FRENCH CLUB


















LATIN CLUB








NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY






MARCHING BAND








SYMPHONIC BAND








WINTER GUARD

















SATURDAY SCIENCE















FILM-MAKING CLUB









FOOTBALL








BOYS' SOCCER







GIRLS' SOCCER






CROSS-COUNTRY






WRESTLING







BOYS' BASKETBALL




BOYS' SWIMMING


















BOWLING

The team held a strong sence of team spirit and determiniation as evident by the many best seasonal performances.












