People told her that she had a special shell. Sabine had noticed the junonia at the Chamber visitor center and remembered the spots; her shell seemed to look like the junonias they could find in the shell books. However, after stopping by the *Islander* office (where we told her it was not a junonia but took her picture because it was an interesting shell), she and her dad found a shell just like it at She Sells Sea Shells, identified as a Babylonia. The *Islander* gave Ed Hanley of Neptune's Treasures a call to find out more: it's not a local shell, so it either traveled a long way or someone with a quirky sense of humor planted it. Mr. Hanley noted that Babylons are found in the Pacific and Indian Oceans. But any way that you look at it, it was a rare find for Sabine on Sanibel — she might be the only person ever to find a Babylon on a Sanibel beach.




The Sanibel-Captiva Lions Club has begun their annual Christmas tree sales at the corner of Periwinkle

Checking the trolley map will help you plan your evening so it (and you) will move smoothly.





Fifth graders honored by mayor

Mayor Carla Johnston met with Tylor Compton's 5th grade class at The Sanibel School to commend them for their environmentally conscious efforts to combat Sanibel's water issues. In addition, Johnston informed the class that they have been awarded a grant from the "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society to continue their experiments with mangroves

"You all know a whole lot more than a lot of adults do," Johnston said. "This is a thank you to all of you for coming and speaking up and being part of making a difference."

Compton's class questioned panelists at WGCU's Oct. "Water Woes" forum. In honor of their commitment to improving the quality of water on Sanibel, Johnston handdelivered letters and pins to the students last Wednesday.

While visiting Compton's classroom, Johnston explained


how the city has faced the water issues. "Any of you ever look at a puzzle and think, 'Wow. That's too complicated. We'll never be able to put it together.' That is a little like dealing with the water problem," Johnston said. "You have to figure a strategy like finding the corners or figuring out the color scheme. You put it together piece by piece by piece by piece.

Johnston explained that the city will soon know how their work has affected the decisions made by the Army Corps of Engineers. "We'll soon know whether we've made any progress on that one piece. Then there's a whole lot more pieces. I'm delighted that you came [to the forum] and tried to do that. I'm hoping that you decide you like solving puzzles and will be crazy enough to run for mayor."

When Johnston and Compton announced that the class had been awarded a grant from the "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society, the students cheered. "We are looking for chances to be helpful," Compton said.

The money from the grant will go towards equipment needed to work on their mangrove study. Their experiments include the effect of heat on growth, whether fresh or brackish water will produce more growth, the effect of the nutrient-rich releases from Lake Okeechobee, the effects of temperature on growth, and of water affects the growth of mangroves.

Compton complimented her students for their hard work and eagerness. She said, "I know your voices are powerful."



Holistic Health Notebook:

Living in harmony with gut critters

We seldom think of bacterium as friendly but we should. We cannot live without them. The good kind, of course. Those critters lurking on spinach leaves do us no good at all. Stay away from them. And while you're at it, feed the friendly guys inside your guy well, because if they are healthy and hungry, they keep the unfriendly guys at bay for you.

But we're getting ahead of our story. I've been talking recently about two medical/nutrition conferences I attended, and am providing you with the short version of what I learned. According to Dr. Nigel Plummer, approximately 100,000 billion (yes, with a B) viable bacteria make their home in our guts. Think you're clean? Approximately 1,000 billion bacteria live on your skin. Two hundred species of bacteria live in your mouth, and up to 500 species reside in your gut. Makes you not want to kiss anyone, doesn't it? As we age, however, the number of viable friendly bacteria diminishes, and the number of unculturable microflora raises to about 80%. In other words, about 80% of your friendly bacteria cannot reproduce.

Why is healthy bacteria so important? They are essential to the normal anatomical and physiological development of the intestinal mucus. They help facilitate cell development and turnover, and assist in the motility, secretions, and absorption of food in the small intestine. They are part of the body's immune system. They provide nonimmunological protection against infection, and stimulate the maturation and balance of the immune system from birth and throughout life. They function as part of the body's metabolic detoxification pathways. This last function is getting more important every year, as according to the National Research Council, there are over 100,000 chemicals in use in our environment, and 1,000 new

it's winter in the midwest and northeast

— but it's peak butterfly season on Sanibel. Gayle Edwards, a master gardener instructor, will be the guest speaker. She is regarded as a top authority on the butterflies of Southwest Florida. She founded and supervises the butterfly garden at the University of Florida Extension in Fort Myers. Gayle has a fascinating and colorful presentation of the many vibrant local butterflies. Her presentations at regional conferences are always a favorite.

She will show you the host and nectar plants that will bring butterflies to your garden in less than a week. These plants are available at the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation Native Plant Nursery on Sanibel.

Handouts will be provided. The lecture is free and open to the public. Seating is limited. Thursday, Dec. 7, 10 a.m. at the Sanibel Public Library on Dunlop Road. chemicals are introduced every year.

One of the most toxic elements in the environment is mercury. Methylmercury is particularly dangerous because it is rapidly and completely absorbed from the gut, has a long retention time in the body, and effectively penetrates the blood brain barrier where it targets and destroys neurological tissue.

The main route of excretion of mercury in man is via the colon. Here is really where the bacteria jump in and give us a hand. One of their main activities is binding heavy metals for enhanced excretion in the feces. However, antibiotic use leads to significant reduction in excretion of total mercury and lower amounts of mercury in the feces. The half-time elimination of mercury increases from a normal of ten days to over one hundred days after antibiotic treatment. Suppression of friendly bacteria by antibiotic use raised mercury concentration in all tissues, particularly in the brain.

Other enemies of friendly bacteria are chlorinated water, alcohol and sugar. Bad stuff. Kills them off.

What is good for the bacteria? A diet that is rich in many types of fiber, particularly vegetable fibers. Those fibers build a "nest" for the bacteria, and provides food for them.



I always recommend using a blend of friendly bacteria, combined with FOS (fructooligosaccarides) that provides a good meal and helps them implant in the gut. Who should use friendly bacteria on a regular basis? Anyone who uses antibiotics, drinks chlorinated water, eats sugar, has had any type of gut issues like diarrhea, or regularly eats processed foods. In other words, just about all of us.



Capt Dick's Recipes:

Pan fried grouper with almonds

Ingredients:

- 3 lbs. boneless, skinless grouper fillets (or snapper or orange roughy)
- 1/2 c. unpeeled slivered almonds
- 1/2 tsp. allspice
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1-1/2 tsp. paprika 1/4 c. olive oil
- 1/2 small bunch parsley, coarse stems removed
- Lemon wedges for garnish

How to:

Rinse the fillets and pat them dry with paper towels. Check the fish for bones and remove with tweezers, if necessary.

In a food processor, combine the almonds, allspice, salt, pepper, cayenne, cumin and paprika. Pulse until finely ground, but do not over process or the nuts can become oily.

In a shallow baking dish, spread out the nut/spice mix. Dredge the fillets in the mixture, one at a time, shaking off the excess.

In a large heavy skillet, heat the olive oil over medium-high heat. Fry

the fillets for about three minutes on each side, until light brown. With a slotted spatula, remove the fish to a warm platter or individual serving plates and scatter with parsley sprigs. serve with wedges of lemon.


Both artists hope that the viewer will better appreciate our island and region, perhaps seeing with enhanced vision.



Brodersen receives Award of Excellence in Digital Art

Local artist Pam Brodersen recently was honored with the Naples Art Association Award of Excellence in Digital Art at the 45th Founders Exhibition. Held at the von Liebig Art Center in Naples on Nov. 17, the event was one of the largest in the Art Center's history.

Brodersen described the award as an affirmation. She explained, "There's a very big stigma about digital art. By winning the award, that verifies the fact that people are accepting digital art as a fine art.

In the post modern world the question of what constitutes fine art is often clouded by technological advancements. "Part of the problem is they advertise point and shoot cameras--no brainer stuff. Then you put it in a computer program and make it a painting. You can do that, but that's not the kind of work I do. I think there are a lot of people who feel that that is what computer art is," Brodersen said.

Working with the computer fuels her creative energy so much so that she keeps an alarm clock in her studio that will notify her when it is time to eat. "The hours just fly by," she explained. "Often there's as much time spent in digital art as there is in other art because there are so many possibilities. Everything is the same in digital art. You're still working with color. You're still working with values. You're working with composition. You're working with emotions."

While the tools Brodersen uses to create her work make traditionalists uneasy, the skill she employs to construct her pieces is unquestionable. A professional photographer in Chicago, Ill. for 25 years, Brodersen's work stands out for her sensitive handling of light, color and movement.

She said, "As an artist, I'm totally involved in everything I do on the computer. Sure I use a computer because that is my media. The computer is a tool for the artist as a hammer and chisel are for a sculptor."

Curator for the von Liebig Art Center Jack O'Brien said, "She is at the forefront of photography. She started in traditional photography and moved completely into digital which is where everyone will end up, I predict. She has a tremendous use of colors.'

Starting in photography for advertising, Brodersen worked with a large format 8 by 10 camera. "I did what's called tabletop still-life. I worked for Kellogg and McDonalds and Sara Lee. I'm used to manipulating things around in front of the camera," she explained.

From her work in traditional photography, grew her appreciation for

digital. She said, "If you were going to do a bowl of cereal and you wanted flakes flying in the air, we would have to rig them with little wires and monofilament lines. Nowadays, you can shoot the bowl and get each one of the flakes and do it in the computer. It's just taking what we used to do manually one step further.'

At the Naples event, Brodersen's work "Evening Light" was one of over 500 entries. Only 179 were chosen for the exhibit, and out of that, only 23 won awards.

She explained, "That's been a piece that I've liked a lot. It's based on a photograph and then I went in and added and deleted. I reworked the colors.

Inspired by natural imagery, "Evening Light" is indicative of Brodersen's style. "I use strong colors. It varies depending on mood or subject. The subject dictates the style," Broderson said.

As for showing in Naples, Brodersen said, "It's a little outside of my community. It's a bigger venue. I admire the people who run it and the artists that jury the show."

While "Evening Light" will be on display at the Founders Exhibition through Jan. 7, Brodersen will be showing with internationally renowned sculptor Jud Nelson at BIG ARTS in the Founders Gallery from Jan. 6 through Jan. 31.







It will be a grand time at BIG ARTS when Marty Grosz takes the stage Saturday, December 9, at 8 p.m. According to the critics, Marty Grosz is today's foremost jazz rhythm guitarist and chord soloist. He is virtually the only major jazz guitarist who doesn't use an amplifier. This makes him either the last remaining proponent of the acoustic guitar tradition in jazz or the lone harbinger of a new non-electric movement.

One of jazz music's great comedians (his spontaneous monologs are often hilarious), Grosz is a brilliant acoustic guitarist whose chordal solos bring back the sound of Carl Kress and Dick McDonough of the 1930s, while his vocals are very much in the Fats Waller tradition.

Since 1950, Grosz has been recording and touring with such groups as Dick Wellstood's Friends of Fats, Yank Lawson and Bob Haggart, Charlie Byrd, and the New York Jazz Repertory Orchestra directed by Dick Hyman (with whom he appeared at the White House.) In 1986 Grosz became a charter member of The Classic Jazz Quartet, for whom Grosz wrote most of its arrangements.

As a featured single Grosz has made guest appearances on Public Radio's A Prairie Home Companion and Fresh Air with Terry Gross, and on NBC's Today

Show. He was spotlighted at Carnegie Hall during the Cool Jazz Festivals and, more recently, at New York City's prestigious 92nd St. Y concerts and at the Vineyard Theater in Manhattan.



Well, I don't know if you're a great college football fan, but I do know that most of the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club members are. So it came as a pleasant surprise that at this past week's meeting our official greeters Friday morning were none other than the dynamic duo of Woody Hayes and Brutus from Ohio State. They came to help us get all fired up for the then upcoming big game between Ohio State and Michigan over the weekend. Don Russell, club sergeantat-arms and crazed Ohio State Fan led the shenanigans. Rotary members seized the moment to have a little fun and cheer or jeer for Don's alma mater. In case you missed the game, Ohio State won.

Would you believe, our guest speaker then had to follow all this frivolity and bring us back to reality of "The Dangers of Phosphate Mines in the Area?" Bill Byle came down from Charlotte County to highlight the risks of phosphate strip mining to our area. Phosphate strip mining is a risk to our environment, economic vitality, and quality of life. Quoting one of Sharon said, "that the unsung heroes of any election is the poll workers" and poll workers are needed in 171 precincts in Lee County. The training of poll workers provides the backbone of good poll management and they are trained to prevent voter fraud and other infractions at our polling sites.

This year we also had a two-week period of early voting opportunities. Four sites in Lee County were available and 29,914 votes were cast during that two-week time frame. Lee Counties' cost for four early voting sites and staffing was \$44,157. This early voting option, although costly, brought in a significant increase in the number of votes over previous years. The number of registered voters in Lee County is currently 326, 933. 48% of eligible voters went to the polls this mid-term election and 25,389 absentee votes were cast. Sharon also made note of the fact that many of our eligible voters do not vote in mid-term elections. Some Lee County voters may not be year-round residence and only want to vote in national election.

Électronic voting machines have caused concerns for voters and many have asked for some kind of receipt or a copy of their ballot. Sharon explained that, at 'the present time voting machines can't give voting receipts. There may be a possibility of receipts in the future. The reason we don't get copies of our ballot is because of the potential use in vote buying. Sharon indicated voters would never receive a full copy of their recorded ballot.

The #1 concern for the board of elections is voter fraud. In this year's election provisional ballots were used if there was any question regarding voter eligibility. There were 536 provisional ballots this year as compared with 35 in 2002. Provisional ballots are researched and crosschecked before any of these ballots are counted. Be assured if you are a registered voter and have voted only once in the election, your vote was counted.

When during any election cycle there are close election races, a paper trail is provided by the electronic voting machines. An examination of race under-votes (no votes) and over-votes (too many votes) for each candidate is reviewed. A determination is then made on the count and election results are given. As the Lee County Supervisor of

Elections, Sharon could not stress enough how important it is for each and every voter to use the review page provided on your voting screen. If there is a flashing light, review carefully before pushing the button to cast your vote.

- How to dock a boat "Not to worry.. You do have insurance, don't you?"


Sanibel Sea School's goal is to promote marine conservation through education

through a series of day camps for kids and through field trips for adults. Given the cutbacks in public education, Sea School is also a great place to send – oops, great advantage to offer – your over-active grand children where they will actually learn something. Or, leave the little darlings by the pool with the maid and take yourself out. Both relieve stress.


Most Sea School activities are hands on and involved with some of the school's ongoing research, so don't look for a lot of crafts projects coming home. The Sea School does real-world work, not makework. According to Sanibel Sea School Owner, Bruce Neill, kids who invest sweat equity also "develop appreciation and a sense of importance for both science and the particular projects." He tells of one ADHD student's total immersion in a project for sampling, calculating the occurrence of a particular shell along a mile of gulf. He worked non-stop for hours trying to design meaningful sampling techniques. Other projects include Red Tide sampling, sea bird observations, fish population studies, distribution of shells and other "death assemblages," and of course, mangrove research.

Although a 501(c)3, The Sanibel Sea School is profit driven. Call 472-8585 to inquire about Kid, Teen, and Adult programs and tuitions. Or ask Bruce to come speak to your group. Get him started on mangrove habitat or biogeochemical cycling systems.

For Charlotte County, the risk is substantial, but did you know that 64% of Charlotte Harbor is in Lee County? The economic consequences to our area are potentially devastating

"Strip mining influences the water quality and habitat of Charlotte Harbor estuarine system and impacts the larger watershed area. Charlotte Harbor stretches from the headwater of the Peace River southward to Estero Bay. The watershed of Charlotte Harbor covers 4,360 square miles." Bill

Phosphate mining has caused the interruption of freshwater flow to the upper Peace River [by] stripping the land of its minerals, soil, and sand [leaving] pits of hard tar-like soil. This nonporous condition inhibits rainwater's flow: . [the] flow of freshwater is one-third less than its historic levels. At the same time [that] diminished flows of freshwater have been reaching the Harbor via the Peace River, the lower portion of the Harbor has been deluged with excess levels of freshwater from the Caloosahatchee River. The natural ebb and flow of the bay waters into the river waters (saline) created the conditions that allow the emergence of breeding grounds for our aquatic life. We no longer have those

natural conditions."

Phosphate mining, although not alone in its negative affect on our waters, is a large contributor to our current water quality problems. To quote another of Bill's handouts, "When mining changes the land, it changes water flow. It's the plants, animals and people downstream who live with the consequences." Kevin Lewis of SWFAS at Zonta

Kevin Lewis, chief executive officer of Southwest Florida Addiction Services (SWFAS), was the speaker at Zonta's recent breakfast meeting. Lewis has 22 years of service with SWFAS and has been the CEO since 1993. In this position, he is responsible for directing the entire scope of treatment services for the oldest and largest notfor-profit substance abuse treatment program in Southwest Florida. The center serves Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades, and Hendry counties.

Lewis told the group that alcohol remains the primary substance for abuse and impacts one in five Americans. Alcoholism is a disease that affects all parts of society. Seventy-three percent of the overall substance abuse population is male and twentyseven percent is female. He noted that patients have gotten younger in the years that he has been involved. The focus for treatment has also undergone change. What used to be seen as an acute problem is now seen as a chronic disease that requires a strong community support system with advocacy as a vital part. For the past two years, SWFAS has been exploring innovative new approaches to treatment as part of a prestigious grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Southwest Florida is the lowest-funded region in the state for substance-abuse services for adults. At the same time, the at-risk population in our region has nearly tripled in the past 20 years. SWFAS' Detox program is operating with one bed for every 32,000 adults at risk, while there is one jail bed for every 250 adults. This represents a tremendous deficit, resulting in numerous negative consequences, including up to 30 adults being held monthly in the Lee County jail, inappropriate admissions to mental health centers, and local emergency rooms being over-burdened.

Currently SWFAS is conducting a campaign to raise \$8 million for a new detoxification center. Lewis presented a video, created pro bono by Chaos Productions, which







Evie's bed takes up three-quarters of her room. Its four legs are on bricks so the tokoloshe can't jump on her when she,s sleeping and slit her throat. We believe in the tokoloshe, a hairy dwarf-like creature, sent by malevolent spirits, usually at night, to cause illness, injury and even death. Evie has told me he only spooks black people. Why? I ask. Because she says, white people don't believe in him, so he's got no power over them.

She lifts me onto her bed, because I too can't climb onto it. I lie on her embroidered cover and watch her rubbing cream into her face. "Why do you do that?"

"Because it makes my skin lighter," she answers

I tell her, I lie by the pool to get darker, and she laughs. We sing the chorus of the popular Jeremy Taylor song, "Tell me, tell me why, I want to know the facts, why all the black people want to go white and the white people want to go black." Evie is my second mother, my third parent.

On her wall she has a picture of Sir Seretse Khama, the black King of Bechuanaland, and his white, English wife Ruth. She loves the picture, tells me Bechuanaland is on our northern border, how Sir Seretse is so clever he went to England to attend Oxford University, then he met Ruth Williams, a clerk, and married her. When I ask her if there are any mixed marriages in South Africa, she says one word in three words, A part heid, that mean two words apart hate. She explains further, "Immorality Act — it's illegal." I nod, as if I understand.

We are in her room one day when the radio beeps three times and then ends with one long beep. It's the One O'clock News. The stern voice of the announcer reports that a notorious black gang, the Msomi Gang, is terrorizing the township. I know Evelina's last name is Msomi. I tell her I can keep a secret and ask her if she's related to the Msomi Gang. Tears

of laughter fill her eyes, she slaps her black knees. I notice her legs are brown, but her knees are black and she takes me and rocks me backwards and forwards repeating, "No! No!"

Evie's favorite song is The Tennessee Waltz. She sings it to me all the time, very soft and very slow,

"I was dancin, with my darlin' to the Tennessee Waltz."

Evie, s sweetheart is Roderick, a driver for a company in Johannesburg. I always hope the police won't raid whenever Roderick sleeps over. Evie's little room became very crowded when Eric, named after my elder brother, is born. Evie carries him, wrapped in a blanket on her back as she works in our house. He sleeps with his head against her back. We love him.

One morning Esther comes to my mother, they talk quietly and my mother follows her to the servants, yard, telling us not to come. Eric had died during the night.

Later I knock on Evie's door but there is no answer. It is only a few weeks later Roderick is killed in a car crash.

My mother phones a black taxi company, who drives Evie to Park Station, where she takes a train to a town near her kraal.


We have given her leave and she will come back when she feels better," my mother explains to us.

"But she didn't say goodbye," I cry.

'Because it's not goodbye," Mom answers. "I want to write to her," I insist.

"That's very nice, but I do not have an address.

I sit with Spotty in the garden. Evie knows everything about me, the way I eat my softboiled egg, then turn the empty egg over so the unbroken shell is on the top and pretend I haven't touched it, how I say the multiplication tables, my favorite shirt. I don't even know where she lives. Softly I begin to hum, "I was dancin, with my darlin'

Donald Wiles James, Jr.

Donald James, Jr., a resident of Sanibel, died Nov. 10, 2006 in Tampa, from complications following surgery. Born November 16, 1930 in Nyack, N.Y. to Donald Wiles James and Katherine Adelia Woodward he was raised in Port Washington, N.Y.

James received a BA in Economics from Haverford College in 1952 then served in the Army Security Agency as a Chinese language translator in Okinawa and Taiwan during the Korean War. He received an MBA in International Columbia Business from where he was a University Bronfman Fellow and a Harriman Scholar. At Columbia, he co-founded the first U.S. branch of AIESEC, an international exchange program for business students that recently celebrated its 50th anniversary.

In 1958, James began work at Pan-American Life Insurance Company and remained part of the insurance business until his retirement. In 1962, he moved to West Hartford, Conn. to work with the Life Insurance Marketing & Research Association where he was senior vice president. In 1982, he formed D.W. James Associates, Inc. a consulting firm specializing in compensation and planning for the life insurance industry.

James was an avid genealogist and co-authored several articles identifying the origins of the James family of Newport, R.I. He was a life member of the New England Historic Genealogical Society and the Newport Historical Society. He was also a enthusiastic tennis and bridge player and had belonged to the Hartford Tennis Club, where he founded a USTA New England sectional tournament honoring the late Walter Rapp, and joined the Dunes Tennis Club when he came to Sanibel. He had achieved Top Ten ranking in Men's singles in the New England region for his age group before suffering a stroke in 1998. He was a member of the Bridge Club at MacGregor Point and was working toward his Life Masters.

He discovered Sanibel in 1981 and each year spent more time here until he became a full-time resident in 1997. He had served as a director of the Shell Harbor Home Owner's Association, and remained active in the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club.

James is survived by his wife of 47 years, Nancy Burke Teass James, of Sanibel; his son and daughter-in-law Stuart Woodward James and Karen Simroth James of Afton, Va.; his daughter and son-inlaw, Payton Leigh James-Amberg and Sean Michael Amberg of Corvallis, Ore.; and his sister and her partner, Ann Woodward James and Mari Margaret McLean, of Pataskala, Ohio. His dearly loved grandchildren, Katherine Anne James, James Christensen Amberg and Maren Elizabeth Amberg, will all miss their "Fopper.' A memorial will be held at Oakland Cemetery in Sag Harbor, N.Y at the convenience of his family. Memorial donations may be made to the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston, Mass., or the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center & Research Institute in Tampa.
