# Sanibel Sea School teams with Pace Center for a special day

Ichristman/Sibreasenewspapers.com The Sanibel Sea School's motto is, "Every day is a field trip," and 13 young women from the Pace Center for Girls in Fort Myers spent an exciting Saturday in Sanibel learning about nature and marine life.

The Pace Center gives girls from at-risk environments structure and role models to help them succeed in life. Sea School founders Bruce and Evelyn Neill teamed with Pace director Debbie Webb to arrange the adventure for the girls. For several of them, it was their first trip to the beach. The Neills took the group to Blind Pass.

After a brief time on the beach, they walked under the bridge to the estuary that backs up to Tarpon Bay, Brace led the young women in some listening and observing exercises, and then gave short lectures about estuaries and tilangruses.

As the girls waded through the water, several bent down to scoop up shells and asked questions about them and nearby birds. Some of the girls were besitant to get their feet wet or to touch anything, but most were curious about their surroundings, and dug through the bottom of the estuary to see what they could find

The girls grabbed a seining net to catch fish and live shells. Bruce, who has a doctorate degree in conservation biology, answered their questions as they headed for the mangroves. He asked the group to lick the salty leaves as he explained the importance of manaroves to our cosystem.

Your life is absolutely shaped by this banch of (mangrove) trees that you've never really seen or appreciated before." he told the group. "New that some of you have licked those mangrove trees...I want you to recognize that the reason your life looks like it does is because of these trees."

After lunch, the group headed to Bailey's Beach for another sea life excussion,

Evelyn, who calls herself an "uvid naturalist." became interested in giving these young women an enriching educational encounter after she heard a presentation about the Pace Canter.

"I was captivated about what they were trying to do," she said, "and the fact that these girls are making it out of a system that's put-

ting them at risk. We want to make it possible for programs to come out and learn a little bit about the marine ecosystem," Evelyn added, "It's an interesting place with mysteries that they don't normally experience. I think it fills your life with opportunity to see other parts of the world and nature."

Evelvn noticed a young woman as she curiously examined mussels and egg cases. "I don't think she would have been naturally interested in that," she said. "It was just opportunity. Nature is that way, It's not so much about what you go to teach, it's what you find along the way

Fifteen-year-old Jakila P. enjoyed her trip to Sanibel. "We learned about conch shells and how they make babies on the logs," she said. "I've never been to an estuary: I learned a 1, a.

Pace program director Marianne Kearns accompanied the group on the field trip, and thinks the day was a big success.

"It's incredibly awesome for (the girls)," she said, "because some of them have never been to the beach before, and definitely had not seen an estuary before or touched mangroves. I hope that it gives them possibilities for their future and that it inspires them to learn more about nature. I noticed some of the girls were really picking up things and looking at things and finding things, and those are the girls who are going to grow up and remember this and possibly further them-

selves. That's what I hope they get out of this, "Even the ones who are distracted," Kearns added, "they are learning, too. Every little piece of this activity, they're learning something from it. We believe that, that's why we have PACE!

# Call for submissions for the CHNEP 2008 calendar

We live in a beautiful place and many of you have captured this beauty in your artwork as is evi-denced by the 2005, 2006 and 2007 calendars produced by Charlotte Harbor National Estuary Program, a partnership program working to protect the natural environment from Venice to Estero Bay to Winter Haven. (PDF files of these calendars are posted CHNEP the website on www.CHNEP.org.)

You can have your artwork published in the 2008 calendar! CHNEP encourages you to submit up to three images that capture the beauty of the natural environment found within the CHNEP study area for the 2008 calendar. The images could have been captured by the young or old, amateur or professional, today or 50 years ago and in any medium (photography, oil, illustration, etc). The goal is that the 2008 calendar will depict the diversity of the natural environment found within this geographic area, which may include rivers, streams, estuaries, native plants and native wildlife.

You may submit up to three (3) digitized entries by 5 p.m. on Friday, July 20, 2007. There is no entry fee. The only "rules" are:

The images captured must be within the watershed of concern to the CHNEP, which includes all or portions of Charlotte, DeSoto, Hardee, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Polk and Sarasota counties. Maps of the program watershed are posted on the CHNEP website www.CHNEP.org.

Each person may submit no more than three images. Images that conform to a  $4 \times 3$  ratio (12 x 9) are preferred as they conform to the anticipated print size of the calendar.

disk. If you want help in digitizing your image, contact The Set-Up in Cape Coral (239/542-4142 or info@thesetup.com) or a local commercial printer. Scanning costs are estimated to be \$50 an image. Please note that only images with resolutions of 300 dpi or greater for a 12 x 9 inch image can be considered for printing on a 12 x 9 inch feature page.

Images with lower resolutions may only be printed smaller and placed within the dates of the calendar.

Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form that serves as a release for CHNEP to use the entries in items such as the 2008 calendar, the newsletter Harbor Happenings and on the program website. If images include people who are recognizable, a signed model release form is required of each person. Images will only be posted for selection if a release form is received. The forms are posted on the website www.CHNEP.org.

Entries and forms must be received by Maran Hilgendorf, CHNEP, 1926 Victoria Ave, Fort Myers FL 33901-3414 prior to the deadline. If you have any questions, please contact Maran at mhilgendorf@swfrpc.org.

Entries that comply with these rules will be posted on the website for selection by the public.

### Select images to include in the calendar:

During the month of August 2007 we'll ask you to select up to 20 images that you believe best depict the beauty of the estuaries and watersheds in the CHNEP study area. CHNEP will have the final decision on entries posted and printed and will not display images that are obscene, provocative or whose content is otherwise questionable or whose quality does not conform to the standards as specified here. CHNEP retains sole discretion as to what constitutes inappropriate content.

### Subscribe to Harbor Happenings to receive a calendar:

The calendar is anticipated to be sent free to every person who receives the program newsletter Harbor Happenings as of September 30, 2007. (Subscribe for this free newsletter by completing an online request form.) We anticipate that as many as 18,000 calendars will be produced.

# Fusing glass and sharing with friends: Artist Vicki Bundschu is a creator and a teacher

Step into Vicki Bundschu's studio on any given day and you're likely to see several islanders cutting, placing and designing vibrant shards and pieces of glass into unique shapes and figures- the limit only being their imaginations.

Bundschu creates jewelry, vases, platters-nearly everything- out of fused and kiln formed glass.

"It takes a long time, but it's a wonderful hobby," she explained. "A lot of people want to learn, and they all come over (to my studio)."

For the past five years Bundschu has been developing her technique.

"I began in Petra Kaiser's beginner's class at BIG ARTS. Since then I've taken several advanced classes to learn different techniques in fusing," Bundschu said. In the five years she has devoted to the

In the five years she has devoted to the art form, Bundschu has gained a wealth of knowledge, a new kiln and studio (thanks to her husband, Master Captain George Bundschu) and has become the treasurer of the International Guild for Glass Artists.

"It's really fun when you get involved. I learn something new everyday," she said.

For Bundschu, working with fused glass came from an interest she developed when she and her husband ran a sea shore motel in Cape May, N.J.

"I had a young man who worked for us. His parents owned a stained glass shop. He was only 16 and taught me how to do it," she explained.

Once the Bundshcus retired from the hospitality business, they found a place to call home on Sanibel.

"We came here on vacation like everyone else," Bundschu said. "Living in the motel was like living in a phone booth. We wanted some place to come to. It was like living on top of Bailey's."

Sanibel offered the couple a seasonal respite from the hustle and bustle of the New Jersey shore and gave the pair the opportunity to try new things. While George acquired his captain's license, Vicki explored her creativity at BIG ARTS.

"I went to BIG ARTS and took a mosaic class and the furniture painting class. My girlfriend said, 'Let's take fused glass with Petra.' Since then I've taken six or seven (glass) classes all over the place," she said.

From Allentown, Pa. to a progressive kiln programming class in Lakeland, Fla., Bundschu has studied a variety of different methods for working with glass and created many delicately wrought iridescent and vibrant pieces.

Out of all of her work, Bundschu's favorite is her bubble fuse. The bubble fuse is a square of aqua colored glass divided

into numerous

s m a l l e r squares by intersecting pieces of c o b a l t s p a g h e t t i glass. In the middle of the small squares

are tiny, perfectly formed bubbles.

"It went surprisingly well," she said of the bubble fuse. "I did it on a kiln shelf, fused it for eight minutes, and where there was an air pocket, a bubble formed."

Bundschu liked the results so much that she and a friend decided to try out a special glass bubble wash. Both were wary of the strange substance and decided against trying it out on glass. Later, Bundschu learned that the

expensive vial of bubble wash was only baking soda. "I busted out laughing. I put on a respirator thinking it

respirator thinking it was toxic and never fused a piece because I chickened out," she said.

While Bundschu enjoys just creating with glass, part of what

has made this season in Sanibel even better has been working with her friend and fellow glass artist Carol Strange.

"I'm enjoying Carol. She has a kiln, so it's fun," Bundschu said.

While the pair share an appreciation for glass, they work in different ways. Strange fuses wine and liquor bottles, while Bundschu said, "I would rather create."

Getting set to return to Cape May for the summer, Bundschu is looking forward to sharing her talents up north.

"I really like Cape May, and I hope to be involved in teaching at the new art center," she explained.

While Bundschu would surely make an excellent teacher, having worked with so many islanders this season, she is a bit unsure.

"Every minute teaching is not making what you want to make," she said. "It's a lot of fun, but sometimes you want to do your

places to bird. Birds have long been indicators of environmental change, sounding the alarm about the impacts

of pesticides, polluted water, and the loss of contiguous forest. While IMBD continues to promote the joy of birds, it will also tackle a challenging, yet pertinent topic in 2007 - climate change. While the cause for this trend is still being debated, many of the songbird species we see and enjoy in nature are shifting their ranges and migrating earlier, often making it more difficult for them to find food such as insects, flowers, and berries when they need it.

Climate change is of particular concern for birds and other wildlife when viewed in concert with other threats like habitat loss, pollution, and invasive species. It is the combination of these stresses that may prove to be the greatest challenge to wildlife conservation in the 21st century. Today, as the rate of warming increases, scientists are exploring how climate change will affect birds and how we can reduce our impact.

Songbirds play a critical role in ecosys-

tems by eating insects, pollinating plants, and dispersing seeds. Changes in climate risk throwing ecosystems off balance along with all the natural services they provide for people. One pair of warblers, for example, will remove the defoliating caterpillars from more than 1 million leaves within the two to three week period that they are feeding their nestlings. Fully twothirds of our flowering plants including many food crops depend on pollinators like birds, producing a global economic benefit estimated by the Smithsonian Migratory Bird Center at \$117 billion per year.

Hence, the global reduction of pollinators raises alarm from an economic viewpoint alone.

In addition, the nation's 46 million birders generate over \$85 billion in overall economic impact creating over 860,000 jobs. Florida itself ranks third in the nation in economic impact from birders and wildlife viewers. In short, birds are extremely important to us all.

At the Zoo, guests will have the opportunity to learn one-on-one with biologists and staff from the National Wildlife Refuges. Children can engage in an interactive migration game and receive an educational coloring book. Around the Zoo, guests can also learn how to make their yards more bird-friendly at the National Wildlife Federation certified Backyard Wildlife Habitat. There was a great many speculators in the Real Estate market. They were looking for easy money. These speculators were investors not owners. Banks and mortgage companies seemed to have lowered the standards on mortgage requirements and were granting creative mortgages. 2005 was by historical statements an overheated market. We are now in a correction period. Jeff said, "Real Estate speculators should be a sub-group of Gambler's Anonymous." The good news is the fever is breaking and the health of our real estate value will return.

# The Day Trippers: Pin pointing the islands' causeway issues

Now that Sanibel is preparing for the formal opening of its new bridge and causeway we have to take steps to prevent structural damage problems in the future. A lot of the problems Sanibel has with its broken causeway can be laid at the doors of day trippers: those mainland visitors who storm the causeway each day to spend sunny hours on Sanibel beaches and make purchases from our stores.

Although Sanibel values the business that day trippers provide, they have gained so much weight

in the last few years that our poor causeway shudders and buckles from stress each day and has gotten a hernia. We are talking about metric tons, not 28-inch waistlines.

In the meantime our causeway sags from the sheer tonnage and is at a loss to figure out why people have gotten so heavy.

While waiting for our new bridge and causeway to be completed it is urgent that we take remedies now to avoid similar

trucks from entering Sanibel. To insure safety, a weight station must be added to the existing one that weighs trucks. This new weight station would weigh passenger cars

and their contents and place a maximum weight on each. As a case in point, a typical passenger car weighs around 2,000 pounds. An allocation of an additional 900 pounds would be made for passengers and their contents. If a passenger car exceeds this limit, the passengers in that car would exercise the

following options: passengers would be

removed until the total weight achieves the legal limit. Those passengers who are removed could walk back to Fort Myers, thus allowing the remaining passengers and contents of the car to drive through. Or they could wait in a passenger weight station at the side of the causeway until that passenger car completes its rounds in Sanibel and prepares to exit the causeway on its way back to Fort Myers.

However, there's another important consideration. As each passenger car prepares to leave Sanibel it would be weighed again. One lunch

over the limit again. If this were to happen, passengers would again have to leave the car - or pur-

chases from island stores would have to be confiscated until the car's weight is reduced sufficiently.

# Keep those bones strong!

I've been hearing a lot about osteoporosis lately. Ölder women and younger women. Athletic women and couch potatoes. Women with good diets, and women who think that a balanced diet includes a can of soda, a donut, and a stalk of broccoli (a liquid, a dry food, and something green).

Bones should stay strong through the duration of our lives but unfortunately, 21st century diets and lifestyles can sabotage our best efforts to maintain bone health. Fortunately, there is much we can do to ensure the health of

bones all the way through our senior years.

### **Dietary Habits That Rob Bones**

One of the most common problems related to bone health is our love affair with acid-forming diets. When the diet is overly acid (high protein, excessive grains, sugars, soft drinks, alcohol, as well as stress and other factors), the body alkalinizes the blood by pulling minerals out of the bones. Maintaining the proper pH is critically important to bone health.

High protein diets contribute to the loss of bone minerals because animal proteins leave an acid residue in the body. By the same token, grain-based diets can have the same effect.

How, then, should we balance the diet to maximize bone health? Lots of vegetables and fresh fruit, along with modest amounts of protein foods help maintain bone density by reducing the acid load and providing the body with a variety of minerals.

Remember that the various organs and systems of the body do not have competing

interests. In other words, a bonehealthy diet is a heart- and brain healthy diet. A diet that is optimum for permanent weight loss is also good for lasting health.

### **Beverages for the Bones**

While ad agencies would like you to believe that "milk does a body good," that may be true only if you are a calf. Cow's milk was intended to build strong, big Notebook calves. Cow's milk is a rich source of calcium but according to the World Health Organization, up to 80% of the world's popula-

tion is intolerant to dairy products. Countries that consume far less dairy than the US have far less osteoporosis, probably because their diets typically focus on lots of vegetables. Again, eat those greens!

How much calcium do we need? Actually, that is an over-simplistic question. Our bones are constructed of twenty-six nutrients, and when we take huge amounts of calcium and neglect the other twenty-five nutrients, we build dense but brittle bones. I highly recommend a balanced mineral supplement with modest amounts of calcium, and lots of vitamin D. I have written extensively about vitamin D in this column, and cannot overstate its importance. Yes, I know we live in the sunshine state but unless we spend a considerable amount of time in the sun with most of our skin exposed, we are still deficient in this important vitamin.

Diet isn't the only factor in bone health, however. Next week, we'll examine lifestyle issues related to bones.

# FLORIDA'S ENDANGERED SEA TURTLES

# Find out about them

Turtle Tracks is an interpretive program on the life cycle of sea turtles provided by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation on Thursday mornings at 9 a.m. The cost is  $\sigma$ 3/adult; kis are free. In addition, a \$2 fee is necessary for parking at the beach site visited.

SCCF monitors sea turtle nests on Sanibel and Captiva; someone is always available during the day to answer questions at 472-2329. Or visit the Foundation at 3333 San-Cap Road, on the left at Mile Marker #1.

# What you can do

May through October is nesting season on the beaches of Sanibel and Captiva for endangered sea turtles. Humans observing some simple rules can help these ancient creatures the water. Artificial lighting confuses them and, disoriented by lights, baby turtles will wander away from the water and die.

Keep the beach and water free of litter. Many sea turtle

- Keep obstacles off the beach overnight (beach chairs, umbrellas). When a female comes on the beach to nest, an obstacle will cause her to turn back and either return to the water (and possibly eject her eggs) or find a different section of the beach. Unlike humans, sea turtles will not attempt to go around or to the side of an obstacle.
- Lights confuse nesting females and hatchlings. Keep lights near the beaches off or shielded from May through October. It is naturally lighter over the water than it is over the land, so nesting females and hatchlings both head toward the light in order to head toward
- Reep the beach and water nee of inter. Many sea turne deaths are due to trash discarded in or close to the water
   balloons, plastic bags and styrofoam mistaken for food.
- Stay clear of any marked nest areas on the beach. It is a federal offense to disturb or interfere with a nest or to have in your possession eggs or any part of a turtle such as skull, bones or carapace. It is illegal for an individual to retain possession of any threatened or endangered sea turtle hatchlings.
- Give nesting females room, darkness and quiet. It is illegal to disturb a nesting turtle with lights or noise.
- All dogs on the beach must be on a leash and cannot be allowed to disturb nesting turtles or hatchlings.

### How to:

In a large bowl, whisk together egg whites, cornstarch, sesame seeds, 1 teaspoon of salt and 1/2 teaspoon of pepper until frothy. Add the shrimp and toss to coat.

Heat one quarter cup of oil in a large non-stick skillet over medium/high heat. Working in two or three batches, cook the shrimp until golden brown and crisp, two to three minutes per side. Transfer the shrimp to a paper towel lined plate to drain. Add more oil to the skillet if necessary for the remaining batches.

Wipe the skillet with a paper towel. Add orange juice, soy sauce, and sugar.

Boil over high heat until syrupy and reduced to about 1/3 of a cup, about four to five minutes.

Return the shrimp to the skillet. Add the scallions and cook until heated through and coated with the sauce, about one minute. Serves 4

# **Broadway Palm's "Swing!" offers exuberant energy and eclectic mix of Jazz**

"Swing!" is currently ablaze and burning up the stage at the Broadway Palm Dinner Theatre — a two-hour dance fest that takes the exclamation point in its title seriously. The original production was conceived by Paul Kelly with direction and choreography by Lynne Taylor Corbett and opened on Broadway in 1999. It was an instant, runaway success. This musical dance revue

puts on no pretensions — it only aspires to provide an evening's worth of world-class entertainment and send the audience home in a charmed, exhilarated and happy frame of mind. Broadway Palm's rendition of "Swing!" was recreated by the very talented, exciting director/choreographer Kenny Shepard and his equally talented choreographic partner, Carol Worcel. This gifted duo more than hit the mark of the original Broadway Tony Award -nominated version.

This feel-good show doesn't even try to hint at a story line, plot or anything that even looks like a thread to link various dance and song numbers together. "Swing!" succeeds brilliantly on its own as a dazzling display of some of the best song, dance and music styles of the 30s and 40s --- the Big Band sounds associated with Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw and Harry James.

The visceral impact and excitement of swing dancing is presented by an outstanding ensemble of some of the best dancers seen in these parts — every bit as good as any dancers you'd be likely to find on the Broadway stage - Richard Bull, Jason Campbell, Mathew deGuzman, Ian Frazier, Katie Hagen, Jami Keck, Lindsay Kraemer, Joseph Perkins, Kate Phillips, Courtney Self, Lauran Stanis and Courtney Tilford.

shows visual emotion, it can also stir deep emotions from an audience. The "Swing!" dance ensemble succeeds in providing exuberant energy all around. They show so much joy and excitement on their faces that you cannot help being pulled in to the fun and zest of what is being performed on the stage.

Part of the dazzling dance technique involves the male dancers tossing their partners up in the air as if they were as light as feathers. Add to that the visual delight of the ladies

wrapping and unwrapping themselves out of these lifts — absolutely razzle-dazzle smiles, strength and complete control - to end up in a high kick or split.

Even though the dancers are the stars of this basically dance revue they are not the only high points of the evening. The Singers in "Swing!" are of equal caliber. Skilled vocal technique combined with charming humor — that's Joseph Byrne, who sings with classic-Broadway wide-open sound, then the twang of Country Western and on to the inflections of cool jazz. These singers add in a huge way to the enjoyment of this show as they put their own enthusiastic brand of spin on 'Swing!

And, as if this were not enough of in this overabundance of riches, real admiration and accolades go to the superb jazz band on stage (just so you know, this terrific band is made up of Broadway Palm's in-house musicians). The Stingers, as the band is

White. It is just about as good as it gets for an

evening of amazing dancing, great singing, and a swell jazz band.

All in all it's about good old-fashioned fun; forget about world events, gas prices and the real estate market. "Swing!" assures us we can still have confidence in life, love and the pursuit of happiness in these United States with hot dancing and cool music.

It appears that there is an extremely high peak demand for water from 4 to 5:30 a.m. being caused to a large extent by irrigation system timers which have been reset to operate during a short 4 a.m. to 8 a.m. time period, two days per week. This is in accordance with many recent media reports regarding new stricter watering restrictions throughout much of South Florida.

However, these new restrictions do not apply to IWA Members who are irrigating with IWA's water; and, if a need for additional water became necessary, such as for fighting a fire during this extremely dry weather period, system pressure may fall to unacceptably low levels, and public safety may be jeop-



ardized. The restrictions for the islands remain as they have been since June 2003, and are as follows:

"Sometimes I am not sure I'm an artist officially," Rohl said. "But I have consistently, sporadically made art literally all of my life." Rohl remembers the first time she got paid for a painting of a horse when she was a teenager. Today she may feel a simi-lar buzz when art gallery jurors see her work and respond. "The judge has connected to the piece in some way," she said. Because she rarely gets a chance to talk with jurors who chose her work, she said it's uncertain exactly what about her work spoke to them. "But I know something worked," she explained.

For Rohl, the process of creating works of art is akin to a poet writing in a journal; it's a creative release that orients the creator. Each piece is about the journey as she paints, draws and sculpts images of animals and people. Rohl said her subjects show an inner dynamic, connecting her as she works, and ultimately the viewer, to a sense of an individual's place in the world. "When emotions, ideas and a new tool all land in the same spot, I'm inspired to work," she said

Rohl ha worked in charcoal, oils, acrylics, found objects- just about all mediums throughout her career. Rohl works mostly in her studio either in Fort Myers or in New York and sometimes in Colorado, but just about anywhere has potential. "Wherever I can find a wall that I can slop around in front of without being concerned about the floor, etc. can be a studio for me," she said.

# Boaters offer tips for preparing for upcoming hurricane season

With hurricane season approaching, over 150 marina, boatyard, and yacht club managers recently gathered in Orlando, Florida for the first Marina Hurricane Preparation Symposium. Organized by BoatU.S. in conjunction with the Marine Industries Association of Florida and the Marine Industries Association of South Florida, the group shared tactics, tips and experiences with the goal of successfully managing another year of potentially increased storm activity.

Towards those efforts, the following storm preparation tips may help boaters reduce the chances of damage to their own vessels as well as improve the odds that their boating facility will quickly recover:

The most important task is to make a hurricane plan now and put it in writing; speakers at the Symposium continually stressed the need for facilities and individuals to have well thought out, written plans. A plan should include where your boat will best survive a storm, what supplies you'll need, and who will be doing that work if you are out of town when the storm approaches.

■ If possible, arrange with the marina now to get your boat out of the water and onto high ground – it is the single best thing you can do to take care of your boat when a storm is approaching. Check to see if your boat's insurance policy offers "hurricane haul-out" coverage to help foot the bill.

Does your marina tie-down boats? Boats that have been brought ashore and secured to the ground tend to experience much less damage. Some facilities strap boats down to large metal eyes imbedded in concrete or secure lines to earth augers. It's extra work, and it's worth it.

Don't count on the marina adding extra lines and stripping the boat unless you've made prior arrangements. Once hurricane warnings are posted, marina operators will be far too busy to accommodate last minute requests. Begin by reviewing your dock contract now to see if it requires you to take certain steps when a hurricane threatens and talk to your marina operator now to coordinate plans

Regardless of where you leave your boat, anything that creates windage must be removed. Bimini tops, dodgers, outriggers, antennas, portable davits should be taken home or stowed below. Ventilators should be taken out and the openings sealed. Don't tie dinghies on deck take them ashore.

■ If possible, sailboats should have their masts unstepped. This will require that you maintain your rigging, with well-lubed turnbuckles and cotter pins, so that pulling the pins doesn't take forever. If the mast is left up, all sails and covers must be removed.

If the boat will be secured at a dock, add extra dock lines and chafe protection. Look carefully at potential chafe areas - chocks, pilings, pulpits, and dock edges. Replace older dock lines that are weakened by salt, dirt and UV exposure. Using a fender board with at least three large fenders is also worth considering.

Begin tracking storms as soon as they are identified. While forecasting has dramatically improved, hurricanes can still change direction and intensity very quickly. # Help researchers find **Marco and Whitaker**

Researchers studying manatees in the state of Florida are asking for the public's help in locating two rehabilitated manatees named Marco and Whitaker that have been tagged and released in southwest Florida. Anyone who sees a manatee with a belt, located just above their tail, is asked to call the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) dispatch at 1-888-404-FWCC (3922), #FWC or \*FWC on your cellular phone, or use VHF Channel 16 on your marine radio.

Marco is an orphaned manatee that was rescued after suffering a shark bite in May 2004 near Marco Island in Collier County. He was released in Warm Mineral Springs in February 2007 with two other manatees. He was last seen in the spring but is suspected to be in the Charlotte Harbor area since he is a larger animal. Marco's tail is heavily damaged from shark bites. If his tail is visible, the belt will be as well.

Whitaker was also an orphan and rescued because of cold stress in February 2006 near Whitaker Bayou in Sarasota County. She was released in Warm Mineral Springs with Marco and another manatee in February 2007. Whitaker was last seen in the Myakka River just north of the El Jobean bridge and could be anywhere in the area. Whitaker has a freeze brand, which is a marking with a letter and number that is sometimes visible on two places on the manatee - either on the top "shoulder region" parallel to the head or near the base of the tail.

The Manatee Rehabilitation Partnership, a cooperative effort of non-profit, private, state and federal entities, have equipped Marco and Whitaker with tracking gear to help researchers and veterinarians monitor their health and re-adaptation to the wild. The tether is attached to the belt and is designed to break free of the animal if needed, such as in the case of entanglement. Finally, the radio-transmitter tag is attached to the tether and floats just above the surface of the water line. Both Marco and Whitaker have lost the transmitter and tether and are just wearing the belt component of their tracking device. Without the radio-transmitter, Marco and Whitaker are much more difficult to spot, but their belts can easily be seen when they surface for air.

Public sightings of Marco and Whitaker will provide researchers the opportunity to attach another tag and allow for future monitoring of their adaptation and health.

# Florida celebrates May as Clean Air Month

State encourages citizens to adopt clean air practices

Florida is recognizing May as Clean Air Month, encouraging citizens to adopt environmentally-friendly practices to reduce energy consumption and protect air quality. A leader in clean air technologies, Florida is one of just three states east of the Mississippi River that currently meets all National Ambient Air Quality Standards and the only highly urbanized state.

"Recognizing May as Clean Air Month encourages Floridians to make a commitment to helping ensure that Florida continues to meet and exceed air quality standards,' said Department of Environmental Protection Secretary Michael W. Sole. "By reducing emissions and investing in clean energy technology we will ensure a stronger, healthier environment and economy for future generations.'

Over the last eight years, the state has successfully prompted the modernization of older power plants to achieve large reductions in emissions of soot, sulfur dioxide and smog-contributing nitrogen oxide. Further significant reductions are projected over the next eight years due to the implementation of new federal requirements, the Clean Air Interstate Rule and the Clean Air Mercury Rule. As part of Clean Air Month, DEP is encouraging Floridians to do their share for cleaner air by adopting clean air practices

- Use public transportation or carpool.
- Purchase energy efficient products.
- Conserve electricity at home and work.
- Maintain heating and air conditioning units.
- Ensure vehicle efficiency by keeping tires inflated at the correct pressure.
- Plant native trees and shrubs.

More than 25 percent of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) fleet of clean energy transportation is comprised of 125 hybrid vehicles and more than 300 alternative fuel vehicles that use combinations of fuel, ethanol and electricity products. Just last year, the state joined executives from General Motors and Inland Food Stores to open the first public E85 ethanol pump in Florida in Tallahassee. The use of E85 can provides positive environmental benefits in the form of reduced greenhouse gas emissions.

DEP's Office of Greenways & Trails is pumping biodiesel, a "green" fuel made from homegrown vegetables, vegetable oil, fats and grease, into its fleet of field trucks. The field vehicles tow tractors and heavy-duty maintenance equipment an average of more than 300 miles a week over the rugged terrain of the 110-mile Cross

Florida Greenway and along paved highways. The Florida Renewable Energy Technologies & Energy Efficiency Act – a four year, \$100 million plan to diversify the state's fuel supply and promote energy conservation and efficiency. It takes the first comprehensive step toward a diverse, reliable and secure energy future by reducing regulatory barriers to expedite electric generation capacity and providing rebates, grants and tax incentives to drive the development of alternative fuel technologies.

# Fiddlesticks Foundation awards \$480,000 to local charities

The Bobby Nichols Fiddlesticks Charity Foundation has awarded \$480,000 to three local charities to help at-risk children in Lee County.

The funds were awarded to Abuse Counseling and Treatment, the Children's Advocacy Center, and Southwest Florida Addiction Services.

Fiddlesticks residents raised the money during the Nichols Cup Celebrity Pro-Am Golf Tournament in February. The tournament and the foundation are named for Bobby Nichols, a Fiddlesticks resident and winner of 14 PGA Tour tournaments.

"Our goal is to make a difference for the kids in our community," said Jack Rogers, tournament chairman.

The Children's Advocacy Center has been a recipient of the funds since 2003. Abuse Counseling and Treatment has received funds from the foundation since 2005. This is the first year that SWFAS has been selected as a beneficiary.

The Bobby Nichols Charity Foundation, a non-profit organization founded in 2002, is a group of Fiddlesticks members known as the Pipers who volunteer to organize and run the Nichols Cup Celebrity Pro-Am Golf tournament. The mission of the Pipers and the foundation is to raise funds for local children's charities, while recognizing the golf legacy of Bobby Nichols. The Foundation has raised more than \$1.4 million since the tournament began five years ago.
