










Television

























Room 154 was the sole English classroom in the back hallway and was recently renovated into a math classroom. Math Department Head Mr. Hal Johnson said, "[The room] became a math classroom and the teachers expressed their desire not to teach in a room with artwork.'

He also said Room 154 was painted over because it was found to be a distraction for both the teachers and the students. Also, many teachers felt that the murals were messy and in need of alteration.

Parking plans put on hold

The Town Council pulled the proposed WHS parking policy that caused much debate in Westfield. After many months of discussion, the Town Council opted to leave the issue for next year's council to address instead of voting it down at the meeting.

The ordinance passed on

its first reading, but was pulled before the second reading began.

Council members said that because many residents opposed the plan, voting in favor of the ordinance would not be a smart solution. It became evident that the ordinance would not have passed if it had been voted upon.



Eye on stress at WHS

"They've been called Generation Stress-the stressed out generation of American youth, obsessed with an almost unattainable vision of perfection: the best school, the hottest clothes, the coolest music, the nicest body, the best friends" wrote Mr. Andrew Julien of The Hartford Courant.

Superintendent of Schools Dr. William Foley said, "The sources of stress are a combination of the demands parents put on children to achieve, and the stress students place on themselves by over-scheduling."

Student Assistance Counselor Ms. Maureen Mazzarese said, "Parents are often over-invested in the success and failures of their children, which can add layers of stress and anxiety to a child's life." She also thinks that some of the stress may come from academic pressures that are unreasonable for a teenage brain.

"We are trying to distinguish the line between healthy and debilitating stress," said Principal Dr. Robert Petix. While Petix sees the positive effects of stress in its invigoration of students, he recognizes that stress at the expense of health is dangerous.

The Board of Education has recognized the problem of stress at WHS and is planning to address it through the Strategic Planning Committee. From this, it hopes to find ways to help students deal with the stress they are feeling.

Special Ed concerns addressed

Dr. Ted Kozlik, Westfield assistant According to superintendent of pupil personnel services, addressed the Westfield Board of Education (BOE) Dec. 2 regarding the district's special education program. Kozlik reported that the number of students enrolled in out of district programs, selfcontained classes and resource room programs is rising in proportion to the increasing student population.

He also reported that the district's students with disabilities are currently exceeding the standard test scores set by the No Child Left Behind Act.

Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources Dr. Margaret Dolan, Westfield special education students have scored above the mandated NJ Adequate Yearly Progress benchmark in each grade level, also above the county average.

Since one of this year's BOE goals is to evaluate the district's in-class support program and the achievement of Westfield special education students, Dolan stressed that test scores must continue to improve in order for the program to maintain its success.

Ice, ice baby!

Generally, snow days are a result of unsafe roads, and once they are cleared, normal activities can resume. But the issue that has been overlooked is not the danger in getting to school but the potential hazards one faces upon arrival. WHS has been plagued by ice for the past month.

Editorial

Every day, members of our school can be seen struggling to walk a mere 100 yards from their cars towards any of the entrances to WHS. Although WHS Nurse Ms. Margaret Teitelbaum said that only a few students and a teacher have reported falling, it is time that the administration does something to help eliminate this hazard before a more serious accident occurs.

Ice accumulates during late hours making it difficult to have safe conditions by 7:30 a.m. However, when student and faculty safety is at risk, a solution must be found. If more time is needed to clear or remove the ice, then a delayed opening must be given consideration, particularly because it does not use up another snow day.

Rock salt has been used in some areas, but is often ineffective at low temperatures. The district has simply decided to use the cheapest method by spreading sand. This just covers the problem and does nothing to actually reduce it. However, using products that include calcium chloride can help speed the melting process.

The inconvenience of a delayed opening or the cost of more potent chemicals for melting ice are minimal in comparison to the peace of mind of knowing that the school campus is safe for all students and faculty.












