






#### JUNIOR PROM

Gray.






#### **BONNIE HUANG**




#### **GREGORY STRICKER**


species, while traveling abroad.






























## JENNIFER BORKOWSKI

On her free time, Jennifer Borkowski enjoys bowling, music, volleyball, and making her own books, book bags, and clothes.
















## LAURA KENNEDY
























# PHYSICAL EDUCATION










# **NHS**


#### A.S.S.I.S.T.



#### **DECA**



ant Treasurer Mike Waranowicz.














# BOYS TENNIS














