
to People Student Ambassador Program.

With all this work, Derek still tries to spend time writing poetry and other prose pieces, thinking, traveling, listening to music, and watching animated Disney movies.



On her free time, Jensen sings, plays the piano, swims, hangs out with her friends, and helps out with the school's music department.




Leland Norris






























PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The team was coached by head coach George Najjar and senior captains Joseph Lardino, Omar Joseph, and John Nuber.

































NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

The National Honor Society is a prestigious organization composed of seniors chosen during their junior year on the basis of their academic and extra-curricular excellence.



I'd like the tears of those who grieve, to dry before the sun of happy memories that I leave behind when day is done.




