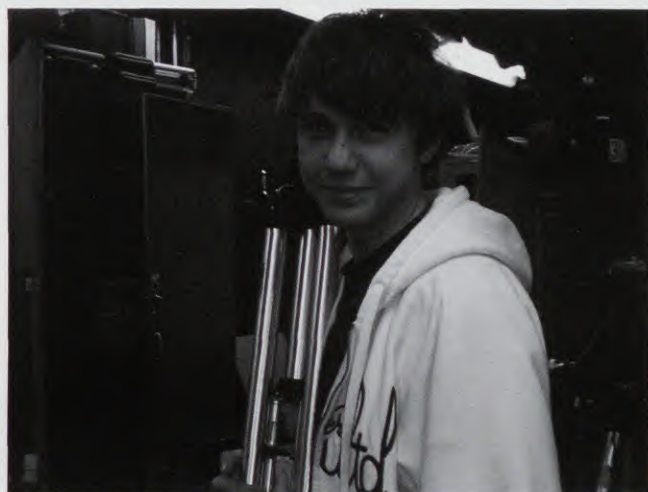

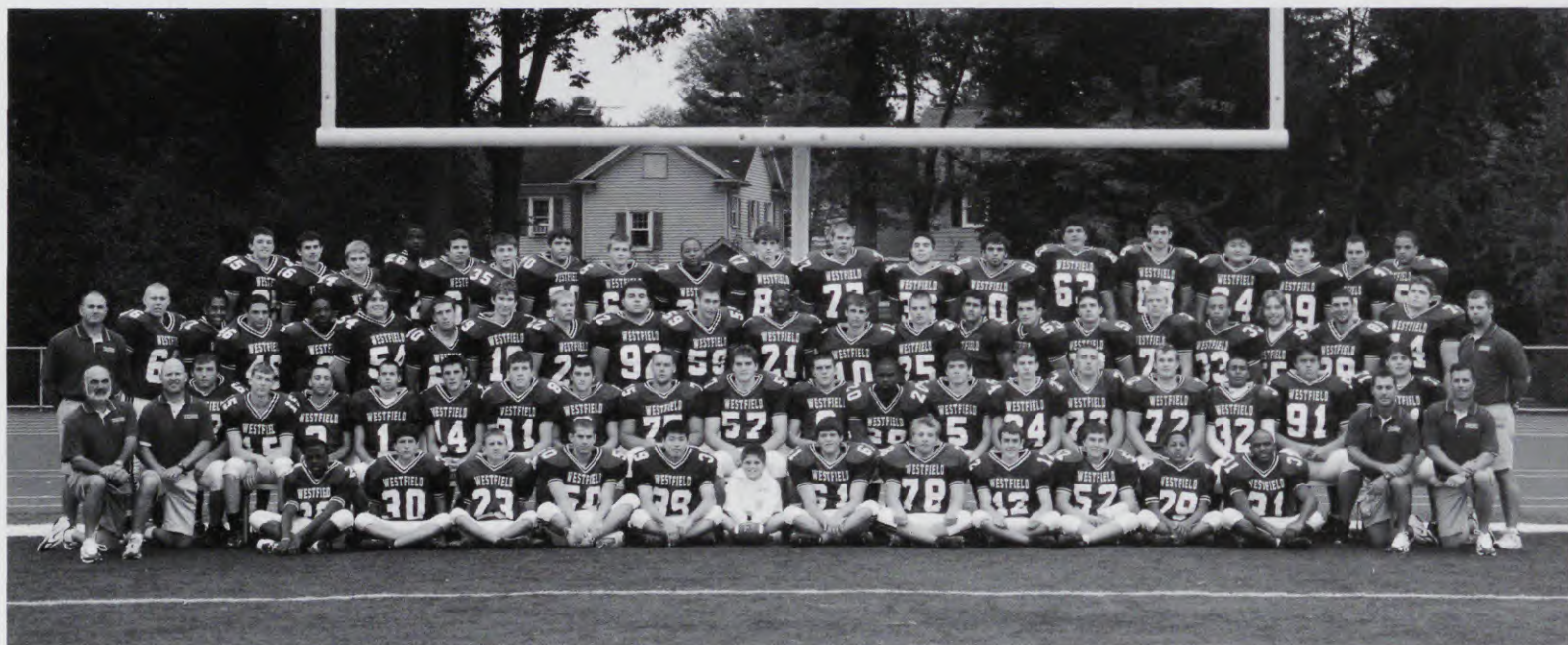

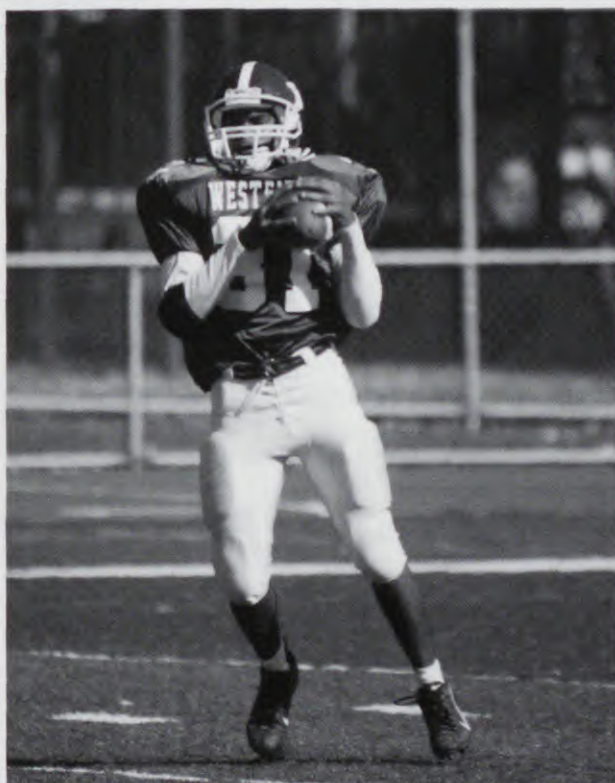

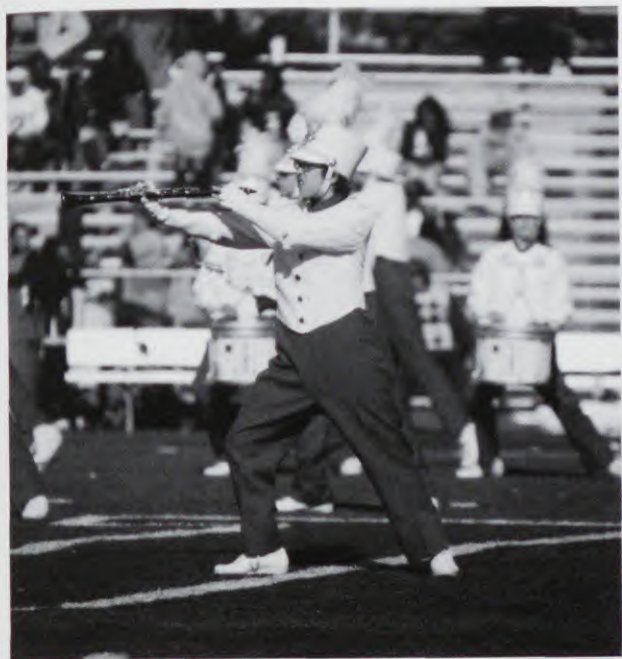

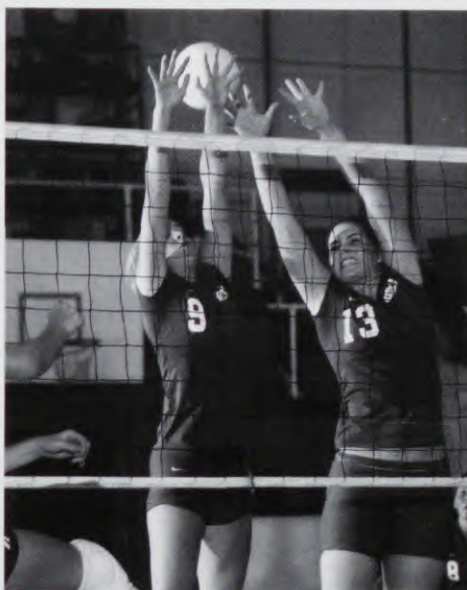

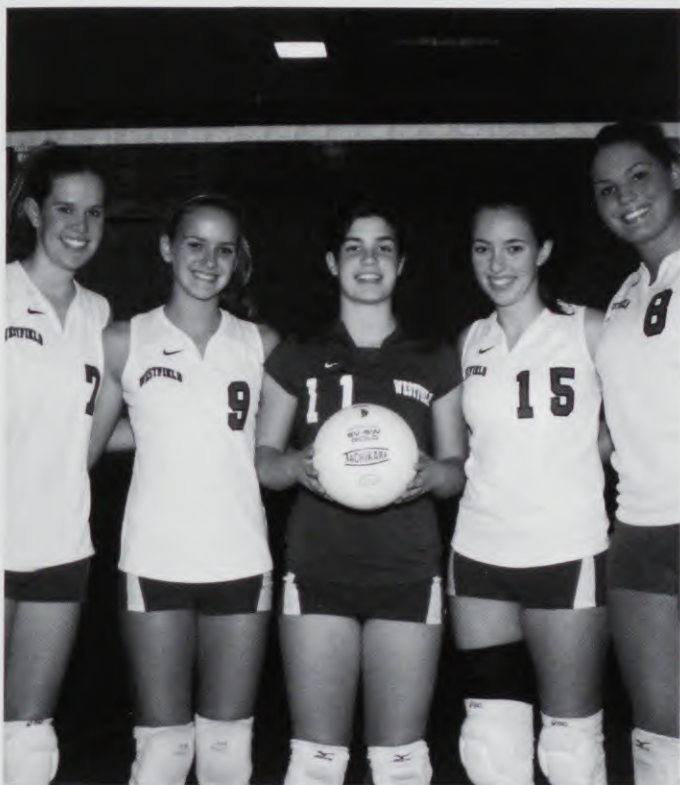

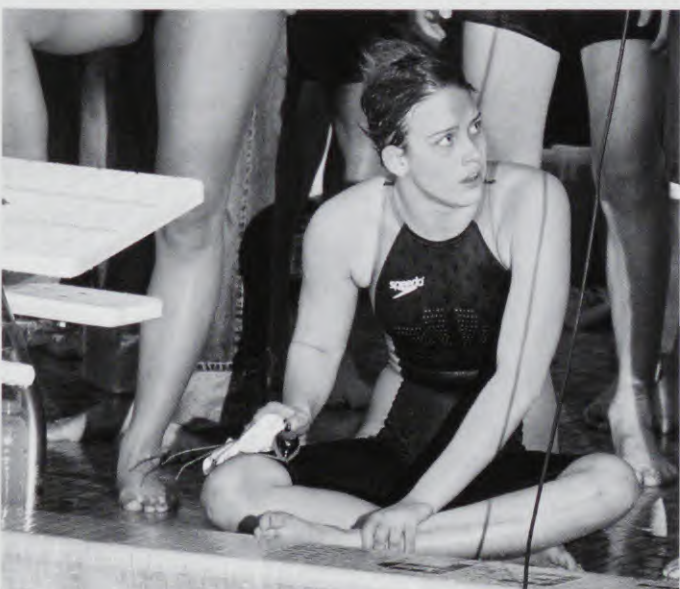

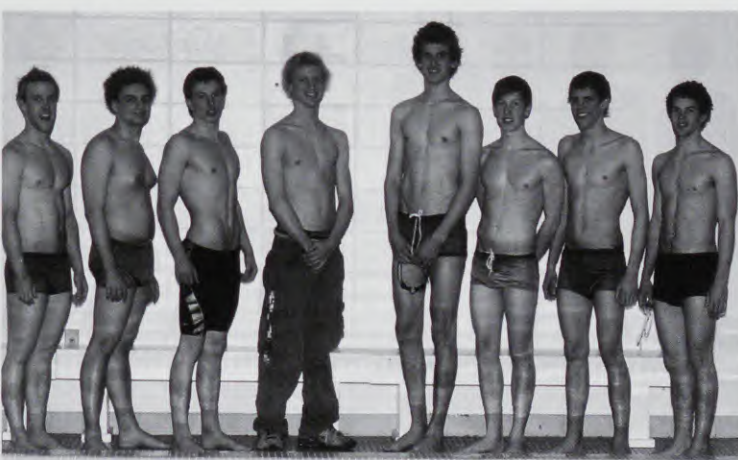

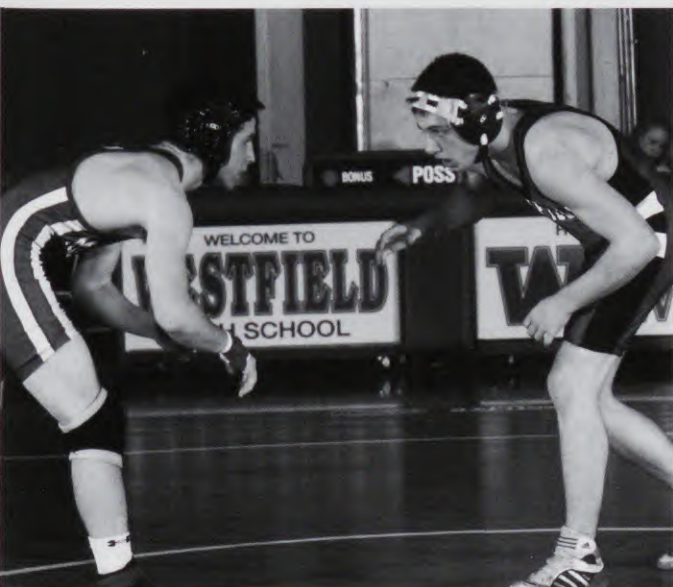

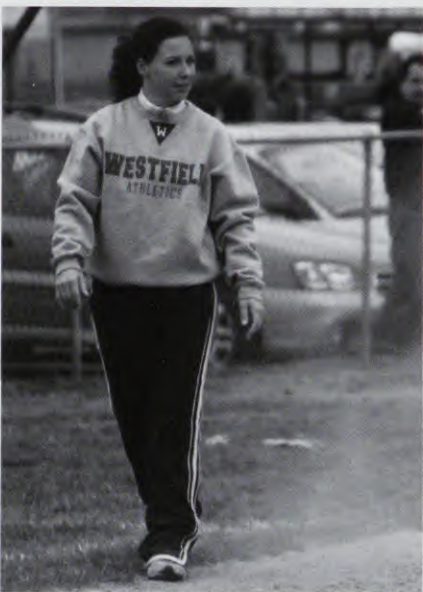

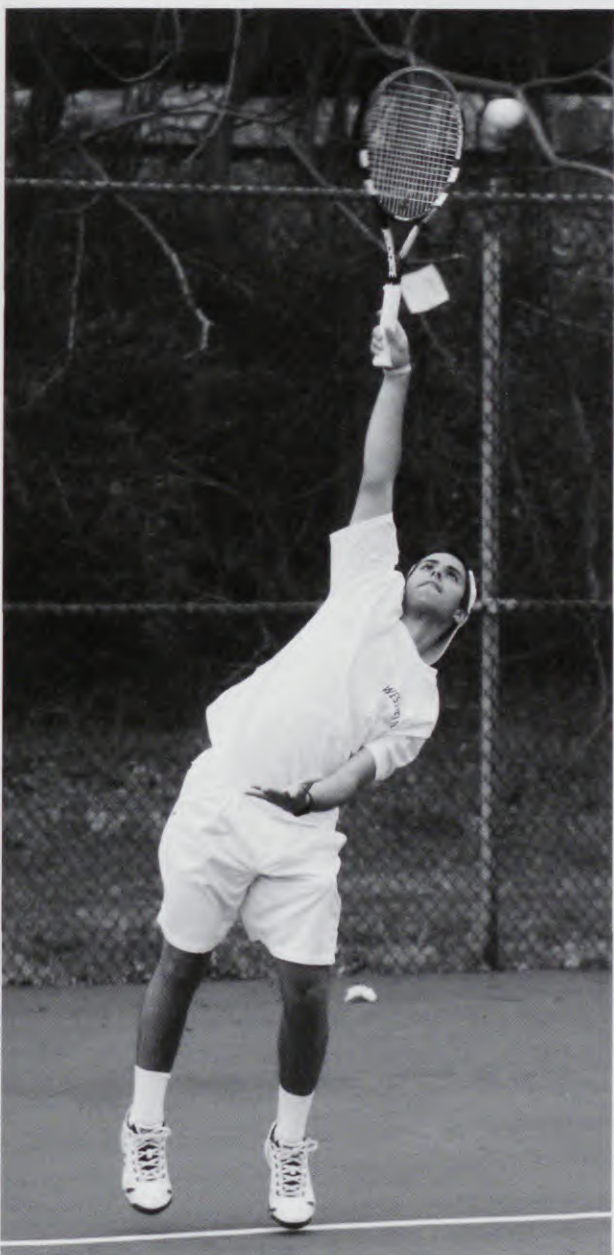

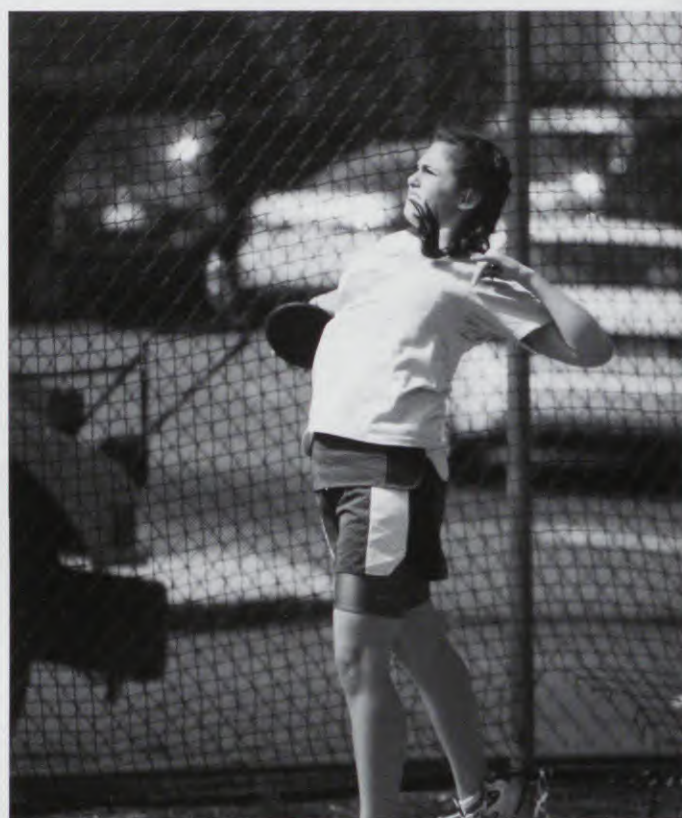

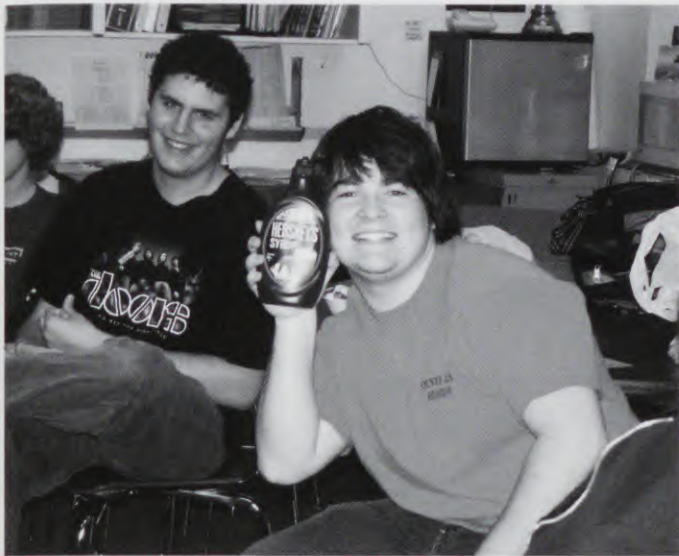

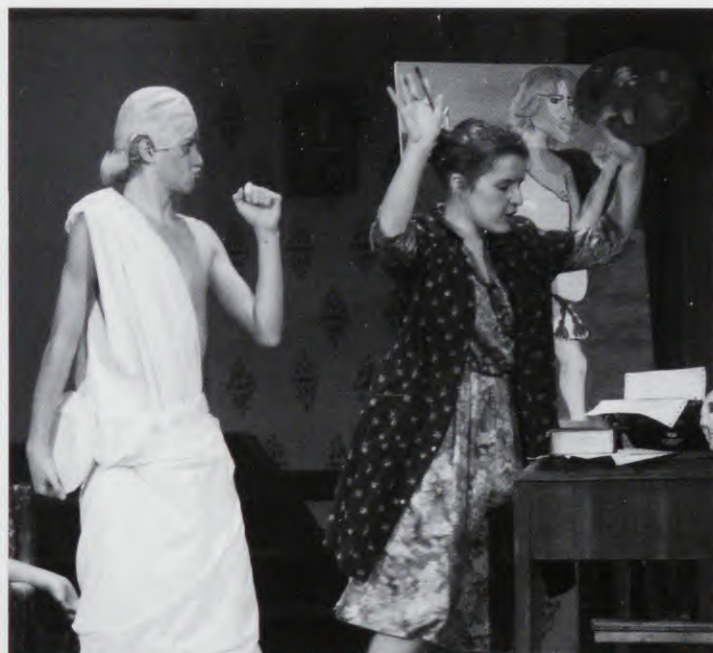

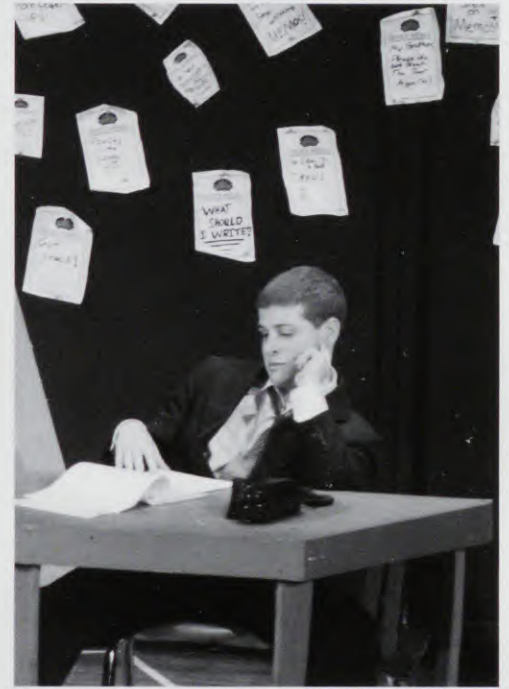

Art Show

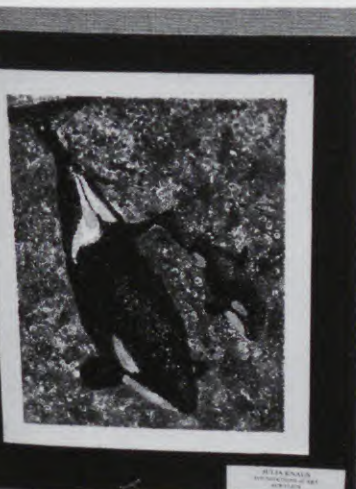

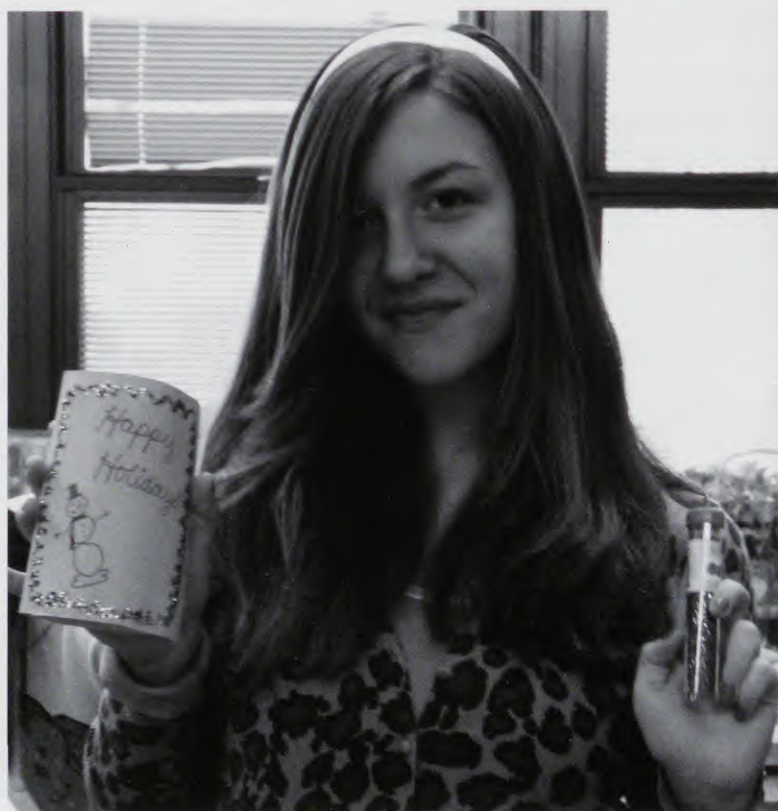
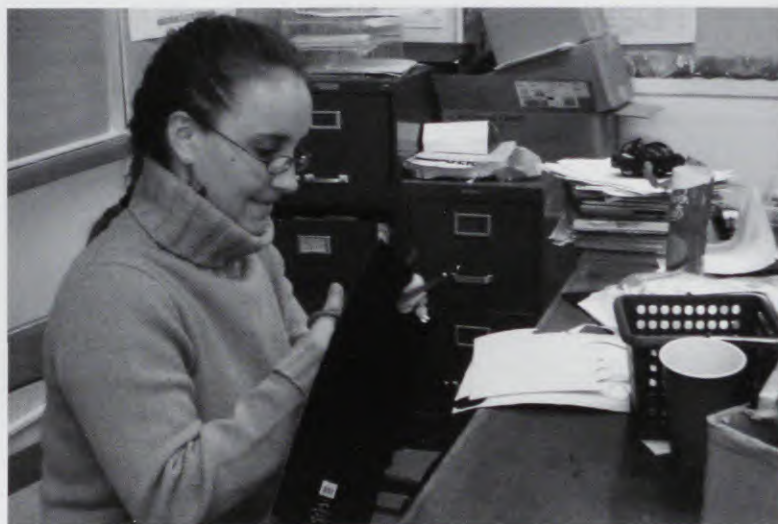

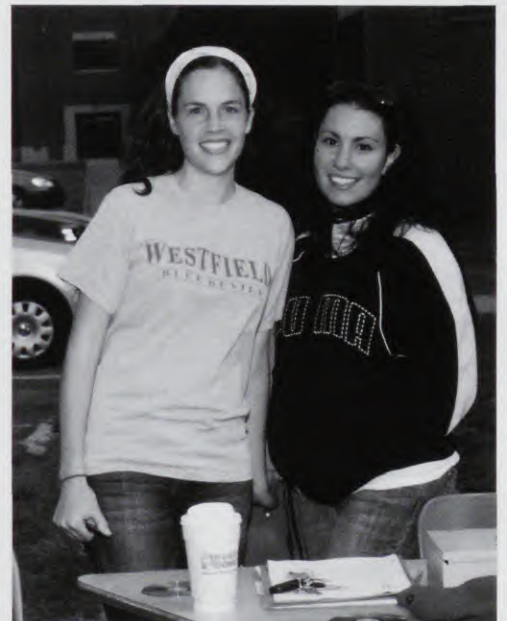


Student Council

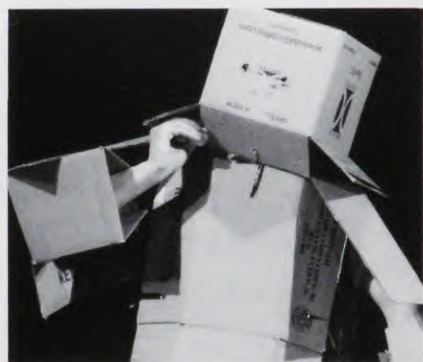

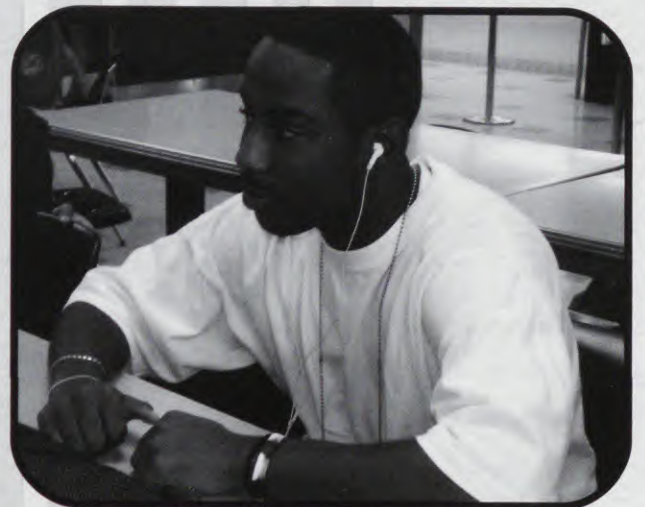
Closing
