






EDITUR'S FOREWORD


FOOTBALL

For the first time since 1954, the Westfield High football team compiled a winning record, five wins against four losses. The team won three out of its first four games, including a 26-0 opening-day victory over Clark Regional. Although Les Zorge's squad lost to Rahway, 22-0 in their next game, they defeated Roselle Park 13-0 and squeaked by Roselle, 7-6.

After a 42-0 whitewashing by Columbia, the Blue Devils climbed back into the win column with a 27-6 upset victory over Bound Brook. The Zorgemen insured their winning season the next week with their second consecutive upset win, this time 7-0 over Springfield Regional. This was a notable victory, not only because it promised a season's average better than .500, but also because it marked the first time since the championship team of 1948 that the Blue Devils have shut out three different opponents in one season. In their last two games, the Blue Devils lost to North Plainfield by a 27-12 score and dropped a 7-0 thriller to powerful Plainfield.

Perhaps the finest game of the year was the finale against Plainfield. Anyone who saw the game must have been inspired by the fight waged by Westfield against the heavily favored Cardinal team. After battling through a scoreless first half, the two teams continued evenly until the last play of the third quarter when Plainfield tallied on a one-yard plunge. The fourth quarter was especially hard-fought, with the Blue Devil line turning in a fine defensive effort by halting Plainfield on the Devils' nine-yard line.





BASKETBALL





SWIMMING

THE SWIMMING TEAM-1960

Westfield's swimming team completed its third consecutive undereated season with a 13-0 mark, running its string of dual meet victories to forty-five in a row, all under Coach Joe Kursar, whose mermen have lost only one meet during his four years at WHS.

The ace of the 1960 team was Dan Nichols, who shattered three free-style school records on his own and who shared in the conquest of two relay records. Others who shared in the record-breaking 160-yard medley relay were Hank Marshall, Bill Smart, and John Weinmann. Marshall and Weinmann later established individual records, in the 100-yard breaststroke and the 160-yard individual medley, respectively. Captain Weinmann along with Greg Weiss and Skip

Rollins also helped Nichols break the 160-yard free-style relay.








GYM PROGRAM





The members of the Bowling Club are divided into ten teams of four boys each. Every week the teams bowl in match games. The club strives to promote good sportsmanship through competition.






