






This thought, so appropriate to you, is in our minds as we, the Class of 1959, dedicate our **Weather Vane Annual** to you, Miss Theurer.




CROSS COUNTRY

BASKETBALL

Westfield's basketball team was something the school will never forget. Facing some of the toughest teams in the state, it steam rolled to 24 wins, including its first Union County title, while dropping only three. As a clutch team it was unequalled, winning two games in the last ten seconds and two others in overtime.

The Quintet crushed its first four opponents by a margin of 83 points. The underrated Scotch Plains upset the high riding Devils 70-78. We proceeded, however, to roll over our next seven opponents, including 80-77 overtime conquest of Linden. In this game Ken Hite poured through 28 points.

This brought us into the first of three meetings with Cranford with a 11-1 record. In pre-season predictions Cranford had been rated the top team in the county; we proved otherwise. After the Cranford game we continued our winning ways in four more games, including an overtime decision over Union 65-64 and a squeaker against Milburn 56-54. This brought us into the second Cranford contest. Unfortunately when the final gun sounded, we were on the short end of a 74-49 score. The team then closed out the regular season with wins over Somerville and Roselle.

And so we entered the County tournament with an 18-2 mark. Seeded first for the first time in its history, the team began its march to the top with a runaway victory over Edison Tech 59-41. Ray Bailey hit for 20 points in his best performance of the year. Next we met a team we had beaten twice during the regular season, Springfield Regional. They, too, fell before the powerful Laymen 71-66.

Then came the game with Scotch Plains, the team which had beaten us earlier. Although both teams were off, we posted a decisive 43-31 victory to reach the finals.

Our opponent was the Cranford team which was favored to take the title. But the Devils led throughout the game for a 54-46 victory and the County Championship.

In the state tournament we reached the Group IV Sectional finals before being upset by the Cinderella team of the tournament, Weequahic.

In post season polls Capt. Ken Hite was selected for All County team and the third Group Four, All State team. Bob Haines was selected for All County second team, and Tom Gilson and Ray Bailey received All County honorable mention.














TENNIS

THE ORCHESTRA




MASK AND MIME COUNCIL
