Dressed all in blue, marching to their graduation ceremony, the Class of 2003 will be heading out of the blue and into the "wild blue yonder" of their futures.






A Night in Hollywood



Farewell to the Blue




They Came So Close


















































Atheletic Trainer Assistants









Science Rules


