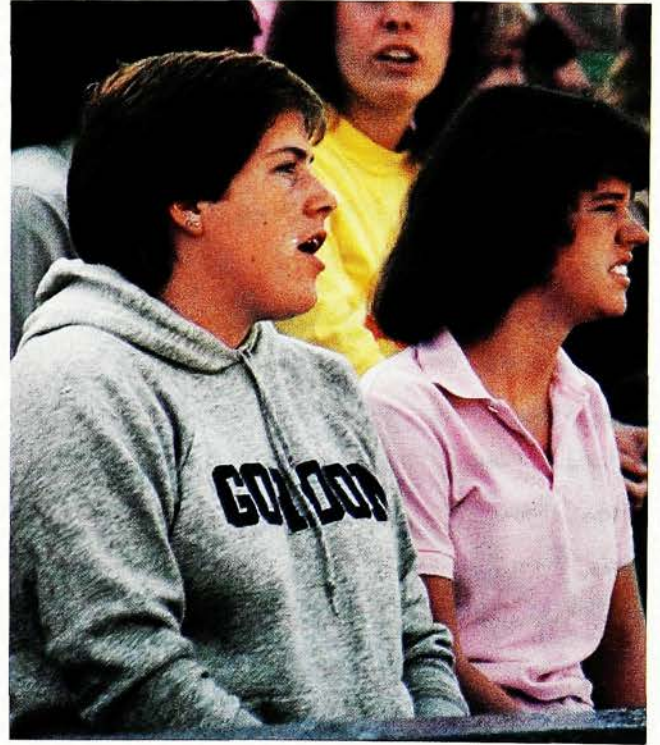
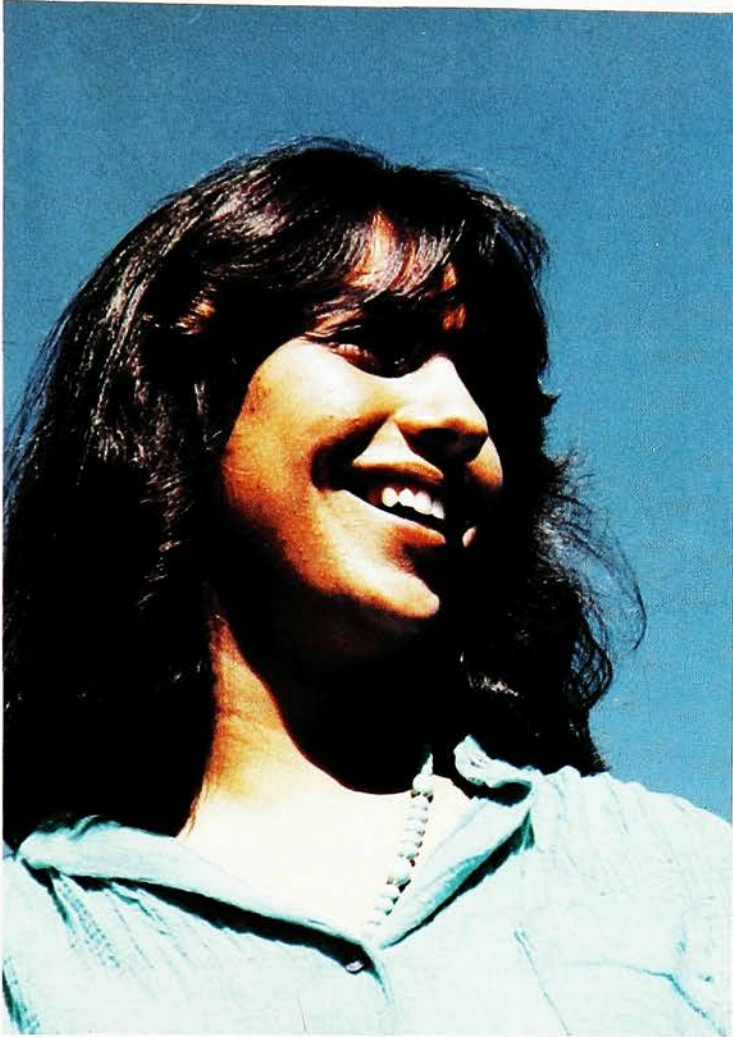


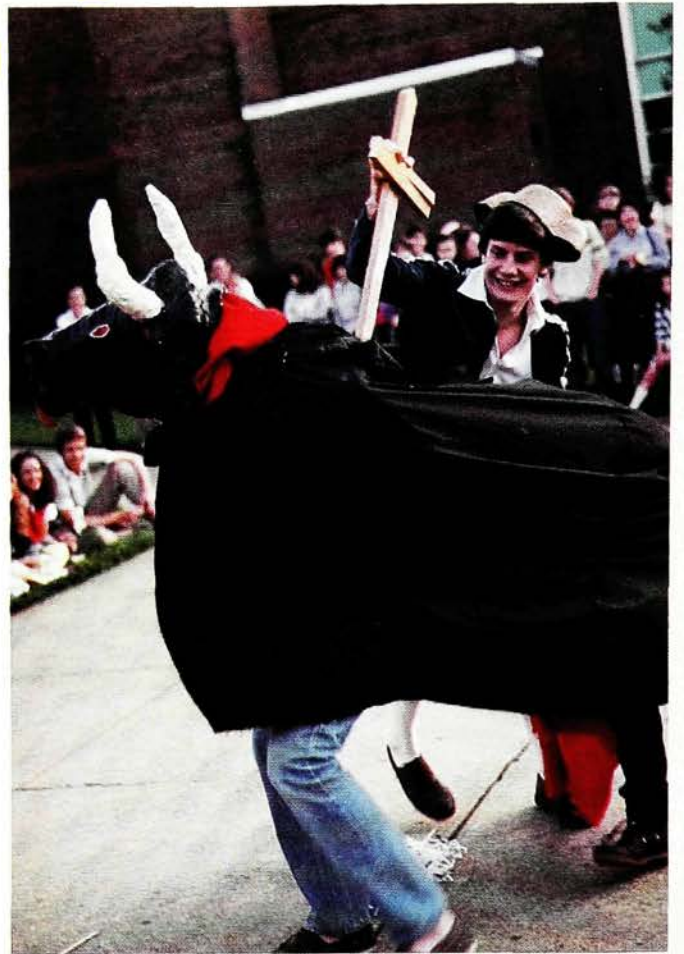
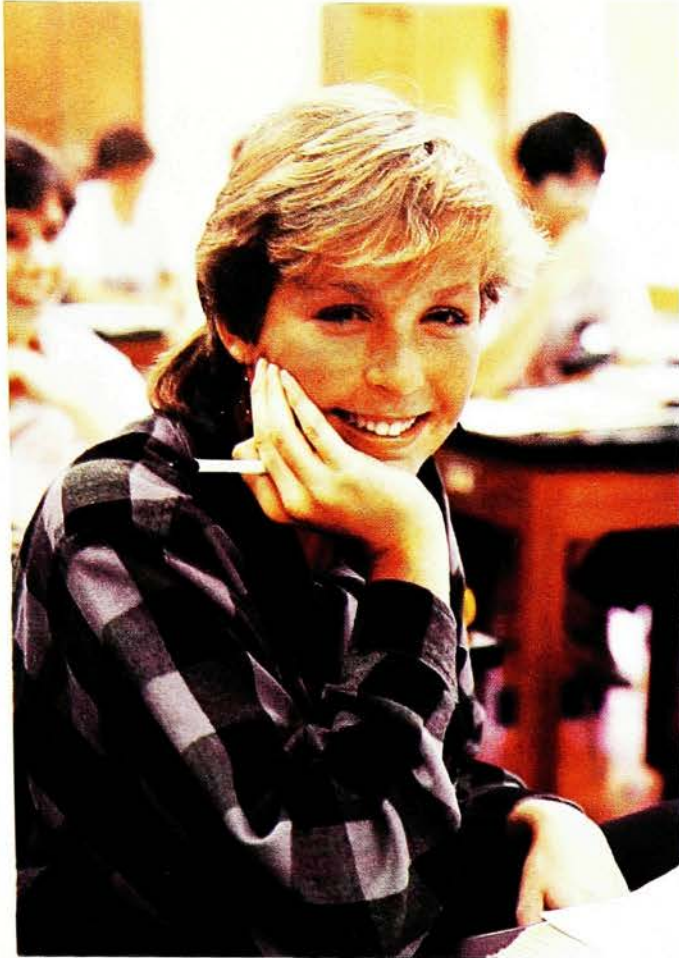


CHALLENGE

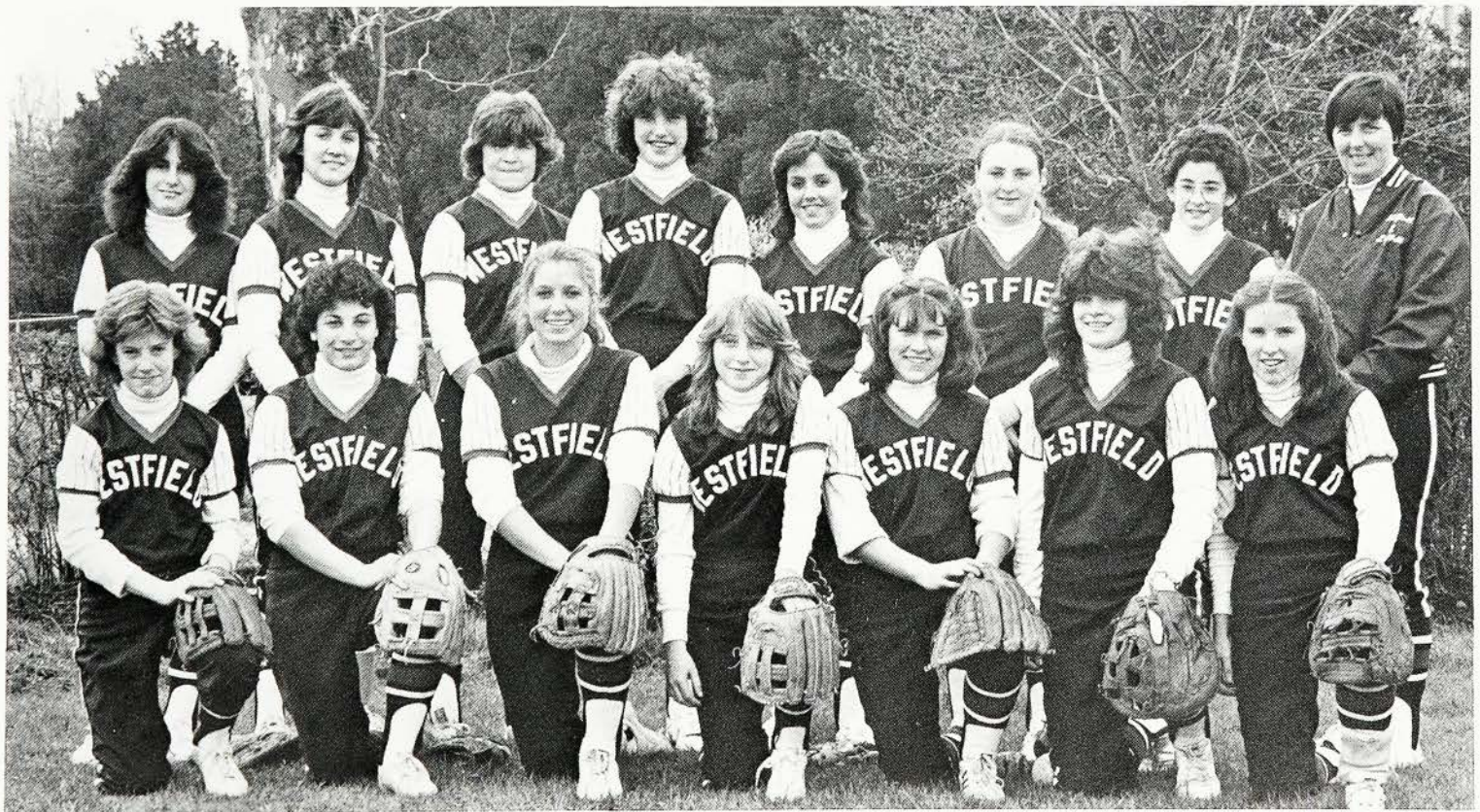
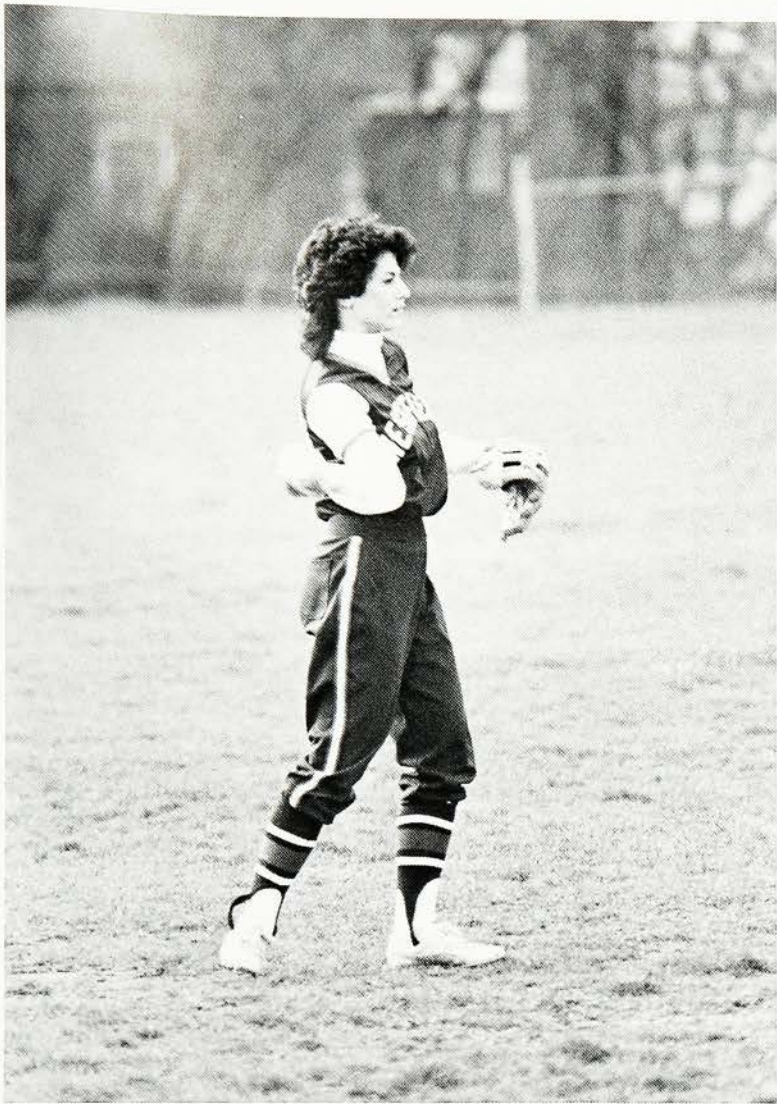
SOFTBALL

This year's team drew in many underclassmen; therefore Westfield can look forward to an even stronger team next year.

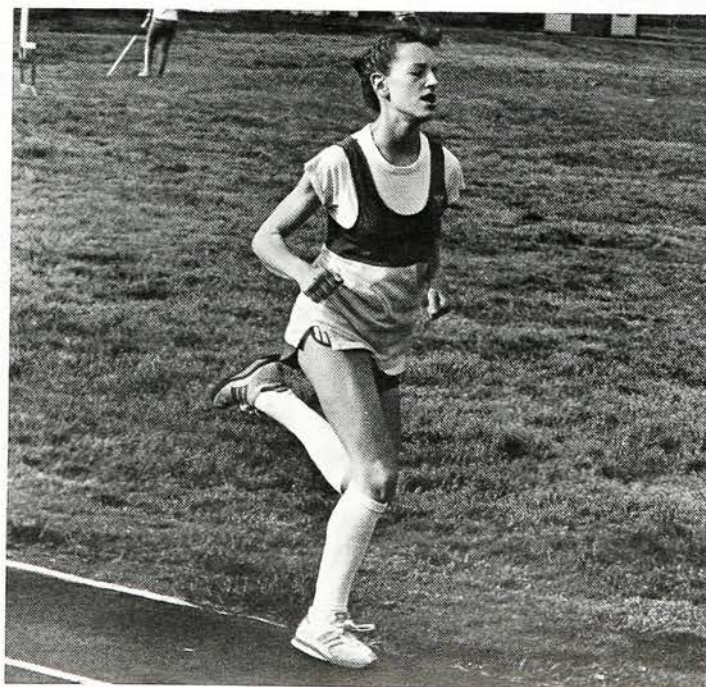


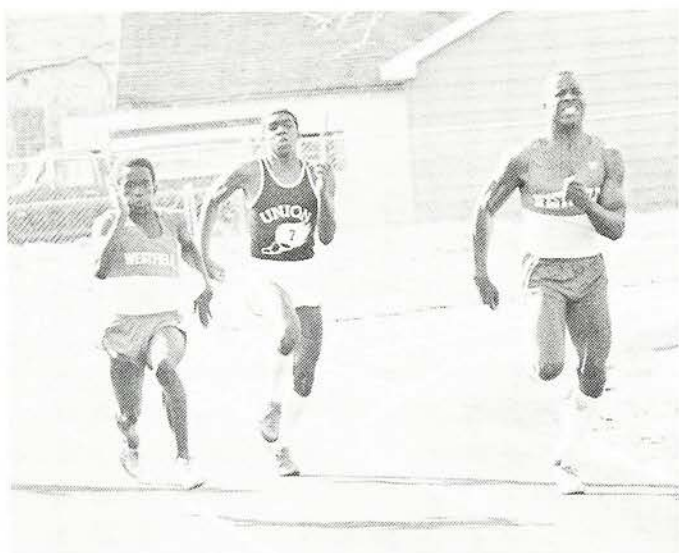

limited success.

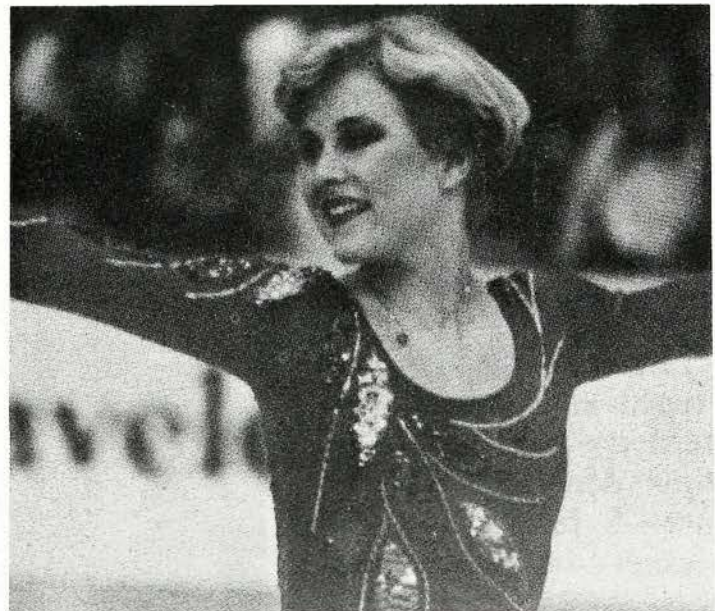

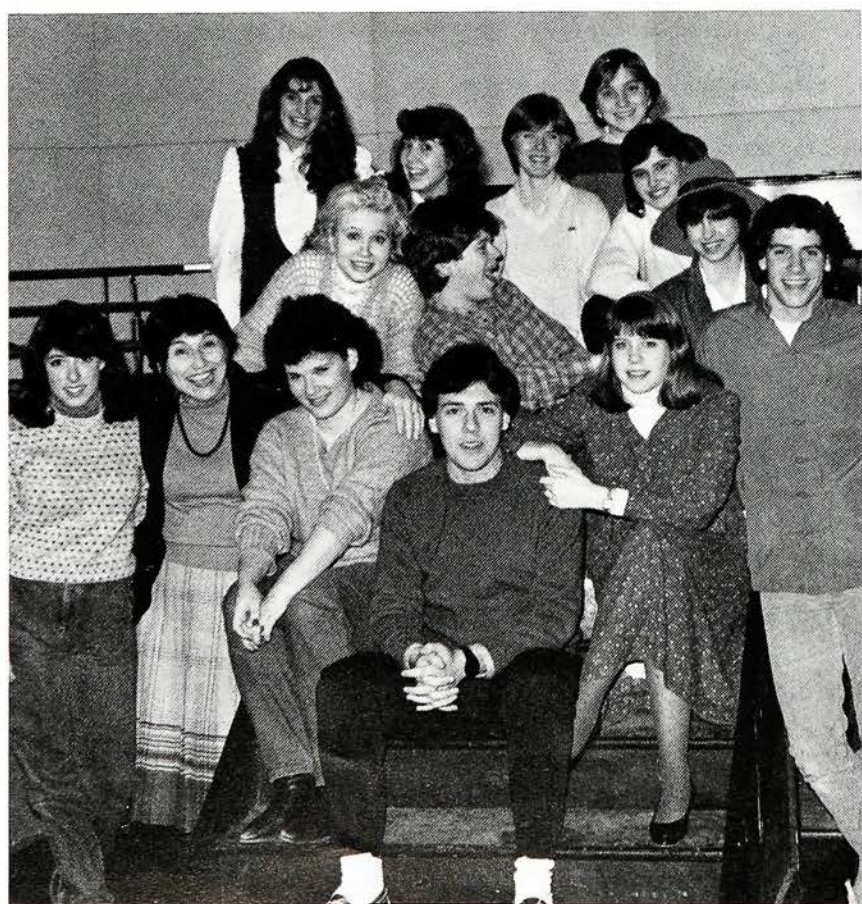
Ingredients:

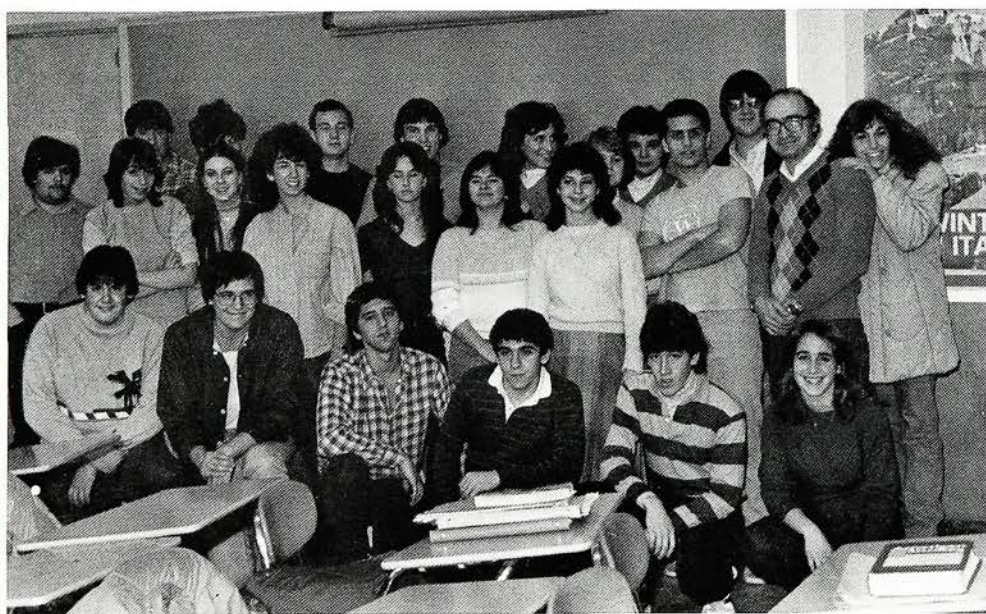
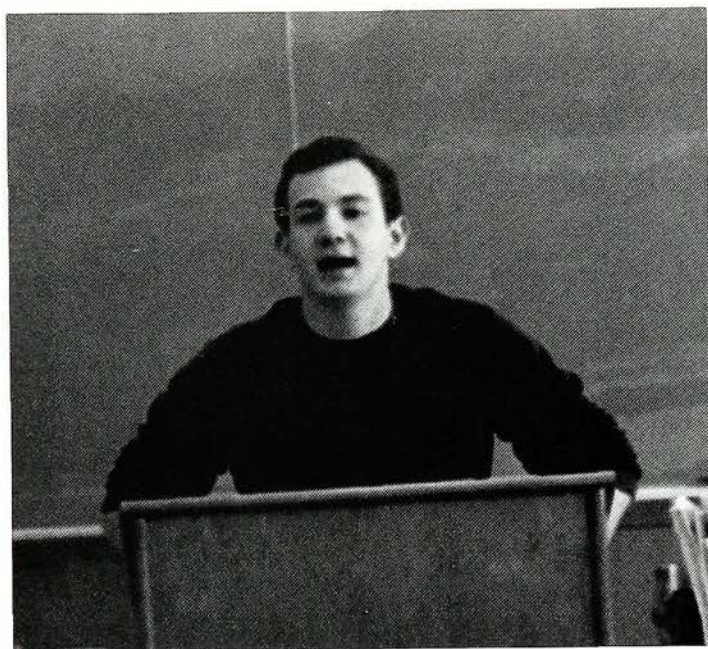
FRENCH CLUB

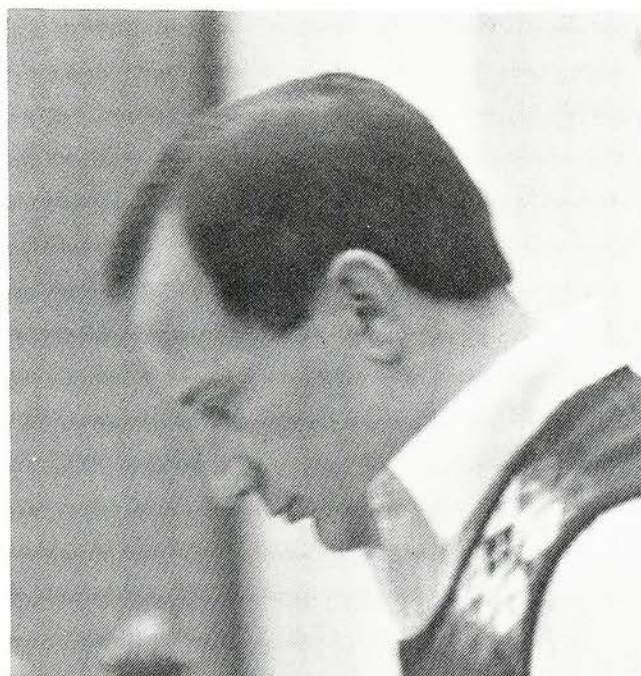
MARCHING BAND

SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA



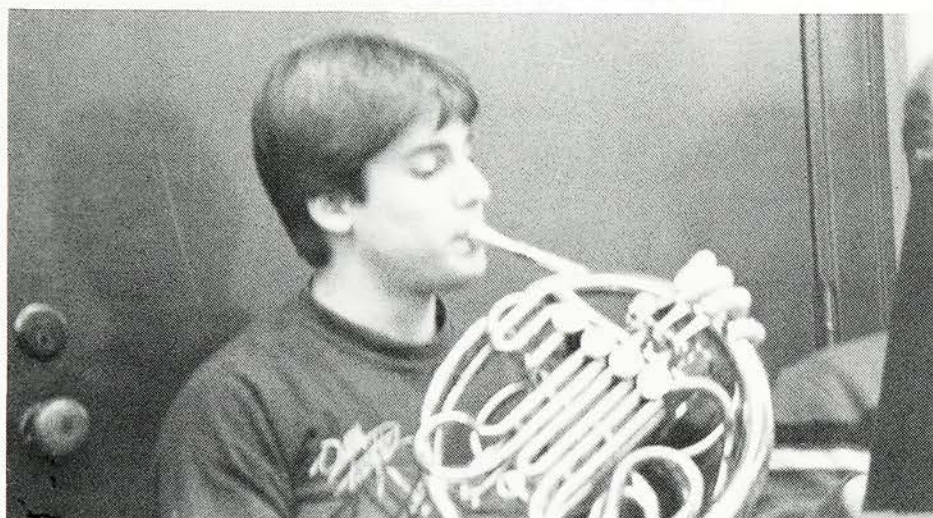

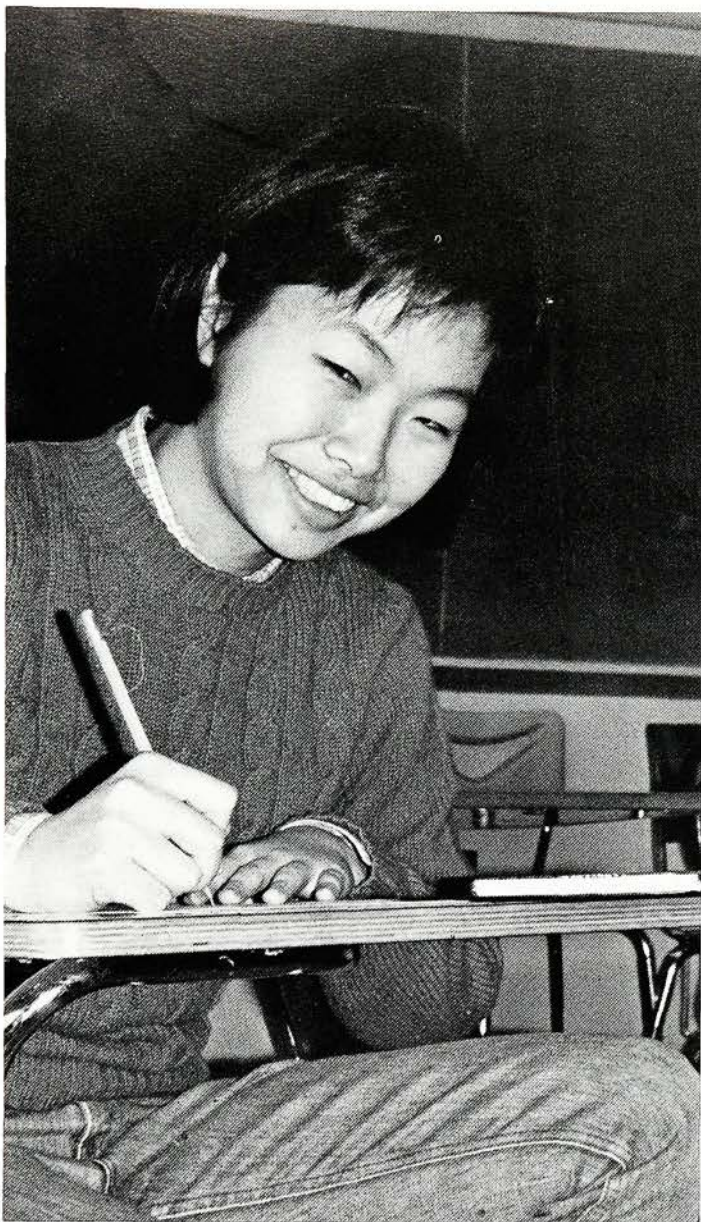


PHYSICS CLUB



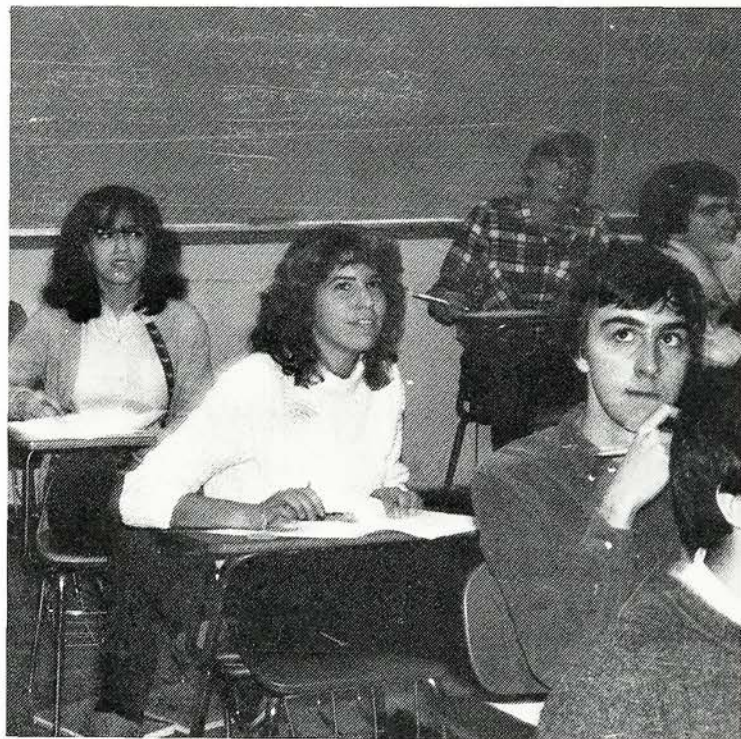

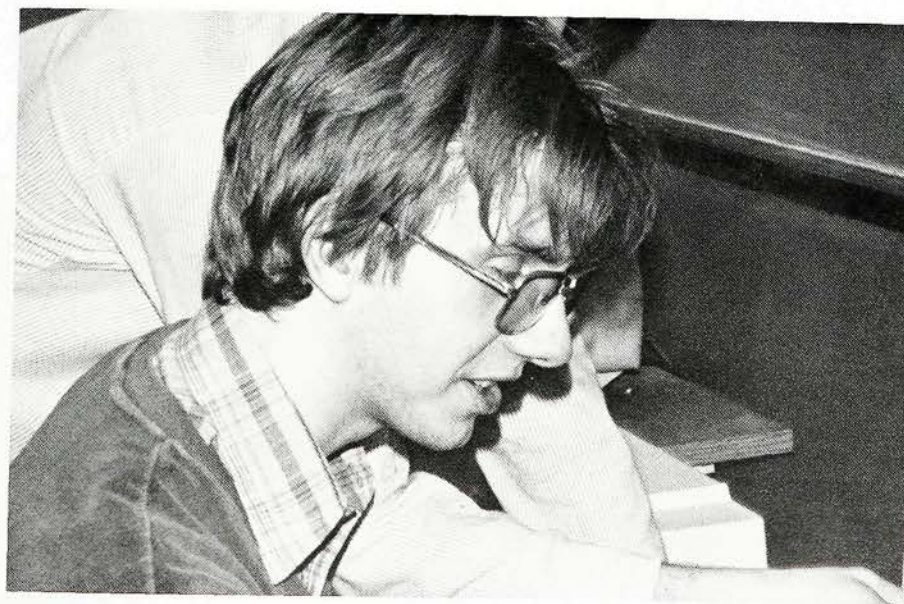
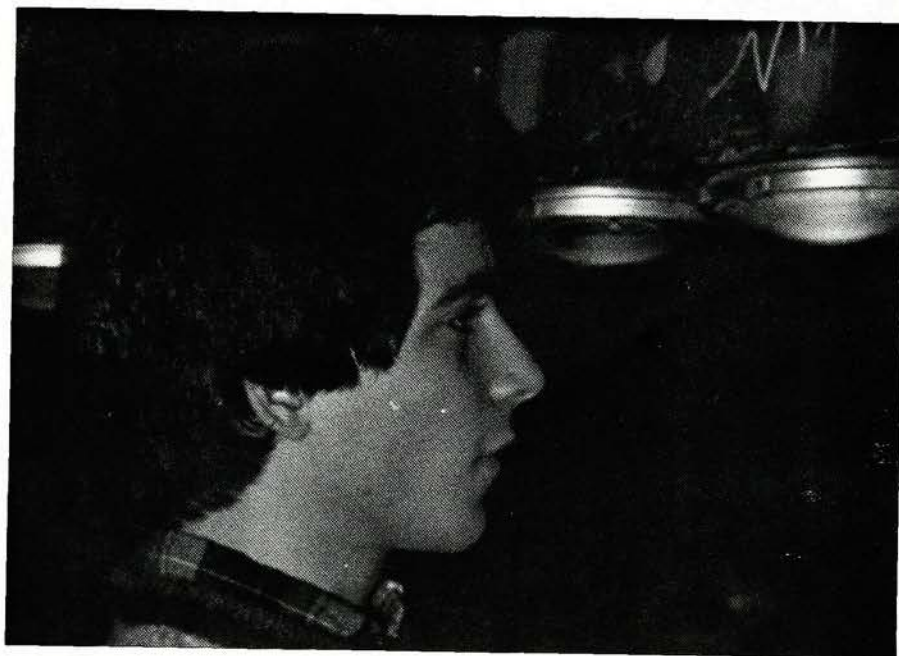
AMERICAN FIELD SERVICE
