








FOREWORD


MRS. GERTRUDE ROGERS


Hampered by a small turnout of football candidates and the Asian Flu epidemic, Westfield's Blue Devils posted a 3-6 record for the 1957 campaign.





Stern drives through Regional's line behind the blocking of Bill Lane, George Reasor, and Terry Bentley.








The night before the game brings out a crowd to the Pep Rally, where the Plainfield Cardinal is burned in effigy.



Coach Lou Recchia's harriers finished up their season this year with a 4-6 record. The Asian Flu and injuries plagued the team, allowing the new coach to field an entire team only once all season. 
Captain John Guthrie, an all county prospect, inspired Coach John Lay's court men to a winning season. The 1958 campaign led to a 9-8 tally.






Senior Literary Club






The Spanish Club

GYM PROGRAM


As a brief resume of the physical education program throughout the year, the Physical Education Department presents an annual gym program in which each girl in high school participates.

Twelfth: To Sue Stanaway, Peggy Loeb leaves her pad of blue slips.


Thirteenth: To the overwhelming relief of the principal, the faculty, and the majority of the student body, we leave.
