


















Juniors



























Freshmen

Each and every day is a new experience to us. Each one of us will form new groups and meet new people, and form memories with each other. These memories will remain with us forever.




Project '79




Sports




Foreign Language After School

Every day Michelle threatened to quit. What happened? Actually, Michelle's high spirits and tuneful energy powered us through many a dry session.

















































Graduation - A New Beginning
