



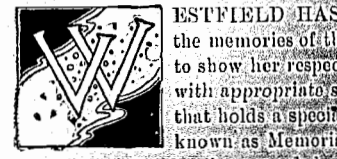

QUARANTINE NOT REMOVED.

Tom's Family Must Remain in Quarantine Until June 4. Special Meeting of the Board of Health.

At a special meeting of the Board of Health held last Tuesday evening, it was moved by Committee member Connolly, and seconded by Committeeman Welles, that the quarantine on the Tom's family on North avenue, must be kept until a period of 14 days had elapsed since the disinfection, or until June 2d.

The Board was somewhat influenced to an opposite action by the words of State Board of Health Physician Hunt, who had said that the State Board did not keep quarantine on now for such a long period, relying on the superior disinfectants and the superiority of the methods used. The Board no longer used sulphur, but bichloride of mercury and formalin, thoroughly done by an experienced man. As this was done here in this way, he did not think it was necessary.

A communication from the State Board notified the Board that the State's attorney had received instructions to take up the case against R. Newton French, the undertaker, who buried the child in the public dump.

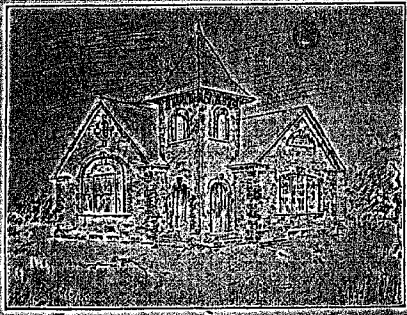

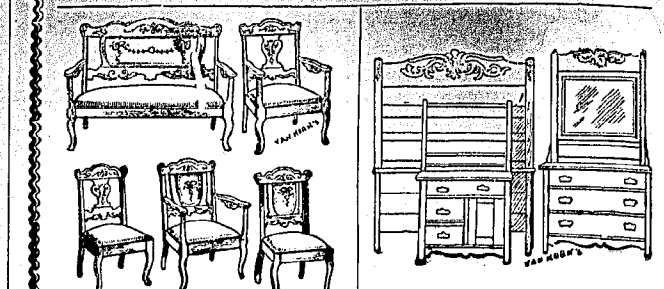
