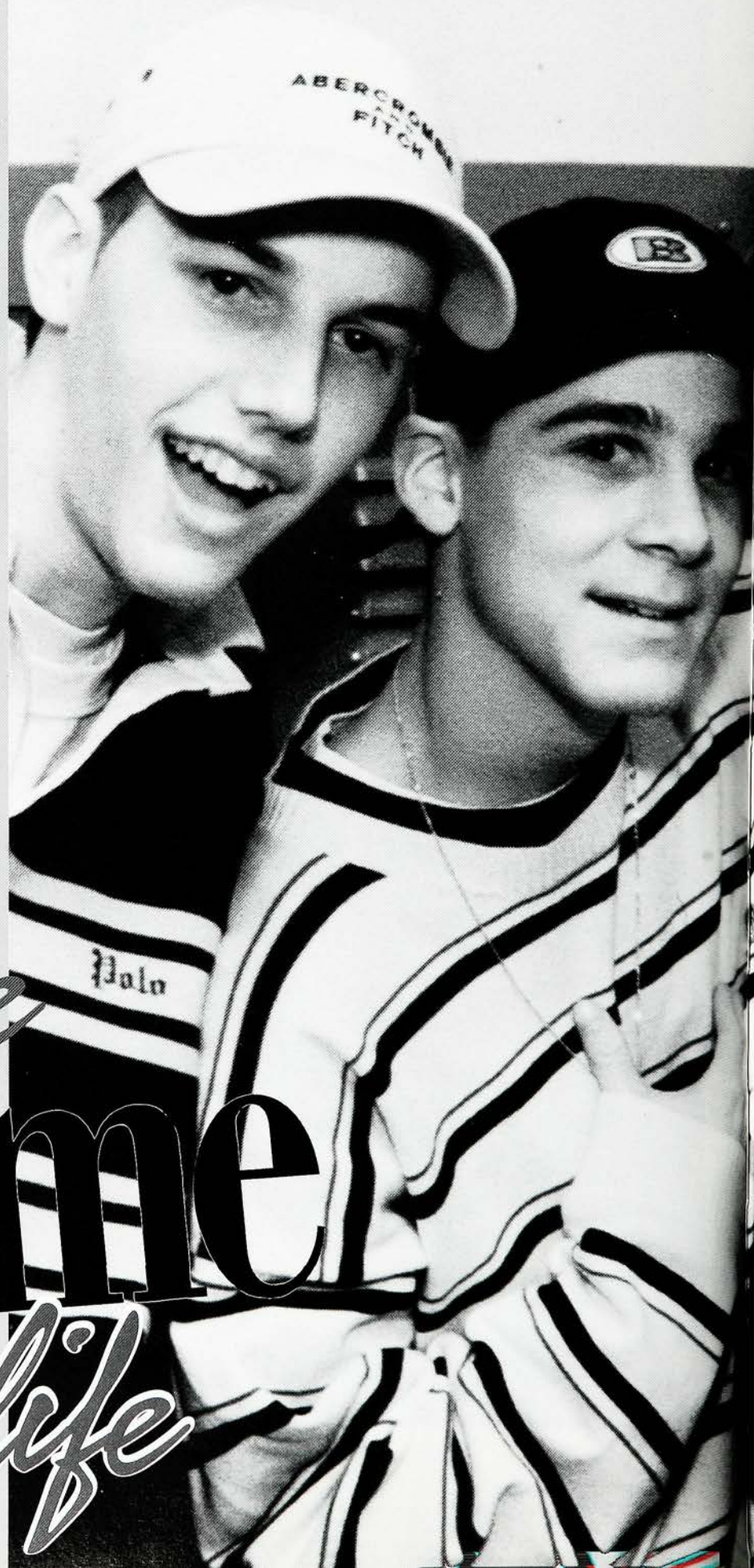


Juniors

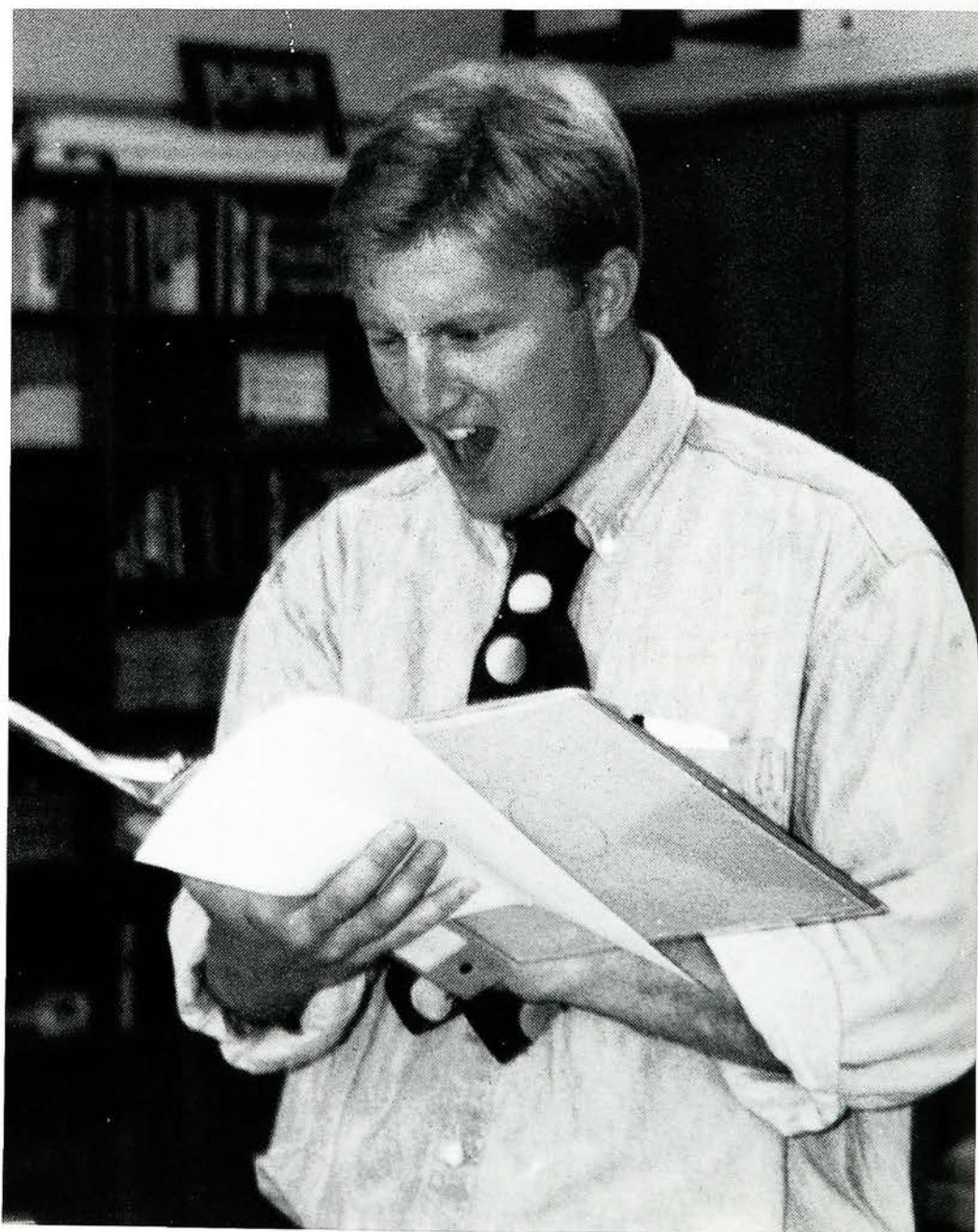
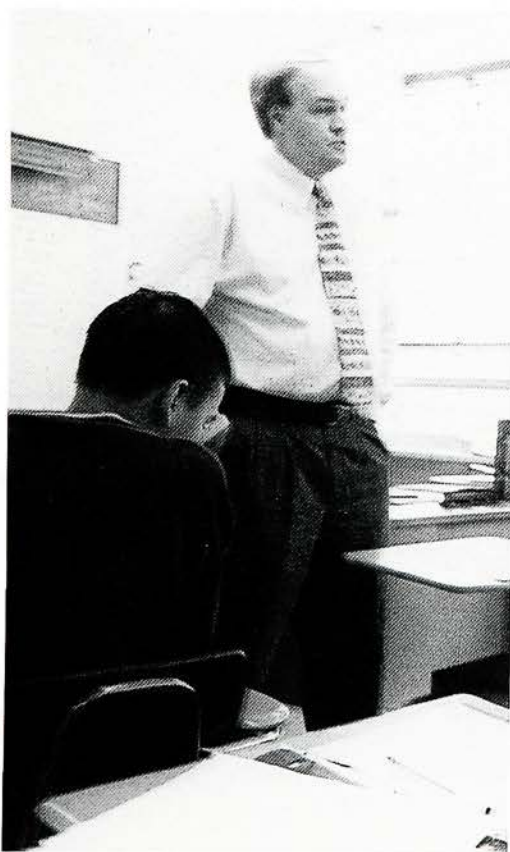
Project '79

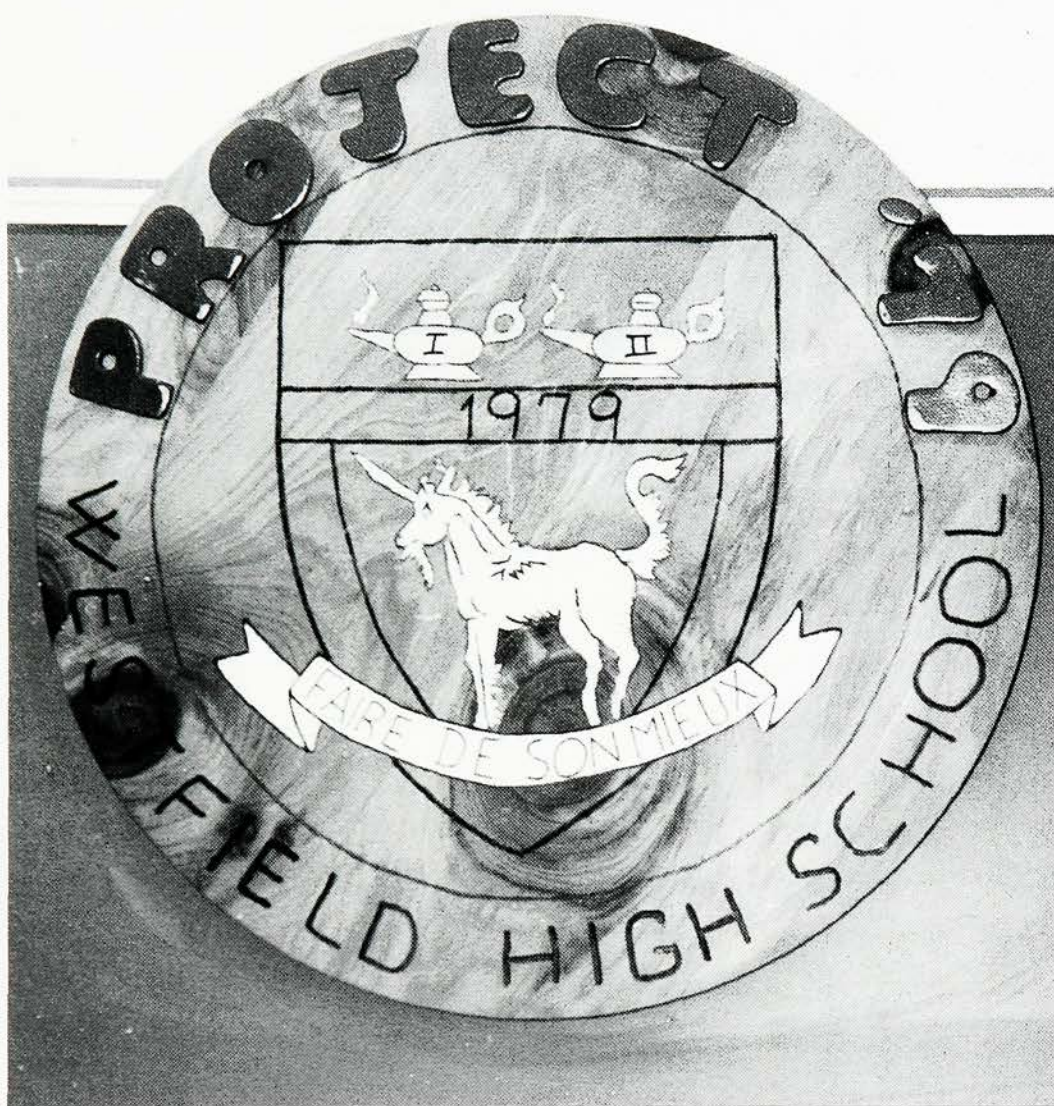

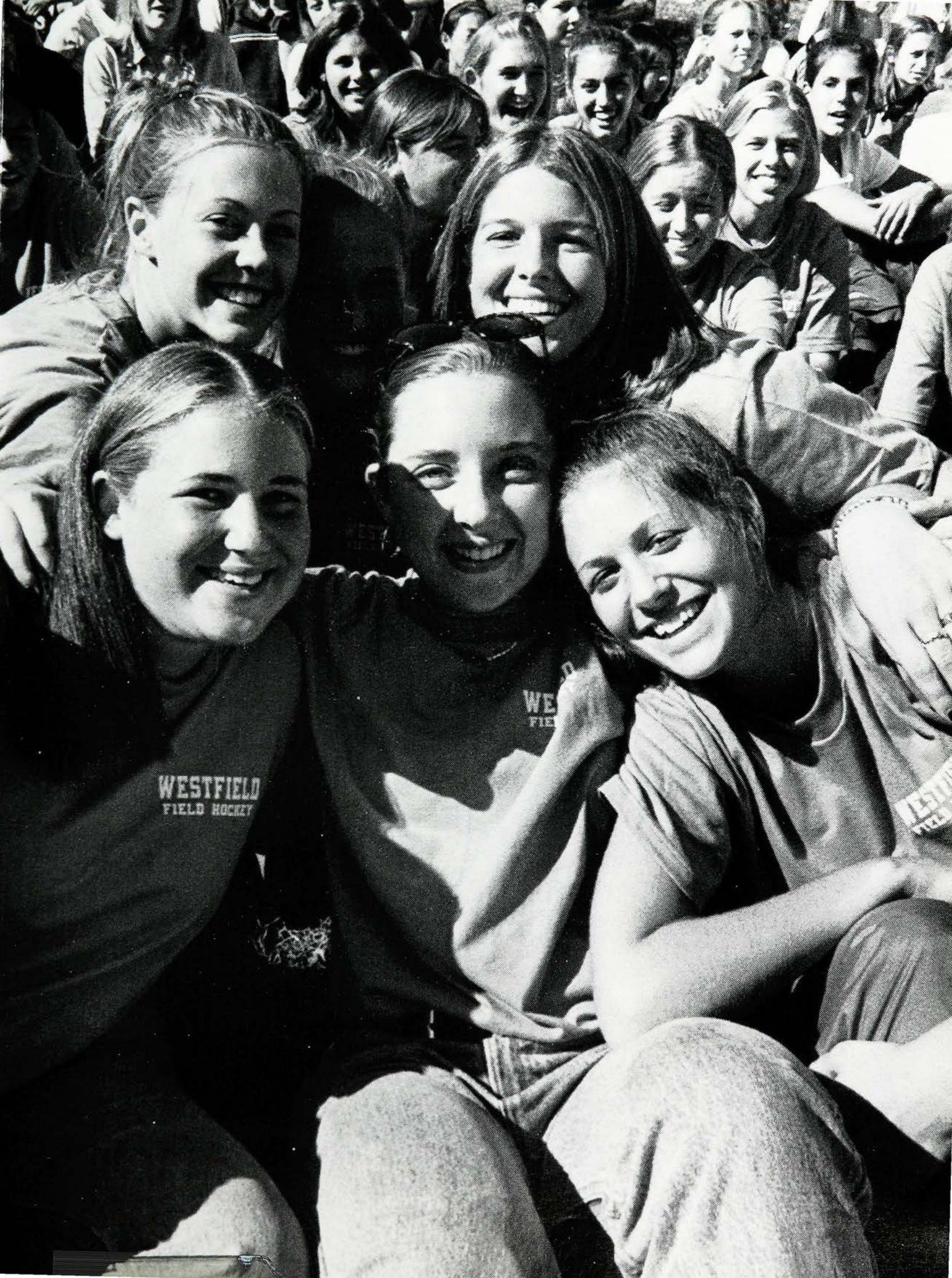


Sports
