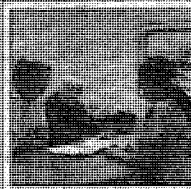
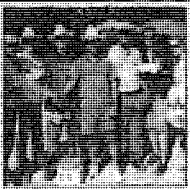

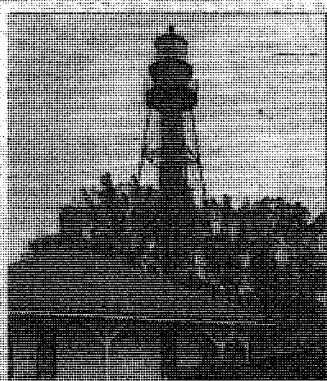

"Many of our members have been out of town over the summer, and they came back excited about the improvements that have been made to the path system since last spring. The Periwinkle Project is getting just rave reviews from our group. Also, it was great to see all the improvements to the facilities at Bowman's Beach since our picnic last year. Registration begins for annual Birding and Wildlife Festival

Registration is now open for the Southwest Florida Birding & Wildlife Festival, hosted at the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve in Naples on Jan. 18-20, 2008.

Coordinated by a variety of area agencies and organizations, the fourth annual event has expanded to include opportunities for participants to learn about birds and other wildlife of this region.

"This year's festival will offer even more than in previous years by including information on Florida's unique flora, fauna and wildlife, including panthers, orchids and butterflies," said Randy McCormick, Education Coordinator for the Rookery Bay Environmental Learning Center.

The festival will feature activities, presentations and field trips over the course of three days. Space is limited and registration is required for participation in more than two dozen guided trips through wildlife habitat and natural areas around the region. Presentations and workshops provided by bird and wildlife experts will give a closer look at particular species and issues. Live raptors from the Audubon Center for Birds of Prey in Maitland will also be on hand for up-

close and personal interaction.

Pre-registration is not necessary to attend the presentations or onsite activities. The event will kickoff with a keynote address by noted author and naturalist Scott Weidensaul, who will sign copies of his newest book — "Of A Feather: A Brief History Of American Birding" — before and after his presentation on Friday, Jan. 18 at 7 p.m.

The cost to attend the three-day festival is \$20 per adult and free for children under 12. Entry fee includes admission to the Environmental Learning Center in Naples. Field trips carry an additional fee.

The Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve is managed by DEP in cooperation with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The reserve is one of 27 research reserves operating across the nation. DEP's Office of Coastal and Aquatic Managed Areas (CAMA) manages Rookery Bay along with 44 other sites that include aquatic preserves, National Estuarine Research Reserves and the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. CAMA's programs and activities are designed to help Floridians better understand and conserve the state's resources through research, education and preservation.

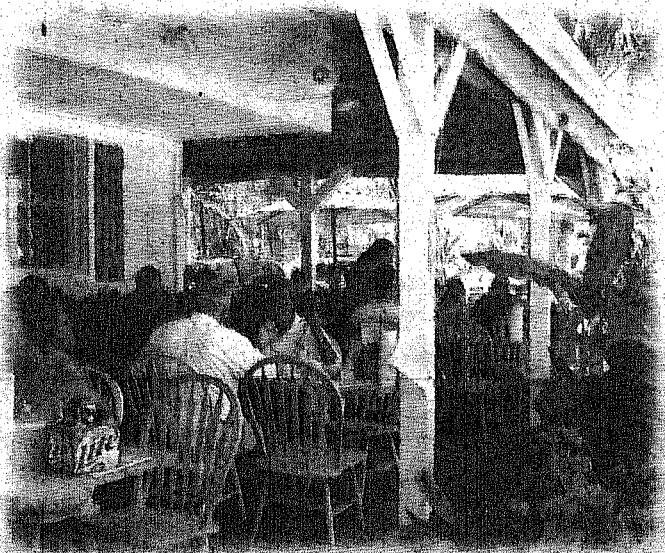

Esparanza Woodring Rodeo Nets plenty of competitors

The 14th Annual Esparanza Woodring Memorial Cast Net Rodeo drew 36 youngsters and 16 adults for the contest held at the Bait Box on Nov. 3. Competitors tossed a net at both moving and stationary targets. Three-year-old girls and seasoned, commercial fishermen tested their skills throughout the day.

All proceeds from the entry fees and raffles went to Solutions to Avoid Red Tide (START), which is a grassroots, non-profit organization dedicated to funding and promoting efforts to prevent, control and mitigate red tide.

Each participant was offered free training in the art of net casting before the contest. Part of the drill includes holding the net in your mouth before flinging it as far and wide as possible.

The winners in the older youths' division were: David Nichols (first place), Zane Smith (second place) and Mitchell Vinalon (third place). The top three finishers in the younger youth division were: Nickolas Composta (first place), Jennings Ventura (second place) and Sam Archambault (third place). Tyson Tindle won the the Men's

division, followed by Harley Howell, Dan Howell and Roy West. Venisha Cohoon won the Women's contest ahead of Caroline Semerjian, Megan Flenniken and Andrea Pesci-Jones.

David Nichols of Naples celebrated his 14th birthday by winning his second consecutive contest. "It was pretty fun," he said. His stepbrother Mitchell Vinalon agreed. "It was pretty cool," he added.

Abby Neill was happy just to participate. "It was really fun, even if you don't win," she said. "It's not as easy as it looks."

As for the adults, Harley Howell felt no qualms about edging out his dad, Dan, for second place.

"It's no big deal," he said, while his father admitted he enjoyed vying against his sons.

"I love the competition," Dan said.

First-time participant Megan Flenniken decided to join the fun on the eve of her 23rd birthday.

"I work on the shrimp boat with Dave (Godfrey of Bait Box) and I know (event director) Ralph (Woodring)," she said, "and they told me to come down to see what it was all about. I think it's great to bring out a lot of the locals and

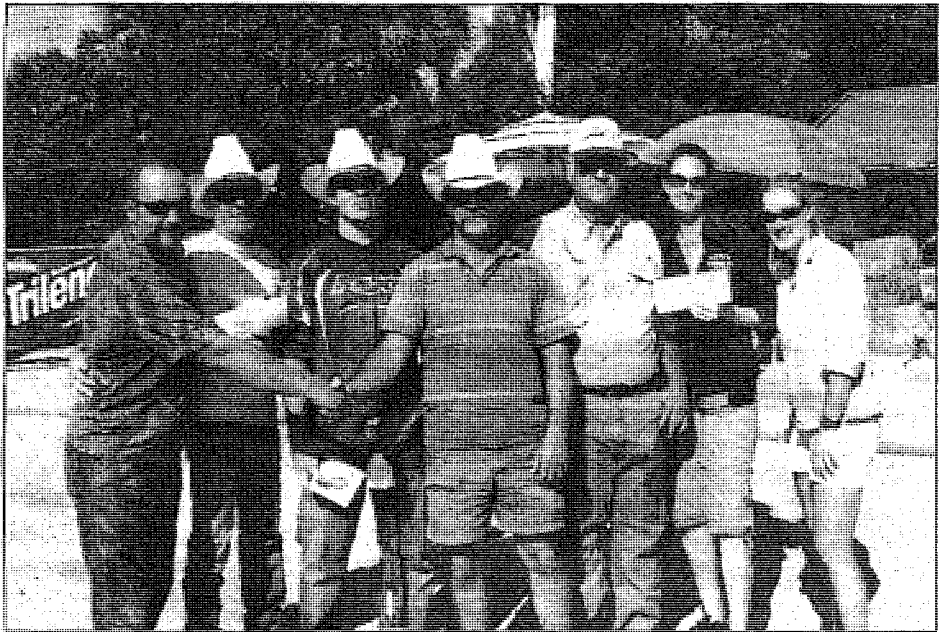
the kids to get them interested in the history of the island, because the rodeo's in memory of Esparanza. It's a great way to get people to remember the Island's history."

As for net casting, Flenniken quickly learned, "It's a little more difficult that it looks." As for the most important tip she received during her training? "Open your mouth so your teeth don't go flying out with the net," she said.

Lifelong Sanibel resident and Esparanza Woodring's son, Ralph Woodring, spearheaded the event and was happy with the turnout. "We've had more kids than we've ever had," he said, "and we're real pleased with that. It's a great thing, because basically this is what it's all about — for the kids. My mom loved kids, and she taught a lot of kids to cast nets, including my own over the years, so this is really special to me."

Many of Woodring's relatives were involved with hosting and running the event. They got together for a family reunion during the weekend of the rodeo.

Esparanza Woodring was born in Cayo Costa in 1901, and spent more than 75 years in the Sanibel area as a commercial fisher and guide. She was a net casting expert, and that inspired her son to establish the annual rodeo.

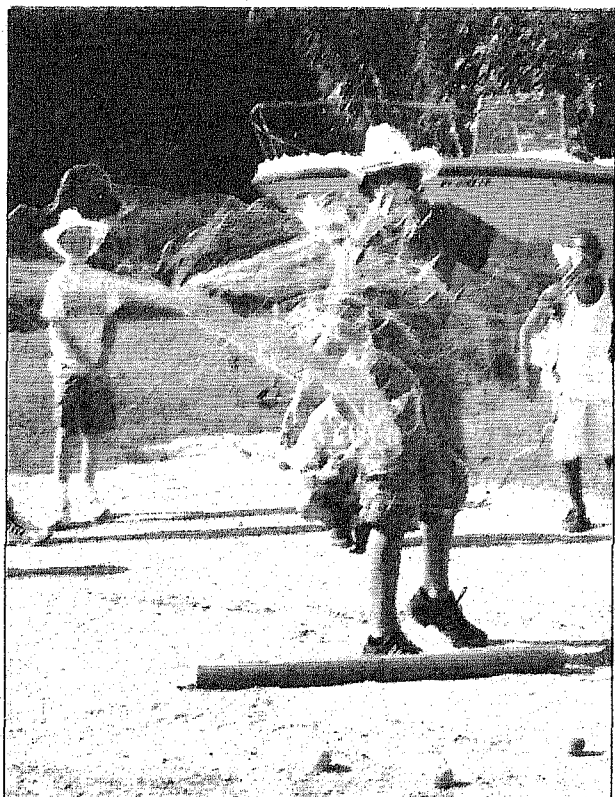

Mitchell Vinalon tests his net casting skills.



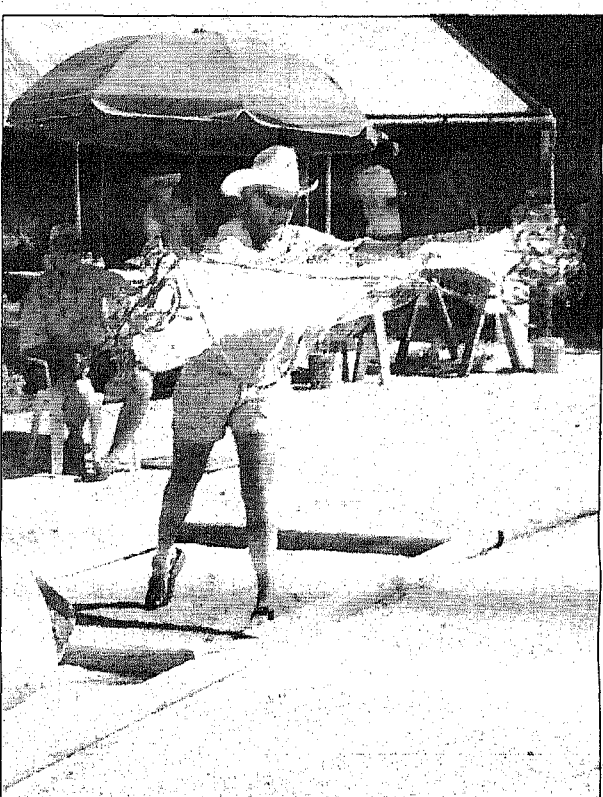

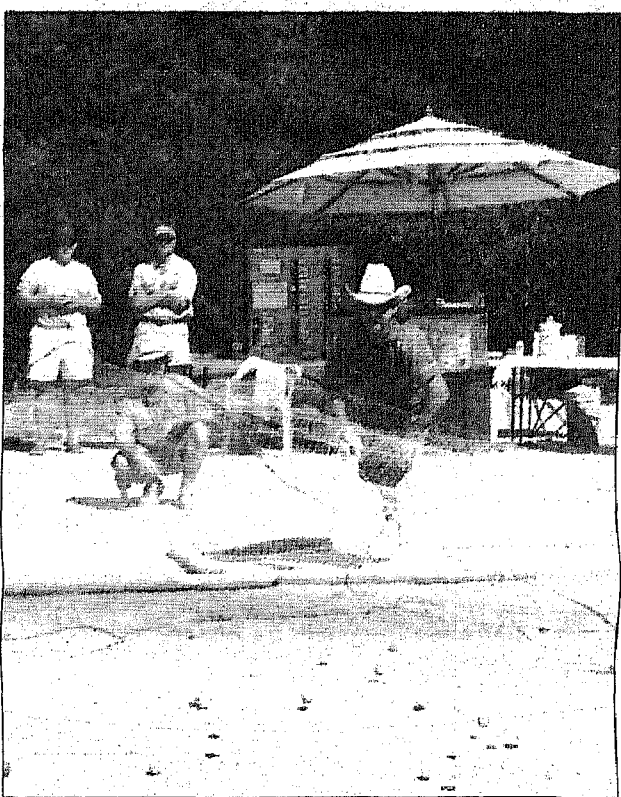

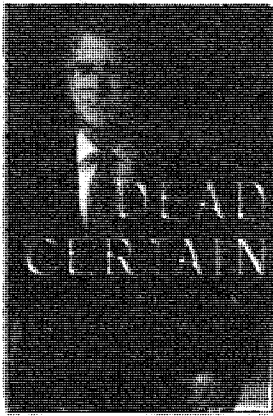
Best-selling author coming to Sanibel

In researching the book, Draper had rare access to the president himself — six hour-long interviews — and to key members of the administration, including Dick Cheney, Condoleezza Rice, Karl Rove and Laura Bush. He has put together a story of the Bush presidency with an emphasis on how the personality of this strong-willed president has affected the outcome of national and international

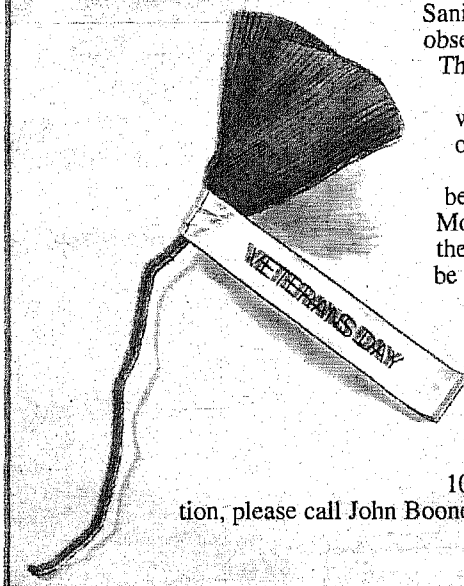
events.

Draper is a Texan who spent several years as senior editor of Texas Monthly and who now lives in Washington, D.C. and is a national correspondent for GQ magazine. He is also the author of "Rolling Stone Magazine: The Uncensored History," and a novel, "Hadrian's Walls."

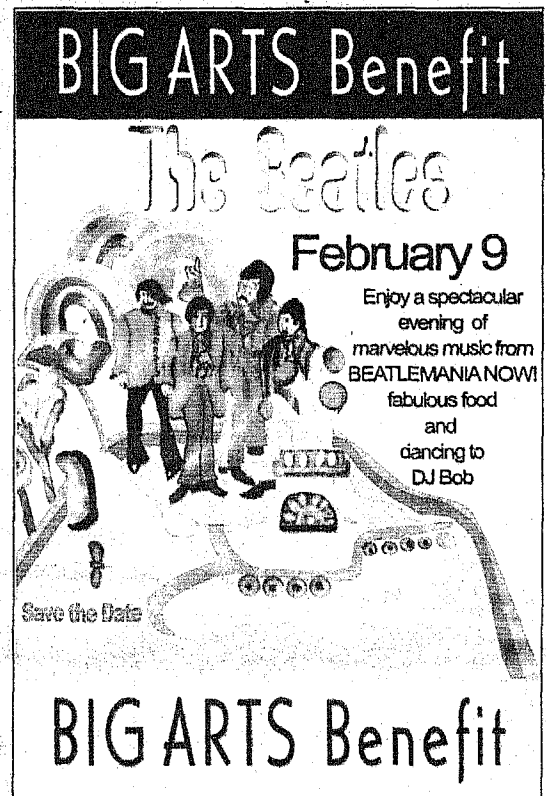

Over the years, BIG Arts has stretched like a rubber band and expanded its programming tremendously. Community members have been instrumental in our growth. 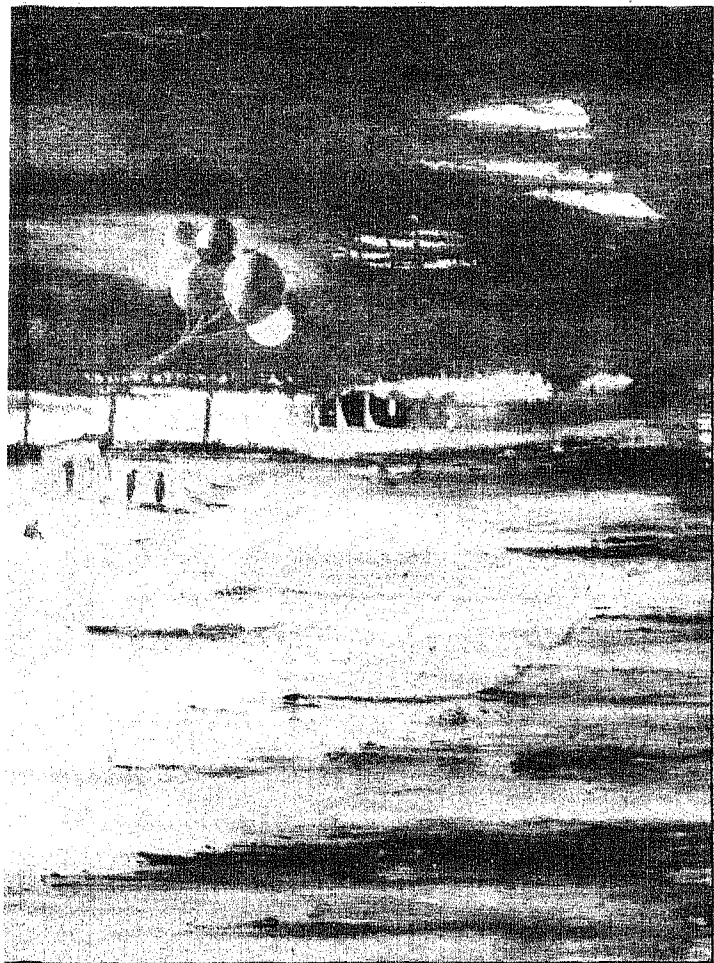

Award-winning FISH thriving with new walk-in center

It's no secret that Friends In Service Here (FISH) is very important to many Islanders. In fact, FISH recently was recently honored with a Best of the Islands award for the organization's contributions to the community.

After receiving a lot of help from the community during a fundraising campaign in February, the local FISH chapter opened its new facilities two months ago. The office is located at 2340 Periwinkle Way, Suite I-1, behind The Village Shops. Business hours are Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

FISH president Maggi Feiner was relieved to have most of the office renovated by the time the doors opened on Sept. 4.

"It happened through wonderful volunteers who were in here on Saturdays and Sundays sometimes until 7 p.m. helping to paint," she said. "It came through the wonderful service people on the island that donated plumbing, painting, carpentry work. It was scary towards the end of last week, but it all came together."

The inviting, peach-colored office features paintings by FISH volunteer and board member Toni Ory.

"She framed them, she hung them," Feiner said, "and they keep the office very cheerful."

There will be a grand opening later this year, when most of the volunteers return to the islands. Meanwhile, Feiner is excited about having the new facility available for those who need it most.

"The purpose of the walk-in center is to provide information to the community as to our various services," she said. "Also, we will direct people, if we cannot help them, where they can go for other services available."

FISH resource development director Bill Fellows has been a volunteer since last year and a board member since January 2007. He has driven clients, delivered meals and equipment, and he even helped paint the new center.

"FISH's goal is to assist people and maintain independent living in their home environment through the walk-in center," he said. "We now have an anchor site on the island that we've never had before, so people can actually come to us to gain information on how we can help them. Our biggest challenge is to get people to ask for help. We have a better opportunity now with a presence on the island. Now that we are more visible, hopefully, that will break down some of those barriers and will increase our ability to achieve our goal. People will see us and may ask questions about what we are."

FISH volunteers help their Sanibel-Captiva friends by:

- driving them to medical and dental appointments
- delivering them hot lunches and medical equipment, such as wheelchairs, walkers, canes and crutches
- visiting them when they're ill, shut-in or lonely
- providing them with information regarding health, safety and security.

The volunteers host the monthly Friendly Faces luncheon and provide transportation to anyone who wants to participate. They also answer clients' phone calls every day of the year.

"The majority of our clients do live alone," Feiner said. "And unfortunately, their families live quite a distance from them, or they don't have families. What we're hoping with this walk-in center is to get these people out and get them into the center because they want to feel useful. They can help us in the center — various tasks, like stuffing envelopes. Many of them truly want to give back because maybe we drive them to doctors' appointments, so they want to do something for us. We'll get them in there, and they'll have interaction with the volunteers."

"We have one gentleman who was at a Friendly Faces luncheon, and he told me he had not seen a living soul outside of a driver taking him to his doctor's appointment in over 30 days — no contact," she added. "He's one that would like to come in and help out."

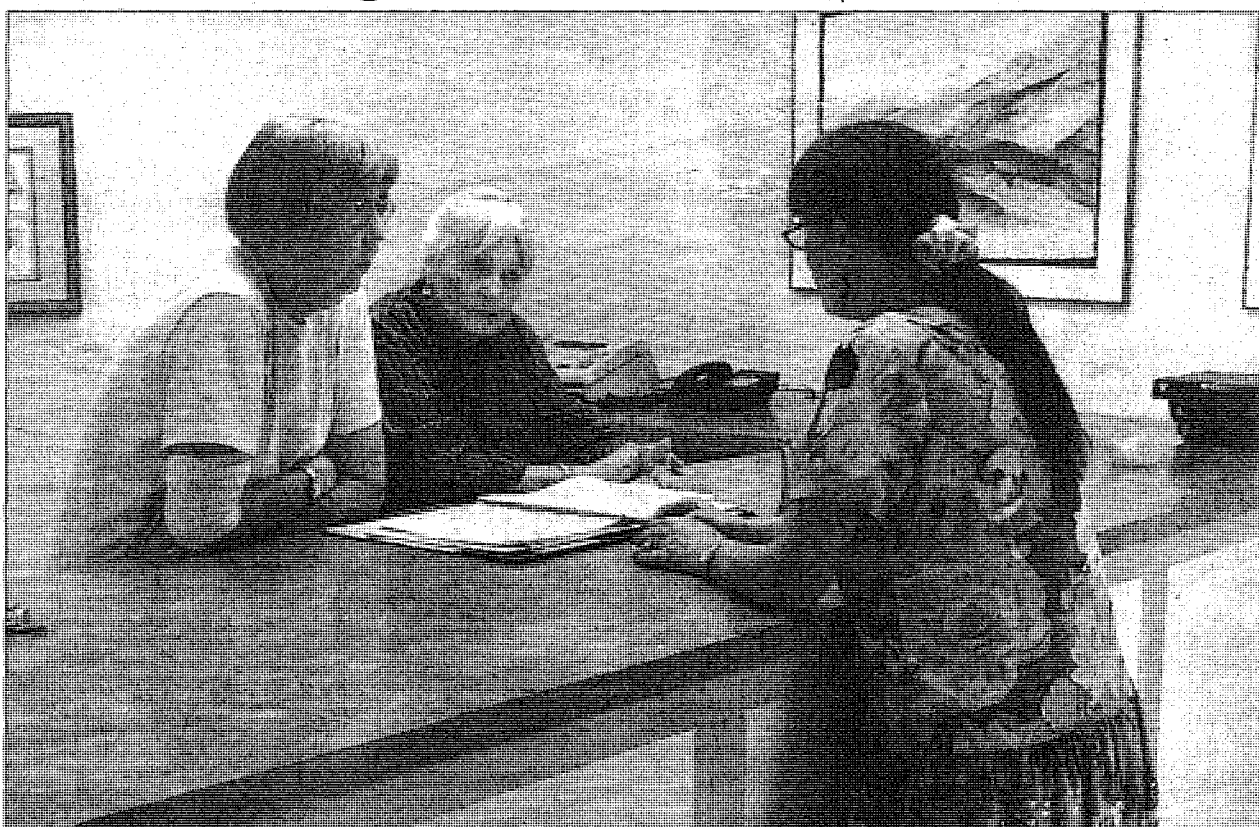
"We sponsor an Alzheimer's support group which meets monthly here on the island," Feiner said. "It is run by a professional from the Alzheimer's group in Fort Myers. They come out here, they meet with individuals, discuss the problems, situations, what they can do, how to diagnose Alzheimer's if they need, and give them any helpful hints as far as support."

"We have a hurricane committee that works very closely with the city as well as the county on emergency preparedness," Feiner continued. "We maintain lists of people here that we contact, we help them fill out special needs forms, we help them get their hurricane passes. We make sure, if they stay, they have a list of all the things they're going to need to get through a hurricane. We also maintain a list of hotels that are handicapped accessible, have restaurant ability, and are also pet-friendly. The majority of our elderly people have animals, and when we were hit with Hurricane Charley, these people did not leave because they were concerned about where they could go. They did not want to go to shelters, they didn't know where to go, and they were not going to leave their pets at home."

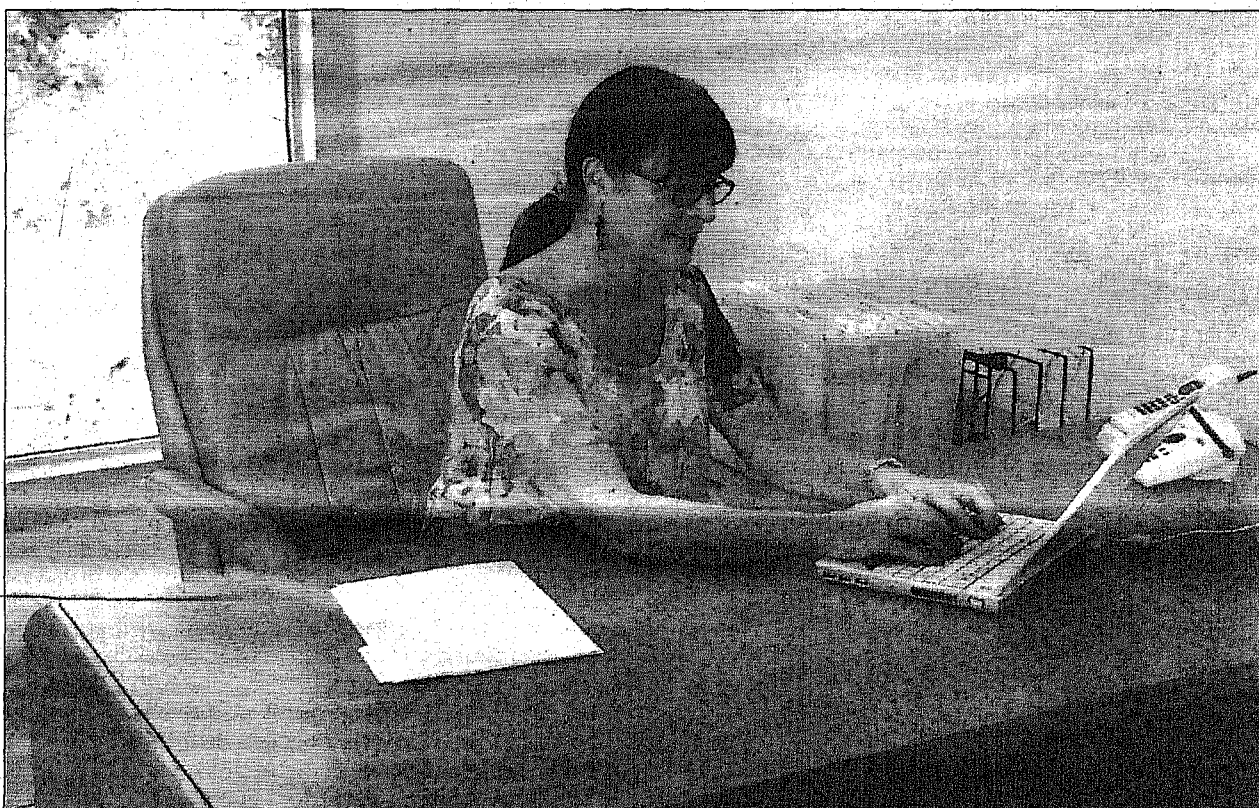
"Transportation is a big part of (FISH)," Fellows said. "We take people to doctors' appointments, hospital visits, physical therapy sessions — non-emergency transportation needs on and off the island. Last year, we had 132 individual clients and we had over 2,000 requests. So that's an average of 40 calls a week that were responded to."

Nearly 100 FISH volunteers help out during season; however, that number dwindles to a dozen during the summer, while the demand for services remains constant. Feiner always welcomes new helpers to join the team.

"It's a wonderful opportunity for volunteers," she said. "Last year, our volunteers drove over 15,700 miles, they volunteered over 2,500 hours, and we delivered in excess of 800 meals. We also delivered over 300 pieces of small equipment. We have meal delivery at noon every single day for people. The wonderful thing about FISH volunteers is they can give as much time as they want or as little time as they want. They usually do anywhere from one day a month to five or six days

a month. Many of our volunteers are active in other areas of volunteering on the island.

"We have volunteers on (phone duty) 24 hours a day," Feiner added. "They answer every phone call that comes into our main phone number at that point. The phone volunteer goes to a directory and finds a volunteer that is willing to help with whatever that specific need is. If it's for a driver, they'll find a driver. If it's for equipment, they'll make arrangements for the equipment to be picked up and delivered. They're involved 365 days a year."

Fellows has enjoyed aiding other islanders. "As a volunteer, the direct feedback you get is so rewarding," he said. "You hear from the people you're helping how we have allowed them to stay in their home. Without us, they would either have to move out to some other care facility, and they're just so appreciative of just the little bit of time we give them. You get a lot back. You hear all these old stories about Sanibel, you hear very interesting things about the past that you would never be exposed to if you weren't volunteering."

Volunteers Carolyn Graham and Nancy Dorrity were at the center when it opened. "I do meals, I do phones, and I do visitations," Graham said. "It's nice to give back."

Dorrity, who has worked with Zonta and Bright Horizons, was making her FISH volunteer debut. "I wanted to do something," she said. "FISH is something I've always been interested in."

Feiner expects awareness of the new facility to increase in the coming months. "We'll start picking up business," she said, "and then as more families return, and the children of families return, I think we'll have a lot more people in here. We're hoping to identify more individuals out there who need help, and not only need help, but that we can actually help them live much more independently and easier in their homes."

"It's not an activities center," Feiner added. "It's truly a walk-in center. As Bill was saying, we're trying to get the exposure out there. There are many people on this island who do need help. It's very hard when someone calls into FISH and says, 'Let me find out about your services' over the telephone. You really have a hard time reaching them. So, we're hoping that by them coming in or their families bringing them in, they can sit down and put a face with the organization. We can really discuss what their situation is, what needs we can

handle, and if we can't handle it, who we can refer them to for assistance."

"We're very careful to not be redundant with any of the other great organizations on the island," Fellows agreed. "It's not the senior center. We try to fill the gaps that those organizations are not filling, so we look for that little niche where we can help out. We think we have a unique opportunity here to provide direct service to people. Our measure of success is increased volume of activity. The more calls we get and the more help we provide is how we measure success. We're anxious to step up to the needs, so that's why it's so important that we become more visible and people will know enough about us to ask for help."

Fellows credits the local for a fundraising campaign earlier this year for financing the facility. "We're so appreciative of the island residents," he said. "That allowed us to not only open up the center, but to enhance our equipment, too."

Feiner stressed that all the services FISH provides are free; however, the organization is maintained strictly through donations, which will be accepted at the new walk-in center.

Not A One Time Event



Holistic Health Notebook

Getting into good physical condition is like cleaning your house. You dust, mop and tidy on Saturday... then do it again on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. If you keep up with it, the task is not quite so large, but the house needs attention on a regular basis.

Same with your body. You sweat, grunt and pummel your body into shape... then do it again and again and again. Fortunately, if you perform regular maintenance, staying in shape is not as difficult as getting into shape.

What else do you need to keep your body toned? Adequate amounts of protein, eaten at regular intervals throughout the day. Muscles and visceral tissues are constructed of protein.

When working with overweight clients, I often find that unless they are consuming enough protein for their metabolic needs, muscles erode rapidly, even if they are punishing their bodies at the gym. How much protein? The average man needs about 75 to 85 grams of protein per day (more if he is working hard or under stress). The average woman requires about 45 to 65 grams per day (ditto the added conditions, with an additional protein requirement if she is pregnant or lactating.)

Eating protein throughout the day stabilizes blood sugar, which helps keep energy levels high and reduces adrenaline surges that can sabotage lean tissue and build a spare tire around the waist.

Fat is needed, too. The right kinds of fats. The right amounts of fat. But eat fat to lose fat! Fat is critically important to health and I often find that people do not eat enough of the good fats.

Depending on metabolic rate and activity levels, I recommend from four to eight servings of fat each day (serving size: 1 teaspoon). Sprinkle olive oil on your generous salad. Use fish oil and flaxseed oil each day. Prepare your soups with a little butter and olive oil.

Last, eat vegetables. Can I say it stronger? EAT VEGETABLES! I know of no other health habit that confers as many benefits to the body as eight to 12 servings of fresh vegetables each day. Of course, eight servings of vegetables is not four cups of mashed potatoes.
