
Memorial High School, "The Time is Now" to strive for our goals. As SWMHS celebrates its 50th year, new opportunities have opened up to aid students in their quest for success.




VARSITY BASEBALL






VARSITY GOLF


VARSITY FOOTBALL






VARSITY WRESTLING









QUO VADIS




