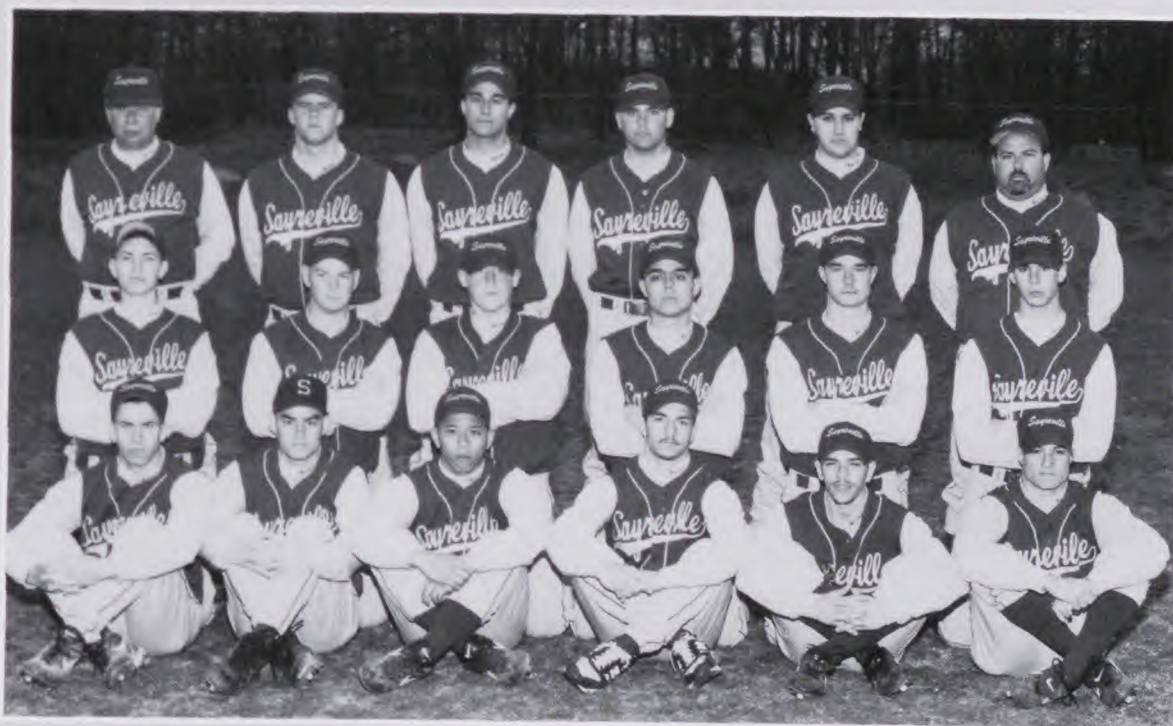

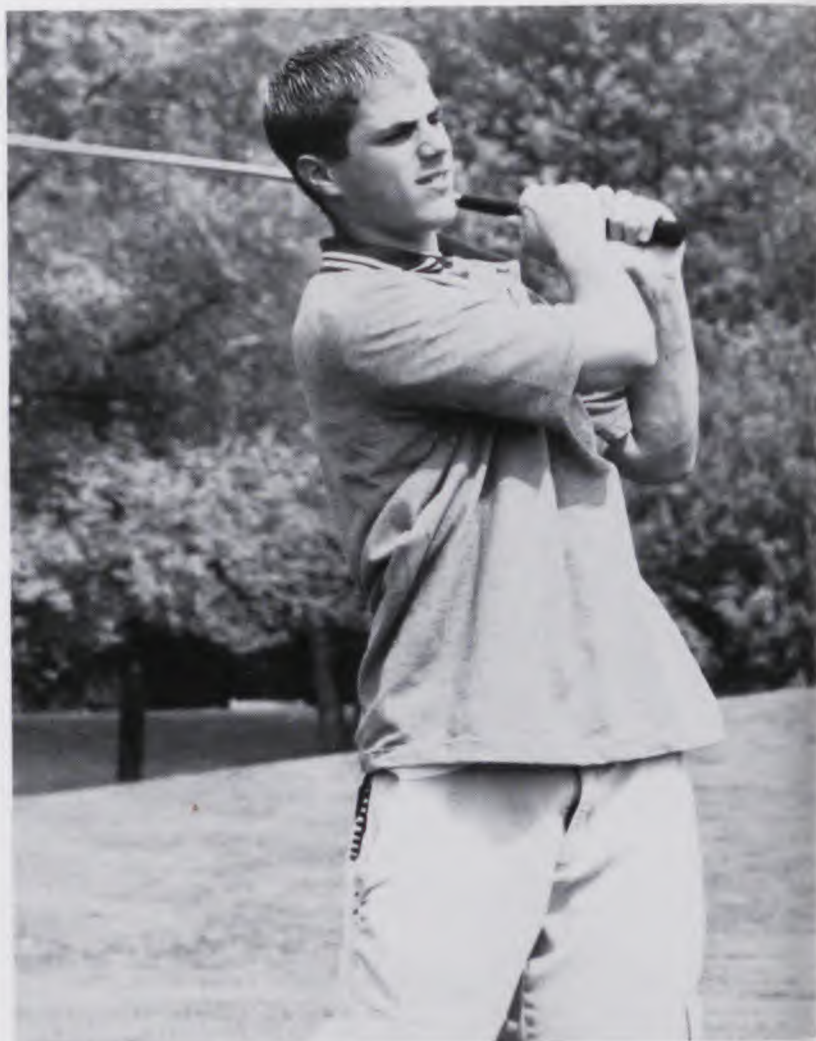

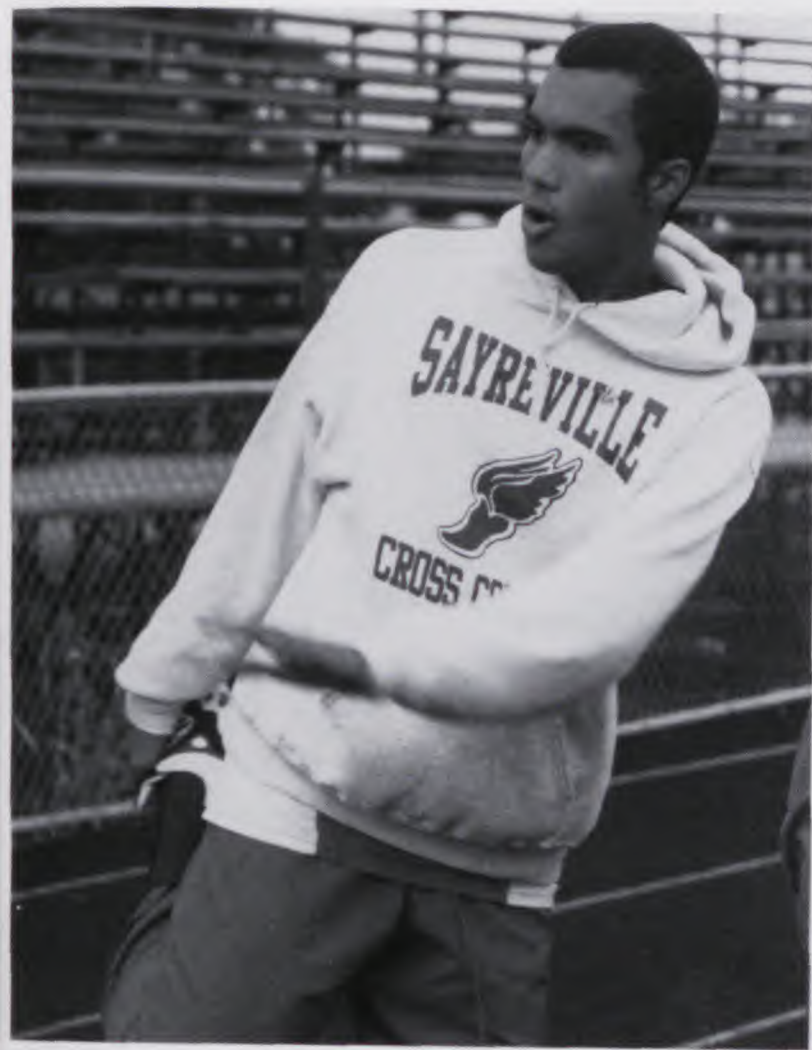

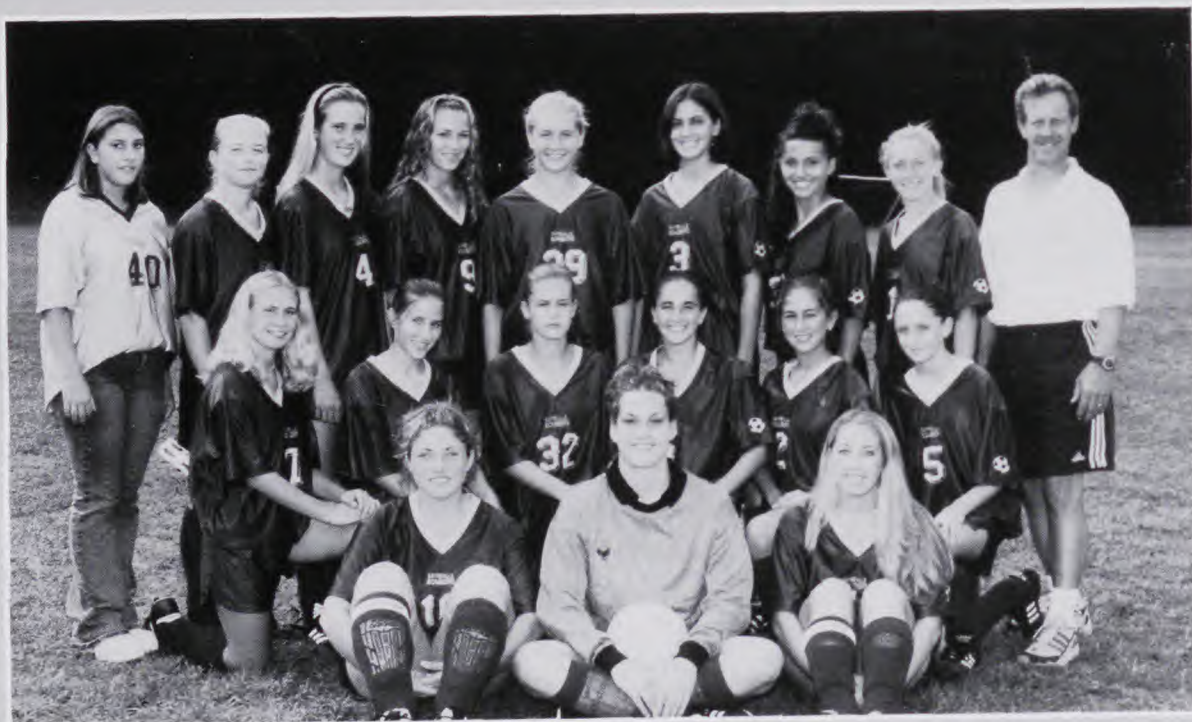

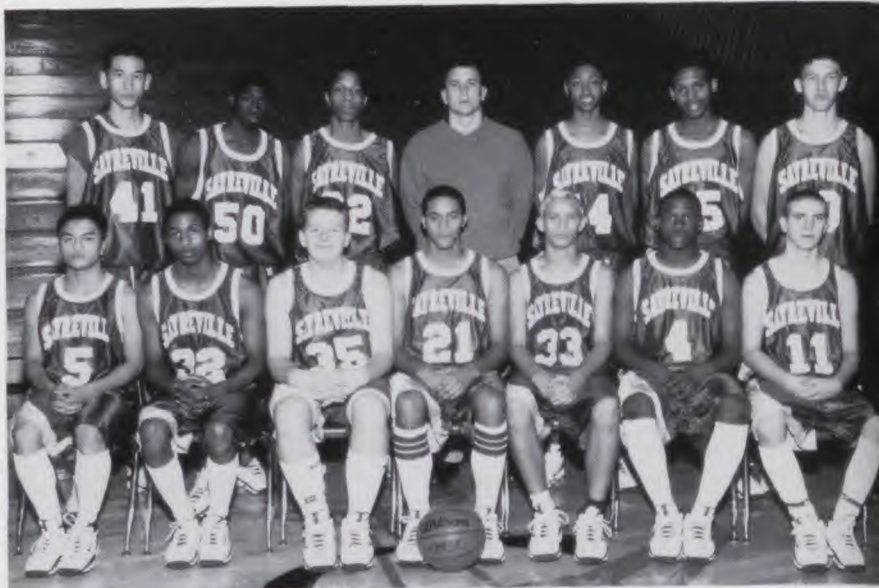

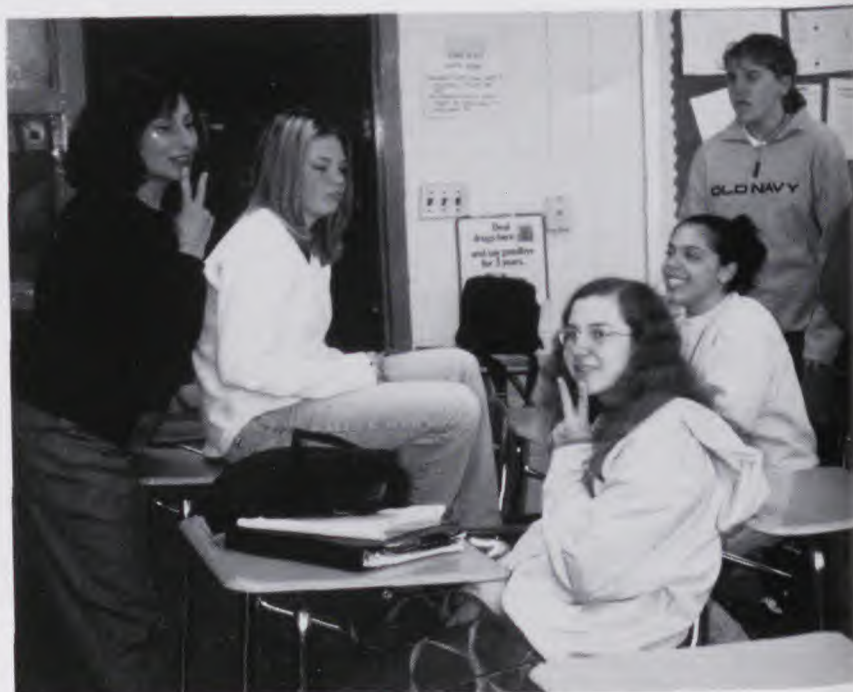
Chess Club
