She plans to attend college in the Fall but is still unsure of where. She clearly typifies the "excellent student," and the title Homecoming Queen is a tribute to her.











SOCIEDAD HONORARIA HISPANICA

The Quo-Vadis staff wishes the seniors in the Spanish Honor Society the best of luck in their future endeavors.












NHS SHINES AT SAYREVILLE


WORLD HUNGER DAY

This year's World Food Day presentation, led by chairperson and organizer Chris Corvino, was a very fulfilling and fruitful one.








Other courses that could generate some interest include current history, a course designed to force the student to be a worldly person, and economics, where one can learn how America balances its large budget.






Enough of boring classes like Biology and Physics. I don't want to be a doctor or an Engineer; I want a career in music!
























VARSITY SWIMMING






The French Honor society operates a tutoring service during the school year. In the spring semester, members are welcomed into the Sayreville elementary schools where they introduce the French language to younger children.




ECO/BIO CLUB




ACT






COOPERATIVE OFFICE EDUCATION
