Glee Club: 1; Senior Commercial Club: 4.

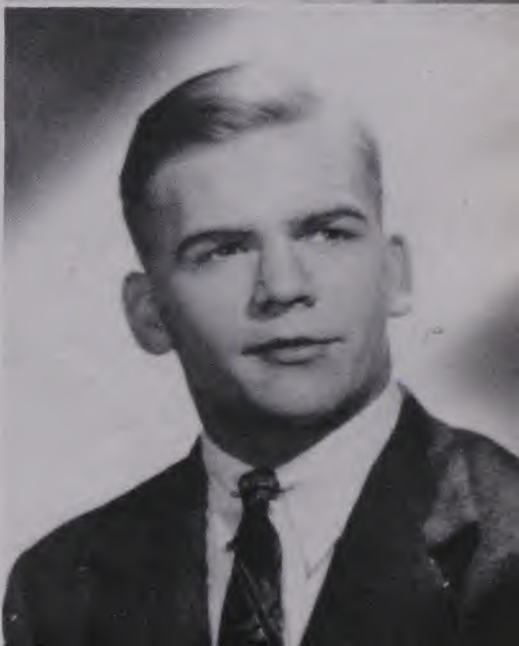

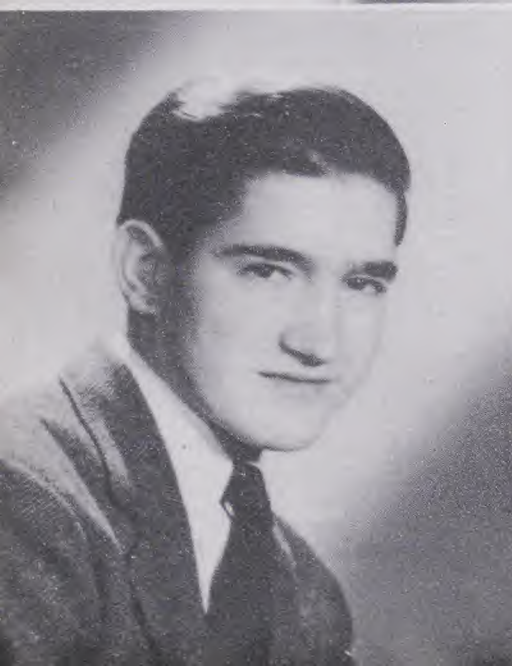

Who is chasing that girl? Timber is at it again. Blond and curly headed Jim is always conniving. Timber states that his only reason for coming to school is to see somebody.

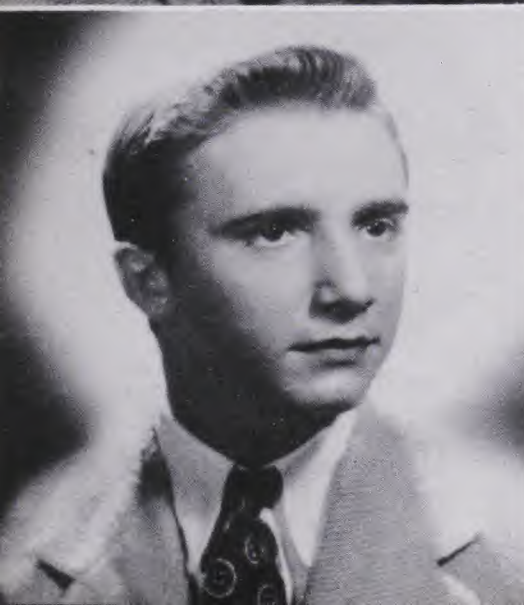


WILLIAM HOCKENJOS

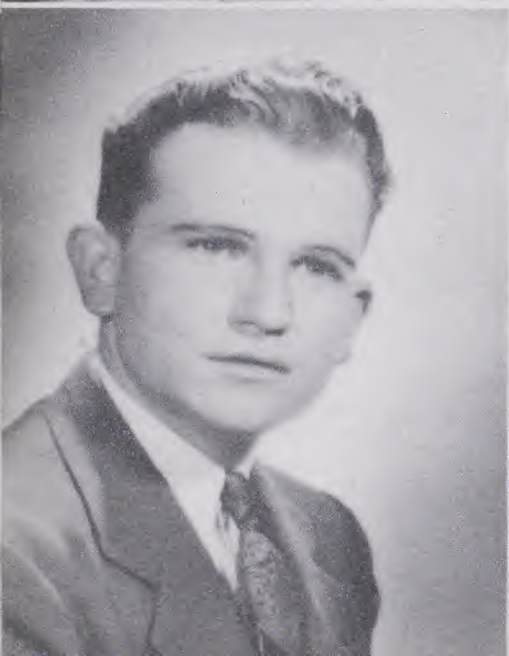

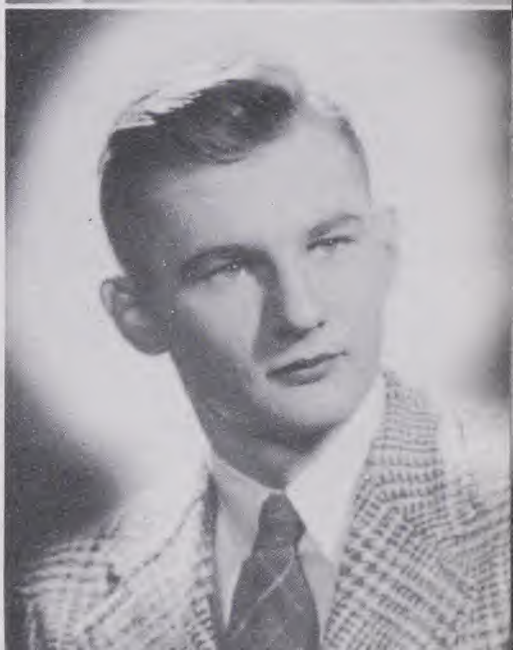


RAYMOND MIKLIOS
