
Science

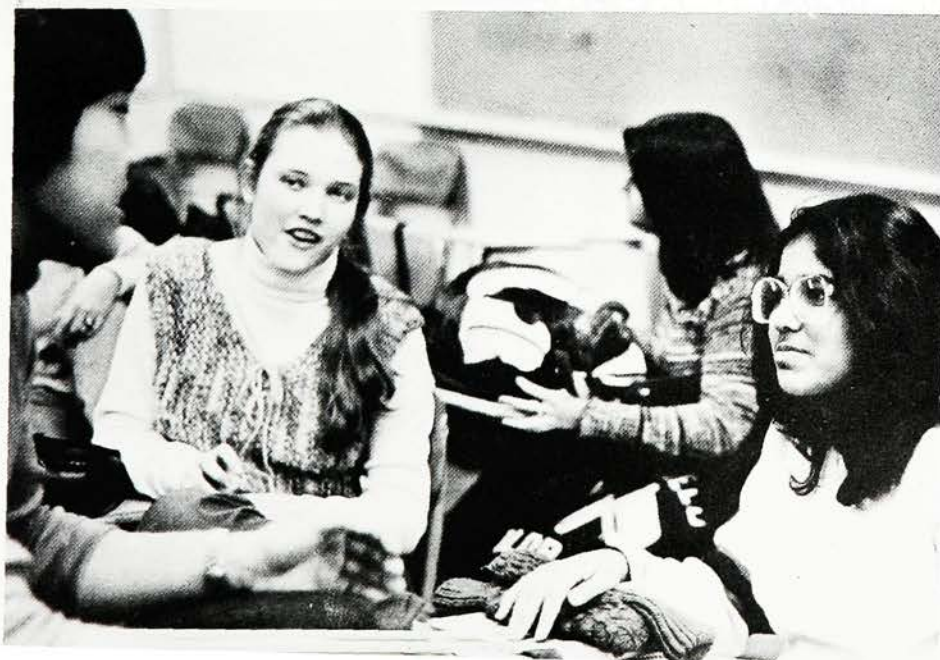
German Club

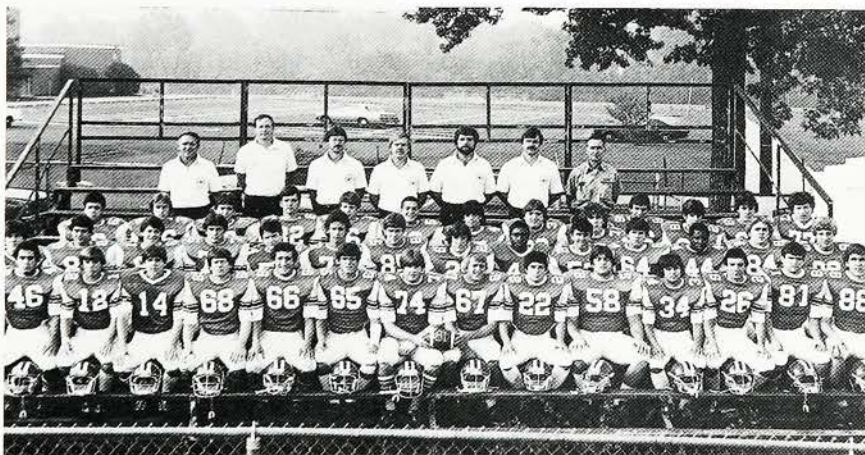
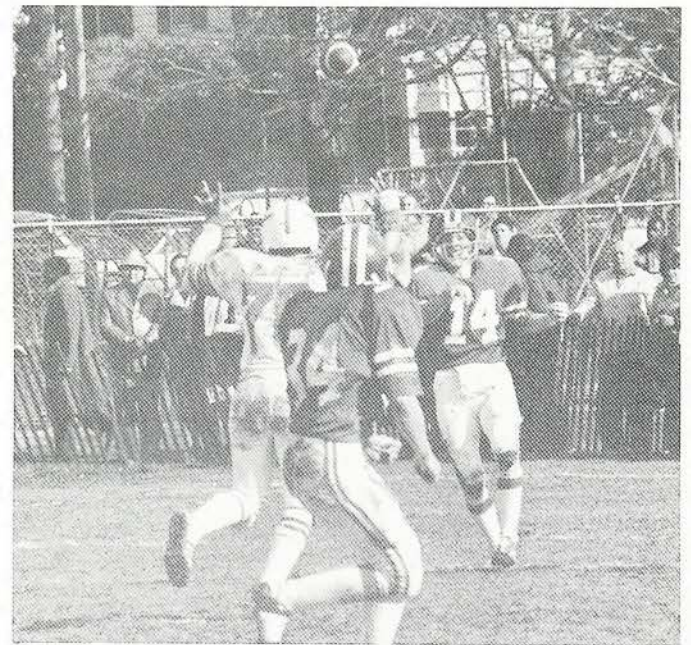
Football

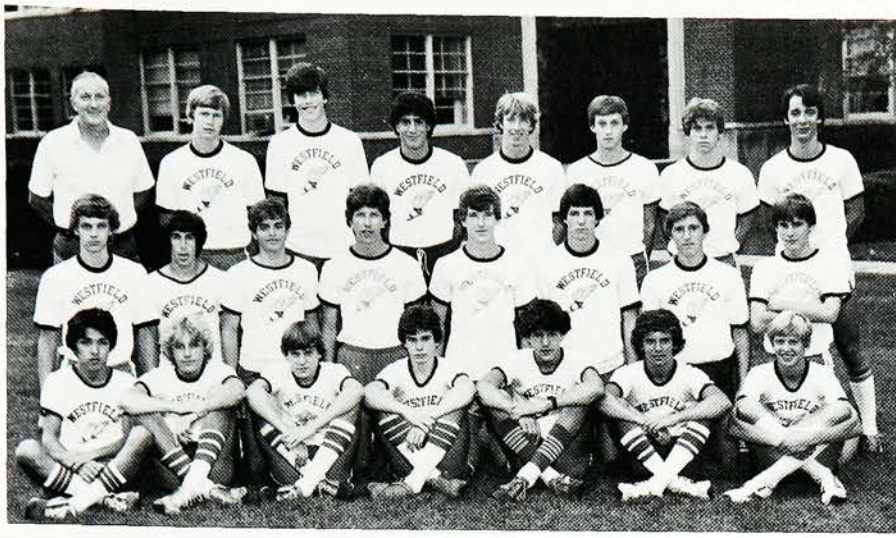
Cross-Country

Girls' Soccer

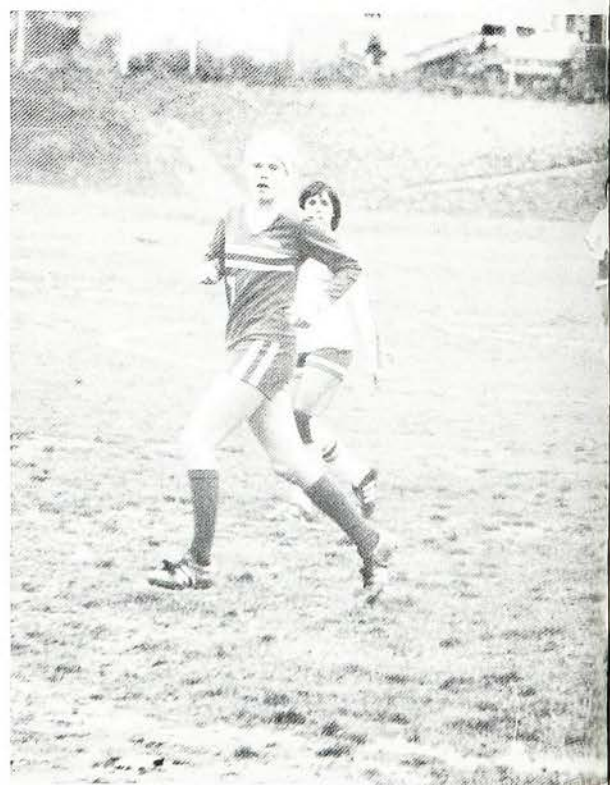

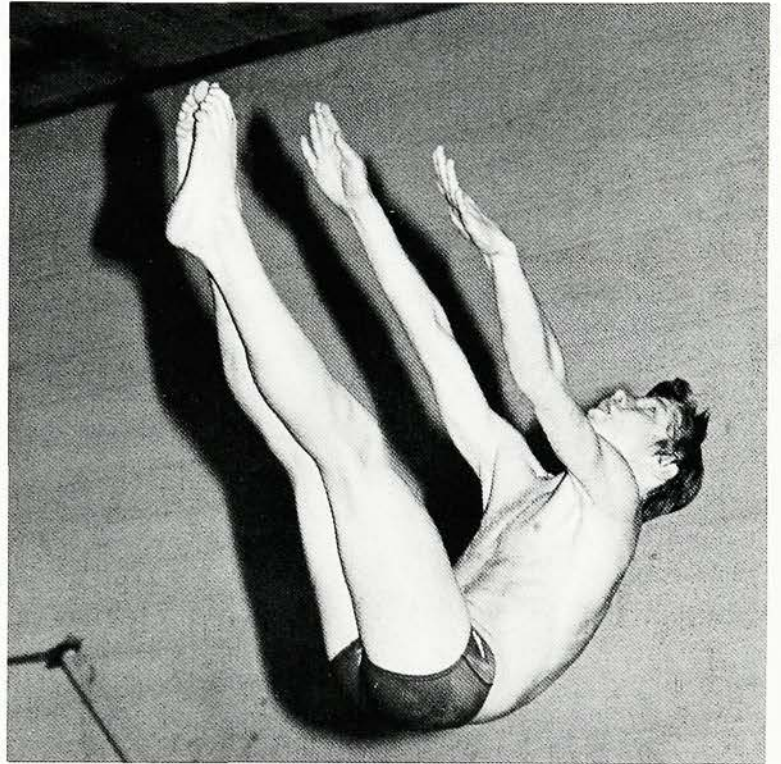
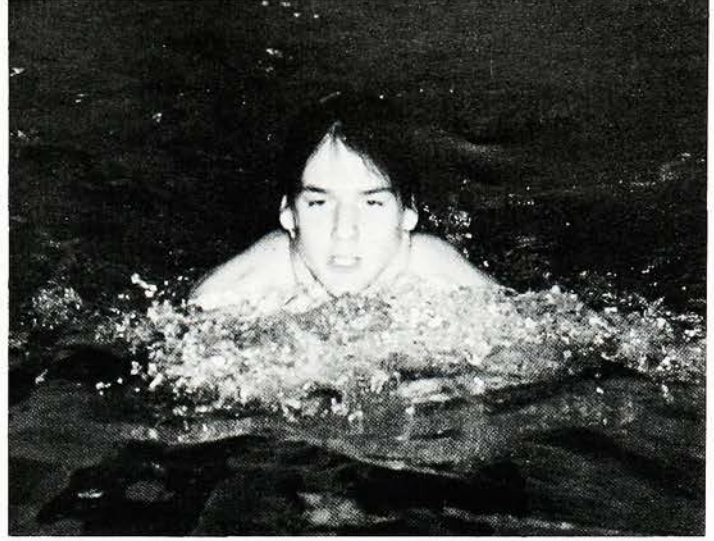
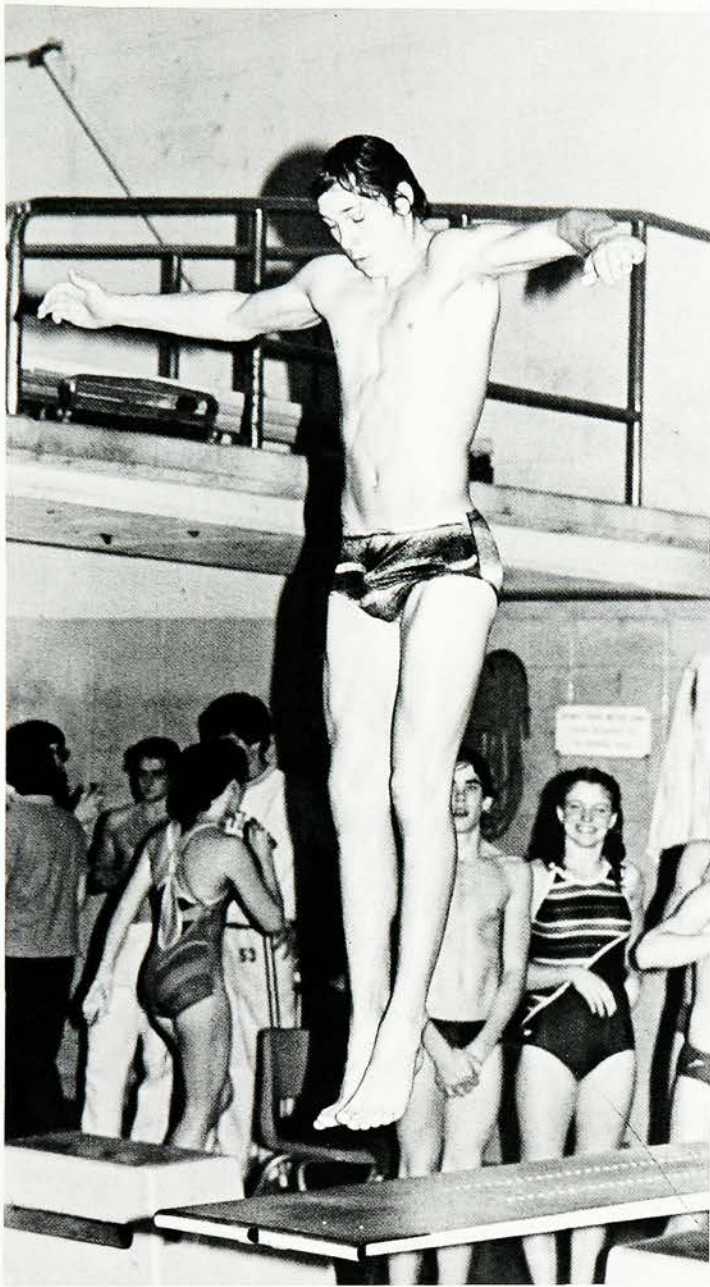
Boys' Swimming

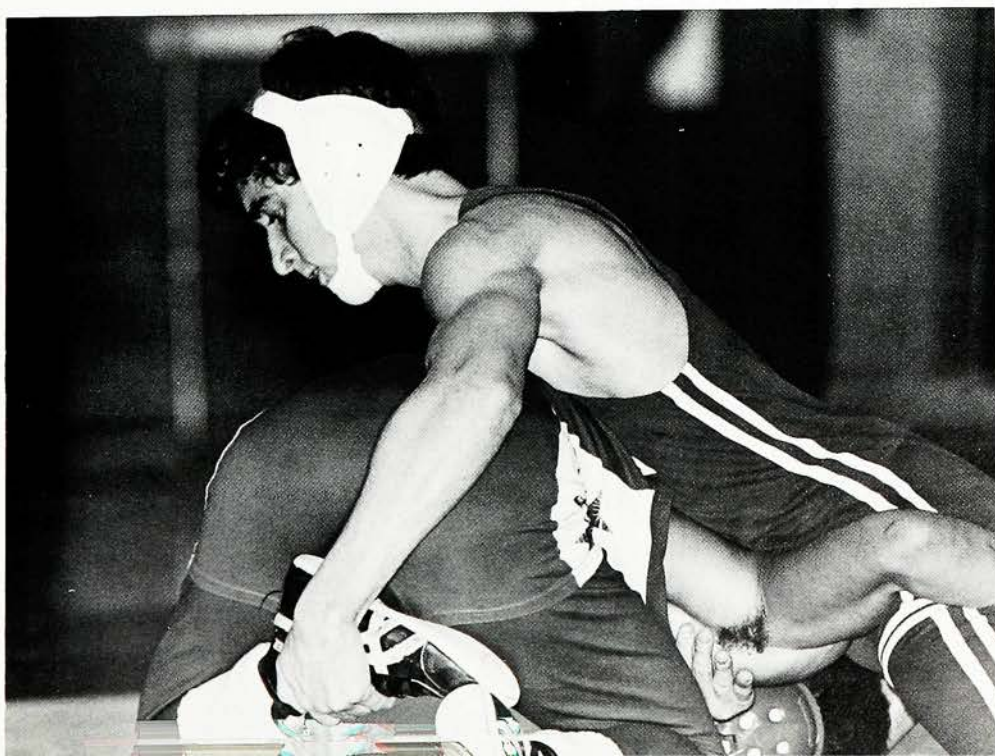
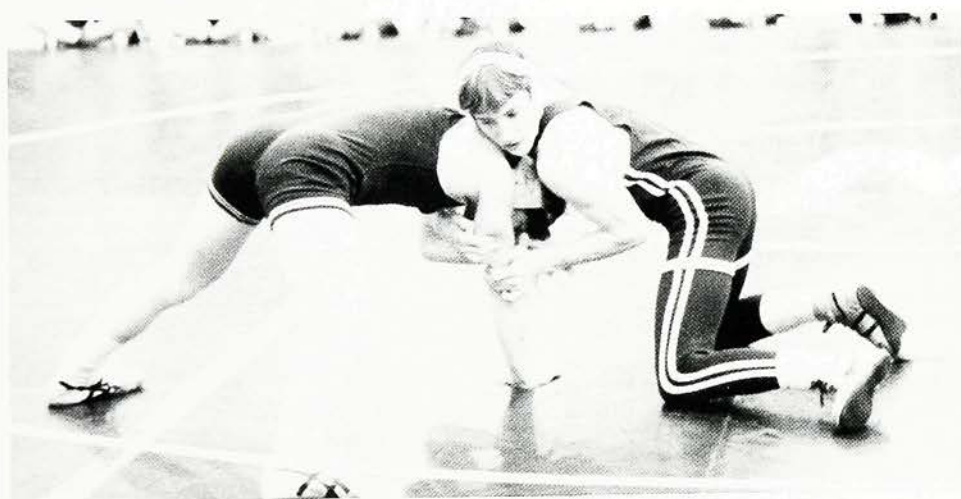
Wrestling

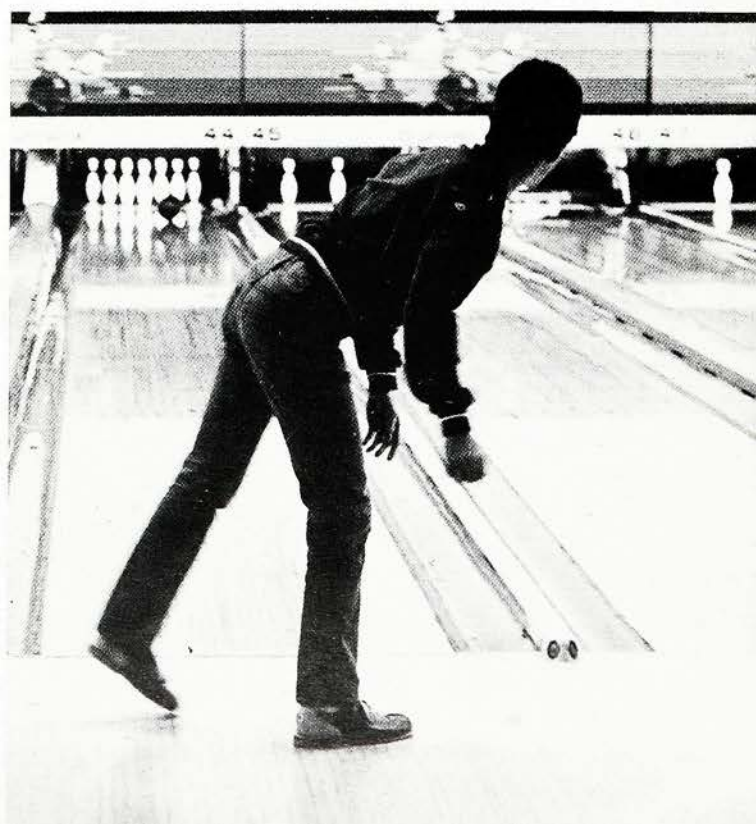
Bowling

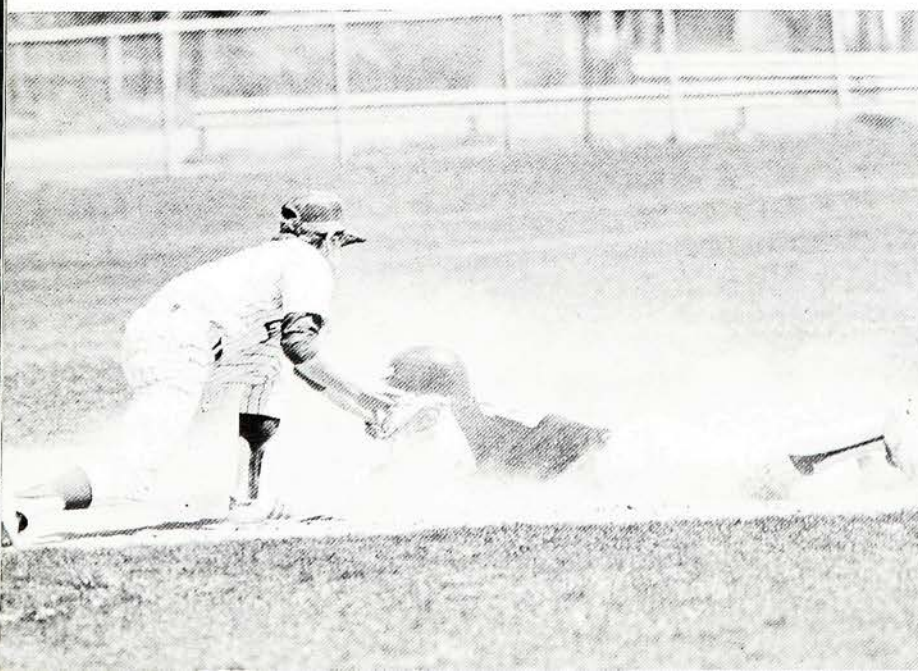
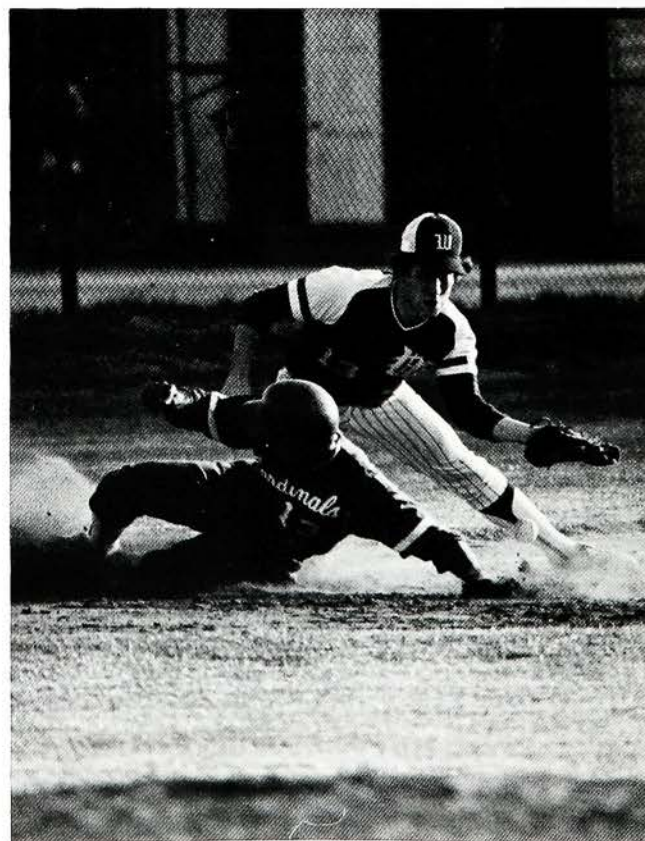


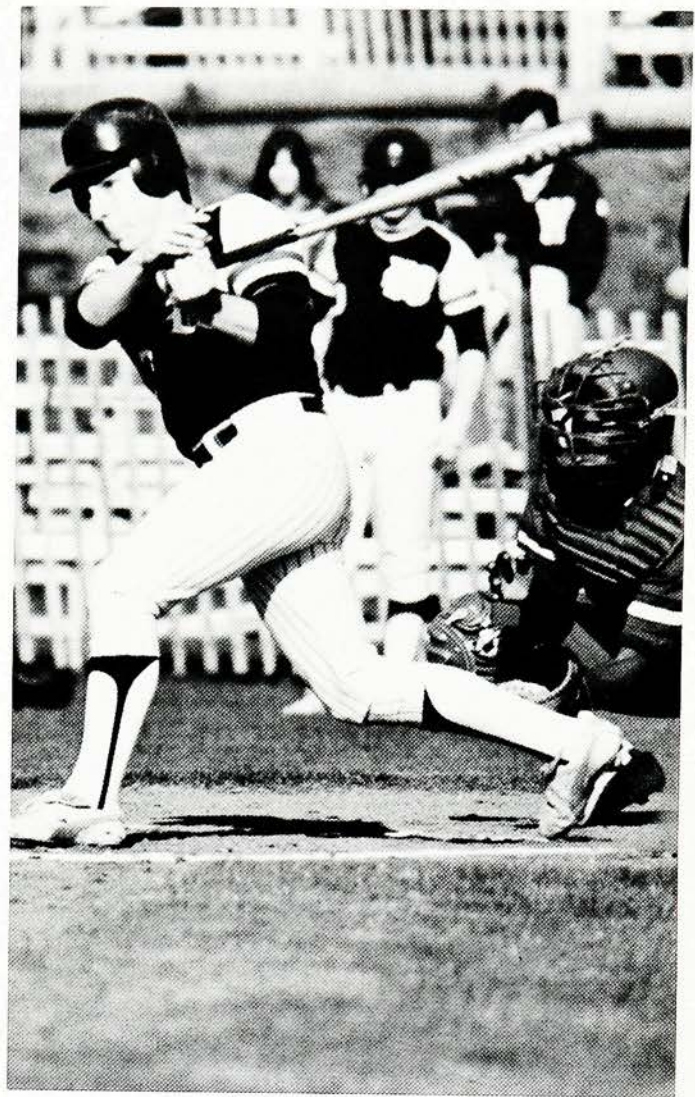
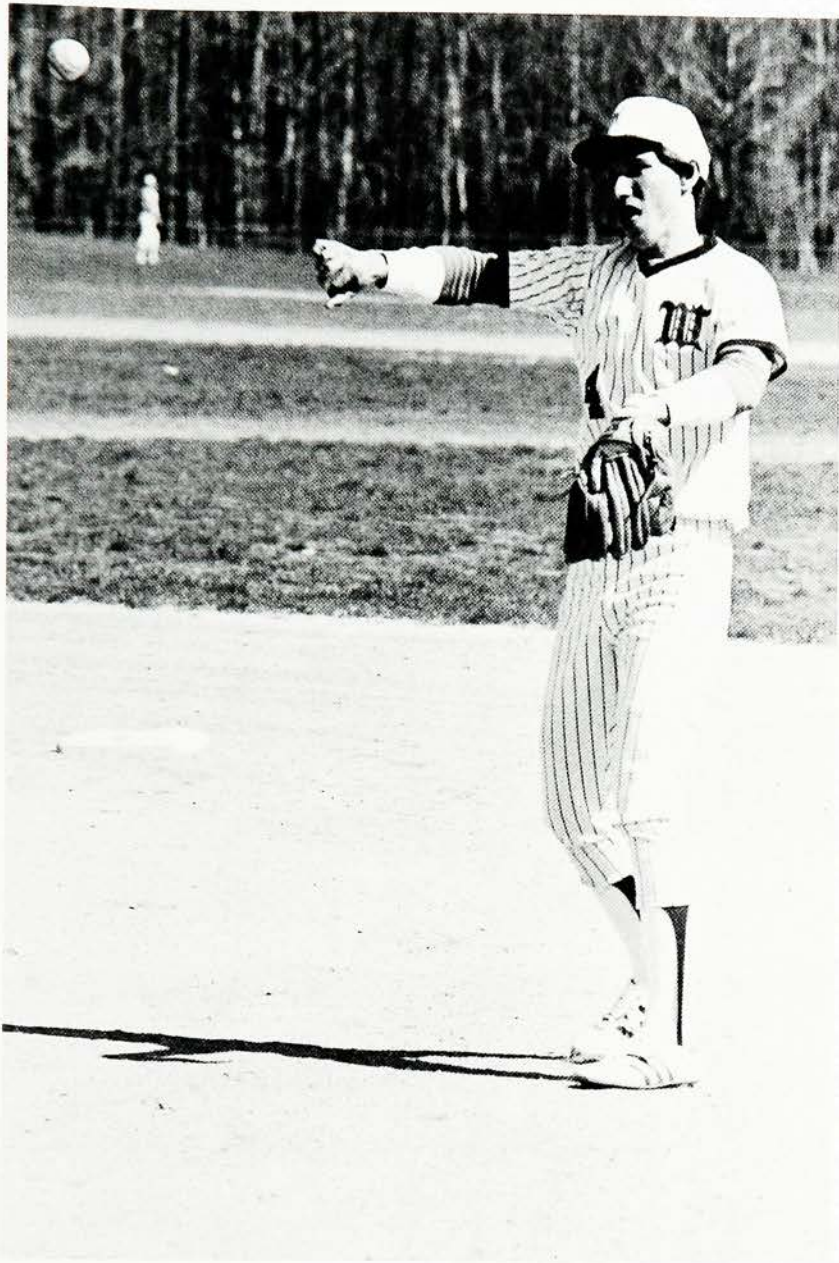
Baseball

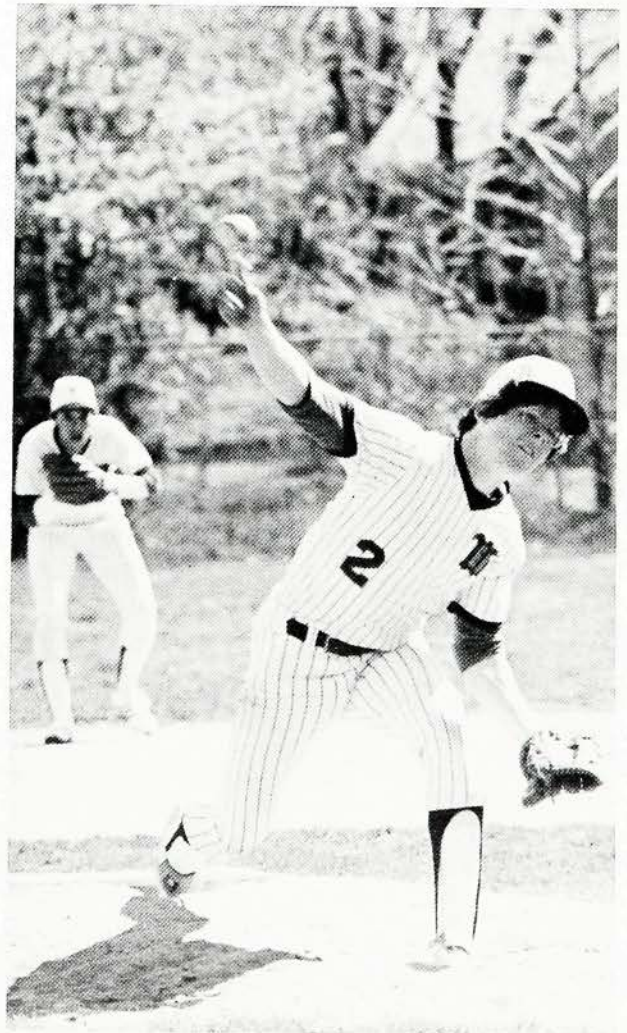

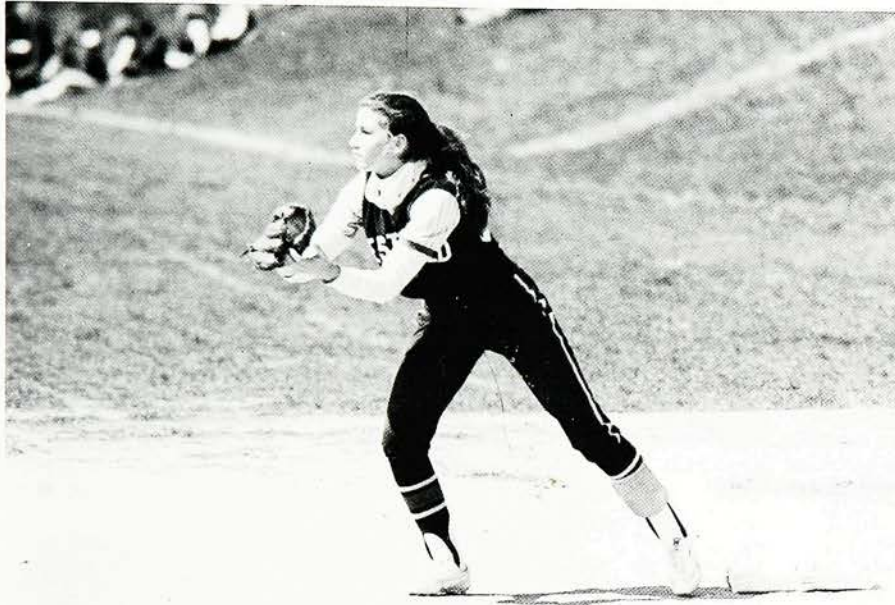
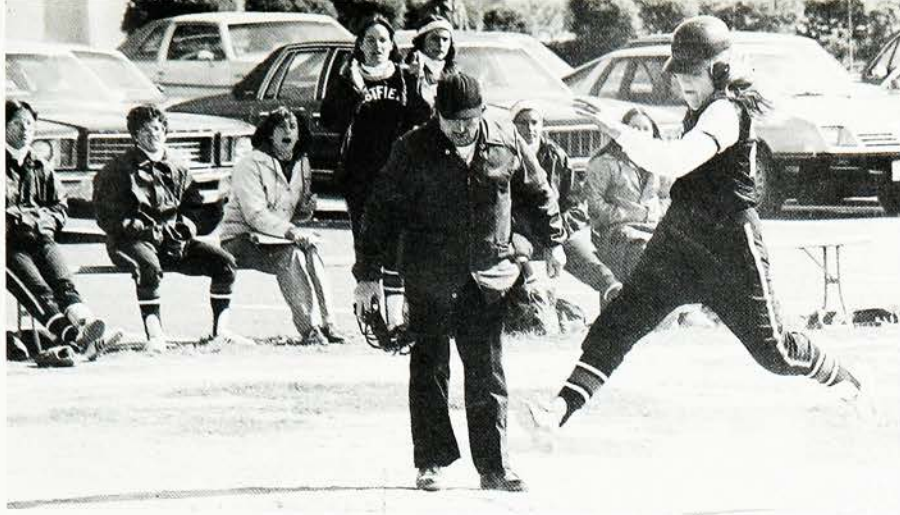
Softball

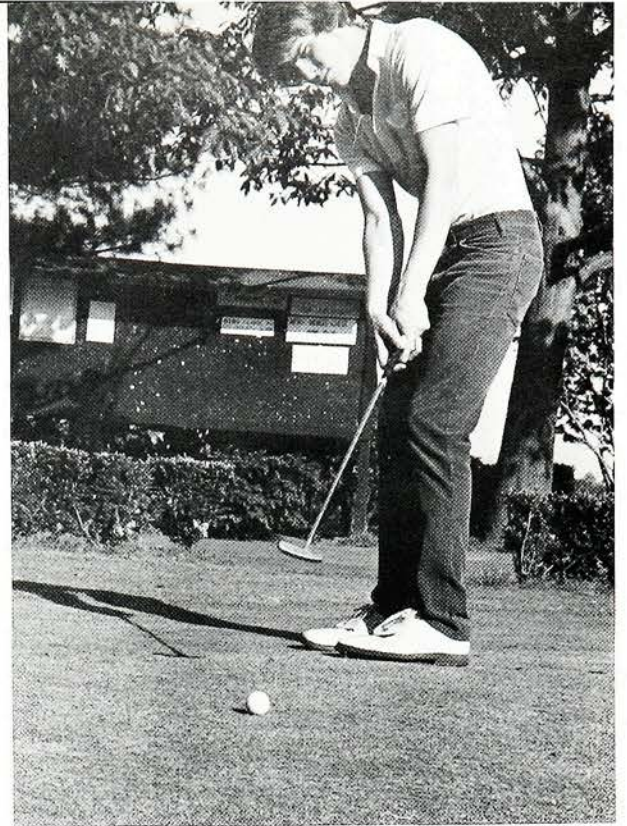
Golf
