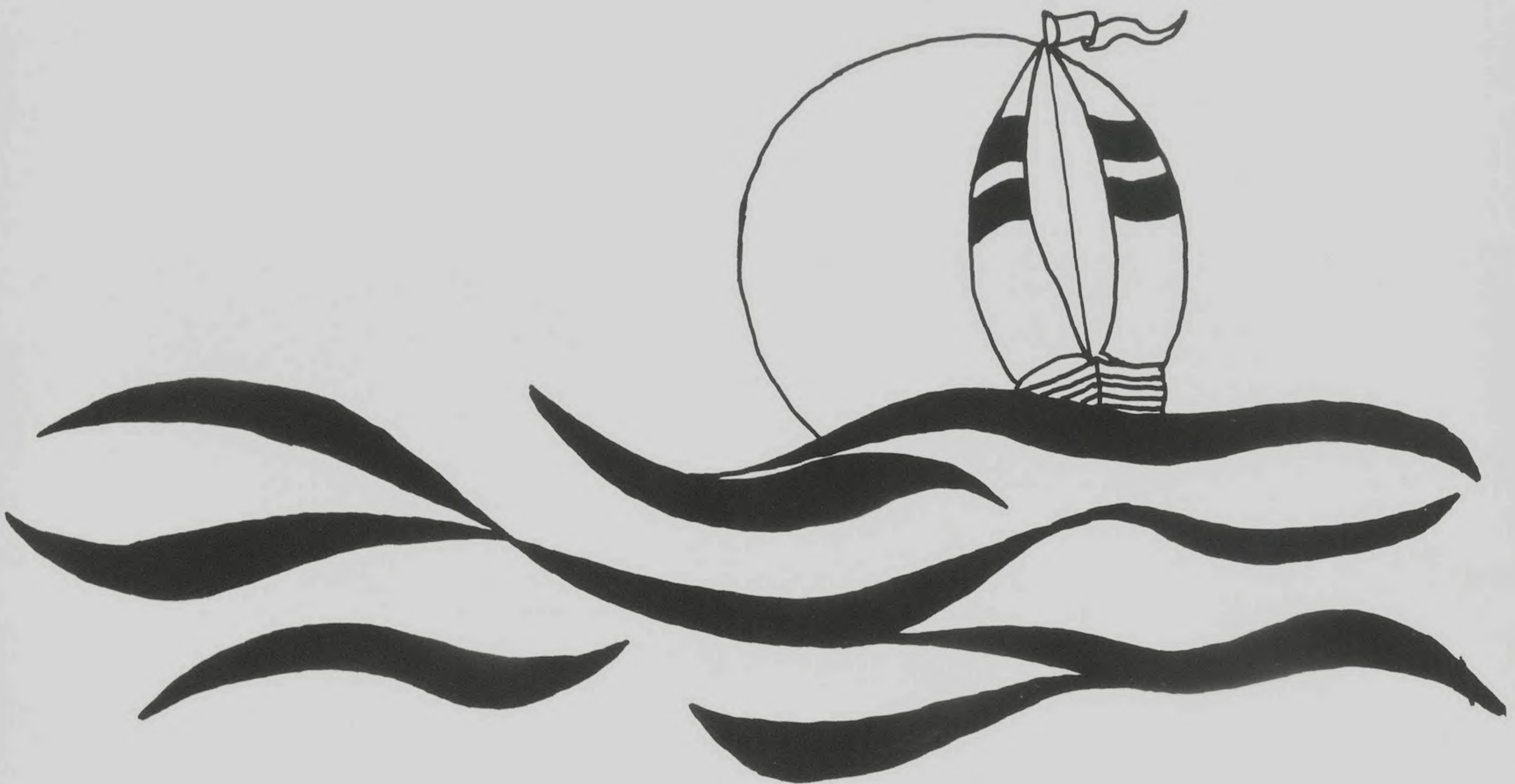
ODYSSEY

ENGLISH

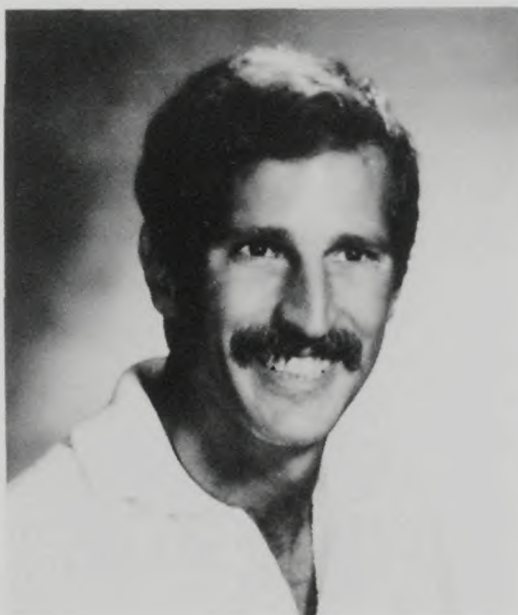

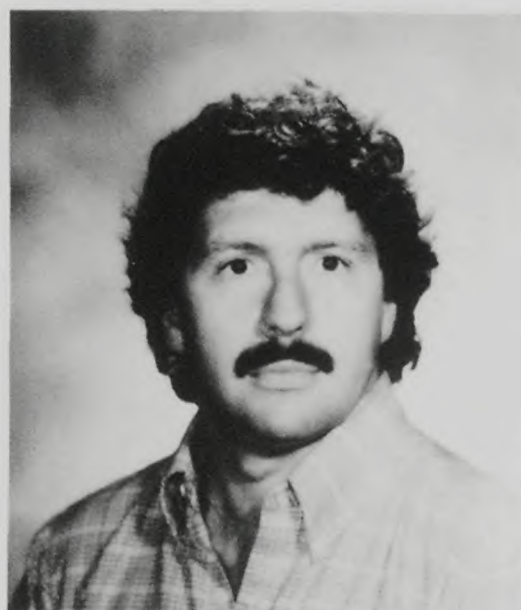

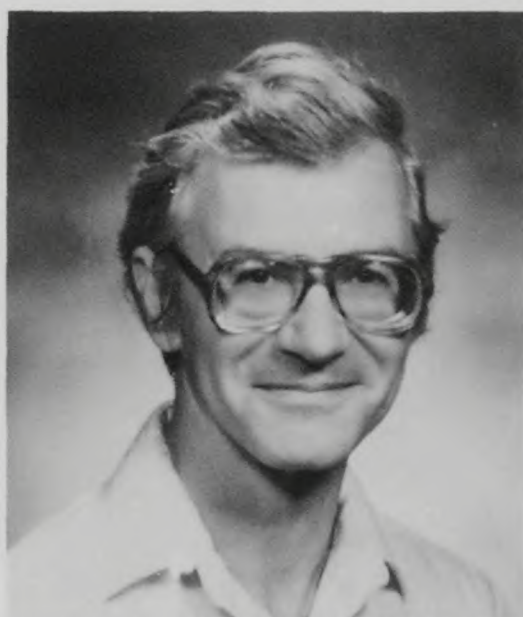

Students are urged to participate in team sports not only for themselves but as a method of engendering school spirit and good sportsmanship.



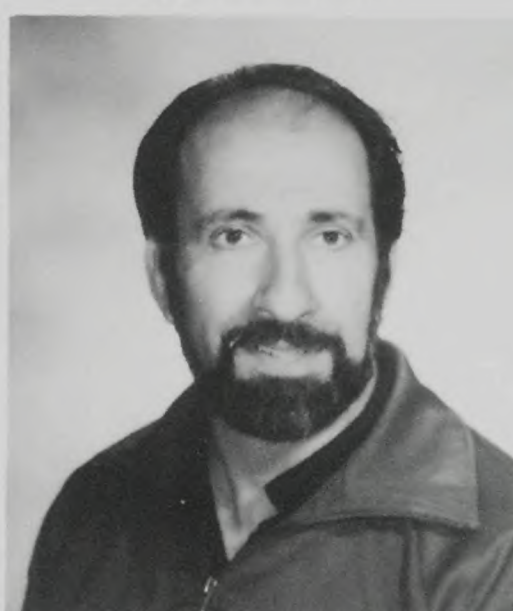

The Waldwick High School Math Team meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings, before the start of the regular school day, to discuss challenging math problems. Each year the team participates in 30 contests on the county, state and national levels. The Waldwick Team has won many awards during the past ten years, virtually always finishing among the top five high schools in New Jersey in every contest. Seniors on the team are encouraged to write original research papers and submit these papers to the Westinghouse Science Search. Interested students study additional mathematics during the summer either independently or as part of National Science Foundation funded programs at colleges throughout the country.

The Academic Decathlon of New Jersey is a statewide scholastic competition for juniors and seniors of both public and private high schools. The teams consist of nine members from each high school who then compete in a series of ten different academic activities. Each team consists of three "C" students, three "B" students, and three "A" students. Activities include the challenges of giving a speech, writing an essay, communicating through conversation and participating in the Super Quiz. Teams also take written comprehensive exams in economics, grammar, and literature, fine arts, mathematics, science and history. In the state competition students are awarded certificates, plaques, medals, and trophies based both on individual and team achievements. The school which is victorious among the New Jersey schools will then compete in the National Academic Decathlon in Los Angeles.

QUIZ BOWL

Similar to the Decathlon but different is the Quiz Bowl which is reminiscent of the old T-V show, Information Please. Questions are fielded in a great variety of subjects with speed and accuracy triumphing. In November, Waldwick competed in the Bowl at William Paterson College going down in defeat at the hands of Glen Rock High.
