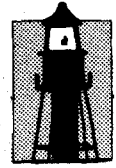

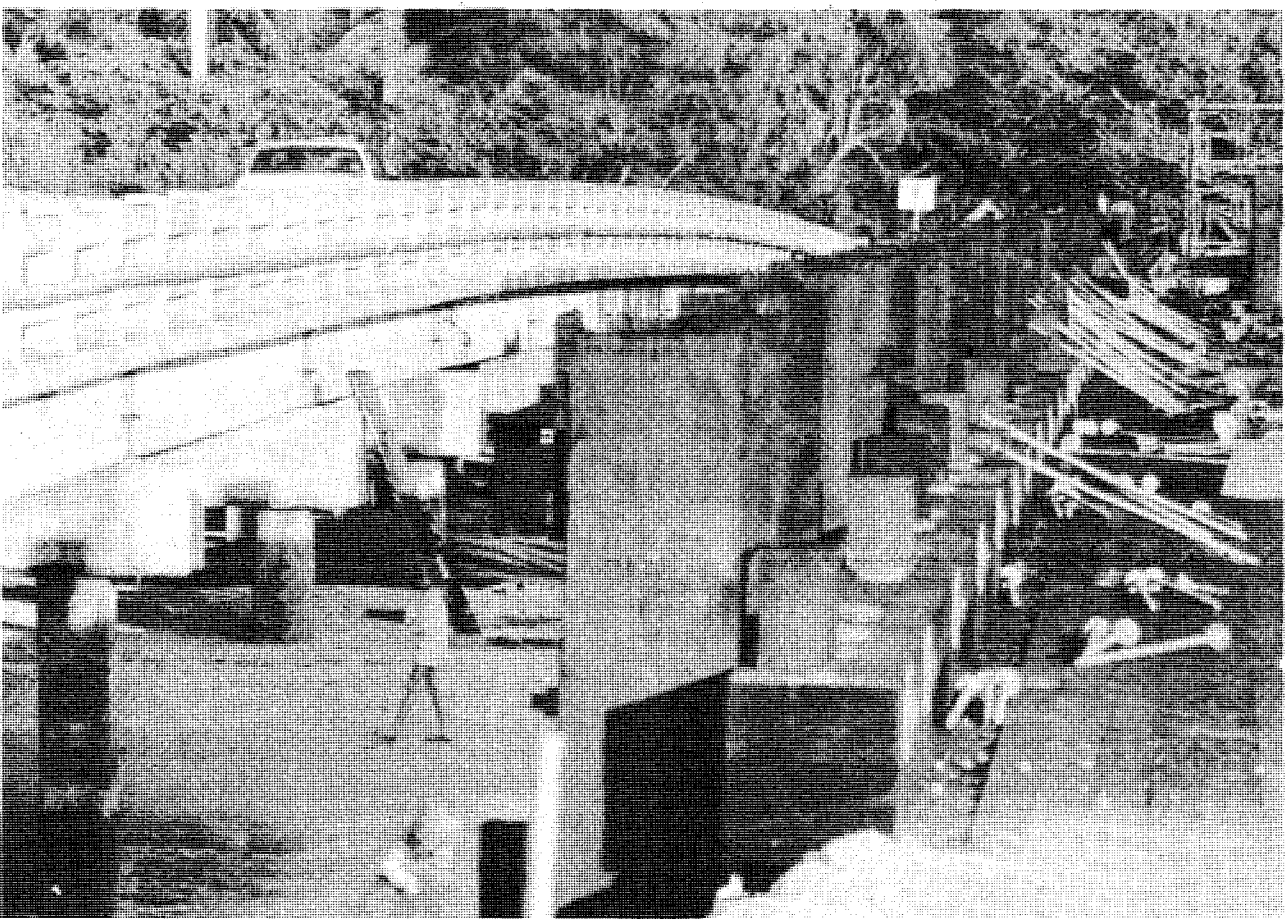

Claim filed against city in gator attack

John Engel, an elderly island resident who was bitten on the foot by an alligator while working in his back yard on August 17, has filed a claim against the city of Sanibel seeking damages.

Engel's attorney, Kim Hart, said the city is responsible because it relocated the alligator, placing it in the waterway behind Engel's house. That waterway is not a relocation site, according to Assistant to the City Manager Bill Mills.

Hart said the city policy of relocating alligators is dangerous, is opposed by professionals and will eventually result in a death if not stopped. He said that is why he took Engel's case.

It can be proved that the alligator which bit Engel was moved at least twice in the past by the city of Sanibel, Hart said.

So far, Engel's medical bills have exceeded \$10,000 and, although Hart would not give an exact amount, more than that is being sought in damages.

Engel is over 80 years old and his foot is still not alright. He lives in the West Rocks subdivision and was working in his yard when the alligator came up behind him and bit him on the foot.

In saying a death is inevitable, Hart added that "If he had been a smaller person, it could have happened to my client. The alligator was trying to drag him into the water to drown him and then consume him at leisure."

Engel was able to pull his foot out of the alligator's mouth.

Hart said the people of Sanibel need to be made aware of the danger and this was his primary reason for taking the case. Told that alligator policy had been discussed frequently on Sanibel, Hart said, "Yes, but a lawsuit seems to focus people's attention. I don't think we should have to wait until a little girl is gobbled up by an alligator who has been relocated in a pond in her back yard because he was troublesome somewhere else."

Engel had previously been denied payment by Sanibel's insurance company and hired Hart when he was denied payment. Under the law, Sanibel has six months to respond to the notice of claim before Hart could proceed further legally. Hart said he hopes Sanibel will act responsibly and not delay the full six months.

160 turn out for restrictions hearing

Over 160 people filled the City Council chambers at Sanibel City Hall Monday afternoon for the Planning Commission's public hearing on proposed building restrictions for island homes. No conclusion had been reached by mid-afternoon.

Speakers from the general public fell roughly into two categories: those who want restrictions on house size, and those concerned that new restrictions would make many existing homes non-conforming so that they could not be rebuilt if damaged in a storm.

The Planning Commission was considering both its Land Development Committee subcommittee recommendations and alternate proposals from the planning staff. The staff's plan maintains restrictions on the outside shape and size of a structure, but eliminates the total floor area and the number of story limitations. They agreed with arguments presented at previous hearings that objected to the city setting interior restrictions after

Mother Nature reigns supreme

Environmental experts bow in different directions

The Sanibel Planning Commission doesn't cotton to fooling around with Mother Nature and, on that basis, didn't approve a proposal to dredge between the jetties located between Lighthouse Point Condominium and Lighthouse Resort & Club developed properties.

"Mother Nature is trying to tell us something," summarized Planning Commission Chairman Bob Janes. "She doesn't want that thing dredged because she keeps filling it in with sand. And we're going against Mother Nature when we try to continue to dredge the thing."

Deciding between what Mother Nature does and what several environmental experts say would be best for her systems was the dilemma the commissioners faced at their March 13 meeting. And the decision-making process was not made easily or swiftly with the questionable information yielded from the cross-examination and hypothesizing of the environmentalists.

Lighthouse Point Condominium and Lighthouse Resort & Club associations are seeking a development permit to dredge sand from a man-made inlet, composed of two jetties, and deposit the material west of the jetties (on the Lighthouse Resort & Club property) to form a dune where

the beach has eroded. In addition, they want to restore a deteriorating wooden wall separating an existing pond (on the Lighthouse Point Condominium property) from the area between the two jetties, which they also want to repair.

The associations' attorney, Tim Murty, explained that the purpose of the dredging is two-fold: to add sand to the eroding beach west of the inlet and also to restore the tidal flow of water to the man-made pond, which, in turn, would reduce the objectionable odors emanating from it.



having made restrictions limiting height of a structure, requiring a sloped roof on high buildings and creating setbacks from the boundaries of the lots.

Thus, the question was asked, once you have limited a structure to a specific number of feet (45 feet above mean sea level), why limit the number of stories? Neighbors, they felt, would not be affected by the difference between of a 45-foot tall, two-story structure and a 45-foot, three-story structure.

Both CONA and CASI specifically backed the staff's recommendation.

During the early portion of the hearing, Arthur Kaufman, a resident of Lighthouse Way, said "If the developers who mutilated our street had any sense of what is right or wrong, none of us would be her today."

The hearing was continuing at The Islander's press time late Monday afternoon.

Sanibel turned down on CARL funding

Sanibel city officials learned last Wednesday they had been turned down by the state on their request for \$10 million in Conservation and Recreation Lands (CARL) land acquisition funds.

Sanibel had sought the money to buy environmentally sensitive lands. The denial kills the possibility of receiving funds from that source for at least a year. The city can reapply next year.

Bill Mills, assistant to the Sanibel city manager, had

been trying to find out Friday why the city was turned down. His calls had not been returned by state officials late in the afternoon.

Mills, Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation Executive Director Erick Lindblad and City Councilman Mark "Bird" Westall had presented the city's case to the Lands Acquisition Advisory Council of the Department of Natural Resources in Tallahassee on March 2.

Mills was told by a secretary in that state office on Wednesday that Sanibel was not on the list of approved projects.

CASI, city host hurricane meeting

The Condominium Association of Sanibel Island (CASI) and the city of Sanibel are sponsoring a Community Service Meeting on insurance concerns before and after the hurricane.

The meeting will be Wednesday, March 28, at 7:30 p.m. at Sanibel Community Association.

Patsy Collins, insurance specialist from the State

Department of Insurance, Division of Insurance Consumer Services, will discuss homeowners' insurance, including wind and fire coverages."

Robert Widdifield, director, National Flood Insurance Program, Southeastern Regional Office, will explain flood insurance and show slides of Hurricane Hugo aftermath.

Scott Jones, State Farm Insurance Company Claims Adjustment Office, will speak on problems encountered in submitting claims after Hurricane Hugo in South Carolina.

Each speaker will address the respective topics and then the floor will be opened to questions.

Attendance is urged by CASI and the city. This forum is designed to answer questions and address issues on insurance preparedness in order to reduce the risk of Sanibel residents repeating problems encountered by victims of natural disasters, according to organizers.

C&S to move ATM from Jerry's

In the interest of employee security, Citizen and Southern National Bank will be moving its automatic teller machine from Jerry's shopping center, back across the street to its branch on the corner of Casa Ybel Road and Periwinkle Way. The bank no longer wants to expose their employees to any possible danger when walking across to Jerry's to restock the machine with money.

The move was tentatively OK'd by the Sanibel Planning Commission at its March 13 meeting, when it recommended approval of a variance to impermeable coverage and developed area standards. The bank already exceeds coverage, so David Kelly, of Surety Construction Co., offered to remove an equal amount of the asphalt driveway as it would need for the installation of the ATM.

According to Kelly, it is impossible to re-install the machine in its original position because of construction changes that have taken place over the years.

Ninety day ban set on dolphin captures

Dolphin captures will be the subject of a 90-day voluntary ban, the National Marine Fisheries Service announced Thursday.

The ban concerns dolphins in the Gulf of Mexico and in the Atlantic Ocean and has been agreed to by groups with permits to capture dolphins.

The temporary ban is to give scientists time to investigate the cause of an unusually large number of dolphin deaths over the past couple of years. Over 900 dead dolphins have washed up on beaches in the eastern United States since June 1987.

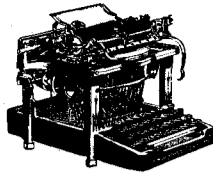

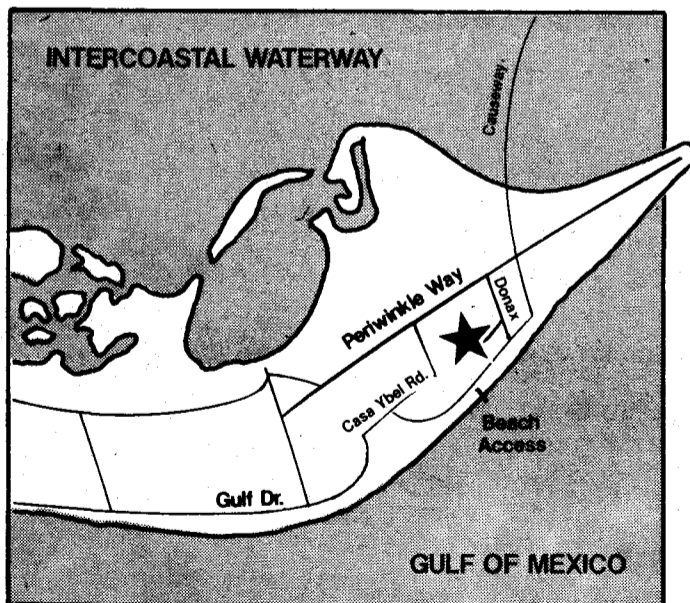
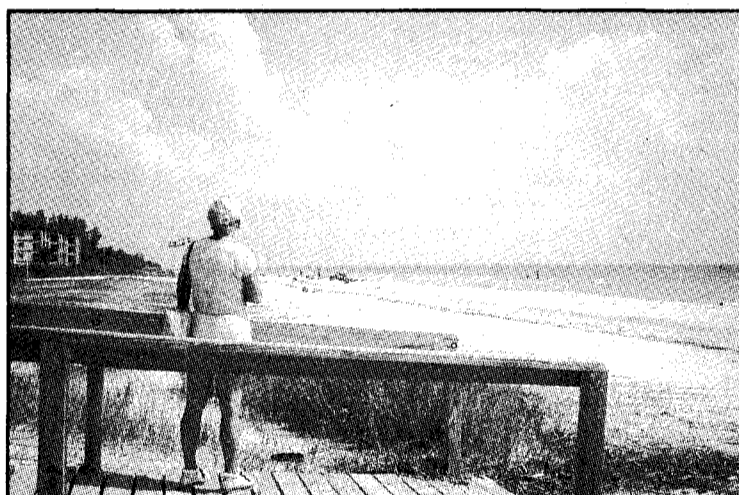
Bridge decal sales office hours changed

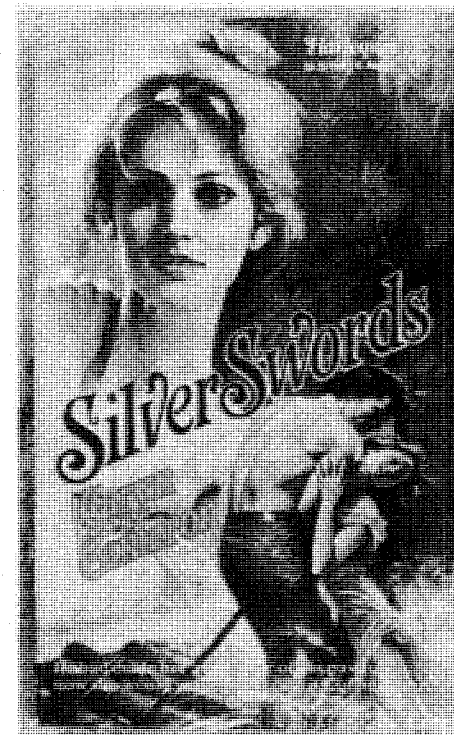

The other hero Lindbergh

This week's serial look at island legends rests upon my personal hero.

We were packing for an annual trek to Jamaica one year when my roommate pulled out a slim paperback volume she said she intended to take along for readings on the beach. It looked like an inspirational religious tract or one of those sappy Hallmark booklets you buy for your mom on Mother's Day because you can't afford roses.

So, naturally, I scoffed. Ann packed it anyway, along with her tanning potions numbered 25 SPF to 4.32, at which I also scoffed. I, like many tourists, packed neither a book, a sunscreen nor a brain.

I packed, as I did every year, a journal and a pen with which to capture all the profound revelations that regularly wash ashore on Jamaican beaches.

It was the same journal I'd packed the last four years, and still the pages remained empty but for a few random thoughts with the perspicacity of lunatic ravings.

One day as I lay mindlessly employed, sponging up incoming inspiration, Ann began to recite, "The beach is not the place to work, to read, write or think. I should have remembered that from other years. Too warm, too damp, too soft for any real mental discipline or sharp flights of spirit. One never learns. Hopefully, one carries down the faded straw bag, lumpy with books, clean paper, long over-due unanswered letters, freshly sharpened pencils, lists and good intentions. The books remain unread, the pencils break their points and the pads rest smooth ..."

A tingle ran through my body, like the realization that someone had just read my mind (which I thought I had left back in Minnesota) -- or, scarier, my soul. I felt suddenly exposed. I asked Ann for some Number 15, but it didn't help.

That's how I became hooked on Anne Morrow Lindbergh. Her lessons on life continued daily on the beach that year, each one opening a window to my soul. Each one urging and simultaneously frustrating the self-detained writer in me.

Oddly, it wasn't until we reached the "About the Author" in the back of the book that we realized this was the wife of that worldwide hero, Charles. Anne had already become our hero.

When I got home, I immediately checked out every book by Anne Morrow Lindbergh I could find. My admiration grew as I read about the trials of living with an international idol. Trials that culminated in the kidnapping and murder of her firstborn.

A couple years later, I was drawn to Sanibel Island, where I had decided to live, sight unseen. I felt it was right, so I sold everything and moved here.

In all my research on Anne Morrow Lindbergh, nothing had revealed the setting for her "Gift from the Sea" given to me on the shores of Jamaica. I had no idea I was moving next door to Anne's "island from the world."

I moved to Sanibel, I told all back home, to become a free-lance writer. If my ship were to come in, I explained, I better be seaside. When I discovered my proximity to the island that once served as Anne Morrow Lindbergh's inspiration, I knew I had done right. Another body tingle told me so.

Of course, there's no certain proof that Anne actually wrote "Gift" about Captiva, despite her many visits here. In all her five diaries, she never even mentions Captiva Island. But then why would she? At a time when she had to disguise herself to go to the grocery store and was told to "never write anything you would mind seeing on the front page of a newspaper," Anne had no reason to reveal an island hideaway that insulated her from the injustices her husband's fame had dealt her.

Pritt's 'dominant role' in council meetings a concern

In reading *The Islander's* account of the City Council meeting of March 6, I was struck by the role of Mr. (Bob) Pritt, the city attorney, in public discussions. This is not the first time that many of us have wondered why council permits this.

While Mr. Pritt has had a great deal say about the bridge ordinance, including a statement which certainly could be considered ill advised (i.e., the ordinance is "fatally flawed"), he neglected to emphasize that this ordinance like all others, has a severability section. This means that, should one section be in error, it can be removed without affecting the rest of the ordinance.

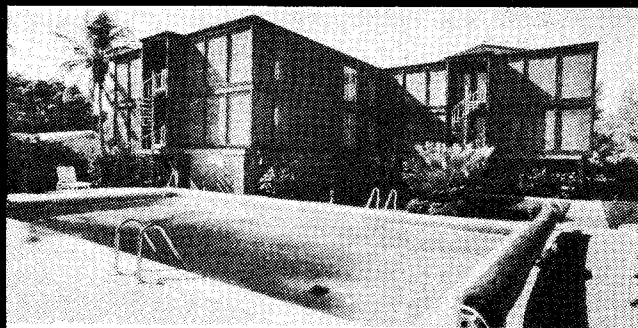
Although Mr. Pritt has had a copy of this proposed ordinance since early fall, his comments as Mayor (Jerry) Muench went through the ordinance consisted of speculation, not fact (such as the statement that the county might take away Sanibel's share of toll dollars.)

Mr. Pritt did the council and the general public a disservice by his comments and by engaging in a dialogue with the public, which is rightfully the province of elected officials. He also did us all a disservice by not emphasizing to the council that the charter permits non-substantive changes in any initiative ordinance, and that this ordinance has the built-in safety valve of severability.

Later in that same meeting, and in reference to another item on the agenda, Mr. Pritt said that the effect of an ordinance is the same as that of a resolution. I suggest that Mr. Pritt (and the council) read Section 3.10 of our charter.

I further refer Mr. Pritt (and the council) to Section 6.02. This section gives the voters the power to require council

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Ireland to dredge seaplane ramp

In what must have been his swiftest dealing with the city, Myton Ireland, of Sanibel Island Marina, received tentative approval of his request for a development permit to dredge sand from the inlet channel leading to the canal network of Sanibel Estates and Shell Harbor subdivisions. The purpose of the dredging is to keep clear the access to his seaplane ramp and dock on Lighthouse Way.

The Planning Commission at its March 13 meeting concurred with the staff report's finding that it is in the public's interest that the canal entrance have the maintenance dredging every three to four months, because the area naturally has a fairly rapid build-up of materials which otherwise would clog the inlet.

Dredge and fill operations of this type are no longer permitted by local, state and federal regulations, but Ireland already has his exemptions from the Department of Environmental Regulations and the Department of Natural Resources, and is awaiting his exemption from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The permit will be valid for five years and authorizes the dredging of up to 50 yards of material from the seaplane ramp area of the sand beach.

When asked what he was going to do with the fill, Ireland said it likely would end up being spread on his marina driveway, which is all sand.

Commissioner Louise Johnson half-seriously suggested that he should take it down and dump it on the beach west of the jetties between Lighthouse Point Condominium and Lighthouse Point Resort & Club (see article, page 1A).

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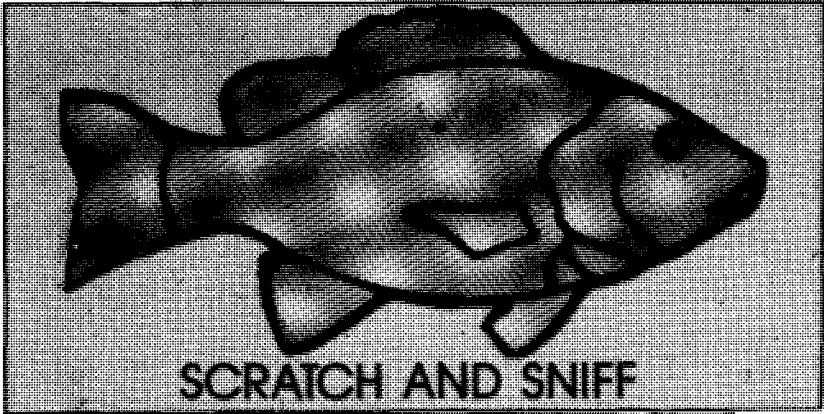
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Captivans celebrate beach project

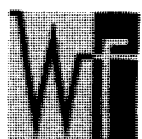

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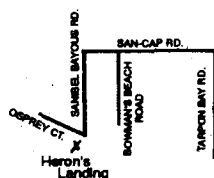
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Sanibel's Planning Department, however, recommended denying the permit because the proposed dredging activity is inconsistent with Land Development Code standards of environmental performance; qualifies as geologic development in the Bay Beach Zone, in that it will result in the lessening of material that makes up the beach and will interfere with the natural geologic patterns; and will interfere with public access to and use of the beach.

Because the issues are environmental, the applicant and the city hired environmentalists, each a professional engineer with coastal ecology experience, to study and report on their findings.

The hearing became a battle of credentials and differing opinions, with each side attempting to discredit the testimony of the other.

Carla Palmer, of Dyer Riddle, Mills & Precourt Inc., presented her report for the city with up-front suggestions of how the associations could accomplish their objectives by using different methods other than dredging.

Palmer had no objections to the repair of the jetties, but recommended shortening them to allow a new dynamic equilibrium to develop over time. She said the sudden removal of the sand between the jetties may disrupt the current dynamic equilibrium and may cause further erosion downdrift because the natural process of filling-in would occur between the jetties,

thus depriving the movement of sand downdrift, to the west beach.

More, deeper erosion would be caused on the west beach, according to Palmer, because the associations propose to put paths in the dunes created by the dredged material. She said the paths would merely direct the water exactly where it shouldn't go, and rapidly wash out the new sand. Palmer said the installation of walkovers and vegetation plantings would be preferable if the dunes were allowed.

Palmer said it seems as if the proposed dune is merely a place to dispose of the spoil material from the dredging activity. She said the renourishment of the beach would have to be repeated often because of the established erosion pattern west of the jetty.

Eliminating the nuisance problem of the bad smell of the pond, which has been closed off by accreted sand for approximately three years, could be easily and inexpensively solved simply by installing an aerator, according to Palmer.

She said the pond, which is ringed by pruned mangroves, is not a productive mangrove ecosystem because it is very deep and has steep sides. Further, it doesn't provide the habitat and shallow waters necessary for the utilization of many species of wading birds which are regular inhabitants of natural healthy mangrove ecosystems.

CEPD discusses lower federal funds and Sanibel erosion

A letter from Sanibel asking for mitigation of erosion damages and a letter from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers saying to expect \$833,900 as the federal share of the beach nourishment project were discussed at last Wednesday's Captiva Erosion Prevention District meeting. The amount originally budgeted as coming from the federal government was \$2.2 million.

However, neither letter was a big shock. The CEPD had been watching the erosion situation at the west end of Sanibel ever since they added 100 feet to the groin at the south end of Captiva, and there had been times previously when it looked doubtful whether any money would be received from the federal government.

The CEPD did take immediate action on both matters.

CEPD engineer Tom Campbell was sent to Tallahassee to discuss the Sanibel erosion situation with the Florida Department of Natural Resources and Earl Howard, who had prepared the original application for federal funds, was asked to go over the figures and discuss with the corps its rationale for the lower amount.

When the CEPD added on to the terminal groin at Turner Beach, it signed an agreement that if the groin caused erosion on Sanibel the CEPD would mitigate those damages. The March 9 letter from Sanibel City Manager Gary Price asked the CEPD to begin the mitigation procedure saying, "This is a serious situation that has already led to the condemnation of one structure in the area, also has the potential of affecting other structures and possibly Sanibel-Captiva Road."

A crucial part in determining the amount of erosion is played by the six-month beach and hydrographic surveys conducted by the CEPD to determine the amount of erosion that has taken place. The next one is scheduled for April and would have cost \$33,435 if, as in the past, it had covered all of Captiva and the western tip of Sanibel. However, Wednesday the CEPD board voted to add another \$2,500 to include a larger part of Sanibel in the survey.

The federal funds amount finally received would reimburse Captiva taxpayers as a refund of a portion of what they paid for the project.

In other action, the board discussed a preliminary outline of goals and objectives prepared by its consultants. It was decided to have each commissioner write up suggested changes and other ideas and send them to Project Planner Bill Stronge, who will bring the list back to the next meeting (April 11, Captiva Community Center, 6 p.m.) where it will be discussed in detail. A final list would then be put together for consideration at the May meeting.

Commissioner Dennis Parravano had proposed at the February meeting that the CEPD needed to have all goals and objectives written down in one place as a reference for board members and as an informative document for the citizens of Captiva and for other people with whom the CEPD deals.

Also last Wednesday, the CEPD approved spending \$9,840 to have vibracores stored under the Community Center building analyzed. The cores were taken about 10 years ago off the Captiva coast and the CEPD hopes an analysis of them will narrow down the search for good sand sources.

They have never been scientifically analyzed and were lost for a time, until rediscovered under the building. It is not certain how many are there, although the number is believed to be between 10 and 35.

Developer wants consistency in gate standards

Developer David Lee Almas would like to know why the city is tacking new security gate requirements on his particular development, when others on the same street were allowed to be installed seemingly by different standards.

As a condition of approval of a conditional use permit, the Sanibel Planning Department is requiring Almas to provide a back-up area for a vehicle stopped at the security gate he proposes to install at his Eastwood Landings subdivision on East Gulf Drive. The city also wants the gate located a minimum of 60 feet for the center line of the right-of-way.

Almas maintains it can't be done, that there are no rules or guidelines in the code and that the configuration is too small with the bike path and the current drainage constraints on the entryway.

He pointed out at the March 13 hearing that the city has never required a back-up area before and that the 60-foot setback requirement is greatly in excess of others on the same street. He said Kinzie Island subdivision's setback is 47 feet and The Colony is only 39 feet.

Planning Director Bruce Rogers said that it is a reasonable safety condition to expect and that Almas shouldn't use past poor examples as a basis for being consistent. He said Kinzie Island's gate is "terrible" and should never have been approved, and that The Colony's is "not quite as bad."

Rogers said most gates are merely a marketing device and that he hoped that one day they actually would be used for security.

Rogers and the commissioners expressed agreement that Almas' configuration problem was exacerbated by the fact that he didn't include the security gate on the development plat the commission approved. Rogers said the commission was under no obligation to approve the conditional use if it's not consistent with even the general code requirements.

The commission unanimously recommended approval of the permit, including Almas' request that the setback condition be reduced from 60 feet to 55 feet. A second hearing will be held Tuesday, March 27.

"Why do I always seem to set some precedent?" Almas asked in frustration.

"It's because you have a black cloud following you around," Commissioner Ernest Klautt simply explained.

SANIBEL-CAPTIVA ROAD intersection. Evans' goal was to provide another possible use, in addition to office and commercial uses, in order to better merchandise the property. Evans has four months before he must submit construction plans, during which time he hopes to know what he wants to do with the property. The vote was 4-3, with commissioners Jim Krieger, Louise Johnson and Jim Hermes dissenting. A second hearing will be held Tuesday, March 27.

- A resolution was passed unanimously giving approval to JKM Group's request for a development permit to develop a two-building commercial complex on **TARPON BAY ROAD**. One building will house The Timbers restaurant and five commercial units and the other a bank with drive-up facility. As a condition of approval, soundproofing will be required in accordance with the code and live entertainment will not be allowed.

- The commission passed a resolution granting Charlie Garcia, of Florida Marine Construction, a variance to dock standards to allow a nonconforming patio dock to be extended at Richard Mauch's property on **KINGS CROWN DRIVE**. As a condition of approval, Garcia must remove the existing boat lift.

- The commission unanimously passed a resolution granting Ronald Legore a variance to allow for the after-the-fact construction of a solid wall enclosure of an existing screen porch at his house on **SANIBEL-CAPTIVA ROAD**. In order that a wastewater request not be required, Legore has redesigned the enclosure, reducing it to less than 20 percent of the living area; the excess previously enclosed area will be converted back to a screen porch.

Palmer said the mangroves are healthy and would thrive in this freshwater pond because it is not competing with other vegetation. She said the odor associated with the mangrove-fringed pond is normal and would not be solved by dredging out the canal and restoring the tidal flow of saltwater, which naturally contains more sulfur than fresh water. Palmer said the sulfurous odors probably would be reduced by adding more oxygen, hence the recommended use of the diffused aeration system.

Because the associations desire to have fish in the pond, as would be there were it fed by tidal flow, Palmer suggested a determination of the water quality be made and the pond be stocked with fish best suited to the closed system.

Her report completed, Murty began his cross-examination. He asked about her schooling in coastal engineering (a master's degree in systems ecology), how many projects like this one she had undertaken (only this one) and if she really knew exactly what would happen with reference to the dredging and jetties (an educated assumption based on past patterns, "It's a textbook case.")

Murty quibbled with her use of the word "may" throughout her testimony, pointing out that nowhere did she use the word "will."

Palmer countered that it is a prudent use of the word because one cannot say absolutely what would happen. She said it is a "very, very good possibility," however.

Palmer answered Murty's questions about mangroves surviving in a freshwater system, and said she couldn't see the mangroves being out-competed because of the direct influence the groundskeepers have. She said well-manicured lawn and grounds surround the pond, and the mangroves are so well-trimmed they look like a hedge. With the steep slope, she said, the mangroves are confined to the very edge and haven't been able to spread out as they normally do in a natural environment.

Janes requested that Murty "postpone the cross-examination" to allow some comments from the commissioners and to proceed with the presentation of the applicants' proposal.

Through Commissioner Louise Johnson's questioning, it was established that the littoral drift goes predominantly from east to west, and that it is documented that jetties cause erosion on the downdrift side.

Commissioner Jim Levy pointed out that about 25-30 feet offshore at this location there is an "extremely big hole" in the bay, that fishermen know as one of the deepest anchoring and fishing areas other than under the causeway.

Murty proceeded with the proposal. He said the residents wish to dredge in order to restore the tidal flow, with the hopes that the sea life of the pond will be restored and the odors will be reduced. He added that their "motives may be a little bit further than that."

He said, contrary to Palmer's testimony, his experts would provide evidence that will lead to a different conclusion: That their proposal will result in a more healthy mangrove area.

Todd T. Turrell, who has his own coastal engineering firm, said he was contacted by Lighthouse Point because nature closed off the tidal flow to the pond, creating a stink, and the residents wanted the aesthetics of flowing water and the fish that go with it.

He said there is public access, that at mean low water, people can wade across the tidal pools and walk over the bermed sand.

The big questions, Turrell said, were sediment transport and environmental.

He said artificially bypassing the jetty by dredging is the most effective method to get sand to the downdrift beach, and that the method is encouraged by the Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. He said it has been permitted by the Department of Environmental Regulations and he could guarantee it is the most efficient way to solve the problem.

He said the problem in removing a jetty, which is "a rare thing," is that properties constructed 40 years ago have been stabilized by the structure, and the systematic removal of a jetty would have "catastrophic effects" and would be asking for "big problems" as far as beach erosion is concerned.

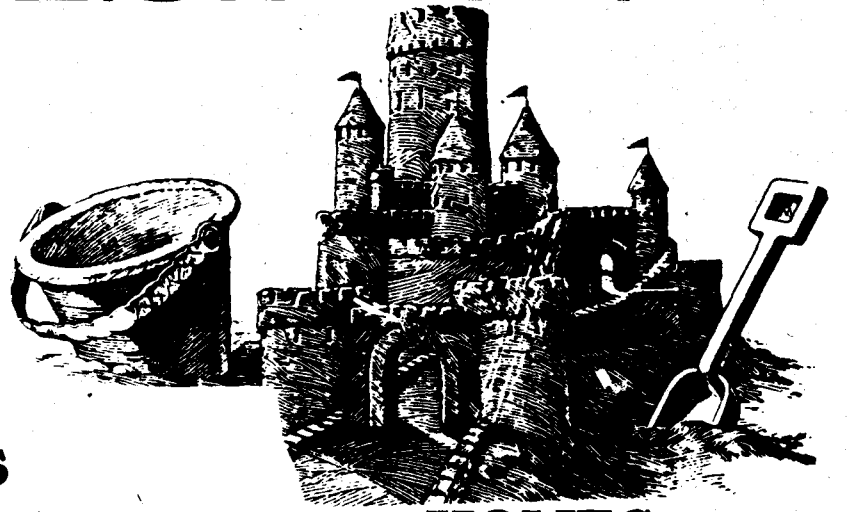

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Sanibel police get new cars with new look

All four Sanibel Police Department cars are in the process of being replaced by new cruisers with a new exterior design. In the process, the city will own the cars rather than lease them, save money and have better equipment, according to Chief Richard Plager.

The new cars, which are predominantly white, have a lighthouse on the side and "Sanibel Police" in large letters. The old cars had the city seal and just the word "police."

The old cars were Dodge Diplomats and had cost about \$400 each a month to lease with any repairs paid for by the leaser.

That contract expired on March 15 and, if the city had wanted to renew, the cost would have been about \$600 a month, and the city would have had to pay for any repairs.

So, the city looked into buying. At first it appeared that each vehicle would cost about \$16,000. But further investigation uncovered a volume purchase arrangement which is used by the Lee County Sheriff's Department. That department allowed Sanibel to participate in the arrangement and the city ended up getting the cars for \$12,004 each with the purchase financed at a 7.5 percent rate.

Plager said the financing will be paid off in two years and the city will then own the cars. He said this was a saving of \$5,712 over leasing the cars for two years and that leasing would not have resulted in ownership.

The new patrol cars are eight cylinder, 1990 Ford LTD Crown Victorias.

Plager said there will be other improvements in the

vehicles. For example, instead of the wire cage in the old vehicles which separated prisoners in the back seat from the driver in the front seat, there will be Plexiglass cages.

This will provide more protection for officers, Plager said, providing particular protection against prisoners spitting on them.

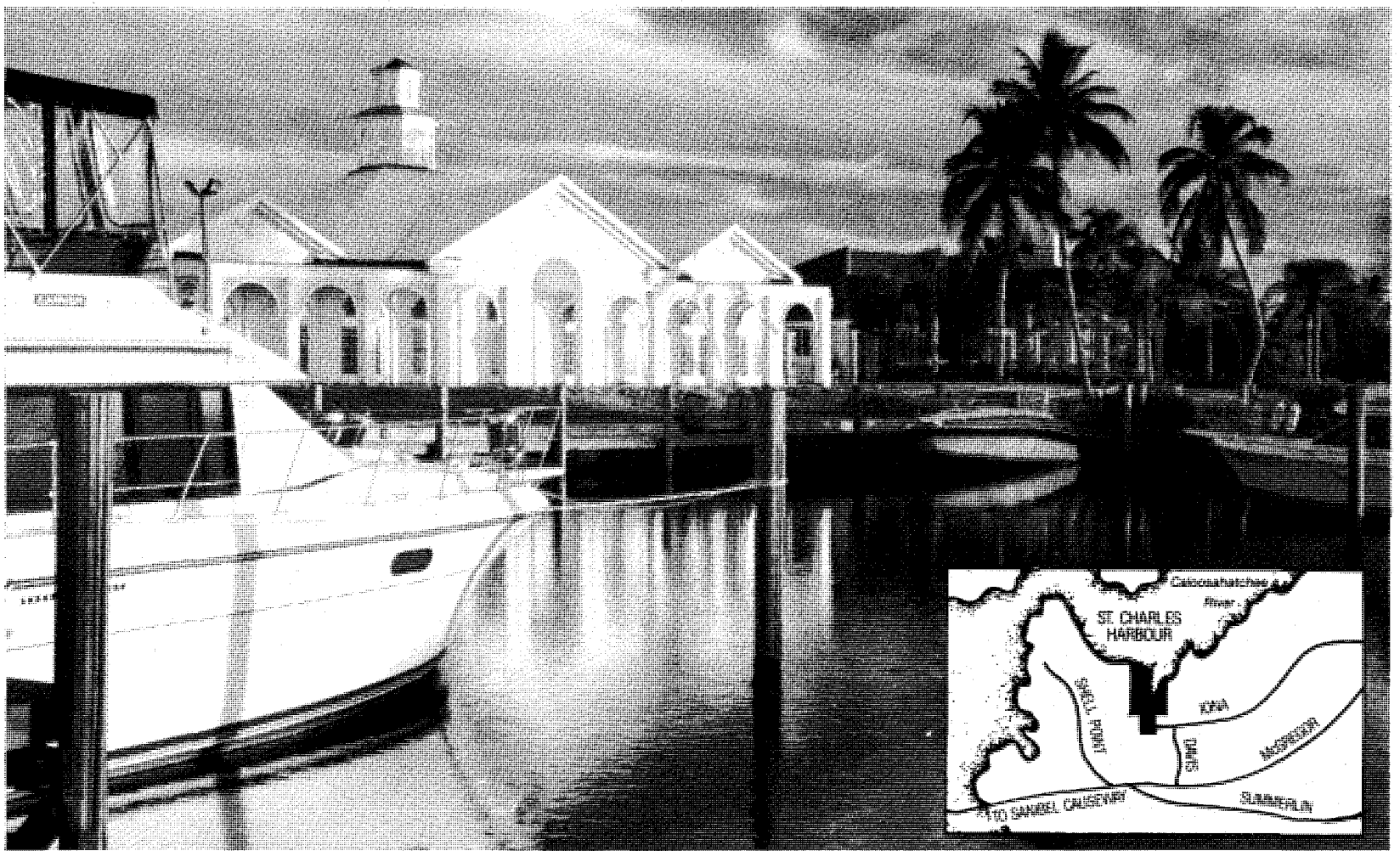

"Sanibel Island is not unlike the Earth island; it, too, is a living system," Sanibel Mayor Jerry Muench told the crowd last Wednesday at Centennial Park in Fort Myers.



Annalee Fadiman

Clifton Fadiman and Annalee Whitmore Jacoby Fadiman were married 40 years ago on Feb. 13. The marriage united Fadiman's family of Russian Jews with her Mormon heritage.

Annalee Fadiman explains this. "My great grandfather was never really a Mormon," she insists. "He was a Scottish miner who was drawn to the sunshine and there happened to be a Mormon mission there."

For whatever reason, he became Bishop John Sharp and a power behind the Central Pacific Railroad. He was photographed at the historic driving of the golden spike that joined Central Pacific to Union Pacific Railroad at Promontory, Utah, in 1869.

Anne Sharp, Annalee's mother, married Leland Whitmore, a man who followed a checkered career, according to his daughter.

"My mother did everything right," she says. "She had two boys and two girls, two blonds and two brunettes. After a series of jobs and career moves, my father became interested in aviation. Now, that was exciting."

Leland Whitmore arranged air races, bought a World War I Jenny and took people for rides, she recalls. Later he built planes but, being a little ahead of his time, he never made it to aviation big time.

Long-lapsed Mormon or not, the Whitmore offspring had a heritage of travel and languages, of men and women who *did things*.

The Fadiman family, on the other hand was more interested in ideas. Isadore Fadiman, a Brooklyn pharmacist, and Grace had three sons. Edwin, the eldest, died some years ago, but lived to introduce his middle brother, Clifton, to France and to wines. William, the younger brother, is a movie producer and editor in Los Angeles.

Clifton Fadiman claims an assortment of eccentric relatives, some of doubtful authenticity. They might have been real people or creations of his unbridled imagination.

By the time Annalee Whitmore was in junior high school, her family had moved to Piedmont, Calif., where she finished high school.

She attended Stanford University, Class of '37, where she was the first woman managing editor of the university newspaper. On the strength of her writing, she was invited to write for the movies. She signed a seven-year contract as a junior writer for MGM and became one of the 100 writers working in the Thalberg building.

"I was thrilled," she remembers. "On the very first day they were filming 'The Wizard of Oz' and the lot and commissary were filled with little green Munchkins and the cast in costumes."

Dinner party guests: He might invite Dr. Samuel Johnson, Isaac Newton or John Maynard Keynes. She would ask Clare Luce "because she was waspish and brilliant and her unkind comments were so interesting" and with guests Zhoe Enlai and Gen. MacArthur, the dinner party could get a peppery.

Books: Clifton Fadiman is reading the second installment of Robert Caro's projected four-volume biography of Lyndon Johnson.

Words of wisdom: Clifton: "Nuggets of wisdom come from the realm of advertising. Slogans conceal thoughts rather than reveal them."

Then he goes into instant mental replay and quotes Aldous Huxley.

"It is a strange thing that after all the wise words that have been written or said throughout history, if we were asked to sum up one's final thought, it would be 'Let's all try to be a little kinder.'"

Although the Hollywood experience was "thrilling, glamorous, exotic," the only credit the young writer received was for "Andy Hardy Meets Debutante."

She also worked a little on "Zigfield Girl," "Honky Tonk" with Clark Gable and Lana Turner and on a preliminary script that threatened to co-star Greta Garbo and Mickey Rooney.

She was saved from that fate by a discussion on China at J.P. McEvoy's beach house where young writers gathered.

McEvoy's son, Dennis, who wrote for Reader's Digest, mentioned that the magazine was looking for someone to cover Asia.

"The idea was irresistible. I was idealistic," she explains. "I asked for a year's leave from MGM and expected to leave immediately. The State Department turned me down, probably because I was a woman," she adds wryly.

Not to be denied, she kept after the assignment and in 1941, with the assistance and intervention of John Hersey and Henry Luce, she became the only American woman correspondent in China.

"The press hostel was a bamboo shack plastered with mud and thatch, with oiled paper at the windows," Annalee Fadiman says, calling on her talent and training as a reporter. "It was cold and our

heating system was an old gasoline drum with a little charcoal. Rats chewed through telephone wires and ate our soap."

Despite the hardships (or because of them), she found the world 'exhilarating."

"The Chinese were brave beyond belief," she recalls. "They could fix anything and make things of nothing. Everybody, including correspondents, was half starved, shivering, soaked most of the time, but laughing. I wouldn't have missed it."

With the United States entry into World War II, Chinese and U.S. censorship increased.

"Anything beyond pretty, little, feature stories had to be smuggled out," she says, making a little face to show what she thinks of "pretty, little, feature stories."

Bigger things were brewing in China. Since 1931, China had been at war with Japan. The Japanese surrender revived internal strife between Nationalist forces led by Gen. Chiang Kai-shek and Communist forces under party chairman Mao Zedong.

Both leaders figure in Annalee Fadiman's personal recollections, as do Zhoe Enlai and Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

In 1944 and 1945, Annalee was back in China, finding "no more glowing, laughing faces."

The people had more to eat, weren't being bombed, but seemed far less cheerful.

In 1946, she recorded her China experiences and observations in "Thunder out of China" written with Theodore Snow, another Asian expert.

Movie rights to the best-seller have been optioned by Paul Newman.

Zhoe Enlai made a vivid impression on the young journalist. She describes him as "electric."

"He knew every word you were saying and his own speech was embellished with wit," she remarks.

As to Gen. MacArthur whom she met first at a press conference in Manila and later in Australia with his wife, Jean, she says, "He was not the imperious man of his image. He was generous, thoughtful, liberal and funny."

"The only man I was ever jealous of," her husband interjects, adding "and, with reason."

Annalee pats his hand and chuckles, but denies nothing.

The Fadimans met when "Thunder out of China" was a Book-of-the-Month selection and Annalee was a guest on "Information Please." Fadiman, of course, was the resident genius in both areas.

"We got together," he says contentedly, "and gradually it all worked out."

"Here on the mainland I am rooted down, tethered to earth's four corners like a barn," Anne once wrote.

Anne Morrow Lindbergh's words expressed perfectly those embedded in my own writer's block. I had found the same freedom in island life that had given wing to her poignant verbiage. She stripped away every excuse in which I had clothed my psyche to protect it from fear of writing.

Perhaps her husband spanned the Atlantic and swooned hearts with his dimpled chin. But Anne Morrow Lindbergh was, in my mind, the real free faller and charmer of the family. She laid bare her soul and took womanhood on a flight to then uncharted territories by looking into an island seashell.

She gave me, in her gift from the sea, the courage to finally fill my empty journal with sentiments previously believed inexpressible.

Chelle Koster Walton, a Sanibel free-lance writer, is contributing editor for Caribbean Travel & Life Magazine, co-author of the guidebook "Hidden Florida" and author of the book "Sanibel Island Eyes."

CEPD Administrator Alison Hagerup went under the building on one occasion to examine the condition of the nearest ones. She said she hoped the engineering firm doing the study was going to recover them from under the building because, "I went after them last time and I swore I would never crawl under this building again."

The CEPD last Wednesday granted South Seas Plantation a permit to store sand on the beach at South Seas. The resort plans to do the first maintenance dredging since 1978 of the channel into its harbor.

The sand from the dredging would then be stored temporarily on the beach before being used in a project to redesign the layout of the golf course at the resort.

The CEPD took no action on a request for \$3,000 to help pay for lobbying efforts in Tallahassee by the "Beach Watch" program of the Florida State Beach Preservation Association.

Board members were reluctant to spend money for a lobbyist at a time when they had no specific proposals before the legislature.

The request that the CEPD join the lobbying effort had come from Allen G. Ten Broek, president of The Mariner Group, which owns South Seas Plantation, the largest on Captiva.

a substantial removal of the structures to see any positive impact downdrift.

Commissioner Jim Krieger asked what the hole is and if it was created by the jetties. Turrell explained that it was just the deep, tidal waters of San Carlos Bay.

Planning Director Bruce Rogers asked Turrell if he knew how the "hole became a hole," and asked if he knew about a "deep hole" before Levy mentioned it.

Turrell said he was merely referring to the deep waters of the bay.

"You've referred several times to the deep hole and how the sand is going to end up in the bottom of that deep hole," Rogers said, and asked Turrell to show where the deep hole is on an aerial photograph.

"All through your presentation, you've led the commission to believe that you know where the deep hole is; you know how it got there," Rogers said, asking him again to identify it on the photograph. "Just simply say you don't know, and we'll go on."

Turrell said what he does know is there's deep waters throughout there, and as far as sediment transport loss into deep waters, "it might as well be a deep hole all along there."

When asked about the sand movement after the dredging operation, Turrell said some of the sand normally lost offshore would drift back into the inlet, necessitating another dredging in about three or four years.

Commissioner Jim Krieger asked how frequently it would have to be dredged and Turrell said it was hard to guess how fast nature would fill in the system, but it would be some years.

Johnson asked if removing part of the jetty would eventually equalize the beaches on both sides of the jetty and Turrell answered that it was questionable, because of the offshore losses to the bay.

"Then you're saying it may not," said Krieger.

"I'm saying it may not," said Turrell.

Krieger said, to follow Murty's line of questioning, "You can't say that it won't."

Turrell agreed, saying that when dealing with coastal engineering, if anybody says he knows exactly what will happen, it's not right. "We have to base it on experience."

Murty said he wasn't sure if "we're getting through" that in addition to the dredging, the proposal is to move sand to the place that's suffered the erosion and to build a dune, the natural process would move the sand further down.

Hans Wilson, of Dexter Bender & Associates, turned the subject back deciding which method was best for the pond: to monitor and regulate the salinity or to maintain its natural nature of a tidal saline lagoon.

He agreed with Palmer that the aerator's advantage is that it reduces stratification, but his concern is that it relies on man's consistency in operating the system. He said Mother Nature is more reliable.

Wilson said the most negative aspect of the aerator system is that it eliminates a mangrove seed source for the San Carlos Bay area.

He said that during the seasonal high tides, salt water would enter the pond and kill the fish "and we're back to square one."

Wilson discussed the offshore sand drift, reiterating Turrell's points, and read a letter from Dr. Jim Beever, resource management and research coordinator of the Southwest Florida Aquatic Preserves, in which he emphatically endorses opening the pond to the tidal flow.

Discussion of the movement of the sand and jetty removal drifted back and forth in the form of a partial approval of the permit, until Commissioner Ernest Klautt finally asked for a recommendation of outright denial of the entire proposal because it is inconsistent with the codes. After a summary by each commissioner, most of whom cited that there were viable alternatives to the dredging, the recommendation of denial was unanimously approved.

A second reading will be heard Tuesday, March 27.

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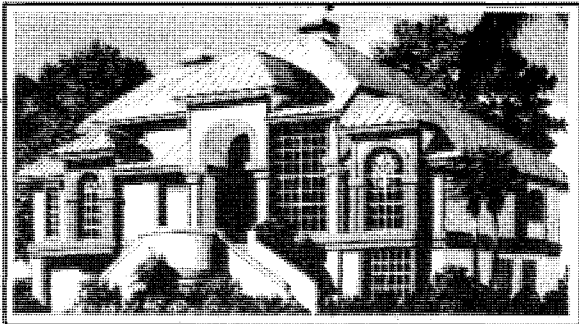
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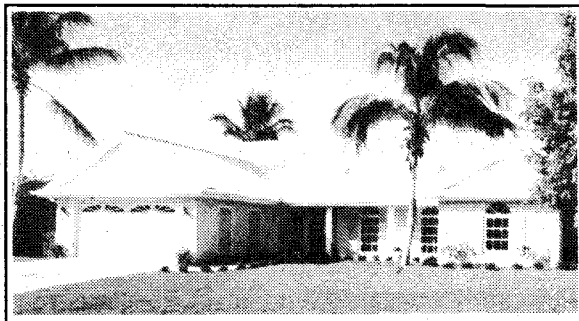
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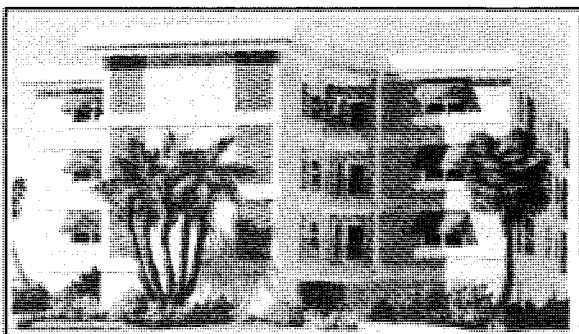
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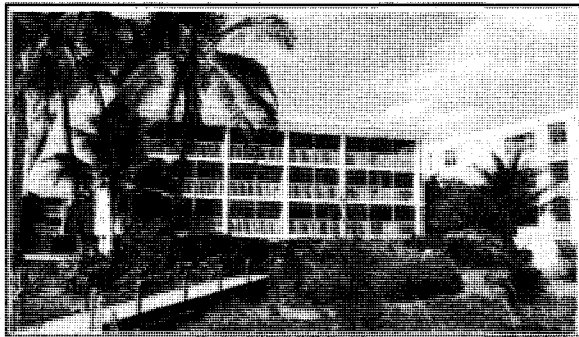
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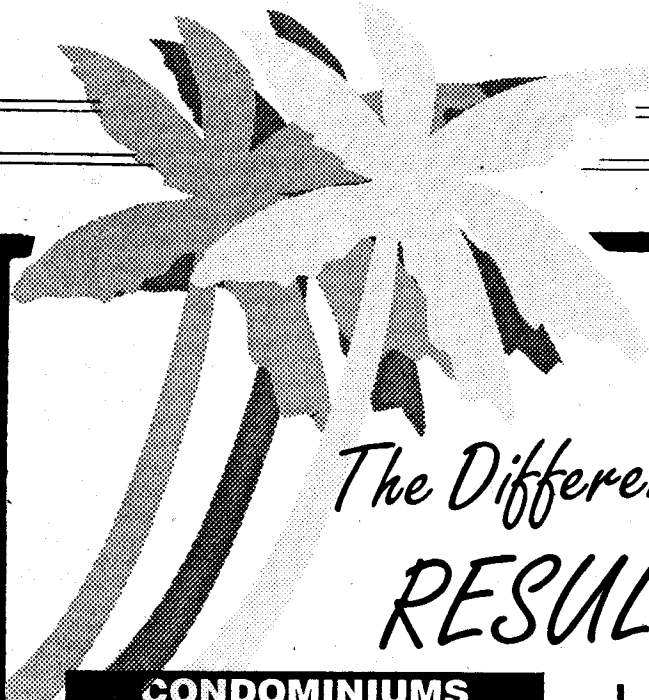
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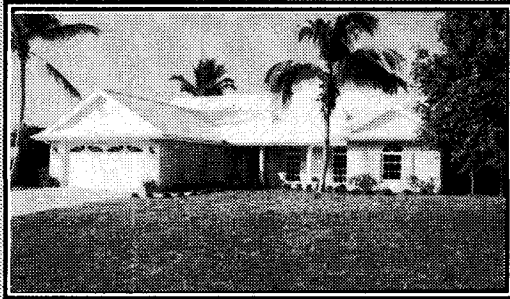

Riding the storm out

Cyclone provides a 'lift' as McPhees

●continue their around-the-world adventure

(From the navigation station of the sailing vessel Shadowfax from Capt. Scott McPhee, Gretchen McPhee and David Poole. For this dispatch, Poole was not on board.)

Shadowfax enjoyed a leisurely 103-mile sail overnight from the island of Moorea to Raiatea.

We had met a nice couple, Gary and Kaija, from Canada, and offered them a ride so they could pick up a chartered sailboat in Raiatea. This was Kaija's first time out of the sight of land. They really enjoyed the trip, so I let them take a shift on watch. Gretchen and I watched them during their watch because we weren't sure they knew exactly what they were watching for.

The island of Raiatea is the largest of the four main leeward islands and measures 12 miles north-to-south and 8 miles east-to-west. Raiatea's two highest mountains are over 3,000 feet tall. Raiatea's largest export is empty beer bottles.

We were able to take our dinghy up the Aoppoman River, the only navigable river on the island. It was an interesting trip with wild flowers, fruits and coconut trees lining both shores.

After Gary and Kaija picked up their boat, they followed us east for 25 miles to the island of Huahine. We had a wonderful sail to the island, but with the wind direction as it was, we were unable to sail into the pass. When I tried to start the motor, I found the fuel lines to be clogged and no immediate solution. We sailed as close to the pass as possible and called one of the sailboats we could see in the anchorage. Three different boats responded by coming out with their dinghies for a tow party. Sometimes things just work out without even trying.

After a day in the engine room to fix the problem, it was time to explore.

Huahine is 13 miles north-to-south and about four miles wide.

The island is split in two and legend says that the God Hiro did it while paddling his canoe. (I think I've seen him at Timmy's Nook.)

We toured the island by car and found the natives to be very shy until a conversation was started.

The best Tahitian dance show we've seen was at the Relais Mahana Hotel. The dancers were amateurs who had won a local talent contest. It was obvious they weren't doing it just for the money.

Huahine has anchorages so beautiful you could stay on board and just watch the world go by.

The next island to visit was Tahaa, back 15 miles to the west, just 2 miles north of Raiatea.

When we left Huahine, the weather was fine so we decided to tow the dinghy instead of putting it on deck. (For the first time.)

As soon as we left, the weather deteriorated rapidly. One violent gust of wind blew out our forward sail.

When we reached Tahaa's pass, our dinghy was very close to flipping over. Gretchen turned Shadowfax into the wind while I tried to adjust the lines to the dinghy. The seas were breaking over the bow and back to the cockpit. We guess the wave heights to be 15 or 20 feet.

After the dinghy was more secure, we headed into the pass with these waves pushing us along. Luckily, the waves weren't breaking along the pass so Shadowfax surfed in behind the reef to the calm waters of the lagoon.

Tahaa is actually inside the same circular reef as Raiatea. The island is about six miles long north-to-south and is seldom visited by tourists.

We found one small restaurant, The Hibiscus, run by a memorable man named Leo. Leo has a pet pig called La La, weighing in at 200 pounds.

Leo says La La used to be allowed in the dining room, but now she's too big. It seems that La La would lie under your table while you ate and would get up and walk away with your table, food and all.

The health codes here are a little different. If the dogs, cats, pigs and goats are healthy, they are allowed in any restaurant, bar or hotel.

After Tahaa, it was northwest 25 miles to the island everyone has heard of and dreamed of -- Bora Bora.

Bora Bora is the smallest and possibly the most beautiful of all islands. It is five miles long and the famous twin-peak mountain is 2,100 feet tall with

sheer cliffs dropping into a turquoise lagoon.

We found a resort called the Oa Oa, with moorings to tie to and a large sign declaring, "Yachts Welcome."

The Oa Oa was the perfect place to watch cruise ships enter and charter boats come and go.

One of the cruise ships we saw was the 440-foot computerized sailing vessel Windsong. We found it hard to get on board for a tour so we went over the captain's head and went right to the help.

Gretchen and I made friends with the people guarding the back door. They were able to show us everything from the luxury rooms to the bridge. The computer runs everything. It measures wind strength and direction and adjusts the sails accordingly. Quite a yacht!

The next week the harbor was visited by four cruise ships. They were all 600-foot luxury liners in great shape and all flying a unique flag. They were all from the USSR.

By the time the third one arrived, we wanted to talk to someone aboard and see what was going on. I didn't think Russia even had cruise ships.

We met two crew members off the Maxim Gorky -- Kirkov and Viktor. Kirkov spoke English very well and his wife teaches it back in Russia (How many of our schools teach Russian?)

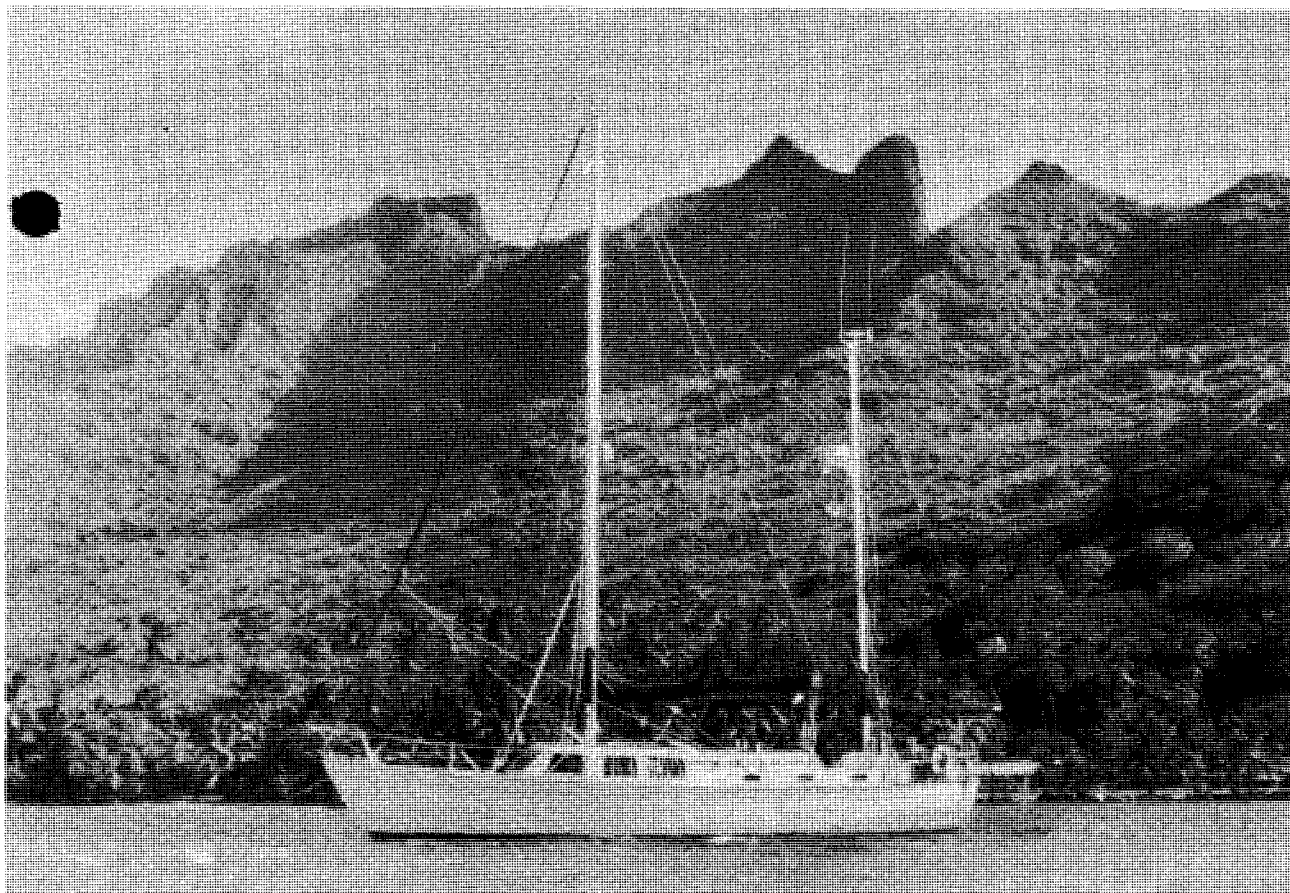
We invited them out to Shadowfax for a Budweiser beer. They talked it over for a minute and accepted. This was the first time they had ever seen a private yacht. They were like two kids in a candy store.

Kirkov's first question as "How much?" I didn't know how many rubles Shadowfax was worth so I told them in U.S. dollars.

I asked them what they thought of Mr. Gorbachev and they said the reform is too slow. They want a yacht like Shadowfax now, not in five years or even one year. They were amazed at what a little capitalism could get you.

We sent them back to their boat with Shadowfax T-shirts, pictures and a Newsweek magazine with Gorbach on the cover.

That week at Oa Oa was nice and restful, a good thing because of what happened next.

Controversial 'for sale' signs sprout on Captiva

Real estate "for sale" signs have begun popping up beside the road on Captiva and some island residents don't like it.

About five years ago, the Captiva Civic Association asked Realtors to take down their "for sale" signs and, with occasional exceptions, such signs disappeared from the island.

The civic association argument is that it will not look as if a lot of property is for sale if signs are not up.

Captiva Civic Association President Robert Kessler said last week he has "tried diligently" to stop the Realtors from putting up signs.

However, after a couple of Realtors put signs up, the others followed close behind. Kessler refused to name the Realtors who first posted the signs saying he thought it best to let community pressure work.

"Maybe it will get so ridiculous that the people on Captiva will take it up and get their Realtors to take down the signs. Then the Realtors will decide they were better off the way it was before," Kessler said.

Although Kessler refused to name names, one source said Brokers Consultants of Sanibel was the first to put up the signs, followed quickly by VIP and then by most or all of the others.

Vince Kelly, sales manager for Brokers Consultants, said he did not think his company was the first to put signs up but that he considers the signs part of doing a good job for his clients.

"I put them up strictly because my clients want them up," Kelly said. "All I am doing is doing my job. You can't make everybody happy but my sellers are very happy."

He said he is getting about 10 calls a week as a direct result of signs in front of property for sale on Captiva.

Kelly pointed out that every landscaper, contractor, electrician, etc., puts up a sign when working on Captiva property. He called the Captiva Civic Association's no signs effort illegal restraint of trade.

Kelly pointed out that he did not "make a big deal out of it" several weeks ago when somebody pulled up every one of his signs on Captiva. He just replaced them.

The signs are normal size "for sale" signs and nobody even notices them unless they are looking for property, Kelly said, calling the excitement of some Captiva residents over the signs "their latest pet peeve. By May, it will all be over with."



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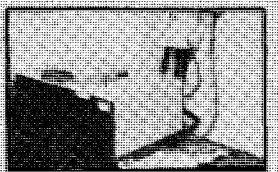
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Our perfect dinner would start with lamb

To us, a nearly perfect dinner would start with a soup such as Creme Olga, followed by a leg of lamb accompanied by flageolets. Next would be a tossed green salad of chickory, Belgian endive and watercress served with a classic vinaigrette. To top it off? A superb dessert, a real crowd pleaser -- Ginger Roll.

We like lamb either as a roast leg, or a rack, or in chops, or butterflied and broiled or boned and stuffed with marrow. As for the left overs, they go in stews, curries and in the ever-present stock pot.

The trick with lamb is to never over cook it. Plus, if you are serving a leg or a roast, trim off all the fat and fell.

We cook a roast in the European manner: 18 to 19 minutes per pound as we prefer it pink to rare. Most people over cook it so you do not know from what animal you are partaking.

When preparing a leg, after I trim it, I then make a paste of crushed garlic and salt which I mix with olive oil. Before I coat the meat, I cut small slits in it and put some of the garlic-salt mix in the slits. After that, coat the leg with the oil (etc.) mix. Place on a rack in the roasting pan, grind pepper over it and put some sprigs of fresh or dried rosemary over the top. Cook in 350 degree oven.

I baste occasionally with beef or lamb stock. If you want the lamb cooked more, cook longer than the 18 to 19 minutes per pound.

The recipe for flageolets I wrote about some time ago. When you buy them, try and get the Haricot Sec and soak overnight. They are preferable to the canned ones.

Creme Olga

4 tablespoons butter
5 bunches of scallions, trimmed and chopped
Salt and pepper
5 cups chicken stock
3/4 pound of mushrooms, sliced
1 cup light cream
Chopped fresh dill for garnish
Melt butter in heavy pan, add scallions and cook until wilted. Do not let brown. Add salt, pepper and stock,



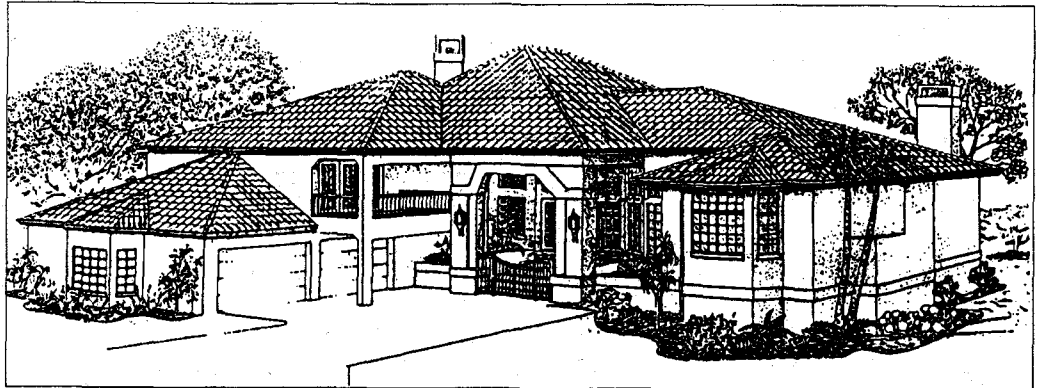

bring to a boil, add the mushrooms and bring back to a boil. Remove from stove and puree in batches in a blender. Pour back in pan, add the cream and re-heat. Serve in warm soup bowls and garnish with the dill.

1/2 cup sugar
1/4 teaspoon salt
2/3 cup cake flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground ginger

'Sanibel Flats' a 'first-rate' adventure yarn

"Sanibel Flats" by Randy Wayne White is a first-rate adventure yarn with many a twist, turn and trial.

Charter Capt. White has written a good book. And, in so doing, has created a protagonist who could become as long-lived as J.D. McDonald's Travis McGee.

Marion D. Ford is a marine biologist, recently free of an undercover life "after 10 years of being necessarily suspicious and living a life of professional deceit." As a reluctant hero, he is intelligent, honorable and incredibly ingenious.

His sidekick, an irrepressible superannuated hippy, Tomlinson, is equally bright and engaging.

The main plot is pretty straight forward, with interwoven subplots that aren't. The challenges are

Herculean; the ending, a surprise. Well, two surprises.

True, most of the action of "Sanibel Flats" takes place far from Sanibel. So what? Its real action roaring ahead in a place that's superbly delineated.

True, there is some gratuitous sex, but White resists several other opportunities for exploitation.

True, dialogue is larded with impolite words, but it's honest dialogue and White has a good ear for the casual way some people talk.

True, some of the dissection data is reminiscent of college biology, but M.D. Ford cares about his specimens, his procedures and his environment.

True, the women in "Sanibel Flats" are less fully realized than the wonderful cast of males, but White does give three-fifths of them worthwhile aspirations.

As the guerilla communist general who yearns to

pitch in the major leagues would point out, that's a fine average.

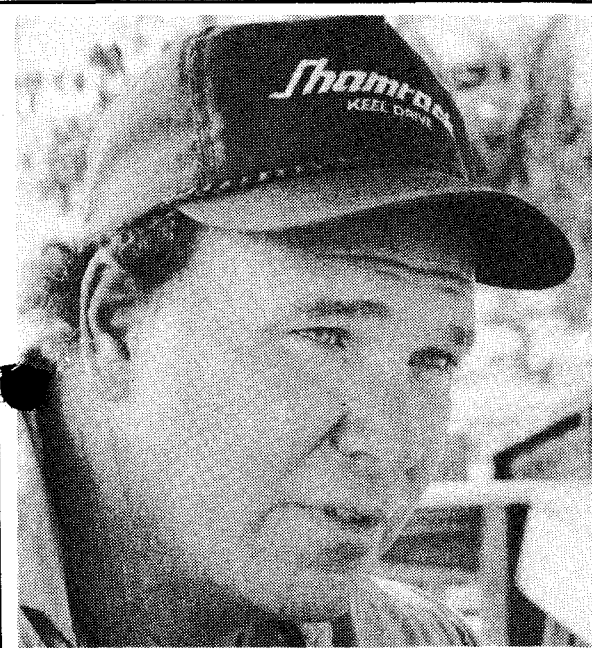
True, there is some gut-clenching violence, but it is an accurate and terrifying account of brutal drug-fed political frenzy that exists just beyond our borders.

White has done his research, much of it first-hand, and he integrates it well. But, above all, he has brought to life characters who demand more books.

Aside from Ford and Tomlinson, Jethro Nicholes, MacKinley, Police Major Lester Durrell and reporter Henry S. Melinski are all people who can enliven additional pages. General Rivera deserves a follow-up, too. And, even the off-screen covert types are given a patina of detail that makes them real.

"Sanibel Flats" is a good, fast read but should not be read so speedily that pages 121-123 are missed.

White's personal adventures reflected in fictional works

Randy Wayne White came to Southwest Florida in 1971 because he wanted to work on a newspaper. Gannett had just bought the Fort Myers News-Press and his enthusiasm, if not his experience (none) landed him a job as copy editor.

In his spare time, White who had lived in Ohio, Iowa and North Carolina, qualified for a U.S. Coast Guard captain's license and sharpened his general writing skills.

In 1977, White left newspaper work and became a full-time fishing guide. He kept at his writing, however, writing a column for "Outside" magazine and articles for "Playboy" and "Sports Illustrated" plus a few things under a pen name. He has written about the Mariel Harbor boat lift, the peasant war in Nicaragua, the destruction of rain

forests in Indonesia and the America's Cup races in Perth.

"But I've never written a fishing story," he recalled, sounding bemused. "I wonder why?"

White married his Rockingham, N.C. high school sweetheart 17 years ago and he and Debbie

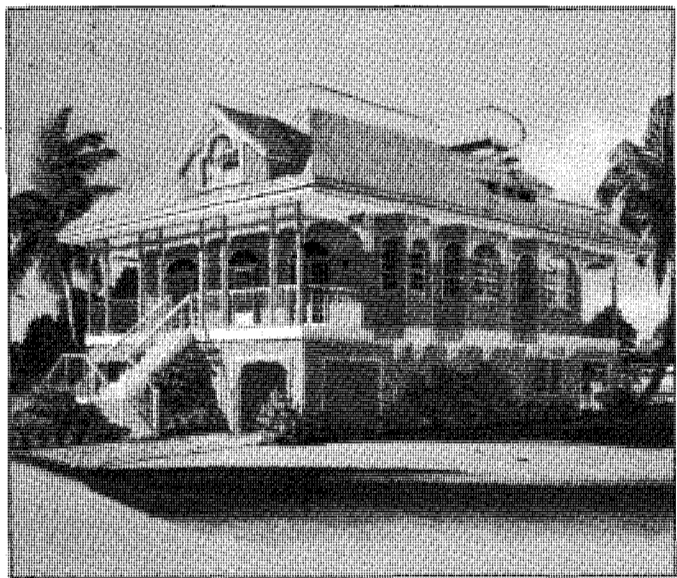

Only one player in a thousand plays all 52 cards. He builds up a picture of the two concealed hands and then takes all four hands in account as he picks his way through 13 tricks.

If you want to practice this art, begin by remembering the bidding during the play of the hand. Note each player's bids and passes and draw simple inferences from them.

For example, an opening bid promises a certain minimum strength and a probable suit length. A player who bids two suits is usually long in those suits and

short in the other suits.

In most situations, a player who fails to bid has only a limited count in high cards. Note the kind of failure: whether the player failed to open the bidding, to overcall or to respond to his partner's opening bid.

The opening lead and the early play tell you more about the location of the missing high cards. Sometimes the play to the first trick or two will reveal the entire hand as though each opponent had shown you his cards.

In today's hand, South failed to make his contract because he credited his opponents with hands they couldn't hold. He was playing a non-existent set of 52 cards.

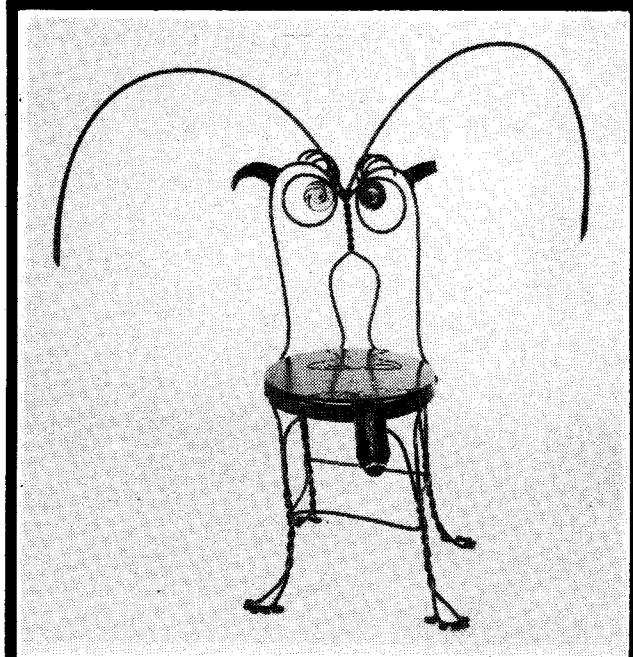
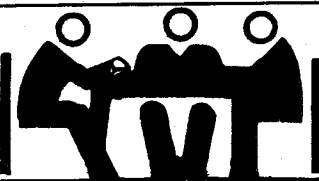
West opened the ace of hearts and East signaled for a continuation by dropping the king. West continued with the four, East played the jack and South ruffed.

South read the heart position accurately. He thought of the clubs and credited West with the ace-queen of his bid suit. Since this meant that West would win two club tricks, South decided that his only chance was to avoid losing a trump trick.

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

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
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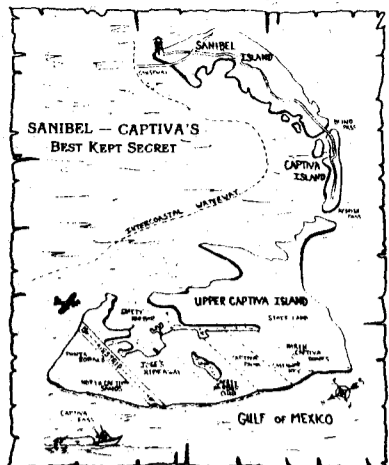

In the hope of capturing a singleton jack or queen in the East hand, South began the trumps by leading the king. When no honor dropped, South led a trump to the ace and then fell back on leading dummy's 10 of clubs for a finesse through East.

The finesse worked but came too late to do South any good. West took the ace of clubs, drew dummy's last trump with the queen, and then got out safely with a heart. East eventually got the setting trick with the queen of clubs.

South went down because he was playing a hand that existed only in Never-Never Land. South shouldn't have felt sure that West had both the ace and queen of clubs for his opening club bid. All sorts of honest citizens bid one club with rather peculiar club suits. But South should have felt quite sure that West held Q-J-x for his double of four spades. If West held Q-x-x or J-x-x, he would pass, fearing that a double would cost him his trump trick.

Since South should have expected to lose a trump trick, his only real chance for the contract was to find the queen of clubs in the East hand. If South thought things through, he would come up with a very accurate picture of the concealed hands and could play with those hands in mind. If it turned out that East didn't have the queen of clubs, South would go down but at least he would have nothing to reproach himself for.

After ruffing the second heart, South cannot afford to draw two rounds of trumps before starting the clubs. He should, instead, lead a low trump to dummy's ace, and return dummy's 10 of clubs for a finesse. South can later cash the king of clubs and ruff a club in dummy, after which there is no problem.

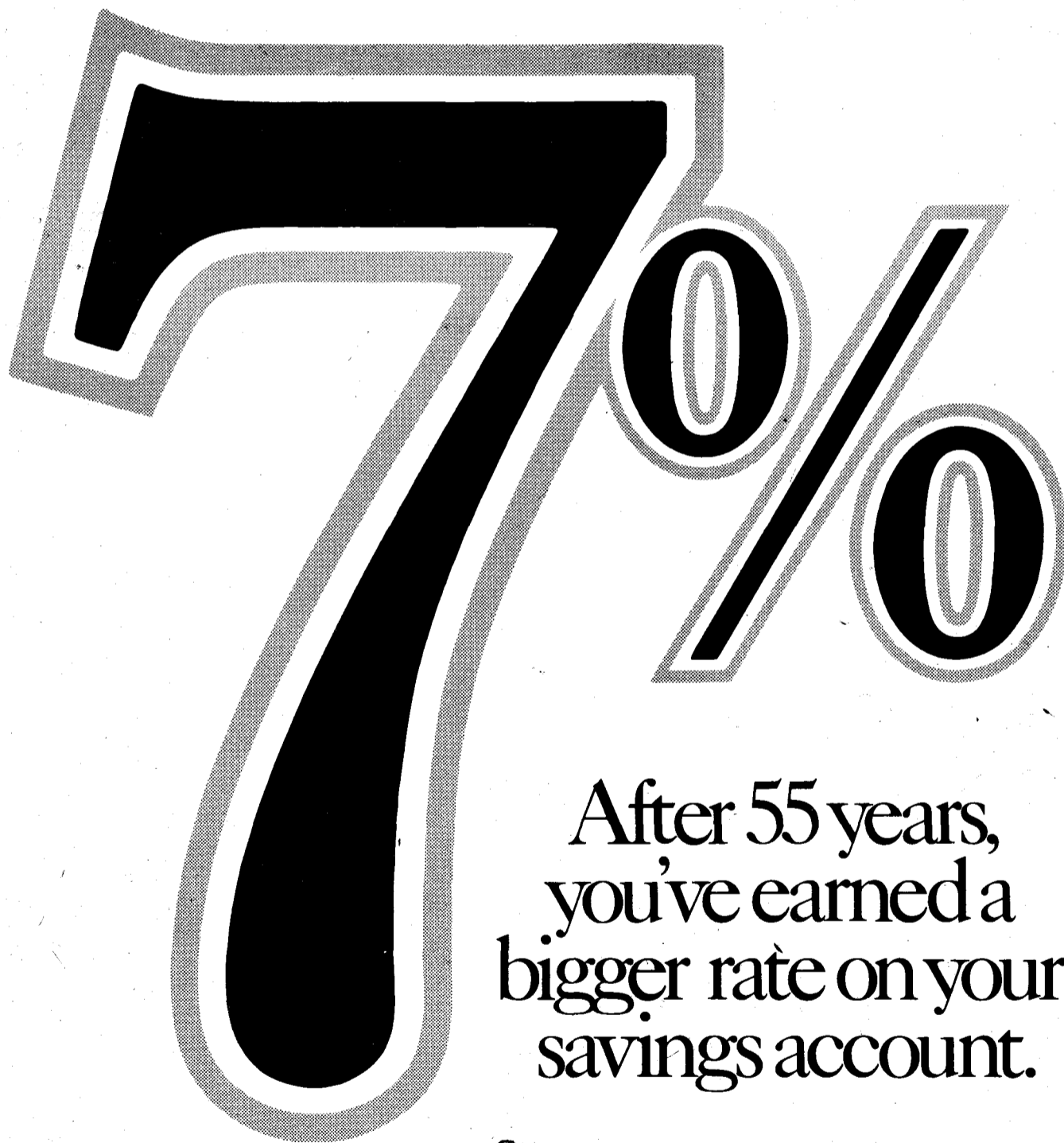

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Ginger Filling

2 ounces diced, crystalized ginger
1/4 cups cream, whipped
1 1/2 tablespoons granulated sugar

Soak the ginger in the brandy for 30 minutes. Then fold this into the whipped cream, spread this mix over the unrolled cake. Roll up using the tea towel as a guide. Dust the sugar over the top, trim off both ends of the roll and then serve.

I make the cake the day before and roll it up and

refrigerate. The morning of the day I am going to serve it, I whip the cream over ice (this prevents it from "weeping") then fold in the ginger-brandied mix and then re-roll and refrigerate. Then I dust the sugar over the top before serving.

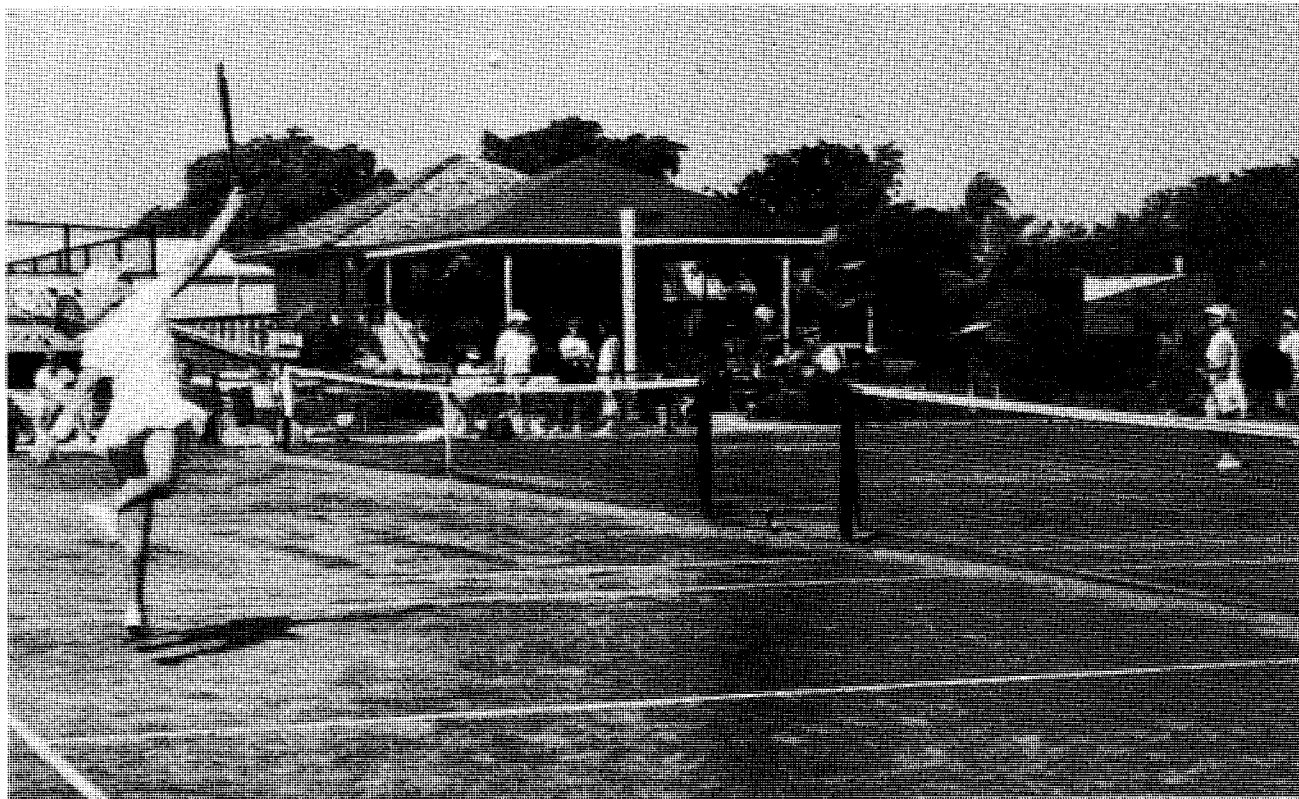
"It made me realize that even on Sanibel the needs of people are great," explained See.

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Meeting scheduled concerning Captiva Drive improvements

A public meeting concerning the proposed Captiva Drive improvements has been scheduled for this Thursday, March 22, at 7 p.m. at the Captiva Community Center.

Representatives of the Lee County Department of Transportation will be on hand to answer questions. The general public is invited.

The meeting is being called by the Captiva Civic Association in connection with the county's recent proposal to raise Sanibel-Captiva Road to a height of 5 1-2 feet for two miles on the Sanibel side of Blind Pass, but not to raise the height of Captiva Drive on Captiva.

The immediate approach to the road would be raised as part of the current project to construct a new bridge over Blind Pass.

However, county engineers recommended not raising the road in front of residences beyond Turner Beach because that would create drainage problems and could endanger trees beside the roadway.

The county did recommend widening Captiva Drive from 21 feet to 24 feet except in areas where trees would be damaged by the widening.

Captiva Civic Association President Robert Kessler said last week the meeting was being called so that Captiva residents could get their questions answered regarding the road proposals.

He said, "It appears the county has completely forgotten about raising the road" and he also thought many Captiva

residents would oppose widening the road.

Kessler said he had not read the county roadway study, which was issued in December 1989, and was not aware of the county objections that raising the road would create drainage problems and endanger trees.

The \$2.1 million in road work was approved two weeks ago by the Transportation Committee of the Lee County Commission. However, the committee asked that the comments of the Sanibel City Council and the Captiva Civic Association be acquired before the proposal is presented to the full County Commission.

Migratory bird decline discussed

Loss of habitat is a primary reason for the decline in the migratory bird population in the United States, Dr. Rollin D. Sparrow told the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society during its meeting last Thursday.

Sparrow showed charts demonstrating the drastic declines in numbers of numerous species since 1971. He said the northern pintail had experienced a particularly alarming drop in numbers.

In past years, according to Sparrow, most of the attention and study has been devoted to species, such as ducks, which are hunted. However, he said the species that are hunted make up only 7 percent of all species of migratory bird and more attention is starting to be paid to the other species.

Sparrow admitted that hunting is a controversial issue. He asserted that hunting was not the primary reason for the decline in migratory birds and that hunters had provided a lot of financial and other support for the purchase of wetlands and for efforts to preserve water fowl species.

He said hunters also help in the recovery of banded birds as illustrated by figures which show that 70 percent of banded birds are non-game birds but only 25 percent of bands returned are non-game birds.

Sparrow outlined the migratory bird treaties the United States has with Canada, Mexico, Japan and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

He is in charge of the implementation of the Canada-U.S. waterfowl management agreement and he participated in a waterfowl program in Russia.

In his introduction, it was mentioned that Sparrow's Ph.D. research had been done on the kestrel, which is also known as the sparrow hawk.


Sparrow used slides to illustrate his talk.

Burrowing owls

Despite its natural tunneling abilities, this 'miner' caves-in Cape Coral's waterline project



Named after the Greek goddess of wisdom, to whom owls were sacred, *Athene cunicularia* is Florida's smallest owl. Only nine inches tall, burrowing owls live in pastures and grassland areas - including those around noisy airports.

Despite persistent rumors to the contrary, the burrowing owl does not automatically make a beeline for the nearest gopher tortoise burrow and remodel it. *Cunicularia* ("the miner"), frequently digs its own burrow and leaves a large mound of excavated earth at the entrance.

The entrance mound serves as a perfect lookout point for a vulnerable ground bird that, unlike many owls, is diurnal rather than nocturnal. Fortunately, it's difficult for predators to sneak up on a creature that can look backward and forward almost simultaneously.

When not swiveling their heads 180 degrees or bobbing up and down on their long legs, burrowing owls engage in other activities essential for the survival of the species. Specifically, feeding and breeding.

The latter activity is currently frustrating and infuriating Cape Coral's city manager, just as the lowly snail darter once frustrated and infuriated the mighty Tennessee Valley Authority. Indeed, a hapless William Noonan lies firmly impaled on the horns of a dilemma.

On the one hand, state officials insist that Cape Coral install a dual-water system. On the other hand, wildlife officials insist that the pipes for said system neither destroy nor disturb in any way the nests of some 250 federally protected burrowing owls.

In a recent article, aptly entitled "Dual-Pipe Water Hits Feathered Wall," the Fort Myers News-Press quoted City Manager Noonan as follows: "We've got one or more state agencies hammering at us to

get this project done and now we have the owl people."

Mr. Noonan's exceedingly dim view of both "the owl people" and the 160-gram birds that brought his \$39 million project to a screeching halt is quite understandable. But on the sanctuary island of Sanibel, residents would be delighted to discover *cunicularia* nesting in areas scheduled for development.

The owl's presence is not beyond the realm of possibility. In his book about island nesting birds, Hal Harrison noted that burrowing owls sighted at The Dunes in 1972 had moved to less congested areas. Unfortunately, he didn't say where.

Around that time, however, Dr. K.C. Emerson saw some at the old airstrip off Middle Gulf Drive. But since the birds subsequently left the property that is now owned by Container Products Corp.,

they're not in a position to interfere with its development.

Perhaps the owls abandoned our barrier islands and found a happy home in the bulldozed wastelands of Cape Coral. A few, however, may have stayed on Sanibel. If so, there was only one place for them to go -- Wulfert Point.

Formerly a farming area, Wulfert's abandoned fields provide prime habitats. We know that many gopher tortoises live on the 465-acre tract, but are there any burrowing owls? We may soon find out.

Sanibel's environmental expert is currently inspecting the Wulfert tract, the site of a proposed golfing and boating community. Should he find any burrowing owls in the path of development, the city will certainly want to ensure their protection.

Music for the event will be provided by Heidi and Jim Walsh.

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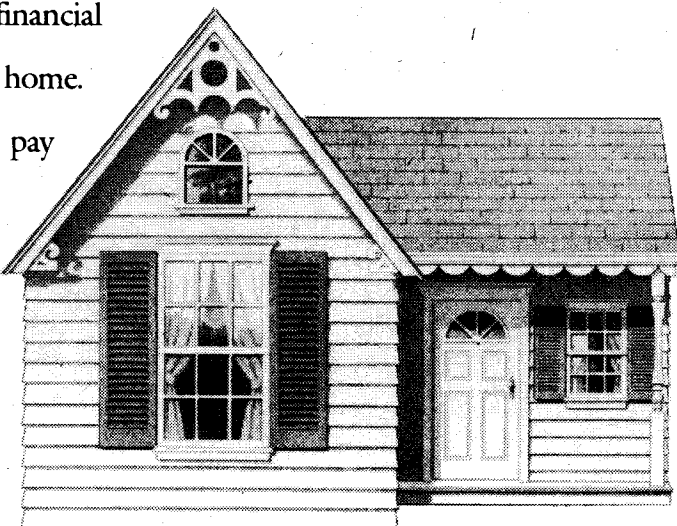
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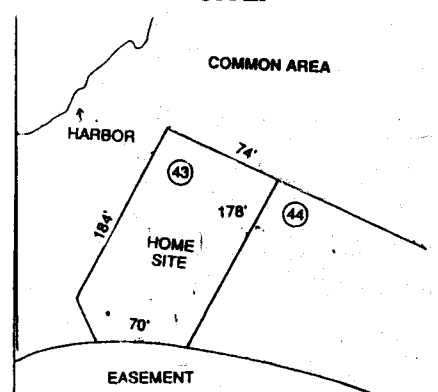
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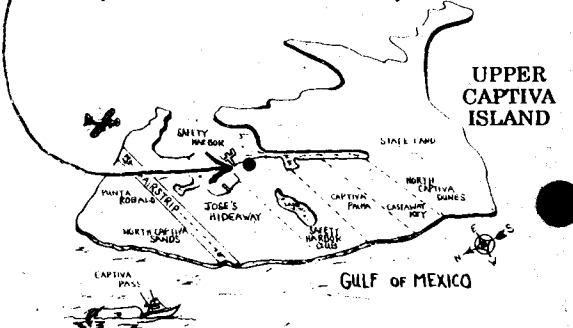


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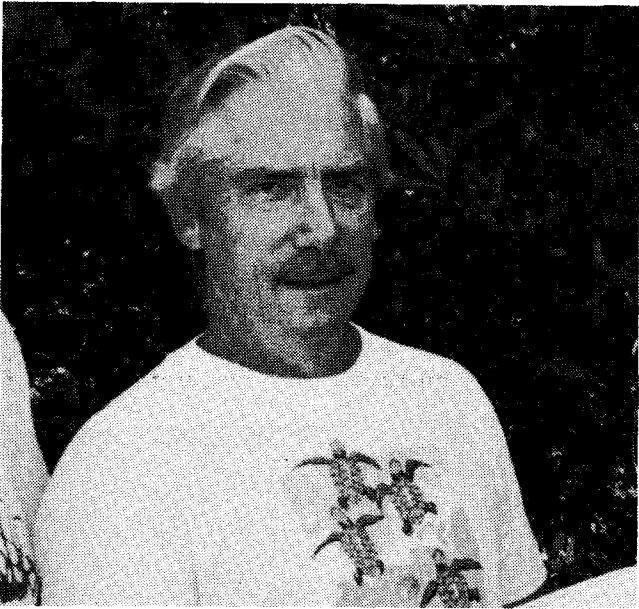

LeBuff retiring from 'Ding' Darling post

Charles LeBuff, who has worn numerous hats over the years -- most simultaneously -- is taking one of them off. LeBuff will retire on March 31 from his position as the biological technician at the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge, where he has worked for the past 32 years.

He will continue running Sanibel Sign Services, giving natural history tours, writing and working with Caretta Research, the sea turtle conservation organization he founded in 1968.

LeBuff was one of the original members of the Sanibel City Council, a past president of the Sanibel-Captiva Audubon Society, an early board member of the American Alligator Council and is currently a member of the Sanibel City Wildlife Committee.

LeBuff is world famous for his work with loggerhead turtles and will soon have published a major book on the life history and the biology of loggerheads.

In 1972, LeBuff received the Governor's Award for his loggerhead conservation work. The Sanibel City Council praised his work with loggerheads in a 1988 resolution.

LeBuff's plans make it seem that he will work even

harder after retiring than he has since he moved to Sanibel in 1958. He and his wife, Jean, plan to paint their house inside and out. They also plan to increase the size of their sign company and to do some fishing and travelling.

LeBuff also plans to write another book. This one will not be about turtles but will have a Sanibel theme.

The retirement of LeBuff will be a major loss for the refuge. Ron Hight, the manager of the facility, said, "Charles has been the mainstay of a refuge that started slowly on an isolated barrier island. Just as the island has changed, the refuge has become more complex. Charles has provided continuity through all this period."

Hight went on to say that LeBuff will be hard to replace and "We will miss his humor, his clear thinking and his knowledge."

Prior to coming to Sanibel, LeBuff conducted red tide research for the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries in Naples.

At the Darling refuge, LeBuff has served as a law enforcement officer, conducted biological tasks such as

It's business as usual at CROW

Although the Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife facility on Sanibel will be without a staff veterinarian until Renee Simoneaux arrives in mid-June, work with injured and ill animals and birds at the center continues.

The facility's former vet, Dr. Marc Elie, resigned as of the end of February.

The staff rehabilitators and the veterinary students doing internships are able to handle most treatments, according to both CROW President Wallace Kain and Karen Elling, a rehabilitator at the facility.

Kain said CROW also has arrangements with four area veterinarians to handle emergency cases.

"So, we have pretty good coverage," Kain said, "but we don't like it as well as having our own veterinarian in house. But it works."

Elling said she and veterinary student Bob VanDuys were currently doing most of the operations on animals being brought to CROW.

The hiring of Simoneaux was announced two weeks ago. However, he does not complete his training at the University of Florida College of Veterinary Medicine until June.

Two chances available to visit CROW

Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife is holding its annual meeting and an open house this week. Both are open to the public.

The annual meeting is Wednesday, March 21, at 1:30 p.m., and the open house, which is traditionally held the last Sunday of each month, is on Sunday, March 25 from 1 to 3 p.m.

Both events are being held at the clinic grounds on Sanibel-Captiva Road and, for both events, people should park at the Sanibel Elementary School ball field lot across Sanibel-Captiva Road from the entrance to the CROW grounds.

Surviving eaglet doing well

The sole surviving eaglet from the disrupted nest near the intersection of McGregor Boulevard and Summerlin Road continues to do well at Care and Rehabilitation of Wildlife. The eaglet's parent was shot to death on Feb. 25 and two other eaglets fell from the nest and died.

The eaglet "is eating up a storm," CROW rehabilitator Karen Elling said late last week.

A reward is offered for information leading to the conviction of the person responsible for the shooting. Informants can remain anonymous and should contact Ron

Hight at the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge.

Hight, in addition to managing the refuge, represents the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the enforcement of laws against harming federally protected wildlife. The bodies of the two dead eaglets and their father have been sent to the wildlife service's Madison, Wis., laboratories for diagnostic work.

The eaglet, who is about 12 weeks old and stands about 2 1/2 feet tall, was brought to CROW by Mark "Bird" Westall, chairman of the Lee County Eagle Technical Advisory Committee.

Westall went to the nest site two weeks ago and noticed that the female eagle was on the nest but the surviving eaglet was not evident. He looked in the vicinity of the nest but was unable to find the youngster.

The next day he returned and, after about an hour, found the eaglet on the ground. He captured it and brought it to CROW.

It is important that the bird remain wild and not grow used to people, according to CROW officials. Therefore, it will not be receiving visitors while at the facility.

In addition to having the problem of caring for it while not allowing it to get used to people, CROW will have the problem of flight training. Eaglets need to be taught to fly and an expert will either have to be brought in on that subject or the bird will have to be sent elsewhere.

There are about 25 eagle nests in Lee County, according to Westall, and a serious problem is their loss of habitat as a result of development.

This is illustrated by the history of the eagle that was killed. He and his mate had nested a few years ago in a tree about 700 feet from where they are now nesting. He was found shot near the old nest site.

That tree was destroyed by lightning and they moved to another tree. The nest in the second tree fell apart when a limb broke off, according to Westall.

So, this year they moved to the current nest. All three nests are on land slated for development, according to Westall.

The eaglet at CROW is being given lots of food and is so far eating well. It was malnourished when it arrived. A big nest was made for it in an outside cage.

Captiva melaleuca removal discussed by county

Four Captiva residents showed up on Thursday, March 8 for the Lee County organized community meeting on melaleuca removal.

Two of the Captiva residents had many melaleucas on their property and said they would allow the county to remove them. A representative of the Jensen's On The Beach business said that Jensen's would really prefer that they not be removed but would be willing to discuss removal with the county if the county would provide replacement trees.

Roger Clark, biologist with the Lee County Division of Planning and Construction, said the county would provide replacement trees, probably buttonwood.

The fourth Captivan has no melaleucas and was just there to observe the meeting.

Clark said that Sanibel City Manager Gary Price had

asked the county to look into removing the melaleucas from Captiva.

Sanibel recently completed a program to remove melaleucas from the island. That program saw the removal of over 2,800 trees. Although there was media coverage of the removal of the "last known melaleuca" on Sanibel last September, a number have been discovered and removed since that time.

Price is concerned that the seed pods from the trees on Captiva might cause Sanibel to be re-infested with the tree, which is considered obnoxious because of the large amounts of water it uses and because it tends to crowd out other vegetation.

Clark estimated there are more than 100 melaleucas on Captiva. A man at the meeting said there were 22 on his property and a woman said she had a row of them. There are 16 at Jensen's.

Although the removal plan is to include Buck Key, Ron

Hight of the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge said there are no melaleuca known to be on Buck Key at the present time. A small cluster of them there were killed in the past.

Clark said he planned to put together a melaleuca removal proposal for the barrier islands and present it to the Lee County Commission in a month or so. It initially would be a voluntary program.

Clark said the melaleuca were introduced to Florida originally in an effort to dry up the Everglades. He believes the Koreshans introduced them to Lee County.

Clark said there exists an attempt to make commercial mulch out of them. He said people using mulch made from melaleuca would not only help get rid of trees but would also help save cypress trees, the alternative source for that type of mulch.

The annual Great Island Pickup, Rid Litter Day, on Sanibel will be held on Saturday, April 21. Volunteers are currently being recruited for the trash pick up, island spruce up event which is sponsored by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation and the city of Sanibel.



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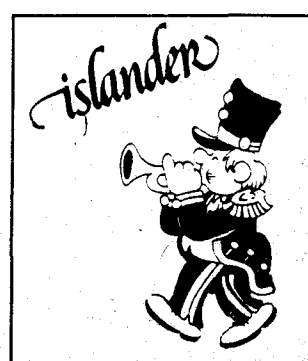
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Committee discusses Jet Skis again

Another in a series of hearings on Jet Skis was held recently by the Service Delivery Committee of the Lee County Commission and the proposed Jet Ski law was reshaped again.

In its current incarnation, the frequently changed law proposal would eliminate beach-based Jet Ski operations in all locations except areas of Fort Myers Beach and along the Sanibel Causeway. It would close down all operations on Captiva except for the one located at South Seas Plantation.

The Sanibel Causeway had not been included in previous versions.

The current proposed law would ban Jet Skis and other personal watercraft within 500 feet of beaches except in those areas (the causeway and commercial parts of Fort Myers Beach) where allowed. Previous versions had varied bans from 300 to 1,000 feet off shore.

A difference in views became apparent during the hearing between commissioners Bill Fussell and Ray Judah. Fussell said he wanted Jet Skis to be restricted to only being rented out of commercial marinas. Judah said he opposed that idea because it would put the Jet Skis in the back bays which were the most sensitive

environmentally.

Roaming vendors from boats and parasail operations not tied to an assigned beach corridor at Fort Myers Beach would also be eliminated. This caused Judah to comment that he had met with the parasail operator who works off of Captiva and found him to be a responsible person. Judah wondered if a way could not be found to allow him to continue his operation.

A representative of Holiday Water Sports, which operates out of South Seas Plantation, had earlier objected to that particular parasail operation because it takes customers off of private property, the beach at South Seas Plantation.

County staff also objected to looking for a way to include one operator, saying the commissioners should remember that the law they enact will set a precedent which will be looked at by governments along the entire east coast of the United States.

Commissioner John Manning told the staff he wanted a final version of the proposed law prepared as soon as possible and he wanted it to include limiting operations to designated areas, limiting each rental operation to no more than six boats, having each operation submit safety plans to the county and eventually having each operation tied to a land-based permit.

A few residents and industry representatives testified both for and against Jet Skis at the hearing.


Perhaps the most colorful testimony came from Captivan Joe Baer, who called the machines "instruments of the devil" and asserted that it was either Jet Skis or Captiva, "The two cannot co-exist without the loss of the serenity of our little island."

The staff promised to have a final version of the proposed ordinance ready in six to eight weeks. Two more public hearings before the full Lee County Commission will have to be held before the proposed ordinance could become law.

The proposal would not affect Sanibel, which as an incorporated city makes its own laws regarding water craft in island waters.

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
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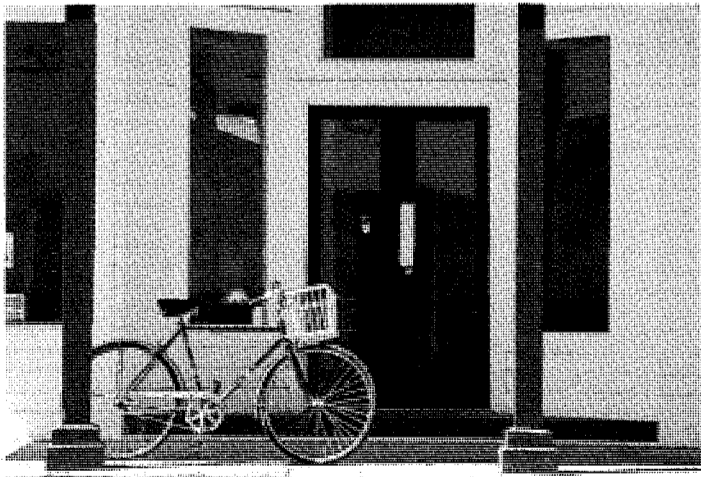
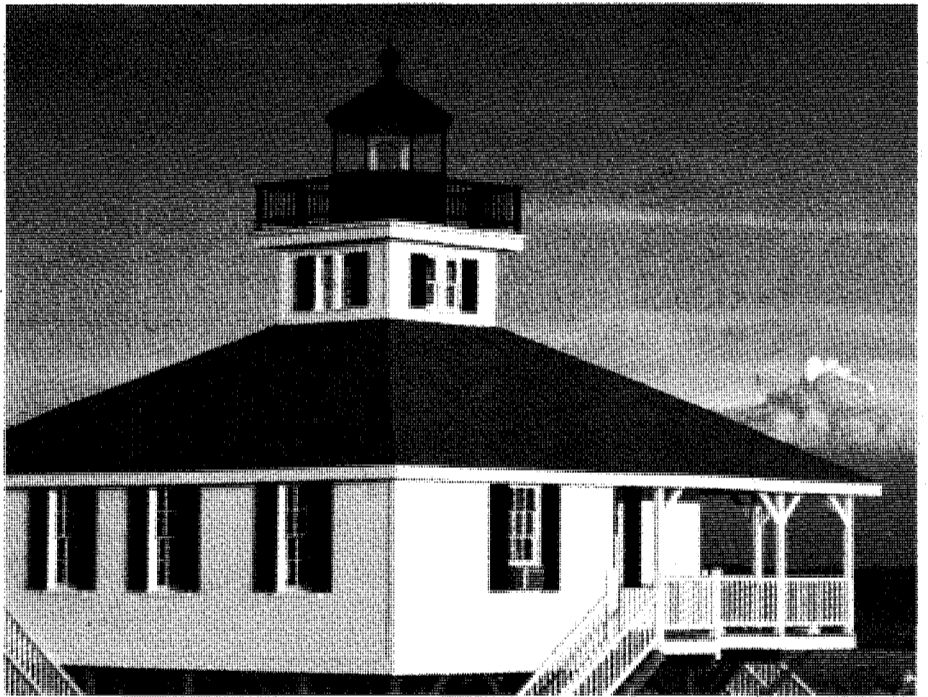

Alligators

Feeding alligators anywhere is not only **ILLEGAL**, it also is extremely **DANGEROUS**. An alligator that is accustomed to being fed will become a dangerous animal if left unfed for a period of time. Animals that are not artificially fed are less likely to become problems. A "tame" alligator becomes bold; he loses his fear of man. Then he has difficulty distinguishing between a fish and the hand that holds it. Because of the alligator population here, dogs should never be allowed to run on the islands. Fence your dog or walk him on a leash. **NEVER** tie your dog in an unfenced back yard. For help with a nuisance alligator, call the Sanibel Police Department, 472-3111. The dispatcher will contact the state.

On Sanibel UNRESTRICTED PARKING WITH NO STICKER is permitted for everyone along the causeway, at the Sanibel Lighthouse and Fishing Pier at the eastern tip of the island, at Gulfside City Park off Casa Ybel Road, on the east side of the Sanibel end of the causeway, at the gulf end of Tarpon Bay Road and at the Trost property on Tarpon Bay Road. Off-islanders with **RESTRICTED PARKING STICKERS** can find beach access at Bailey Road, Beach Road, Dixie Beach Boulevard, Nerita Street, Donax Street, Fulger Street and on the Sanibel side of Turner Beach. Island residents with **RESIDENTIAL PARKING STICKERS** can park on West Gulf Drive west of Rabbit Road, the bay and gulf sides of Buttonwood Lane, the bay and gulf sides of Seagrape Lane, Colony Walkway, Bay Drive and on Henderson Road at Castaways Lane.
