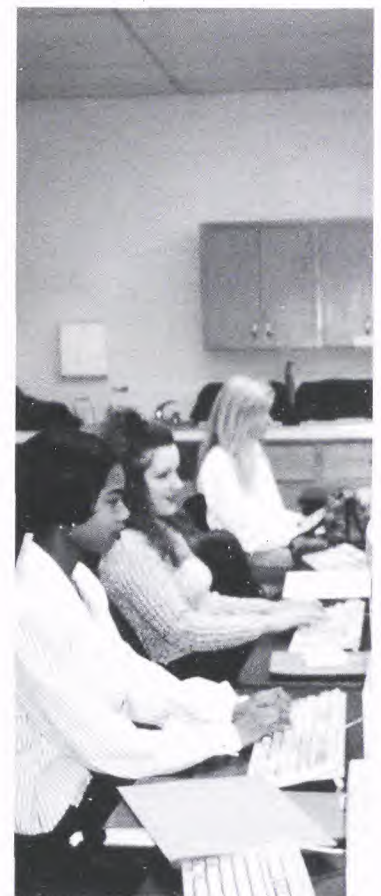

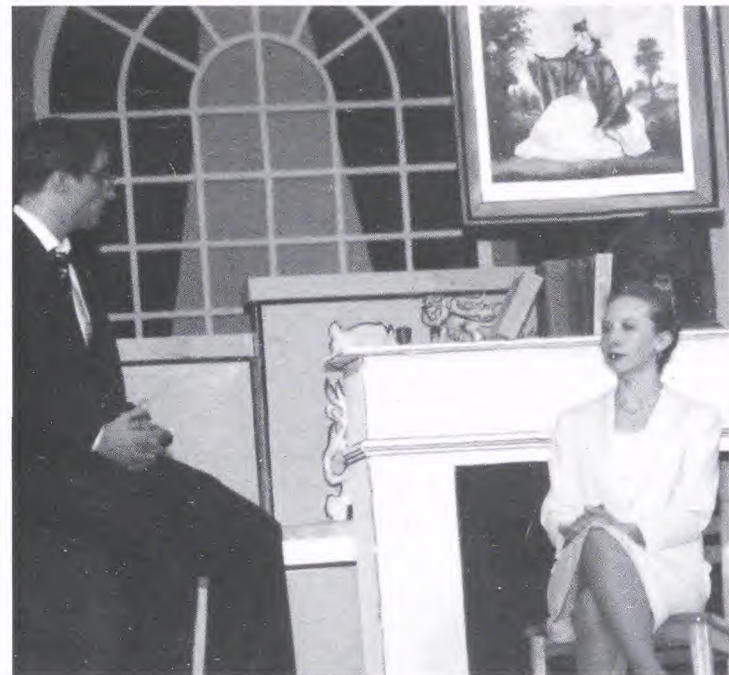
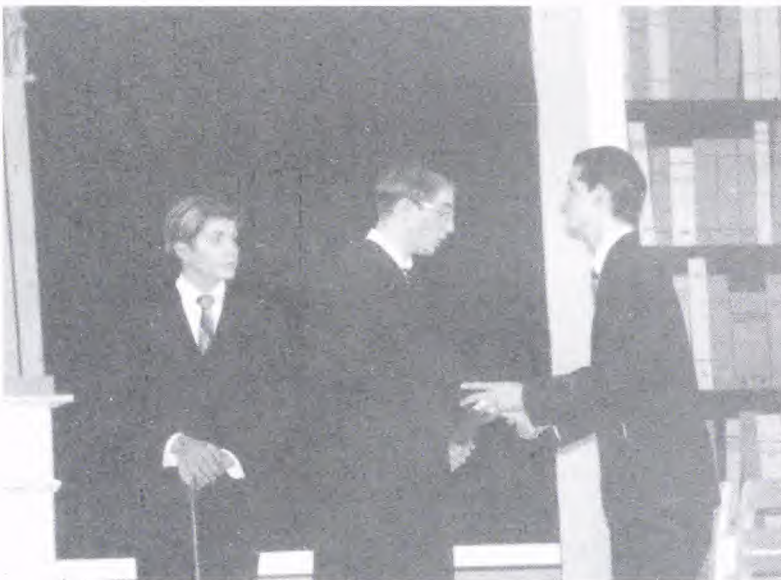
MATH CLUB

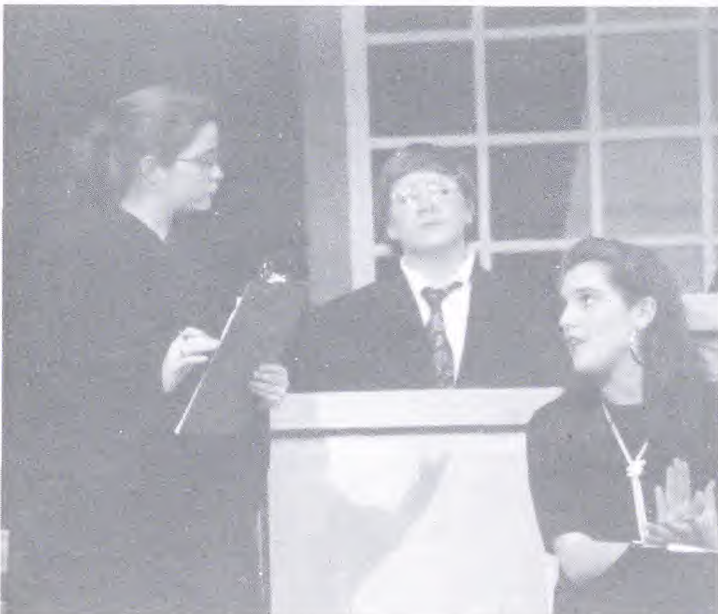






WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION

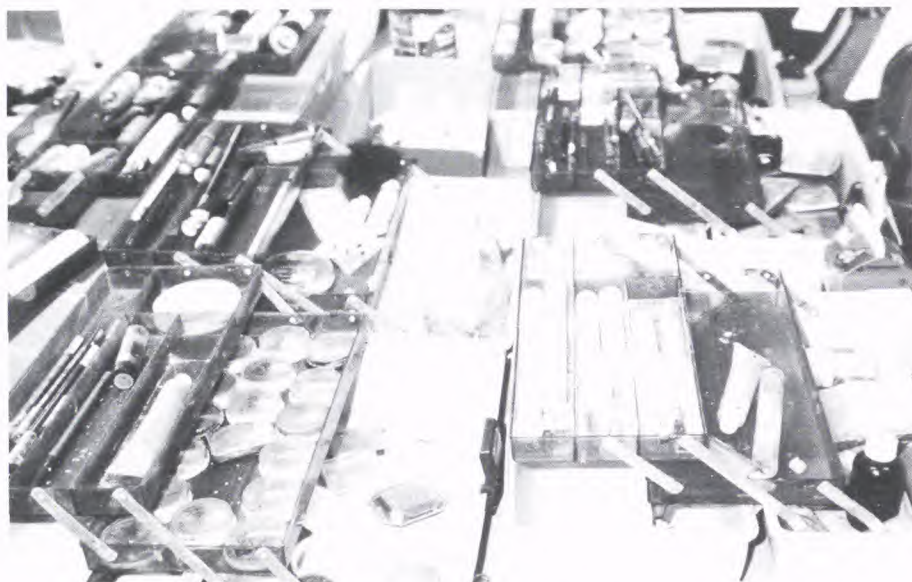

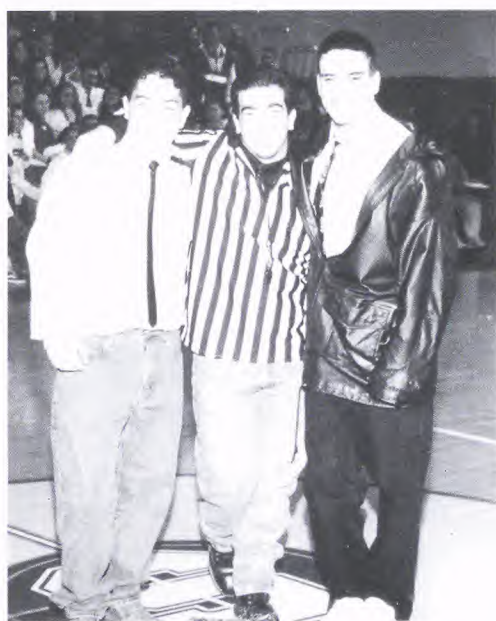

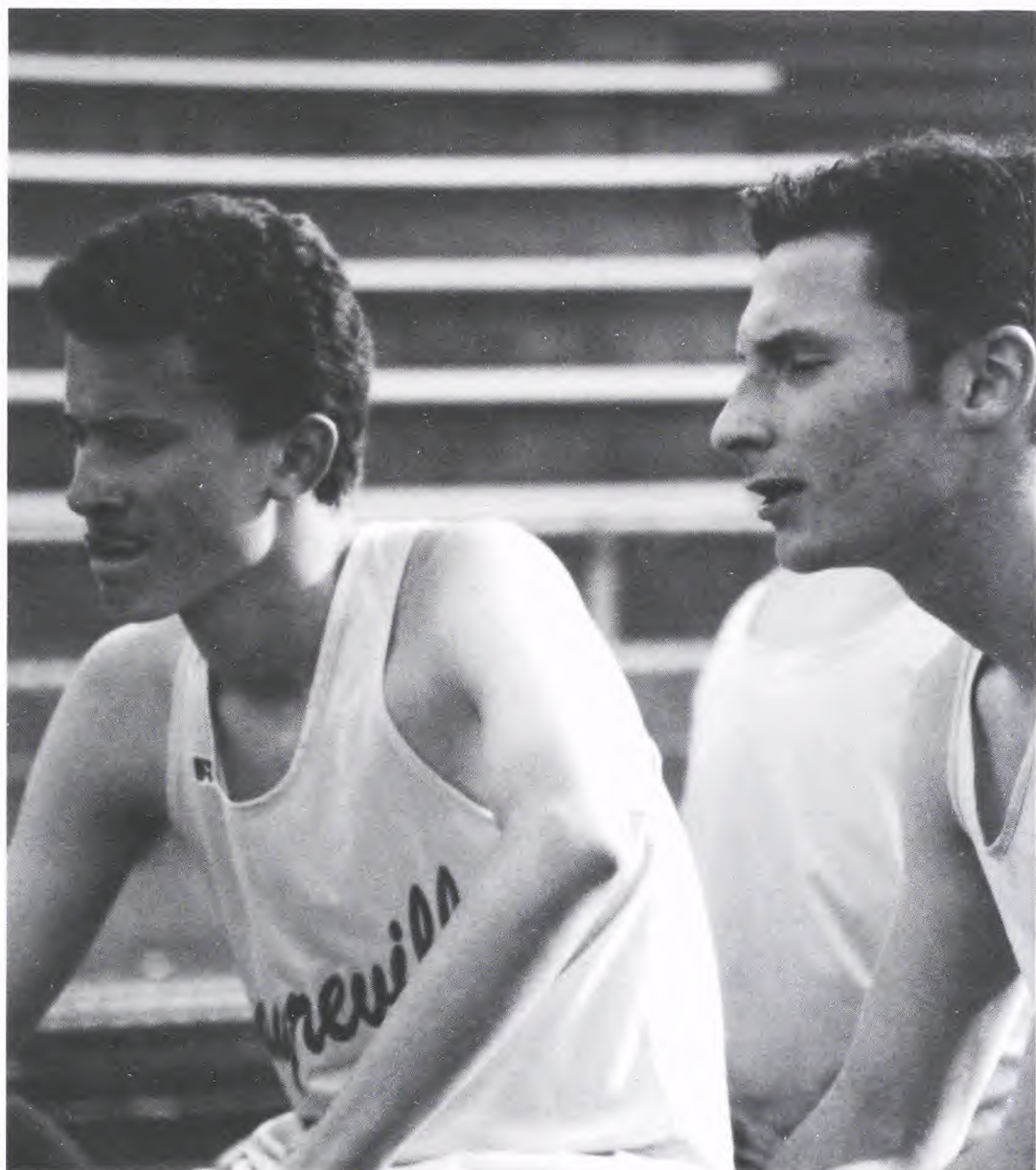

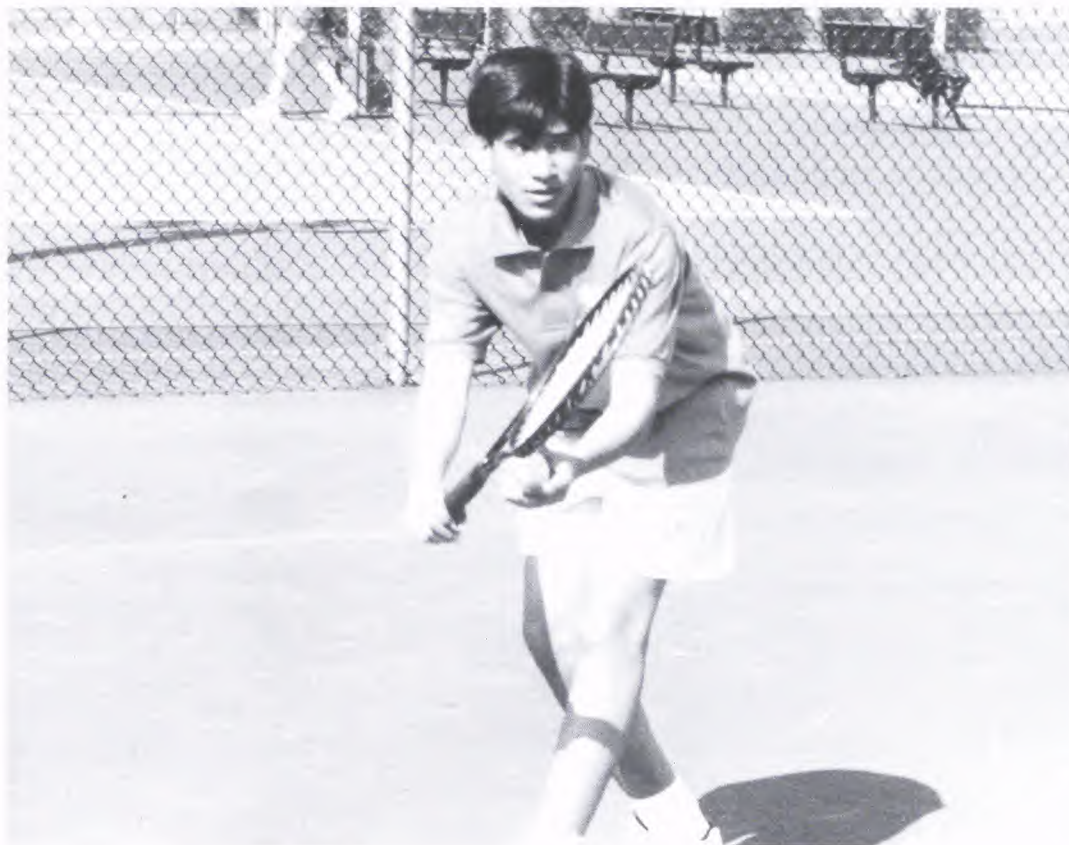

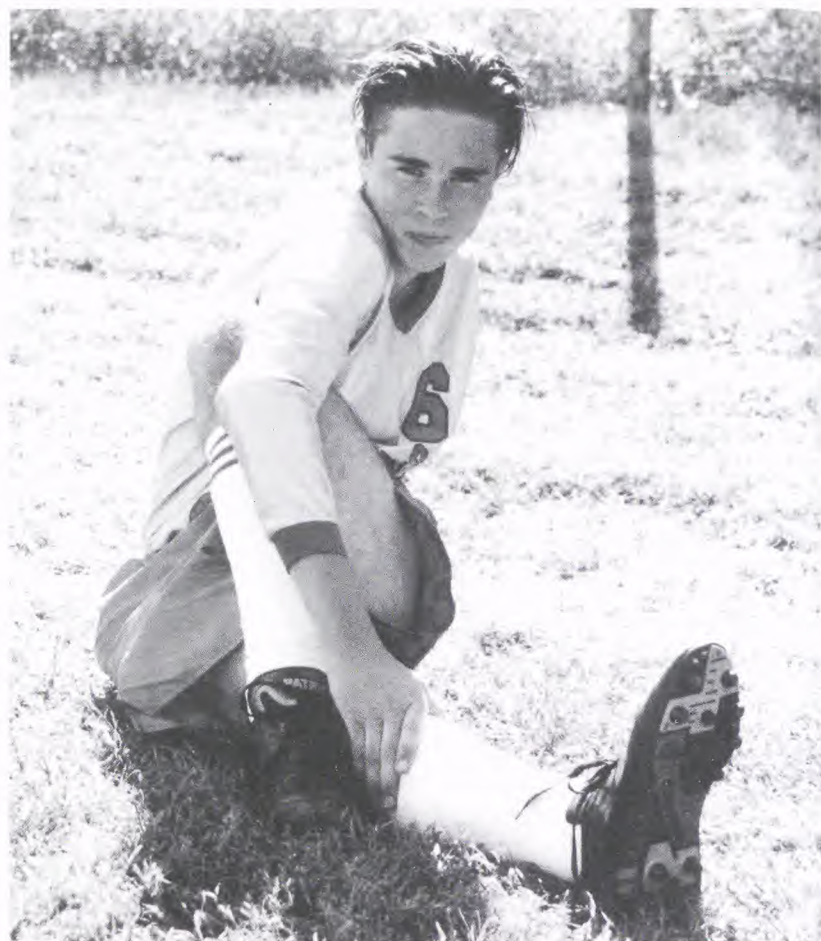

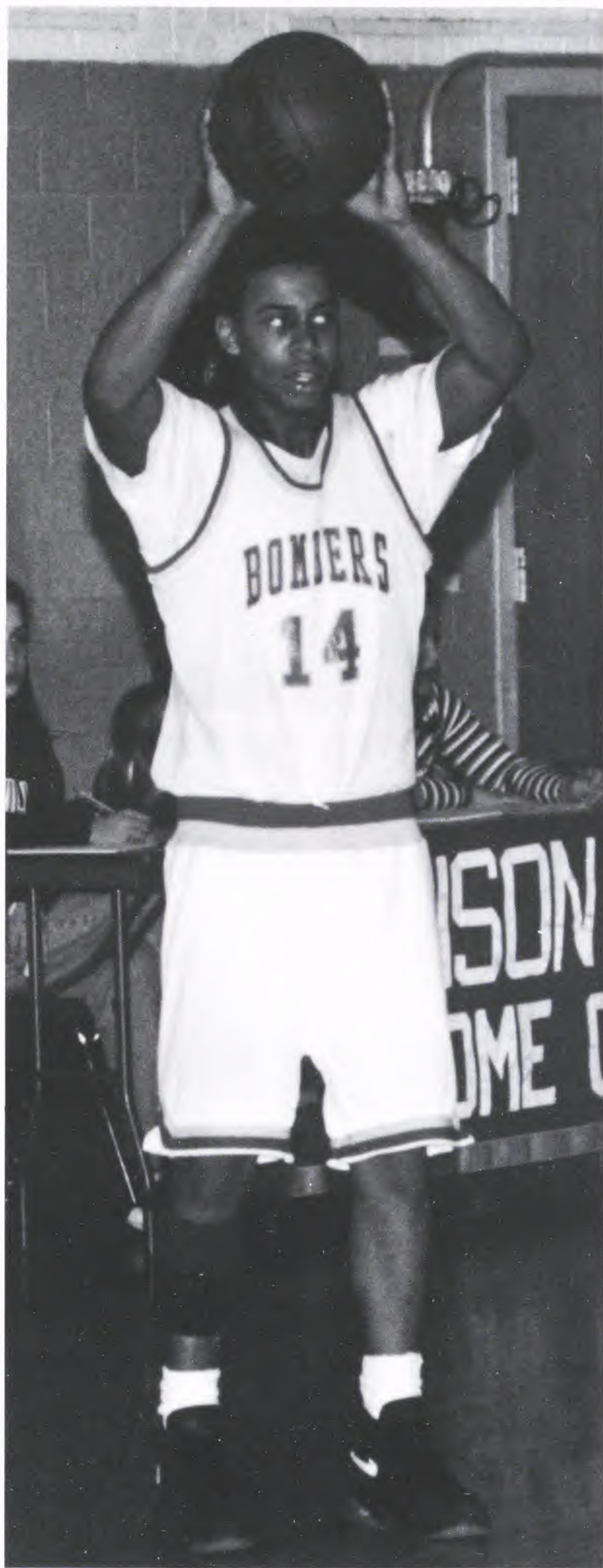

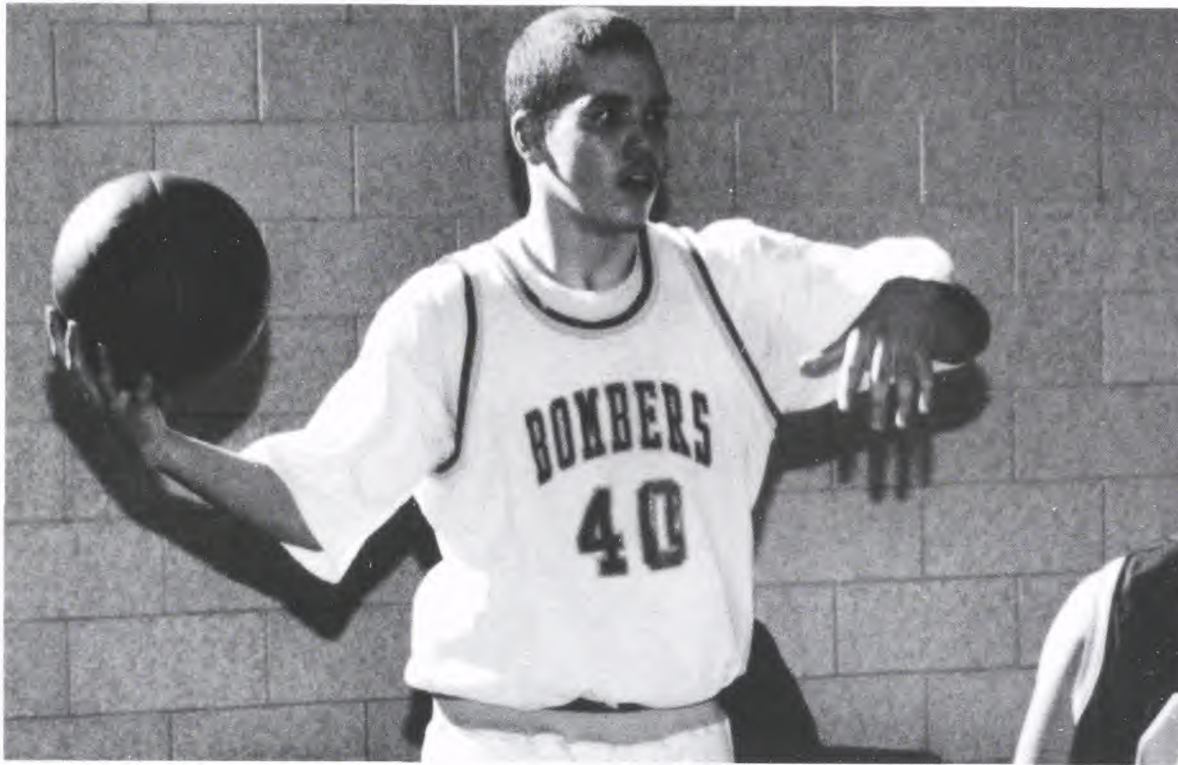
