# Public comment period opens on Blind Pass dredging

From the Captiva Property Owners and Bayous Preservation Associations

Lee County submitted a permit application to dredge Blind Pass and place the beach compatible material on Sanibel and Captiva shorelines. The Florida DEP responded to the application with their questions, which will be answered in early August so the permitting process can move forward.

A Notice of Application for an Environmental Resource Permit for the maintenance dredging of Blind Pass will be published the week of July 17, possibly as early as Monday, July 17. The public has 14 days from the date of publication of this notice to comment.

Please send a letter supporting the project to the DEP: they will be counting letters. Encourage your Sanibel and Captiva neighbors and friends — anyone living in the project area — to write a letter.

- 1. Your letter can be short.

b. That you live in the project area

- c That you support the project (the re-opening of Blind Pass) and urge them to move forward with it.
- d. Voice the urgency of their approving this project without unnecessary delays so the sand bypassing project at Blind Pass can begin, as scheduled, in January of 2007.
- e. After your signature, include your name, Sanibel or Captiva address, and phone number.



# Sanibel mayor leads opposition voiced at Lake O workshop

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers last week presented its "Tentatively Selected Plan" for public comment at a series of three meetings, the second of which took place in downtown Fort Myers on July 12 with about 175 people in attendance.

If the Corps wanted public comment on its proposed new plan, that's what it got — and all of it was negative.

After a slide presentation consisting of complicated flow charts and graphs, Dennis Duke, deputy district engineer for the Corps' South Florida Restoration Project, stood for more than three hours, listening to area elected officials, representatives of various agencies, and citizens tell him why the new plan was unacceptable.

He said the new plan, which caps the level the lake can reach at 17.25 feet, would have kept the lake 1.5 feet to 2 feet lower during last year's rainy season, with far fewer releases of polluted Lake Okeechobee water into estuaries.

The Army's plan is based on studies using the years 1965 through 2000 — a fact for which the Army was much criticized during the public comment period.

Duke got an earful.

Sanibel Mayor Carla Johnston told him the Army's tentative new plan fails to meet even its own goals and objectives. She said it would "send more dirty, nutrient-laden water down the Caloosahatchee River than the biologists say is acceptable, and more than is happening now.

"How can you say that's an improvement?" Johnston

"This is not the plan that does the best for the estuaries," Johnston continued. "You say your objective is to reduce the releases. It's not doing it."

Johnston asked Duke how he could present the proposed

new plan "with a straight face."

She outlined what the city of Sanibel wants from the Army Corps with regard to the water releases and said any

new schedule must:
• send less water to the estuary, not more;

 allow discretion in the Corps' decision-making to prohibit releases in excess of biologists' acceptable levels;

be based on current data;

· recognize estuary damage;

 incorporate added water outlets for emergency storage, such as land the South Florida Water Management District owns or leases; and

 incorporate a year-round management technique with multi-directional water releases, to the south, east and west.

"Maybe engineers don't care about sea grasses as much as environmentalists," Johnston said, but she told Duke the loss of the sea grasses "means the fish don't spawn. And if the fish don't spawn, the birds don't have anything to eat. And if the birds don't have anything to eat, the tourists don't have anything to see. And if the tourists don't have anything to see, the real estate brokers don't have any customers.

"So it all comes down to the economy of the whole area," Johnston explained.

Johnston said she believes it's possible to solve this problem but accused the Corps of having "either tunnel vision or just plain acceptance of mediocrity rather than interest in helping both the inland community and the coastal stakeholders solve this problem.

"I'm not sure whether you're listening to these comments," Johnston said. "I rather think that you're enduring the evening, and I can tell by the smile on your face that's true," Johnston told Duke. "You're just waiting for this [meeting] to get over. It's another charade, you'll have the records, you'll have the tapes, and you'll pay no attention. Well, I hope you'll pay attention.

"Is the Corps at the local level just a welfare program for engineers?" Johnston asked.

"Do something. Surprise us."

But she did not sound hopeful.

"There's no point in destroying Southwest Florida, and that's what I see you doing."

The next public regional meetings will be held in September during a 45-day comment period.

The Army is planning to put the new release schedule into effect beginning in January 2007.

Opposition to Army plan universal

Representatives from all interests expressed their disagreement with the Army Corps' proposal. In addition to local elected officials, there were people from the boating, tourism, and hotel industries; as well as representatives of environmental groups and government agencies. All speakers said the same thing: send the excess water south, the way


nature intended.

Currently, about 20 percent of Lake Okeechobee's polluted fresh water is sent to the south, according to Duke. About 50 percent is sent west down the Caloosahatchee, and 30 percent goes east down the St. Lucie River.

Mother Nature, on the other hand, sent almost 100 percent of the lake's excess water to the south toward the Everglades.





# Red tide

Red Tide conditions as of July 14, 2006

This summary report of current red tide conditions around Florida includes a map of sampling results and regional status reports. Reports are generally updated on Friday afternoon. Additional information, if available, is provided on Tuesday afternoon.

Regional Red Tide summaries

East Region: No Event.

Northwest Region: Water samples collected this week in upper Perdido Bay of Escambia County contained no Karenia brevis. Additional samples, collected last week in St. Joseph Bay (Gulf County) also contained no K. brevis. Check with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Division of Aquaculture for the most up-to-date information regarding shellfish area closures.

Southwest Region:

A bloom of the Florida red tide organism, Karenia brevis, continues to impact the southwest coast from Boca Grande Pass (Lee County) to Seagate (Collier County) with highest concentrations detected in southern Pine Island Sound and San Carlos Bay. Alongshore samples collected in Collier County contained K. brevis concentrations ranging from low to medium between Lely Barefoot Beach and Seagate as well as medium concentrations offshore of Wiggins Pass. Additional offshore samples detected background concentrations as far south as Marco Island. Multiple fish kill reports have been received from Lee and Collier counties.

Mororists coming over the Causeway this past weekend couldn't miss the dead goliath grouper in the cove on the bay side, just beyond the drawbridge span.



Brodie Burns studies the goliath grouper, a probable Red Tide victim.




This Goliath Grouper is presented to you as a gift from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the South Florida Water Management District.

This fish was found Saturday morning July 15, at the west side of the Sanibel Causeway beaches. Goliath grouper are totally protected from harvest in Florida waters and have a normal lifespan of 30-50 years.

Apparently that protection does not apply to our water management officials.

This grouper is one of the tragic legacies of these managers, paid by our tax dollars, yet whose decisions are killing our estuaries. One can see and smell the death all over our beaches.

Manage the water low! It would be far better to risk a sugar cane drought than the death and destruction of our estuaries and wildlife from excess fresh water releases.

# **Diamonds and CROW**

When thinking of CROW, people don't generally think of diamonds and jewels at the same time. But during the last few months, customers entering Friday's, the Sanibel Diamond store, became immediately aware of CROW. Phyllis Starks — who has been with the store for ten years — and her colleagues wanted to do something special during their recently ended big sale.

"We're planning on bringing in some new, exciting items in the fall, so to make room, we had a liquidation sale and asked customers to help CROW, which we feel is a crown jewel here on the island," said Phyllis.

Below are the some of the public comments from the Army Corps' July 12 workshop. They all have one thing in common: they don't like the Army's "Tentatively Selected Plan."

Rob Jess, Manager, J.N. "Ding' Darling National Wildlife Refuge

"I work for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Department of the Interior. My responsibility is to protect the refuge, and it's very, very difficult for me to be a federal employee right now," Jess said.
"I went through your milestone schedule

and the various graphs, and my gosh, it's complicated."

He said he thinks the Army Corps of Engineers and the South Florida Water Management District have "painted themselves into a corner.

"I'm not sure who we could blame as to who put you all there, but the fact is that you're there, and you have to make difficult decisions," Jess said.

"I think there's something all of us as federal employees have lost, and there should be a mandatory course for this: Common Sense 101. We're losing it. We're losing common sense. The policies are restricting us. I've spent four-and-a-half years dealing with this issue and I just see us getting further and further away from the common-sense approach.

"We're sacrificing another estuary, our estuary here on the West Coast, and it just doesn't make sense to me," Jess said.

'On the surface, it seems there's very little I can do to get you guys to stop what you're doing.

Jess said many biologists, including some at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, are assessing the waters around Sanibel and all are coming up with very clear evidence that the negative impacts Sanibel is experiare coming down Caloosahatchee from Lake Okeechobee.

"They are detrimental, they are longterm. We are at the point where we may not be able to recover," Jess emphasized.
"The seagrasses are critical for us. We

are a marine refuge. We are in serious trouble, and it's difficult to sit here and take one slap in the face and then take another slap as these things go on. We're going to lose what we have, and it may be crying Chicken Little, but I highly doubt it because the science is there.

Jess raised some laughter from those attending when he said he'd tried to read the Army Corps' recent Environmental Impact Statement and even tried to print it — he said he blew out a printer because it was so

The thing is thick, and it's hard to understand. Even for a scientist, it's difficult to understand

The 2,825 acres of wilderness area within 6,400-acre "Ding" Darling once was 90 percent coverage with sea grasses, but no longer.

"We worked very hard to get it to that [90] percent] point. And it doesn't hardly exist anymore," Jess said. "We are getting excellent at growing algae on the refuge, and it's unfortunate.'

Jess called for Stormwater Treatment Areas on the West Coast like those on the East Coast.

"Why can't that happen?" he asked.

He also charged the Army Corps with using an "ace in the hole" by claiming public safety was at stake because of the weakened state of the Herbert Hoover Dam surrounding Lake Okeechobee. The Army, which once denied the reports of problems with the dam, now is claiming there is a 10 percent to 15 percent chance of failure if the lake reaches 18 feet.

"I'll have you know as a public citizen, when you raise that [public safety] card, that's the ultimate card, that's your ace. When you raise that, you're really up against the wall, and I suspect that's what's

appeared to be the general feeling in the room when she said, "Stop messing with Mother Nature. She really knows best. Mimic her systems. Do whatever you have to do to send the water south."

"You and the Army Corps are the only ones who believe your plan is going to work," Dennis Boback, mayor of Fort Myers Beach, said to a huge round of applause.

After one speaker said she was speaking on her own behalf and not that of the agency she represented, Duke muttered he wished he could do the same.

Sanibel Island icon Sam Bailey spoke emotionally about the island he and his family have called home for more than 100

"It's vital to us citizens, not just the tourist trade but the people who live there. There's too much contaminated water coming down the Caloosahatchee River and hit-

ting Sanibel Island head on," Bailey said.
"Water is our most important thing. We're surrounded by water. Basically it's our livelihood -- but it's also our home. We're getting more than our share pouring right into our bays, our island, our Gulf, and it's destroying us.

"We've got something worthwhile, but if you take the water away from us, you're destroying us.

"The government has got to get behind us and save the water around Sanibel Island.'

Army to come back to public in fall

Duke said the Corps of Engineers will be back before the public for comments on its Tentatively Selected Plan in September with regional public meetings to take place during a 45-day comment period.

ments are taken seriously to provide balance for flood control, water supply, and environmental restoration.

going on. But if [the dam] is that bad and I were in your shoes, I'd be moving people. Taking a 10 to 15 percent chance that there are people [living south of the lake] who potentially could be killed, that's 10 to 15 percent too high.

"If we're in that much danger up in the central area below Big O, I think action ought to be taken to protect those individuals," Jess said to more applause. "We ought to be buying that area out.'

In fact, he said, "remove the dam, remove the people, and let the Everglades go back to the way it used to be.

When the applause died down, Jess invited the Army Corps' members present to visit the refuge and see the devastation.

Lee County Commissioner Ray Judah Judah called Dennis Duke a "man of integrity" and complimented him for the public workshop. As far as the plan Duke presented, though, Judah said it's not balanced, and he's not surprised.

"People have been asking who should be held accountable and, unfortunately, one would hope it could be the Corps of Engineers," Judah said. "I hope these c

spends about \$24 million in an election cycle, donating to campaigns at the state and federal levels. Given that fact, he said, "it's not a surprise you have a plan that's not balanced.'

Judah said he had hoped that with the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Project, there finally would be an understanding that the Corps' work back in the late 1940s had caused tremendous devastation economically and environmentally to the state of Florida. He said there was hope throughout the state that the Army Corps' new study perhaps could reverse the destruction to the Everglades, Florida Bay, the Florida Keys, and to its estuaries.

"Unfortunately, now we seem to be in a quagmire here because we're not taking into account environmental restoration," Judah told Duke.



# Law elected president of BOAF

R. Harold Law, Jr., Sanibel's Chief Building Official, has been elected President by the members of the Building Officials Association of Florida (BOAF), which had its beginning in 1953.

The BOAF is recognized as a professional, non-profit, statewide volunteer organization comprised of Code Officials and industry representatives from almost every jurisdiction in Florida. The threefold mission of the BOAF is to provide for the safety, health and welfare of Florida citizens through education, development, maintenance and enforcement of building codes. Since 1979 Law has been a chief building official in various states including Tennessee and Texas and a strong proponent of adherence to the mandatory state laws and building codes. While Law was serving as chief building official for St. Johns County, Florida, prior to his acceptance of that same position in Sanibel in 2003, he had to convince his wife of the advantages of this change in location. The best strategy was to select a very cold February day to pop the "moving" question. She asked if it was



warm in Sanibel and Law unhesitatingly replied, "Absolutely." That was it. Law accepted the Sanibel position and his wife is convinced that he was right.

"I didn't have to come to Sanibel and fix things. This was a functioning building department," points out Law. The size of the department, with its seven staff members, is the proper legal size for this municipality and the people in the community understand that building codes protect people and their homes.

"We are here to meet the building codes and explain how people can build or rebuild their home without scheduling problems.' Law elaborates, "The greatest challenge is making sure that everyone understands the code and that the requirements are clear before the job ever gets started. I like to be sure that the builders know as much as I do about their projects and code related issues.'

Right now Law's new thrust as BOAF president is to provide an increasing number of educational seminars for its seventeen local chapters. He explains that the BOAF has been licensed and approved by the State of Florida to offer these C.E.U. (Continuing Education Units). BOAF has been contracted by the state to set up these programs for the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for contractors, building inspectors and officials throughout Florida. One of the real advantages is that BOAF will be able to go to some of the more outlying areas and regions in Florida where these seminars will be offered for the first time this year. All of this came into being when BOAF was named the sole producer for technical assistance to the Department of Community Affairs

With its growing reputation in the fostering of service-based education, Law as president of the BOAC has been working to set up a state-approved program to take an existing inspector and to cross train that person to become qualified in more than one discipline. In other words with this program an inspector can become qualified and tested in dual or multiple fields.

In Sanibel we have the good fortune of having multi-disciplined inspectors who can inspect the complete job, versus only parts of the job, thereby reducing our personnel requirements. With our eye toward the future we are now taking advantage of the program to enhance our ability to become more cost effective and time efficient in this area," explains Law.

Education is his main concern and that's where he wants BOAF to excel. Some time in the future, Law envisions a permanent academy possibly based on the model of the fire academy. This is the kind of futuristic and forward moving thinking that puts Law out front and makes him a leader in his field.

During Law's three years as director of the City of Sanibel Building Department he has created the Contractors Review Board and the Structural Safety Inspector's Volunteer Group. He has also worked closely with FEMA to maintain the City's Community Rating System of "5," resulting in flood insurance discounts for the entire



Judah said the major problem has to do with storage. He told Duke that if the Corps' primary mission is public safety, it's a great expense not only to the environment but to the economic health and well-being of all of South Florida,

"I don't believe you have to necessarily choose one over the other," Judah said. He said nobody wants to see the Glades communities with its 40,000 people flooded.

Judah said using a flow way from Lake Okeechobee to the south is not unprecedented.

"The Everglades Forever Act called for 100,00 acres to. be set aside for storage. The sugar industry was able to get that whittled down to 50,000 acres today," Judah said.

"You say [your proposed new plan] will improve flows to the estuary. It will not. It will cause more catastrophic harm to the estuaries. You're going to exceed greatly the

2,800 cubic-feet-per-second maximum flows. 'While you're well intentioned, Lee County, Sanibel, and any other community that ultimately stands to be impacted by the disastrous proposal you presented to us tonight has no other recourse but to proceed legally," Judah

Currently, according to Hecker, the level of Lake Okeechobee can go up faster than the Army Corps can lower it - and the lake, river and estuary all are "collapsing under the pollution.'

Mike Valiquette, Chairman, People United to Restore our Rivers and Estuaries (PURRE); Vicechairman, Sanibel Planning Commission

Valiquette said that, although he reads the types of charts the Army used in its presentation every day, he only understood some of what it presented to the public July 12.

'I don't think most of these people can understand half of what was on those graphs, and all those letters and acronyms," he said. "If you're going to go to the public for comment, you have to speak clearly to people so they can understand. There are 50 acronyms, and nobody knows what they mean but you guys.'



# New Mound House underground museum to showcase Calusa history

Construction is currently underway at the Mound House on Fort Myers Beach on a new project which, when complete, will give visitors a unique view into the past and an up-close look at a 2000-year-old Calusa shell mound.

Mound House Director Theresa Schober said the project should be completed this year, "which entails the creation of the room and the completion of the archaeology."

Schober said workers excavated the swimming pool adjacent to the main house on the Connecticut Street property carlier this year; they are now waiting for an archaeology study to be completed before creating an underground museum.

We received a grant from the state to remove the swimming pool, excavate down underneath and create enough vertical space for a room inside the mound," Schober said. "The pool is gone - it's been removed and we're in the process right now of doing the archaeological excavation."

Schober said the new museum will eventually become a part of three areas of interest on the property.

Primary space

The goal is to create the primary archaeological space in this underground room," Schober said. The Mound House itself then "becomes the primary historical exhibit and the grounds become the primary environmental exhibit space, so there are at least three components of different types of interest that people might have.'

Schober said the town was awarded a grant for \$270,000, which will cover preliminary work scheduled to be completed this year. But more money will be needed before the exhibit will be ready for the public to actually view it, she said.

"I just submitted to the state in June another \$350,000 grant to fund the actual exhibit," Schober said. "The earliest we'll have funds will be in July of next year.'

Schober added she hopes to have the project completely

Once the exhibit is complete, visitors will be able to see how the mound was constructed by literally walking into the mound. Once inside, they will able to view, through glass, the actual interior "walls" of the mound.

Entry will be through a doorway at the back of the mound.

"You'll come inside a room," Schober said. "When you enter as a group the lights will go out and an audio tape will lead you through, with spotlighting effects, what it is you are seeing in the mound walls.

'We'll use lighting to spotlight fire pits [and] different layers to show how the mound was constructed...

"We've found some shell tool manufacturing areas where they're using shells to make shell tools," Schober said. "Where we find those kinds of things in the wall we're going to create little platforms so that there will be actual artifacts in place that people will be able to see, with the audio tape describing what it is that those things mean, and how they help us interpret behavior."

Exact details of what visitors will see in the exhibit won't be certain until the project is finished, Schober said.

"We're not going to know what people will see until we've completed the excavation," Schober said.

The archaeological aspect of the project will catalog what archaeologists find during the excavation to preserve those details for history, Schober said.

As archaeologists excavate, they inevitably destroy the area of excavation. "The mound where we're digging is going away," Schober said, "so we use our methodology to record exactly what it is that we're taking out.

"That's what's called a 'mitigation project,' mitigating the impact of what you're doing and [also] doing an extensive degree of recording of what was there as you remove it."

Though there are considerable variations of opinions among archaeologists as to why the Calusa built mounds, Schober said, she believes it was more symbolic than out of a need to be high and dry on a barrier island.

"Actually, mound building, as a phenomenon, [takes place] in Florida and it also happens in Mississippi and Ohio and all the way to the Mississippi River... [It] hits all of eastern North America at roughly the same time," Schober said. "Height and authority are connected."

Schober said there are significant similarities in our current culture with height preference and the Calusa mounds that date back to 50 B.C. to A.D.100.

"Even in our own modern world, the most expensive room in a high-rise hotel is the room at the top or if you go into any



courthouse or a council chamber the people who are making the decisions are elevated," Schober said. "When you go into a church, the people who are leading the ceremony are up on platforms. There is a strong connection in that regard.'

# Holistic Health Notebook: Cleaning out the cellular debris





# How I discovered archaeology or walks with my old man

Just about everyone interested in archaeology has stumbled into it in his or her own way. Sometimes it starts with the finding of an intriguing artifact or the visit to a museum. Maybe a TV special or even seeing "Indiana Jones" is responsible.


My interest began when I was three years old and my father gave me a milk-bottle shaped stone plummet he found in Goodland in the late 1940s. My father recalled going to Goodland Point in 1948 in a small army-surplus dump truck and shoveling by hand in midden shell, which was then used as the material of choice for road underlayment. He recalled the mosquitoes being so numerous and fierce that he could only work at 10-15 minute intervals and then had to sit in the cab of the truck for five minutes to allow them to disperse somewhat so he could go back to shoveling shell. During that time he found the plummet, and it was so different he kept it.

My father would frequently take me on walks around our twenty acres, starting from the time I was a baby and needed to be carried most of the way on his shoulders. We would sing songs like "Hello, Joe, What do you know? Just got back from a Rodeo, Saw a dance, took a Chance. Well, I don't know, Hello Joe." These were old vaude-ville songs my father learned by sneaking into shows where kids generally weren't invited.

The more I could walk, the longer the trips became. We picked huckleberries, noted unusual wildlife, felt the sun, wind, and sometimes the rain. When I was five, my mother gently suggested my father take me even further afield, "so I could learn something." My father had heard about an old shell mound on a backbay near Doctor's Pass, so one day we went walking in that direction to see if we could find it. My father carried a shovel, but he always did on these walks, as you could investigate something from a safe distance with it... kill a rattlesnake, or — once or twice — help dig out some car whose driver had got it stuck in the sugar sand trails.

We walked west maybe a half-mile, a long way for me. Through sand pine and oak scrub, then into climax slash pine flat-woods with a dense understory of saw palmettos. We were traveling an old rutted woods road heading toward the distant dark green wall of mangroves fronting Inner Doctor's Pass. I remember a large indigo snake crawled across the trail in front of us, and for a very brief moment it spanned the road continuously!

Finally we came out in a bare clearing at the interface of the uplands with the mangroves. Dead snags from salt-blasted buttonwood and black mangrove stuck up in strange shapes like a Zen garden. I would learn this was a saltern or salina area, where periodic high tides had deposited so much salt glittering on the gray muck that only



cord grasses and black rush would grow.

The old trail became a corduroy road through the mangroves. Large potholes and ruts filled with brown tannin-stained water smelling of rotten eggs straddled gaps in the cut logs. There were signs people had gotten stuck in here not too long ago — not a good place to bring even a four-wheel drive vehicle. The tide was out, otherwise we would have waded in up to our ankles or deeper.

Up ahead, through the mangroves we could see higher ground, and I felt for the very first time the feeling of awe and mystery coming on to a place where humans had lived one thousand years or more ago. There were shell mounds, partially dug away, rising on all sides, covered in a dense coppiced growth of stoppers or Eugenias (as I would later learn). Large gumbo-limbos, silverbarked mastics and jamaica dogwoods towered above the other luxuriant hammock plants. A skunky smell — acrid, but not unpleasant — filled the air, and I would later find out this smell came from a plant, the white stoppers.

We crossed the site and stood looking out on a narrow channel, a winding stream cutting through the tall, surrounding mangroves. We would later find this channel connected Inner and Outer Doctor's Bay, and had quite a volume of water moving through when the tide was running. I would later fish there and hear about the skeleton of a fellow, missing five years, that had been found not too far away.

It was evident even from this first visit that much of the site had been dug away years ago for road fill. My father took his shovel and scratched around a bit, showing me several sherds of pottery, one or two of which had ticking or incised decorations. The intensely rich black dirt they came from had a rich, sweet, decadent smell like no other I ever smelled. Nothing smells like a South Florida "black dirt" midden, a smell I will forever remember from that first time.

We didn't stay long, and I took a half-dozen of the most interesting sherds back with me. I showed my mother and told her how excited I was by what I had seen on that trip. For quite a while the sherds still smelled of the mysterious midden in which they had lain centuries before Columbus. I will always remember that time, with my father, and how I stumbled across archaeology.



# Johnson is Leaving performed at the library

Sanibel was treated to a bit of English theater this week as Bruce Purchase presented his one-man show, Johnson is Leaving at the Sanibel Library on Tuesday evening, July 18.

The show focuses on the declining health and last days of 75-year-old Dr. Samuel Johnson, an 18th-century wordsmith who composed a dictionary long before the word Webster became a known name. More specifically, Johnson is reflecting upon his life, its triumphs and tragedies and his relationships with various family members and friends throughout his years on Earth.

Written for Purchase by playwright John Wain, the 80-minute monologue weaves humor, insight, spirituality, lament and more into a spellbinding offering.

Purchase's performance is hypnotic and makes one believe he is in the room with Johnson as he remembers his childhood, career, time spent in debtors prison and accolades bestowed upon him by the King of England.

The relationships between fathers and sons, men and women, Johnson and his younger brother Nathaniel, Johnson and his mother and more are flawlessly performed as Purchase deftly slips from one character to another, holding full conversations with himself but never leaving it unclear as to who is saying what.

In a post-performance interview, Purchase, 67, said he has been doing the dramatic piece for three years, giving more than 150 performance in that time. He said most of those have been in England for audiences ranging from 100 to several hundred. He said giving the presentation to the small group in the intimate setting of the library's meeting room was a rare treat.

Purchase said he is visiting Sanibel for only a few days and Tuesday's performance was a one-time event.


# Welcome to Betsy's Necessities

A captivating sign on the side of the building invites you into betsy's necessities, a unique boutique in The Village on Periwinkle Way. The shop (in Seaweed Gallery's former location) — with its freshly painted white walls, spiraling staircase and high beamed ceiling — creates a soothing background that accents the one-of-a-kind pieces that Tibetan artisans of India have spent a lifetime perfecting. A feeling of warmth, shopping comfort and being able to browse without pressure is what owner Betsy Rottman wants to create. "The focus is on the exquisite items in the boutique," Rottman notes, "all of which feature blue lapis, coral, turquoise and/or cockleshells and intricate hand stitching and beading."

A collection of decorative boxes may catches your fancy first. You can almost visualize the artists spending endless hours creating the design then hand stitching the beads onto the boxes with inserts of lapis, coral or cockleshells. The boxes come in all different shapes and sizes — let your own sensibilities tell you whether you want to use them solely as decorative pieces or in some more practical way. Equally dramatic are the Tibetan tapestries/wall hangings in lapis, coral and turquoise sewn with the same intricate hand beading but including an eye-catching center medallion or equally intriguing arrangement of tiny shells.

Another display is a bevy of unique purses that range from hand/wrist bags to shoulder strap bags, makeup cases, evening bags, passport travel bags/wallets. Some have beaded or wooden handles and feature the blue lapis/coral/turquoise subtly combined with seed pearls and beads and sea glass in exquisite and subtle touches. Belts with unusual designs, some adjustable and others in varying sizes and widths, are again one of a kind, handmade by the Tibetans and reflecting the same quality of craftsmanship







store" to a permanent location where she could a)






about and appreciate what she has to offer.





Above:, "In the Sacred City" Mixed Media by Bea Pappas; Left: "Heron in Flight" Acrylic by G. Knight




# Local Zonta members in Melbourne






# Rotary on the move

I was thrilled to be in the fortunate position of reviewing Broadway Palm Dinner Theatre's production of my very favoritestever musical, The Sound of Music, which runs through August 12: Executive Producer Will Prather and Director Marie Jagger-Taylor have assembled what has to be the finest ensemble of vocal talent available in regional (or wider) theater today. Some faces (and voices) are familiar to Broadway Palm audiences; most are not.

The irrepressible Beth Brandel (Sister Margaretta) has been waiting and hoping she'd one day play this part... ever since she first played Gretl 25 years ago! Beth, the "Day by Day" gal in the recent production of Godspell, is one of those performers who "bubbles" with the joy of being alive and being on stage and, in the role of Sister Margaretta, obviously loves and admires the free spirit that the postulant Maria brings to Noonburg Abbey. Sister Berthe (Amber Carson), on the other hand, shows just the right amount of disapproval... albeit perceived as humorous by the audience. Carson has been singing "all her life" and made her Broadway Palm debut Godspell.

Elisabeth Kisselstein is a Syracuse, N.Y. native, a long-time professional singer and, in Sound of Music, makes her Broadway Palm debut in one of her favorite roles, The Mother Abbess — "Reverend Mother" to

This show, a reprisal of the original Broadway production, expands the Rev. Mother's character a bit beyond that of the beloved movie. For example, she's overheard Maria singing bits and pieces of "My Favorite Things" as she (Maria) goes about her daily chores. It is a song the Mother Abbess herself used to sing as a girl and she asks Maria to sing it so she can get the words down. Of course, the two of them then finish it out together in a well-blended duet. I found Kisselstein's rendition of the amazing "Climb Ev'ry Mountain" breath-

Heather Beirne (Maria) makes her debut at Broadway Palm after a run at the Prathers' Golden Apple Theater as Belle in Beauty and the Beast. She has a big, glorious voice with fabulous enunciation that could fill Carnegie Hall in a heartbeat almost too big for this venue.

Tara Marlena Laberge makes the Countess, Elsa, the almost-stepmother, as believable as the character ever is. The role is written in such a way that, regardless of the performer, it is hard to like her. She's a snob, she's an already-rich gold-digger, she's just not someone one would want to hang out with (much less bring into a houseful of seven children as their new mother!).

Paul Gregory Nelson (Captain Von Trapp) is a familiar performer as well as director at the Broadway Palm; he has been a part of many shows over the theater's 13year history. Tall and elegant, with a fine voice, he is quite believable as the loyal Austrian naval officer whose whole concept of family was annihilated when the children's mother died. His "warming up" to Maria was very perceptively rendered.

Liesl, lovely Liesl, was perfectly cast in Holly Williams, a Jacksonville native who makes her debut on the Broadway Palm stage in this production. She has the "perfect" face an ingenue is "supposed" to have and a delightful singing voice.

The kids were marvelous. The performance I saw featured Jeremy Miller as Friedrich (superb as the voice-starting-tochange 14-year-old Friedrich), Lindsay Lam as the trickster Louisa, Kevin Hein as Mr. Mischief Kurt, Megan Carrasquillo as the practical and down-to-earth Brigitta, Danielle Taylor as Marta and Jessica Kieffer as cute little Gretl. All local, these young performers were thoughtfully cast and did a

There were a few timing issues the night I went early in the run that may well have been ironed out by this time. Lovely though it was, we had the impression that "Sixteen Going on Seventeen" seemed rushed.

Or, when Maria returned to the Von Trapp home and added her voice to those of the children who, with Liesl's guidance are trying to feel better by singing "My Favorite Things," it's too early in the song. And Maria's volume needed to be brought up

slowly, as if from a distance.

Another, near the end, was when the family has sung in the contest and left the stage to make their run for the border. Max (Paul Bernier, in a superb depiction of this character part) returned to the stage to get the vote tally from the judges way too soon and then — instead of delaying by some means the announcement of the winners long enough for the family to have even gotten off the premises — immediately read off their names.

Another small item in a similar category (improves as a run continues) was the rhythm of the "business" in "So long, Farewell." The singing was, as expected, delightful; the choreography was not as polished the night I saw the production as it might have been ...but practice, I'm sure, has made perfect.

The Sound of Music is wonderful family entertainment with performances Wednesday through Sunday at 8 p.m. fol-

lowing a fabulous buffet dinner that starts at 6. On Friday, August 4, at 10:30 p.m., you'll have the chance to sing along with the cast at a special Sound of Music Sing-Along. Lyrics will be projected on a big screen (just in case you can't remember all those words you've been singing for over 40 years) and patrons are urged to boo the Nazis, hiss at Fraulein Schraeder and yell Hurray! for Maria. For this "performance" Sound of Music attire is certainly suggested, but not required. There will be no buffet, but the bar will be open.

Tickets for the regular shows range from \$25 to \$48; children 15 and under are only \$15 for dinner and the show. For the Sing-Along, tickets are \$25 in advance and \$30 on the day of the show. 



"Our float was well received. People loved the flying alligator. I hope the community will support the silent auction which in the end will benefit the island," said Charlie Frese, Tower president. Frese, accompanied by Tower artist Ralph Bigletti, drove the jeep.

Tower artists Marianne Ravenna and Connie Sebring, with friend Susan Pataky, rode the float with the critters. Ravenna manned a pressure washer that served as the

"The crowd had lots of enthusiasm. The children were very well behaved and polite. All the kids said thank you after receiving their paint box," said Lister.



**Barney Baller** 

### **Bernard Baller**

Beloved Sanibel watercolorist Barney Baller passed away on Saturday, July 1, 2006. He was 88. Born on Jan. 10, 1918 in New

York City to Anna and Max Baller, Barney lived in all of the several boroughs of New York City, graduating from George Washington High School, then New York University with a degree in business administration. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II, attaining the rank of Lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps. The Ballers lived in East Brunswick. N.J., on Farrington Lake and, for 36 years, Barney owned and operated the Fireside Restaurant/Crown Diner and Barnabee's Liquors.

In 1986 Barney and his wife, Helen, moved to Sanibel and became 20-year summer residents of East Orleans on Cape Cod where Barney was very active in the local art associations. He enjoyed sailing and canoeing in both New Jersey

and Cape Cod. Barney's passion from an early age was art and painting and he pursued them vigorously until shortly before his death. He was active in Kiwanis, BIG ARTS, the Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce and Florida Repertory Theatre. A member of the Sanibel-Captiva Art League and Naples Art Association, he participated annually in the outdoor arts and crafts shows held on Sanibel, in Naples and Cape Cod — a tremendously prolific watercolor artist. His -favorite subjects were children on the beach, seascapes and urban scenes, all of which have brought

joy to many people. "I've known Barney ever since he and Helen moved to the island." Sanybel's Finest owner and good friend Jack Elias said. "Soon after they arrived, he came in with sever--al watercolors and sketches. I really liked them and told him I would be delighted to show his work in our gallery. We sold dozens of them interally, just as fast as ne could produce them, they were out of here. He'd be in two or three times a week with them — he got such a thrill out of meeting some of his collectors when they were in here at the same time! We'd go for coffee and discuss 'the affairs of the world' - all those things that neither of us could do anything about, we played golf... we were good friends. And Barney had a great sense of humor — we used to call each other up every once in awhile

just to share the latest 'best joke' we'd heard!

"The day after 9/11 he came in with a truly luminous painting of the New York skyline with the World Trade Center intact and asked if I thought we could do something with it. I told him I thought we should sell it and send the proceeds to the City of New York. With the help of Bank of the Islands, we did and, because of a connection one of my employees had made flying back from vacation, we were able to route the proceeds directly to Mayor Guiliani's office. Barney was thrilled."

Barney continued to paint and produce pictures for Jack long after he became ill — during his last few years primarily animals and birds, some with inscriptions on them — and donated some of his recent works for auction to benefit Alvin A. Dubin Alzheimer's Association.

"He continued to be able to get the feeling, the character into his art, almost until his death" Elias commented sadly. "The colors and the spirit were still there...

"He was one of a kind, and I will really, really miss him — a great, great friend."

Barney's survivors include his loving wife, Helen; his two sons — Wayne, and his wife, Molly, of Dayton, Ohio and Clinton of Birmingham, Mich.; and four grandsons — Michael, Steven, David and Cameron. His son Roger preceded him in death.
