Ogling the octopus joubini



Cephalopods are the most highly developed mollusks and include the octopus, squid, cuttlefish, and nautilus. Cephalopods are found in all the oceans of the earth and at all depths. They are widely regarded as the most intelligent of the invertebrates and have well developed senses and large brains. The octopus can walk and swim rapidly, as well as change color at will which serves as communication and camouflage.

The octopus usually hunts at night, concentrating mostly on crustaceans, clams and snails. It grabs its prey with its arm and injects it with poison. Its jaws are armed with a parrot-like beak and a toothed radula used for scraping, cutting and

chewing food before it enters the esophagus.

The octopus can move backwards by jet propulsion, with its eight tentacles trailing behind, or by walking slowly using the hundreds of suckers on its tentacles. It brings its "catch" back to the hole or crevice in which it lives.

During the day the octopus devours its catch and tosses the broken shells outside its home, which is a dead give-away for divers searching for an opportunity to view these intriguing creatures.

A species of octopus seen frequently on Sanibel is Octopus joubini. As we discovered last week, this intriguing creature is nimble and small enough to fit inside a little fighting conch. The bite of the small Sanibel octopus can be very painful, which we were pleased not to experience first hand.

Learning effects about early childhood trauma

wrote about the lingering effects of childhood trauma on the brain. It is a sad topic, isn't it? Particularly when considering the statistics of how many children and teenagers suffer trauma? extreme The effects do not go away with the passage of time.

The reason I am exploring this theme is that I recently attended a seminar by Dr. Ellen Wright, a medical doctor who deals with these issues, and she related how this type of stress affects the balance of neurotransmitters and hormones later in life. She correlates trauma with later development of depression, ADD/ADHD, and inflammation.

Here are some tidbits from her PowerPoint presen-

Prenatal or early life stress may increase the likelihood of maladaptive immune responses to stress in late life.

Current studies of indi-

vide evidence of alterations in the neuroendocrine system that involve levels and activity of cortisol, DHEA and changes in immune function that predispose these indi-

viduals toward an innate (Th1) immune response.

There is a genetic link that increases vulnerability when associated with traumatic early life events, particularly serotonin in response, which can increase the risk of depression and suicidality.

Dr. Wright suggests that when an individual complains of major depression, anxiety disorder, ADD, ADHD, or dissociative disorders, they should be screened for early childhood trauma. The problem is that when these symptoms are present, the treatment of choice is often drug therapy, which may or may not resolve the underlying


several therapies, including individual and group therapy, EMDR (rapid eye movement), music and/or art therapy, and nutritional modulation of the neuroendocrine system.

I am particularly fascinated with that last recommendation, because we know that the balance between calming and stimulating neurotransmitters can be altered by specific nutritional therapies. One of the most useful tools in assessing neuroendocrine balance is urinary neurotransmitter test-Some of the brain chemicals that can be tested in this manner include serotonin, epinephrine, norepinephrine, PEA, cortisol, and many others. In the hands of a doctor who understands this instrument and can provide appropriate nutritional support, this test can provide real-life solutions to these

complex problems.

Gemstones are worn as amulets, in jewelry, or simply carried loose about the person. They may be whole or ground into powder and used as medicine. Various gemstones were often used to prevent or cure common ailments and in ancient times were also endowed with magical properties.

Today gemstones are still highly regarded as powerful amulets and talismans for protection against the effects of the paranormal realm. Below are the six must-have stones for ghost hunters - truly spooky!



The line's debut, however, was as auspicious for new passengers as it was bold.



Local artist describes work as self-taught folk art

It took being out of work, a hurricane and a whole lot of boredom to draw out the artist in Jen

Before moving to Southwest Florida from Ohio seven years ago, the 30-year-old had never painted a thing.

First, it started with coconuts. The Sanibel resident began painting them to send home as gifts to her family back in Ohio. She got a following after someone noticed one of her deccoconuts and requested she make one for

"I couldn't believe it," she said.

But after Hurricane Charley struck Sanibel four years ago, Slind really caught of case of artsy fer-

vor. "After Hurricane Charley, there was so much debris laying around. Living on Sanibel, I had no power, no job and nothing to do," she said. "However I had lots of paint and tons of plywood from boarded up windows and metal roofing in piles and piles. So I just started painting everything. I liked how my paintings looked on the plywood and particleboard, so I've stuck

with it ever since."
Slind said that she draws inspiration from the blues of the Gulf of Mexico and the regional flair of the vibrantly colored homes.

Her work, which can be found at YOLO Sports on

Captiva, includes brightly colored bird houses, glass jewelry with pieces of shell and sand from Captiva inside it and paintings.

"I guess would describe my art as self-taught folk art," she -said. "I haven't been formally trained in anything I do - I just sort of figure it out as I go along. I've branched off into fused glass and mosaics."

"I like incorporating found objects in my pieces and recycling things like Corona bottles and caps because they are very abundant on the island," she continued. "It's so fun and so rewarding every time someone purchases something I created. My pieces are very reasonably priced. I always tell people that they can own a Captiva beach house for as little as \$20. Of course it's only a bird house, but it's by far the cheapest real estate on Sanibel or Captiva."

She calls her work "fun and not serious."

Slind also said that her pieces are one-of-a-kind and modestly priced so that everyone can afford to take home a souvenir of Captiva.

"You can take home three paintings for the price of one," she said.

Prices range from \$10 for a sign and \$49 for some paintings. The majority of her pieces cost \$29

Retrospective exhibit opens at BIG ARTS: The Work of Gale Bennett and his influence on artists

BIG ARTS opens two exhibits honoring the late Gale Bennett Wednesday, Oct. 1. The Legacy of Gale Bennett, Part 1: A 45-Year Retrospective will be in Phillips Gallery, and Part 2: The Work of His Students, will be in Founder's Gallery. Paintings by Betty Cater, Barbara Madsen, Don Rothschild, Marcy Calkins, Georgene Knight, Anne Walter, and Jane Hudson will be included. An artists reception will be held Saturday, Nov. 1 from 5:30 to 7 p.m. at BIG ARTS, 900 Dunlop Road, Sanibel.

Bennett, 68, died in March after a stroke, but he had battled illness for some time. He was the winner of the 2008 Angel of the Arts Achievement Award, and was a popular instructor at BIG ARTS, and in Giverny, France. He was a prolific painter, producing more than 30 paintings in 2007, which, according to his wife 'Cello, was close to his yearly average. She has donated his painting 'Three Palms' for sale to raise funds for the BIG ARTS Scholarship program in memorial for both Bennett and Bill Phillips, who died in August. Phillips was one of the founders of BIG ARTS, and Bennett had a great deal of respect for his lifetime of contribution to

the arts. 'Cello Bennett is one of the curators of the show, which highlights the evolution of Gale's work. His legacy spans over four decades and includes a variety of work from figurative to semi-abstract to impressionist. His fascination with the natural environment infused much of his work. Using only the primary colors; red, blue and yellow and white, he created vivid hues which showcase his talent for capturing light and color.

Bennett is remembered as a teacher with a huge, generous heart. His student, Pat Lally, recalls Bennett's advice, "Set yourself free, go for it" and "play music, stay loose and let it go." Artist Sheila Hoen, Bennett's student since 2001 said, "Gale Bennett liberated me from the confines of other painting instructors."

She added, "There is so much to say about Gale that one could write a book about his teachings; however, he always emphasized courage, the ability to exaggerate for effect, using your eye to analyze colors and contrasts in composition, and the importance of freeing yourself from the confines of the expected. 'Loosen up,' he'd say, 'an inspired painter knows when a mistake creates a great painting.' He emphasized the folly of over think-ing your work; 'If you are frustrated, you are painting with your mind and not your eye."

Artist Barbara Madsen said, "I'll never forget the day Gale came into the room reciting Yeats' poem The Coat. Gale hung his well-worn jacket up on a hook and asked us to paint it in the spirit of Van Gogh painting his shoes. The poem begins I made my song a coat/Covered with embroideries/Out of old mythologies/From heel to throat...We never could anticipate what Gale would ask us to do. He was an original"

original." For Bennett, a prolific output came along with his insatiable thirst for life. He grew up in Florida, studied at the School of Visual Arts in New York, and exhibited in Manhattan galleries, before returning to Florida for good in 1968. In 1996 Bennett opened ArtStudy in Giverny, France. He spent six months there every year and took students to paint in the garden of impressionist Monet. artist Glaude "Painting Monet's pond in the evening light," Hoen said. "It was magical." A quote from Claude Monet will be engraved on gravestone: Bennett's "Nature never ends." His




Pictured is a fused glass bowl by Petra Kaiser who will be instructing a class at BIG ARTS on Oct. 9







This year, we have the theme of 'Let's Go Outside," Westland explained, noting that this week's "Ding" Days are all about getting families, adults and kids alike, to reconnect with the great outdoors in addition to celebrating the centennial anniversaries of the three area refuges.

To keep with this year's theme, the week-long event will offer tons of outdoor activities for both youngsters and adult, from live animal presentations to biking and boat tours.

There will also be a few special guests, everyone from a Teddy Roosevelt re-enactor to exotic reptiles!

Roosevelt reprisor Joe Wiegand will make several in-charac-

ter presentations about the unique refuges that the President dedicated in 1908. On Tuesday, Oct. 21, at 7

p.m., Wiegand will make an appearance at the Sanibel School. The event is open to the public and is free-of-charge.

"Ding" Days begins on Sunday, Oct. 19, with a free beach

walk and a bird tour that costs only the refuge entrance fee.

Monday, Oct. 20, and Tuesday, Oct. 21, are jampacked with activities for people of all ages including bike, birding and kayak tours, a nature and sealife cruise, and a sunset paddle tour at Tarpon Bay Explorers.

On "Teddy Roosevelt Day," Wednesday, Oct. 22, Wiegand will come aboard Captiva

Cruises' narrated Roosevelt Channel Coffee & Cruise, which

departs at 8:30 a.m. from McCarthy's Marina.

At 11 a.m. on Wednesday, "Teddy" will appear at a free 100th Anniversary Celebration at the "Ding" Darling Education

Center, which will include cake and a presentation about 100year-old Matlacha Pass, Pine Island, and Island Bay National Wildlife Refuges.

What an amazing man Teddy Roosevelt was," said Westland, who was equally complimentary of the man who will be playing the president, adding that Wiegand was so impressed with "Ding" Darling during a visit, he agreed to come back especially for the refuge's special week of fun!

Thursday and Friday will echo the same adventurous activities, such as kayak and bike tours, nature cruises, and a special Roosevelt Channel Cruise and a Sunset Cruise, both on Friday,

through Captiva Cruises.

Another special presentation will happen on Friday at 11 a.m. in the Education Center, during which wildlife photographer Dudley Edmondson will speak about his new book, "The Black

and Brown Faces in America's Wild Places."

Westland said that Edmondson's book is about African Americans connecting and making careers in nature.

'And that's what we try to do. We try to get diverse audiences to connect with nature."

On two special days, some kids will get special explorer backpacks filled with tools to help them really enjoy their out-



Volunteers play vital role at museum

"Volunteers do not necessarily have the time; they just have the heart," according to author and writing coach, Elizabeth Andrew, The Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum is fortunate to have a team of 90 volunteers with servant's hearts. "Like most not-for-profit organizations we operate with a very small team of five full-time and six part-time employees. Without our generous volunteers, the Museum would cease operating as we know it today and the breadth of services provided would be impossible to deliver or support," reports José H. Leal, Director and Curator for the Shell Museum.

People volunteer for a wide variety of reasons. Some have the need to feel needed while others want to share a special skill, or make new friends. Many volunteers possess the desire to impact the world around them, while many merely want to demonstrate commitment to a cause like educating the public about shells and mollusks, heightening awareness of the natural environment and promoting shell and mollusk research.

According to Joanne LaFleur, Education Specialist for the Museum, "there is a long list of individuals who since the grand opening of the Museum in November of 1995, have contributed to carrying out the mission and vision of the organization. Ginny Avery and Peg Bisignani are representative of the spirit of the Museum's volunteer

"Ginny and Peg, origi-nally under the guidance of Anna Marie Nyquist, contributed to the creation of a phenomenal school program," reports LaFleur. "As a result of their efforts, more than 18,000 Lee

County students have experienced first-hand the world of mollusks. Students leave the Museum with an understanding that every creature plays an important role in nature and needs to be protected."

Early in her career Peg Bisignani was a third and

fourth-grade teacher. For years she dedicated her life totally to her family. But, when the children were grown she realized just how much she missed her interaction with school -aged children. While raising her family she was involved with cub scouts and coached a swim team so engaging with the Shell Museum's educational program was a natural fit. In the beginning she really didn't know too much about shells but the Museum's training program and some independent reading quickly brought her up to speed on the world of mollusks. "The Museum's children's program is wonderful," reports Peg. "The interactivity really makes the Museum come alive for the children, many of whom have never visited Museum before. It's surprising how many of the children and adults for that matter, don't realize that there is a living creature that makes the shell. The most rewarding experience is when the children get hooked and bring their parents to the Museum. It is incredibly exciting to listen to the children share their knowledge of mollusks with their parents." For many years Ginny

um or don't want to come season. The roles are as because they think it's varied as the individuals oing to be boring. Museum's school program is very kid- friendly and hands-on," reports Ginny.
"What keeps me coming back is witnessing the children's excitement when they visit the live tank and realize for the first time that there is a living creature inside the shell and eventually are able to connect this to the bigger picture of conservation of the natural world. Also, the Museum staff is very supportive and there is a fantastic group of dedicated volunteers that serve on the team."

Due to an increase in the number of Museum visitors and expansion of educationprogramming, Museum needs additional volunteers throughout the entire year, not just during who fill them. Q&A with SCCF's Rae Ann Wessel

Rae Ann Wessel is the policy director for the S a n i b e I - C a p t i v a Conservation Foundation.

Where did you grow up?

Around the world. My father was an entomologist and plant pathologist whose expertise was in crop pests which we followed around the globe. I was born in southern France, we moved to Mexico, New Jersey, Tokyo, Hong Kong, Taiwan, the Philippines, Hawaii, California then back to France and Africa.

What did you do after high school?

I attended the University of Nice, France then Wittenberg and Duke University.

Who/What inspires you?

Pioneers, the natural world and because of the work I am doing now I would include leaders who tackle difficult issues and make sometimes unpopular choices for the greater pub-

lic good.

What do you do in your spare time?

What spare time? My passion is exploring and learning about why things are the way they are and how they fit together with everything else. I enjoy travelling, sailing, scuba diving, hiking, reading and my garden...many more than I have time to engage.

You've done a lot of work for the restoration of both the Caloosahatchee and The Everglades (to name only two), why are you so passionate about Florida's waterways?

I feel connected to this place. I'd really like to see if we can breathe life back into these man altered systems that were once so functional, beautiful and balanced with the Florida environment. My training in limnology (study of freshwater systems) and marine science made south Florida an ideal place to study. I am in awe of the uniqueness of

this land- its history and the natural wonders that define it and the people and families who for generations have loved, survived and lived with natural Florida.

What would you consider one of your greatest achievements in life? Or are you working towards any goals right now that might one day be considered your greatest achievement?

work on the Caloosahatchee and I'd call it more of a work in progress. In 1994 I worked with the News Press to coordinate a community forum on issues related to the river. From that gathering of over 400 people we formed the Riverwatch group the Caloosahatchee River Citizens Association, (CRCA). We initiated a study of the rivers oxbows and I began compiling the history of the river, the oxbows and early settlers

river keeper, Charles Edgar Foster, who came to be known as the River Rat. With Charles' boat, my technical committee co chair John Capece and an intrepid band of volunteers we conducted surveys to document the physical and biological conditions of the oxbows, tributaries and surrounding land uses and the stories of the Caloosahatchee. We sponsored a river cruise to share the beauty and history of the Caloosahatchee with the public and ten years after we began, following years of talking about oxbow restoration to anyone who would listen, a grant funded the restoration of the first oxbow in Hendry County. We continue to work on getting at least half of the remaining 38 oxbows restored and the Oxbow and Riverlore cruises continue. It is not what I have done alone but what I have achieved with others that is the greatest achievement.

Why is conservation, especially in Southwest Florida, so important?

First and foremost it is our responsibility. Three others sum it up best for me:

The purpose of conservation: The greatest good to the greatest number for the longest time.

Visiting curator to lecture about declining mollusks

On Oct. 15 at 7 p.m.,
Thomas Watters, the
Curator of Mollusks at the
Museum of Biological
Diversity at Ohio State
University and the Science
Director of the Columbus
Zoo and Aquarium's
Freshwater Mollusc
Conservation and
Research Facility, will be
presenting a free program
called "The Silence of the
Clams" at the BaileyMatthews Shell Museum.

Watters' presentation will focus on Freshwater mussels, one of the most imperiled animals in North America that many people don't know exist.

According to Watters, two out of every 10 mussel species are facing extinction and dozens have already been lost forever.

Watters says he wears two hats in his position at Ohio State.

"I am Curator of molluscs at the Museum of Biological Diversity. The collection of freshwater mussels is among the largest and most important of its kind in the world."

The Museum of Biological Diversity is home to more than a half million specimens, all of which are electronically cataloged and the catalog is available on the web.

They also have large holdings of freshwater and land snails, with a significant collection from the Smoky Mountains collected by Mollusc Division personnel. In addition, the museum also has a large

collection of

Florida tree snails and an on-line mapping program of their distribution.

"We are most proud of our On-Line Ohio Mussel Atlas, which allows the viewer to query the many map layers in conjunction with over 30,000 mussel records. We are now working to increase the Atlas to all of Canada and the U.S.A.," Watters explained.

His other hat, Watters continued, is as Science Director for the Freshwater Mollusc Conservation and Research Facility at the Columbus Zoo & Aquarium.

"The facility is dedicated to researching freshwater mussels and propagating them in an effort to halt their march to extinction. We have successfully reared and propagated many species, including federally endangered ones."

The largest effort on the part of the Mollusc Conservation and Research Facility was to reintroduce the endangered Northern Riffleshell back into Ohio.

This reintroduction process involved the transplanting of 1,700 individuals from Pennsylvania to Ohio. All mussels were fitted with radio transmitters and released into Big

Darby Creek in Ohio.

According to Watters, this was the single largest introduction of an endangered species in the history of the state of Ohio.

"I will highlight some of this effort in the talk," Watters said.

Watters lecture will introduce the audience to the world of freshwater mussels-- from their biology to their demise.

"While people are aware of the plight of polar bears, whales, and other 'charismatic megafauna,' most are in the dark concerning the most imperiled of all of North America's animals - mussels," said, Watters.

"Dozens of species have been driven to extinction by the activities of mankind and many more are on the brink. To most people mussels are little more than living rocks," he added.

"The goal of my talk is to change that attitude.

Mussels have among the most bizarre and fascinating life histories of any mollusc, or any animal for that matter. I hope that when the talk is done the audience will have an appreciation of the plight of these animals and their unique place in the ecosystem, and realize that they are not 'Living

Rocks' but 'Mear Mothers!'" Watters said.


