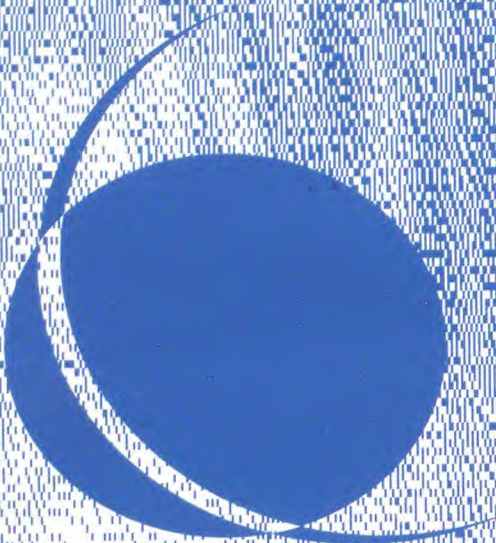

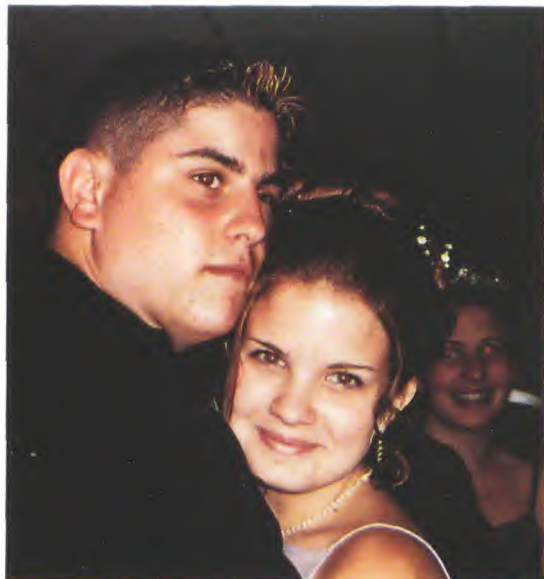


Junior Prom

The Last Pep Rally

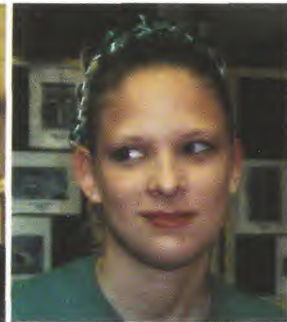
OCTOBER 13, 2000

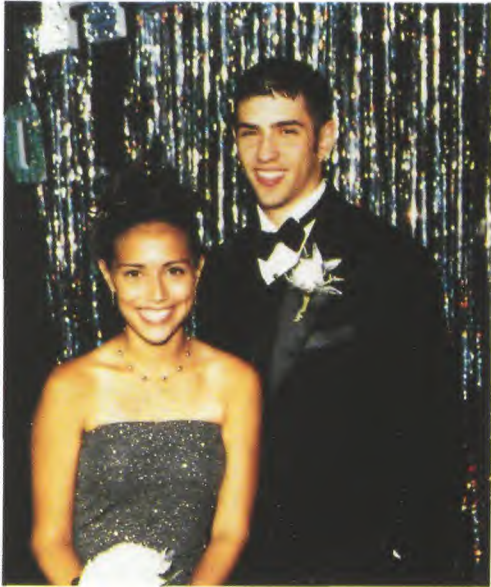

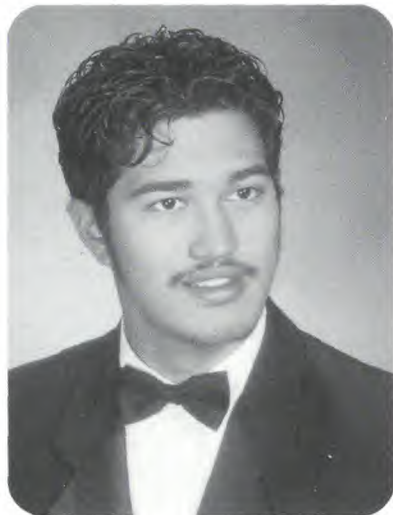
Defensive Player of the Year

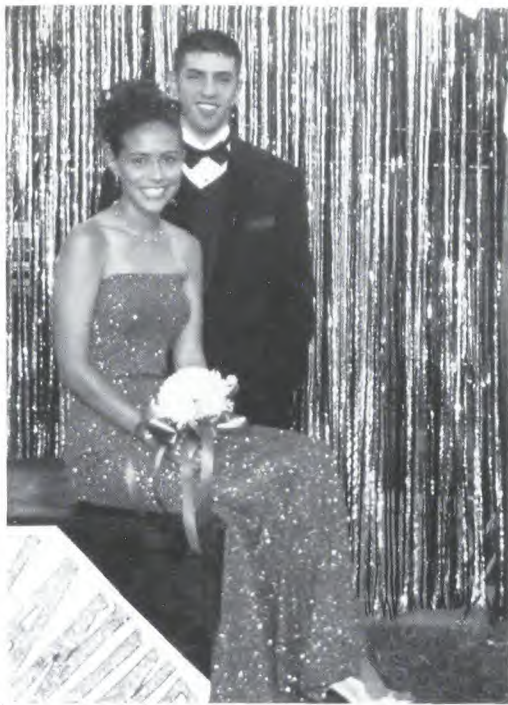

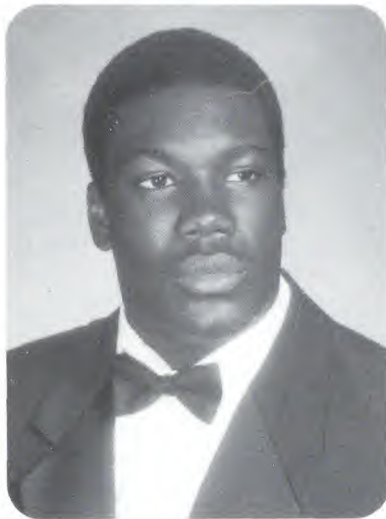
A President for all Seasons

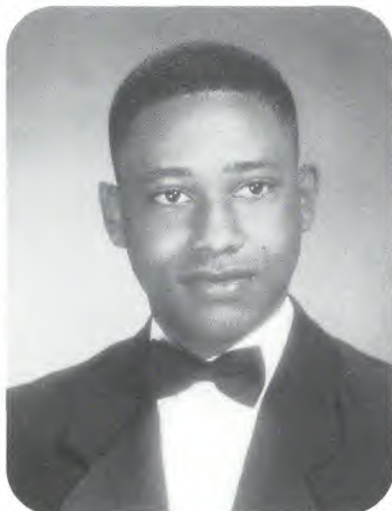
URANIA NG

#5 Holly Feret



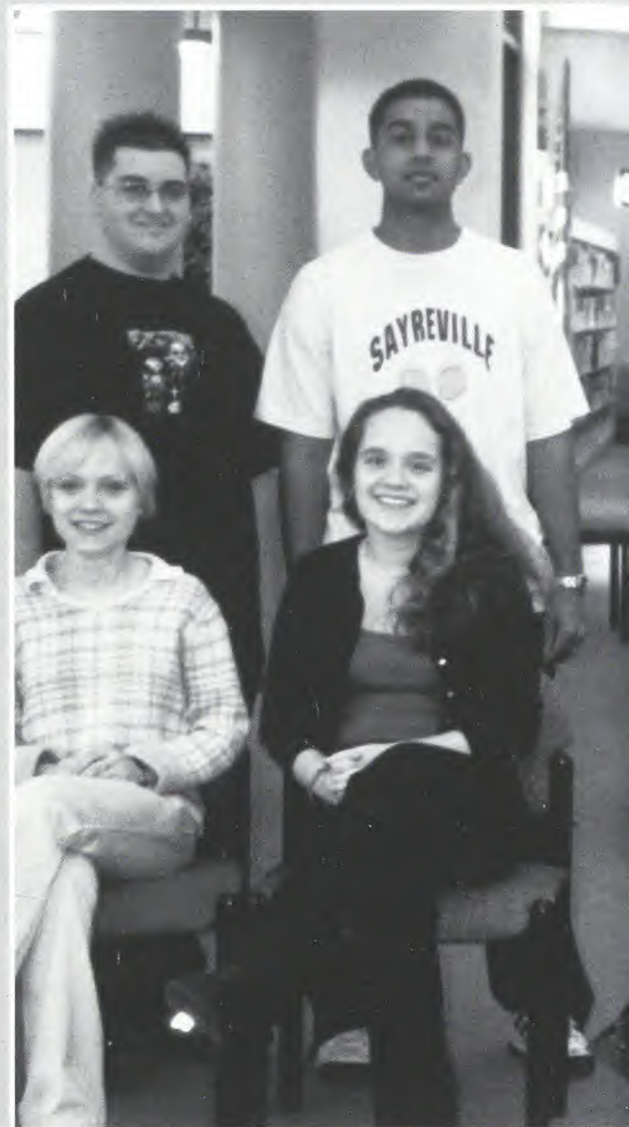

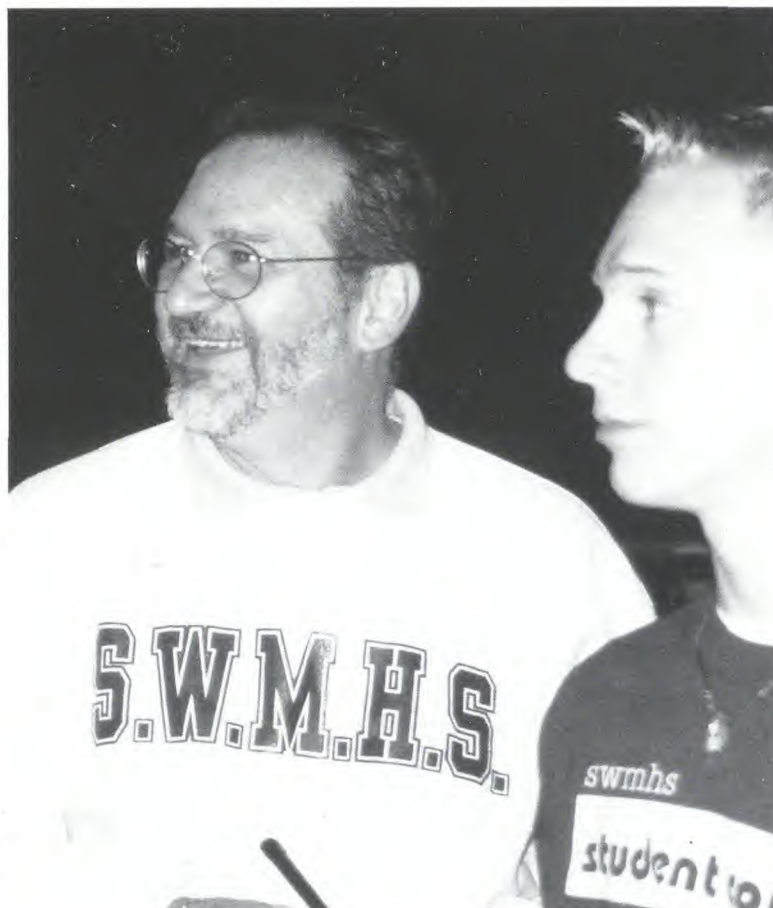

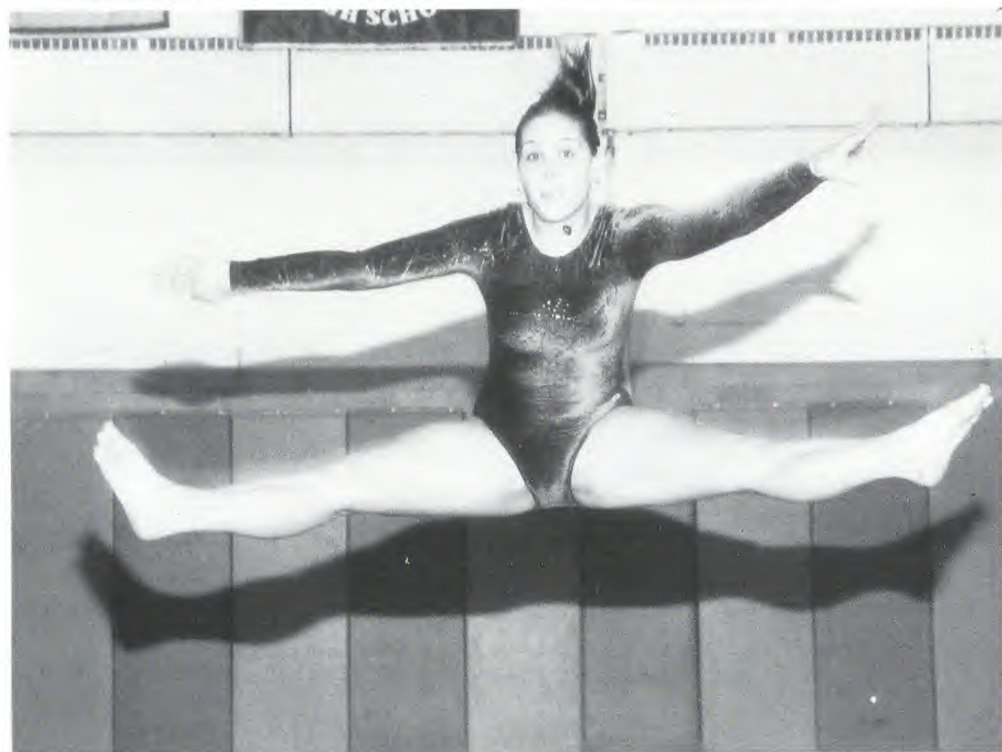

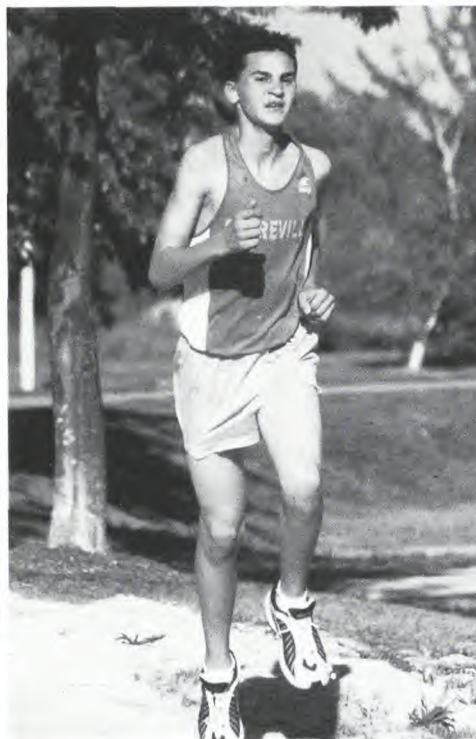

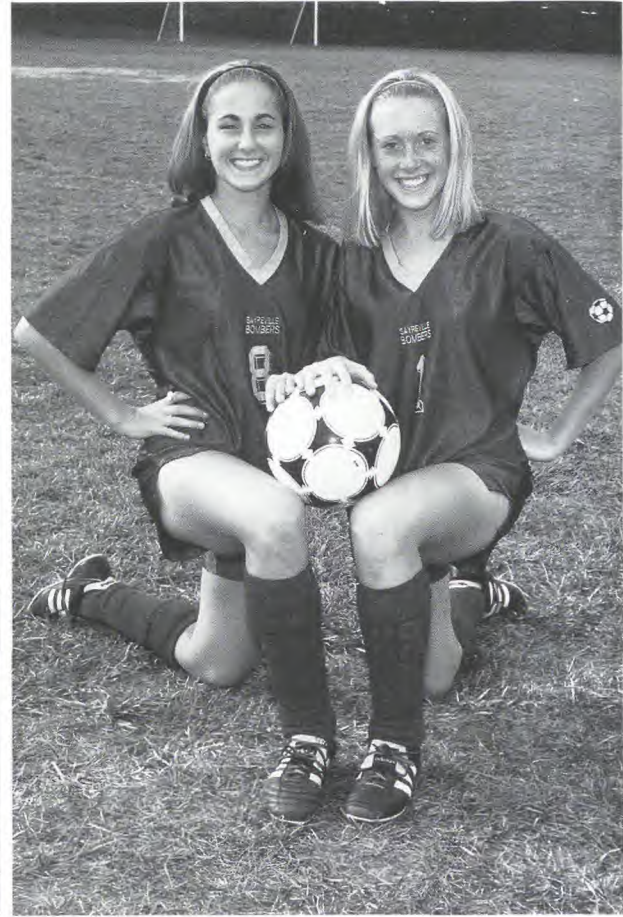

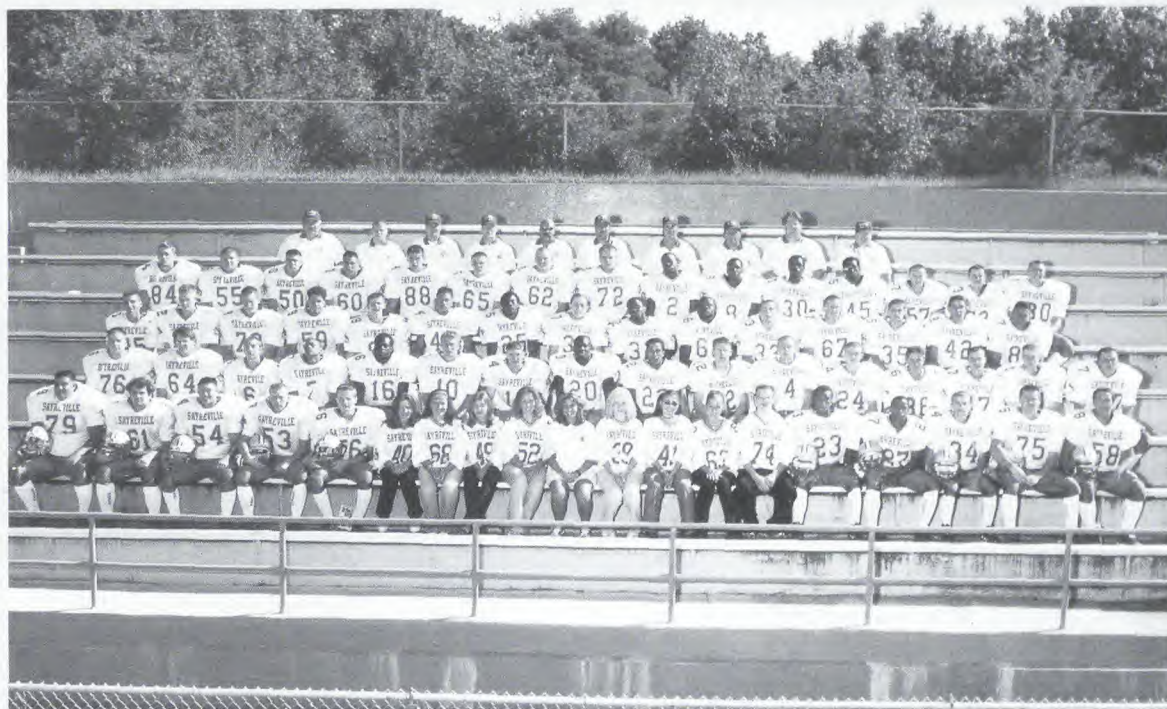

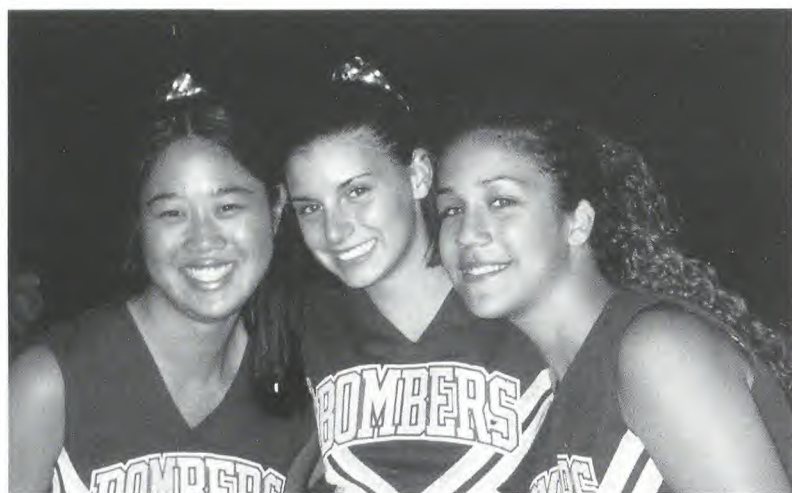

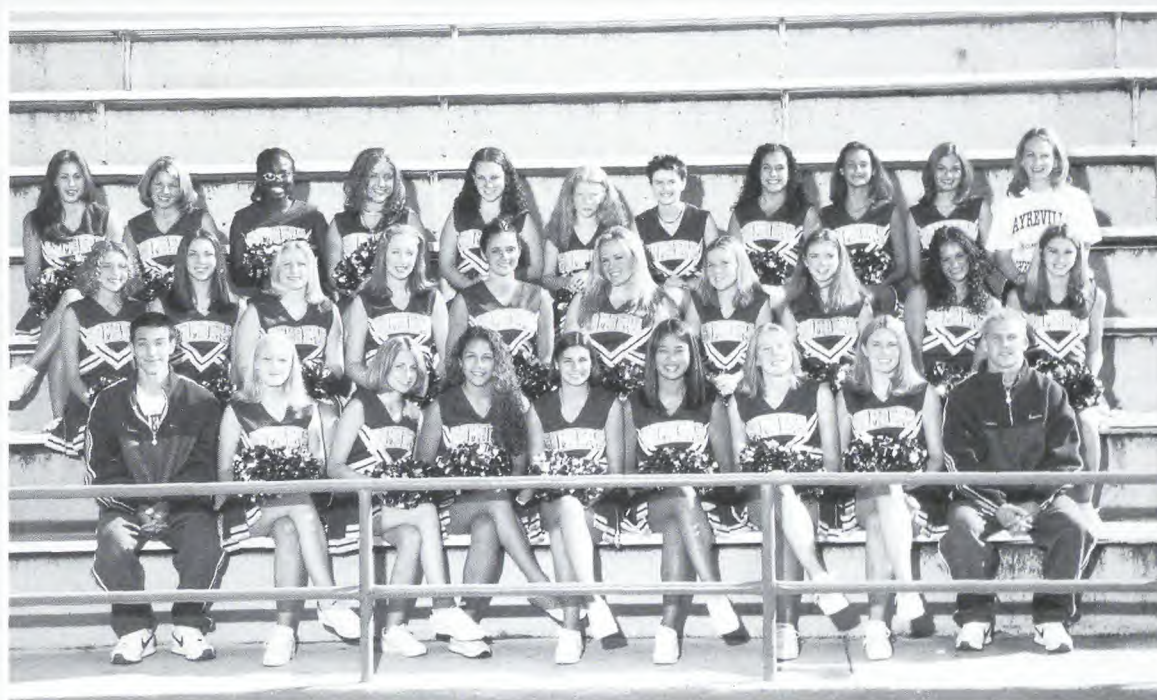

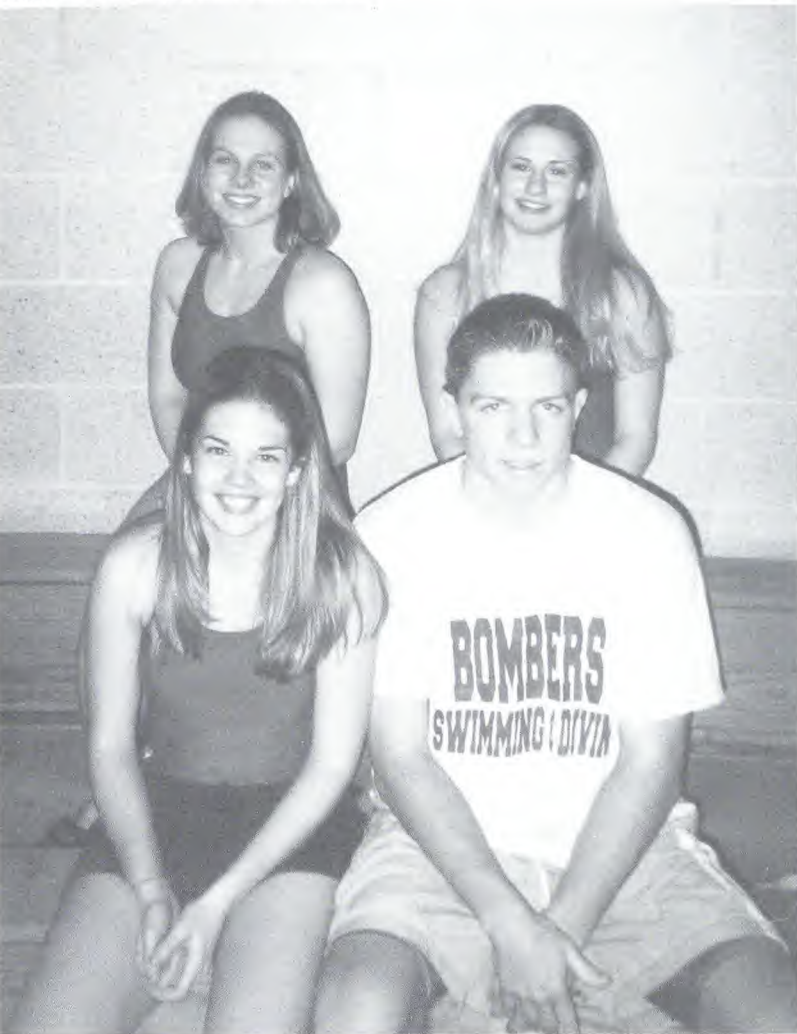

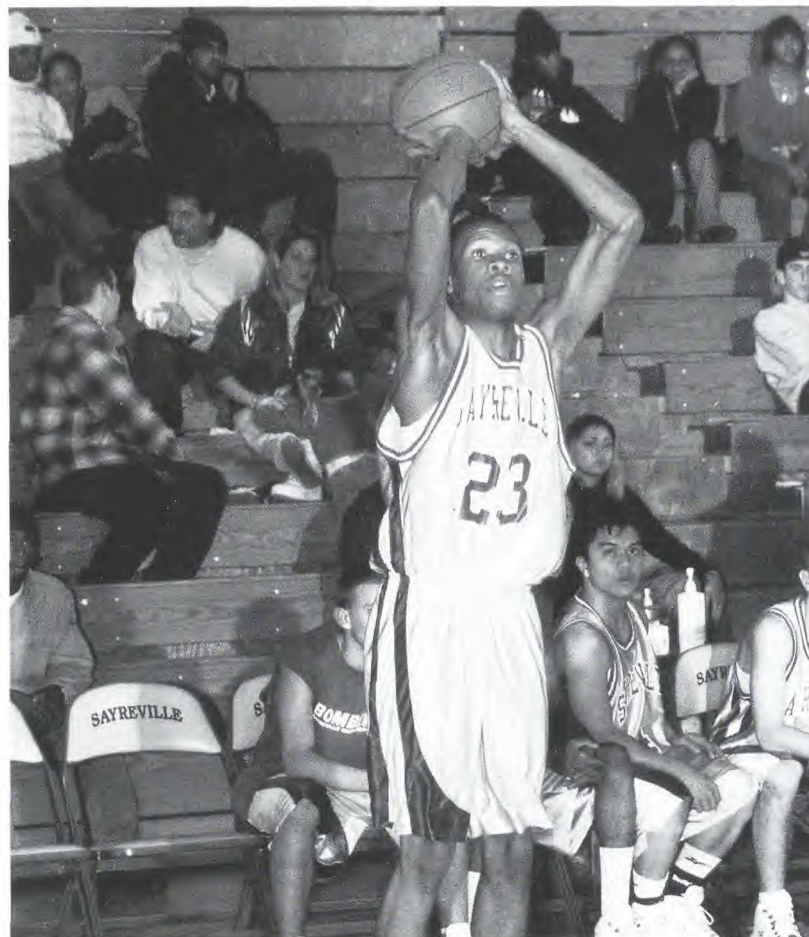

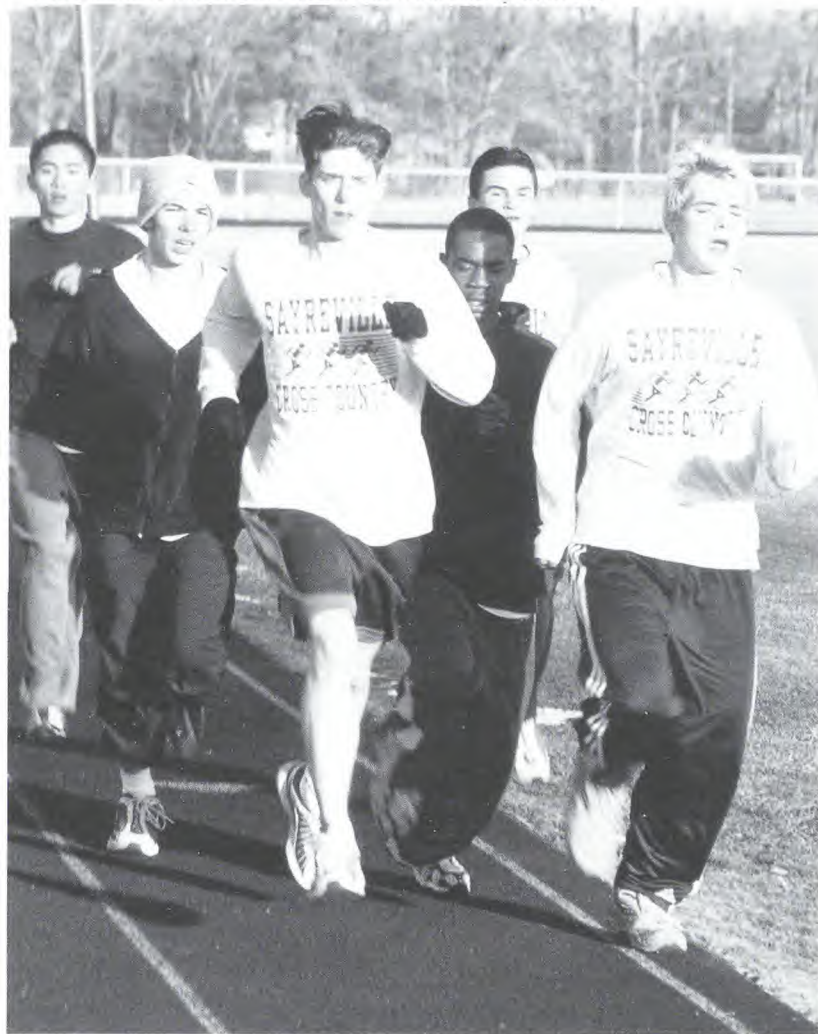

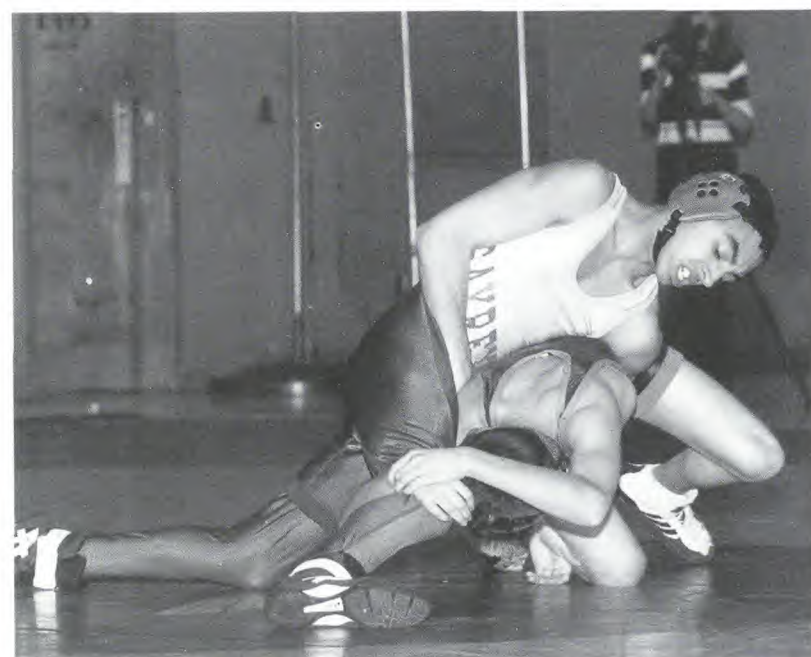

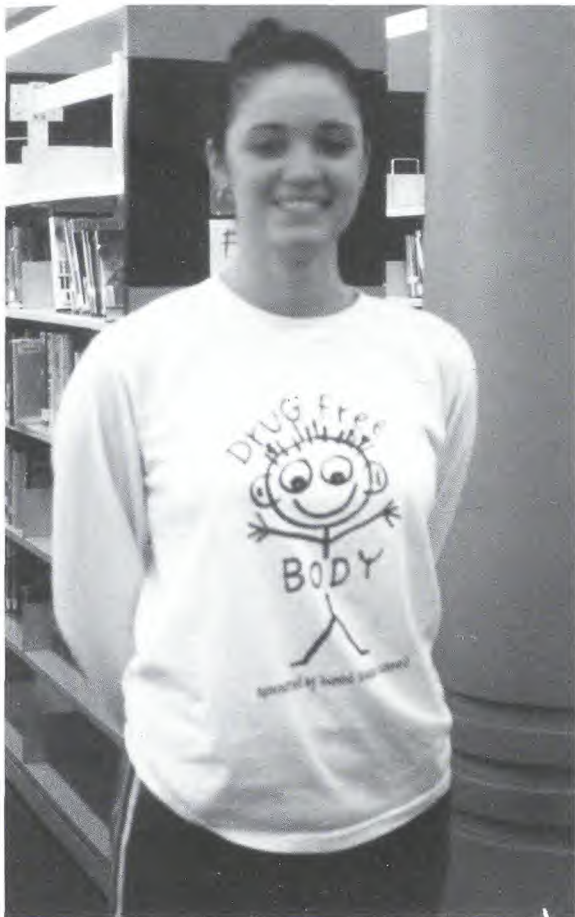


Math Club

Mu Alpha Theta

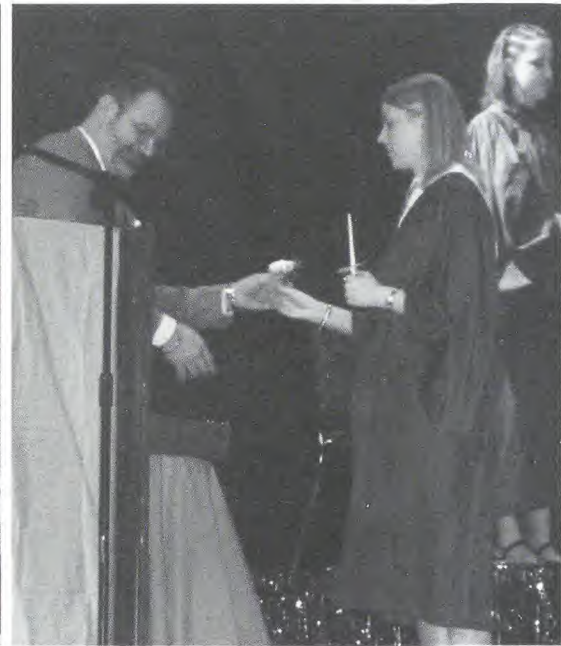

National Honor Society

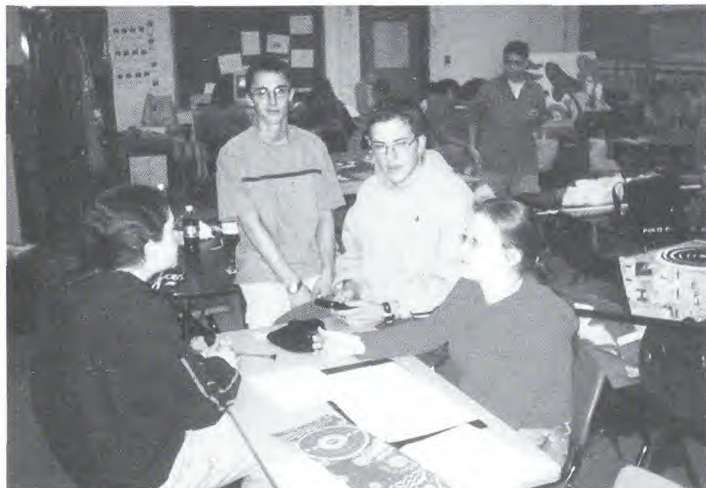

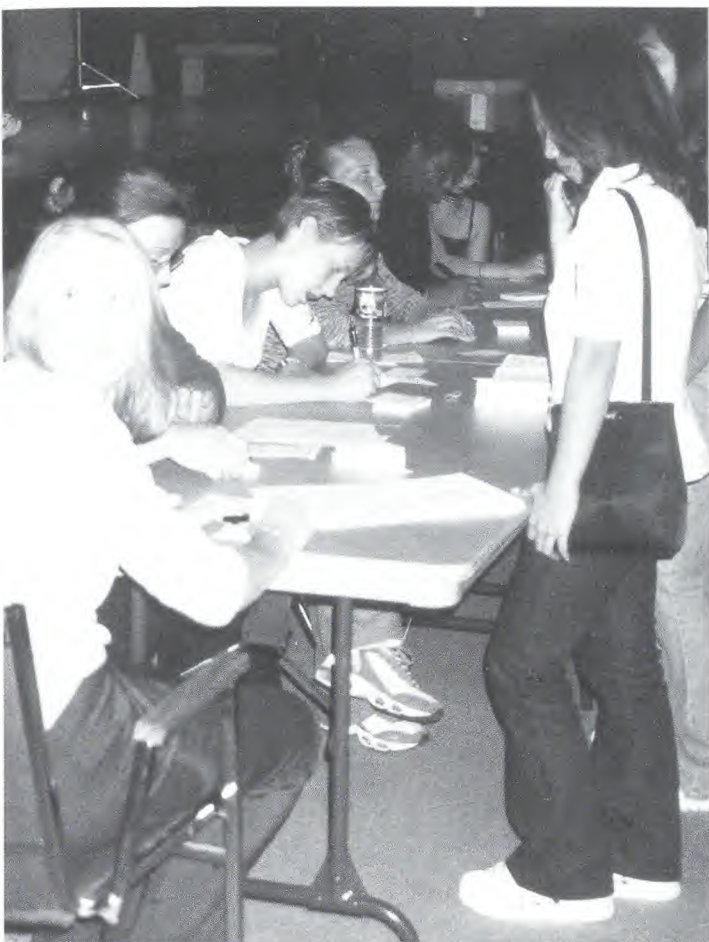

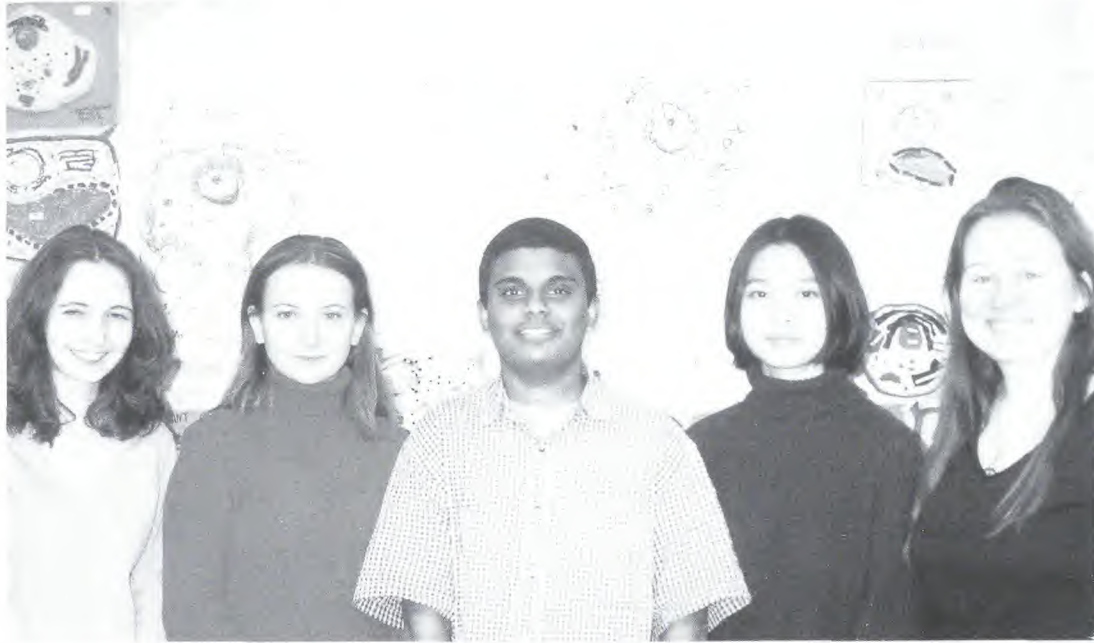


Peer Leadership

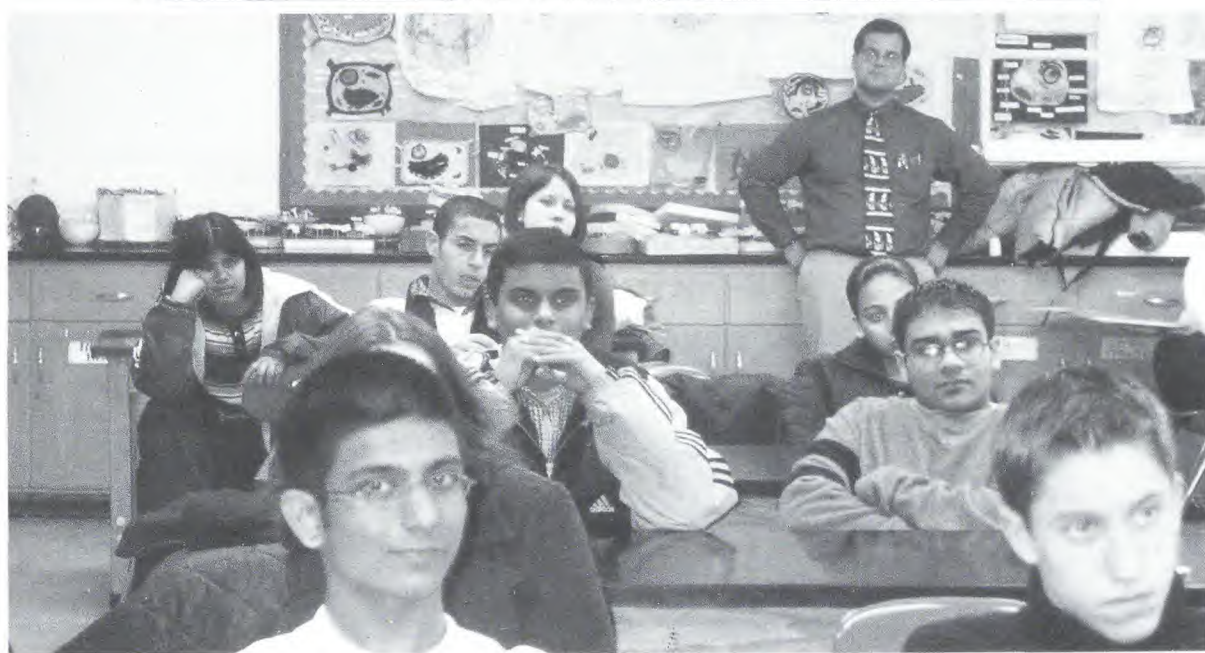

Science Rules

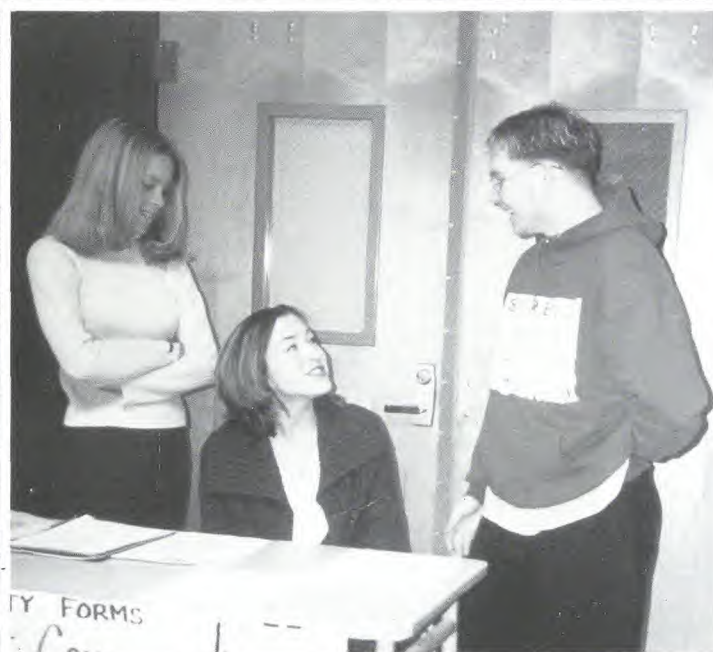

Spanish Honor Society

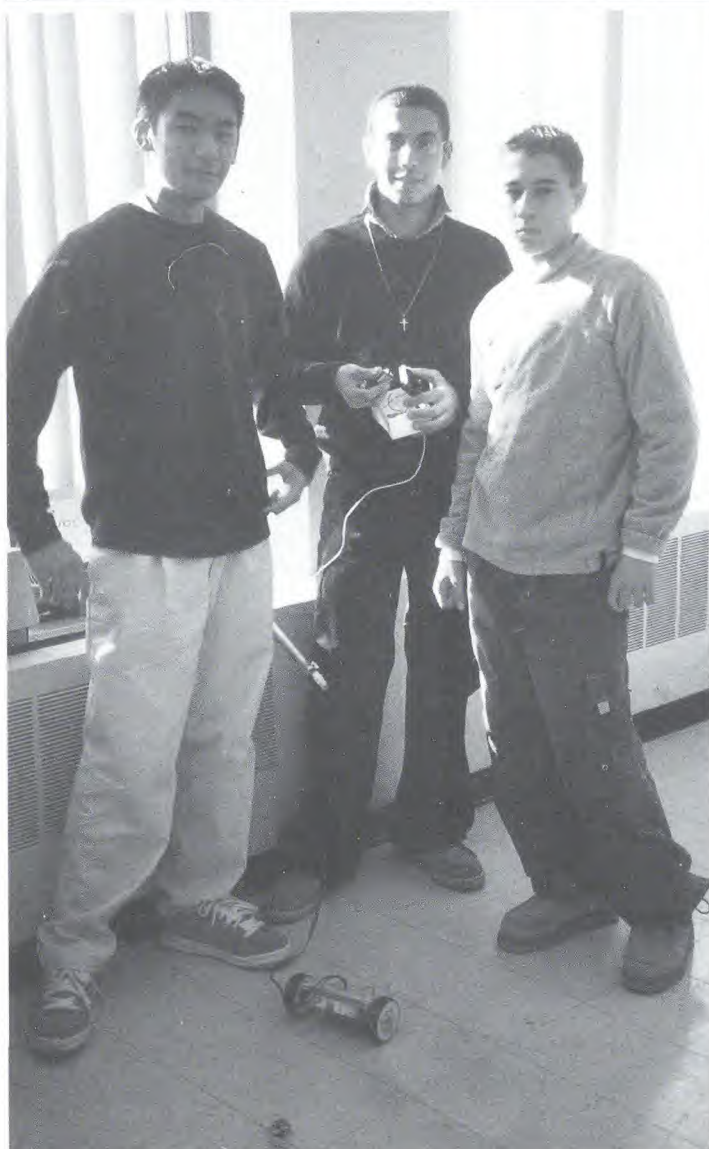

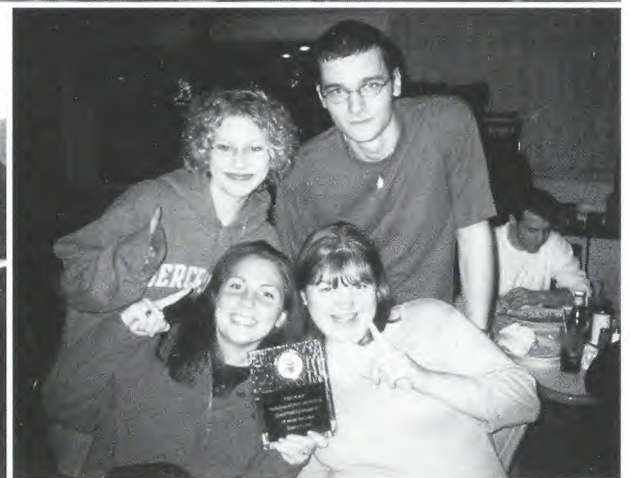
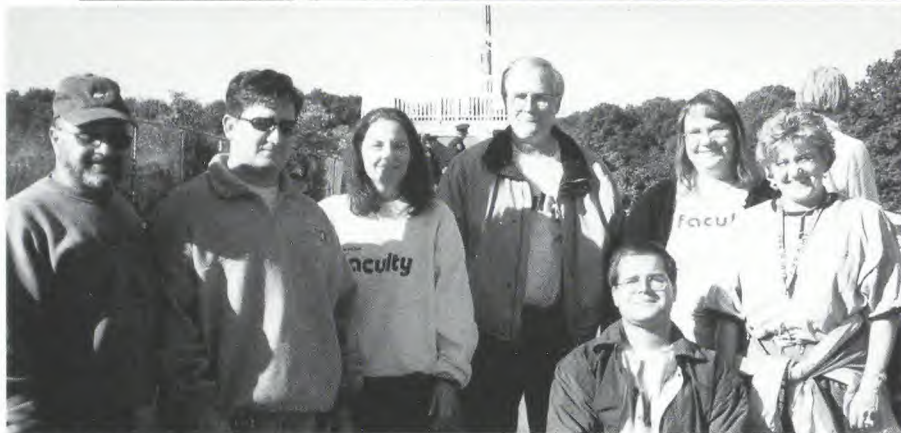
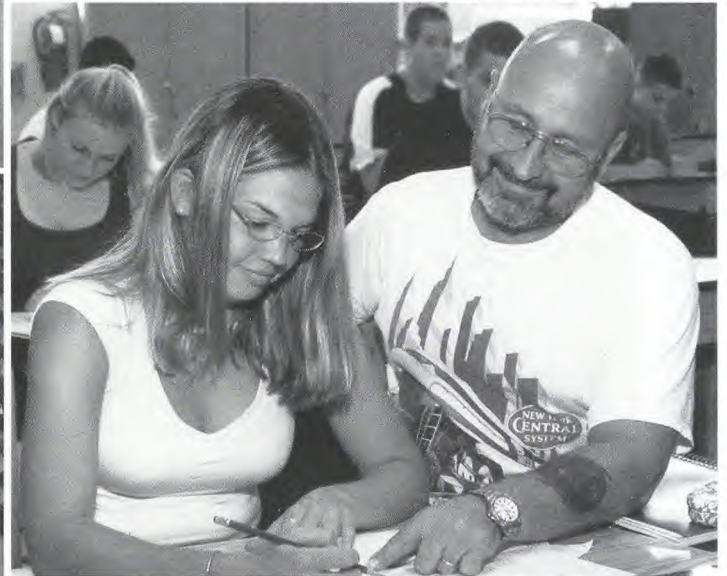


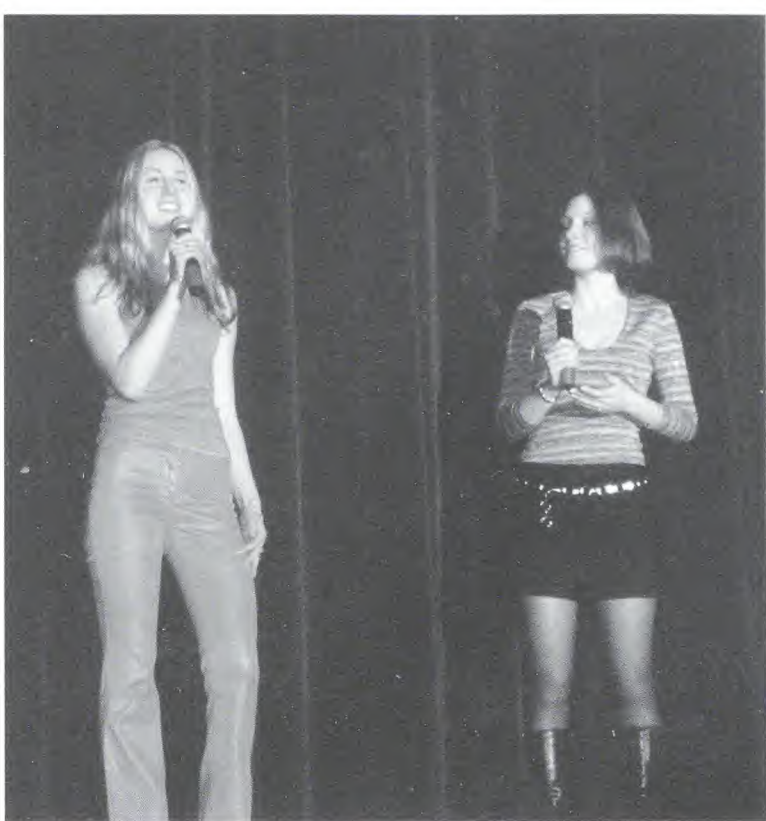
A new beginning

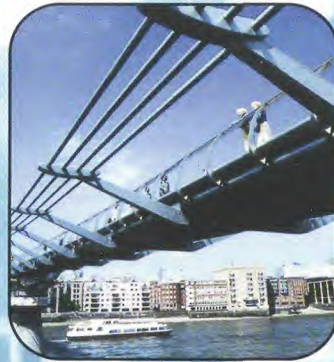

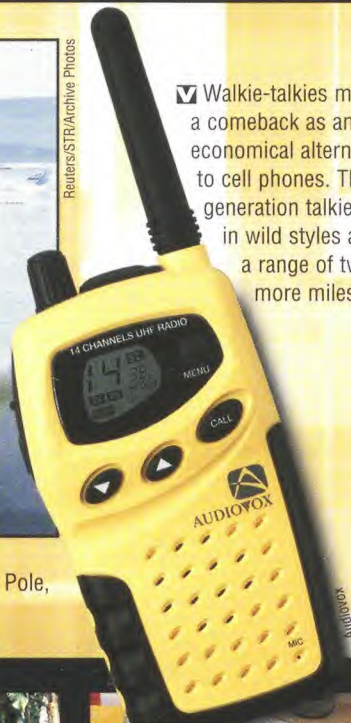

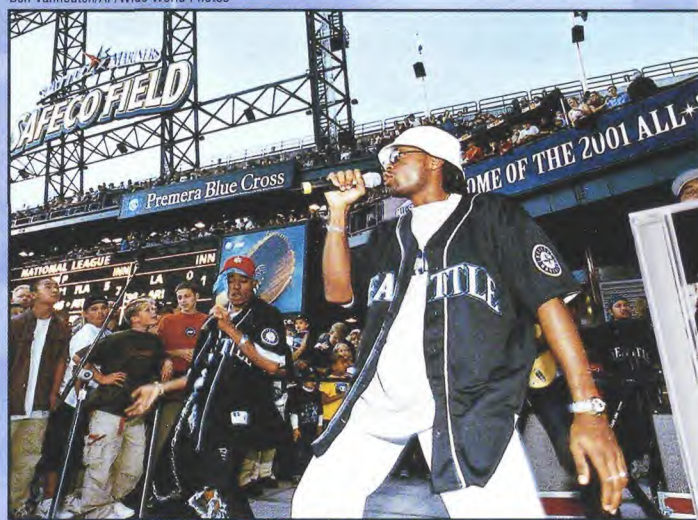

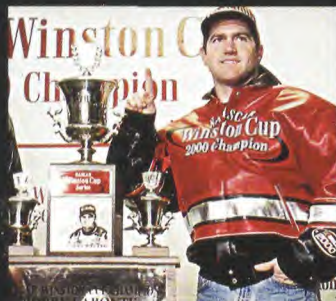

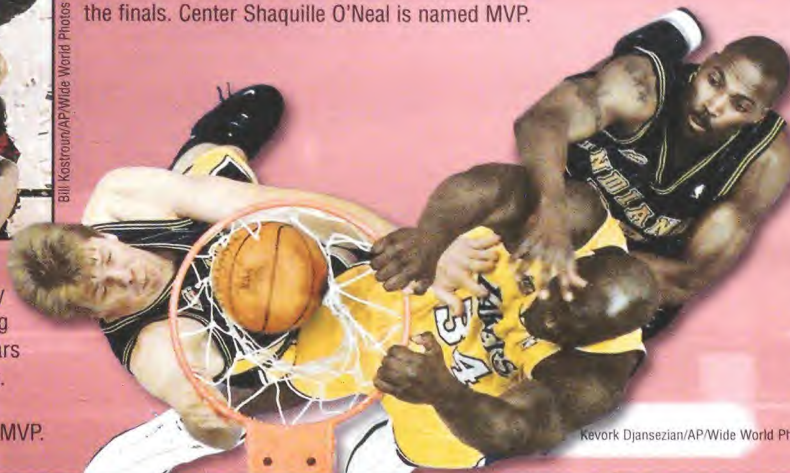
